... cherished day, it would be assumed-


#### **Griffin:**

Except for maybe-


#### **Travis:**

Travis: (laughs)
Griffin: Yahoo Answers-
Travis: Here's a hard candy.
Griffin: This- this question was sent into us by Cheesecake Jones. Um, and I think you, you know what it is. Uh, it's a Yahoo Answers question from Lindsey O'Malley, who asks "What does my son mean? ### Justin:

#### Travis:

### Justin:

<b>Justin:</b> Sweet-
<b>Griffin:</b> That-
<b>Justin:</b> Sweet-
<b>Griffin:</b> Cheddar!
<b>Justin:</b> Cheddar.
<b>Griffin:</b> That I buy with the money.
<b>Travis:</b> These Siberian tiger puppies aren't gonna pay for themselves.
<b>Justin:</b> Yep.
Travis: Wait, are tigers puppies?
<b>Justin:</b> Are you riding your tiger again during the show? We said-
<b>Travis:</b> Yes.
Justin: during the show, you wouldn't.

Travis:

But he's so epic.

### Justin:

Have Gregor feed him a steak and keep him out the room for like an hour.

### **Travis:**

### **Travis:**

(laughs)

### Justin:

No one would. That's who, Gregg. You are the only Gregg we have, Gregg. Don't leave us without your Greggness.

### **Travis:**

### Justin:

There it is. Come on, Gregg.

#### **Griffin:**

Also, um-

### Justin:

And you can always call us, Gregg. (laughs)

### **Griffin:**

Also, speed. Gives you that extra-

#### **Travis:**

Yeah.

### **Griffin:**

... that extra boost you need to-

#### **Travis:**

Just a little bump.

### **Griffin:**

Just a little bumperoo to help you finish studying for that exam.

#### **Travis:**

(whispering) Don't do drugs.

#### Justin:

Don't do drugs. (laughs) I'm currently a senior in high school. I'm not. That's not true. Uh, but Cony is, from Gmail. And Cony says, "I'm in charge of making our prom go on without a hitch. Do you, as the wizards of cool-"

#### **Griffin:**

Mm-hmm (affirmative)

### Justin:

### Justin:

#### Justin:


All dried up down there. It's like a desert. And, but, if you get to fif-, uh, so here's my suggestion. Have a kid, just don't get like super invested.
