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[theme music plays]

Rileigh: Hello, and welcome to *Still Buffering*: a cross-generational guide to the culture that made us. I am Rileigh Smirl.

Sydnee: I'm Sydnee McElroy.

Teylor: And I'm Teylor Smirl.

Sydnee: It's been a busy week!

Rileigh: Yeah.

Teylor: Yeah.

Sydnee: Yeah.

Teylor: Yeah.

Sydnee: Busy—like, week, weekend, kind of collection.

Rileigh: Weeks.

Sydnee: I— I mention that because we've been very busy, hard at work like little elves... of Candlenights.

Rileigh: Ah, yes.

Sydnee: Putting together Candlenights things.

Teylor: Ah, that's— that is true, yes.

Rileigh: Yes, that is very true.

Sydnee: Maybe Candlenight doesn't have elves.

Rileigh: What do... we have?

Sydnee: Some other sort of mythological—

Teylor: Gremlins!

Rileigh: That's what— yeah.

Sydnee: Gremlins.

Rileigh: Gremlins.

Sydnee: The gremlins of Candlenights.

Rileigh: [laughs]

Teylor: [laughs]

Sydnee: Have been busy creating content that will be, I think, quite enjoyable to

all.

Rileigh: I hope it is quite enjoyable.

Sydnee: I just wanted to mention that right away, because I'm very excited about it! I'm very excited about what we are putting together for everyone.

Rileigh: It's December 19th, you can still obviously get tickets. It's online.

[laughs]

Sydnee: Yeah. Yes, it is not in person. There is still a pandemic.

Rileigh: Yes.

Teylor: But that means more of you can come.

Rileigh: Exactly.

Sydnee: Exactly, and we're still hopefully raising money for— well, I mean, we are raising money. Not hopefully. I guess I'm just hopeful that people will actually give money.

Rileigh: Yeah [laughs]

Sydnee: For— I mean, I know you are. But you know what I mean. Harmony House. It's a wonderful organization in our area that benefits those facing homelessness, and I care about them very much.

Rileigh: Yes.

Sydnee: Uh, but it's been busy, so we haven't had as much time for watching all of our... our holiday favorites? Um... Justin and I of course are far enough into the pandemic that we've been obligated to watch *Schitt's Creek*.

Rileigh: There it is.

Sydnee: That's what happens. [laughs]

Rileigh: You reached that stage.

Sydnee: If you're in the pandemic long enough, you have to watch it.

Rileigh: I haven't yet. I haven't gotten to that point yet.

Sydnee: [laughs] Uh, it's gonna keep going, and you have to watch Schitt's

Creek. It does— I enjoy it now. [pause] [bursts into laughter]

Rileigh: [laughs]

Teylor: I had the— see, I started watching it slightly before you, but at a much slower pace. And I had to stop and question myself, 'cause you and Justin both are very adamant about how bad it is early on and I'm like, "I kinda like it? What does this mean about me? I'm already kind of okay with it on season one." [laughs]

Sydnee: Hey, listen. You and, like, everyone, and all the Emmy voters, so you're in good company.

Teylor: Oh, okay.

Sydnee: It was just— and, I mean, I do— I'm in season four, and I do enjoy it now. Either that, or I just watched so much that I don't— I don't know any different anymore.

Rileigh: If only you all could've been a part of the conversation when you all first started watching it, like, first few episodes, because you both were just like— I mean, like a week ago. You both were like, "No, it's— like, how— how are people watching this? It sucks!"

Sydnee: Everyone— I found all the characters reprehensible at first, and it was hard for me— like, who do I root for? I don't want anyone to win!

Rileigh: [laughs]

Sydnee: I don't feel that way anymore, before I get attacked by all the...

Rileigh: Yeah.

Sydnee: There is not nickname I could give to fans of *Schitt's Creek* that wouldn't sound offensive or insulting.

Rileigh: [laughs]

Sydnee: So I'll just say, all of you fans of that television program. Don't attack me. I do enjoy it now. I get it. I think. Either that or it's just become, like, so comfortable and safe, 'cause that's all I know now.

Rileigh: Sure.

Sydnee: It's the only world.

Rileigh: That's how I feel about *Veep* though.

Sydnee: Yeah.

Rileigh: No one— no one's good on that show.

Sydnee: That's true.

Rileigh: Sometimes you just need a show where it's like, "Wow. [laughs]

Everyone sucks!"

Sydnee: *Schitt's Creek* makes a turn, though.

Rileigh: Okay.

Sydnee: Schitt's Creek— you know how, like, early Parks and Rec— they have to

make the turn.

Rileigh: Yeah. You don't really like any of 'em. Yeah.

Sydnee: Yeah. But they make that turn so much faster. Like, The Office made

the turn faster. This show— I just felt like it took a while. [wheeze-laughs]

Rileigh: Yeah.

Sydnee: But they made the turn. [laughs]

Teylor: I guess—I guess I'm just okay with shows that have no likable characters. Like, I love *It's Always Sunny in Philadelphia*, and the premise of that

show are "Here are a bunch of people that you should not like." [laughs]

Rileigh: Yeah.

Teylor: "Be enter— entertained by them."

Sydnee: Uh, it has— we have managed to squeeze in there in between— I regret to inform everyone that Spookley the Square Pumpkin does have a Christmas special now. How is that fair, that I have to have Spookley the Square Pumpkin from the atrocious Halloween children's movie thrust upon at yet

another holiday?

Teylor: Well, I don't know, Syd. I mean, now that you've revealed yourself as

such a harsh critic—

Sydnee: [laughs]

Teylor: —of a beloved property—

Rileigh: [laughs]

Teylor: —anybody that listened to you about this square pumpkin fella I think should give him another chance.

Sydnee: [laughs] I, uh— the girls, of course, love it.

Rileigh: Yeah.

Sydnee: Obviously. Um, not as much as *The Grinch Who Hates Christmas*, which is what Cooper will only call *The Grinch*—

Rileigh: [through laughter] *The Grinch Who Hates Christmas?*

Sydnee: Yes. "Can we watch *The Grinch*—" er, no, *The Grinch Hates Christmas*." "Can we watch *The Grinch Hates Christmas*?"

I'm like, "That's not what it's called, honey."

"The Grinch hates Christmas!"

"I— he does, but that's not—[laughs quietly]"

Rileigh: [laughs]

Sydnee: "I— okay."

Teylor: She's got the point of it.

Rileigh: Yeah.

Sydnee: She understands.

Rileigh: That's the premise.

Sydnee: But, um— but hopefully there's been some time for some more adult holiday fare.

Rileigh: You know. [holding back laughter] Those classic adult holiday films.

Sydnee: [laughs] That everyone knows and loves.

Rileigh: [holding back laughter] Such as...

Sydnee: The Princess Switch.

Rileigh: [through laughter] *The Princess Switch*.

Sydnee: And the *Princess... Switched*— or, what's the second one called?

Rileigh: Princess—The Princess Switch: Switched Again.

Teylor: Again.

Sydnee: Okay.

Rileigh: [laughs] Is the full title. [laughs]

Sydnee: I watched them both, but I... you can't expect me to remember those—

[laughs] that second title!

Rileigh: No.

Sydnee: [laughs quietly] It's like A Christmas Prince. There's A Christmas Prince,

there's A Christmas Prince Wedding, there's Christmas Baby Prince—

Rileigh: Yeah—[laughs]

Sydnee: You know. Uh, I liked these films, because, uh, Vanessa Hudgens plays more characters, I can only assume, as they go on. And the gambit that they've set up that they now have to deliver on, where Vanessa Hudgens plays an increasing number of characters forever, as many sequels as Netflix will do, I love that.

Rileigh: Mm-hmm. Um, I feel like we should clarify, for anyone who hasn't seen these wonderful films.

Sydnee: Yes.

Rileigh: The first one, The Princess Switch: The Regleeur Switch, um, not the

Switched Again—

Sydnee: Did you say "Regleeur"?

Rileigh: The Regleeur Switch. [laughs]

Sydnee: [laughs]

Rileigh: Um, is about Vanessa Hudgens as a small-town baker, a regular girl—

Teylor: Well—

Sydnee: In Chicago.

Teylor: Chica—

Rileigh: In Chicago.

Teylor: —small town of Chicago. [laughs]

Rileigh: A small town baker in Chicago. [laughs]

Teylor: Quaint little Chicago. [laughs]

Sydnee: They always do in these movies— they're always like— they present 'em like they live in this big city, but then they'll show, like, their little bakery and where they live, and pictures of the city, and it's like, this is not... this— this is not accurate. [laughs]

Teylor: That was like Christmas Prince's father that lives in New York and owns, like, what? Like, a deli or something in New York?

Rileigh: Yeah.

Sydnee: Uh-huh.

Teylor: But it looks like it's from, like, the streets of, like, [through laughter] 1930's New York.

[all laugh]

Sydnee: Well, they're empty. There are so many shots where they're, like, standing in an empty street! And it's like, where are you? [laughs]

Teylor: You're just on a sound stage in New York, maybe.

Sydnee: [laughs]

Rileigh: [laughs] So, first Vanessa Hudgens, named Stacey, is a baker. And her friend Kevin enters her in this baking competition. This international baking competition in the country of Belgravia.

Sydnee: Mm-hmm.

Rileigh: Um, where she just so happens to look exactly like their... duchess?

Sydnee: It is not the Duchess of Belgravia. It is the Duchess of—

Rileigh: Montenaro.

Sydnee: —Montenaro, who is there because she is about to wed...

Rileigh: The prince of Belgravia.

Sydnee: The prince of Belgravia.

Rileigh: Yes, okay.

Sydnee: It is an arranged marriage. In order to— I guess for international relations? I don't know if these two countries were at the brink of war [laughs] prior to this film. That is not covered.

Rileigh: [laughs]

Sydnee: But you do get the sense that it's important they wed.

Teylor: I hope it's not that important, actually, seeing as how the crux of the movie is that these people are actually not gonna get married, but, uh...

Sydnee: That's true. [laughs]

Teylor: [laughs] These royals are really messing up the delicate international relations with their wacky hijinks.

Rileigh: Yeah. [laughs]

Sydnee: [laughs] The— the third one is gonna be [wheezes] called *The Princess*

Switch: The War Years.

Rileigh: [laughs]

Teylor: [laughs]

Sydnee: It's a dark turn for the franchise.

Rileigh: Uh, but in case you were wondering, yes, the Duchess of Montenaro is played by Vanessa Hudgens also. The Duchess of Montenaro Vanessa Hudgens falls in love with regleeur Vanessa Hudgens's friend Kevin, and regleeur Vanessa Hudgens falls in love with the Prince of Belgravia. And guess what? They switch places. [laughs quietly]

Sydnee: Mm-hmm. Because she just wants to see what it's like to be a regleeur person. Just a normal... just a normal baker from Chicago, who's visiting Belgravia for an international baking competition.

Rileigh: Right.

Sydnee: Like normal.

Teylor: Just normal stuff, yeah. [laughs quietly]

Rileigh: Um, so then the sequel, Switched Again, they now— Stacey, baker Vanessa Hudgens, is the Princess of Belgravia. She has married the Prince of Belgravia. I think they said this is two years later?

Teylor: Yes.

Sydnee: Yes.

Rileigh: The movie— like, the actual movies did come out two years apart, so I guess they're following along with reality's timeline here. [laughs]

Sydnee: [laughs]

Rileigh: [through laughter] Um, which raises a lot more questions. But, uh—

Sydnee: They actually— they actually dealt with COVID really well in Montenaro and Belgravia.

Rileigh: Yeah. [laughs]

Sydnee: And, um, they— it was not even mentioned. [laughs]

Rileigh: Yeah. Um, you have to wonder how long ago they filmed this movie, because obviously there are no— I mean, there is a scene in this movie where I looked at it and it was like a Christmas concert, and there were a hundred people right next to each other singing in this giant church, I think, also filled with hundreds of people, and it was the wildest thing I have seen in a long time.

Sydnee: Yes. Nary a mask to be found. This was filmed before.

Rileigh: This was filmed before.

Sydnee: This was in the before. [laughs quietly]

Rileigh: The before times. But being reminded that people could be in groups that large in the same room was very startling. Um... but yeah, the second movie, the— Kevin and Duchess of Montenaro Vanessa Hudgens have broken up because now she's about to be Queen, so her life's too crazy.

Sydnee: That's never really explained. It's like a miscommunication thing. Like, he thinks she doesn't have room for him. She thinks he wouldn't want to be...

Rileigh: Royalty?

Sydnee: Married to the Queen of a whole country for some reason? Like that would not suit him?

Teylor: She's gonna be just very busy, and you don't wanna—

Sydnee: [laughs]

Teylor: Too— too busy for him. [laughs]

Rileigh: [laughs] And I think— are we supposed to believe that Kevin— and he

has a daughter, by the way, Olivia— have they moved to Belgravia?

Teylor: No.

Sydnee: Uhh...

Rileigh: Or are they in Chicago?

Sydnee: No, they're still in Chicago running the bakery.

Teylor: Yeah, 'cause you see—

Sydnee: 'Cause remember there's the scene— there's the scene at the

beginning where he's supposed to look scruffy?

Rileigh: Yeah! Okay.

Sydnee: [laughs]

Rileigh: Yes.

Sydnee: You know, as scruffy as anyone looks in these films.

Teylor: I was gonna say, it's, like, very—

Rileigh: He has on sweatpants. [laughs]

Teylor: —very attractive actor wearing less than the fanciest clothes. And

they're like, "Oh, he's havin' a hard time." [laughs]

Sydnee: "Oh, look, this is a rough breakup for him." That—

Rileigh: So— yeah.

Sydnee: Go ahead, finish— so in this one Vanessa Hudgens has to play three parts.

Rileigh: Yes, she also plays Duchess— I have to find— I don't know how to shorten the titles of these various Vanessa Hudgenses.

Sydnee: There's Fiona, Margaret, and Stacey.

Teylor: There we go.

Rileigh: Stacey is bake— the baker. Margaret is the Duchess. Fiona is a new character in the second movie, Margaret's evil cousin, who is trying to steal the throne and steal her money.

Sydnee: Basically, she's like— she spent through all her money. She's like— like, you get the sense that she's one of those royals that just goes and, like, parties and spends atrociously. And anyway, she's spent all her money, so she really just wants to take the throne, though, long enough to transfer a bunch of money to herself as a Fiona—

Rileigh: To a bank account in the Caymans, as she says. [laughs]

Teylor: Well, and she has—

Sydnee: And they're going to spend the summer on Capri, and they need money, her and her two friends, to spend the summer on Capri. And so, she only wants to pretend to be the Queen for, like, two days, to give herself this infusion of cash, and then give the throne back to Margaret and... leave. [laughs quietly]

Teylor: And she's got this, like, little racket set up where her and her two henchmen, like, go to royal events and just rob everybody. So that's—

Sydnee: [laughs]

Teylor: —that's been her game for a while now. [through laughter] But—

Sydnee: They do—they do steal toilet paper, and I do enjoy—

Rileigh: [laughs]

Sydnee: —like, in the context of 2020, they do steal toilet paper. Okay. And later, she tries to give the orphans... a wrapped roll of toilet paper. And I know right now you're thinking, "Did she just say 'the orphans'?"

Rileigh: Yep. [laughs quietly]

Sydnee: There— as a collective character, the orphans feature prominently in these two films. There—[laughs] there is an orphanage that— in both countries, actually. There are two different orphanages!

Rileigh: Yeah! Yeah, there are!

Sydnee: That is a plot device in two different countries!

Rileigh: There are two orphanages.

Teylor: Yeah.

Rileigh: Also, it said Fiona was the Duchess of— or, like, her father was the Duke of some other country? So, is this another case of, like, some marriage between royal families to make it so Fiona and Margaret are cousins? Like, were they avoiding a war between Fiona's country and Montenaro?

Sydnee: I don't— there's a lot to wonder about, like, how these lineages work. [laughs quietly]

Teylor: I also just can't help but wonder if Fiona is— if she's some sort of royalty, could she not just, like, ask for more money? Does she have to start robbing people and resort to high treason?

Rileigh: Well, because the reason Margaret is becoming Queen is because she had a cousin that said they did not want to be— they did not want to take the throne. So, if we are to assume—

Sydnee: A different cousin, I note.

Rileigh: —that a different cousin was the next in line for the throne, but now Margaret is gonna be Queen, Fiona has to be somewhere in there. 'Cause Margaret was a Duchess. So Fiona— would Fiona not also be a Duchess?

Sydnee: To complicate matters more, this takes place in the same universe as *The Christmas Prince*—

Rileigh: [laughs] Yes.

Sydnee: —so Aldovia's a real country that exists in this narrative. And in Aldovia, King... [pause] Christmas Prince— I don't know—

Rileigh: King—[laughs]

Sydnee: —[laughs] I don't remember his name.

Rileigh: King Christmas!

Sydnee: [through laughter] King Christmas.

Rileigh: [laughs]

Sydnee: After he wed Amber, she became Queen Amber. So that's the way their lineage works. So... I don't know who anybody is.

Rileigh: Yeah, I have no idea.

Sydnee: Uh... all I know is that I hope these countries don't go to war because of all this Christmas Prince... ess Switching.

Teylor: I mean...

Sydnee: [laughs quietly]

Rileigh: [laughs quietly]

Teylor: ...they—they have so much in common, I don't know why they'd ever fight. They are entire countries that are just Christmas. Like, that is...

Sydnee: [laughs]

Rileigh: [laughs]

Teylor: I wanna know what any of these places look like in, like, July. [through laughter] Because—

Sydnee: They're Christmas, and vaguely British. That's the whole thing.

Rileigh: Yeah.

Sydnee: Everybody has a sort of British— this is like in— you know it was just, like, all in the US. "What do we think fancy royal people sound like?"

"I don't know. Bad British accent?"

"Yeah!" [laughs]

Rileigh: [laughs]

Sydnee: "That's right. [laughs] That's what I think fancy royal people sound like."

Uh, so... I don't even know where to start with these movies. Um... I have to say, one thing from the top. Vanessa Hudgens, I think, does a really excellent job of distinguishing one character from the next.

Rileigh: Yes.

Sydnee: I actually could keep track of who was who, based on, like— not— I mean, 'cause they change their hairstyles and—

Rileigh: Their makeup is a little bit different.

Sydnee: —the makeup, the hairstyle, and of course their outfits. Um, and then the one cousin is obvious 'cause she's blond, and the other two aren't. But, like—

Rileigh: And evil.

Sydnee: And she's evil. And she has, like, the really out there accent. But—

Teylor: [laughs]

Sydnee: [laughs quietly]

Rileigh: Like a movie villain accent! [laughs]

Sydnee: Yes, she does.

Teylor: I think— I— she— she had one line where she said, "The powder room, LOL." And I just— my soul left my body.

[all laugh]

Teylor: She just said the word "LOL" with a fake British accent! An evil fake British accent. Give her all the awards!

Sydnee: But I appreciated it because, like, I get the sense that, like, Vanessa Hudgens went, "Okay. I see what it is. It's fine. I see what this is. I'll go with it. I'll do it. It's fine."

And she does do a good job. I could tell who was who by, like, facial expressions, the way she carried herself, her whole thing. Um, and I think that's even more difficult, considering that the thing that was supposed to be different— so, in the first film the big difference between the two of 'em is Stacey the baker is very organized and likes to keep things on schedule and be busy, whereas Margaret the Duchess is spontaneous. [pauses] That's really just the only word they use. She's spontaneous.

Rileigh: [simultaneously] Yeah. Spontaneous.

Sydnee: [laughs quietly] She doesn't like schedules.

Rileigh: Right.

Sydnee: And this is also the excuse given for why Stacey the baker can't make it work with her hot sous chef Kevin.

Rileigh: Mm-hmm. Who Stacey definitely should've been with. Like, from the jump.

Sydnee: Because she's like—they're, like, super close. She's, like, a second mom to his daughter. Uh, he's really hot. They get along great. So, then they were like, "Well, how are we gonna make it so that these two—" 'cause she's

like—not only is she not into him, like, they make a point of her saying, like, "[nasally voice] Kevin? Why would I like Kevin?"

Teylor: [laughs quietly]

Sydnee: "Kevin?! Are you kidding me? Kevin?" Like... [laughs] every time. And it's like—

Rileigh: Yeah. It is unbelievable to her.

Sydnee: And it's like— did you— like, he took his shirt off in that one— did you— have you looked at him?! And the reason is, like, "Oh, he's so spontaneous."

Rileigh: And she's *so* organized. [laughs quietly]

Sydnee: "And I'm so organized. [through laughter] It would never work." And that's it! And we're all like, "Oh, obviously."

Rileigh: Right.

Sydnee: "Obviously."

Rileigh: It is more— even more unbelievable when you finally see the Prince of Belgravia. And you're like, "Okay. So, Stacey, you have this Prince— like, sure he's a Prince, but... when you're just looking at them, Kevin is still much more attractive than this Prince, and also a lot cooler?"

Sydnee: Yes!

Rileigh: The Prince is kind of just, like, there.

Teylor: Aww.

Rileigh: Like, Prince is from the original Disney Princess movies that just kind of, like... exist.

Sydnee: He is not given a single line that— like, you know in the script it just says, "Prince."

Rileigh: [bursts into laughter]

Sydnee: And says that. Like, you don't need any name. There's nothing

identifi— he is just, like—

Rileigh: What is his name? [pauses] Edward?

Sydnee: Edward. But, like, you don't need to know that, because they don't

give— this poor guy is given no character traits other than "Prince."

Teylor: Well, I guess opposite the whole— the reason that the other couple makes sense is that they're both spontaneous is these two are both— like, why does he fall for the— the Stacey-masquerading-as-Margaret version of the Princess? 'Cause he falls in love with her, the Prince does. And I guess it's because she seems really adept at running a small country. I guess.

Sydnee: [bursts into laughter]

Rileigh: Yeah. [laughs]

Sydnee: That is it! Because she—

Rileigh: Logistical reasons. [laughs]

Sydnee: Yes! Because he loves her planning and organization, and he just falls head over heels for her. I mean, they couch it in this, like— the royal family holds, like, a big fancy benefit for the orphanage—

Rileigh: [snorts]

Sydnee: —every year.

Rileigh: [laughs] The— it's just "The Orphanage."

Sydnee: But, like, when she asks them, like, "What is the—like, tell me about the orphanage."

They're all like, "Ew. We don't know."

Rileigh: [laughs]

Sydnee: "Like, we wouldn't *go* there. Are you kidding me? Excuse me? Go there? No."

And she's like, "Well, maybe you should go there and ask them what they need."

And he's like, "Oh, my heart be still."

Rileigh: "Whoaaa." [laughs]

Sydnee: "I've never— [laughs] I've never had ideas such as this! [laughs] I should go there and ask them what they need!"

Teylor: There's also a very, very, uh, romantic— or panic-inducing, in the middle of a pandemic— uh, scene, depending on what timeline you're watching this in, where they play Twister. So, I think that they bonded there.

Sydnee: [laughs]

Rileigh: Mm-hmm.

Teylor: I think that was a very important... you know. [laughs]

Sydnee: Well, they— I don't think they knew how to overcome that, like, she's not royal, and she's American. And, I mean, you know what that means in, like, a film like this. Where you have, like, the royals who are supposed to be sort of, like, proper and stuffy, and then you have, like, the American who comes in and is, like, "Well, she's throwing all of tradition out the window!" You know. Like, it's that kind of thing.

Rileigh: [gasps] Is this like Harry and Meghan thing?

Sydnee: Well, I don't-

Rileigh: Is this commentary? [laughs]

Sydnee: I don't know, because she's also supposed to not be spontaneous, and very organized! So, I don't know how to, like... but she's very American, but also very organized. [laughs]

Rileigh: [laughs]

Sydnee: How does this all come together? Only Vanessa Hudgens could pull it

off, is all I know.

Rileigh: That's true. [laughs]

Teylor: Now, I will say, I will— I did feel bad for my man Edward in the second film, though. I, uh— however much he lacked personality in the first one, his role in the second one is, uh, like— let's see. His wife is lying to him for no apparent reason other than he's—

Rileigh: Yeah!

Teylor: —he just might not be trustworthy. I don't know. [laughs] Like—

Rileigh: But they've been married for two years. [laughs]

Sydnee: She just does.

Teylor: It's like, "Let's keep the circle as small as possible. Let's not include my husband, who is gonna have direct contact with this whole charade."

Uh, and then he's gaslit by a small child. Uh, it's like—[laughs] you know? Any sympathy you lack for him in the first movie, you can find it in the second. [laughs quietly]

Sydnee: This is very true.

Rileigh: Yeah, that's true.

Sydnee: This is very true. Let's— I wanna move on to focus on the *Princess*

Switch— Sch— Switchedaroo 2.

Rileigh: [wheezes]

Sydnee: The Princess... Two Switch. [groans] [laughs]

Rileigh: [through laughter] *Elec— Electric Switcharoo.*

Sydnee: [through laughter] *Princess 2: Electric Switcharoo*.

[all laugh]

Sydnee: Starring Vanessa Hudgenses.

Rileigh: And featuring Vanessa Hudgens. [laughs]

Teylor: [laughs]

Sydnee: And also Vanessa Hudgens. But, uh, first... [laughs]

Rileigh: Let's check the group message.

Teylor: Maybe she's changed.

Rileigh: Yeah.

Sydnee: In the second movie she's sad. 'Cause, I mean, one, her dad died.

Rileigh: Oh yeah!

Sydnee: Like, that's why she's becoming Queen is 'cause her father passed away. So, like, I mean—well, I mean, she has a reason to be sad. But also, she kind of doesn't wanna be Queen, but does, but doesn't. And it's like a self esteem thing, but also, like, "Do I really want this? You know? It's, like, a lot of trouble. Teylor: Yeah.

Rileigh: Yeah.

Sydnee: You know, like you do.

Rileigh: As you do.

Teylor: They also have a classic endearing scene of a flour fight in the kitchen, Kevin and Margaret.

Sydnee: [laughs]

Rileigh: [laughs]

Teylor: Am I— am I the only one that can't stand scenes like that? Like, I know it's supposed to be fun and frivolous, but a scene where it's like just people purposefully making very large messes, I just spend the whole time like, "No! No! [laughs] I'm so mad!"

Rileigh: Yeah. And they didn't even— they didn't even need the flour! They were making hot chocolate!

Sydnee: Well, and here's the thing.

Rileigh: [laughs]

Sydnee: Here's the thing. 'Cause, like, I do— the thing I like about these Netflix movies over, like, a Hallmark movie is, like, the Netflix movies are like, "You know, it's like a Hallmark movie, wink, wink." Like, that's their whole thing, right?

Rileigh: They're self-aware.

Teylor: Yeah.

Sydnee: They're self-aware. And the Hallmark movies are not. Uh, so I like that, except that at least in a Hallmark movie, when they start throwing cocoa or flour, it's usually just, like, in their hometown kitchen with, like, the boy next door, and you know they're gonna have to clean it up later.

Rileigh: "You have a whole castle."

Sydnee: So, uh, they switch places. As we have noted, they do not tell Stacey's

husband.

Rileigh: Which, they do tell Kevin.

Sydnee: Yes, Kevin knows.

Rileigh: They do tell their helper, the woman who... I don't know what her

official role is. She, like, escorts the Queen, I don't know, to—

Teylor: Like the— like the Zazu to Margaret.

Sydnee: There you go. Adviser?

Rileigh: Adviser?

Sydnee: Council?

Teylor: I only understand royal configurations through *The Lion King*. That is my

only understanding of how royalty works.

Sydnee: [laughs]

Rileigh: Um, so they tell her— they tell Olivia, the child—

Teylor: Yeah. [laughs] [through laughter] Just the child!

Sydnee: But not Stacey's husband!

Rileigh: But they—they don't tell Stacey's husband, and I could not figure out

why!

Sydnee: And they pretend all day like Stacey's in bed with a headache so severe that she can't get out of bed all day, but every time her husband tries to go check an her they like. "No no no Den't "

on her they're like, "No, no, no, no. Don't."

Rileigh: The little girl is the one who's like, "No, no, no, no." [laughs]

Teylor: And then the little girl is like, "You know, do you think you're a little bit, maybe, hovering? Like, maybe you're kind of being a bad husband, because you're so up in your wife's business?"

And he's, like, actually concerned about this! [through laughter] He is gaslit by a small child!

Sydnee: [laughs] Uh, and so at a Christmas concert, the evil cousin, Fiona, in order to get cash, kidnaps Stacey, who she thinks is her cousin Margaret. *Kidnaps* the woman who is about to be crowned Queen. That is what she thinks she's doing. That's a big deal.

Rileigh: Yeah.

Sydnee: Because they were supposed to be reunited through a marriage that never happened.

Rileigh: [through laughter] We don't know the dynamics.

Teylor: And it's also not like— it's not, like, a wacky hijinks kidnapping, you know? It's, like, a full on, like, we're in a whole different movie for a second. Suddenly we're, like, chloroforming—

Rileigh: Yeah!

Teylor: —[through laughter] Vanessa Hudson!

Rileigh: Yeah!

Sydnee: Yes.

Rileigh: Like, Stacey goes into the bathroom and is like, "Oh, thanks." You know, one of Fiona's evil friends spilled a drink on her to get her to the bathroom, locks her in there, and then Fiona pops out of the stall and just covers her mouth with a toilet paper roll.

Sydnee: So Vanessa Hudgens had to chloroform herself there, didn't she?

Teylor: Yeah.

Rileigh: Oh yeah, she did.

Teylor: The range!

Rileigh: Uh, but yeah! Then they just drag her, mostly unconscious, into a van. And throw her into a dungeon.

Sydnee: It's intense!

Teylor: [laughs] I was not ready. I like these kind of movies 'cause they're low stakes, when all of a sudden this— this kidnapping narrative is introduced. I'm like, "Oh, I don't like this. I don't— take me back to the— go back to— make cookies! Do something! Knock— break a vase! I don't like this!" [laughs quietly]

Rileigh: Yeah!

Sydnee: And then it seems like her plan, when, like, Margaret shows back up, who is—

Rileigh: Dressed as Stacey.

Sydnee: —who has been dressed as Stacey, but is Margaret. She shows back up and she's like, "Thanks, Stace. I got it all cleared with Kevin. Everything's cool now. Thank you so much for taking my place."

And she's like, "I don't know what you're talking about. I'm you."

Rileigh: "I'm the Queen."

Sydnee: "I'm Margaret." And it's like, this is your gambit? This is the play?! "I'll just keep pretending."

It's like, "No, no, no. I'm— we can switch back now. It's me."

"No, I don't know what you mean."

[laughs] And it's like, okay?

So then she goes away. Uh, Fiona breaks up with Kevin—

Rileigh: It's very sad.

Sydnee: —after they just got together.

Rileigh: Kevin is sad.

Sydnee: There's a daring rescue, of course.

Rileigh: Yes. Of Stacey.

Sydnee: After poor Edward is let in on... the plot.

Rileigh: Yeah. [laughs]

Teylor: [laughs]

Rileigh: After everyone else, the drivers, and the advisers, and the small

children are like, "Yeah, Edward." [laughs quietly]

Teylor: "That's not your wife."

Sydnee: "How did you not know?" Uh, and they narrowly stop the coronation of

the wrong Queen.

Rileigh: Yes.

Teylor: They, uh— the— the— now, the suspension of disbelief in the first movie as to why they could switch places, it almost works because the Duchess Margaret likes to be out of the public eye, so you could kind of think, "Well, nobody really knows what she looks like, and her and Edward haven't known each other very long so maybe it works."

But all that is thrown out the window in the second one [through laughter] where it's just like, "Here is your husband of two years. How could somebody else be you? I don't know."

Rileigh: It does— yeah, you have to wonder. He sits down and talks to who he thinks is Margaret, but it is Stacey pretending to be Margaret.

Sydnee: So, his wife. He's sitting there talking to his wife!

Rileigh: He's talking to his wife now of I guess a year, but, like, girlfriend of two years. They've been living together. Um, and doesn't know that it's not his wife.

Sydnee: And, like, the way that they play it where he's like, "I'm worried that I'm not giving her enough space. I'm worried—" like, that kind of thing. And, like, "I'm worried she doesn't—" I mean, basically like, "I don't know if she loves me anymore" is kind of where he's going with this.

I thought, "Oh, he— oh, okay. He saw right away."

Teylor: Yeah.

Rileigh: Right.

Sydnee: Like, that's what they're gonna do. They're gonna be like, he's— and then he's gonna be like, "Did you really think you could switch on me again? Like, obviously that's where this is going.

No.

Teylor: No.

Sydnee: No. It's earnest. It's all earnest. Which makes it even more

heartbreaking!

Teylor: [laughs]

Rileigh: And then later he does believe that Margaret is still Stacey.

Sydnee: [laughs]

Rileigh: When— when she's still dressed as Stacey and has to be like, "No, it's real— like, I— I am Margaret. There's something wrong. Help, please. I am not your wife!" [laughs]

Sydnee: I think we've traumatized Edward.

Teylor: [laughs]

Rileigh: Yeah!

Teylor: [through laughter] He doesn't know who to trust! [laughs]

Sydnee: Poor Edward!

Rileigh: He doesn't know who he's married to. [laughs quietly]

Sydnee: Now... go ahead, Tey.

Teylor: Oh, no. I was just saying, you know, this all seems like very poor ruling of countries here. Like, these are not the people that I think should be in charge. But, uh, I do like the inclusion, at least in— Mul— wait, where— Mul— Muldaria? Where are we?

Sydnee: Montenaro.

Rileigh: Montenaro.

Teylor: Montenaro. They say that the coronation can't happen without, like, the Prime Minister there. So that kind of shed some light on it. Like, "Oh, wait. Okay. So this is just some royal wacky hijinks, and then this Prime Minister, who's called in for this midnight coronation, and now there's two Princesses, is just like, 'Uh, I need to get back to actually running this place. [through laughter] Thank you for taking care of that one orphanage, and, like—'"

[all laugh]

Sydnee: That's—that's exactly what—you—y—yes. Exa—that is exactly where I was going. I was gonna say, that is the big relief of the sequel is that you

learn that in Montenaro— and we can go ahead and— let's just assume this is true of Belgravia— and Aldovia, while we're at it.

Teylor: [laughs]

Rileigh: They're all in the same world, apparently.

Sydnee: That there is a Prime Minister, and a Parliament, let's hope, who are actually running things. And they just give the royal family these... this one orphanage that they get to run. [laughs] In each country, and that's what they get to do to, like, feel good about how they're running the cou— maybe it's not even real. Maybe it's like as soon as the royals leave, like, the parents come out and all the kids get paid.

Rileigh: Yeah.

Sydnee: Like, for their day's work acting, and, like—

Rileigh: "Thanks for making the royals feel important."

Sydnee: "Thanks for making the royals feel like they did something again, yes. And you can keep the toys, that's fine, yes, thank you all again. Nice work today! Nice work, everybody! Love to see those smiles!" [laughs]

Rileigh: "I'll see you back on Christmas." [laughs]

Sydnee: "See you back—[laughs] now, listen. This new Princess, she wants to really be involved. She may come back twice this year instead of once. I don't know! But— so we may call you in again for an extra day of work." [laughs quietly]

Rileigh: Oh, man.

Sydnee: [laughs] "Now, not you. You have aged too much to be believable in this orphanage anymore. I'm really sorry. We're not gonna be able to— hey! Come back in a couple years. You could play one of the parents, maybe." [laughs]

Rileigh: [laughs] Yeah. We didn't even mention the, um, potential love interest-turned evil accomplice chief of staff.

Teylor: Oh yeah.

Sydnee: Oh, I forgot he was— there were so many—

Teylor: An— Antonio.

Rileigh: Antonio, who is Margaret's chief of staff who's like, "Silly girl. You can't

run a country by yourself. You need me to tell you how."

Um, and tries to... what? Seduce her. Woo her. Date her.

Sydnee: Woo her, and then gets in with Fiona on the kidnapping.

Rileigh: And all Fiona has to say is, like, "I'm just doing it for money."

And he's like, "Okay, well, give me some money and I'll help you." [snorts] "Commit treason." [laughs]

Sydnee: So then she commits treason. She k—[stammers]— she kidnaps the Princess of one country, she tries to usurp the throne— like, she tries to stage a coup and overthrow Montenaro. And then she's like, "I'm really sorry... about all that."

Rileigh: "Oops!"

Sydnee: "I'm sorry. I just always, you know, wanted to be like you."

Teylor: Yeah, and she says, "My parents never liked me." [laughs]

Rileigh: Yeah! [laughs]

Teylor: [laughs] Like—

Sydnee: And everybody's like, "This poor— this poor girl."

Rileigh: "Aww."

Sydnee: "Aww. I mean—"

Teylor: "Alright. [baby voice] You can do a little treason." [laughs quietly]

Sydnee: She— and so they're like, "This— you're right, this isn't that big a deal. Um, we are gonna throw you in the dungeon."

Rileigh: Right.

Sydnee: When she says, "Guards, take her to the dungeon," I half expected the Prime Minister to step in and be like, "Actually, uhh..."

Rileigh: [laughs]

Sydnee: "We have police. Let's—let's not— we don't need to do th— we don't do that anymore?"

Rileigh: And we know they have police because she said that the two evil henchmen were like, "Yeah, they're already with the police. They already confessed to everything," so.

Sydnee: So they're gonna, like, go through the criminal justice process in Montenaro, but not this one. She's going to the dungeon with the guards!

Rileigh: [laughs]

Sydnee: It's like, "No, how about we use, like, the justice system?"

Rileigh: Yeah.

Teylor: There was, like, that moment where it was clearly framed as, like, a sentimental delivery where she's like, "Hmm, I'll ask the judge for a reduced sentence." And it's like, "Oh, good. Happy family." [laughs]

Sydnee: The, uh— the scene— I have to briefly talk about the airport scene. So, like, once Fiona's been stopped—

Rileigh: In the dungeon.

Sydnee: —and is in the— safely in the dungeon, she admits that she broke up with Kevin, as Margaret, so Margaret has to rush to the airport. Classic Christmas movie scene, right? She's gotta rush to the airport and stop Kevin and Olivia from

getting on that flight back to the bakery in Chicago so that she can tell him that she loves him.

Um, and so she rushes through all the way— like, I guess she's the almost-Queen, so I guess that's why she gets to get all the way to the gate.

Rileigh: I guess she can do whatever she wants, yeah.

Rileigh: Yeah.

Rileigh: It's boarding now!

Sydnee: It's boarding now. He's trying to get co— by the way, the line for coffee is super long.

Teylor: Yeah.

Rileigh: So long.

Sydnee: And they stop and talk to him while he just stands there, holding up this line for coffee for so long. I wanted to say, like, nobody has ever been in an airport that was involved with this scene, 'cause if I were in line for coffee and the guy at the front was standing there discussing, like, wedding pla— I would be like, "Excuse me?!" [laughs]

Rileigh: "I have a flight!"

Teylor: Imagine that going down at, like, LaGuardia. [laughs]

Sydnee: [laughs]

Teylor: [through laughter] 'Cause people would've been thrown out physically.

Sydnee: Or, like, the people who are selling the coffee who are like, "Do you—could you please, sir? Excu—father? Could you move?"

Rileigh: "This is a Starbucks!"

Sydnee: [laughs]

Teylor: "Please, literally anywhere else." [laughs]

Sydnee: Uh, and then she's like— he's like, "Well, I gotta— my plane boards in five minutes."

And Stacey's like, "Well, but for the Queen of Montenaro, surely they could wait a few minutes."

And it's like, [flatly] really? Really.

Rileigh: Can they?

Sydnee: Can they? What if they have a connection, *Stacey*?

Rileigh: And they don't hold the flight, to be fair.

Sydnee: No, they don't— well, they don't, and they shouldn't! Maybe I'm on that flight and I have somewhere to be! [laughs]

Rileigh: Yeah! Uh, and it also makes you wonder, how does marriage work in this country? Because they just— they say they're married once they just go to a priest and he's like, "Okay, you're married."

Is there no sort of, like, marriage license? There's no... anything? [laughs]

Sydnee: [laughs]

Teylor: [laughs] It's just another thing that lands on the Prime Minister's desk.

Sydnee: [laughs]

Rileigh: Yeah! [laughs]

Teylor: "Oh, oh, okay. Oh, you got— you got married in a Starbucks by a— by an airport priest? Yeah, yeah. No, that doesn't fly. I gotta fill out these papers now. Thanks!"

Rileigh: Yeah, especially with the Queen! You have to think there is some sort of process there.

Sydnee: [laughs] "[posh voice] Oh, thank you, Prime Minister. I'm off to the orphanage!"

Rileigh: [laughs]

Teylor: [laughs] Great.

Sydnee: She's like, "Yep. Good, good, that's good. You do that."

Rileigh: "Alright, thanks, Margaret."

Sydnee: [laughs]

Teylor: Well, you know, we have failed to mention that there is an odd presence of perhaps a mystical force in both of these movies.

Sydnee: Oh yeah, with that guy!

Teylor: There is this man—

Rileigh: Oh yeah!

Teylor: —that kind of helps— facilitates them, like, all the wacky hijinks, and he plays several roles. He's, like, a cab driver, and he works at one of the stalls in the Christmas Village, and it's basically he just kind of lines up the hijinks where they find love. And he appears in this movie too. Sydnee: Oh yeah!

Teylor: Yeah! So I want to see the team up. I wanna see the sort of Avengersesque assemblage of the evil cousins versus the altruistic royals.

Rileigh: Mm-hmm.

Rileigh: "We're gonna end the war." [laughs]

Sydnee: "We're gonna make— it's sort of like the EU, but it's whatever... " I don't know what continent they're on. [laughs]

Rileigh: Their own thing. [laughs]

Teylor: Christmas... uh, zum— ism— area?

Sydnee: The Christmas Union.

Teylor: Yeah.

Sydnee: It's the CU.

Rileigh: Yeah.

Teylor: [bursts into laughter]

Sydnee: So the Christmas Union will be formed. [laughs] Of Aldovia, Montenaro, and Belgravia.

Rileigh: And Belgravia, yes.

Sydnee: And all will be well. And meanwhile, the Prime Minster's still like, "[weakly] Guys... could you just—" [crosstalk]

Rileigh: All three of the Prime Ministers, I guess.

[all laugh]

Teylor: They just—they just get together on Christmas and just... hunker down with some nice scotch. [laughs quietly]

Sydnee: I don't know. "What do you think they're gonna do?"

"I don't know. It'll involve weddings and switches, and there will be Americans. The Americans always show up." [laughs quietly]

Rileigh: All we know for sure... is that we have a threequel to look forward to.

Teylor: Aw yeah. Switchin': Baby Switch. A lil baby switch-switch. Babies.

Rileigh: They do— they make that hint. Stacey Vanessa Hudgens is like, "Royal

baby?" [laughs quietly]

Sydnee: Mm-hmm?

Rileigh: And then that's the end of the movie.

Sydnee: Um... well. It is just occurring to me—

Rileigh: You're next, Syd! What's next?

Sydnee: Yes.

Teylor: Uh-oh.

Rileigh: Uh-oh!

Sydnee: That we did not discuss that.

Rileigh: We didn't.

Sydnee: Oh.

Teylor: Just a little soft kidnapping. Ah, it's lighthearted.

Sydnee: [laughs quietly] It's no big deal. It's a lot funnier— the coup was a lot

funnier than the one that's been attempted here.

Rileigh: Right.

Teylor: Yeah. [laughs]

Sydnee: 'Cause it was fake.

Teylor: Yeah.

Rileigh: Yeah.
