Justin:

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

They said he couldn't—

Griffin:

He's on a— he's on a hang glider of success.

Justin:

So this is our special Easter edition, the stone of ignorance has been rolled away, there in its place is uh, is us. [laughs] My name is Justin McElroy.

Travis:

I'm Travis McElroy.

Griffin:

I'm Griffin McElroy.

Justin:

We are uh, we are still alive, but we're sleeping in there.

Travis:

Hey, can I— can I say something? I don't wanna offend anyone, so I can't stress enough how much this next statement has no religious connotations whatsoever, but of all the holidays that you really look forward to as a kid, Easter is the only one that doesn't translate to adulthood.

Griffin:

Do you think? What do you mean?

Travis:

There's no baskets when you're an a... Like, okay, so when you're a kid you celebrate Christmas, and you're adult and of course Christmas rules. And then you get Halloween and then you get to be an adult and you get to drink and dress up.

Griffin:

Yeah, Hallo— Halloween gets better, I would say.

Travis:

Yeah, Halloween does get better. And like— and like Saint Patrick's Day just gets way more awesome when you get older.

Justin:

But why do you even have Saint Patrick's Day if you're kid? What are you doing?

Travis:

But then Easter, like, what's the adult equivalent of an Easter basket?

Justin:

Well, by most— most people see when they reach adulthood or so, they're so scared of dying is the thing. So this days is super wicked 'cause it means you get to like, live forever I guess.

Travis:

Mmm.

Griffin:

What about um, jello eggs? Ain't nothing wrong with that.

Travis:

[laughs] It's pretty cool.

Justin:

What about donut eggs man, you guys get those when you're...?

Travis:

Cake eggs.

Justin:

Fake eggs?

Travis:

Cake, cake, cake.

Justin:

Fake eggs are— are baller, 'cause you know it's like—

Griffin:

I like, I like rake eggs, which uh, they're eggs, they're so big you have to eat them with a rake.

Justin:

[laughs] These are delicious. Uh, this is My Brother, My Brother & Me, it's an advice show for the modern era. Uh, I'm Justin. Did we cover our names yet?

Travis:

I think we already did that.

Justin:

Thank you again to everyone who came out to see us perform live in Chicago.

Griffin:

On my birthday.

Justin:

Um, our next... On his birthday. Our next live show is in the works. Uh, no details yet, but um—

Travis:

I mean, you could always come see my one man show at the Chuckle Hut, uh, Fakin' the funk.

Justin:

Fakin' the Funk, starring Travis McElroy.

Griffin:

We can say where our live show will not be.

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

Like, West Coast, sorry guys.

Justin:

Sorry guys, eventually we'll get there.

Griffin:

We know that they—

Travis:

Until we set up a brother franchise out in the West Coast.

Griffin:

Yeah, we're like rallies. Like, we're sure there's a ton of people who— actually I'm sure because I see that info on our statistics page, that we have a lot of listeners in California, and soon we—

Justin:

We will get out there. Griffin and I will be out there in June, we just can't get Travis out there. Well, okay, we will— we will do, we will get out there eventually, that's promise to the west coast.

Griffin:

This nation is so goddamn gigantic, too big for its own good.

Justin:

Yeah, too big to fail.

Griffin:

Uh, if we could, if we could just get rid of the bread basket, we might be able to get over westward.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

But we can't do it now, because of bread basket.

Justin:

Yeah, sorry brask— basket. Um, so let's get into the uh, the questions? Or, we did need to talk about something else though.

Griffin:

Oh my God.

Justin:

Griffin, about what happened?

Griffin:

About my fucking psychic abilities.

Justin:

Yeah, about your ability to prognosticate into the future.

Griffin:

I need to stop making jokes, because apparently my jokes are future truths. And I don't wanna like, cause the end of the world with a future truth.

Travis:

Right.

Griffin:

I was... People sent me this link a lot this past week, this is from ESPN, which is like my favorite website. Uh, here's the headline, you ready? "PhillieBot to crank out first pitch." Yes, that's right, the— the University of Pennsylvania has crafted a one-armed, three-wheeled robot that threw out

the opening pitch before Wednesday's game between the Phillies and the Brewers at Phillie— at Phillie Diamond, that's what they call it.

Justin:

A robot.

Travis:

You know—

Griffin:

A mother fucking robot.

Travis:

They spent so much time thinking about if they could, they didn't stop to think about if they should.

Griffin:

Or if they could.

Travis:

Didn't that work?

Griffin:

Then I guess they did, they guess they like...

Justin:

They thought about that pretty hard 'cause they did.

Griffin:

Uh, the ball appeared to be traveling no more than 30 or 40 miles an hour. Do you know what this sounds like? To me, this sounds like a beard. It sounds to me like they're trying to throw off everyone's scent. Like, "Whoa, we made a little wacky robot. We put a pinwheel on him, isn't he harmless?" Justin:

The robot threw, yeah, 30/40 doesn't sound that bad until it's a robot that's eight feet away and it launches that at your brain.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Uh, so let's get right to the questions. Uh, "How do I get my roommate to stop chewing with his fucking mouth open? Whenever he eats something, I can hear his disgusting mouth noises from across the room. I've told him multiple times it makes you wanna vomit, but he still does it, what a fucking cow." Furious.

Griffin:

Wow.

Justin:

I hope he was typing this like as his roommate watched. [laughs] He's sitting there looking over his shoulder.

Travis:

Uh, you could do what Justin used to do whenever I chewed with my mouth open and just stand across the room going, "Ncah, ncah, ncah, ncah."

Justin:

Did it work?

Travis:

Yeah, it worked.

Justin:

Yeah, it worked.

Griffin:

Guys, I don't wanna... This may not be the best time to get into this.

Justin:

Why?

Griffin:

You both have bad mouth chewing policies and practices, you both chew poorly.

Travis:

Well, I don't take dainty bites, I take hefty bites.

Griffin:

Travis takes— Travis is like, in a— in a race. Travis is trying to figure out how few bites he can use to consume. 'Cause Travis is all about energy conservation and chewing burns those precious calories that he's gaining from eating his pizza bagel, so.

Travis:

My friend in uh, Trevor in college said I eat like I look like someone's about to take my food away from me. [laughs]

Griffin:

You do, like it's some sort of post-apocalyptic future and you've just found this can of gravy.

Travis:

God forbid anyone tries to move my bowl, I will take your hand off.

Justin:

Yeah, he's brutal.

Travis:

Um—

Justin:

Uh, uh, well, it's because he uh, it seems, sounds like you— sounds like a pretty good— pretty good uh, little ploy you used on there telling him that makes you wanna throw up.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

[laughs] I think you've tried the direct approach, maybe uh, maybe start stealing all the food in the house so he didn't have any food and then he has to eat somewhere else. What about that?

Griffin:

I'm gonna say, you give him the Sly Stallone treatment and you go right over the top, you smack and you jaw as loudly as you possibly can at every single thing that you eat. Like, if you could work moans into it. Like, [moans] like, you're getting some sort of like pseudo sexual satisfaction from that taco. I've eaten some pretty good tacos before actually.

Travis:

Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

... you wanna see it and you wanna hear it, and you really wanna add to that satisfaction by like, letting yourself know that you're doing a good job eating, and that the thing you're eating is making your mouth feel good. That's why I'm saying moan it up.

Justin:

By the way, if— if I ever if I say hey, what's up with all the eating noises? And you go to tell me that it's considered uh, high praise in some countries, you better fucking have a plane ticket in your pocket. That's uh, that's... 'Cause otherwise stop.

Griffin:

Justin:

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

Justin:

Is this a thing, referring to your bedroom as your secret space? Is this a thing? It didn't catch on here I guess.

Travis:

You know, I said that out loud and now I feel...

Justin:

"Go to your secret space Darryl." [laughs] What?

Griffin:

You— you should just be happy that he does make chewing sounds, 'cause what if he didn't have a mouth? Then you'd feel bad? What if you were deaf? What if you were deaf and you couldn't hear any sounds?

Justin:

[laughs] Celebrate.

Griffin:

Maybe count your blessings.

Travis:

Griffin.

Griffin:

What?

Travis:

You know what I need.

Griffin:

I do. Um, how about this? This one was sent in by GollyAOllie, thanks Sir or ma'am. It's by Yahoo Answers user, Big Jeff.

Justin:

Big Jeff?

Griffin:

Big Jeff asks, "Wrestling themed wedding? I wanna get married in a wrestling ring. I've got plenty of money to spend, my dad won the lottery in 2008. My girlfriend doesn't even like wrestling, but I do and I wanna get married in a wrestling ring and then I want Brock Lesnar to come in and beat the shit out everybody you know, like he does. And I want him to F5 my obese aunt."

Travis:

W— What?

Justin:

What?

Griffin:

I don't want a man to attack my new wife, so I want Kelly Kelly to out [laughs] and FU my girlfriend, which would be hot because my girlfriend is a little bigger than Kelly Kelly."

Justin:

Yeah, I bet. Judging from this question, I bet she's a little bigger, I think.

Griffin:

"I've only told my girlfriend I wanna get married in a wrestling ring and she hates it, frowny face emoticon."

Justin:

So you say, "Hey, do you wanna get married wrestling?" Uh, "No, I don't." Okay, well, what about this?"

Griffin:

Why don't I consult the internet, 'cause—

Justin:

Let me paint you a picture, I'm gonna move forward as though you said yes.

Griffin:

"I've got a loose outline. Um, it involves Kelly Kelly um, you know, your mom's sister, she's a little overweight, we're gonna get Brock Lesnar to F5 her."

Justin:

We're gonna get— we're gonna get Brock Lesnar to furiously try to reload your aunt.

Travis:

You know what's great? Because I don't know who any of these people are, he might as well be saying like completely made-up mythological names and—

Griffin:

Travis—

Travis:

... to me it's just completely insane.

Griffin:

... if Kelly Kelly is a real person who's become famous for professional wrestling, I'm gonna go hang myself.

Justin:

[laughs] What happened to Griffin, Kelly Kelly?

Griffin:

Kelly Kelly, he saw Kelly Kelly and hung himself.

Justin:

Man, this is a we... "Did you go to uh— did you go to did you go to Big Jeff's wedding?" "Yeah, it was pretty good, until the end. Brock Lester came, came down and beat the shit out everybody." "Who is that, is that a real person?" "Yeah, I think so, 'cause again. Apparently it is."

Travis:

It was like, 50 to one and he whooped everyone's ass.

Justin:

[laughs] You know, like he does.

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Like he does.

Justin:

Like he does, that's Brock Lesnar for you.

Griffin:

They put the cake at the top of the ladder, they had a ladder match. Brock actually won.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Of course. Although that would be his aunt, that fat mom's sister, she got right in there.

Justin:

After she got reloaded.

Travis:

In case anyone was wondering, I imagine that it's like, when you see a stand-up comic in like everyday life and you're like, "Be funny." I bet going up to a wrestler would be like, "Punch me." He's like, "Oh man, I— I'm off the clock, I don't— I don't wanna punch just—"

Griffin:

"I don't punch."

Justin:

Yeah, but presumably if uh, this Lesnar person is making an appearance at your soiree—

Travis:

He's still an individual.

Justin:

... he's been compensated richly for [laughs] the ass beating he's about to deliver to everyone like he does.

Griffin:

Is that wrestling fans are really like? Are they really like, uh, okay, if I— if I was a big wrestling fan and I met The Rock and The Rock beat the shit out of me, I don't think I'd be a wrestling fan anymore.

Justin:

[laughs] I think I'd— I think I'd be a litigant, actually. I think that I would be—

Griffin:

I think maybe find like another hobby.

Justin:

Yeah. Uh, I don't— I don't think that that would continue to be one of my... My real passion is wrestling, it really caught fire after Jake Snake Roberts kicked me in the crotch and then threw me down a well. [laughs]

Griffin:

"How was Big Jeff's wedding?" "It was okay. Uh, Instead of handing out rice to throw, they handed out folding chairs and [laughs] Booker T killed both of them with a folding chair. So probably not the best wedding."

Justin:

So, they're dead now.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

No problem.

Griffin:

I got my cuisinart back.

Justin:

[laughs] And I got to shake hands with Jimmy Superfly Snuka, so it was, it's pretty good, I guess. pretty good wedding overall.

Griffin:

It was a pretty good wedding, Ray Mysterio—

Justin:

It was officiated.

Griffin:

Ray Mysterio officiated.

Justin:

Oh, was it? I could've sworn that was Hacksaw Jim Duggan.

Travis:

Dammit, I was trying to come up with the Hacksaw Jim Duggan joke.

Justin:

Yeah, I just...You should've been like me and not come up with one, just say his name in some sort of context.

Travis:

Undertaker.

Justin:

Okay good.

Griffin:

What are we doing?

Justin:

Yeah, do you want my Paul Bearer impersonation? [laughs] "[high-pitched] Say yes, I do." You know what, I'm just assuming he's Christian, these could be Jewish services too. [laughs] They could be sm— they could smash a commemorative plastic cup at the end.

Griffin:

They could— they could hoist Big Jeff up on a chair and then pull it out from under him and hit him with it.[laughs]

Justin:

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Travis:

Justin:

Yeah, it will.

Griffin:

Oh my God, yeah. Instead of, here comes the bride, we get—

Travis:

Where you walk in your own fucking theme music and jump over the ropes.

Griffin:

Yeah. "It was so romantic, she walked down the aisle to crazy train. [laughs] There were fireworks and shit, it was pretty cool."

Justin:

Um, I think that this... I... Big Jeff, I- I usually don't try to get into uh, I don't— I don't get any of these things, I don't get into these sorts of conflicts but I think your wife, I think your wife is wrong on this one.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

I think you're right. Although it would suck if he showed up and they try to pull the Montreal Screwjob on him and he had to marry somebody else.

Griffin:

What's... Is that a— is that a—

Justin:

That's deep, that's a deep cut. There's one wrestling fan out there who just laughed. [laughs] Trust me, he is in stitches. Uh, hey, "I'm getting married later this year," wow, "I just found out that not one but possibly two of my groomsmen may not be able to make it to my wedding. They're both in the Navy, so their schedule is dictated by our commander-in-chief. What do I do? Should I find a couple of second stringers to take their place, or should I

make two of my other groomsmen walk down in the... down with two stinky, possibly cootie infested girls? Rich from Seattle."

Travis:

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Yeah. That's not a good— that's not a good framing for it.

Griffin:

Although they probably are not as good as two dudes who are in the Navy.

Justin:

Yeah, that's true.

Griffin:

Navy men, Naval officers.

Justin:

I hate to hear this, 'cause that's a tough, that's a tough one, 'cause you know, you- you want it to be those people. I mean, I'm sure they'd understand.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

But... I don't know.

Griffin:

You gotta— you gotta have a sit down with that commander-in-chief.

Travis:

Yeah, whattup Obama?

Griffin:

You gotta— you gotta go talk to Barry and you gotta figure it out.

Justin:

Say, "Listen, let's spin these schedules."

Griffin:

Hey, let's jaw for a second.

Justin:

Hey, hey, give me some of these Jelly beans.

Griffin:

Barry, I know you're busy.

Justin:

Barry— so help me work this out for a second, what is he asking here?

Griffin:

He wants to know if he, if it's... I think it's, what he's really asking is it, is it acceptable to have backups? Is it acceptable to have- to have uh... What's the theater term?

Travis:

Understudies.

Griffin:

Yeah, can you have that for a wedding?

Justin:

I don't understand though, he says, should he find second stringers take their places or should I make two of my other groomsmen walk down with two stinky possibly cootie infested girls? I'm not sure I understand.

Travis:

What... When... I think he's asking, do you have someone double up and like, take one bridesmaid with—

Justin:

Oh, oh two.

Travis:

Yeah, two bridesmaids on either side.

Justin:

Two each, okay.

Griffin:

Nice.

Justin:

Wow.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

That's a pretty—

Griffin:

When you do that you're no longer a groomsman, you're— you're a cocksman. [laughs]

Travis:

The problem is, is like-

Justin:

Who's this is ladies man?

Travis:

... if you don't get second stringers, if you don't get understudies, your side is gonna be out of balance from your bride side.

Justin:

Yeah, that's true and your bride is not gonna like that.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Whoa, hey speaking of which dog, why are you asking us? You are not making this decision, sir.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

[laughs] Sorry friend, you can have all the opinions you want about this, this is not up to you.

Griffin:

You know what you could do?

Justin:

What?

Griffin:

Wrestling wedding, and then it wouldn't matter if it was unbalanced. Cause it could... you could have a fucking Royal Rumble and you have-

Travis:

And you would think, oh you would think like, the two friends in the Navy they're out of town, but then they totally come in.

Justin:

Oh, shit, shit.

Travis:

They tag in and like, fucking, kicking dude in the face.

Justin:

"I thought they retired from weddings, this is amazing."

Griffin:

Oh my god, it's Drew Carey Kelly, Drew Carey's in the mix now. See, that's appropriate 'cause he was in the— he was in the Navy right? And he was in the Royal Rumble.

Justin:

"My groomsmen look a lot older than I remember them. [laughs] They don't look like they're in very good shape, but their face paint looks amazing."

Griffin:

Did you see Kelly Kelly? She looked so beautiful.

Justin:

[laughs] Assuming it's a she, she looks beautiful. Assuming Kelly Kelly is a woman, She's one of the— she's part of the GLOW right? The gorgeous Ladies of Wrestling, is that still an entity? Is that?

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

I haven't kept up, but I'm gonna assume.

Travis:

That is the most offensive name I've ever heard, is that really a title for a group?

Justin:

I don't think it's extant, but yes.

Travis:

Okay.

Justin:

Okay, I uh, they used to show Gorgeous— Gorgeous Ladies of Wrestling um, Saturday mornings I think.

Travis:

Um, I think you gotta go with two sec—

Justin:

Cardboard cutouts?

Travis:

... two second stringers.

Griffin:

Holograms.

Justin:

Holograms.

Griffin:

If you tell me that the Navy doesn't have that kind of technology, you can fuck right off because they all live in boats under the sea.

Justin:

What is the odds on cardboard cutouts? What is the situation with that? There's a... That the lady could like, just kinda carry down. What's about animatronics?

Travis:

Oh shit, I love animatronics. If you call the fungineers at Disney, they'll set you right up.

Justin:

The sorry?

Travis:

The fungineers.

Justin:

The fungineers?

Travis:

Yeah, the funions.

Griffin:

The imaginauts.

Justin:

The imaginauts.

Travis:

Imaginistas.

Griffin:

Guys listen, we don't need to give him— we don't need to give him— [laughs] We don't need to give a bunch of phony baloney bullshit answers, like cardboard cutouts and robots. Let's talk about holograms, let's talk about real tech.

Justin:

Will.i.am taught me this technology exists.

Griffin:

I have seen Wolf Blitzer made of light.

Travis:

[laughs] As opposed to the regular Wolf Blitzer that's made of pure darkness.

Justin:

[laughs] He's the most hateful man in America, that's the statistics. Rich, I think you gotta get backups. Just, just get two other guys you know sort of well. And if your roommates or your—your good groomsmen should happen to make it, you just gotta go give those guys the old heave-ho.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

And then bonus, if they kind of look like your two original choices and you only shoot him in wide shots.

Justin:

[laughs] That's good too, and then... but they do have to do their stunts.

Um, "Last year I met an incredible girl who I've since developed feelings for; unfortunately, she was in a relationship at the time. Recently however they've gone through a messy and drawn-out breakup uh, so now she's single, but seems to have a fair bit of baggage to deal with. I know she's interested in me and I think I can make her happy, the problem is that I've been with girls who just come out relationships before and it's always turned out pretty badly. [laughs]

Travis:

You know what? I—

Justin:

Travis:

... I've totally flipped, I'm with you Justin. What's the worst that's gonna happen? Like, so either you don't take a shot or you take a shot and it doesn't work out, the end result is still the same.

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

But what if you take that shot and it totally works out?

Justin:

Yeah, take that shot, there's— there's other girls, trust me.

Griffin:

I got another—

Justin:

Just take the shot and—

Griffin:

Here's another point. What if you—

Justin:

Yeah?

Griffin:

... what if you die before the end of this podcast?

Justin:

What if you should start... Here's what you should do.

Travis:

In fact bad news, you will die at the end of this podcast. We'll try to— we'll try to like, stretch it out as much as we can.

Justin:

You have one podcast left to live. If you only had one podcast left, how would you just spend it? With us I hope, but um—

Griffin:

Tim—

Justin:

Tim, you can just kinda, just call her right now.

Griffin:

Live like you were dying at the end of this podcast. [laughs]

Justin:

Come, pick it up, call her, fuck it, right? I mean, if it doesn't— if it doesn't work out, oh well, well you learned a valuable lesson.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Griffin:

Uh, This Yahoo was sent in by Louie Dog, thanks Louie dog.

Travis:

Louie.

Griffin:

It's by Yahoo Answers user Leprechaun Tori. Leprechaun Tori asks, "My best friend and I are starting up a babysitting company where we live and we need a name, any help?" Right, "She's 14 and I'm gonna be 14 in May, we are both CPR certified and we both most definitely wanna be babysitters. Our names are Asha, her and Victoria, me, but I like to be called Tori. Thank you to all who help in tribute. We had a name but we decided we didn't like it, it was Monsters and Fairy Tales, [laughs] but it didn't stick with us." Um...

Travis:

Babies, mothers incorporated?

Griffin:

Nope. Nope, no, that's really bad.

Justin:

No, that's pretty bad.

Griffin:

But marginally better than Monsters and Fairy Tales. [laughs] "Honey, look in the phone book for something um, relating to babysitters." "Oh, we got Monsters and Fairy Tales. I don't know what kind of service or product they provide though."

Justin:

What about the Snuggle Corps, is that good?

Griffin:

Like, C-O-R-P-S?

Justin:

Yes, C-O-R-P-S.

Griffin:

What about the Snuggle Army?

Justin:

That is also my favorite, it's my favorite genre by the way right now. Snugglecore, have you heard of it? [laughs] It's really good.

Griffin:

That's what hinder is right? I've never heard of hinder.

Justin:

Hinder is snugglecore.

Griffin:

Let me just, lemme drop some—

Justin:

What about Enron? [laughs] They're not using that anymore.

Griffin:

The Enron of babysitting. [laughs] um, there's... I have a few Yahoo uh, responses. Um—

Justin:

Oh good.

Griffin:

... John says, "Perstige Worldwide."

Justin:

Wait what? Perstige?

Griffin:

Yeah. Like, prestige, only you spell it wrong 'cause you're 14. Is kinda like how Kidz Bop has like, a Z, and the Z is also backwards.

Justin:

[laughs] Sure, okay. Hey, also Kidz Bop. You're pretty good.

Griffin:

Um, Adriana says, "Super Sitters, Care for Critters."

Justin:

What?

Griffin:

Care for Kids.

Travis:

That is misleading.

Griffin:

Asha and Tori, the two that complete the story.

Justin:

Wait, what?

Griffin:

Asha and Tori, more for the glory.

Justin:

What? What? What are they? Are they— are they barbarians? [laughs] What is their— what is their career? More for the glory? “This was some glorious babysitting today Tori, aye.”

Travis:

“The night is ours.”

Justin:

“Twas. We shall— we shall bathe this day in Valhalla.”

Griffin:

Youngsters helping the young ones.

Justin:

That's good 'cause you wanna— you wanna get— you wanna really reinforce that you're leaving your children with children, other children.

Travis:

Yeah, irresponsible children watching children.

Griffin:

Babies helping babies.

Justin:

Bar— barely out of Puberty Inc. 50/50 chance.

Griffin:

The circle of baby help. You could call it, who's babysitting who?

Justin:

Who let the babies out? We would never. That's... What about that? That's pretty good, right?

Griffin:

Um, Ronson Rurgrats. See, there you have trademark issues with both the candy in the television.

Justin:

You gotta get some Zs in there.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

You gotta get some Zs.

Griffin:

Runzz.

Justin:

Runzzzz.

Travis:

Zrunz.

Griffin:

And Ruggratz. What about rug with two Gs [laughs] to make it hard?

Justin:

[laughs] This is the most street babysitting outfit I think ever, pretty much. If you want street babysitting that's just really raw and really what's happening today, get rugggg and ratz.

Griffin:

It's— it's hard to uh, to— to get on this baby's level unless you are a street as it is. We're talking like, fresh out of the womb, their babies were are so street— so streetwise.

Justin:

So what... Since your baby was fresh out the womb, it's been so street, Where do you find care that matches that level of real core authenticity?

Griffin:

I find it with Ruggratz.

Justin:

Oh.

Griffin:

It's got two Gs and Z, and the Z is backwards in the phone book. I didn't know they could do.

Justin:

They're gonna have to pay a premium for that.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

But I think it's gonna be worth it. Does Yahoo have any other—

Travis:

I want you guys to know that I zoned out 'cause I started picturing street babies.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

And it made me really happy.

Justin:

Yeah. I mean, I think it's a pretty positive mental image, but if only we could write some jokes about it too. Like, if we— we can't get lost along the path here, you gotta—

Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Everybody, get this picture in your mind that Travis is painting, really think about it. [laughs]

Travis:

Griffin:

Good.

Justin:

Rug life, okay, love it.

Griffin:

Is this... What is that baby listening to? Baby Tupac?

Justin:

[laughs] It's reincarnated Tupac. No, trick question, no trick question, Tupac's still alive, so it's not reincarnated Tupac.

Travis:

Except it's T-W-O PAC. [laughs]

Justin:

'Cause he's two, terrible Tupac. [laughs]

Griffin:

He's— he's lis— he's listening to uh... Ah fuck, what was the Lamb Chop? Big—

Justin:

Good, Biggie, fuck.

Griffin:

Lamb Chop but also [laughs] Biggie. Lamb Chomp and Biggie.

Justin:

Oh fuck, you are zinging this one. [laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs] Listen— listen guys, [laughs] listen—

Justin:

Listen, wait, hold on, don't go, don't go.

Griffin:

Muppet babies, only Biggie's in the mix. [laughs]

Justin:

Muppet babies but... but gangsters.

Griffin:

Teletubbies and— and also Busta.

Justin:

[laughs] Telebustas.

Griffin:

Fuck, no. See; obviously, these jokes aren't working. Just do it yourself.

Justin:

Just wait, please wait. Listen, we could get you to there, but we want you to start making jokes on your own.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

The magic was in you the whole time.

Griffin:

[laughs] Just imagine thug babies and you're there.

Justin:

Ah, okay. Listen, we've- we've stalled for long enough uh, I— I think personally, I think we've— we've waited uh, for this— for this journey we're about to take right now. Just a bunch of friends headed to the Money Zone.

[music plays]

Justin:

So listener Curtis Warley, who wants us to wish his friend, his dear friend Robin [inaudible]. [laughs] I'm sorry, I tried.

Griffin:

Rob Mumblebop.

Justin:

Rob Mumblebop, Rob Movie— Mulvihill? Yeah, that's it, That's good. Rob Mulvihill.

Griffin:

I like Mumblebop better.

Justin:

All right. Rob Mumblebop, a very happy 27th birthday. Rob is a huge fan of MBMBaM. We are a little late on this one, his birthday— his birthday was April 2nd.

Griffin:

Oh okay. Only 23 days late.

Justin:

Hey, when you go, when you go belated you go MBMBaM, that's our— that's our new uh, sales angle that we're using. Uh, so— so tell me some things about Rob, Griffin, hit me with some Rob-toids, as we say.

Griffin:

Um, well, his name is very short.

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

Very, very easy to spell. Very quick if you're on... if you're doing a standardized test, that's only three bubbles.

Justin:

It trips off the tongue.

Griffin:

Right off the next one, Rob Mumblebop, right off the tongue. [laughs]

Justin:

No, you're still doing that wrong, but go right ahead. Tell me more, I'm intrigued.

Griffin:

Uh, you know what the— you know what the Bops favorite team is?

Travis:

Tell me.

Griffin:

The Detroit Red Wings.

Justin:

Perfect.

Griffin:

They play hockey.

Justin:

Love it.

Griffin:

Curtis Warley uh, included this on is enumerated list of Rob features.

Justin:

[laughs] Yeah. So the bold voice for Rob?

Griffin:

He did this right to the Rob-tone and he wrote um, "Detroit Red Wings" parenthesis, hockey team. Thank Curtis. 'Cause we're idiot babies.

Justin:

Thanks Curtis, for the vote of confidence.

Travis:

There are some people on this show that appreciate that kind of insight.

Justin:

[laughs] What about his favorite metal band now? If I, if you had to pick one, what would you narrow down?

Griffin:

Um, it actually doesn't say. Here's the thing, Curtis, I don't wanna make... Curtis paid for this message um, to honor Rob, so I don't wanna make it all about Curtis, but I feel like I have to give him some advice. Uh, as far as list making goes, 'cause he wrote some things about Bob. Underoath. You don't say? Is he in Underoath? 'Cause that'd be pretty fresh? Is it a band that he likes, is that a band he doesn't like?

Justin:

[laughs] He hates Underoath, you should see him.

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

He has a beard for all occasions.

Justin:

He did a good job with this next one though, he's a drummer. See, that's—that we could work with.

Griffin:

Yeah, we can make some giggles about that, but beards? He's got a beard on his chin, he's got a beard on his beard. His nose has a beard, it's called a mustache, [laughs] but he calls it his nose beard. That's why I love Mumblebop, he's got a way with words.

Justin:

Mumblebop, happy birthday. Uh, sorry about your friend Curtis, he— he does, his heart's in the right place, God bless him. He knew that he wanted—

Griffin:

But his list making abilities are in oblivion, they're in space, he doesn't possess them.

Justin:

There— they might as well not exist. Our other uh, uh, special, special message this week is from PC perspective. Back, our first—

Griffin:

Oush.

Justin:

... very first—

Griffin:

Can't get enough.

Justin:

... repeat sponsor.

Griffin:

I heard that their industry and business numbers—

Justin:

Yeah, just really good.

Griffin:

... their sums, their money calculations um, supply and demand, I hear it all went up 400%.

Travis:

Whoa wow, right through that glass ceiling.

Justin:

[laughs] That's what that means.

Griffin:

Smashed right through it. We gave them— we gave them a tune and we gave him that sponsorship and everyone's like, "Oh, I gotta I get it."

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

They got so horny for PCs.

Justin:

Now Griffin, what this... we... what does PC stand for again?

Griffin:

Uh, it stands for Prickly Cactus.

Justin:

Prickly Cactus?

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Think about it, I'm not quite sure that's right. PC perspective is a great spot for information, in depth reviews on PC components and technology news. They got a hardware leaderboard at pcper.com/hwlb, great page for recommendations in new PC builds without having to dive into tons of details.

Griffin:

Guess what guys?

Justin:

Hit me.

Griffin:

I just checked the leaderboard.

Justin:

How's your rig?

Griffin:

My rig is number three.

Travis:

Whoa

Justin:

Whoa.

Travis:

Whoa.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

That's a big... That's a good rig.

Griffin:

The only people who—

Justin:

I bet it's puttin' out polygons like nobody's bizz.

Griffin:

... the people who are above me are; Bill Gates and the... Apple Bill Gates.

Justin:

Apple Bill Gates?

Griffin:

Uh-huh.

Justin:

Just wow, and— and he's a PC user, huh?

Griffin:

Uh-huh.

Justin:

It seems odd to me.

Griffin:

It is weird. Hey, know thy enemy.

Justin:

[laughs] If you wanna discuss how odd that is, you should go to PC performance. Uh, they got a podcast pcper.com/podcast uh, where they tell you about uh, PC stuff. Uh, it doesn't have as many jokes as ours, but unlike ours there is some worth uh, to listen to.

Travis:

I hope they will actually better your life in some way.

Griffin:

I hope that they have jingles about us.

Justin:

Yeah, I hope they've written a jingle or two about our show uh, My Brother, My Brother & Me, instead of my show— I'm not saying it on the track, start again. Uh, uh, so go to pcper.com. Um, so what have you— what have you worked up so far?

Griffin:

I didn't... You know what? I've been working on it all morning trying to get a jingle together.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

So that we can combine the magic of Rob Mumblebop and um, PC Perspective and the services that they both offer. Um, [clears throat] and I'd like to take everyone back. I'd like to take everyone back on a journey with me to, I would say the soundtrack of the year 2001. Do you think 2001?

Justin:

Griffin:

What have you listened to it?

Justin:

What?

Griffin:

Have you listened to the pcpwr podcast?

Justin:

Well, you know what? I did. Uh, I did. Uh, Rob, I did not catch him.

Griffin:

Lemme ask you a second question to follow up.

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

Have you seen Gone 60 seconds?

Justin:

[laughs] Yeah.

Griffin:

Because like, I don't feel like you guys got this song, like you guys got the goof or the spoof.

Justin:

"I have a friend who's a girl, I'm a guy, who steals all my male friends. Uh, I'll meet someone new and then as soon as they meet this girl, they start hanging out with her instead of me, a fact she constantly reminds me of. I've got a chance to win back her most recent theft at a wedding all three of us are attending, I need some good advice. What can I do to win back this bromance? Thomas."

Travis:

You know it was funny we should get that question. Um-

Justin:

No, this is not a spoof, this is not a goof.

Travis:

.... not, I don't know an hour or two later we received this question, "I have a friend who's a guy that claims I keep stealing his bros because they end up calling me to hangout instead of him. But I can't help that one, I'm more fun to hang out with, and two, I'm a girl. He's currently trying to claim our newest Canadian friend for himself, how can I keep from bo— him boxing me out of this friendship? An upcoming wedding is the next time we all hang out in the same place—

Griffin:

Holy shit.

Travis:

... is that the best time to make my move? Obviously, I'll be looking hot. Daniel." Or Danielle.

Justin:

[laughs] I think probably, yeah.

Griffin:

Danielly.

Justin:

I think he's got it on that second pass, but—

Griffin:

Um, this is incredible. Has this ever happened before?

Justin:

This is a dueling—

Griffin:

"Hey Brothers, I hate Jeff. Love Mark." Hey, Brothers, I hate Mark. [laughs] Love Jeff."

Justin:

[laughs] Um, I uh... Man, is I toughie. I feel like Thomas... What... There's something in Thomas' question where he does not realize this sort of like, insurmountable millennial long odds that he's up against here.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Like, it's the— like it's the basic heartbeat of the species that is- that is thwarting you.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Not anything about you personally.

Griffin:

Um, I got... guys, I don't wanna keep beating at that horse here, but the best solution is WeddingMania 29.

Justin:

[laughs] Again?

Griffin:

Again.

Justin:

You sma— you smash Thomas with a folding chair.

Griffin:

A WrestleWedding-

Travis:

Three friends enter, two friends leave.

Griffin:

See, that's what we do. Another—

Justin:

That's pretty brilliant.

Griffin:

... we get another ladder match. We put your friends on top of the ladder and then Thomas and Danielle, or Danielly, they just go right at it.

Travis:

I wanna know what kind of cruel intentions like, where all these two people are living in that they are constantly competing over new friends.

Justin:

"Hey, did you st— did you stee— steal Phillip from me?" "What you mean like? We went to Denny's last night. Is that what you mean?" Like...

Travis:

"You son of a bitch."

Griffin:

"You son of a bitch." Last night—

Travis:

"You got another one Daniel."

Justin:

"Denny this was our special place. You asshole."

Travis:

"And I told you that in confidence."

Justin:

[laughs] "I told you about the... how good their griddle cakes are, just with secret, I thought was a secret."

Travis:

Why can't you just all be friends?

Justin:

Dude, why can't you all three be friends? Is like, every guy wants to... is that the thing, is this like— like, is there a third, is there another perspective from a friend who's like, "I was hanging out with this guy and he had a sexy friend and then I hung out with her and now she's... they're both getting weird about it."

Travis:

They just cry all the time.

Griffin:

It sounds like Danielle is saying that Thomas kinda sucks to hang out with.

Justin:

Thomas, like—

Travis:

He is a great uh, facilitator of new friendships. He's like a realtor of friendships.

Griffin:

Oh, so Thomas brings them in and then Danielle is the one who closes?

Justin:

Right, exactly.

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

That's bullshit man. Danielle, you gotta pass some of that— some of that sweet friendship juice back to Thomas.

Justin:

Pass it on down, pass it down the line. Share with your buddy.

Travis:

To be fair, Danielle's not doing anything wrong. She's just better than Thomas.

Justin:

Yeah. She's got boobs and stuff.

Griffin:

Listen, nobody is saying that Thomas'... Nobody's saying Danielle isn't better than Thomas. Like, that much is obvious just from there. [laughs] You know how many emoticons uh, Thomas used on his email? Zero, you know what I mean?

Justin:

I don't know how he's feeling? He's like— it's like talking to data.

Griffin:

Danielle used one, and it was a winky face, which is my very favorite emoticon.

Justin:

Oh, really?

Travis:

Thomas, you know it helps? Don't refer to your friendships as bromances.

Justin:

Yeah, that would... that probably scared them off.

Travis:

"I just met this new guy and we're in a bromance, why doesn't he wanna hang out anymore?"

Griffin:

"We got fly dude kisses all the time."

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

I think he's a real bromosexual, just like myself and I really love hanging out with him.

Can we start referring to like... [laughs] Can we start calling like, high fives in fist pounds and like, chest bumps? Can we just refer to those as dude kisses from now on? [laughs]

Justin:

"Just gave him a big bro smooch, it's not a big thing."

Travis:

"I gave him a double fist pound, it was real European."

Justin:

[laughs] It's how they do it there.

Griffin:

I'm gonna get dude kisses going, I'm gonna get it started.

Justin:

I think you should, I think that would be cracking.

Griffin:

Um, Danielle, stop being so— stop being so fucking greedy. Thomas is so lonely.

Travis:

Leave Thomas, be more awesome.

Justin:

Why don't you go back in the annals the history? Find a friend that you don't like anymore and give it back to Thomas.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Oh, so you're saying like, hand me down friends?

Justin:

Exactly. Like—

Griffin:

Hand me down friends. Make new friends, keep the old and give some to Thomas, yeah.

Justin:

Give some back to Thomas, yeah. He'll appreciate it.

Griffin:

Think of it as a frie— a friendship tax, 'cause Thomas does a lot for you, visa the getting you friends.

Justin:

Exactly.

Griffin:

You gotta kick back like, 20% back to him.

Travis:

A finder's fee.

Griffin:

10% in the social security, so that when you're old and like ready for death uh, you have some friends there waiting for you.

Justin:

Griffin, Yahoos, I need some.

Griffin:

Okay. Um, I found these, I found two and I'm gonna try and combine them into one super question, 'cause they're topical.

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

Uh, alright, here we go. Yahoo answers user Prego asks; "What to do for Easter with no kids?" [laughs] "My husband and I have no kids. Well, we are expecting." Congratulations.

Justin:

Way to go guys.

Griffin:

"Are there— are there any ideas that we can do for Easter? I think it's gonna be raining Sunday too, something fun like a sexy egg hunt or something."

Travis:

Excuse me?

Justin:

Sorry?

Griffin:

Like a sexy egg hunt or something.

Justin:

It's the world's fas— it's the world's fastest egg hunt, that's one left out.

Griffin:

Um, Yahoo answers user Corsair asks, "What are some good ideas my boyfriend's Easter eggs? My boyfriend and I are being silly this year and having an egg hunt and we're filling each other's eggs with little things. I filled about half with candy but I need some cute sexy ideas to fill the rest. Uh, I'd like a few of them to be rather suggestive but nothing is coming to mind. The trick is that whatever it is, it has to fit inside of one of those plastic eggs, help." So, two questions.

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

Travis:

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

You saying it was death.

Justin:

Griffin:

You guys are—

Travis:

I actually, this year I invented something new for Easter and it's called um, a Solo Solitaire Egg Hunt. What you do is, you take a couple ambien and then you hide some eggs—

Justin:

Okay.

Travis:

... and then you wake up and you try to remember where you put them eggs.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

That's pretty good. What do you put—

Griffin:

After the swe— the sweet veil of ambient has been lifted from your eyes.

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

You go searching memento style for your—

Travis:

And inside the eggs, more ambien.

Griffin:

Everybody wins.

Justin:

[laughs] Have a great night.

Griffin:

Happy— happy birthday Jesus.

Justin:

Maybe fill it with lube. [laughs] "Hey, I found your... Ah fuck, what is this?"

Griffin:

Oh no. You saying lo— you're saying loose lube, not like a one—

Justin:

I'm saying loose lube,

Griffin:

... not like a one shot, like uh, like the beginning of—

Justin:

I'm saying— I'm saying when they uh, when they open it, I want it to look like the world's worst pinata, just everywhere just lube spraying like in jets.

Travis:

Oh my god, there's lube everywhere.

Griffin:

"Honey in one egg I've hidden lube, in one egg I just emptied it out and squeeze it [laughs] and you... we gots to keep them straight."

Justin:

Wait, this is so important, these are jellos that's in here, enjoy.

Griffin:

Um, a lot of people are saying that this is distasteful.

Justin:

Oh yeah? Just because of the whole Jesus thing right? The whole—

Griffin:

It is— it's a religious holiday, um—

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

... and like, I get it, I get it you guys. It is maybe not the intended way to spend the holiday.

Justin:

I get it.

Griffin:

But, I can't... I'm so down with it, like, I'm so down with their— their pioneering.

Travis:

Here's my main problem with it, with all this talk of like, sexy egg hunts and all this stuff, how did they bypass painting up your scrotum to look like an Easter egg?

Griffin:

[pause] Justin, um—

Justin:

Yeah, [laughs]. What's up?

Griffin:

What if you hid the eggs all over your body, like a— like one of those, you turn yourself into a sushi platter, you turn yourself into like a playground where you've hidden a bunch of eggs.

Justin:

A wonderland perhaps.

Griffin:

A wonderland of eggs, of hidden— hidden away eggs. Um, I mean—

Justin:

[sings] I just looked in your armpit, checked right between your butt cheeks.
[laughs]

Griffin:

Right? You get, hey, lift up these— lift up these fat boobs.

Justin:

[sighs] Bound to be one behind your knees.

Griffin:

Uh-huh .

Justin:

[sighs] Your body is an egg hunt.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

[sings] Looking inside your ear canal, your body is an egg hunt.

Griffin:

Ah Christ. Um, put a condom in that egg, you silly.

Justin:

Silly, it's easy, silly goose. Hey, I wanna hear [laughs] Griffin's last question. Uh, but first uh, uh, a few quick housekeeping things. Again, thank you everybody who came out in Chicago, it was a great time.
