And so you can see everybody lined up from tall to short, and I've fixed the angle so that the board in both photos is precisely aligned. So, we offer uh, now it's uh, \$250,000 prize for anyone who can demonstrate a claim of the paranormal. So we get some really interesting applications. And one gentleman was named Nick Nelson, who's from Montana, and he operated this place called the Golden Vortex. And he sent us these photos where he would be shorter in one image and taller in the other, and he'd draw lines between them. But then you'd look and his feet were completely in different placements. The camera had moved. Like, get a tripod, buddy.
