**Intro (Bob Ball):** The McElroy brothers are not experts, and their advice should never be followed. Travis insists he's a sexpert, but if there's a degree on his wall, I haven't seen it. [theme music plays]

**Travis:** [calm voice] I'm your middlest brother, Travis McElroy.

**Griffin:** I'm your sweet baby brother, Griffin McElroy. And uh, Travis has a—Travis has a voice, everybody.

**Travis:** Well, I—so, I thought—I thought, you know, it's year—this is the last episode of the year, so we can do our normal, every year, like we do every year, standard just kind of year-end review.

Griffin: Okay. Okay.

Travis: And just kind of talk about how 2020 went...

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis:** ... the highs, the lows, if we can even think of any.

**Justin:** Yeah. The fashion. [laughs] If you think of any lows...

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin:** ... the fashion, the trends, the movies that shaped us.

**Travis:** Yeah, exactly, you know?

**Justin:** The cultural milestones, the moments that united us physically.

**Griffin:** Yes.

**Travis:** Yes, yes, yes. There's a lot. A lot happened this year, and...

**Griffin:** Was that—was that there, uh, Pizza Rat? Was that 2020?

**Travis:** Uh, no. I think that—I think that was 2017.

Justin: Ooh.

**Griffin:** Ah, shoot. I was pretty close, though.

**Justin:** It feels so new!

**Griffin:** He was a rat, though. So—

**Travis:** Okay. What about Balloon Boy? That feels more recent.

**Griffin:** Balloon Boy was pr—Balloon Boy preceded pizza. Balloon Boy flew so Pizza Rat could walk and steal pizza.

Travis: Okay.

**Griffin:** So I know that that's—that did not happen in 2020.

**Justin:** It would've been kickass if Pizza Rat flew also.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: Yeah. Well, um... I played, uh, some video games this year.

**Griffin:** That's not gonna do it, no. We're looking—Travis, we're looking for cultural touchstones.

**Travis:** Right, right, right.

**Griffin:** We're looking for, um, big, important moments in our uh—in entertainment history. Because that's what—what are we now, if not part of entertainment history?

Justin: Yes.

**Travis:** Oh, there was that moment when they said the one movie won the Oscar, but then it was like, "No, it was actually—"

**Griffin:** Not this—not this year, I don't think.

**Travis:** Fuck, really?

**Griffin:** I don't think that one was this year.

**Justin:** They didn't win uh—they didn't win one this year, I will say.

Griffin: Um... fuckin'...

**Travis:** [exhales]

Griffin: ... come on, y'all, Scoob!

**Travis:** *Scoob!* 

**Griffin:** Fucking *Scoob!* definitely came out this year.

Justin: That's good.

Travis: Scoob! Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Justin: Did Scoob! come out this year? It did.

**Griffin:** Celebrity faux pas. There have to have been those. [gritting teeth] Who really stepped in it this year?

Travis: Uhh...

Griffin: Oh, n-oh. Ellen!

Justin: Ellen stepped in it!

**Griffin:** Ellen did step in it this year. She—

**Travis:** Oh, when she went to that football game.

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin:** She did, she—well, she did that. First off, everybody was like, "Ellen's not a nice person, surprise."

And everyone was like, "Wow, that is a surprise. Look at her dance."

**Justin:** Do you ch—are you chill with W? When you dance like that?

**Griffin:** Yeah. And then she's like, "I'm not mean. I'm chilling with [through laughter] war criminal George W. Bush! [normally] We're at a football game! What's more American than that?" Ellen...

**Justin:** It's hard—it's hard—we never really talked about that, 'cause I think we always assumed Ellen is just on the brink of having us on her program.

**Griffin:** Oh.

**Justin:** So we don't really talk about that stuff a lot. But like—

**Travis:** The problem is, she has to wait for an opportunity when there are three openings.

**Griffin:** Yeah. In a row.

**Justin:** And three—[laughs] And three chairs.

Travis: Three chairs.

**Justin:** She does—she's having more made. She keeps—that's what her people keep telling us.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** Um, I feel like if—the one thing about us is that if we do see—if we were at football, [wheezes] if we saw W. over there...

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** ... just like, double-dippin' some nachos, and enjoying a Coke, like, I...

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** I—I feel like we probably would be the—this is the exact thing that we would get busted for. [laughs]

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** Right? This is the exact thing that would bring it down for us, is 'cause it would be like so—[through wheezing laughter] So funny...

**Griffin:** Yeah.

**Justin:** ... if big o' G.W. was there. I feel like we would have to get a chill going, just for the—just for—you know what? If Ellen had come out, and they were like, "It was for the Vine."

**Travis:** Yeah, right?

Justin: "No, that was just for the Vine. It was hysterical."

Travis: "Guys, I was making a TikTok. Don't you get it?"

Griffin: Oh...

Justin: "I thought it was for the Vine!"

**Griffin:** Guys, fucking Tiger King! Remember him?

Justin: Yeah.

**Travis:** I actually missed tha—I didn't watch it.

**Griffin:** This dude—this dude is straight-up zany, gang.

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin:** And the way he hurt those animals... [laughs quietly]

Justin: It's not funny.

**Griffin:** Not funny, but every other thing about him... aside from the assassination attempt... and everything else that that dude sort of stuck his snoot right down into?

**Justin:** [laughs] All the other bad parts.

**Griffin:** So fucking zany! Aw, I love that.

Uh, John Krasinski got out there, and he was like, "It's good, fam." And then he was like—and then he sold it, I guess, his show, *It's Good, Fam*. He sold that one—

**Justin:** [laughs] He sold it!

Travis: He did sell It's Good, Fam.

Justin: I wish—that's so great. Why can't we ever sell [laughs] anything we

start?

**Travis:** Right? It would be like if somebody came to you, Justin, and offered you a million dollars to buy the idea of Munch Squad from you.

Griffin: Yeah. Um-

**Travis:** Which Justin would do.

**Justin:** [sucks air through teeth] In a fuuucking heartbeat. Of course I would. I wouldn't sell it to John, though.

Travis: No.

**Justin:** 'Cause he'll just—he'll move in to the Munch Squad.

**Griffin:** Mm-hmm.

**Justin:** Ol' John K. will move into Munch Squad. Kind of polish the place up a bit, give it uh... some new curtains—the curtains of celebrity, and then he'll sell it at a profit.

Travis: Oh, he'll flip it.

Justin: He'll flip it.

**Travis:** Yeah, he'll flip it for sure.

Justin: He'll flip Munch Squad.

**Travis:** He's a bit flipper!

**Justin:** He's a bit flipper. Anything else memorable this year?

**Travis:** Anything else? What, uh—fashion?

Griffin: Swifties got their fill, didn't they? And um...

Justin: "Swifties"?

Griffin: You know, Taylor Swift listeners.

**Justin:** Oh, their bellies—they have solved—

Griffin: They are sated, aren't they? Big bellies laying—laying on the futon,

just, "Ah, I couldn't—Taylor, I couldn't—"

**Travis:** Also that music grease all over their cheeks.

**Griffin:** "Oh, I couldn't possibly, Taylor. Another one? Oh..."

We got um... "WAP" is a good—that was a song that everybody really liked.

Justin: Yup.

**Travis:** Yeah, that was a good one. A powerful anthem.

**Griffin:** It—yes. It stood for "what a powerful song."

Travis: Yep. Mm-hm. "Women are powerful," is what it was.

**Justin:** [laughs] That's what "WAP" stands for.

**Travis:** "Women are powerful." I never looked it up, but that's what I assume. I like putting together, uh, like, figuring out what things stand for. It's gotta be "women are powerful."

**Justin:** Backronyms, they call it, I think.

**Travis:** Backronyms. Scott Backronyms.

Justin: Um-

Griffin: That's a...

**Justin:** Anything else from the year?

**Griffin:** There was an elect—there was a big election.

Justin: Yeah.

**Travis:** The big one!

**Justin:** That one went good... -ish.

**Travis:** Yep. Went pretty good, very smooth.

**Justin:** Very smooth, very s—

Griffin: Um, I guess McDreamy did come back...

Justin: Did he?

**Griffin:** ... to *Grey's Anatomy*.

Travis: Really?

**Griffin:** Even though—yeah, he super died. But I guess he came on back, 'cause they're having fun over there.

Travis: Oh.

**Griffin:** That's it! That's the last one.

**Travis:** That's all that happened.

**Justin:** Oh, that—

**Travis:** And it was a pretty smooth year. Pretty quiet—

Griffin: Smooth sailin', baby! At least in the world of entertainment, we can

agree.

Justin: Yeah.

**Travis:** A quiet year. A quiet year.

**Justin:** There was that, um... there was that Munch Squad about, uh, Mountain Dew doing a cookbook. You remember that?

**Travis:** Oh, I remember, I remember.

**Griffin:** I don't think we can do our own...

**Justin:** Like the way we talked about—

**Travis:** No, I think that was—hey, there were some pretty epic things that

we did.

**Justin:** That was news. I mean, that was news, just 'cause we touched on

it.

**Griffin:** Oh, Travis, tell me more about these epic things we did.

Travis: Well...

**Griffin:** At least—as long as they weren't epic fails!

**Travis:** Oh, then I... I have nothing, then.

**Griffin:** Alright. Well—

**Travis:** I started doing Play Along at Home. That was new.

**Justin:** That was new.

**Griffin:** So big.

**Justin:** Oh, I found out that GD Ritzy's will sell you the good ice by the bag,

if you want it.

**Travis:** Really?

**Griffin:** Oh, really?

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin:** The round ice—the little pebbles?

Justin: The good ice. They'll give you a bag of the good ice. [laughs] For

Travis: Nice. Hey—

**Justin:** That was a late—late breaking in the year. [laughs] I think.

**Travis:** Okay, so that was our year!

Griffin: Cool. Um... I didn't have any bathroom time accidents while driving

anywhere in a car. And that was a-

**Travis:** That was a pretty good year.

**Griffin:** And it's not that I do that often, but it's why I'm so cautious to make sure I go every time before I'm about to leave the house, is for this exact reason. It's so I can claim that at the end of the year, no bath—no car-based bathroom accidents.

**Travis:** I didn't murder anyone this year.

**Justin:** That's good.

**Griffin:** That's huge!

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin:** That's huge.

**Justin:** Uh, this is an advice show.

Travis: Justin, did you murder anyone this year?

Justin: This is an advice show...

**Griffin:** Only with jokes.

**Justin:** ... where you're never forced to incriminate yourself...

Travis: Mm-hmm.

Justin: ... ever.

**Travis:** I'll get ya!

**Justin:** You're gonna have to work harder than that. Uh—

**Travis:** I'm wearing a wire.

**Justin:** Next year, um... yeah, that's true. Next year, we'll be, um, naming 2021, picking the theme of the year. I—it's hard to imagine that we'll— [chuckles] It is—it is a time-honored tradition that we have fucked up pretty much every single time.

**Griffin:** This bit—it is—we've talked about this before. It is *cartoonish*...

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin:** ... how bad we did this year.

**Justin:** It almost makes you want a counter program, to see if we can steer the year.

Travis: Ooh!

**Justin:** You know what I mean? [laughs] Work against a theme. I don't know. That seems like it might be... We've done some, I guess. Collabor-18, I feel like, some people did okay. And listen, we'll—there's—there'll be plenty of time when we talk about this for an entire episode. But!

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** Right now, let's help some people. "How do I pretend that I have actu—" [stammers]

**Griffin:** Oh, yeah, it's a tough sentence construction. I do not blame you for just racing right in there.

**Travis:** What is it?

**Justin:** [laughs] "How do I pretend that I have seen *Love Actually*? My friends keep making references to it, but I'm just not interested in watching it." That's from Saving Time in Seattle.

**Travis:** This is a question I very much relate to, because I too have not seen *Love Actually*.

Justin: Wait. That's impossible.

**Griffin:** That is not true.

**Travis:** It is true. It is absolutely true.

Justin: That's impossible.

**Travis:** I admit—

**Griffin:** Okay, let's—let's—okay. A bunch of established British actors play gentlemen who have a series of love affairs with their employees.

**Travis:** Huh!

**Griffin:** And you don't—you don't really realize that until about your 15— your 15th watch or so, when you go, "Damn, this is all bosses and employees! And they're kissing!" And everyone's like, "Yeah!"

**Travis:** Rick Grimes is in it, right?

**Justin:** Yeah. So Rick Grimes is kinda different.

Griffin: Rick Grimes is in it.

**Justin:** [laughs] It's a really—

**Griffin:** It's like a different thing. It's—he's not a boss, but he is, like...

**Travis:** He holds up a sign.

**Griffin:** He's ch—he plays a character...

**Justin:** So you have seen it. Okay.

**Travis:** I have not seen it, Justin. Everyone knows that in *Love Actually*—like, you could live on the moon and know that he's holding a sign.

**Justin:** I just find it hard to believe there's no parts that you not osmosed at this point. Have you not seen it as an intentional thing, or...?

**Travis:** It just ne—it's never come up! People'll be like, "Oh, you gotta watch." And I'll be like, okay! And then, like, I just don't!

Justin: Yeah...

**Travis:** It's not like I'm actively avoiding it! It just—it's never happened.

**Justin:** Except for a—I've talked about it a little bit on Twitter, and I think the thing is—my thing on *Love Actually* right now is that, except for all the parts that are bad...

**Griffin:** Mm-hmm.

**Justin:** ... it's pretty good.

Griffin: Sure.

**Travis:** Okay. Well, a ringing endorsement. I'm running out of the booth right now to go watch.

**Griffin:** Listen...

Justin: That's everything!

**Griffin:** As—as you expect—

**Justin:** That's me! [laughs] Right? I mean, that's me as a human.

**Griffin:** Absolutely.

**Justin:** Except for all the bad parts.

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin:** I'll give you a guarantee, Trav. Bill Nighy fucking rips, my man.

Justin: [laughs] He does rip!

**Travis:** Well, yeah, he always does, but I could watch him in—I could watch him in two *Pirates of the Caribbean* movies!

**Justin:** But it was the first thing he's ever been in for America.

Travis: Oh, really?

**Griffin:** Yeah. He's been in stuff where you're like, "Who's this fucking clown?" And then at the end of this movie, you're like, "This dude rips!"

**Justin:** Like, every other thing he's ever been in, probably, is like, "[English accent] It's me, Parishioner John, and I'm a detective."

Griffin: No, no, no.

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin:** Right? And it's like, "Seven part miniseries on BBC. And I'm Parish John, and I'm a parishioner, and also a detective."

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: God, I'd watch that.

Justin: I know, it's—that's a good...

**Griffin:** But this one is like, "I'm a rocking whole washed-out dude, and I fucking rip, and I'm so funny. And my storyline is... virtually unproblem—it is one of the... it is still problematic, it—"

Justin: [laughs] It is. Except for the fat-shaming, it is virtually...

**Griffin:** "Enormous amount of fat-shaming, but like, by *Love Actually* standards, baby, that's pretty good!"

**Justin:** [laughs]

Travis: Is Hugh Grant in it? I feel like Hugh Grant is in it.

Justin: Oh, yeah, Hugh's in it.

Griffin: Oh, yeah, baby.

**Justin:** [laughs] He's doing his thing.

**Travis:** How problematic is his storyline?

**Justin:** Oh, baby... [wheezes]

Griffin: Trav, I'll tell ya, bud. President Billy Bob Thornton comes to visit his

place...

**Travis:** What?!

**Griffin:** ... 'cause he's the Prime Minister, but he, as far as I can tell, touches the shoulder of an employee that Hugh Grant has his eye on.

**Justin:** [wheezing softly]

**Griffin:** So he de—basically declares war on America!

**Justin:** [wheezes] It's so not far off.

Travis: What?!

**Justin:** Travis, Travis, in the movie *Love Actually*, which is good except for

the bad parts...

Travis: Uh-huh?

**Justin:** ... uh, [holding back laughter] he—he falls in love with an employee, and then the president touches her shoulder, and he fires her, and tells America to fuck off. And then he fire—

Travis: What?!

**Justin:** He fires her, but luckily, she writes him a note and apologizes.

[laughs]

**Griffin:** It's so dope.

Justin: [coughing laughter]

**Griffin:** It's so fucking tight, because then, like, the next five scenes are people partying, because the Prime Minister just said to America, "We're not fucking friends anymore, 'cause you touched—you're trying to Mr. Steal My Girl."

**Justin:** [laughs] I—Billy Bob Thornton is indeed the President of America, which like... yeah?

**Travis:** Not that far off now.

Justin: Yeah, I mean...

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** Basically.

**Griffin:** [sarcastically] It's so cool.

**Travis:** Okay, and correct me if I'm wrong – in the Rick Grimes storyline, he holds up the signs to tell a friend's wife that he's in love with her? Is that correct?

Griffin: Yeah, uh...

Justin: So you have seen it.

**Travis:** I have not seen it, Justin.

Griffin: Okay. Um-

**Travis:** So how problematic is that one?

**Griffin:** Pretty... I mean, I don't know, that one's—that one's just weird, man.

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin:** Well, they actually, more like—ugh. Pretty weird stuff, man... is another good name for the movie. Oh, geez. There's also a—it opens with a—just a pretty choice 9/11 reference...

**Travis:** [sucks in air]

**Griffin:** ... and also ends with us celebrating a huge breach of airplane security protocols. And you're supposed to be like, "Yeah, breach those airport security protocols for the name of love!"

But also, ooh... you did the time period not great for this... Yeah. It's a trip. Not a good flick, but it's a lot of fun, except for the bad stuff. Bill Nighy—

**Travis:** What?!

Justin: Yep.

Travis: Okay.

Justin: Yep.

**Griffin:** Um, this is not funny anymore.

Justin: Nope. You're just listing the things that—

**Griffin:** Just saying people.

**Justin:** But, like, I feel like—can I say something? Holistically speaking, we have answered the question.

Griffin: Absolutely.

**Justin:** Because now, having—assuming you listened to—the answer is, listen to this episode of...

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** ... My Brother, My Brother and Me...

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** ... and then you'll come away with it, like, pretty much getting it.

**Travis:** Yeah. This podcast within a podcast that I'm calling Love Actually,

Actually.

**Justin:** There's some porn people...

Travis: What?

**Griffin:** There's a—yeah. It's—

**Justin:** There's some body doubles for sex.

**Griffin:** Lot of nu—lot of nudes.

**Justin:** Um, the hobbit is naked.

**Travis:** [questioning] There's a lot of nudity in—

**Justin:** The hobbit is naked in it, and Laura Linney is naked in it, and um...

other people are naked in it. It's like, surprisingly, like...

Travis: Now, Elijah Wood hobbit, or that other guy?

Justin: [sighs] No, Bilbo.

**Griffin:** Morgan—fucking Morgan Freeman.

Justin: Yeah. Martin Freeman.

**Griffin:** Not—not Morgan Freeman; Martin Freeman.

Justin: No.

**Griffin:** I said it wrong. Okay. Do—

**Justin:** Morgan Freeman and Martin Freeman make love as body doubles.

**Travis:** Huh!

**Griffin:** Morgan Freeman is the hobbit...

**Travis:** And make a baby named Margan Freeman.

**Griffin:** Okay. So can I do a Yahoo?

**Justin:** I'd love that.

**Travis:** "This is our son, Margan."

**Justin:** [laughs]

**Travis:** "And we love him very much. We're proud of him, even though he's never accomplished anything."

**Griffin:** [interrupting] This one was sent in by Brian. Brian sent this in. Uh, it's from Yahoo Answers user More—

Justin: [through laughter] And never will.

**Travis:** [laughs] And never will. He's the worst 70-year-old on the planet.

**Justin:** "I'm extremely proud of my son that I dislike, Margan. [wheezes]"

**Travis:** "I'm proud of him, even though he's disappointed me at every turn."

**Justin:** "I'm sorry that I have also wanted to say, it's very rude of me, Martin Freeman, that for a while there, I took all the parts from everybody, and didn't leave any—" That guy...

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** That guy... treated himself...

**Griffin:** We were so close to moving on, by the way. We were so close.

Justin: What?

**Griffin:** I was trying to power through—

**Justin:** No, but I just wanted to say, Martin Freeman treated himself to being that guy on *The Office*, and then he dipped into *Love Actually* and got his snoot wet over there.

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: And then he's like, "I'll just go ahead and be Bilbo."

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin:** And then he's like, "Let me—let me real quick just nab Arthur Dent real quick."

Travis: Yep.

**Justin:** "'Cause nobody can think of other people like me. And I'm just gonna get Arthur Dent real quick, and then I would just love to star in *Fargo*, and go ahead and slide me into—oh, *Sherlock*? Iconic role of Dr. John Watson? Yeah! **Justin:** Yeah. [laughs] They shattered the rim, and that was apparently

holding the whole thing up.

**Griffin:** The ceiling.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: [laughs]

**Griffin:** The art school, the gymnasium...

Justin: Um...

**Griffin:** ... the lunch room...

**Justin:** Yeah, so what happened on this is—here's the deal. Any time that a score is run up sufficiently on the other team to where there's not much chance of it being competitive, at that point you trade in – or you "sub" in, if you wanna use the parlance of a sport – you sub in some of your bad players...

Travis: Uh-huh.

**Justin:** ... to give them a chance to get more accustomed to being on the field—or of play.

Griffin: Right.

**Justin:** Which is to say, the basketball... rectangle. And they'll—they'll—they'll uh, you give them a chance to kind of get the nerves out. Like, playing your first big game, but the stakes aren't that high.

**Griffin:** Sure.

**Justin:** And the problem is, if you go long enough down that road, and the other team is still scoreless, at that point you are mandated to start doing what are called "inspirational sub-ins."

Travis: Oh, yeah, yeah, yeah.

**Justin:** For their Facebook page, basically.

**Griffin:** Yeah.

**Travis:** Like, the water boy gets to play.

**Justin:** Exactly, right? At that point, the mascot comes by, and he's like, "I would love to shoot a few, or I'd like to play point guard for a bit." And like, some guys—

**Travis:** They start asking people the card, like anybody out there—

**Justin:** Somebody's grandpa who never made the game winning exact—you see where we're going with this.

Travis: Yes.

**Griffin:** The coach—the coach, but he's wearing a propeller hat.

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin:** Um, a girl... Whatever. You know, whatever.

**Travis:** [laughs]

Justin: Whatever.

**Griffin:** [scolding] Justin...

**Justin:** Whatever it may be. That was a joke about society, Griffin!

Griffin: Oh!

**Travis:** Look at the layers!

**Justin:** But the point is, that is what happen—the farther down that rabbit hole you go, the more people, by the end of it, the opposing team is gonna be, like, ALF, a trashcan...

**Griffin:** [bursts out laughing]

**Justin:** [through laughter] ... the idea of capitalism. Like, you're not gonna have a team, really.

**Griffin:** Another stationary basketball.

Justin: [laughs] Right, exactly.

**Griffin:** That's wearing sunglasses.

**Justin:** A—a team from that bottle planet from Superman—you know, the Bottle City of Kandor. Um, uh—

**Griffin:** An act—an actual Air Bud, but it's just a dog that doesn't—doesn't really have the skills.

**Justin:** He's gotta start somewhere. But that is why you cannot have a zero-zero game—a scoreless game, because eventually, there's just no competition whatsoever.

**Travis:** I think, uh—I think it's mean that, in professional sports, they don't have the mercy rule. I think that that—'cause I remember being a kid and playing a lot of different sports, and really appreciating the fact that the mercy rule existed.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis:** 'Cause mostly, it meant that I could stop, I don't know, picking up pieces of grass from the field or whatever, and I could go home and think about my poetry, or what have you. Um...

Griffin: Yeah, you could... yeah. Um-

**Travis:** I think that that needs to exist more, um, because I would like to see more press conferences with like, grown adults talking about how they got mercy'ed.

**Griffin:** That would be... something. Although I will say, Travis, at halftime...

Travis: Uh-huh?

**Griffin:** The Monst—the Monstars were up 63 to 18. Over—over the Toon Squad.

**Travis:** That is really high.

**Griffin:** That's—they could have—they could have gone ahead and, you know, yoinked them off to Moron Mountain right then and there. But they didn't, they came back, they played the whole damn—

**Travis:** What a great name for an amusement park, by the way.

Justin: [chuckles]

**Travis:** Can we just acknowledge that if there was a place called Moron Mountain, like in your hometown, you'd be wicked proud of that.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Yeah. Yeah. Um-

**Travis:** I'm just saying, maybe the Monstars weren't the bad guys. Hey, let's look back and really reexamine—I think it's time that we put a new lens and look at...

**Griffin:** [hesitant noise]

**Travis:** ... *Space Jam*, and see if the Monstars are the bad guys.

Griffin: They—they were pretty tacitly endorsing slavery, I'm pretty sure.

Justin: Yeah...

Griffin: That team was—so I can't say—

**Travis:** Okay, there's that.

**Griffin:** Yeah. But we haven't even considered the idea of the scoreless basketball game of two teams playing each other—and I'm not saying, like, it's ALF and a garbage can, just like... maybe two teams, like the Or—the Orlando Magic, and the Charlotte Hornets, are just having an off day, and it's third period, third quarter...

Travis: Uh-huh.

**Griffin:** ... and it's just, like, boing-boing-boing. God, again! It— officially, one of us is gonna have to get this in! But it just hasn't happened yet.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis:** ... two teams that I think are good, or at least have been within the last decade.

**Griffin:** Oh, I see what you're saying.

**Travis:** And they're so good that—

Justin: Yeah.

**Travis:** It's—now it's becoming a defense—a battle of defense.

**Griffin:** Yeah.

**Travis:** Where like, they're making good shots, but it's just like, every time! Boom! Someone's there. Boom! Someone's there.

**Griffin:** Oh, my God.

**Travis:** They're playing their gall darn hearts out.

**Griffin:** Alternatively, they both got six men.

Travis: Oh!

Justin: Oh, okay.

**Griffin:** Both got ghost—ghost friends, uh, ghost family that are like, in there. And so when somebody comes up to dunk one in, and they just use their ghost hand to slap it away. I think if that happens to you once, that's probably enough for you to be like, "Ooh. [away from microphone] Uh, there's a ghost. Um..."

**Travis:** There's gotta be a ghost. Can you imagine, uh, a scene like that happening in a movie, and there's a little kid in the crowd and he's, like, clutching his little pendant. But then the same thing happens for the other team, too, and he looks across the court, and there is another little kid sitting on the other side, and he's holding a different pendant. And they, like, look at each other, and they kinda mouth, like, "Did you pray to God too that they would win? Oh, man, I prayed to God that they would win."

Griffin: [laughs] Oh, no!

Travis: "Aw, beans!"

**Griffin:** Man, this is a—there had to be the com—you know, MLB commissioner at some point had to be like, "Gang, we gotta start keeping an eye out for these fucking angels in the outfield."

**Justin:** [laughing quietly]

Travis: "Everybody's got angels now!"

**Griffin:** Everybody's got angels now, and it's great! Like, we're out there, and it's like, "Oh, man, is old, uh, old Tony Danza gonna pitch a no-hitter, or not?"

And then it's like, "But fucking 10 feet overhead, there is a biblical angel battle happening..."

Travis: [laughs]

**Griffin:** "...between both teams—"

Travis: "Ragnarok is happening right here."

**Griffin:** "It's every game! And it's so loud."

**Justin:** Would you stop the—at some point, the baseball would stop, right?

Travis: Right.

Justin: Like, you would—you could keep doing baseball with that going on.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis:** What—as in the sky, you see, like, fucking, I don't know—

**Justin:** Chris Floyd pulls out his flaming sword and strikes down...

**Griffin:** [laughs]

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin:** Yeah, you see the little boy stand up and wave his arms to signal that angels are here, but across the field, a different boy is also waving their arms. And you're like, "Oh, no. Here it comes."

**Travis:** Oh, no. It's ghosts v. angels.

**Griffin:** Then you hear seven horns, and you know—

**Travis:** [laughs] As the seals rip open.

**Griffin:** As the seals ri—it's time! And this is an *exhibition game*!

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: We're ge—we're ending the world—

**Travis:** "[laughs] This is the all-star game. What are you doing?"

**Griffin:** "[through laughter] This is the all-s—it's the homerun derby!"

**Justin:** It's the ba—it's the battle where—it's the all-star game is the battle

when all stars will be snuffed out, and darkness will reign.

**Travis:** [laughs]

**Justin:** All-stars!

**Travis:** [laughs] This is the celebrity versus retired baseball players charity

event. What is happening?!

Griffin: Oh, boy.

**Travis:** [laughs] An angel just lifted up Dan Levy, and flew over the bases.

**Justin:** [snorts]

**Travis:** What is going on?

Justin: Hey, I'll tell you what's going on. We're going to the Money Zone.

Travis: Thank God.

**Griffin:** Smooth. Oh, that was smooth as butter, baby.

[theme music plays]

**Travis:** You know what everybody needs?

**Griffin:** What, Trav?

**Travis:** Well, I mean, there's—if you think about it, a lot—there's a lot—

Justin: Oxygen...

Travis: There's a lot. But you know what they need most of all?

**Griffin:** Stamps.

**Justin:** Come on, Papa, don't—

**Griffin:** Papa, baby hungry, Papa!

**Travis:** Papa Shaq, deliver!

**Justin:** He does say, "As we continue to develop new craveable menu offerings, we're always inspired by our fans." That's love—that's beautiful, I think. "And it's something our fans continue to ask for," so you keep givin' it to 'em, don't you? Nasty.

**Travis:** [snorts] You nasty—

**Griffin:** But wait, they don't explicitly say, "but also, things are shitty"?

**Justin:** It don't—broke the streak. They broke the streak.

**Griffin:** Then we're fucking free, aren't we?

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin:** We're final—this is—I know people are so stoked about this vaccine, but to me, this is the sign of the times...

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin:** ... that we've—that we are just through this thing.

**Justin:** Yeah. We finally d—the—I mean, that is really the sign, Griffin, that COVID's over.

Travis: Yep!

**Justin:** And we're all safe now. You know?

**Griffin:** [softly] Well, we're getting—getting there.

Justin: Well, it just feels like everybody's safe to just burn your masks.

Travis: Yup!

Justin: 'Cause Papa John says that it's fine to...

**Travis:** Burn your masks, burn your pants, whatever you got, really.

**Justin:** Taco Bell's famed nacho fries return for the holidays.

**Travis:** We were out!!

**Justin:** "In a year as difficult and uncertain as this one is..."

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** "... we know our customers crave the comforts that they love most. [laughs] That's why we're excited to bring back nacho fries, because Trump was a bad president, and Coronavirus."

**Griffin:** [bursts out laughing]

**Justin:** "[laughs] And we thought that would help. If nacho fries came back, because of so many people that died [wheezes] of Coronavirus, and nobody could touch anybody, but you can get these nacho fries, and we think it'll fix it!"

**Griffin:** [sighs]

**Justin:** "The magic of nacho fry franchise extends beyond the menu item

itself!"

Travis: Oh?

**Griffin:** Yes!

**Justin:** "The magic of the [through laughter] nacho fries franchise!"

**Griffin:** It's gonna reach out of the menu, and into the empty chair where Grandpapa used to sit.

**Justin:** "It extends beyond the menu item itself, and is brought to life with our next saga of the nacho fries movie franchise that we hope brings some seasonal..."

**Griffin:** [defeated] Alright.

**Justin:** "...and seasoned joy to fans like only we can."

**Griffin:** Fucking—now—okay. This is another sign of the times people are like, "Can we start being ironic again? We've been—we've been so—we've been good boys this year, just talking about how shitty everything is, and hope we can bring you some comfort, but now can we start getting fucking silly on it again?"

**Justin:** "Can we go back to pretending like nacho fries are the most [holding back laughter] important thing on the planet? We—"

**Travis:** Justin—Justin?

**Justin:** "We've been acknowledging that there are other things on the planet other than Taco Bell for a year now, and it's killing us!"

**Griffin:** [laughs]

Travis: Are they being nacho fry-ronic?

**Griffin:** No, they're not.

Travis: Okay.

Justin: No.

**Travis:** Alright. I really thought they were.

**Justin:** "The sixth chapter of the cinematic trailer style..."

Griffin: Oh, boy.

**Justin:** "... ad creative titled *The Craving*, and starring Sarah Hyland and Joe Keery, explores the thrilling journey..."

**Travis:** Wait, what?

**Justin:** "...of a nacho fry—" Shut up! "Explores the thrilling journey of a nacho fry-obsessed protagonist, and his intensifying desire for Taco Bell's most craveable creation, as the potato plot thickens."

I think... [pauses] Listen.

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** I'm not gonna go off on one of my famous Dennis Miller-style rants here.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** But if the—but if Taco Bell truly believes that nacho fries are the most craveable menu item, then I would say that Taco Bell, every time it removes nacho fries from their menu, has committed an immoral act.

**Travis:** Well, you know, Justin, sometimes the people, they crave it too much. And society—that's when we have a recession. So talking about ha—and listen, we're all sad that they're gone, but the economy...

Justin: Right.

Justin: [wheezes]

Griffin: They'll change their motto to "Coca-Cola, king of soda."

Travis: You remember.

**Griffin:** You remember that. Pl—

**Justin:** Remember when Arya Stark was like, "Winter may no longer be coming, but that doesn't mean we can't all chill." And then she lowered her sunglasses, and took a big drink of Coca-Cola.

**Travis:** You remember.

Justin: Ice-cold Coca-Cola.

Travis: You remember!

**Griffin:** Remember?

**Justin:** Um, how about another question?

Travis: Okay.

**Griffin:** Sure!

**Justin:** "I am a permanent employee in a place that hires a lot of temporary workers for the holidays.
