**Intro (Bob Ball):** The McElroy brothers are not experts, and their advice should never be followed. Travis insists he's a sexpert, but if there's a degree on his wall, I haven't seen it. Also, this show isn't for kids, which I mention only so the babies out there will know how cool they are for listening. What's up, you cool baby?

**Justin:** Hello, everybody, and welcome to *My Brother, My Brother and Me*, an advice show for the modern era. I'm your oldest brother, Justin McElroy.

**Travis:** I'm your middlest brother, Big Dog Travis Woof-woof Big Dog McElroy. Fuck.

**Griffin:** See, you lost it last – this is Griffin McElroy – you lost it last week, Travis. I don't know that you're going to be able to get back on that log.

**Travis:** I did it bad. I did a bad job. But I'm about to do a good job.

Griffin: Oh.

**Justin:** Feel like it doesn't.

Travis: Hey, listen. Here's what I need you guys to do this one time...

Griffin: Okay.

Travis: ...just like...

**Griffin:** Get onboard?

**Travis:** Get onboard the game, 'cause it's a good game that I've invented.

**Griffin:** Okay. Just don't st— just start now.

**Travis:** Okay. So here's how it works. I started following this Twitter account that is "SNL hosts intro."

Griffin: Okay.

**Travis:** And it's SNL, like, you know, the performer guest introing the musical guest for the week.

Griffin: Right.

**Travis:** So, I'm gonna tell you guys the combination of the performer introing the musical guest, and I want you guys to take a guess at how good they are at selling that they're excited to be introing that musical guest.

Justin: Okay...

Griffin: Are you going to play the audio of it?

**Travis:** Yes. Justin, I am going to send you the links now for the various videos.

Justin: Okay.

**Travis:** Up first: now, I want you to think, "What do I know about these two people?" right? And I think that this is gonna be an easy one to ease us in, right?

Courteney Cox... introducing Dave Matthews Band.

Griffin: This is important. Courteney Cox, or Courteney Cox-Arquette?

**Travis:** This is Courteney Cox.

**Griffin:** Okay, okay. The original.

**Justin:** Okay, I think she's gonna be like... this— I think we're guessing the tone, right?

Travis: Yes, yes, yes.

Justin: Like, "Excited for you at your bachelorette party."

**Griffin:** All I know is that she's going to absolutely scream the name "Dave Matthews Band."

**Justin:** Okay, see, I don't think that— here's what I'm predicting. I'm predicting like, "I'm exci— I got this for you as a bachelorette party present."

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** "I know this is your favorite band. I'm not that excited to see them, but like, here they are. I got them. I booked them."

Griffin: Right, okay. Let's hear it.

Travis: Let's listen.

**Courteney:** Ladies and gentlemen, Dave Matthews Band!

Griffin: Not even a little bit.

**Justin:** Not that level of excitement, not any level of excitement.

**Griffin:** It's like she's introducing the speaker for like an off, off, off, off, off-Broadway TED Talk. It's nothing for her.

Justin: A different Dave Matthews Band...

Travis: Yes.

**Justin:** ...was originally gonna do it, and this bad new David Matthews band—

**Griffin:** Sh— she met Dave Matthews Band backstage, and did not care for them.

**Justin:** [laughs] They dropped a big jar of relish on her shirt, and she's still thinking about it.

**Griffin:** This is shortly after they pooped on a boat, and so she's like, "I don't want to be associated with them necessarily."

**Justin:** [laughs] Okay.

**Travis:** Okay. Up next: Ben Affleck introducing Nelly.

**Justin:** Okay. He ha— Ben Affleck knows how important it is that he be fully, fully enthused for announcing Nelly. He understands the optics. He's going to be very excited, like he just watched into "the club" and saw Nelly performing.

**Griffin:** I think he's going to have the energy of somebody introducing, like, the poet Laureate. Like, a seriousness, like, "It's time for you all to experience Nelly."

**Travis:** Let's take a listen.

Ben: Ladies and gentlemen, Nelly, featuring Jaheim.

**Justin:** Oh, wow.

Griffin: Yeah, that's...

**Justin:** [laughs] I whiffed it.

Ben: Ladies and gentlemen, Nelly, featuring Jaheim.

**Justin:** [laughs] I whiffed completely. I whiffed it as bad as Ben Affleck whiffed it.

**Travis:** I think Griffin kind of nailed it, actually.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: Like, "Brace yourselves. It's Nelly, featuring Jaheim."

Griffin: "It's time for the honored guest."

Justin: [laughs] Oh, Ben... [laughs] Ben.

**Griffin:** Justin, you want to take a swing at like, a good way to introduce Nelly?

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: Yeah. Is it Jaheim?

Griffin: Nelly featuring Jaheim.

Travis: Jaheim, yes.

**Justin:** Featuring Jaheim, obviously. [presenter voice] Ladies and gentlemen, give it up for Nelly, featuring Jaheim!

**Travis:** Ooh, that was good!

**Griffin:** That's pretty good. That's pretty good. I mean, you've legally have to say, "Ladies and gentlemen," even though folks don't necessarily rock like that anymore, but that's—[crosstalk] needs that.

**Justin:** Yeah, but the— yeah, I understand the difference, but this is...

**Griffin:** It's SNL, baby. It's a big show.

**Justin:** It's the old time. The old ways. [laughs]

**Griffin:** The old time. Good time show.

**Travis:** This one I'm excited to introduce to you, because of the combination of these three people. Paul Giamatti introducing Ludacris, featuring Sum 41.

**Justin:** Holy shit.

**Griffin:** Stoked out of his fucking mind.

Justin: Shit.

Griffin: Stoked out of his gourd.

**Justin:** If they had an orgy at the end of that, our podcast would be the baby.

**Griffin:** He's gonna be so excited that the energy might come off as aggressive.

Justin: Okay.

**Griffin:** Like, he's so angry and happy to be announcing these two.

**Justin:** This is my— this is my— okay, my prediction for this one – and I don't know why I feel this way – but I feel like Paul Giamatti is bringing, like, corporate gig energy. Like...

Travis: Oh.

**Justin:** He had, like... you know, "I used to be big into wine, but ever since I tried a Miller Light Seltzers Platinum...

Griffin: Right.

**Justin:** ...you know, that kind of deal.

Travis: Let's take a listen.

Paul: [excited] Ladies and gentlemen, Ludacris, featuring Sum 41!

**Griffin:** Yeah, man!

Paul: [excited] Ladies and gentlemen, Ludacris, featuring Sum 41!

**Griffin:** That's how you do it, actually.

**Justin:** Yeah, that's actually bringing it.

**Griffin:** That's actually the best tone. Yeah, that's good. I've— I suspected a bit of frenzy would slip into his voice, but that was just like, "Let's get this place fucking ro—"

Travis: Right.

**Griffin:** Like, he improved their performance by getting the crowd psyched and into it.

**Justin:** Like, maybe they weren't psyched to do it, but then it was sort of like, "You know what? We should give them the best show."

Travis: Yeah!

Justin: "We should try our absolute hardest."

**Griffin:** And then he went— and then he goes and stands in front of the stage, like a foot away from them, and just like, nods his head like, vigorously. Like, he's so—

**Travis:** And he's conducting a little bit—

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis:** And they're like, "Why is he conducting Ludacris, featuring Sum 41?"

**Griffin:** And he's like, "This isn't my usual thing, but these guys can really wail!"

**Justin:** [bursts out laughing]

**Griffin:** Like, bruise on it.

**Justin:** This— like the— this feels like before he went out, right? He was like, "I don't know who any of these people are." And they had him like, turn on some headphones, and listen, "This is good, actually. I could get down to this."

**Griffin:** [laughs loudly]

**Justin:** "I think I get it. Okay. I'm ready."

**Travis:** Up next. Bernie Mac introducing Good Charlotte.

**Griffin:** Huh. I think if this is close to the end of sh— this is actually important information. Is this the first music act or the second music act? I—

**Travis:** I don't believe any of these are second music.

Griffin: Okay.

**Travis:** Because none of them contained, like, "Once again," or "Welcome back," or any kind of reference to it.

**Griffin:** Yeah, that's a good point, that's a good point. 'Cause the second one is always, always gonna be: "[flatly] Everyone, Good Charlotte." Like, they've left it all out on the court by that point.

Um, I'm- b- like, bemusement.

Travis: Mm.

**Griffin:** He believes that there— he says, "There are people who like this music. It's not my favorite music, but I recognize the—"

**Justin:** I actually completely agree with that energy. He's not, like, pumped about it, because he knows that you're gonna read that as phony.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** But he's, like— he's happy for you.

**Griffin:** He's pleased for you.

Justin: Yeah.

Travis: Let's take a listen.

Bernie: [rushed] Ladies and gentlemen, Good Charlotte.

Griffin: Nope.

Justin: [bursts out laughing]

Bernie: [rushed] Ladies and gentlemen, Good Charlotte.

Justin: Okay.

**Griffin:** Yeah, no, he's— he was eating a big meatball sub backstage, and you're like, "Hey, you have to go introduce Good Charlotte."

And he was like, "Okay."

Justin: "Okay."

**Griffin:** And he walked out there, and said, "It's Good Charlotte," and then walked back. And within 10 seconds, he had that sandwich right back in his mouth. God bless him.

**Travis:** Now, these next two, I would actually rather not guess beforehand. Let's just listen and discuss them afterwards.

Griffin: Okay.

**Travis:** This is Phil Hartman introducing Bush.

Griffin: Wow.

Justin: Wow.

Griffin: Okay!

**Phil:** [flatly] Ladies and gentlemen, Bush.

Justin: [wheezing laughter]

Griffin: Woah.

**Phil:** [flatly] Bush.

Justin: Oh, man.

**Griffin:** It's like— it's like he thinks that the band is going to spray a neurotoxin into the stu— into the studio...

Justin: Yes.

**Travis:** Justin can also see the video that I have. Justin, can you describe the...

**Justin:** He's looking directly at you like he's a James Bond villain, and you're James Bond. And he's like— he's just found out that your secret weakness is Bush.

**Griffin:** Yeah. Isn't it, though?

**Justin:** And he's like, "Oh, you di—" You know, well... Yeah, it's a v it's like, levels of intensity that I can't quite communicate to you.

Griffin: Do you have the year that Phil Hartman introduced Bush?

**Travis:** No, I don't know the dates.

**Griffin:** That was 1996.

Travis: Okay. Is that good?

Justin: Is that good, or bad? How do you feel about that?

**Griffin:** Things were not great for Phil Hartman in 1996, so he may have just been going through some stuff. He was going through a time.

**Travis:** Up next: Nathan Lane introducing Metallica. And just play it.

Griffin: No!

**Justin:** No, really?

Travis: Yup.

Justin: This happened?

Travis: Uh-huh!

Nathan: [enthusiastic] Ladies and gentlemen, Metallica!

**Justin:** That's what I'm talking about! That's it.

Griffin: Yeah, Nathan! Yeah, Nathan!

Nathan: [enthusiastic] Metallica!

Justin: Thank you for coming to the show, Nathan.

**Griffin:** Thank you, Nathan.

**Travis:** That is how it is done.

- **Justin:** You fucking consummate performer.
- **Travis:** Everyone, take notes.

**Justin:** Take notes from Nathan Lane.

**Travis:** I don't know if Nathan Lane has ever listened to a Metallica song in his life, but that is like, a dad like, introing his kid— like, I—

**Justin:** He's driving you, and he just picked up Brady, and then he opens the sliding door on the Odyssey, and he's like, "Brady, are you ready to go to Detroit to see Metallica?"

**Griffin:** [laughs]

Travis: Right?

**Griffin:** Listen, as long as we're sort of diving into the psyche of the hosts of this show, 1997 was when this episode came out, around the same time that Nate Lane was in a little film called *Mouse Hunt*!

Travis: [laughs]

**Griffin:** He was rolling in the deep piles of *Mouse Hunt* money.

**Travis:** [crosstalk], too.

**Griffin:** Yeah, he could be—he could be introducing anybody. He could be, "Ladies and gentlemen, [forced, gravely] Alanis Morissette!" Like, he would still put that stink on it.

Nathan: Ladies and gentlemen, Metallica!

Griffin: Jesus.

Travis: I love it!

**Griffin:** If we— the next time we play in New York, could we pull strings to get Nathan Lane to introduce us in that exact...

**Travis:** Oh, my God.

**Griffin:** ...in that exact way.

Justin: God. I mean...

**Travis:** That would be incredible.

**Justin:** I don't think I have a connection there, but I - I hope so. Whatever. I just gotta say, what a pro.

**Travis:** What a pro. Okay, one last one.

**Justin:** [laughs] Oh, no.

**Travis:** This is the greatest one I've ever seen.

Griffin: It's not Adrien Brody, is it?

Travis: No. God, no.

**Justin:** Not allowed to play Adrien Brody, but like if you've never seen that one...

**Griffin:** It sucks the moon out of the sky.

**Travis:** Okay. Here it is. Daniel Craig introducing The Weeknd. And, now, don't play it yet. How do you think this one goes?

Griffin: Hm.

**Justin:** I messed up and loaded it, I can see the video portion of this. Um...

**Travis:** Okay, well then let Griffin guess first.

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin:** I think he is... overjoyed.

Travis: Okay. Okay. Justin, go ahead and play it.

Daniel: [formally] Ladies and gentlemen, The Weeknd.

Justin: [wheezes]

**Griffin:** [laughs loudly]

**Travis:** And once again, Justin can see the video.

Daniel: The Weeknd.

Justin: it's like he can't believe someone is named "The Weeknd."

**Travis:** Yes. My theory— and Griffin, now I'm gonna send it to you, 'cause you gotta see it.

#### Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis:** My theory is that, just before he went out, somebody told him the name...

**Justin:** [soft wheezing laughter]

**Travis:** ...and he believed that he was introducing the actual, like, concept of the weekend.

Griffin: Yes.

Travis: That he was like, "The Weeknd." I don't know!

**Griffin:** There's a shrug that goes with it, and he shakes his head, like, "The Weeknd?"

Travis: The Weeknd.

**Griffin:** Maybe if he put a question mark in it, it would have been a lot more powerful.

**Justin:** This is worth—it's worth noting, this— this— a lot of the— the other ones have been from an account that's full of these sorts of things, like host introducing. This is an account that is called "Craig Weekend..."

Griffin: Mm-hm.

**Justin:** That has 517,000 followers, and they just tweet this every weekend.

Travis: Yup. 'Cause he introduces the weekend!

Griffin: [laughs] That's fun.

**Justin:** That is fun. That's a good game, Trav. Thanks, I enjoyed that trip down memory lane. I always love that juxtaposition of performer... and... host. Um, do you think there is any thought to how that will go?

**Travis:** No, not at all.

Griffin: After Adrien Brody, there probably is.

**Justin:** Yeah, probably is a little bit.

**Griffin:** A script that you read.

**Travis:** What's interesting to me is the top part of constructing that game was trying to find any video where the host seemed enthusiastic.

Griffin: Mm-hm.

**Travis:** And it was Nathan Lane [laughs] and that's it! Everybody else seems ranged between, like, "I don't know" and like, "I know it's weird that I'm saying it too!" Yes!

**Justin:** It was a pretty good bit one time where Harvey Keitel was the host, and Madonna was the musical act, and he said, like, "I was so excited when I got here, and I just had this realization that wow, I have a much more enthusiastic gay following than I realized."

Travis: [laughs]

**Justin:** 'Cause Madonna's there. It's good.

Um, okay, so... this is an advice show.

Travis: Obviously.

**Justin:** Okay. Like, enough said, right? So what we do on this show is you send us your questions. I'm gonna set it up.

Travis: Ooh.

Griffin: Okay...

**Justin:** Here's the deal. Okay. When you send us your questions, mbmbam@maximumfun.org. And we will answer your questions. If you need advice, we will help you. Where there will be other skits...

**Travis:** Skits and bits, I would say.

**Justin:** There'll be skits— actually, there's no bits scheduled for this one.

Travis: I just did kind of a bit.

Justin: Okay, that's more of a skit.

Travis: Oh, did it? Okay, that's fair. Yeah, yeah, yeah.

**Justin:** Uh, but uh, let's get into it. Let's help people. I wanna try to help more people than we have been helping, because I feel like that's our real legacy.

**Griffin:** Well, spending 11 minutes talking about SNL introductions is a bad way to start.

Travis: Fair, fair, fair, fair, fair.

**Justin:** Hey, hey, it's been 17 minutes. "I told my boss that I have jury duty on Monday, which I normally have off. I gave the correct date, but the wrong day. It turns out my jury duty is on Tuesday, and I'll subsequently need that day off. A game that I'm openly a fan of is releasing on Tuesday. I don't want her to suspect that I'm trying to fake jury duty and actually taking off for video games. How do I break it to her that I got the day wrong without seeming suspicious?" That's from Misremembered in Missouri.

## Griffin: Mm.

**Travis:** I think that this might be, like, a quantum mechanics problem, by which I mean—

Justin: You don't understand it.

**Travis:** That I don't understand it. No, the very fact that you have— I don't think your boss would have thought this, but now that you're worried about it, you have caused – through observation – this thing to change. Right?

Griffin: Mm.

**Travis:** Because now, whatever energy you're going to bring to like, "I got the day wrong, and it's Tuesday," will have an undercurrent of, "I hope they don't think this is about me playing a video game." And they'll be able to [whispers] smell it on you.

**Justin:** Okay, a couple of good options. What's the game, first off? We gotta—

Griffin: Yeah, I was looking through recent game releases.

**Justin:** I mean, is it COD?

Griffin: I don't kno— it might be COD. They might need those—

**Travis:** Well, this is new question. Come on.

**Justin:** Gotta be a franchise, 'cause why would you be— I was about to say, "Why would you be a fan of a new game that hasn't released yet?" but people do that all the time, it seems, enough to yell at people on the internet about it, so...

Travis: Yeah! Let's see.

**Justin:** Uh, let's assume it's Call of Duty, 'cause I— I can't be bothered.

Griffin: And we all love it.

**Justin:** We all love— zero problems with it.

**Travis:** I love how serious it is and, like, not fun.

**Justin:** Well, it's really cool. So— okay, here's my options. One: loudly, like, start— get a video game magazine from the newsstand...

Travis: Uh-huh.

Griffin: Yes.

**Justin:** And just be like, [sighs heavily] "I can't believe this! This new Call of Duty stinks! They said you shouldn't even get it."

Griffin: Yes.

**Justin:** That's one way to try to decrease. But like, I wouldn't do that. Here's what I'd do.

**Griffin:** Why'd you even – why'd you even say it?

**Justin:** Because this next one's a little more treacherous.

Travis: But then— but Justin, why even introduce such a shitty idea?

**Justin:** Because this next one is treacherous.

Travis: Oh.

**Justin:** And I need to say that you should definitely do the first one before I mention that you should definitely do the second one.

Travis: Okay.

**Justin:** Hire someone to come in and intimidate you.

Griffin: Woah.

Travis: Wait, what?

**Justin:** At your place of business.

**Griffin:** Awesome!

**Justin:** Hire someone to come in and intimidate you. Be like, you know, "You know, I heard that you— you know, Paul Calcutta is a good guy, and I think you would never run a red light, don't you think, Mr. Guy who loves having all his teeth?"

Travis: Ooh.

**Justin:** And he cracks his knuckles like... [knuckle cracks] "That's what Paul Calcutta means to me. Wink."

**Travis:** What does Paul Calcutta mean to you? [laughs]

**Justin:** When you think— when you hear the name Paul Calcutta, what do you think? Do you think innocence? Me too.

Travis: Yeah, me too.

**Griffin:** Well, the—[sighs] the juror wouldn't know the name, I think, right? I've never had jury duty, so I don't know.

Travis: Well, he does now!

**Justin:** You're gonna have to fake it. A lot of—[laughs] a lot of it's gonna be staged.

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin:** So they're not gonna have any way of checking up on Paul Calcutta, and his case, and if his name is Paul Calcutta, or any of that.

**Travis:** Okay, wait. One step further, Justin. And then-

Justin: One step further than that?! We're already in felony territory!

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis:** And then the intimidating person says, "So if I was you, I'd just say home and play your little video game—"

**Justin:** [bursts out laughing]

**Travis:** Wait, no, hear me out. Hear me out. And then question asker goes, "No!"

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis:** "As much as I love that video game, I love justice more. I will not be intimidated. Paul Calcutta's going down!"

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: That's awesome.

Travis: And then your boss is like-

Justin: "Call his dad!"

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin:** "Call Paul Calcutta's dad on the phone and let me tell him to say his goodbyes."

**Travis:** You know what, I'll call him.

**Justin:** I'll call him. Give me Paul Calcutta's dad's phone number.

**Travis:** "I just wanted to check to make sure that um, I prepaid for that video game so I could pick it up before jury duty. Okay, I'll talk to you. Thank you. [louder] Yeah, I told his dad what's up! I said, "Fuck you, Mr. Calcutta."

**Justin:** Now, here— here's another thing I will say. There is a way that, you know, porque no los dos.

Travis: Oh?

**Justin:** Like, if you go to jury duty Tuesday morning, and you're like, [laughs] "This man's guilty! Don't even let him open his mouth!"

**Griffin:** [growing laughter]

**Justin:** "Everybody, we can all see it, right? We know this man's guilty. Throw the proverbial book at him. Five years. Yeah, sounds good. Okay. Well, it's a good day, everybody. Good jurying. I gotta get— I gotta get home, the download's almost created, and I'm gonna crank it out."

Travis: "It's fine. I got Steam Link. It's totally cool."

Griffin: It's fine. Do it-

Justin: "Start over... trial— start over. [laughs] I got Steam Link."

**Griffin:** "Hey, anyone else think this guy's got big stabbing energy? I do!"

Travis: "He's covered in blood!"

"What are you talking about?"

"Oh, you can't see it?"

**Griffin:** "Judge, do a guilty. Do a guilty now, Judge. You can just say it; we can all go home, play Call of Duty."

"Oh, fuck yeah, is that out today?"

Travis: "Yeah, it's out today."

Justin: "It's out today."

"I hold myself in contempt!"

Travis: "We haven't star— what— we haven't started yet."

"What? You can't handle the truth! I'm leaving!

"You can't leave. You can't go."

Griffin: "Someone fingerprint the Judge..."

Travis: [laughs] "He's got suspicious eyes."

Griffin: "He's got big stabber energy."

Justin: "If I don't touch the evidence, how do I know it's not hologram?"

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** "Hey, could it have been the Riddler? I said 'riddle' and we all thought it, didn't we?"

Travis: "Hey, how do you know I'm not a judge, huh?"

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: "Guilty! Prove I'm not."

**Justin:** "We didn't vote on who the judge would be."

**Travis:** "Can I be the bailiff this time? I'm not sure what he does, but I always liked Bull on Night Court!"

**Griffin:** Uh-huh. Sometimes during your interview to see if you're a suitable juror, just stand up and produce a knife from your pocket and stab it into the table, like in *12 Angry Men*.

Travis: Yeah!

Griffin: And they're like, "That's nothing right now."

You're like, "Oh, sorry." And then you do it like five minutes later, like, "Shit, you gotta tell me when it's time for me to stab my little knife into the table."

**Travis:** Oh, and keep trying to introduce evidence to the case. [laughs] "I wanna introduce—"

"That's a Subway coupon with like six punches out of it."

"Exactly! I think we all know what this means; I only need four more punches until I get a free footlong. Interesting, isn't it? What a coincidence."

**Justin:** Uh, how about another question?

Griffin: Yeah, sure.

**Justin:** "I don't have a dog, but I love dogs. When I see them out and about, I wave at them, only to get an uncomfortable wave from their owner. How can I wave from just the dog without getting weird looks from humans?" That's from Incidental Dog Walker Stalker in Denver.

**Griffin:** [singing] You cannot! You can't do this thing.

Travis: Yeah, you gotta wink.

**Griffin:** No, not that either, actually.

**Travis:** Well, 'cause the wave is too big, but you can do like a "Hey, we're in this together," wink, you know, kind of little thing. It's what I used to do when I worked at PetSmart, and I'd see a dog, and like, I didn't want to talk to the owner, but I wanted the dog to know that I was glad they were there.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: Little wink. Wink!

Justin: Did they pound it?

Travis: You can-

**Griffin:** They can go to the pound.

**Justin:** Oh, come on.

**Travis:** That's prison for dogs. That's prison.

**Griffin:** The thing about the wave or the wink – the wink is nothing, but the problem with the wave is that's a human greeting.

**Travis:** Oh, fair, yeah.

**Griffin:** If you wanna smell— well, you can't smell the butt, unless you're like, *really* sneaky. Like, and I'm talking Sam Fisher, very ninja sneaky.

Travis: Okay.

**Griffin:** Um, can you smell the dog's butt from far away, and let the dog know it? You know what I mean?

**Travis:** Oh, like, just a sign of just like— like a wave is kind of like a long-distance high-five when you think about it, so you kind of sniff like it was a butt, and they're like, "Oh, I got it."

**Griffin:** That's— but the problem with that is it's very gross.

Travis: This is true.

Justin: Mm.

**Travis:** Maybe when you wave and the human waves back, say, "That wasn't for you!"

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: "It was for him."

**Griffin:** You know, it's kind of a power move to have a dog treat. And then you're like, "Oh, hey, I just happen to have this dog treat in my pocket. Can I give it to your dog?"

And at that point, the dog is like, "Hey, if you say no to this, I'll eat you in your sleep."

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin:** And so then you're— I'm out. I will— I'm now this person's dog. it is that quick. It is that easy, Jeremy. Do you see?

**Travis:** This can happen like that, Jeremy. All these years spent together? Over!

**Justin:** Down the toilet.

**Griffin:** I forget what bacon strips taste like, Jeremy. So just think about that. Um...

**Travis:** I remember how you gave me some sort of pill this morning. They would never do that, Jeremy.

**Griffin:** They would never give you medicine.

**Travis:** They'd give me bacon strips.

Griffin: Um, alright. Asked and answered, I feel like.

Justin: Yeah, I hope that helped.

Griffin: Um...

Travis: Just throw 'em a wink.

**Griffin:** Do you wanna do another question? I do have a phone line that connects me directly to the Clouds where the Wizard lives.

Justin: Um, yeah, let's do that before the Money Zone. Why not?

**Griffin:** A lot of people sent this one in. it's on WikiHow, and I guess nobody wrote it? It doesn't have anything. Um...

Travis: Did I write it?

Griffin: You may have written it.

Travis: I mean, if no one's gonna claim it, I'll claim it.

**Griffin:** This is how to get rid of a nickname. And it's awesome.

Justin: Ooh.

Griffin: Yeah, people develop nicknames-

Travis: How to get rid of a nickname?

**Griffin:** Yeah, I hate my nickname and I want a new one. Well, good news. This article's gonna tell you exactly that. Um, so we're gonna start with part one: challenging the nickname.

Travis: Woah.

**Griffin:** There's a picture here of a person walking, and they're wearing cargo shorts and a hip sort of, rugby shirt. And um, they look a lot like Zack Morris.

## Justin: Feels like it has, though, doesn't it?

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin:** It takes their power away. No, not if you do pretend good enough. "If bullies call you a name, show them you're not intimidated or scared by looking them in the eyes, laughing, and just walking away without looking back. Or you could say something like, 'Here we go again, this is boring,' or 'Why are you talking to me?'"

## Travis: Ooh!

**Griffin:** I like that last one a lot, actually, but then the next one is, "I don't know why you keep calling me that, but it's boring, and I don't care."

Methinks the Zack Attack do protest too much.

**Travis:** Yeah, that one might not have the power you were hoping for there...

# Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis:** ...of "This is boring? What do you— this isn't for *you*. Wait, hold on, Zack Attack. Did you think I was calling you Zack Attack for your entertainment? Because it's for *my* entertainment. Was that not clear how this transaction was playing out? Oh, let me explain, Zack Attack. I'm a bully."

Griffin: "I hate you."

Justin: [laughs] "Yeah."

Griffin: Right.

**Travis:** Yes. "Because I am a very small person in my heart, and so I need to feel big by making you feel bad, and now that you've engaged with me and said that it makes you feel bored, that's actually a negative thing, so I'm fine with that, actually. So..."

**Justin:** Yeah. "Any sort of thing that I can do to sort of steal your shine."

**Travis:** Yeah, that would be amazing.

Justin: "I'm a hater!"

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** "What don't you get, bud? I'm a hater! I drink Haterade! I love it! I live for it!"

**Travis:** "I'm gonna kick you in the butt. And I don't care if you like that either, Zack! Oh, sorry, wait. That felt good. Wait, Zack?"

**Griffin:** "Zack? Kicking me in the butt? So boring. Why don't you leave?"

Travis: "Why are you kicking me in the butt?"

Griffin: "Why don't you go away from me, stinker?"

"Introduce yourself at the start. Just introduce yourself casually, by saying, 'Hey, everyone, I'm Jill.'" I don't know that I've introduced myself in a while. Not because I'm big shit, but also that I don't, um...

**Justin:** Meet people.

Griffin: Meet people, and so when I-

**Travis:** Well, that's why— yeah.

Travis: Was.

**Justin:** An expectation setter.

**Griffin:** Yes, exactly.

**Travis:** So that's interesting, 'cause I was going to suggest a Harold, which I think I've suggested quite often on this show.

**Griffin:** A few times.

**Travis:** But it would be nice to just have somebody, like, as like a no-like a human autocorrect. That when someone's like—

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: "Hey, Bobby!"

And they just go, "It's Bob."

**Griffin:** That's good! Maybe you could get a Cameo from Paul Giamatti just saying, "Hey, everyone, here's Griffin!"

And then you can, like, you know, hack into the speaker system of any party you're at, and just play that as you walk in. that's good.

**Travis:** Ooh, get a Cameo from Nathan Lane that's like, "He's only going by Griffin!"

And then, like, you can play that any time someone's like, "What's up, Griffy?"

And you're like, "Mm, hold on. Let me pull out this Cameo."

**Griffin:** "Mm, hold on, wait a second. I have a very important Cameo from Nathan Lane I have to show you."

Justin: [laughs]

**Griffin:** Uh, an also, last thing, "Remember that nicknames don't last forever."

Travis: Well...

**Griffin:** And there's a picture of a woman saying, "Little Zacky!" to a little boy, and then as a grown-up, she's like, "Zachary." It's all she says, is "Zachary," and then there's a period. And she looks pretty serious. So like— but Zachary is smiling, so it looks like his older mother is saying, "Zachary, I need to talk to you." It was something along those lines.

Justin: "I'm Zachary, I'm happy to present, Bush."

**Griffin:** [laughs]

Justin: "I'm Zachary, here is Bush."

**Travis:** Can we just say that saying, "Nicknames don't last forever" is, uh, a complete lie? 'Cause there are many, like, people throughout history, it's like— Stonewall Jackson! I got no idea what that dude's first name is!

Griffin: I know. I know.

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin:** Yep. You could— there's so many— there's war heroes out there that you walk around, and they were like in World War I or whatever, and it's like, "Tell me the story, Grandpa, about your friend."

"Oh, you mean Big Boner Joe?" Like, 'cause that's what they called them out there. It was rough in the trenches.

**Travis:** Here's the problem: I'm getting confused by the Count Donut lore, because I can't tell if he dies in you, like a Jekyll and Hyde thing, or if you're—

**Justin:** His body dies temporarily, by which I mean his soul is sent to hell.

Travis: Uh-huh. Woah, wait, what?

Justin: I control his body—

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** Spoiler and then control his body to uh, bring you the latest donut news...

Travis: Okay.

**Justin:** And then I evacuating back into the night, or in this case the 11:15 AM.

**Travis:** But I really like— listen, Count Donut, I enjoy your presence, but I did not realize it came with the cost of my older brother being temporarily in hell.

**Griffin:** Yeah, hell sucks, dude.

Travis: What?

**Justin:** [gurgling gibberish]

Travis: Okay.

Griffin: [bursts out laughing]

**Justin:** [laughs] Krispy Kreme has announced it: Halloween is over, and on Justin's birthday—

Travis: Also Travis's.

Justin: November— a very special day to Justin.

Travis: It's also mine.

**Justin:** Krispy Kreme announced their Thanksgiving donut collection.

Travis: What?

Travis: [makes disgusted noises]

Travis: Oh, boy.

**Griffin:** W— why?

**Justin:** "And nearly half are planning to attend more Thanksgiving celebrations than they did before the COVID-19 pandemic."

Travis: What?!

**Justin:** Yes! Good! Hooray, says Krispy Kreme! People are doing a worse job than they did before! They're giving even more nasty than they did before COVID was a thing. Just pack them in like sardines and cranberry sauce their nuts off. Fantastic, I love this. I love suffering.

Travis: You do?

**Justin:** "—a way to share your gratitude with others in the most delicious way possible, because nothing says 'Thank you for having me to Thanksgiving' like a box of donuts you bought the day before Thanksgiving." 'Cause there's no way they're open!

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** "According to a new survey, even during this cooking and baking-filled holiday..."

Travis: Uh-huh?

**Justin:** "56 percent of consumers plan to spend less traditional time in the kitchen..."

Travis: Okay.

**Justin:** "...in order to spend overdue time with missed family and friends."

**Griffin:** That is a wild sentiment.

**Justin:** That's a wild stat, isn't it? I wish Justin was here to talk about this, because that's a truly wild statis— I don't know how I'm supposed to gain— literally, I feel like I understand everything less than I did before I read that statistic. No insight has been important to me.

- **Griffin:** Okay.
- **Travis:** Take another run up at it.
- Justin: [gasps]
- Travis: Hey, Justin.
- **Griffin:** Hey, Juice, how was hell this time, bud?
- Justin: Yeah, it was fine.
- **Griffin:** Did you see anyone cool?

Justin: No. [wheezes, laughs]

Travis: Okay!

Griffin: Alright. Okay.

**Justin:** I don't like this bit. I can't come up with a good joke above it.

Griffin: Yeah. Tell me what's inside of hell.

**Travis:** You literally could have said anyone's name, and that would've been fine. "Who did you see down there?"

"Anyone." And it's-

Griffin: Anyone. Any bad-

Justin: Alright, I'm gonna do a real joke. [gasps]

Griffin: Hey, Juice, how was hell? Did you see anyone cool down there?

Justin: Cryptkeeper.

Travis: See? Good!

**Griffin:** Cryptkeeper was in hell! That's interesting. 'Cause he's done stories for us... here on Earth.

**Travis:** Is he inherently bad? I never thought of him as, like, the antagonist.

Justin: You look at him, you know he's bad! He's died and gone to hell!

**Travis:** Excuse me, what? You look at him and you know he's bad, Justin?

Justin: Canonically. Canonically, yes.

Travis: Mm.

**Justin:** Why does he know all these scary stories? You don't tell stories like that to good people. You tell them to evil people that are going to real Christian hell.

**Travis:** One of them's from his mee-maw.

Justin: Mee-maw's in hell, too.

Travis: What?!

Justin: Hey, thanks for listening to-

Travis: No, not Judith Keeper!

**Justin:** [bursts out laughing] She was so active at the DAR at her church!

Travis: She did so much for the community!

Justin: [through laughter] Thanks for listening—

Travis: What was her secret advice, Justin?

Justin: What?

**Griffin:** Last time you were in hell, you said you saw Limbaugh, but I was like, "You were only in hell for a minute, dude. There's no way, of all the people down there, that you saw a big— a big one like that. Statistically, there's no way."

**Travis:** And now you're telling me you saw Crypt and Judith Keeper? Were they together?

Travis: Oh, no!

**Justin:** They didn't know each other were down there, because they couldn't recognize each other down there.

**Griffin:** Aw, man.

Travis: Don't they look the same?

Justin: Cryptkeeper and Judith Keeper.
