Justin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Is there anything I should do while, whilst in Huntington besides listening to Clinton McElroy 103.3 WTCR morning's trap-a-man man, trav-a-man man from twitter. You're already doing the most important thing. All your news information, sports, weather, everything you need is right there.

Griffin:

Justin:

Griffin:

Travis:

Justin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Griffin:

Oh, my god.

Justin:

Travis:

Oh, my god. Now I need to check. Go on about your business. I'm going to look.

Justin:

[Laughs]

Griffin:

As far as other things to do, soak in the sights. Go for a walk on Marshall University's campus.

Travis:

Dear Clint McElroy, why the hell doesn't Ducky Crabtree have a Facebook page?

Justin:

Facebook page for Ducky Crabtree, or I quit the internet forever because there's no point.

Griffin:

Go to Hillbilly Hotdogs.

Travis:

You could hunt down Justin.

Justin:

Well don't do that.

Griffin:

You could hunt down Justin like he's wild game.

Justin:

Well don't, don't do that.

Griffin:

Um.

Justin:

I'm going to vote against that one. Are we voting?

Travis:

Yes.

Justin:

I don't, I don't think that one's very good.

Griffin:

Or you could stay there for 22 years and then leave.

Travis:

Um, let me give you an alcoholic's perspective. Two dollar pitchers at The Union on Monday, karaoke on Tuesday at Sharky's, five dollar all you can drink at Fat Patty's on Wednesday, Thirsty Thursday's...

Griffin:

No, it's V-Club. You're thinking of the V-Club, is Wednesday all you can drink.

Travis:

No.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Griffin:

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Travis:

Mm-hmm [affirmative]

Justin:

Travis:

It is. There's a good drinking scene in Huntington.

Justin:

If you like...

Griffin:

Yahoo answers user Timothy asks, and this question was sent in by TJ-Mad, uh, loyal listener to the show. Thank you, TJ. What does it mean when kids or Japanese people come and stand next to you?

Justin:

[Laughs]

Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Justin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Griffin

Justin:

[Laughs] It's coming on down. What's that tumbling down the mountain? I think it's a nugget of fortune headed your way.

Griffin:

The problem is you can't try to stand next to a Japanese person to try and emulate that good fortune.

Justin:

Mm-hmm [affirmative]

Griffin:

Because they'll run away.

Justin:

Ooh.

Griffin:

They're spry.

Travis:

And if they run away, that's six more weeks of winter.

Griffin:

Yep.

Justin:

Um, I'm...

Griffin:

Omens and portance.

Justin:

Um, I... Here, this is a bad omen. Um, my [laughs]... This is from Formspring, "My best friend's ex GF constantly hangs out with our friend in group, having isolated all her friends when they were dating. This is a problem because even when they were dating we barely tolerated her often selfish and childish behavior. Please help." Eh, she's a zilch. Just tell her to go away.

Justin:

Travis:

Justin:

I don't think so.

Griffin:

Actually I'm trying to have a conversation with you. Ooh, gross.

Justin:

Too bad, that's grody.

Griffin:

Let's don't and say we did.

Travis:

[Laughs] So bring up all mid-ninety's phrases. P-A-R-T-Y? Because I gotta. Mask...

Justin:

Oh, okay. And that's just the mask.

Griffin:

Shoop.

Justin:

Shoop! [Laughs] Push it! Reaganomics.

Griffin:

[Laughs]

Justin:

If that doesn't, if that doesn't work you can always dump a bucket of pigs blood on her.

Travis:

[Laughs] No harm could come from that.

Justin:

She'll messa— she'll get the message. Tout, tout suit I think. Um...

Griffin:

Um, no, talk to uh, talk to her ex that is a staple of your group, because it's his problem.

Justin:

[Laughs] That's on him.

Griffin:

He brought this, he brought this fucking albatross into your group.

Justin:

[Laughs]

Griffin:

And now it's his turn, it's, it's his job to dispatch her.

Justin:

Next time just be like, "It's on you, Ricky. It's on you." The next time...

Griffin:

It's on you, Ricky.

Justin:

Next time she comes in, and then walk out the room.

Travis:

And then you get the bonus of every time she keeps coming in the room, you get to give them that look. You get to look at across him across the room and be like, "You son of a bitch."

Griffin:

This is your doing, Rick.

Travis:

We talked about this, Ricky.

Griffin:

Richard.

Justin:

Richard.

Griffin:

Richarrrrd. Kyle on Gmail asks, "Hey, guys. Is talking to yourself weird?"

Justin:

Context, all about context.

Travis:

It's not.

Justin:

Context is so important.

Griffin:

You know what, if you're giving yourself like a badass pump up speech in the mirror...

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

I do that from time to time.

Travis:

You know what I decide it was weird because I talk to myself all the time. Talking to yourself about stopping talking to yourself is weird.

Griffin:

That is weird.

Travis:

Like I'll start to say out loud...

Griffin:

But looking at yourself like...

Travis:

Like what am I doing? I need to stop. I look crazy, and I use my hands a lot, and it's...

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Justin:

Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

[Laughs]

Justin:

Griffin:

Or...

Justin:

Or what?

Griffin:

Cut her in half.

Justin:

Cut her in half.

Travis:

Whichever one of you stops doesn't really love her.

Griffin:

You know obviously which half to take. Hmm, the bottom.

Travis:

[Laughs]

Travis:

I thought you meant cut her in half lengthwise.

Justin:

Oh, no.

Griffin:

Oh, no. She'll die from that.

Justin:

Oh, yeah. You'll have to put her together like one of those whistle suckers that doesn't work unless you have- Remember those whistle gummies that people used to have, and you stick two gummies together and they turn into a whistle? She'd be like that.

Travis:

I got you.

Justin:

I might have dreamed them.

Travis:

Whip!

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

He's MIA.

Griffin:

I don't know, I haven't seen him in a while.

Travis:

[Laughs]

Griffin:

Did he go AWAL? No?

Justin:

No.

Griffin:

VTOL? No?

Justin:

No.

Griffin:

Those aren't...

Griffin:

He's MIA.

Travis:

Guys, like, I just got the news. He's Kibby POW.

Justin:

Oh, no.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

No, we're going to get you, Kibby. Stay strong.

Griffin:

Tristan's going to come, he's going to bust up Osamas.

Justin:

Tristan's coming, Kibs.

Griffin:

Just hang on. Hang on to hope. Uh, this is a topical sports question, which we'll know a lot about.

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

Who better, Lebron with no legs or Kobe with no legs?

Justin:

This is how much I know about sports is the thought I just had was, "Okay, so they both have legs". I do know that, I've settled that now. I know they both have legs.

Griffin:

They both have two, big strong legs each.

Justin:

Sinewy.

Griffin:

Big, sinewy beautiful trunks.

Travis:

You know you said, you said who better. Um, beautifully phrased. And I, you know, at first thought, who would be better in a sporting event? But maybe he's asking who would learn the most and become a better person?

Griffin:

Okay, so let's cut it in. Let's split this question in half like we would, um, with uh...

Travis:

Shane's girlfriend.

Griffin:

Shane's girlfriend.

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

Um, so who would be better at sports?

Justin:

Me.

Griffin:

Okay? Really?

Justin:

Is this between us?

Griffin:

You think if you went Chicago 21 against LeBron and Kobe, that neither of which had legs...

Justin:

Let me tell you...

Travis:

Would they, would they like cripple masters join up? And one would be the arms, and one would be the legs.

Griffin:

And their torsos would fuse, and they would be like a push-me pull-you, but they'd be really good at basketball?

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

I love this.

Griffin:

I love it too.

Travis:

And really good at offending reporters.

Griffin:

Um, oh, but they play for two different teams now. Don't they? That would, that would get tricky.

Justin:

So, okay. Kobe Bryant, 31 years old.

Griffin:

Okay. Are you looking up some stats?

Justin:

Yeah. Kobe Bryant, 31 years old, and according to this card that I cut off the back of his action figure, he's got a power rating of eight.

Griffin:

Okay.

Travis:

Okay.

Griffin:

That's a lot of fucking power, dude.

Justin:

It is, it's a lot but—

Travis:

It's on a scale of ten?

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Okay.

Justin:

His smarts are a nine and his tech skills...

Griffin:

Jesus.

Justin:

His tech skills are a seven.

Travis:

Wow.

Griffin:

This guy's a fucking super genius.

Justin:

Yeah, he's a super genius.

Griffin:

Holy hell.

Justin:

He's a super genius, super slam dunk artist.

Griffin:

What's he doing balling? He should be up in NASA taking us to the moon and shit.

Justin:

He balls at night and invents during the day.

Griffin:

Oh, my god.

Justin:

Lebron James, age 25, power rating 9.

Travis:

Ooh.

Griffin:

Oh.

Justin:

Yeah, smarts...

Griffin:

He kicked it up.

Justin:

Seven. Tech skill, get this, ten.

Griffin:

Holy shit.

Travis:

Holy shit.

Justin:

Yeah, Lebron James is really good with tech.

Griffin:

Do you guys remember when time travel was invented in the year 2010 by the king, by the basketball king?

Travis:

[Laughs]

Griffin:

The king of all basketball?

Justin:

We have to get back. How? There's only one way. We have to subvert the laws of the Lebron Continuum.

Travis:

[Laughs]

Griffin:

The fuck. The fuck, Lebron. You missed that really important three pointer, and now the Miami Heat lost their basketball game. Not to fast, pew, pew, pew. He times travels back and makes the shot.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

That's what that sound was.

Justin:

He goes back and he meets George Washington and a clown, and he helps him decide where to put the state capital.

Travis:

[Laughs]

Justin:

Lebron James in: The Time Belt. Um, so uh, I guess. I guess that answers that.

Griffin:

Lebron James.

Justin:

Lebron James.

Griffin:

But who would be a better person? We talked about the sports side. Who would be a better person.

Justin:

It depends. If you live in Cleveland, uh it's Kobe. If you live outside of Cleveland, it's Lebron. Because Kobe didn't, didn't...

Travis:

No, but see, here's the difference. I think Kobe has the most to learn.

Justin:

Kobe's got a... What? Why?

Travis:

He has a... Well he's kind of a dick.

Justin:

Because he's, because his tech skills are severed?

Griffin:

No, you're, you flipped them.

Justin:

You flipped the script.

Griffin:

Lebron's kind of a dick.

Travis:

Griffin:

Sure.

Justin:

Yeah, they think he's the best.

Griffin:

Did you move down to Miami, Travis?

Travis:

Um.

Griffin:

Did you get down there?

Travis:

Griffin:

Okay, so you're a world resident?

Travis:

Except Northern, Oklahoma. Represent.

Griffin:

Um.

Justin:

So I guess that answered. Yeah, I think we've pretty well addressed that one.

Travis:

Driven it right into the ground.

Justin:

BC Potter... Maybe that's what happened. Maybe they didn't lose their legs.

Travis:

[Laughs]

Justin:

Maybe they're just driven into the ground, waist deep. Who poured this cement here? Oh, Larry Bird.

Travis:

Larry Bird and Bugs Bunny.

Justin:

[Laughs] Just get into the shenanigans of Space Jam Two. We took LeBron and Kobe's legs. Get on Daffy's shoulders, stupid. BC Potter from Twitter writes, "My woman wants me to shave the old berry patch. Any suggestions to get the job done as clean as possible?" What's going on in her scene that she wants you to be clean shaven down there? Because you think you're going to do it once, you're setting yourself up for a hobby. Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

One side looks like, one side looks like a man's penis. The other side looks like a baby's.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

Travis:

Justin:

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Travis:

Justin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Justin:

Griffin:

You do?

Justin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Justin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Justin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Griffin:

Michael.

Justin:

Michael, when you die are you going to be sad that you didn't understand wake boarding for a day, or are you going to be sad because you didn't get that spray, that ocean spray, in your face as you wake boarded your way down the coast?

Griffin:

Justin:

Justin:

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Travis:

Justin:

Tim, Tim McGraw said best.

Griffin:

Every fucking episode with this.

Justin:

Live like you were dying.

Griffin:

[singing] "You gotta get that seafoam, gonna spray it on your face!"

Justin:

[singing] "Your friend looks at you knowingly, you're sharing a sweet moment."

Travis:

Hey, you know what a good, a great moment for the end of this inspirational movie? Michael looks at Chaz and just kind of smiles and says, "Hey, you got a life mustache," and reaches up and wipes the spray off.

Griffin:

Justin:
