Griffin:

And your WinAmps.

Listening is not a two-way street. It's time now for you to relax, breathe, and learn with My Brother, My Brother, and Me. It's an advice show for the modern era. I am Justin McElroy.

Travis:

I am Travis McElroy.

Griffin:

I am Griffin McElroy. I don't like that idea. That... that listening isn't a twoway street. You're saying that we shouldn't have... be having a dialogue with our fans right now?

Travis:

No, it's not. A dialogue is a two-way street but listening is not. If listening were a two-way street, there'd just be a lot of quiet.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Sure, but I just want... I want people to feel that they can come to us, and talk to us, and question—

Justin:

They do, but they already had... Their part of the conversation, goes on for literally the entire week, except an hour. This is the part... like, this whole... I like to imagine that, for this whole week, we've been sort of sagely, like, nodding and stroking our chins.

Griffin:

As the world just moans and wails.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

We just... We're just listening the entire time.

Justin:

Really—yeah, weighing it over. Then... and then, like, for one week...

The clouds part...

Justin:

... one hour out of the week. We just give that wisdom down. So if you're driving, stop. Go park. If you're sweeping, finish sweeping, and then stop.

Griffin:

Give yourselves to us.

Justin:

Yeah, give yourselves to us.

Griffin:

Entirely, for 40 minutes.

Justin:

Body and mind. As we convert your questions into wisdom.

Griffin:

You... you can call this period you listen to this show The Calm.

Justin:

[laughs] Welcome to The Calm.

Griffin:

The Calm.

Travis:

The Calm.

Justin:

That's our new name. The Calm. Um, this one comes from SuperSara77, uh, which I like for the alliteration. "How do I deal with my suite mate's ruckus, arrhythmic love-making?" [laughs] "Her squeaking the bed is getting to me... her squeaking bed is getting to me." Hi, reading. Uh, "I've suggested the beanbag, but to no avail. Travis:

Griffin:

That'd be good.

Travis:

Whenever your suite mate starts her arrhythmic love-making, start pounding on the wall in rhythm and see if she falls in line with it.

Justin:

Yeah. [laughs]

Griffin:

That's a... that would be a fun experiment. Um, if I may suggest, don't listen to us. Don't listen to us when you're listening to your roommate's lovemaking, because that's not a Freudian mental connection that you want your subconscious to make.

Travis:

[laughs]

[laughs]

Griffin:

You don't want... well, maybe it would be nice every time you listen to us to think of sweet arrhythmic love-making.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

But every time you hear love-making or participate in love-making, the last thing you want to be thinking about is... is our voices.

Justin:

Yeah. Uh, I...

Travis:

I disagree.

Justin:

Excuse me Phil... excuse me Philip. I'm enjoying our love-making. Arrhythmic though it may be. But I believe in order to climax, I'm going to need to turn on My Brother, My Brother, and Me. It's a podcast. You'll enjoy it. Maybe you won't.

Griffin:

See, now we're getting meta.

Travis:

If, at the end, you yell, "I'm ready for Griffin's last question," then...

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs] Um, you should talk to your... your roommate and talk about how gross this whole... this whole scenario is. 'Cause you have to see her the next morning.

Justin:

Uh, I... there is a reason why we make this show the perfect, uh, length for a love-making session.

40 minutes?!

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

Well, I am... I am, of course including, uh, a 35 minute get pumped nap for afterwards, before you get pumped again.

Griffin:

Oh, thank god.

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

I was about to ask, uh... a really embarrassing question.

Justin:

[laughs] "My Brother, My Brother, and Me, uh, my brother said on a show that we do together..." [laughs] "The ideal length for love-making..."

Griffin:

I love it when people do stuff like that just to mess with you. Like, oh, you mean it... it takes you less than an hour? To climax? That's so... that's so bizarre. You don't have a 13 inch penis, soft? That's... that's just... well, that must be terrible for you.

Justin:

Uh, Penis Soft was my favorite software developer in the... in the '80s, by the way. They made a lot of really great racing games.

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Travis:

Justin:

Unde rmeat. God. Have you seen that callie's under meat? It is off the chuck.

Griffin:

I don't wanna sound weird, but...

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

... That cat has some sweet tits.

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

[laughs] Me-yow!

Griffin:

Like, really, just... bonkers stuff going on down there.

Justin:

Yeah, meow indeed.

Griffin:

It's weird, because it's just the back two.

Travis:

Yeah.

I don't really like her... the... her other... eight?

Travis:

Is it... is it at all possible that your cat is a boy, and that's his balls?

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

[laughs] Does your cat have giant balls? Uh, maybe your cat's... Okay, think about this for a second. You've assumed treated your cat, like, you've named it Mrs. Snuggle Baby, and it's been your cat, your girl cat, for years, right? But it's been a boy this whole time, and now it's like, biologically reasserting that by increasing its ball size four-fold. And so you'll, like, see them finally and be like, yes. Griffin:

I'm just saying that's kind of a cool look.

Justin:

Um...

Travis:

I was actually thinking of naming my new garage band that. Furry Cat Testes.

Griffin:

Furry Cat...

Justin:

Furry Cat Testes? What is the, uh... what's the story with, um, with cat balls? Are people looking at these things more than I knew that they were? Is that... with the kids?

Griffin:

It's troubling when in the same week, I get asked two questions that have to do with cat genitalia. Um, uh, I didn't know. Maybe it's some sort of... some sort of... it's like bird watching? Maybe they're—

Travis:

Looking at cat balls is the new watching paint dry. Kills some time.

Justin:

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs]

Uh, I—I don't think that you should... I think it's one of the mortal sins to covet the balls of another animal. Isn't that in... in the Bible or something?

Griffin:

Well, no.

Travis:

Please don't.

Griffin:

Because cats are an exception because you're supposed to worship them, and their sweet tits and their huge, awesome balls.

Justin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Now... well, Jay, as... I mean, I'm not a... a dictionary author, but it sounds like you're describing a hug. Which...

Justin:

Oh, okay.

Griffin:

I think... I think hugs are still kinda cool.

Yeah, hugs are all right. Um, the thing is... I... here's what I think. If they could use your picture in a catalog to sell sweaters, you're not overstepping the bounds.

Griffin:

Sure.

Justin:

Travis:

Travis:

Um...

Justin: Or my grandmother, Jesus.
Travis: [laughs]
Griffin: Maybe, uh
Justin: It's a family name. Don't be a jerk.
Griffin: Sometimes you just can't help it, though.
Justin: Yeah.
Griffin: Sometimes you gots a supes attractive girlfriend, like, you there's nothing you can do about it. It's a forgone conclusion. You are gonna you're gonna just grope a little bit.
Justin: Griff, can you tack "if memory serves" into that last paragraph when you're editing?
Griffin: Uh-huh. If memory serves

[laughs]

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

From what I remember about the female form, um...

Travis:

[laughs] I read in a book once...

[laughs] If I learned anything from watching Titanic, it's...

Griffin:

Um, I mean, as long you're stealth about it... just... just... I mean, you gotta understand. We got this question last week about the guy who has a friend who's too touchy-feely with his girlfriend. Um, maybe there's a connection here. Um, just be polite and be conscientious. Don't do it at, like, you know...

Travis:

A funeral.

Griffin:

A funeral. You know?

Justin:

Yeah. Or look around you and see if, like, anybody else is being a weirdo, like, with the hugs and stuff. If you're in a hug-friendly environment, you'll usually get a pretty good sense of it.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Um, and... and again, this is one of those, uh... if you have to wonder about it, then it's probably already too late.

Travis:

Yup.

Justin:

Like, if the thought... if that thought crosses your mind, you are... you're a conscientious enough person that, you know, y-you're just gonna have to put the kibosh on it.

Griffin:

I'll tell you what I... I'll tell you what I cannot stand. What I can't stand for. And this was big when I went to high school. Is, um, boyfriends and girlfriends who would walk side by side, uh, with their hands in each other's

back pockets. First of all, when... when you do that, you become a... a fucking TIE fighter. Like, nobody can get past you. Like, you...

Justin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Justin:

Griffin:

Oh, yeah...

Travis:

But, like, multiple. Like... [makes many small kissing sounds] I love you. Mm. Mmm.

Justin:

Yeah. Mm-hmm.

Travis:

Mm... Eugh!

Justin:

I don't like it when the girl stands on the guy's feet and then grabs his wrists and then walks with him like he's a big exoskeleton.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

Like, we get it. You're in love, right? You don't need to form Voltron.

Travis:

Uh-huh. [laughs]

Justin:

I hate... I hate that. "How does one gain swagger when entering a club? I wanna become a lady's man when I go to clubs/parties. Any tips?" From SwagLess, Formspring.

Griffin:

[singing] I'ma just gonna put some Fifty Cent over this question while you guys answer it.

Justin:

That would be awesome. Uh, I... I have a seven-tiered plan for you, to help you get your swagger in a club or party.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Shots, shots, shots, shots, shots, shots.

Griffin:

Well, I mean, physical inebriation will certainly grant you swagger. Um...

Justin:

Yeah, why do you think people even do it? This is why people pre-drink. This is why people go to, like, have a drink before they go to the club so they get that swagger going.

Griffin:

Pre-gaming is important. I would say, maybe, don't do shots. I... You gotta slow build up to it. With a... you know... maybe a case of Keystone with your boys.

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Back at the...

Justin:

Shot... shots should be reserved for when you're drunk enough to not remember how shots will make you feel the next day.

Griffin:

Right. You can't... you can't go from zero to shots. Regardless of what LMFAO and Lil Jon tell you.

Justin:

You really get the impression from that song that they walk into the club and just start pounding shots, which isn't a healthy art.

Travis:

No.

Griffin:

No. Because you'll be at that club for 25 minutes, and then you'll be...

Justin:

Yeah, it's untenable.

Griffin:

... you'll be asleep or you'll be kicked out of that club.

Justin:

Why is Lil Jon asleep?

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin: Lil Jon, you just got here.
Travis: Shh, he's had a long day.
Justin: Shots! Shots! It's 7:30, what are you doing?
Griffin: Um
Justin: This is a Chili's.
Griffin: Drinking is good.
Justin: [laughs]
Travis: [laughs]
Griffin: There are other things you can do, though, to gain swagger.
Travis: Okay.
Griffin: Aside from aside from like, a like a mental swagger. You know?
Travis: Yeah.
Griffin: Where, like, you know that you Maybe you get a nice haircut, and you buy some new shoes.
Justin:

That will... you GTL it, and then you'll be able to swagger. Um, you could also, um... I don't know if it's possible. Can you give yourself a club foot?

Travis:

See, I was going to say pimp cane and tiny shoes.

Justin:

Whoa. Well, that would do it. That would give you a club foot.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Right? You want like... what, now... what is a club foot? I am unfamiliar.

Griffin:

A club foot is like, uh... from... if memory serves, a clubfoot is a... like a foot that just kinda, like, stops, like, halfway. It's like a 'fo.'

Justin:

Griffin:

It's a Mitchell game, basically is what you're playing, and you need to do whatever you need to do to get your sexy right.

Griffin:

Justin:

Griffin:

Get your hair right. Get your shirt right. Get your watch right, and your shoes right.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Maybe a little makeup?

Travis:

Get your soul right.

Griffin:

Maybe a little man makeup.

Justin:

By... and by makeup, he means makeup. Like, seriously.

Griffin: Get your makeup right. Get some blush right. Some eyeliner.
Justin: Right.
Griffin: Yeah.
Turation.

Yeah, get all those things. And uh... and by get your watch right, he means don't wear a watch, because it's 2010 and you've got a cellphone.

Travis:

Yeah. You are just getting—

Griffin:

I like Travis's idea of getting your soul right, too.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Whoa.

Travis:

You gotta get clean.

Griffin:

Maybe... just find out what's going on in there.

Justin:

You think he's got, like, a swagger road bump that's keeping him from swagger.

Griffin:

I'm saying he's got a metaphysical, meteorological road bump that he needs to get right before he can get that swagga'.

Is... is road bump a real thing, or is that a word we just invented? I'm pretty sure...

Travis:

I'm almost certain it's a real thing.

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

I'm pretty sure at least three of the words I used in my last sentence were made up words.

Justin:

[laughs] Um, what is keeping you from swagger? What is keeping you from getting your sexy right?

Travis:

I think... I think this is a job for a licensed therapist.

Justin:

Yeah, that... Travis has made a great point. We don't wanna be... end up in a protracted legal battle.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Um... What about... what about...

Travis:

Go to a therapist, say, "Hey, I need your help. I gotta get this swagger figured out."

Griffin:

Get your therapy-wagger figured out.

Travis:

Travis:

Justin:

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin: Um
Travis: But that has nothing to do with anything.

Griffin: Hey, can we introduce a phrase into the the consciousness of America, right now? Um, if, whenever you see an unattractive person, instead of commenting at all on their unattractiveness, can we just say they have their sexy wrong?
Travis: [laughs]
Justin: Yeah, I think so. Th-their sexy is is is wrong. Your your your sexy, um, your sexy is
Griffin: It's incorrect.
Justin: It's incorrect. You've done it wrong.
Griffin: It's fallacious.
Justin: Take another shot at your sexy. [laughs]

Travis: [laughs]

Griffin: [laughs]

"All my friends, and everyone in my class are so immature. Any time my teacher says the word ball or anything that sounds like "penis," they laugh. Should I suck up and pretend to laugh?"

Griffin:

[laughs] Suck it. Sorry.

Justin:

Uh, "Or tell them to shut up?" Benjamin from Gmail. Um, Benji. You're young. If you can't laugh about balls and words that sound like penis... what words are those, by the way?

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

I, uh...

Griffin:

[laughs] Maybe if you say the word "jeans" weird. Then...

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Pencil.

Griffin:

Maybe? Pin...

Justin:

Yeah, maybe?

Travis:

Pinochle.

Griffin:

Pinochle? Definitely.

But if... if you're... you're 12 years old and you're talking about pinochle, you have much, much bigger problems.

Travis:

Panis?

Griffin:

[laughs] Panis?

Justin:

Menses. Um, but, I think that this is the time in your life when you gotta give yourself permission to laugh at balls and words that sound like penis. I know that I actually found that kind of stuff funnier as I got older and just let myself go. Let myself enjoy it.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Did you hear the latest Prairie Home Companion?

Justin:

[laughs] Guy Noir is up to his old tricks...

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs] This Yahoo Answer question that I am reading, apropos of nothing, was sent in by Jonathan Bartram, close friend of the show. Um, which by the way, to earn that designation, you actually have to be a close friend of the show. We don't just throw that around. Justin:

Travis:

[laughs] See, now this riffing is going to be funnier than the question is.

Travis:

No, say it.

Griffin:

KeithUrbanF wants to know, "Does sausage have seeds?"

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

[laughs] Of course it does!

Griffin:

"I told my friends..."

Travis:

Where do you think more sausage comes from?

Griffin:

"I told my friends at school today that I thought sausage had seeds in it, and they all thought I was crazy, but I always thought that sausage has seeds in it. Does it?"

Travis:

[laughs]

Well, if sausage doesn't have seeds, what kind of tree did I fall out of when I was eight and break my arm?

Travis:

Exactly.

Griffin:

I like...

Justin:

Think about it.

Griffin:

... sausage tree sounds like something it's... it's not. Sausage...

Justin:

Sausage Tree is actually a new club for discerning gentlemen that I am opening up. In 2011, get there.

Griffin:

A very... a very private club.

Justin:

Select... select...

Travis:

Sausage Tree, formerly Gentlemen Hole.

Griffin:

Gentlemen can come and be gentlemen.

Justin:

And be gentlemen together as gentlemen.

Griffin:

On each other.

Justin:

Yes. Your membership cards from Shemanigans will be accepted. So just come on right in. Uh, there... that... it's anise, right?

Griffin: There are pellets, in sausage.
Justin: They're pellets, right.
Travis: It's gristle.
Justin: No, it's not gristle. It's like
Griffin: It's Grisham.
Justin: Like, flavor. It's it's Laurence Fishburne. It It's, uh, it's like seasonings, right? Like pepper, and stuff.
Griffin: Uh-huh. Coriander.
Justin: Like peppercorn.
Travis: Popcorn.
Justin: Coriander.
Travis: Paprika
Justin: Pop-erika
Griffin: But, um, I totally support the idea of planting things. Just to see if a tree will grow out of them. So

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

... So, just go sausage-crazy. Maybe tuck a few microwaveable pizzas down in the lawn and see if... if a pizza tree springs out. You... you don't know until you try.

Justin:

Guys, if I... if I plant a Bagel Bite, and it grows a Bagel Bite tree, I am quitting my job. I am divorcing my wife, and... 'Cause I will have everything that I will ever need. Right there.

Griffin:

If you get that Bagel Bite tree and a shemale kitten, you are fucking set...

Justin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

Justin: It's actually It's actually a show about gardens that I do with Ina Garten, the Barefoot Contessa.
Travis: [laughs]
Justin: It's not it's not very popular.
Griffin: How many episodes?
Justin: It's actually
Griffin: How many episodes?
Justin: It's actively disliked. A half. We finished one and she had to go make some scones for Jeffrey.
Griffin: [laughs]
Travis:

[laughs]

Um, "My friend recently sent me a picture of his new tattoos, and I do not like them at all. We are very good friends and he respects my opinion. I don't want to lie, but I also would rather not tell him the truth." Okay. Uh, "How should I respond?"

Travis:

What a conundrum.

Justin:

Yeah, you've... you've really drawn yourself into a logical corner here.

Griffin:

Well, first of all, uh, we need to address the fact, uh, this question was sent in by our website. Our fresh new website which, if you haven't been to it, is mbmbam.com.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Go to it.

Justin:

More on that later.

Griffin:

But there's an... there's an input there where you can put in your own questions. Uh, and make sure you put your name on it. 'Cause this guy didn't put a name on it, so how is he going to know that this wisdom is for him? Just a cautionary tale.

Justin:

We know that... we know that he is not a friend of one very special gentleman, who I think you... you guys all know who I'm... I'm referring to. I believe his twitter username is Elenem?

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Elemim. Forgive me. That's a...

Elnamim. Elnemar.

Justin:

El...

Travis:

Elmememar.

Justin:

El... El... Elm...

Travis:

Pinochle.

Justin:

Elmum? Elmumum? Al-u-minium? Uh, this gentleman, who we will refer to by... because this is, uh, a Christian podcast, we'll refer to him by his... his Christian name. Uh, and that's Erickson from, uh, uh... Rochester, New York. He's the reviews editor at eBaum Nation and he made the ultimate...

Griffin:

Sacrifice, I would say. [laughs]

Justin:

I don't want to call it a sacrifice!

Griffin:

I would call it very much a skin sacrifice. It's like he's in a Saw movie, and in order to get out of some trap, he had to get this thing on his skin which he can't use for anything else.

Travis:

I think it's more of a skin contract.

Justin:

Yeah, it's a skin contract with us, so we have to do this show forever.

Griffin:

Thanks Eric!

Justin:

Thanks Eric. We're getting ready to wrap up season one and take a three month hiatus. He got an awesome, um, uh, M-B-M-B-A-M tattoo with our new little "pack your bags" guy. Um, and, uh... you can get his tattoo on a t-shirt, coming up soon.

Griffin:

You can rent the skin off of his forearm, put it on a t-shirt, and we'll... you can just wear it. That's the, uh... that's the kind of service that we provide here at MBMBaM.

Justin:

Yeah. You've earned that right, to rip his arm off. Um, uh, now, uh... to our question. Uh, you have to lie.

Travis:

You have to.

Justin:

This isn't... this isn't up for debate. You have to lie.

Griffin:

Maybe we shouldn't of connected these two points, of this guy hating his friend's tattoo and Eric getting a totally sweet tattoo. We're not lying, Eric. We totally love your sweet tattoo, but this guy...

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

... it... it sounds like he's talking about something completely different.

Justin:

Your sweet tattoo and your sweet cat tits. We love them both.

Travis:

Here... here's the thing. It's one of two problems. Either it is the quality of the tattoo is not good, or the tattoo itself is bad. Now if it's the quality of the tattoo, he can get that redone. He can go and get something over it, anything like that. But if it's just, the tattoo is stupid...

Travis:

Justin:

Wait a minute, why are we ignoring the third... pretty obvious option? You have to stop being his friend.

Travis:

Oh yeah.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

You don't want to be hanging out with a guy who has Bret Michaels' face on his face.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

The... the only solution is to not be his friend anymore.

Travis:

And... Side note, unless it actually is Bret Michaels. Then it's awesome.

Justin:

If it's Bret Michaels, uh, getting a tattoo of a face on his face, that... you've got the most meta friend ever. What if it's a guy named Bret Michaels, but not *that* Bret Michaels? [laughs] Got tired of all the jokes and had real Bret Michaels' face tattooed on his face. Is that a cool friend? Is that somebody you want to spend time with? I don't know.

Griffin:

I mean, I wouldn't say cool. I wouldn't say cool in the traditional sense of the word.

Justin:

Like, not cool. No.

Griffin:

Justin:

Griffin:

Griffin:

Travis:

Justin:

[laughs] And then you'd be like, "You there now. You can't get mad at me."

Griffin:

I feel like...

Justin:

It's... it's on my body forever. [laughs]

Griffin:

Maybe we need to come up with some sort of... MBMBaM identikit. Where like... a tattoo. Like a standard-issue tattoo that fans can get. And it wouldn't be... wouldn't be quite as large as Eric's, 'cause I don't know if any fan is as die hard as Eric. Justin:

Or even have regular meetings, really.

Travis:

Yet.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

Whoa!

Griffin:

If by episode 300, we have to come up with some sort of conspiracy to assassinate some sort of leading political figure, or religious figure.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

I don't know. That would actually be... I hope that our show...

Travis:

Right. It's time to let you guys in on something.

Griffin:

Okay.

Travis:

Go back to our archive. Every third word, write them down. Then rearrange them. You'll get it.

Justin:

Ask Tom Hanks. He'll help you.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

Um, Mr. Hanks, do you have the codex? I need the codex to decode the shows. The Illuminati plant. Um, this is taking kind of a weird turn. Griffin, do you have a Yahoo question that will, like, take us out of this odd...

Griffin:

Yeah. Uh, I'm gonna read a Yahoo...

Justin:

This odd... Pope-assassination path we seem to be wandering down.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

I'll read a Yahoo Answers question. That will... that will make you feel less weird.

Justin:

And not wandering so much as sprinting towards the assassination to a public figure.

Griffin:

I'm saying we're not there yet. I'm saying in, like, 270 episodes.

Travis:

We... we haven't earned... we haven't earned that street cred to order the death of someone.

Griffin:

That's... that's fucking... that's like six years down the road. Like, we'll cross that bridge when we come to it. I'm just saying, I want to be part of a community. And by be part of, I... I mean lead.

Justin:

And by community, you mean angry...

Griffin:

Cult.

Justin:

Pope-killing mob. Okay, okay.

Griffin:

Uh, Max Jackman sent this one in. Can we just take a moment to set that in?

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs] Thanks Max Jackman. Um, Yahoo Answers user SidewaysSmileyFace, uh, asks, "Is the Human Centipede real?"

Travis:

That was the sound of Justin taking off his headphones and walking away.

Justin:

Is The Human... We're done, guys. Like, our c... c....

Griffin:

You don't mean the show. You mean fucking humanity. People. America.

Justin:

I don't... I'm not gonna answer this question. I need to talk about the fact that, as a society, we're done. Dog, there are people wandering around on this earth that... that were like... they were sitting at their den. Not reading. And... and they suddenly realize, like, I... This question is gnawing at me too much. I've gotta go ask the internet if the Human Centipede is real. It's a...

Travis:

Have you guys seen that new documentary? The Human Centipede?

Justin:

Have you seen that docu-drama, The Human Centipede? Where a mad scientist sews a person's mouth to another person's butt hole?

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Twice.

Justin:

Twice. Have you seen that movie? Because it was... that's a st... that's a true story.

Travis:

It was a hard-hitting introspective.

Griffin:

It was on Nat Geo the other day. Uh, so it must be real.

Travis:

[laughs] I was watching Planet Earth and they were doing a special about the Human Centipede.

Justin:

You'll know if the Human Centipede is ever real, because you'll see me about six feet away, jerking it so right.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs] You have got to get your Human Centipede right.

Travis:

[laughs] You want swagger?

Griffin:

There... there's one way to have swagger, is to walk on all fours with two human beings suspended by your mouth and butt hole.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

[laughs] If you walk into a club with anything less than six legs, your sexy is not right. You've gotta get your leg count right. It's so... it's so important to have your... your Human Centipede fresh.

Travis:

And then... and then ask the DJ to turn on Jitterbug.

Justin:

[laughs] People will never see that coming. Uh, that, I have a... I have a, uh, a regiment I call G-T-L-N-C-S, and it's, uh, gym, tan, laundry, new centipede segment. Where I cut off the back... my back quarters.

Griffin:

Sure.

Justin:

And I find a new person to sew to my butt hole. [laughs]

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Right. I... Well, I call... I refer to that as pruning. Um...

Travis:

Rinse and repeat.

Justin:

Yeah. You just gotta get a new person to sew to your butt hole every night before you go to the club.

Travis:

And that's what Craigslist is for.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs] Oh...

Travis:

You know, we laugh and joke, but I'm really sad.

Justin:

Yeah. This culture is... I'm really worried about people. Like, these... we make light of these people, and this isn't a crazy person. This person is just, like, way stupid.

Griffin:

I mean, that's...

Justin:

Like, way, way stupid.

Griffin:

That's why we do this show. 'Cause if... if... if we had to deal with shit... if I had to deal with this shit by myself, like, knowing that these people existed and I just had to eat that knowledge and... and digest it myself, I would... I would be driven crazy.

Travis:

Here... here's a scary proposal.

Justin:

I'll tell you what we need...

Travis:

One is that someone saw that movie and thought, "Oh, this is probably real." But scarier than that is that someone else said to this person, "You know, that's real." And they couldn't determine, on their own, whether that was true or not.

Griffin:

Right.

Justin:

What we mean... what I just realized that's very important is that we need listeners to, after they've listened to a show, track down these questions on Yahoo and then post a show link in there. So people le... Like, 'cause I need the truth to get to them. What... what answers did people have for that, Griffin? What... what... what answers did people have about, "Is The Human Centipede real?"

Griffin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

Justin:

Griffin:

He may have seen a human holding a centipede, and it freaked him out.

Justin:

Maybe we was... saw a human holding a baby and he got confused.

Travis:

Maybe it was one of those Chinese dragons.

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

I always get those confused. You take off the top, and it's just butt hole, mouth, butt hole, mouth. It's awful.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Miss replies, "It would be cool if it did." Uh, no it fucking wouldn't.

Justin:

[laughs] Would it? Would it be cool? Hey, that... hey, that's cool how you have your mouth sewn to another human's butt hole.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

That's... that's a pretty cool thing you got there.

Justin:

That... that's cool!

Travis:

Awesome!

Justin:

I'm glad that's happening for you.

Griffin:

You know, you've really got your centipede right.

Justin:

[laughs] You can tell, you've really got all your legs. Your leg count is right where it needs to be. So nice.

Travis:

Nothing like showing up to your high school reunion with your mouth sewn to someone's butt hole to really show them how you got your shit together.

Justin:

"Yeah, I've only been in a human centipede for, like, three years, but I'm hoping to be the front segment in, like, four or five. But it's really gonna get

my... gonna get my sexy right. Gonna... it's all about the politics, man. It's a politics game."

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

"If you wanna be the front segment in a centipede, you gotta... you gotta eat some dooky from a man's butt hole."

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

"But a lot of these new kids, they come up out of college with their Master's degrees and butt holes, and they think that they're just gonna be the front segment. It's like, hey, get in line. I mean, literally, get in line behind me and sew your mouth to my butt hole and we'll see what we can work out for you in a few years. But not right now, okay? Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

That's how that phrase goes.

Justin:

Do you think... I've never seen The Human Centipede. Is that front segment person... are they just like...

Griffin:

They got a sweet deal.

Justin:

Wow. That's convenience!

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

They just mostly... they just...

Justin:

How pleasant!

Griffin:

They just kick it, mostly.

Justin:

Yeah, they just, like, kick it... well, they don't kick, because that could be dangerous, but they de... they don't want to dislodge the person, 'cause they got a pretty good deal going.

Griffin:

Right.

Justin: Right?
Griffin: I'm totally yucked out. This is like the second week in a row where we end the show where it's like
Justin: I know, but quick. I got a serious I have a serious question for you. If you're in the human centipede, and you gotta get out of it
Griffin: Uh-huh.
Justin: would you rather cut off a person's mouth and have a mouth stuck to your butt hole forever?
Griffin: Uh-huh.
Justin: Or cut off a little sliver of your butt hole?
Griffin: Of your own butt hole.
Justin:

And then... and then make them have butt hole mouth forever. [laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

[laughs] I think I'd rather just kill myself.

Justin:

You would rather kill yourself?

Travis:

Yes.

Justin: That's that's the coward's way out. That's why you'll never be front segment.
Travis: [laughs]
Griffin: I still say that I would wrap myself in a chrysalis and become a human butterfly.
Travis: [laughs]
Justin: [laughs]
Griffin: Now, I know that's caterpillars.
Justin: [laughs]
Travis: [laughs]
Griffin: But
Travis: Oh god!
Justin: "What, mommy that's what's up with that giant butterfly? It's it's beautiful and crying."
Griffin: "Its thorax has three torsos."
Justin:

[laughs] "Why is that... why is that giant butterfly's middle segment wearing FUBU gear, mommy?"

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

"I don't understand."

Griffin:

Um, I mean, you would still be pooping into mouths. Uh, but you would have the... the great, big, beautiful wingspan of a monarch. And I think that that would more than make up for it.

Justin:

That's what happened to Lindsay Lohan.

Griffin:

We have to end the show.

Justin:

Uh, I thought we already... it...

Travis:

Did we not end it 10 minutes ago?

Justin:

I thought the show would basically end when everybody turned it off, which was... which was a few minutes ago. Um, so, housekeeping, uh, before we hear Griffin's last question. Um, uh, mbmbam.com is brand new. It is so full of, uh, games, activities for kids, uh, forums, all our old shows...
