## MBMBaM 587: How Travis Got His Woof Back

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**Intro (Bob Ball):** The McElroy Brothers are not experts and their advice should never be followed. Travis insists he's a sexpert, but if there's a degree on his wall, I haven't seen it. Also this show isn't for kids, which I mention only so the babies out there will know how cool they are for listening. What's up, you cool baby?

[theme music, "My Life (Is Better With You)!" by Montaigne plays]

**Justin:** Hello everybody and welcome to *My Brother, My Brother & Me,* an advice show for the modern era. I'm your oldest brother, Justin McElroy.

**Travis:** I'm your middlest brother, Travis, Big Dog! Woof woof! McElroy.

**Griffin:** He's back. He's back on that horse. Good job, Trav. This is Griffin McElroy, the youngest one of them.

**Travis:** Guys, we've gotta watch, I'm really excited. Big budget rom-com movies are back.

**Justin:** They're back.

Griffin: It's back.

**Travis:** Coming Valentine's Day 2022—

**Justin:** Like, if I could say, just like movies for adults, you know what I

mean?

**Travis & Griffin:** [simultaneously] Yeah.

**Griffin:** Yes, finally.

**Travis:** Adult films.

**Justin:** Finally, adult films.

Griffin: Not... kid shit.

**Travis:** Are back. They're back.

**Griffin:** When?

Travis: Marry Me, starring Jennifer Lopez, a.k.a. J-Lo, and Owen Wilson,

a.k.a. O-Wil, and I'm so excited.

**Justin:** The classic pairing.

Griffin: Yes.

**Travis:** Oh my god you guys, let me tell you. This is a by the book, right

down the line-

Justin: Thank you.

**Travis:** — classic story. Right.

Griffin: Uh-huh.

Travis: So here it is. J-Lo—

**Griffin:** Can I guess? Can I guess, actually?

Travis: Yeah. Yeah.

**Griffin:** Just based on the title, not knowing. Okay, *Marry Me*. Story of Jennifer Lopez and Owen Wilson. They are at a wedding venue in Vegas. Like, uh, a Cineplex of wedding venues, and they're getting married, but then they look across at the other venue, like across the hallway, and they see each other and they're like "Wanna switch?" And so they switch marrieds— This is starting to feel like a... Stanley Kubrick psycho-sexual...

**Travis:** Yeah, Griffin.

**Griffin:** Sort of experience.

**Travis:** In your version of this, are their partners also cool with this?

**Griffin:** Yeah, they love it.

**Travis:** Oh, okay.

Griffin: They're cool with it.

Travis: Nice.

**Griffin:** They definitely like it.

Justin: Hmm...

**Travis:** That's actually less, um, less than the actual *Marry Me* plot.

**Griffin:** Well then, but then Owen Wilson and J-Lo, they were originally gonna get married. They switched, and now they have to find their way back together.

Travis: Oh, okay.

**Griffin:** Right?

**Travis:** Oh, they were originally going to get married?

**Griffin:** Yeah, but then they have to go through two, very messy divorces, and that sort of legal battle is what occupies most of the runtime of the film. It's like *Kramer vs. Kramer vs. Kramer vs. Kramer vs. Kramer*, which is the alternate title for the film.

**Travis:** No, screenwriter John Rogers of *Leverage* and *Magicians* and a lot of other fame, wouldn't deliver such a, uh, let's say milquetoast plot as you've just outlined, Griffin.

Griffin: Okay...

**Travis:** The *Marry Me* plot—

**Griffin:** Um... Why not call this movie *Notting Thrill* instead?

Travis: 0000!

**Griffin:** Like, she leads this thrilling, you know, rockstar lifestyle, and then they get *Married At First Sight*, another real television show on the *Lifetime* network, thank you very much. For that gift. So like, this sounds like an exciting film but I've seen about 11 seasons of it.

**Travis:** Well, here's the thing, I assume that they haven't given everything away in the trailer, which is a very good trailer, by the way.

Griffin: Right.

**Travis:** So maybe there's, I don't know. There might be like a zombie attack of something in it, or something?

**Griffin:** Oh! Can I give you a different, just to spin it a little bit. Um, she looks out and sees someone in the audience, and she's like "Fuck it. Yeah, let's get married, you". And Owen Wilson's like "Yeah!" And he gets up on stage and she's like "No, not you!"

Travis: Ohh, twist.

Griffin: "The big, the big hunky boy right behind you."

**Travis:** And it's Vince Vaughn.

**Griffin:** And then who should walk— It is the [laughs] the hunkiest boy, Vince Vaughn.

**Justin:** Classic. Current movie heartthrob! [wheezes]

**Travis:** Yeah, and they're back together. Him and Owen Wilson. The dream team.

Griffin: Fuckin' Doctor Hardbody, Vince Vaughn.

Travis: [laughs]

**Griffin:** Um... And that's gonna be— But then Owen Wilson's so embarrassed. But there's another person in the audience that sees sad Owen Wilson onstage and is like "I'll marry you". And then we're getting closer back to the plot of my original pitch for *Marry Me*.

**Travis:** Can the person who is like "I'll marry you" be a bigger, like, more famous star than J-Lo?

**Griffin:** Or stronger, harder-bodied. Yeah.

**Travis:** Even stronger, harder body?

**Justin:** No-one's stronger or harder...

**Griffin:** Than Vince Vaughn, yeah.

**Travis:** Oh my god, you're right. Maybe it is also Vince Vaughn. It's Vince Vaughn's twin brother, Twince Vaughn.

Justin: No.

**Griffin:** Yeah?

**Justin:** Hey, real quick, I can up with a new bit. It's just called "Lightning... Round Impression Times".

**Travis:** Okay.

Griffin: Oh, of Owen Wilson?

**Justin:** No, yeah, it's like we all go round, we have to go in a circle, and anybody can call this at any point, right? But it's a lightning round.

Travis: Okay.

**Justin:** I'm only explaining the rules once. Okay?

Travis: Okay.

**Justin:** Lightning round.

Griffin: Okay.

Justin: You just call it, and then everybody has to immediately do their

impression of the person in order.

**Griffin:** Okay.

**Justin:** I called it, so I get to go last.

Travis: Oh, okay.

Justin: Griffin?

**Travis:** Who are you calling? Is it Owen Wilson or Vince Vaughn?

Justin: Owen Wilson.

**Griffin:** Can we— Let's start with a neutral Owen— Oh, okay. You want

me to start?

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin:** [slightly imitating Owen Wilson] "Oh, uh, oh me? I'm a Royal

Tenenbaum."

**Justin:** No, you're not even trying. Travis?

Travis: Alright, here's mine. [imitating Owen Wilson] "Oh, wow! It's me,

Owen Wilson. I'm marryin' J-Lo. This is so weird."

**Griffin:** Oh fuck, I was doing Luke Wilson in *Royal Tenenbaums*.

**Justin:** [laughs]

**Travis:** Oh, can you try again? Can you take another run at it?

**Griffin:** Yeah, okay.

**Justin:** [cackles loudly]

Griffin: Sure.

**Travis:** And then I'll do my Luke Wilson doing an Owen Wilson

impression, which I'm pretty proud of.

Griffin: Okay, okay. [imitating Owen Wilson] "Come on, Big Blue. It's old

school time."

**Travis:** That's pretty good. Here's mine.

Griffin: That was—fuck. I did Luke— I did fuckin' Luke again. What's

Owen Wilson look like? What's his deal?

**Travis:** He's the one with like the blonde hair.

**Griffin:** Ohhhhh, right. From *Bottle Rocket*.

**Travis:** Right right right right. Most well-known from *Bottle Rocket*.

Griffin: And, uh—

Justin: Okay, can I do one now?

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: Okay. [shouts] "Damnit, Dennis! Get off of my petunias!"

**Griffin:** That was pretty good.

**Travis:** No, that's Mr Wilson.

Justin: That's Mr Wilson. Okay.

Griffin: Okay.

**Justin:** That's Mr Wilson from [wheezes]—

**Travis:** "Please, Mr Wilson is my father. Call me Owen."

**Justin:** Let me try, let me try one more. I'm sorry.

**Griffin:** Okay. Yeah sure sure sure.

**Justin:** I'm so sorry. God, idiot. Stupid. "Well, Tim. I'll tell yah what yah

gotta do differently."

**Griffin:** No. Okay.

Travis: I don't—

**Justin:** "Is you have to love your wife, and your kids."

**Travis:** "Hey, Tim. Stop being a complete dipshit all the time."

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: Let me try one more? Real quick?

Travis: Okay.

Justin: Sure.

**Griffin:** And I promise I won't fuck this one up. [silent pause]

Justin: That's Wilson the bowling ball from—

**Griffin:** So that's Wilson from, yeah.

**Justin:** Castaway, thank you Griffin very much.

**Griffin:** [laughs loudly]

Travis: Uh-huh.

Justin: You know what, Griff?

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: I had it in my heart, and I didn't think it would land, so I thank

you for going there.

**Griffin:** Yeah.

**Justin:** Because it did put me in the headspace to scoop you up.

**Griffin:** Yeah, sure. Uh, who gets to pick the next one? This is fun. I like

it.

Travis: Now I—

Justin: No, that's it.

Griffin: Oh.

**Justin:** It's just if somebody comes up in conversation.

**Travis:** Oh, right right right.

**Griffin:** Right, okay.

**Justin:** Anybody can call it, whenever. 'Cause if like— I feel like if we're

gonna start referencing these people, we have to prove [laughs]

Travis: Our bona fides?

**Griffin:** Yeah, sure.

Justin: Yeah, some expertise.

**Travis:** Or else we're ju— Or else what are we even doing?

Justin: What are we doing here?

**Griffin:** Yeah, yeah.

**Justin:** Well, I'll tell yah what we're doing here, friends. It's an advice

show.

**Travis:** Really?

**Justin:** We help— Yes.

**Travis:** Okay.

**Justin:** We help you, the lipseners.

**Travis:** Okay.

**Justin:** We help you, the listeners.

**Griffin:** Yeah.

Justin: You know?

Travis: Do we?

**Justin:** We, the people.

Travis: Woah!

**Justin:** "Hey brothers, I live at the end of the hallway in my apartment building. Next to each door is a wall socket. Someone put one of those plug-in air fresheners next to my door, but no-one else's." [laughs]

Griffin: Aw, man.

**Justin:** I— Wait, hold on. "But no-one else's. I don't think my apartment

stinks." [wheezes]

Travis: Mmm...

**Justin:** "There's no trash or unkempt kitty litter or anything, and the hallway and building doesn't smell bad, so I'm at a loss here. Do I leave it, and have everyone think my apartment stinks? Do I remove it? Did the landlord put it there? Was it a rude tenant? Help me." That's from Putrid 'Partment in Portland. P.S., if it matters, thank you for this.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis:** Yeah, always.

Justin: Hey, thank you for this.

**Travis:** 'Cause you could've just kept that quietly to yourself and been worried about it, like, internally like "I don't know". But instead you chose to tell us, and tell the world. Thank you.

**Justin:** You need to pretend like we're the doctor and you're like "I do have this weird— When I move my arm like this, it makes me barf". You know what I mean?

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** And then you don't wanna leave the room like "Should I have told him about that one with the barfing thing?"

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Travis:** If you're gonna tell anyone about moving your arm and it making you barf, it should be a doctor. Just to be clear.

**Justin:** Yes. "If it matters, it's a generic flower smell."

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis:** Okay.

**Griffin:** You know what fucks this up for me?

Travis: What?

**Griffin:** Is— By the way, I remembered another Wilson impression. [singing "Hold On" by Wilson Phillips] "Some day somebody's gonna come around and make you wanna say goodbye."

Travis: Uh-huh.

Justin: Is that Wilson Wilson?

**Griffin:** That's Wilson Phillips.

Justin: Wilson Phillips.

Griffin: Wilson Wilson?

Justin: Wilson Wilson.

**Griffin:** Alright. So, um, what fucks this up for me is that they live at the

end of the hallway.

Travis: Uh-huh.

**Griffin:** If it was the middle of the hallway, you could say "Oh, they just placed it there for maximum dispersal of the flower scent." You live at the end of the hallway. That is covering, at best, you know, 10 feet? It's like just for you. It's only for you. There's no other argument.

Travis: I tell yah what—

**Griffin:** It has to be because of something you did.

**Griffin:** Yeah.

Griffin: No way.

**Justin:** I'm such a old man. When I read this, all I could think was like "Who's paying the bill for those outlets out there?"

Travis: Oh boy.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** Those unattended outlets. Who's picking that up? Are you? Are you paying the electric bill for the... air freshener someone saddled you with? That seems wild.

**Travis:** Hey, wait. Hey, just life hack. If each apartment's paying for their own, just plug in an extension cord in someone else's outlet and run it into your house.

Justin: Yes.

**Travis:** Power everything off of one power strip.

Justin: Yes.

**Travis:** My dude.

Justin: Yes.

**Travis:** Hell yeah, dude.

**Justin:** And the whole— everything, dude.

Travis: Yeah, man.

**Justin:** Throw your keys down to the people waiting by the payphone.

**Travis:** Even better, dude. Just, uh, rewire an outlet so it goes out the wall instead of into the wall, right? And then move out of the apartment, park your van right next to the apartment building. Run an extension cord up to that outlet. Boom! Free power.

**Justin:** Boom. It couldn't have been easier. [chuckles]

**Travis:** It couldn't have been easier.

Justin: Nothing is more simple than that.

Travis: That's what they won't tell you. I know this hack. They don't

know I know this.

**Justin:** You don't know how your place smells, yah know?

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin:** They say that, I heard a life hack that if you're gone on vacation for a while, when you, um, get back, pay really good attention to how you

house smells because that's how it smells to guests.

**Travis:** Where'd you hear that life hack, Justin?

**Justin:** Probably on TikTok.

**Travis:** Yeah, probably.

**Justin:** And it's like, okay, but what do I do with that? You know what I

mean?

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: It's just, my house has a smell. Everybody's house has a smell.

**Travis:** Well, that's why I have—

Justin: I remember JW Neil's house had a great smell, 'cause he was the

Travis: [chuckles] Yup.

Justin: And, like-

**Griffin:** Oh yeah.

**Travis:** That was me with Ryan Baker.

**Justin:** That house smelled so great.

Travis: Man.

Justin: His house smelled great, and then he would come to school and

his clothes would smell like his house.

**Travis:** Oh yeah.

Justin: Just seems like "How do you smell rich? That's amazing."

**Travis:** It smells so good.

Justin: "What does your Mom do with— "

Griffin: That's awesome.

Travis: That's like—

**Griffin:** I mean, for me, it was if I smelled Gushers, and like "You guys

got Pringles?"

**Justin:** [wheezes]

**Travis:** Oh, you could smell it on the rich kid?

Justin: [laughs loudly]

**Griffin:** Yeah, if they had like Gushers. Maybe it was just like a psychosomatic thing, where like I saw them have Pringles and Gushers in their lunchbox, and I was like "Damn". So whenever I go to their house, I'm like "Oh, this is the Pringles and Gushers kid. It smells fucking great in here."

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Travis:** "Go to the school psychologist!"

"What? I just!"

**Justin:** [wheeze] "Go to the guidance counsellor! You're going to JROTC."

Travis: "But it's called Goosher—"

"Not again."

Justin: "They're called Gooshers! It's a brand!"

**Griffin:** "They're really good."

Justin: "They're really good!"

**Griffin:** "If you try 'em. You get used to 'em!"

**Justin:** [wheeze] "That's what it says on the box! 'Gooshers; you get

used to 'em!""

**Travis:** "After a while."

Griffin: "Fuck yeah, I got a Hot Pocket, Pringles, and Gushers. What'd

you get, Griffin?"

"Um... An uncooked raw egg and Prongies."

**Justin:** [quiet laughter]

Griffin: "And Gooshers."

**Justin:** [through laughter] "And Gooshers."

Griffin: [in a pleading voice] "If you eat 'em all toge— If you get it all in

one bite, it's pretty good. Raw egg and Prongies and Gooshers."

**Justin:** "Have of 'em are liquid-filled, and no-one knows why."

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin:** My wife would flip if somebody did this, 'cause she's got allergies.

You know?

Griffin: Yeah.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Griffin:** Right. Oh god, it's—

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** About every season.

Griffin: Only quarterly, yeah.

**Justin:** Yeah, it's quarterly appearance.

**Griffin:** Um... Hey, can I read—

**Justin:** He does our financials, so he'll do like a financial report with investors. Um, talk about EBITDA and uh, some of the other, um... You

know, ROI and stuff.

**Griffin:** Some of the big names.

**Justin:** You know, the big academics.

**Griffin:** Hey, can we— Can we supplicate ourselves in front of the Wizard's throne just for a second. I've got a good one from here.

**Travis:** I'm kinda saving myself for marriage.

**Justin:** Thank you.

**Griffin:** Okay. Well, Guillaume sent this one in. Thank you. It's a good one. It's a wikiHow article. It was— There's always a thing that says "author info", but it never like actually says who the author is. It's just

sort of a collaborative team effort on behalf of... Anyway, this is "How to be perfect—"

Travis: 000!

**Griffin:** "— (kids/teens)."

Travis: Oh.

**Griffin:** And it makes me feel bad, this article does, because pretty much everything on it, I didn't... do. Or even attempt to do. So that makes me think that I was a real stinker of a kid/teen. Um... Because these steps would never be stuff that I was just never interested in. Like "Step one: Make your bed as soon as you wake up."

**Justin:** I'm not washing my bedding a lot.

Travis: Now-

**Griffin:** Yeah? Is that how you should be doing it?

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** 'Cause you could go a long— No-one will ever say anything.

**Griffin:** I know. I know. Try not to fuck it up next time so bad.

**Travis:** [laughs quietly]

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin:** Mm-hmm.

**Travis:** In front of the like entire Zoom call. Your damage is minimal.

**Justin:** You could just be— You should've— If it had been—

**Griffin:** [laughs quietly]

**Justin:** If you had been thinking quickly, you could've been like "Hahaha, what a great joke, boss. I love saying that about a person that we really care about."

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin:** [chuckles] "Just as a goof."

**Griffin:** Yeah.

**Travis:** "About a person we respect so much. 'Cause we'd never say that

in front of 'em on a Zoom call."

**Griffin:** [laughs] It's a... It's past that point though now, right?

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin:** So now you're gonna have to get help of all of your other coworkers. And we're reaching, yes, pretty gaslighty territory at this point, that is probably a bridge too far, but if you can get the rest of your coworkers to casually drop in conversation like "Oh! Derek and the boss? Yeah, they're the real like Hardy Boys of the, uh, of the—" Oh, not Hardy Boys. Fuck.

**Travis:** Yeah, I don't think the Hardy Boys were always pranking people. [laughs]

**Griffin:** Right. "They're the real Jerky Boys of the Skype generation."

**Travis:** No, the Jerky Boys were the ones who solved crimes.

**Griffin:** Yeah, I got them flipped and switched, just a little bit.

**Justin:** Uh... [imitates rock guitar]

Travis: Oh.

**Griffin:** I was wondering.

**Justin:** [imitates rock guitar] [sings] I wanna munch!

**Travis:** Squad!

**Justin:** [imitates rock guitar]

**Griffin:** I hope it's a burger, 'cause you just said "burger" a lot.

**Justin:** Got nothing to do with burgers. [sings] I want to munch!

Travis: Squad!

**Justin:** [imitates rock guitar]

Griffin: Squad!

**Justin:** Welcome to Munch Squad, it's a podcast within a podcast, profiling the latest and greatest in brand eating. I wanted to wait until we did a second question because I have so much fuckin' shit to go through.

Griffin: Okay.

**Justin:** This Mu— This segment is back and better than ever. And I— Normally, I would not burn this many things in one episode, but there's so much to cover. Honestly.

Travis: Okay.

**Justin:** Did you guys hear that DJ Khaled is doing a wing... thing.

**Travis:** He's doing a wing thing?

**Justin:** [shouts] "Another Wing!" [normal] Is what it's called.

**Travis:** Wait, what?

**Justin:** Yeah, DJ Khaled's doing a wing store of a chicken wing restaurant. It's a virtual concept called [shouts] "Another Wing!" [normal] And it's, um, it's a DJ Khaled, um... wing store. [wheezes]

**Travis:** Is it a— wait. But I'm— The ti— The name...

**Justin:** DJ Kha— I don't understand why you're confused, legitimately. It's DJ Khaled does wings. I mean—

**Travis:** No, I get that. That's not the thing. I'm trying to figure out if

"Another Wing" is a play on words, or some kind of—

**Justin:** It's a, it's play on "Another one".

Griffin: Of course it is.

Justin: Come on.

**Travis:** Another—

Justin: "Another one!" DJ Khaled.

**Travis:** Okay, but does it— But it's more like "another thing" than that.

**Justin:** No, Travis, it's— DJ Khaled says "Another one".

Travis: I know that.

Justin: That's—

**Travis:** But then it's just—

**Justin:** One of his great sayings.

**Travis:** But then you just switched one whole word— That's not a play on

words. You just changed one word to a different word. Like [sighs]

**Justin:** Just real quick, I have so much other shit to go through. This is not even the story this week. I just wanted to tell you guys the flavors.

Uh, "Un-un-unbelievable Buffalo".

Travis: Okay.

Justin: "Don't Quit Nashville Hot."

Travis: Huh?

Justin: "You Loyal! Lemon Pepper. Honey! Honey! Hot Siracha."

**Travis:** That's good, I like that one.

**Justin:** And the signature, "They Don't Want You To Win TRUFFALO".

Travis: Oh...

**Justin:** [wheezes]

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Travis:** I'm a little lost on that one. Okay.

Justin: "You can order any— [laughs] You can order a la carte! Or choose

from combos like the 'All I Do Is Wing'". [laughs]

Travis: See! Now, that's good!

**Justin:** "Or 'Major Key Meal".

**Travis:** "All I Do Is Wing" is amazing play on words!

Justin: [shouts] "Another Wing!"

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: "All I Do Is Wing" maybe would been a bett— Yeah, but I'm not

here to get in DJ Khaled's head. I don't know.

**Travis:** I bet "All I Do Is Wing" was the first thing they came up with.

Like, before even the concept of a restaurant.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Yeah. He just said it wrong one day, and they were just like

"Well, hey, let's do wings."

**Travis:** Oh, hey.

**Justin:** "Did you— Excuse me, Khaled? Did you just say 'All I Do Is

Wing'?"

"Uh... Yeah." [chuckles]

"It's, um..."

Travis: "A combo..."

**Justin:** "A rest— It's a restaurant I'm doing."

"You're doing it?"

"Yeah yeah yeah." [wheezes]

Travis: "Yeah yeah yeah."

**Justin:** "Yeah yeah yeah yeah, it's a re— I didn't misspeak! It's a

restaurant!"

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** Um, I wanted to just tell— walk you guys through some of the, um, Thanksgiving offerings from brand eating, 'cause you knooow they're not content to let you eat at home with your family.

Travis: Nope.

**Justin:** Um, and there's a, kind of, different varieties. There's like, some people are doing like... stuff for you to eat— If you wanna bring the flavor of fast food to your dining table, a lot of people have that for you this year.

**Travis:** Oh, thank god.

**Justin:** "7-Eleven is celebrating the season with a Thanksgiving turkey sub."

Travis: Oh, boy.

**Justin:** "It's packed with Butterball turkey, sharp white cheddar cheese, and cranberry mayo."

**Griffin:** I'd fuck that up.

Justin: "It's the... debut of 7-Eleven's signature stuffing-flavored roll!"

Travis: Huh?

**Justin:** "You read that right, the roll is stuffing-flavored."

**Griffin:** What's the roll? Is it like a bread roll?

**Justin:** The roll of the sandwich.

**Travis:** The bun.

**Justin:** It's a sub. It's a sub, the bun.

**Griffin:** Oh, okay.

**Justin:** The bun is stuffing-flavored. And it's the debut of it, and I would have to also imagine it's the finale. The grand finale.

**Griffin:** [laughs]

Travis: Woah, well, is it?

Justin: 'Cause like what are the applications beyond this Thanksgiving

sub?

**Travis:** Stuffing is 90% bread and like rosemary and sage anyways.

**Justin:** Yeah, so they put some of that in there.

Travis: Yeah!

Justin: Whatever. It's branding, bud.

**Griffin:** Whatever, man.

**Justin:** "'There's a lot to the thankful for this year,' says Vareesha Shariff, 7-Eleven fresh food product director. 'We know how much our customers look forward to our seasonal offerings.""

**Griffin:** [snorts]

**Justin:** "And we're delighted to contribute to the fun and spirit of Thanksgiving with satisfying food that reminds our customers of those comforting holiday moments."

**Travis:** So, uh, so just a quick reminder, the spirit of Thanksgiving is like coming together with those you love and, be it family or found family, to share an experience together. And so here is a sandwich you bought at 7-Eleven.

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** [chuckles] Yeah, if you ever wanna be reminded of better Thanksgivings, while you're sitting in the passenger seat of your Ford Fiesta.

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** Because there's— Because the driver's seat is too stained, then this is the sandwich for you. And it says here, "What would a Thanksgiving turkey sub be without a side of chips?"

Travis: Huh.

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** [wheezes] [laughs] Well, now you fuckin'—

Griffin: Now, hold on, Justin!

Justin: You fuckin' tell me!

**Travis:** What is it with a side of chips?

**Griffin:** Now hold on just a minute.

**Travis:** It's a whole new experience.

**Griffin:** If we are trying to normalize... My son hates all Thanksgiving

food, so if we want to start normalizing throwing some...

Travis: [laughs]

**Griffin:** ... chips? On the table too? Have your stuffing, have your corn,

you know, salad, and all of your other wild, not ordinary foods on

Thanksgiving. Put some chips in there. For the rest of us.

**Travis:** And have some dino-shaped chicken nuggets.

Justin: Thank you.

Griffin: Oh my god, yes!

**Justin:** Uh, uh, uh—

**Travis:** Hey, why aren't there turkey nuggets?! Get my five-year-old in

the mix!

**Griffin:** Don't— Oh, we're very close to the beef nugget discourse

again—

**Travis:** Oh, you're right.

**Griffin:** — which I would rather take 10 steps away from.

**Justin:** The Honey Baked Ham Company is rolling out some holiday meal

options.

**Travis:** Wait, for Thanksgiving? 'Cause— Stay out of this, Honey Baked

Ham.

**Justin:** No, are you kidding me? They're in the bizz.

**Griffin:** No, I've had Thanksgiving hams.

Justin: You can't find turkeys, except for Honey Baked Ham knows how

to get 'em.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: What?

**Justin:** Yeah, it's like a turkey shortage? But Honey Baked Ham, they know a guy who knows a guy. There's different options here, um, "And for the seasoned host, there's a signature ham and turkey feast that will feed all guests, with leftovers to follow. And you can choose from some fine sides, like a cranberry-walnut chutney."

Griffin: Yes.

Justin: "Or a green bean casserole."

Travis: Okay.

**Justin:** And then it says here—

**Griffin:** My mouth is literally watering right now.

**Justin:** The second option here is "For a small party of ham-lovers."

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Travis:** "That's not what we call ourselves!"

Justin: [laughs]

**Griffin:** "Honey, honey, what should we put on our wedding RSVPs?" "Um... Uh, we want it to sound pretty casual. Can we call it a small gathering for ham-lovers?"

**Travis:** "No, Doug! Doug! I said we like to pork. To pork!"

Griffin: "Different."

**Justin:** "For a small party of ham-lovers, try Honey Baked Bone-In Ouarter Ham Meal."

Quarter Hairi Meai.

Travis: What?

**Justin:** It's a quarter ham. Imagine if you got a small party of ham-lovers together on this— on the agreement that you were all ham-lovers, and you unwrapped a delicious quarter of a ham for everyone to enjoy.

**Griffin:** Mm-hmm.

**Travis:** As the four of you huddled in the darkness, lest you be exposed, as you enjoy your quarter ham.

**Justin:** Yeah. "Meet at the sign of the ichthus, and there we—" [laughs]

Travis: [laughs]

**Griffin:** [laughs]

Justin: [laughs] "We shall consume! Our beloved ham!"

"For the traditional holiday host, take a—"

Travis: "Wait, what's that? Is that— There's a fleck of something in the

corner of your mouth. Is that— Is that turkey?!"

"What, no!"

Justin: "No! No!"

Travis: "No, I would never!"

Justin: "No! I'm a traditional ham-lover!"

"For the traditional host—"

**Travis:** "He's wearing a wire!"

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: [laughs] "Get him!"

**Justin:** Uh, there's a— Anyway, "But first, brunch." This is the fourth option. "For those who cannot wait for dinner, try the Honey Baked

Brunch." [wheezes]

**Griffin:** Yeah.

**Justin:** "That comes with a quarter ham."

**Griffin:** Throw it all in, honey baby. Why not?

**Justin:** "It comes with a honey ham, two heat and serve sides, honey baked bacon, and coffee cake. This will have you ready for a nap—"

**Travis:** Yeah. Is that what it says?

**Justin:** "— before the main attraction." It says that. Yeah. "This'll have you ready for a nap!"

**Travis:** Oh, know thy self. I love that.

**Justin:** Yeah. This is perfect— That's the perfect way to gear up

[wheezes] for the big show.

**Griffin:** [laughs]

Justin: Let's see what else— Real quick, Taco Bell unveils a new Friends-

giving Party Packs.

Travis: Hell yeah.

**Justin:** Yeah, so they got, uh, this really actually pisses me off, because to get this one, you had to be a member of the rewards community, and you have to have reached Fire Rewards status, to gain exclusive access. I— Anybody should be able to buy anything! Okay?

**Griffin:** Also, do they give those awards out retroactively? 'Cause I'm pretty sure I could qualify.

**Justin:** Yeah. From your college years.

**Travis:** A lifetime achievement award?

Griffin: Just based solely on 1995 and 1996.

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** There's, uh, they got Cinnabon Delights Candied Yams.

**Travis:** Hey, Taco Bell, if you're listening. Lifetime A-cheese-ment Award.

That's all yours.

**Justin:** Thank you. Um, "The Cinnabon Delights Candied Yams. It's sugar, spice, and everything nice. This decadent holiday dish is just like your mom's classic recipe, with a Taco Bell twist."

Travis: Oh.

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** It's just like it. "Rolls, with hot sauce packet butter. Is butter a carb? Who cares, when it's blended with—" Can I stop you there?

**Griffin:** [cackles loudly]

**Justin:** Its— It's not. It's not.

Travis: Also, if you're having rolls with it, you're worried about the wrong

thing being a carb or not.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** Yeah, you've just— You put in a placeholder sentence there and didn't really— "Green bean casserole supreme; it's got all the cheesy and craveable components from the Taco Supreme. The classic side dish just got upgraded to your favorite guilty pleasure." "Oh, my favorite guilty pleasure? Green beans with garbage."

**Travis:** Wait. Does it include green beans?

**Griffin:** [laughs]

Justin: Yip.

**Travis:** 'Cause it just says it includes all the ingredients of a Taco

Supreme."

**Justin:** Nope, nope. It's a classic side dish, it's reheatable. It comes in

Taco Bell Bakeware, which is like so fucking cool.

**Travis:** Oh my god, I love that.

**Justin:** Furious.

**Griffin:** But it's—

**Travis:** It's literal fiesta bakeware.

**Griffin:** It's not a taco with green beans in it though.

**Justin:** Yeah, thank you Travis. Uh, yeah, it's a green beans casserole, but the stuff that makes it a casserole is like taco stuff. You understand?

**Travis:** Nasty. I love it.

**Griffin:** Yeah yeah, I understand. It sounds fucking bad.

**Justin:** "Build Your Own Dessert Nachos. Chocolate and caramel sauces, plus unique Taco Bell crunchy toppings, for your pals to drizzle over triangle-shaped shortbread cookies."

Travis: Yes!

**Justin:** "These— These—" This is the last sentence of this. "These flips on

the tradish..."

**Griffin:** [snorts]

Travis: Oh nooo!

**Justin:** "... were created by Ta— Ta—" Come on...

**Travis:** You were so close! You lost it at the end!

Justin: You were so close. Okay, last one, real quick. Krystal

Restaurants. You know the Krystal ones.

**Travis:** Oh yeah!

**Justin:** It's when you can't eat and don't wanna go to White Castle.

**Griffin:** Yeah.

**Justin:** You go to Krystal, they got these tiny hamburgers. Um, and that's the brand there. [sighs] They're bringing back their signature secret stuffing.

Travis: Yes, finally.

**Justin:** "Krystal Restaurants, the original quick service restaurant chain in the South, is bringing back their stuffing recipe, just in time for Thanksgiving and the holiday season. The recipe features the popular Krystal burgers, with a unique spin on an already classic dish. [shouts] 'Look! Stuffing is the star of the Thanksgiving table!"

Travis: What?

**Justin:** [loudly] "And this recipe ensures that your start shines brighter than them all' says Alice Crowder, CMO."

Travis: Hey, Alice. You know that's not true!

**Justin:** No, the star is stuffing and this is the brightest one in the galaxy!

**Griffin:** [laughs quietly]

**Travis:** But kids don't like sit around in kindergarten, tracing their hands to make stuffing pictures. [laughs]

**Griffin:** [laughs] They probably could.

**Travis:** They could, and now that I've said it, I kinda would love to see it. [laughs]

**Griffin:** Just a five-pronged, like splatter of stuffing.

**Travis:** Yeah. No, make a fist and then just trace the fist. Boom, stuffing.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** "'We're encouraging everyone to bring this classic back their table this season, or be delighted for the first time." And this is the last sentence here. "You won't even need a turkey!"

Travis: Wow! Going hard on this!

Justin: Going hard!

**Griffin:** Usually, like... people who comes up with Thanksgiving food, it's sort of a rising tide lifts all ships situation, and not a "Hey, what's up? It's us. Stuffing. Fuck turkey."

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin:** "Like, you guys work together with me."

**Travis:** Whoever wrote this hates turkey and assumes everyone else quietly does too.

Justin: Yeah.

**Travis:** And we've all just been looking for an excuse to like pull the ripcord and get out, but everyone's been too afraid to lead the way. But not Alice Crowder! Alice Crowder's like "Hey, let's all fuckin' say it! We all know stuffing's the star, right? For too long!"

**Griffin:** "We're all just waiting for stuffing."

**Justin:** [sighs] Um, the last thing it says here.

**Travis:** Oh, boy.

**Justin:** Um, "This Krystal recipe was introduced in 2014 and has been a fan favorite over the holidays. To create this—" Now, get some paper. "To create this stuff—" And a pen.

"To create this stuffing recipe, guests should purchase one steamer pack of 24 Krystals." If you can imagine that, it's like a small, they're like sliders, basically. "The recipe serves between 10 to 15 people, and requires 20 of the square burgers. Your calculations aren't wrong! There are intentionally an extra four Krystal burgers for the chef."

Travis: 000!

**Justin:** "So they can enjoy a little treat."

**Griffin:** Awesome...

Justin: [laughs]

**Travis:** That's just standard practice. Go to any restaurant and like if a chef makes you a steak, they cut off just a little bit of the steak and eat it themselves.

**Justin:** Just enjoy a little treat, for their work in the kitchen.

**Griffin:** Yeah. And that's awesome because like your family's gonna be like "Oh, hey Tommy. When's, uh, when's Thanksgiving food gonna be ready?" And you can be like [makes loud chewing noises] "Five minutes ago, idiot!" [more loud chewing noises]

**Justin:** [laughs] Um, the recipe is great, 'cause it says, uh, the direction are "Enjoy four Krystal burgers now."

**Travis:** Oh, boy. Okay.

**Justin:** "Then place the remaining 20 Krystal burgers, [loudly] without cheese or pickles, and oh god, we should've mentioned this earlier!"

Travis: "I already bought 'em!"

Justin: "Oh no!"

Griffin: [laughs] "Oh, god!"

**Justin:** "Oh no! Don't put cheese or pickles in the stuffing!" You put 'em in the refrigerator, you let 'em cool overnight, and then you brush a casserole dish with butter or cooking oil or spray with— It says "Spray with non-stick spray. Tear the burgers into bite-sized pieces." [chuckles]

**Travis:** Oh, boy.

**Justin:** "And place in a casserole dish, and then yah pour chicken broth over 'em."

Travis: "Hey, Mom? Are you okay?"

Justin: "Yeah, honey. I'm just tearing the Krystals apart."

**Travis:** "Well, it's just—"

**Griffin:** [grunts aggressively with effort]

Justin: "For dinner!"

Travis: "Look, we would just love it if you would just come in and spend

some time with the family. You've been in here a really long time?"

Griffin: Hold on, this next part in this recipe says "Barf a hundred times".

**Justin:** [wheezes] [whispers] God, these look really good. [wheezes]

**Griffin:** Oh, no.

**Travis:** Of course it does! It's tiny hamburgers covered in chicken broth!

[laughs]

**Justin:** [whispers] Hey, guys, just hold on one second. Guys. Oh no. [laughs loudly] I was trying— I was trying to drag the sa— [wheezes]

[cackles]

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** I was trying to drag this image of stuffing over in the Slack, so you guys could see it, and I accidentally dragged it into my recording

interface [wheezes]

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** [laughs] I accidentally dragged it into my DA.

Travis: [laughs]

**Justin:** [laughs] And so now there is a track there— [cackles]

**Travis:** Wait, what?! [cackles]

**Griffin:** [laughs]

Justin: There's a track on this episode! That says "Stuffing 252 pixels".

Travis: Huh!

Justin: Why did you let me do that?!

**Griffin:** That's cool.

**Travis:** So now we have a secret message hidden within the file.

Justin: [laughs]

**Griffin:** Yeah, it'll show up in the iTunes metadata. Oh fuck. Is it— That's weird, Juice, because in the middle of this episode, it ju— I heard a fourth track going "Burger mess. Burger mess. Burger mess. Burger mess." It did it like 20 times, and I thought it was a... a possession.

**Justin:** Guys, look—

**Griffin:** I don't actually— This may be the first time, Juice, actually, where I don't wanna click on your name in Slack to see what image you've sent us. 'Cause it can't be good.

**Travis:** It does actually look good, yeah.

Justin: Check it out, man. It looks choice. It looks choice.

**Griffin:** Guys. It doesn't though. That doesn't look good at all.

**Travis:** Well, I haven't had lunch, so...

Justin: Okay...

**Griffin:** We're gonna have to put this up to— I also haven't, and I still don't wanna, don't wanna see this JPEG. I can smell this JPEG.

**Justin:** Um, and what does it smell like to you, then? And don't say cheese or pickles, 'cause then I know you've fucked up the recipe.

**Griffin:** Uh, I think I-I'm pretty sure I see pickles up in here. Or unless you have to also cut up celery in there.

**Justin:** I've dropped in, just so you can see, for point of reference. If you had to pick the most delicious-looking...

**Griffin:** I'm not kidding! I would hurt this Subway, this Subway sub, with the cranberry mayo. I think that's quite good.

**Travis:** Okay, and ju— To be fair, Justin, I guarantee that this, uh, stuffing picture, this is a professional photographer right there. Show me a picture of a home baker's.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis:** Uh, show me a home-baker's, uh, hamburger stuffing.

Justin: [quietly] Oh my god...

**Griffin:** Yeah, let me see the *Nailed It!* version of that. Also, Juice, I know why you don't like this Subway sub is because I see that cheese.

Justin: Yeah. Raw cheese.

**Griffin:** And it is, it is thoroughly raw.

Justin: Thoroughly raw.

**Griffin:** It's completely raw.

**Justin:** Nobody wants that. The, uh, I also sent you the picture of the Taco Bell dinner, which looks like they adapted beige into an HBO miniseries. It is literally just...

**Griffin:** [laughs]

**Justin:** 50 Shades of Beige.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin:** Um, okay. That is your Thanksgiving offerings around the horn there. So whichever one you wanna enjoy, um... You know, you have your choice.

**Travis:** You know what else you could enjoy on Thanksgiving?

**Griffin:** Enjoy is a—

**Justin:** What, Trav?

**Griffin:** What?

**Travis:** Til Death Do Us Blart!

**Justin:** Oh god, you're right. This is our last one before— [exhales] Okay. If you've never listened, *Til Death Do Us Blart* is an annual... review podcast that we do of the film *Paul Blart: Mall Cop 2*. We do it with the guys from *Worst Idea of All Time*. We've done it every year for— this is our... Fifth? Sixth year?

**Travis:** I think it's sixth.

**Justin:** Sixth year. Uh, we've been doing it for six years, improbably, um, and this year is very fun. Uh...

**Travis:** For you, the listener.

**Justin:** For you, the listener. We are in uniquely great spirits enjoying this one, um, and uh we hope that you will tune into that. You know, it's wherever you find podcasts. I— we don't even— We don't make any money off of it, you know what I mean? Like, just please listen to it. We have a really good time doing it. 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, okay. I just checked guys, I have terrible news.

Travis: What?

**Justin:** This is our seventh. [wheezes]

**Travis:** Oh, boy.

**Justin:** This is our seventh one. If you don't count the bonus episode that we did when COVID struck last year, this is our, um, this is our seventh episode with us. We've been doing it since 2015.

Travis: I mean—

Justin: I cannot believe that. That is fantastic.

**Travis:** Here's what I'll say because we don't make money off it, but if you go to mcelroymerch.com, there is a *Til Death Do Us Blart* shirt there, designed by Tyler Reed.

Justin: Yes!

Travis: [laughs]

[sounds of recording equipment being hit]

Justin: [laughs loudly]

**Griffin:** [laughs]

Justin: [wheezes] [through laughter] What?!

**Travis:** [laughs] There were a lot of words in there we did have to beep.

**Justin:** [laughs] [coughs] What the fuck?!

Travis: Damn, ShittyMichael.

**Griffin:** Yeah.

**Justin:** [laughs]

**Travis:** Sorry, StrongMichael.

**Griffin:** StrongMichael.

**Justin:** [cackles]

**Griffin:** Oh, Travis, he's gonna beat your ass for that, dude.

**Travis:** I hope StrongMichael doesn't listen.

**Justin:** [laughs loudly] My name's Justin McElroy.

**Travis:** I'm Travis McElroy.

**Griffin:** I'm StrongMi— I'm Griffin McElroy.

**Justin:** This has been My Brother, My Brother & Me. Kiss your dad square

on the lips.

[outro music plays]

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**Ben Harrison:** Do you sometimes wonder whatever happened to the kids at your school who really loved *Star Trek*?

**Adam Pranica:** You might remember a kid like me. The one who read *Star Trek* novels and built *Star Trek* models. I also took music classes to avoid taking gym classes that required showering after, but I don't see what that really has to do with—
