Griffin:

Yeah. That's the correct answer. Thank you, Travis.

Travis:

Uh, okay. Cool.

Griffin:

I don't think it matters, um, I've been loosely following it through everyone's, uh, tweets, and Facebook's a- and Friendster updates. And it sounds like every game is just tying.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

So I don't know.

Justin:

So for the score for the World Cup is four to four.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

What I decided is not to root for anyone, because if I make a choice, I am rooting for soccer and that goes against everything I believe in. So-

Justin:

If you choose not to decide, you still have made a choice. This an advice show-

Travis:

... that's beautiful.

Justin:

For the modern era. We take your questions, we answer them. If you wanna learn how to get your question answered by us, stay tuned. At the end of the show, we will provide that information. Our first question comes to us from Mike. Uh, he, he writes from Gmail. He says, "I'm in a bit of a pickle." Oh, Mike, that sounds bad. Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Travis:

Okay.

Griffin:

Girl talk. It's basically... they're replicating-

Travis:

Are you making this up?

Griffin:

They're replicating the burning man 2007 lineup, which is-

Travis:

That was best one.

Griffin:

That was totally the best one.

Justin:

ComFest looks bomb this year. That's what we're saying.

Travis:

What's the lineup at the family reunion?

Griffin:

Lineup at the family reunion is uncle David.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

Uh-huh.

Griffin:

That's pretty much it. It's just uncle David and his banjo.

Travis:

No, fuck that. Go to ComFest dude.

Griffin:

I mean-

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

... your, your uncle David is a competent bunch old player, but you really can't... He's no Major Lazer.

Justin:

You'll be surprised at how quickly, uh, um, you'll forget about a bad family union, but if something crazy goes down at ComFest...

Griffin:

Have you thought about maybe merging the two events and, and inviting your family to ComFest? Be like-

Justin:

Why don't you reunion—

Griffin:

Uncle Dave, Uncle Dave's Rolling on Molly [laughs] over in the cool-down tent.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs] Um—

Travis:

There's one important part here that we're forgetting. Disappointing his mom.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Which makes me think it's not really your decision, Mike. You might feel like it is—

Justin:

Yeah. This one's already been made for you, Mike. You don't need us.

Griffin:

Have you considered kidnapping yourself?

Justin:

Oh shit.

Griffin:

Where did Mike go? He was kidnapped to ComFest.

Justin:

I've always wanted to do that.

Griffin:

Black Diamond took him. With his music.

Justin:

If I, if I had to live like I was dying like Tim McGraw says that would be the only thing I would do is pretend to ha- have myself kidnapped.

Griffin:

That's a good plan. It works in a lot scenes.

Justin:

No skydiving, no rocky mountain climbing. Mike have yourself kidnapped. Nationwide manhunt. It'll be a family union, but it'll be a family union based around, uh, praying for your swift release.

Griffin:

Just make sure that, um, that Denzel Washington isn't your bodyguard or else he'll probably kill a lot of innocent people trying-

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

... to find you.

Justin:

Oh man, I gotta, I gotta watch that movie.

Griffin:

Dope movie.

Travis:

Oh, man, I wanna watch that right now.

Griffin:

Oh, man.

Travis:

Okay. I'm getting, I'm getting off the podcast. I'm gonna go-

Griffin:

Right. Good show, guys. Good show. An anonymous user on Formspring asks, I like my best guy friend, but I'm 95% sure he doesn't like me like that. What do I do?

Travis:

Well, I'm 95% sure you shouldn't do anything. [laughs]

Griffin:

You know, we get a lot of questions like that. And that is your boiler plate... That is your boiler plate answer. Where is your romanticism, Travis? Where is this... I think that, you know, love conquers all. Love is all-

Travis:

But this is like saying I really wanna eat a peanut butter sandwich, but I'm 95% sure I'm allergic to peanuts. Well, that's-

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

... that's a pretty hardy risk there to take. You know what I mean?

Griffin:

Risks, risks are made to be too- to be took. Or be take-

Travis:

Plans are made to be broken. Um, if you... if it is truly your best guy friend, then it's, you know, don't fuck that up.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

I mean, I am a romantic, but-

Justin:

Swallow those feelings.

Travis:

Yeah, bottle them up.

Justin:

Yeah. If n- if you're 95% sure, what has he done to you?

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

Like I'm, I... that means 95% of the time you guys spend together giving you the distinct impression that he would not wanna spend his life loving, laughing, living, and learning with you.

Griffin:

"Sarah, I'm having such a great time hanging out, but I would never ever date you, you cow."

Justin:

"I would never want to convert this to anything romantic, Sarah."

Griffin:

"Don't try and transform this into romance you big, you big animal."

Justin:

"But, you know, I just, I just wanna know if you wanna go to the snow cone place. Listen, don't make this about you. [laughs] You said no strings."

Griffin:

"You should get a boyfriend. A boyfriend, that's not me. Because, oh. I retched a little just even thinking about it."

Justin:

"I just retched on my chucks. Um--"

Travis:

"You are a great friend, but a disgusting person."

Justin:

"Just me, personally."

Travis:

"I am sick when I look at you, I'm sickened."

Justin:

And I'm the last single guy in my circle of friends. Not me, this is formspring again. And I know beyond a shadow of a doubt that all their wives/ girlfriends profoundly dislike me. What can I do to cope with the awkward tension of any social gathering with my bros and their hoes?

Griffin:

Don't-

Travis:

Well, here's a suggestion.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

You want them to like you more.

Justin:

God, man, from the jump, let me help you. Don't say hoes.

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Um-

Travis:

You wanna avoid that.

Griffin:

Stop saying hoes and then [sings] pack your bags and move away. You're not wanted there.

Travis:

[laughs] Oh, God.

Justin:

[laughs] Imagine this, we get... one of the next question we get is like, uh, "I love, uh, all my friends and they have a great group of girlfriends and we're all really close. But every once in a while, um, uh, the zilch comes around that none of us like. How do we awkwardly tell him to pack his bags and move away?"

Griffin:

This guy sounds like a real dupree. [laughs]

Travis:

Owen Wilson. What I love about the question is he doesn't say, what can I do to stop the awkward tension? He says, what can I do to cope with it? I know it's gonna be there. I accept.

Justin:

"Ladies, I know this is weird." [laughs]

Travis:

"I get it."

Justin:

"Let's ride it out."

Travis:

"I know I'm a terrible person and you hate me. Um, but let's just deal with it."

Griffin:

Yahoo answers user, Mr. Stinky Booty asks—

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Do I even need to anymore?

Justin:

No, keep going.

Griffin:

He asks, uh, my mom won't let me have a gun yet. And I want to hunt stuff.
[laughs]

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Can I just use an ax or a machete?

Travis:

Yes, you can.

Justin:

Oh my God.

Griffin:

Coolest kid ever.

Justin:

Okay. There's some problems to address. One is the ambiguity, I think is the main problem. It's not that he... it's the s- it's not the sport of hunting. It's that he feels the need to kill.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

And he wants to kill stuff-

Travis:

Just whatever goes into his field of vision-

Justin:

Yeah. (laughing)

Travis:

He's gonna kill it.

Griffin:

I have to imagine that he's a younger person. Um, by the way, I refreshed the page to, uh, see if any good answers had come up and he has changed

his name in the interim from when I loaded the page to when I refresh the page from Mr. Stinky Booty to True Survivor. [laughs] Which I think is pretty awesome.

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

To Dr Stinky Booty.

Justin:

He must have had a rough afternoon.

Griffin:

Um, I think if he is a child, um, I would say eight years old-

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

... uh, if you can manage to catch an animal in the wilderness and kill it with an ax, then, then I think he should be allowed to do that. 'Cause it would be a real growing experience.

Travis:

Well, he, if he's eight, what kind of liberal mom has he got that's not letting them get it a gun?

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

'Cause his index finger is working just fine.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

He needs to kill stuff.

Justin:

He needs to kill-

Travis:

And when you need something, that's a responsibility.

Justin:

He needs to take living, breathing creatures and turn them into a pile of organic material. Just start that degrading process. Hey, Footsize Mo wants to know on Twitter, he asked us, is it ever appropriate to ask how your cute barista?

Griffin:

Rarely.

Travis:

If you can accept that you're the 20th person that day to do it.

Justin:

Yeah. Cute barista is like begging for it.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

I think that there's something very safe about asking somebody who's in a, s- a service position. It-

Travis:

Hmm.

Justin:

It's almost kind of creepy. Like they're already bringing you coffee. So maybe, you know, ask, go off menu and ask them for their hand.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

I think is like a little weird for me.

Travis:

I'll take... a date with you.

Griffin:

Can I get a grande dinner and a movie?

Travis:

Hmm.

Justin:

That's pretty good.

Travis:

Here's the thing to keep in mind. She's getting paid to be nice to you. So it gets into a tricky kind of, is she really being nice to me or she doing her job kind of thing. And it's too precarious. I think it's too dangerous.

Griffin:

I think we may have actually had this exact question in a prior episode. I think our answer then was if you're... are you good looking?

Travis:

Yes.

Griffin:

Are you a good-looking dude?

Justin:

Then it's always appropriate.

Griffin:

And it's always okay.

Travis:

When she asks you your name to put on the cup, say Mr. Stinky Booty. And then if she continues talking to you, she must really like you.

Justin:

Uh-

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

9, [laughs] 9 MikeO9, 9Miko9, what?

Travis:

Yeah, you got it.

Justin:

Okay. 9Miko9 from Twitter says my friend, Arthur has never been in a fight and always complains about it when he's intoxicated. Should I punch him in the face? Oh shit, we got the best game for you, dude. You and your friend Arthur need to play lock jaw.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Lock jaw. Here's what you do. You go to Arthur, you guys have both been drinking, you put your fist six inches, this is important, from his face. Then you say, "Lockjaw, lockjaw, lockjaw," like that. Justin:

Justin:

Travis:

So-

Justin:

Griffin:

I think Arthur's problem isn't that he's never been punched in the face because I think everyone in some way has been punched in the face. I think that there's... I think there's a difference between the controlled environment of lock jaw and just a primal, just, just a rage fight. Like just a cathartic, like a cathartic uncontrolled punch festival that I think... I mean, I've never been in one. I got punched in the face one time when I was six years old by John Kreider, um-

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

'Cause I cut in the Foursquare line. And I-

Justin:

Asshole.

Griffin:

... God, I know.

Travis:

You were asking for it.

Griffin:

I really was. And, and he was like seven feet tall. And he-

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

He, laid me right out. Uh, he was-

Justin:

Why did a teacher punch you?

Griffin:

No, he was an adult. He was a man child. I don't know-

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

It was one of those jock deals. But um, I think you should probably punch your friend in his face.

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

That's—

Justin:

Yeah. We took the long way around. No harm could possibly come from this.

Griffin:

Um, he won't be upset too, 'cause then you can be like, hey, you asked him, you asked about it. But like, don't punch your friend in the face.

Justin:

What's the proper etiquette for the following situation guys? Etiquette time. Okay. Put your etiquette hats on. Etiquette. I am walking one way and a person passing me going the other way, says something along the lines of, "How are you doing?" Am I supposed to tell them how I am doing? That involves too much conversation. Plus, then I feel required to ask them how they are, and this can end up taking too much time. If I say nothing, then that is rude. Uh, am I supposed to just say it back?

Griffin:

Oh man.

Travis:

Here's my suggestion. Turn around and start walking beside them and just—

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Start talking. "Well, I'm glad you asked. I've been having a rough day and..." just give them really personal details and teach them a lesson about being polite.

Griffin:

I got this a lot in college. I'm sure everyone has, um–

Justin:

You got one of those faces.

Griffin:

Sure. And I mean, I knew a lot of people at my college, but I wasn't friends with a lot of people at my college. So I would be walking into class and, and would pass somebody, um, in the commons as the kids say and they would give me a, "Hey, what's up?" Like, and there's no way that you can answer that question in the... you have to measure out like the distance between you two. And are you supposed to slow down or do they really wanna know what's up or is that just their way of saying hi?

So, um, I, I... this is so pathetic, and you're gonna think I'm joking, but it's totally the truth. If I ever saw somebody in the distance walking my way that I thought I knew, totally I would fake a phone call.

Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

I've already acknowledged that I kind of know them. And now I get a long time to not remember who they are.

Griffin:

Oh. But now I got this phone call.

Justin:

Oh-

Griffin:

I wanna just look at the ground because this conversation so intense. I need to focus-

Justin:

... Why-

Griffin:

On my feet.

Justin:

... why Don't you go with, um, staring right in the eye, say, "What do you care, pervert?" And then push it down-

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Oh, I like it.

Justin:

And then, and then push them down a well.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Or just say, "What the fuck is that supposed to mean?"

Justin:

'Cause, 'cause what I say is... what I'm saying to you is if you do that once, you will never have this problem again. Solved.

Griffin:

Because he won't wanna be your friend anymore.

Justin:

Solved for good.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

Uh-

Travis:

Also, what you can do is just to repeat their question back at them. They don't care. They don't care-

Griffin:

What *is* up? How *are* you doing?

Travis:

How are *you* doing? How are *you-ing*?

Griffin:

Uh, Yahoo answers, Yahoo answers user Aisha asks, what is my body shape?

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

She expounds on that initial question saying, I'm finding it really hard to know what my body shape is. I think I'm an hourglass. But then again, my measurements make me wonder if I am a spoon or even a rectangle.

[laughs]

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

It's waste 31, hip 37, bust, 37.5. Not that that matters. Th- the, the comedy in this situation is... have you ever heard the term, uh, yeah, she's a real... she's got this fine little spoon frame that-

Justin:

[laughs] Is it upside down spoon or?

Griffin:

She's got herself a real tight, rectangular chassis.

Justin:

Got that dodecahedron going. You know what's up.

Griffin:

She's got one of those figure eights, you know what I'm talking?

Justin:

Yeah, real, real good.

Griffin:

Little in the middle, but, but-

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Here's my question-

Griffin:

Really big-

Travis:

... Did she attach a picture?

Justin:

Shaped like Richard Nixon's profile?

Griffin:

She's got a body like a, like a Pi symbol, like the-

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

... symbol for Pi. It's... she doesn't have a torso.

Justin:

Two wide legs.

Griffin:

Two wide legs. No torso. Looking real good.

Justin:

Is there a pic? Is there a picture?

Travis:

Is there a picture?

Griffin:

No pics.

Justin:

No pics?

Travis:

That's a random question to ask without people being able to see you.

Griffin:

She's got one of them Stop sign bodies.

Travis:

That's like asking the question, "What color shirt am I wearing?" That's something you would know better than me.

Justin:

Yeah. To answer your question, you're shaped like a stupid person.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

She's like a big, stupid refrigerator.

Justin:

Like a big, stupid refrigerator. Open up the door, gets some ass and pickles, and you're stupid still. Some of my coworkers have asked me to go out on a night out. Okay, let me start again.

Griffin:

Uh-huh.

Justin:

Some of my coworkers— I'll edit that out in post— some of my coworkers have asked me to go on a night out, but they want to go to a strip joint during the night. Is there any way I can persuade them to do other stuff? Strip joints make me feel gross and pervy. Yeah, fair.

Griffin:

Do you know why they... do you know why they make you feel gross and pervy? 'Cause, 'cause people you don't know, come in and put their, their privets near—

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

... near, around and on you.

Justin:

It is gross and pervy.

Griffin:

It is actually—

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

... legitimately gross and pervy.

Travis:

There is nothing... If you ever go to a strip cl- joint and leave feeling classy and clean, then you were not at a strip joint my friend, you were at a bal- burlesque show, perhaps.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

You were at an IHOP.

Justin:

You were in auto zone and you embarrassed yourself.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

"This is the weirdest joint ever, but these pancakes are delightful."

Justin:

Wow. "Can I have some more cream?" "What? Are you serious?"

Griffin:

[laughs] Uh, you say. Um-

Justin:

Yeah, yeah. Um, h- here's the answer. You, you look them dead in the eyes and you tell them the stone truth that they're your coworkers and you get paid to be around them. So unless someone's gonna cut a check, you're gonna go home to your family who you love.

Travis:

Yep. That's what I say.

Griffin:

What if this, what if the strip joint is his family? Did you think about that?

Justin:

The problem is the strippers are my real family.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Well then yeah, that's gross and pervy, my man.

Justin:

They were... that... Yeah. That's why you're, that's why you're so grossed out 'cause that's your aunt Debra.

Griffin:

You also gotta consider, I mean, if you work at like a, you know, like a, a Hallmark store and your friend, your, your coworkers wanna take you out to

a strip joint, how awkward is it going to be once you've seen him in that environment?

Travis:

And here's-

Griffin:

Once you, once you-

Travis:

Right?

Griffin:

... once you've seen Pamela get all messed up-

Justin:

Oh.

Griffin:

... during, during kegs and eggs and legs Thursday. Thursday mornings.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

You're... you can't look at her the same way ever again.

Justin:

Yep.

Griffin:

Amateur night. What's up, Pamela? Nooo.

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

This is what you need to do, sue your business for sexual harassment. I've seen these videos. That's-

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

... a classic example of sexual harassment. You get paid son.

Griffin:

You know what, you know what you do with that money?

Justin:

Go to a strip club.

Griffin:

Make it, make it rain.

Justin:

[laughs] To, to convince him to do something, uh, to get out of, uh, [laughs] to get out of this, all you need to do is when your coworker asks, sit on their lap and say, "I can just get it started right now."

Griffin:

[laughs] ["Why go the strip club? I can bring the strip club to you."]

Justin:

[laughs] "Any place I go is a strip club. Look at this zipper."

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

"It's halfwa- it's halfway down just, just through this sentence."

Travis:

"All my clothes are tear-away."

Justin:

[laughs] "Let me demonstrate," but they're not tear-away. And you black out.

Travis:

See this suit? It's a nice suit. Right? Watch this.

Justin:

Rip!

Travis:

Gone.

Justin:

I use the bus a lot. And I thought I could use that time to practice my less than stellar social skills. How can I start a conversation with people without coming off as either creepy or annoying? I'd love to meet some new people to hang out with.

Yeah. This is a toughie. Uh, this is something that I have a, a lot of problems with sometimes. Is, is just seeing like a stranger where you don't have a good opening. Travis:

Yeah. Just like if you're on the bus, just be like, "Hey, I know it's creepy, but I just wanted to say, I really like your shoes." Or something like that, where you say, "Hey, I didn't wanna interrupt you, I didn't wanna bother you, but that's a great jacket." And—

Griffin:

What if you, what if you try and pull that game though? And it's like, "I think, like your face is familiar, and I think that I know, but I don't know where I, how we, we are acquainted." And then it's like, "I'm— I am your aunt."

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

"I'm your aunt." And—

Travis:

Well, that's just a serious problem.

Justin:

"You're putting singles into my g-string, and this is awkward."

Uh, you, you, y— uh, what I normally end up doing, I had to do a lot of this when I was working at the newspaper, I had to do a lot of, you know, man on the street interviews, stuff like that, um, is— like, Justin McElroy, the Justin McElroy you know, with any luck, love, internet gadabout, media personality, cause celebre— uh, not cause celebre. I ha— I do have many cause celebres that I care about, whales and things. Um, I don't go up to people.

Griffin:

Hmm.

Justin:

[laughs] They don't know anything about how awkward you are. So you just trick them and pretend you're not an awkward person.

Griffin:

Or-

Travis:

Yup.

Griffin:

... put in those, those ear buds.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Keep your eyes closed.

Travis:

Well, here's the beautiful thing about the bus and any kind of situation like that. You're only gonna have to deal with that awkwardness for like five minutes. You know what I mean? It's a perfect time to practice-

Justin:

Yeah, you-

Travis:

... doing that.

Justin:

Yeah, you got an exit plan.

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Do it-

Griffin:

I don't think—

Travis:

If it fails, then you're quiet for the— rest of the time.

Griffin:

... you can meet people, though. You can't meet p— I can't meet people. I'm, I'm moving to Chicago soon. I'm gonna be riding a lot of buses. And I don't know how I'll be able to, to have the, the focus required to meet people when I know that I'm in, uh, an airtight tube that's full of pathogens and, and maybe terrorists.

Justin:

[laughs] Well, you need, you need a, a starter that you can always bring with you. Uh, a baby is good.

Travis:

Yeah. A dog.

Justin:

Or you can get... a dog is good. Or you can get one of those giant pinwheel lollipops—

Travis:

Oh, yeah.

Justin:

Just like in the, in the bus has go to town on it. And then when they, they're gonna look because you're being so loud with the slurping and licking. And when they look, just be like, "You wanna get down on this?" And that's a great—

Travis:

"There's enough for two."

Justin:

"Do you wanna get down on this sucker with me?"

Griffin:

These right here? These are moon shoes.

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

I wanna get to know you.

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Always carry skis with you.

Justin:

I bounced, oh, I gotta go, um, yeah, I'm off to ski. I'm going out to, uh, skiing. I'm going to ski in the mountain.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

So...

Griffin:

uh, Yahoo answers user Dakotas Mommy-

Travis:

Uh-huh.

Griffin:

Asks help me name my mobile spray tanning business. Any suggestions would be appreciated. It is a spray tan business where I travel to your home. Please let me know what name you like the best. Caribbean Tan To-Go.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

Caribbean Tan To You.

Travis:

Uh-huh.

Griffin:

Tropical Tan To You, Tropical Tan To-Go, Beach Tan To-Go, Beach Tan To You, Tropic Tan To-Go, Tropic Tan To You?

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Um, when I read this, I didn't read it, um, very well, I guess. And, uh, I just read the words mobile spray tanning business, and I thought of like a food truck. (laughing) So like, I would see like pale people on the street and just like pull over and be like, "Hey, just hop in this, this bus with really tinted windows and take all of your clothes off, and I'm gonna spray you with oils and you're gonna be darker when you get out of it."

Travis:

Well-

Griffin:

That's, that's basically just, um, like a, like a mobile rape den. But I guess if it's, if it comes to your home then it's like-

Travis:

I think the important part about naming any businesses is looking to the future, seeing how your business is gonna grow and change and kind of trying to anticipate that. So, I recommend bankruptcy.

Justin:

[laughs] How about, how about casing the joint?

Griffin:

Definitely.

Travis: Let me in your house and I'll spray you with stuff.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Um, dark, dark, dark, dark skin spray, here it comes.

Justin:

Dark-sos.

Griffin:

Dark-

Travis:

Van and tan.

Justin:

How... this isn't. I don't think that we have a good one for it, for her. I think-

Griffin:

I don't, I really don't wanna give up on Dakota's mama 'cause she— she's had a hard year. And I think she could use any assistance we could afford her.

Justin:

How about, how about you call it the, um, call it the Dakota Memorial, uh, Spray Tanning Mobile Station?

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

And then will people say, "Oh, I'm so sorry. Did your daughter die?" [laughs] And you look them straight in the eye and say, "Someday."

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

And then see if they still wanna spray tan. I bet you, they will wanna look youthful and full of life and vigor more than they ever have before. And you will be able to, to really get them on the, uh, get them on the add-ons, like the complimentary fake teeth.

Travis:

I have the-

Griffin:

How about-

Travis:

... the best name. Oh, you go,

Griffin:

S- Spray Tan, Spray Tan for shut-ins.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

'Cause they can't get, they can't get their... the UV rays, the vitamin D that you really need to get a good base going.

Justin:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

So I think that maybe you should just put your target audience right in the name.

Travis:

I say, uh, name it All Over Tan, which has a double, uh, euphemism there, a double entendre where one you're all over the city, you're traveling, but also that awkward moment where they have to get naked in front of you. So just-

Justin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

... All Over Tan. That's copyrighted.

Justin:

Hey guys. Yeah. Oh yeah. Sorry. Um, [laughs] Hi gentlemen. I live in Connecticut and I just started dating a guy in NYC. I'm gay by the way.

Griffin:

Ew!

Justin:

Come on.

Griffin:

We were all thinking it.

Justin:

We're not [inaudible] program.

Griffin:

Sorry.

Justin:

Uh, we get along great. And I think this has some real potential. Okay.

Travis:

Congratulations.

Justin:

The only mismatch is that he likes to go out all the time, and I'm more of a home body. How can I make this work? Wow. I have that exact... uh, I have had that exact same problem in my relationship. I feel like we've kind of dealt with it.

Griffin:

You dated a dude in New York city?

Travis:

Yup.

Justin:

No, Griffin. I've— I've, I've been a home body. I am someone who likes to stay at home. Um, I don't like to go out. And Sydney, especially when we were, you know, still in college, um, she'd like to go out a lot. And what's hard is that if all the things in relationships where like you want to be with somebody that you click with, um, inevitably, there's gonna be something that is just... it's endemic to who you are and it's not gonna change, and it's

not complimentary with your partner. I think that man or a woman, it's just, you're gonna find things like that in the relationship. And the best thing to do is not to hope that it gets better. The best thing to do is to confront it like grownups and say, I, you know, I feel differently than you do, but let's make it, let's work it out. Let's go out three nights a week and stay in three nights a week. You're gonna have to give and, and he's gonna have to.

Travis:

Griffin:

I go out and stay home on my own damn schedule.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

All right.

Travis:

And sad.

Justin:

And this has been the lonely heart corner with Griffin.

Griffin:

It's a regular feature on the show.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Uh-

Justin:

Go to sleep earlier you dummy. [laughs] Less lonely times. So here's the deal. Let me give it to you straight, Griff. Okay. Back in February, I met a girl who's with the Marine Corps [pronounced corpse]. At tha- that time I was, uh, in the process of joining, but hadn't yet... you guys know that I know it's pronounced Corps, right?

Travis:

Uh-huh.

Griffin:

... I don't think they appreciate it with [laughs] when you actually say the words in conjunction with each other.

Justin:

Do they not? Okay.

Griffin:

Marine Corpse.

Justin:

Together, they weren't... I didn't, I didn't map it out.

Griffin:

Right.

Justin:

I needed to, to, to think about that one a little bit more.

Griffin:

Thank you for your service.

Justin:

We became friends, and I started liking her.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Now I've sworn into the USMC, and it turns out she likes me. But if we get into a relationship, it could technically be considered fraternization. What should I do? Tristan.

Travis:

Hmm.

Griffin:

That's hot- that's some hot shit-

Travis:

Hoo.

Justin:

Man. That sounds like a Richard Gere movie.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

I love it.

Griffin:

It sounds like, uh-

Justin:

This is scintillating. I don't, think-

Griffin:

Danielle Steel like-

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Court martial of the heart.

Justin:

Heartbreak on the waves.

Griffin:

An officer and an officer. [laughs]

Justin:

Of different genders.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Um-

Travis:

Important to note.

Justin:

Yeah. Not that there's anything wrong with that, especially love on the high seas. You find it where you can get it, right?

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Um... did you join the USMC to, to be closer? 'Cause if so, you did not plan this shit out, my man.

Travis:

I'll say this. This is, this is friend of the show, Tristan. He is dedicated to serving our country. Um, I've been talking to him for a while now about his dedication to the country. Thanks again, Tristan. Um-

Griffin:

Doing a bang-up job of it.

Travis:

You're doing great.

Griffin:

Uh-

Travis:

Yeah, go ahead and fraternize.

Justin:

Hey, how about this? How about this, Tristan? We're at war.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

How about, how about you put your mind on your duty [laughs]-

Griffin:

No, no.

Justin:

... to protect me and my freedom.

Griffin:

Dude, listen, Tristan is doing something-

Justin:

I was-

Griffin:

... that the three of us could never do.

Justin:

I have a busy schedule and I need people to protect me day in and day out, and Tristan is thinking about... swoopin poon.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

I need you to be thinking about stupid Osama.

Griffin:

Okay.

Justin:

And get in, get in the tunnels and go get him. If, if—

Griffin:

But with that constant—

Justin:

He won't be on the water. That's why we haven't found him. [laughs]

Griffin:

But that constant, beautiful reminder of, of swoopable poon right next to him as he's fighting side by side against Osama's evil forces, against the axis of evil—

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

He's gonna fight that much harder 'cause he knows he has something to protect. And so will she. I'm just saying that if anyone's going to take down Osama, it's gonna be Tristan or his girlfriend, Islode. And by which I mean, anyone—

Travis:

Personally, Tristan will be the one. And that will make the end of that movie so much better.

Griffin:

Tristan's gonna take him down. His girlfriend's going to hold the camera up while he is like hog-tying him. He's gonna make Osama bin Ladin say "My Brother, My Brother and Me is the best podcast."

Justin:

[laughs] What if you only have time though? Like what if he's put into like the classic Batman situation?

Griffin:

Oh God.

Justin:

You know, where it's like—

Travis:

He has to either save our podcast or his girlfriend.

Justin:

[laughs] If you go this way, you can capture Osama and get him to promote My Brother, My brother and Me. If you go the other way, you'll save your girlfriend. What do you do?

Griffin:

I didn't think about it like that.

Travis:

I trust Tristan to figure out the correct choice.

Justin:

Yeah. I think we-

Travis:

Which is, I think, Tristan, you throw the girlfriend at Osama.

Justin:

Yeah. And then you shoot him... uh, you shoot Osama. It's like you take it, but, uh, you wing him. Right?

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

And then you take him and you're a hero. And who cares who you fraternize with? This is the solution, catch Osama, and you can fraternize with whoever the fuck you want.

Travis:

I love it.

Justin:

You're a national hero.

Griffin:

I already think he's a national hero. I think-

Justin:

Okay. Okay.

Griffin:

You just go ahead and do whatever you want, Tristan. Ain't no-

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Ain't no law against-

Travis:

There might actually be-

Griffin:

... except for the laws that are definitely against it.

Travis:

I think there actually is.

Justin:

I would grant you regional hero at this point, but not like a national, like global hero except to people who hate our country.

Griffin:

It's my hero.

Justin:

P- PDunk. [laughs] Not a good start, but keep going. Hey guys, is it wrong to be in a long-term relationship with a girl, even though, you know it's not gonna be a happily ever after kind of thing? And if so, how long is too long? PDunk why are you wasting your time?

Travis:

Yeah. And why are you wasting her time?

Justin:

Yeah. Ooh, yeah. Does she know?

Travis:

Yeah, that's the thing.

Justin:

[laughs] I think that might be step one and then maybe we can play out a future after that.

Travis:

Let me give you that future, living alone. Um-

Justin:

Right.

Griffin:

No, you guys are living in the future. PDunk, you gotta live in the present. If you're having a good time with her, even though you know that it's, you know, she ain't marriage material, or maybe you're not.

Justin:

That don't make any sense.

Travis:

But the problem Griffin is long-term relationship. It's one thing to go on a couple of dates with a girl knowing it's-

Justin:

Yeah. Right.

Travis:

... not gonna workout. It's another to be with a girl for like a year and a half, but sitting there thinking, "Well, this is gonna end in February." Like. tha- We've talked about this before. Once you make that decision that this isn't going anywhere, you're never coming back from that.

Justin:

And you could miss, he could miss out on like the special somebody-

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

... of his life because he's dating-

Travis:

And PDunk–

Justin:

... this, this, this spoon shaped harpy.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

I'm gonna be just brutally honest here. I would call that behavior selfish because it's saying–

Griffin:

Oh, my Gosh.

Travis:

“I don't wanna be alone right now. And then I'll keep my options open if something else comes along.”

Justin:

A judgment. On the air.

Griffin:

So should we, should we break up with PDunk's girlfriend for him right now on the show? And–

Justin:

God, yeah, our first breakup.

Griffin:

.Um, Hey, Margaret–

Justin:

This is– Hey, hey Margie. Hey–

Griffin:

Hey.

Justin:

Hey spoon shaped harpy.

Griffin:

Listen. We don't know anything about you, except that you don't make our boy PDunk happy enough.

Justin:

You aren't marriage material, my babe.

Travis:

I'm sorry, um-

Griffin:

You did... You done good. You put in a good effort. Um-

Justin:

Yup.

Griffin:

But you're, you're 100% just wasn't good enough for, for the dunk. So, yeah.

Travis:

And you know what? All the pressure off him. He didn't say a word to us. We made this decision after observing how you guys were together. So don't be mad at him. Be mad at us.

Justin:

And Margo, you can do better. He calls himself PDunk.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Unironically, he's not the kind of guy you wanna meet and take home to meet your folks.?

Griffin:

You can't do better though. 'Cause PDunk is... I mean, he's a solid dude.

Justin:

He's a solid dude.

Griffin:

He had helped me move.

Justin:

Great taste in podcasts.

Griffin:

Gave me a ride to the airport. Um, so you just gotta come and pack up your shit.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

I have a conundrum.

Griffin:

Okay.

Justin:

This is from Stacy. Uh, here My Brother, My Brother and Me, we turn conundrums into funundrums. [laughs]

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

That's our advice. My brother and I— My boyfriend and I—woo. Hoo—

Griffin:

Yowsa.

Justin:

Yowsa.

Travis:

Hoo.

Justin:

My boyfriend... My boyfriend and I are celebrating our three year anniversary in a week or so. Um—

Travis:

You should know that.

Justin:

You might wanna pin down that date, Stace.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

Uh, unfortunately I'm far away in grad school and dealing with crazy family times. This is where you come in. I need ideas for gifts. And I am certain he would love anything you suggest. Well, shit, Stacy. Um-

Griffin:

Thanks for telling us so very much about him to base this decision on.

Justin:

... Yeah. So like an object, a physical object in the world.

Griffin:

A gun rack. Um, let's just, let's just... [clicks fingers rapidly]

Justin:

Um-

Griffin:

Um...

Justin:

... a mug, a nice mug.

Griffin:

A Segway.

Justin:

A pri-

Travis:

Chalice.

Justin:

... a lamp.

Griffin:

A guitar tuner. I'm looking at things on my desktop. [laughs]

Justin:

Jaw breakers. I'm just looking at things. I-

Travis:

A leg lamp.

Justin:

Stream of conscious.

Griffin:

Um, what-

Justin:

You know what's good? A guitar.

Griffin:

... Yeah.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Not just, uh, a gift, but a hobby, you know.

Travis:

Here's the important thing-

Griffin:

What about a high quality, high quality webcam for both you and him? And then you can have video chats.

Justin:

I like that.

Griffin:

From... far away from each other.

Travis:

I think that, that's good. Um, um, any, any anniversary gift? The important thing is to it's a test to prove how well you know them.

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

It is. So-

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

... get them something. Get, get your, your beau something that is specific to him.

Justin:

Get him a bo staff!

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Get him a crossbow with which he can hunt in the wild.

Justin:

A crossbow that shoots bo stuffs. A giant cro- bow shooting crossb-

Griffin:

A bo crossbow.

Justin:

... A bo crossbow. A ballista.

Travis:

A crossbow that shoots bows?

Justin:

... a barista. [laughs]

Griffin:

... [laughs] A crossbow that shoots baristas and then you go to jail for murder 'cause you just shot a Starbucks employee. Why did you do that? Stacey that was the worst present ever. I got you this dead Starbucks employee.

Justin:

[laughs] I got you a... I got you a bum rap for murder. You're going to wanna leave the country. [laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs] Um, no, I think the webcams, uh, car. Three year, that's a, that's a car, right?

Justin:

Three year is the car. Mm-hmm. Fourth year is the dead— [laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs] Um, I wanna ask a question.

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

Well, someone else asked it, but I wanna read it. Um, it's from, it's from a website called Yahoo. Uh, user justanotherhuman asked, Is it weird to like animated characters more than real life people? Let's say a cartoon figure. I think depending on the cartoon, some females look astonishingly beautiful, and usually they have a great personality. I start to imagining how it would be to date such a character, and the outcome is it's better than real life. I don't really like real life females much. Most of them, not all, are really superficial, and usually just want something from you. Don't misunderstand. I can clearly see the line between fantasy and real life. It's just that fantasy is so much more appealing to me.

Travis:

Hey, buddy.

Justin:

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

And you're telling me you're, you're attracted to celluloid people. Like, that's why you-

Travis:

I love them 'cause their bodies are better.

Griffin:

[crosstalk] avatar.

Justin:

I like how they're only two-dimensional and they don't talk back.

Travis:

And I can turn it off. That's pretty nice.

Justin:

And they're glossy.

Griffin:

I... if this guy finds out that those things were animated by real life people and written dialogue by real life people and voiced by real life people, he's gonna lose his shit. Nobody tell him that.

Travis:

Here's the funny thing. This is the Yahoo answers equivalent of the neighbor who says, "he always seemed like such a nice boy."

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Like, this is step one to 10 years down the road, he's killing women.

Justin:

Well, this is what the internet teaches us. Right? It's not that you, it's not that he was always such a nice guy, it's that you never read his post on Yahoo answers.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

Trust me. He was a monster the whole time. "Real people are just too... They're like big sacks of blood."

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

"I just wanna stab them and see what's inside? Isn't that weird?" Here's a pro tip, *bro*, if you have to ask, is it weird-

Travis:

Yes.

Justin:

... odds are probably. If you're questioning-

Travis:

If you have to make the statement, I can clearly see the line between reality and fantasy, you can't, you can't see that line. You are justifying.

Justin:

Yeah. And you know, it's bad when dude is like, I'm so crazy, but I'm gonna step out of that. It's gotten to a point where I can actually sense my own perversion, like, rearing its head. Like, I don't think this is normal. I'm pretty sure it's weird. But it- that's how weird it is. That like, even me a weird guy is like, I don't know, Kev.

Travis:

"I'm gonna be honest with you guys, I'm freaking myself out."

Justin:

I'm freaking out by me. Just me being alone I'm freak. So, hopefully that'll help, Kev, KevMo uh, you're, you are a weird guy.

Griffin:

Creepy Kev.

Justin:

I wanna, I wanna hear our last question, our one to grow on if you will. But, um, first I wanna tell you how you can seek out our advice. Um, you, uh... oh, hold on. I got a good one here [laughs] from Delia. I am a 20... I'm 22 and a hopeless romantic. I've been blown away, not in a good way from the desires of men that I meet. Travis:

[laughs] Silly. I'm not saying that it's a bad thing, LOL. I'm not looking for a serious relationship, but why have men thought that dinner or drinks is no longer necessary, it's making my loving heart sad. Keeping the ears open, loving you three, Delia. Um-

Griffin:

Delia has a strange way of talking. But I dig it.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

I'm just saying-

Justin:

I dig it.

Griffin:

It's a lil- it's strange, but I dig it.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

I don't know, Delia.

Justin:

I feel like-

Griffin:

Chivalry is dead.

Justin:

I... Go to a church, Delia. That's where you're gonna meet nice boy.

Travis:

Go to our Facebook appreciation group and meet a nice boy.

Justin:

All gentlemen. There are still gentlemen in the world. I open a door. I don't-

Travis:

Here's why, those kinds of guys will do as little as they have to do. So, you know, make sure you keep your standards strong and require them to do these things. And they will do them. Or just go out with a better quality of man.

Justin:

... And keep in mind, 22, guys, 22, they're basically children.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

They're like babies. They don't know... They don't have real skills like a marriage-

Griffin:

You don't start to ripen and mature as a person until 23.

Travis:

That's true.

Justin:

Take it. Yeah. Yeah. Take it from Griffin.

Travis:

Delia, date older men.

Justin:

Yeah. Date older men that go to church.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Just go to your local church, find the, the oldest guy you can, shack up, get hitched. Make sure he's got some do-re-mi in the back though if you know what I mean?

Griffin:

Oh yes.

Justin:

Can't buy the cow and milk it.

Travis:

And then you drink the milk, and make you strong and then you kick a dude.

Justin:

I think I messed up the metaphor.

Travis:

Yeah, I think so.

Justin:

I wanna hear Griffin's last- um... Also, Delia, I'm confused by your email. Are you down to bone? Because...

Travis:

Or do you wanna fool around?

Justin:

I was kidding. You know what? It may be, it may be that, that you are sending out the wrong signals that you're down to bone on the 24/7 [laughs]

Maybe you should scale it back a little bit. Maybe wear something more conservative.

Travis:

Go ahead and lock that up. That's your treasure.

Justin:

Maybe when you meet a new person, this is a great way to meet somebody on the bus, "Hi, my name is Delia. And I'm not down to bone."

Travis:

Yes.

Justin:

What you-

Griffin:

So don't even try it.

Justin:

... Don't even try it.

Griffin:

Do you like Scrabble? Because I will play some Scrabble with you tonight.

Justin:

I will play Scrabble.

Griffin:

Play your cards, right. Or your tiles.

Justin:

Your road to passion is on lockdown.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

You know what I'm saying? That's not even a metaphor, it's just, unlock that.

Travis:

But then feel free to give it up on second date.

Justin:

... Second date. I think you gotta go naked date two.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

Um, th- I wanna hear the last question I wan- in actuality now. I'm not just threatening to hear it. Um, but I want to tell you how you can seek out our advice. Uh, as always, these methods are available on My Brother, My Brother and Me.com, which is not a website.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

Mbabam.com it is.

Travis:

I'm trying to say this has been a really well-oiled show. Really just flowing.

Justin:

Yeah, really working the kinks out, for sure.

Griffin:

Well, we've, we've all been burning the candles at both ends and a little bit in the middle.

Justin:

Yeah. I'm-

Griffin:

So just-

Justin:

... not gonna hit my problems onto them though.

Griffin:

... just bear with it.

Justin:

Um, yeah, just hang in there. Uh, you can get us on Twitter. Use the hashtag MBMBaM. Uh, we read all those, always. We see them as soon as you send them. Um, if you wanna get to us directly, that's a great way to do it. Uh, uh, @MBMBaM is our Twitter account if you wanna find out what's, what's new with, with the late, the latest. Wanna make a love connection, or maybe just meet a friend, go to—

Griffin:

Huge thread on Facebook.

Justin:

Our Facebook group.

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Huge Facebook thread.

Justin:

Start a Facebook about meetings— is it really?

Travis:

Yeah. It's blowing up.

Justin:

Uh, if you wanna go there, just meet people, make a new friend—

Griffin:

There is no—

Justin:

Um—

Griffin:
