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Intro (Bob Ball): The McElroy brothers are not experts, and their advice should never be followed. Travis insists he's a sexpert, but if there's a degree on his wall, I haven't seen it. Also, this show isn't for kids, which I mention only so the babies out there will know how cool they are for listening. What's up, you cool baby?

[theme music plays]

Justin:

Like the Chilean miners emerging.

Griffin:

You can't bust that out every week, Justin.

Justin:

[laughs] crashing... [laughs] from the ground- like Chilean miners.

Griffin:

Is that a... is that a reboot? Is that what this is? Are we refreshing the franchise?

Travis:

This is just celebrating the hardworking miners of Chile.

Griffin:

What?

Travis:

This isn't, like, about anything. I'm just glad that they're there.

Griffin:

Ah, yeah. My, um, my spring break is coming up, too. You wanna maybe go to Chile? Maybe we could go chill on the beaches of Chile.

Justin:

[laughs] We just emerged- like Chilean miners emerging from a mine, we have returned for another week of... you know, a lot of people... a lot of people liked that when I did it right after those famous guys came out.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

So I thought what if I brought it back? [laughs] I mean, Chilean miners are still coming out of mines.

Griffin:

Sure, yeah.

Justin:

[crosstalk]. Like, on the reg.

Griffin:

They haven't... they haven't stopped, I hope.

Justin:

Right? They... I mean, they're going in there getting butane and gold. I don't know [laughs].

Griffin:

They're getting butane?! They go down there with just plastic shopping bags and they just scoop up the bute.

Justin:

[laughs]. So, we're back for, for a, a, second run on the Max Fun Network. Thank you so much for rejoining us. This is My Brother, My Brother and Me, an advice show for the modern era. I am Justin McElroy.

Travis:

I am Travis McElroy.

Griffin:

I'm Griffin McElroy.

Justin:

You've got to pry that Chilean miner bit from my cold, dead hands. Um, uh... but, again, we've reemerged. Second week on Max Fun Network. Uh, the response from you guys was so, so nice, um, it really meant a lot.

Uh, if you haven't been to the forums yet, uh, over at Max Fun, there's a lot of good discussion, both MBMBaM and MBMBaM-non-related, um, so move

over there and- there's a thread, a new Max Fun podcast, My Brother, My Brother and Me, you can introduce yourself, say hi. But, um, everybody is getting acquainted there. Let's get acquainted here... with some wisdom. Let's go with our first question. What do you guys say? Just get into it.

Travis:

Yes.

Justin:

Alright? Get deep. "My friends keep on telling me that if I don't go to my senior prom, I'll regret it. Personally, I don't care for dancing and wasting money. Is this one of those things that I'll regret not doing when I'm old? Anti-Footloose, Gmail." [laughs].

Griffin:

Hmm.

Travis:

I actually made up that name because they didn't attach one and I really wanted to talk about Footloose.

Justin:

[laughs] Oh good, oh good!

Griffin:

Good, Travis.

Justin:

This show has become a construction.

Griffin:

That's a...

Justin:

It's just...

Griffin:

Isn't that, isn't that perjury? Isn't that what that is? Isn't that illegal?

Travis:

I, I don't believe so.

Justin:

[crosstalk] This guy. No, but I, I, I think it, it's definitely about the ritual. Like, it's not inherently fun, um, but you'll be kind of a lonely heart, I think, if you don't go, right?

Griffin:

Uh, you, you have to go.

Justin:

You have to go.

Travis:

Yeah, the thing is, like, this is that future, present tense, time travel thing. Look to the future 20 years from now. You don't wanna be the person that, you know, says "Oh no I, I didn't go to my senior prom," because everyone you tell that to will go, "Oh, why not?" Like, you have to go. It's, it's part of your growing up, it's part of life.

Justin:

Plus, there's gotta be a girl you can ask. There's, there's always a girl. I know you don't like wasting money and dancing but it's not like- you'll, you'll be surprised how little of, of the dancing you'll actually do, and it's not a waste. It's like, you know, it's like a traditional... I don't know.

Travis:

Well, most importantly, you only get one shot at it. It's not like, "Well, I don't wanna go now. I'll try again in five years." Like, this is your only chance to go to your senior prom.

Justin:

That's a good point, yeah.

Travis:

So like...

Griffin:

That's actually, that's actually a common misconception, Travis. You can keep going to high school dances after you have, uh, after you've left that particular educational institution.

Justin:

Which reminds me, uh, we do need to wrap this show early. I, I need to get over to Skeffington's to pick up, pick up my tails.

Griffin:

[laughs] Oh, nice. Um, yeah it's gonna be rough, Anti-Footloose, it's gonna be bad. You're not gonna have a... I, I can't think... I, I don't know, I never looked forward to my formal dances whenever I was, um, whenever I was in high school. I actually almost skipped one, uh, 'cause I was gonna go stag, uh, but instead, like, I would just stay at home and I played EverQuest.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Uh, for most of the night. Uh, I mean, it was right after the Dungeons of Norrath expansion came out so like, you know, [crosstalk].

Justin:

Sure, sure, yeah, you had to go over to Kunark.

Griffin:

But I did end up going. You gotta, you gotta pay the money. It's just, you gotta pay your dues and maybe, um, you know, you'll, you'll rub your wiener on a butt to hip-hop music. Like...

Justin:

Yeah, who knows?

Griffin:

... that's, there's an exchange there.

Justin:

It is a trade-off. But yeah, you'll regret it if you don't go. Years from now.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Maybe not immediately but... and it won't be like, it won't be fun, but at least you'll have been there. And you can lie about it later and say... it's also a really good excuse to ask somebody out when you've been trying to work up the nerve, because everybody needs a date. Nobody wants to go solo.

Travis:

Mm-hmm [affirmative]. Yeah.

Justin:

Um, so, so take advantage of that and prey on their desperation.

"What should I do about a girl in my class who is a terrible buzzkill? She always inserts herself into everyone's conversations and ruins the fun by talking about her divorced parents, human trafficking, or 9/11."

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Wow!

Justin:

Was that good Trav? Get, like, a little chuckle?

Travis:

I think that person would be awesome.

Justin:

Got a little chuckle from 9/11. Good, good.

Travis:

I, I just, I'm trying to imagine that conversation. It's like, "Do you guys wanna go to Chipotle for lunch, or do you maybe wanna hit up [unintelligible]?"

"Hey, by the way, that reminds me, 9/11."

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

"I, I remember the last, uh, I remember the last time I went to Chipotle, it's when my divorced parents sold me into slavery. If I remember correctly it was September 11th. Have a good, have a good burrito. Enjoy, enjoy your meal. Sorry, I didn't mean to bumme all over your chips [laughs]."

Griffin:

[laughs] "What is it... did you get the spicy aioli? That's nice. Do you know who loves that? Osama Bin Laden. He gets it in his beard."

Justin:

"Hmm, are you gonna get vegetables? I'll tell you about a vegetable I know, I remember: Terri Schiavo."

[all laugh]

Griffin:

Whoa!

Justin:

Whoa!

Travis:

Whoa!

Justin:

Terri Schiav... no? It's not, it's not time for the Shive to come back on a, with a...

Griffin:

No, not, not quite.

Justin:

... hilarious punchline?

Griffin:

You may have jumped the gun a little bit there.

Justin:

[laughs] A little bit, but somebody's gotta push into the light, right? Somebody's gotta, uh, determine how, how long, uh, you know, the deadline is on stuff like that. I would say...

Travis:

I'd let that one simmer for like another six months.

Justin:

I'd say you've gotta try to trump them. No matter how dark they go, you've gotta go darker. Like, divorced parents, go Batman. Just talk about dead parents. They, they won't... they won't see that coming. Push them into a darker place until you're bumming *them* out and maybe they'll get the message.

Travis:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Griffin:

I, I have a way better idea.

Justin:

Oh, good.

Griffin:

Uh, yeah.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

Wait, better than bringing up Terri Schiavo?

Griffin:

No, no it has nothing to do with that. Why don't you, uh, learn to play and then constantly carry around a cornet, uh, or a small trumpet, uh, and just carry it around and anytime she opens her mouth to say literally anything, just start playing, like, a happy little, like, St. Louis jazz number. Just like a-

Justin:

[imitates jazz trumpet]

Griffin:

Yeah, yeah. Like, uh, like, uh, little bit of, little bit of Zatarain's. Like, just get in there, like, right in her face and just like [imitates jazz trumpet]. Like, nobody can, well, *speak* first of all...

Justin:

Yeah, no one can talk.

Griffin:

... or be sad.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

When they hear that music.

Justin:

Who could be sad? "Uh, that's an interesting point you just made about, uh, about super AIDS sweeping across Africa. I'd like to counter with some zydeco. [crosstalk] buckle in." Uh, so either super dark or super light. Griffin, do you have like a Yahoo, uh, for us that we... a Yahoo answers request?

Griffin:

Sure, sure, sure. I have a few. Uh, how about this one? It was sent in by, uh, Jonathan Bartram. Thank you, Jonathan Bartram. It's by Yahoo Answers user Dr. Know It All, who asks...

Justin:

That's an ironic [laughs] that's an unfortunate name for a Yahoo Answers user.

Griffin:

I have been sold a false bill of goods here. Uh, Dr. Know it All, uh, asks, "If you lived on a beach and overnight all of the sand miraculously turned to cocaine what would you do?"

Justin:

[laughs] Dr. Blow it All, that's who he... not [unintelligible]. He mistyped. Uh...

Griffin:

Um...

Justin:

Well, snow angel right? Blow angel first.

Griffin:

Yeah, well, you make an angel in that sweet, sweet coca but that seems pretty obvious. Uh, coca castles?

Travis:

Well, I think the first thing I would do is contact the Pope and say there's been a miracle.

Griffin:

Yeah. Um...

Travis:

Um..

Justin:

Coke miracle. First, alert the authorities. I can't- [laughs] you can't, you can't take any chances with this. Um...

Griffin:

It just seems dangerous, right? Like, it just seems like dangerous, like kids could wander in there.

Justin:

Just get, yeah, [crosstalk]

Travis:

Because if I know one thing about the beach, sand gets everywhere.

Griffin:

Hey what about, what about some, some answers?

Justin:

Yeah, what is, what is...

Griffin:

What if I just read some of the special help that, um...

Justin:

Yeah, what do people say?

Griffin:

Steven Adler says, "Clean the beach."

[muffled laughter]

Justin:

What?

Griffin:

Seems like it would be pretty tough.

Justin:

[laughs] Yeah, it's all, it's all cocaine.

Griffin:

Just get in there with a fucking Swiffer WetJet and get all the coca up. Uh, Alessa says, "Die of cocaine overdose." That's a pretty good plan, I guess. Two people, two people rated that answer as good. Cool.

Justin:

[laughs] Pretty good answer. Pretty... it is the apocalypse, you might as well wrap it up. I mean...

Griffin:

Holy Phoenix, Holy Phoenix said, "Get rawed the fuck out."

Justin:

Wait, wait, what?

Griffin:

How do you get...

Travis:

Excuse me?

Griffin:

Get rawed...

Justin:

Get... how... spell that for me.

Griffin:

He... R-A-W-E-D. He went ahead and, uh, he took the word raw...

Justin:

Just extended.

Griffin:

And he done, he done verbed it.

Justin:

[laughs] He verbed it out.

Griffin:

So, get rawed the fuck out. Uh...

Justin:

[laughs] "I... how rawed are you right now? I'm pretty rawed. I have been sniffing this beach for a half hour." You know what irritates me is when you see the dealers out there dumping huge bags of flour. It's like gift horse in the mouth, you know?

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Like they've still gotta cut it. Like, come on, man. Is that baking soda? What are you doing? [laughs] Just back, back it up and sell it. It would, it would decrease the market value though, that would be bad for dealers I think if there was a coke beach.

Travis:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Griffin:

Yeah. There, I mean, there are a few people who are suggesting a little bit of profiteering. Um, I don't know, that doesn't [crosstalk].

Justin:

How are you gonna sell that?

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

"Hey, I have some beach here. Will you pay me for it?"

"No, I think I'll just go to the beach, thanks."

Griffin:

Um, there might be some shark's teeth in there, so a little bonus for the kids. Uh...

Justin:

They're all rotted down to nubs [laughs].

Griffin:

Dr. House says, "Roll up a \$50 note and have a snorkel."

[all laugh]

Justin:

That's actually pretty good.

Griffin:

I'll just get a little... oh you, you still take bumps of coca? Not me. I take snorkels.

Justin:

I just, I just did three snorks. I'm, I'm tripping out my mind. You tripping? You trip on coke, right? You trip?

Griffin:

The Greatest Mind of our Generation says [laughs] "Well, there's enough to experiment so instead of snorting it we add some Kool Aid and then make an enema." *What?*

Travis:

What?!

Justin:

What? Wait! How does that thought process work?

Travis:

What I love that that seems to imply that he's often thought...

Griffin:

Oh yeah.

Travis:

"... Man, I would love to have a coke enema, but I just don't have enough."

Griffin:

Yeah. I don't have enough to experiment with.

Justin:

I think you gotta get out there for a coke ball fight. Just mixing them up and tossing them at each other.

Travis:

Build a coke man.

Griffin:

That seems like it, that would be fun for about 35 seconds and then...

Justin:

You should...

Griffin:

... I mean I haven't done, I have never done the coca so I don't know like how quickly it sets off, uh, how quickly it activates within you, uh, but I imagine that it's pretty quickly. Especially when you're, you know, having good time, bouncing around, throwing coke balls at each other.

Justin:

You should come over to my house. It's the home of the world's coolest beached whale. Come, come check him out. He's a fun guy. He sits out there asking if- how into Mark McGrath you are and, and, uh...

Griffin:

Uh-huh [affirmative]. His blowhole is just so crusty and, like, terrible to look at.

Justin:

[laughs] It's closed up. Um...

Griffin:

Mark McGrath? Really?

Justin:

Mark McGrath. Huge cokehead, Mark McGrath, I bet.

Griffin:

Is he?

Justin:

I don't know. I don't know [unintelligible].

Griffin:

That's the Sugar, that's the Sugar Ray gentleman right?

Justin:

Sugar Ray? Yeah. He's in Sugar Ray. What's good... I don't know good coke music. What's, what's coke music?

Griffin:

I can't imagine that Sugar Ray [laughs]...

Travis:

Jack Johnson.

Griffin:

... is too low on that list.

Justin:

It seems like a cokey band doesn't it? Like, Sugar Ray seems cokey.

Griffin:

Well I mean everybody's seen that video, right, where Mark McGrath is like walking into some bar and some like 12 year old kid yells Sugar Gay at him and he like flips the fuck out and like gets in the kid's face and like just takes a bite out of him.

Travis:

That's the weirdest music video I've ever heard of.

Justin:

He takes a video- bite out of the kid? He bites him?

Griffin:

I mean he doesn't, he doesn't literally take a bite out of him. I was speaking figuratively. Like, he got up in his grill.

Justin:

You know I don't appreciate that.

Griffin:

Sugar Gay, that's pretty good though. Should we talk about... 'cause I, this is gonna interrupt the flow and I apologize for that but, uh, I have my reasons. Last night, something big happened to the world. A baby was, a baby was born...

Justin:

Right.

Griffin:

... but not a literal one.

Justin:

Well, a literal one probably was born somewhere. We have to, uh...

Griffin:

Yeah, um...

Justin:

... just statistically.

Griffin:

... but we had nothing to do with that baby.

Justin:

No.

Griffin:

Or, or did we?

Justin:

Or did we? [laughs] Get the blood tests done today.

Griffin:

I'm speaking, [laughs] I'm speaking of course about, uh, Rocky Horror's My Brother, My Brother and Me mixtape. Available now for kids of all ages. Uh, we, we'll have a link like in the post for people to download it for free. It is the freshest thing ever recorded by mankind.

Justin:

We should put it on the Maximum Fun blog too, right?

Griffin:

That's what I was, that's what I was talking about. Um, do you think I still use our old website? No.

Travis:

Ugh, how gauche.

Justin:

1.0.

Griffin:

Um, it's, it's, it really is super fresh. Rocky Horror did a great job with it, uh, and I think like if there's ever like a lull in this episode maybe I can just splice in like a few seconds of a track.

Justin:

There's, um, there's samples online and people can get it. It's for free, right? You just get it.

Griffin:

It is for free, yeah.

Justin:

It's no problem.

Travis:

Not surprisingly my favorite track on there is a track called Travis Was Right.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm [affirmative]. Don't ruin the surprise.

Travis:

Oh, God, that track is fresh.

Griffin:

This, the... it...

Travis:

I won't say anything but...

Griffin:

The album is...

Travis:

... it made the happiest I've ever been.

Griffin:

... the album has an arc to it, it has a narrative.

Justin:

There is a narrative.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

There's a nice, they call them chill downs, at the end.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Justin:

There's a chill down, right? That's what they're called.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm [affirmative]. There's a chill down, there's a chill back. Um, there's a, a beat flip which is, I like that one.

Justin:

He does like two beat flips and I'm, I was pretty impressed.

Griffin:

Yeah and he drops that bass so heavy low and, like, that's probably my favorite part of the album.

[muffled laughter]

Justin:

I, uh, we should just make this show about, uh, dance, dance, dance hall, dance hall tech, techno, dance, techno dance? Is that the gen- genre? It's techno dance, right?

Griffin:

That's perfect. We can do like an instructional thing. So we can like talk about...

Justin:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Griffin:

... your, your best techno techniques. Um, like the, when you drop that bass so heavy low...

Justin:

Right [laughs] that's important.

Griffin:

... um, there's a dance, there's a dance move associated with that, so we can say, like, when it's time to drop that bass, uh, you gotta, like, twist your heels outwards...

Justin:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Griffin:

... and drop your knees down a little bit.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

And sh- like shake two fingers to the floor like you're telling it no, um, and then, like, we'll tell people to do that and then we'll put on a clip of the mixtape like right now.

[music plays]

Griffin:

And people can, like, get their, people can get their, their learn on.

Justin:

Yeah. I, I think that this could be really super instructional.

Travis:

So are you saying that our, our podcast could become a vehicle for us to mention new music that we discover [crosstalk].

Griffin:

Oh no. Oh no, I know where this is going!

Travis:

Like, say that one of the three of us discovered a mystery CD titled Fart Touch and we played that song, and it was magical.

Justin:

[laugh] Now wait, now Travis...

Travis:

This would be...

Justin:

... just walk me through this. Travis sends us this email [laughs] and it says "I found this CD called Fart Touch," and it's like...

Travis:

No, no, no. This is a much more mysterious event.

Justin:

Okay.

Travis:

I'm going through my CD's and Teresa's CD's and we discover this CD simply titled Fart Touch.

Griffin:

Okay.

Travis:

Neither one of us has any idea where this CD came from.

Justin:

Neither one of you will admit to having any idea where this CD came from. Gotcha. Yeah.

Griffin:

At any point did you put the CD in your computer?

Travis:

It, it took me four days of just walking by as we're cleaning up the house saying things like "Hun, where should we carefully store Fart Touch?" Um, and eventually I was like, fuck it, I have to find out what's on this CD and discovered a song, uh, strangely called Fart Touch...

Griffin:

Huh, imagine that.

Justin:

Yeah, go fig.

Travis:

... and it's perhaps... it's perhaps the greatest song I've ever heard in my life.

Griffin:

And here's a clip.

[music plays]

Travis:

[laughs] I have literally listened to that song nine times in the last two hours.

Griffin:

Let me ask you though Travis, did you put the CD in your computer to listen to it? I imagine that you did, right?

Travis:

Yes I did. Yes.

Griffin:

Okay. This is where you, this is why you get viruses and shit. Like, if I saw a piece of digital media that had the words Fart Touch scrawled upon it, like, I wouldn't wanna know what's on there.

Justin:

Are you kidding?

Griffin:

I certainly wouldn't subject my computer's hard drive to it.

Justin:

This is... you learn so much about your brothers doing a weekly advice show with them, because if I saw something called Fart Touch, the signal would not be able to get from my eyes to my brain to compute that it said Fart Touch before my finger would be on the open button on the computer. [laughs] Like, I would already be loading it just as my brain was like "Fart Touch?" It would be playing. Like I, I couldn't get that in fast enough. Are you kidding me? Fart Touch? I'm there! [laughs] Like, yeah, of course, naturally.

Griffin:

I think that says a lot about us though, 'cause like, you, I don't know, you two seem to take more risks than I do. Like you see a Fart Touch CD...

Justin:

Well...

Griffin:

... and you just jump right for it. You, you know that a ship in harbor is safe but that's not what ships are for. They're for, they're for sailing to the open seas and finding Fart Touches.

Travis:

I'm on the SS Fart Touch and I'm out there for adventure.

Griffin:

Ah. What's that...

Justin:

U2's biggest risk was recording Fart Touch, I think.

Griffin:

We, we've, we've not given advice for a little while.

Justin:

I think we gave some pretty, like, advice by association. Don't listen to Fart Touch I think is a pretty good, pretty good nugget of wisdom.

Uh, "I've been with my girlfriend for three and a half years now, but for the past year she's lived in different cities so we had to go do the long distance thing. I'm planning on proposing soon, and after that she's going to be moving back to my city. The problem is I've gotten incredibly used to this long distance relationship. I got a daily routine of work, Taekwondo, dinner and then playing games all night. Um, the, the time that you spend by yourself is, is important and I think you should still try to get, get that time. But keep in mind that the time you

spend by yourself playing video games, um, for example... Taekwondo is not a great example because it's, like, it's, it's helping you be fitter.

Uh, but, but, you know, playing games all night, that, that is without context. You know? Like, it's time that, it doesn't really edify you, it, it doesn't... you're the only one that it affects. And time that you spend with your significant other has, like, context, it has, um...

Griffin:

Value? Is that what you're saying?

Justin:

Yeah, like, a more... you know, not, not... it's not valueless, but it's, it's about finding, like, a balance, you know? You gotta find a balance between the two.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Justin:

Um, and don't... you can always play video games. You know, you can always...

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

... you can always do that stuff but, but... it's, it's about finding a balance between the two.

Travis:

And of course your- it will change, everything will change when you move in with someone and you live with someone, especially when you marry someone, but change for the better. And if you find it changing, you know, not for the better, it's as simple as having a discussion and saying "Hey, you know, I really love spending time with you but I do need some me time here and there," and kind of...

Justin:

Yeah no girl will ever...

Travis:

Find time, 'cause she probably enjoys-

Justin:

... understand that. Sorry, that won't work.

Travis:

Well, she probably enjoys her me time too.

Justin:

It's worth a shot but, like... I, I don't think that any- I, I mean maybe she does, maybe she will enjoy the me time. If she is a very not me time person though, if you're like "I, I need some space," then there's- it's not gonna go well, I don't think.

Travis:

Okay well how about, how about this idea?

Justin:

Okay.

Travis:

Me time together.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

[laughs] Ooh, I like this!

Travis:

Like you play video games while she reads a book, but you're together, you're in the same room, you're hanging out, but you don't have to be, like, constantly staring into each other's eyes for hours on end.

Justin:

"Debra, I like you a lot."

Travis:

Like...

Justin:

"I wanna be together alone. [laughs] Can we do that? Yeah! I wanna be with you but not *with* you." [laughs]

Griffin:

"You sit over there, you sit over there. You do your crossword puzzle and you drink your tea. I'm gonna be over here practicing my Kwon."

Justin:

"I'm just getting my Kwon on [laughs]."

Griffin:

Justin:

"I... do me a favor, Taekwon-don't talk to me for the next hour or so."

[all laugh loudly]

Justin:

"Can we work that out? We can." Just anything, do anything else. Um, you could try to get her hooked on something super addictive. Take her out to [laughs] take her out to coke beach, you won't see her for days. [laughs] Um, but, but yeah, I mean, it's, uh, just a balance, and it is gonna change.

Travis:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Justin:

But remember that, you know, that's, that's quality time. You'll find, you'll find interests that you share. Um, but it is, you're right, it's a huge adjustment. Uh, if it's too hard, get single again, my man.

Griffin:

Just break up.

Justin:

Chuck it, chuck it back to the sea, you know? Forget about it.

[music plays]

Justin:

Griffin, you know what I need.

Griffin:

This one was sent in by Curly Head Poet. Thank you, Curly Head Poet. It's by Yahoo Answers user Amy, who asks... [laughs] oh man. "Does anyone know of any other grandpa names?"

Justin:

[laughs] Oh no!

Griffin:

"It can't-" listen to the parameters, please.

Justin:

Okay. Alright, alright.

Griffin:

"It cannot be Poppy, Grandpa or Pop Pop. Gramps sounds like cramps, don't go there."

Justin:

[laughs] Don't! Don't even.

Griffin:

Additional, additional details. "And *please* no names in other languages. This is America, we speak English."

Justin:

Did she say that?

Griffin:

[sarcastically] Awesome, awesome.

Justin:

[sarcastically] That's awesome.

Travis:

No!

Griffin:

[sarcastically] Definitely, awesome, Amy. Cool. "Any P vowel P..."

Justin:

Vowel.

Griffin:

"... sound."

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

You can, you're fine, like Pee Pee.

Justin:

P...

Griffin:

Well, maybe not that.

Justin:

No, not that.

Travis:

No. [laughs]

Justin:

Let's...

Griffin:

Pay- Paypo.

Justin:

Paypo, that's good!

Griffin:

Popee.

Justin:

Peepums.

Griffin:

[laughs] Any... as long as there's two P's...

Justin:

Go, go, go see your Peepums! [laughs]

Travis:

This is my Peepums.

Justin:

Darryl, go see your Peepums.

Griffin:

My Peepums [laughs] always has the hardest, crumbliest chewing gum. [laughs].

Justin:

Don't- [laughs] "Now Darryl, don't you eat Peepum's nasty gum. You know what happened last time [laughs]."

Griffin:

Peepum's nasty gum sounds like a product that we should copyright immediately.

Travis:

Oh God, I just purchased a pack of Peepum's old-timey nasty gum [laughs].

Griffin:

[laughs] "You're still into juicy fruit. Oh, that's bitch gum. I'm into Peepum's nasty gum."

Travis:

Fuck your fruit stripes!

Griffin:

The thing about Peepum's nas-tee gum is that you have to put the emphasis on a different syllable every time you say it.

Justin:

[through laughter] Peepums, don't you do it! [laughs] Oh Peepums, don't you do it, that nasty gum. [unintelligible].

Griffin:

Um...

Justin:

[high-pitched] Peepums. [laughs]

Griffin:

Alright, listen, Peepum's nasty gum is obviously the greatest thing any of us have ever said, but we... let's give this person some much needed help.

Travis:

I've already decided that Grand Peepums is the best name ever.

Griffin:

Ooh, I like that. 'Cause you can, you can...

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

... you can expand on that. You can have a Great Grand Peepums. Um...

Justin:

Without great gum, though. It should be noted that gum's not gonna get any better.

Griffin:

No.

Justin:

What about, what about, uh, Propoo? Propum? Propur? Propy? Propy! That sounds like...

Griffin:

[crosstalk].

Justin:

... an alien grandfather. Propy.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Prodius.

Justin:

Prodius. "I'm Prodius the Peepums. [laughs] I'm your Peepums, Prodius. Please eat my nasty space gum [laughs]."

Griffin:

Um...

Justin:

Are there any non-double P names that still work? Like if... for some reason, and this is so cultural I guess, but for some reason when you pull away from P's it doesn't feel like a, a...

Travis:

No.

Justin:

... a grandpa name. Like you have to have the P in there right?

Griffin:

Well, there's probably some sort of root language explanation there, like progenitor or paternal. That's... maybe paternal has something to do with it?

Justin:

Gr- I guess granddad doesn't, but who says granddad? That sounds like something you only refer to them as after they're dead.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

This is my granddead [laughs].

Griffin:

Um...

Travis:

Granddead? That's depressing.

Justin:

Yeah. Um, pro...

Griffin:

What about master father?

Justin:

[laughs] Whoa! This is master dad.

Griffin:

[laughs] Mast- I was thinking...

Travis:

A master dad [laughs].

Griffin:

What if- what if the problem isn't the dad or the pops but the grand. What if we could switch the grand [crosstalk]?

Travis:

No but think about, think about the one removed, and you say this is my great grand master dad.

Justin:

[laughs] uh...

Griffin:

What about progenitor prime? How do you feel about that?

Justin:

How about just Philip? Like no one calls him like an adult.

Griffin:

Yeah just call him by his name. Which is even better if you're, like, six and he's like, "Would you like a Werther's?" And you're like, "Um, uh, yes Robert, I would, uh, I would enjoy one of those."

Justin:

"I would enjoy a Werther's. Thank you, Robert."

Griffin:

"Thank you, thank you Robert."

Justin:

"Uh, uh, gum? No, I don't think so [laughs]."

Griffin:

[laughs] "No."

Justin:

"I would prefer not to have it."

Griffin:

"The Werther's will keep, sir."

Justin:

"Unlike your nasty gum that I believe you retrieved from a package of baseball cards circa 1987, Peepums."

Griffin:

What if we did it...

Justin:

"Keep it."

Griffin:

What if we did it like Japanese math and we just called him, like, daddy dad? Or dad dad. Just, like, expand it to whatever power. If that was, I feel like that would be a much... shit, I just revolutionized the whole fucking system. Like what if we...

Justin:

That's much better now.

Griffin:

... what if we got rid of all these arbitrary titles and we just, like, expanded it based on how they actually relate to your nuclear family?

Justin:

Uh, what about nuclear dad? [laughs].

Griffin:

Do you understand what I'm saying?

Justin:

Yes.

Travis:

No.

Griffin:

Like your cousin, your cousin would be your, like, your dad sister son.

Travis:

So you want to de-simplify the language and instead of one word like cousin... throw, like, four words in there.

Griffin:

No, because who the fuck can keep cousin straight? Like, especially once you get to, like, second or third cousins. Like, who knows? Like, who knows. It's, it's very nebulous. I'm saying we simplify the entire thing and we just, we just go dad sister brother, or I guess that would be your dad again. Do you understand what I'm saying though?

Travis:

Uh-huh [affirmative].

Justin:

I do. It's just, like, so terrible of an idea I don't wanna encourage you more. But like, like it's... the one thing I was thinking is I talk about my extended family in public too much. I wish there was some way to complicate it. To keep me from bringing them up all the time. Oh I know. Dad sister brother. Would you call them that to their face? [laughs].

Griffin:

No, I would call them by...

Justin:

"Hi this is my, this is my mom brother. His name is Tom. This is my mom brother Tom." Peepum's nasty gum. Just wanna get that out there one more time.

Griffin:

Goddamn. It's too bad the mixtape, uh, just came out, because I feel like we could get an entire selection out of Peepum's nasty gum.

Justin:

"My wife started k-nitting four years a-" st- I'm sorry, I misread it. "My wife started knitting four years ago, and that was all fine and swell until she started wearing her creations. How can I tell her that I don't like it when she wears these creations without hurting her feelings?" That's from Hip Hobo. [laughs] Um...

Griffin:

There's nothing hip about being inconsiderate.

Justin:

Oh wow. Burn. "I don't like it when you wear that sweater." That... you know what? It doesn't matter if she made it or not, that's not your call to make. You should never say that. Don't ever say that!

Travis:

Unless...

Griffin:

Unless...

Justin:

Unless...

Travis:

... she's *really* bad at knitting and you can see through it and you see all her bits.

Griffin:

[laughs] Unless we have underestimated her terribleness at k-nitting.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

"Hey, listen. I like that sweater..."

Travis:

Because if she's a terrible k-nitter and you can, like, see... [shudders]

Justin:

It's like, "I like your sexy shirt, but I can't have you wearing that in public."

Griffin:

Is that sexy?

Justin:

Sexy if you can see, like, like, through the yarn, see some nippo?

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

I guess. I, I don't know, maybe [laughs]. I've never...

Travis:

You can see her hungry, hungry nippos [laughs].

Griffin:

Whoa!

Justin:

It only happens in, like- in, like, sitcoms. I, I don't think it happens in real life.

Griffin:

You don't do it.

Travis:

Ask to borrow...

Justin:

You don't do it.

Travis:

... ask to borrow her stuff and then lose it.

Griffin:

No, 'cause she worked hard on that! Don't be a guy. No, that's, no.

Justin:

No, no. Don't take Travis's path of, of least thought. Uh, you should, you should, like, just keep it to yourself, dude! [laughs] It doesn't matter. Trust me. There's no situation in which your distaste for her clothing is going to be, like, harder to handle than just her scorn. Just her deep...

Travis:

I have it. Hey, I got it.

Justin:

... resentment and scorn. Oh, good.

Travis:

No, I figured it out.

Justin:

Really good this time, right? It's not gonna be...

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

... is it burn it? Because that's not gonna fly with me.

Travis:

No, no.

Justin:

Okay.

Travis:

No, this is a good one. Encourage her to sell her creations.

Griffin:

Whoa!

Justin:

Whoa!

Travis:

Then she, then she can't wear them because she's gotta sell them.

Justin:

From downtown!

Griffin:

Travis.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

"Why are you wearing money? You're gonna stay in that and we, we won't be able to make a living off of it. Take that off right now and never wear it again, sell it. Ebay it."

Griffin:

Do you think Etsy...

Travis:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Griffin:

... actually got started, um, when some husband was like, "Dude, that scarf, are you serious?" Uh...

Justin:

"You can't wear that."

Griffin:

"Let's go ahead and give that one to internet and..."

Justin:

Yeah, now you get money. Man, Travis, I got- I'm sorry for doubting you. That's a slam dunk.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

You should tell her to sell it, but sell *that* one.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Like, you have to say, like, "This one is very special. I think you should sell it."

Griffin:

"You, you've already worn it. You've filled it with your memories, now let's go ahead and give it to the world."

Justin:

"Let's sell your memories."

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

"On, on Etsy [laughs]." Um...

Griffin:

Ask her to knit me something. I've only...

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

... I've only had knit things for me one time. I only have one knit thing.

Travis:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Griffin:

Somebody knit me a... a Peepum's nasty gum toboggan.

Travis:

I would just want a Peepum's nasty gum cousy.

Griffin:

Yeah to keep your Peepum's, uh, nasty gum warm.

Justin:

I want a nasty gum holster. A knitted nasty gum holster. I can just... [makes whooshing sounds] "That's Slick Rick, he's the slickest nasty gum dealer in the west. You look at him wrong and he'll throw two pieces of nasty gum at you."

Griffin:

I feel like I'm worried because we obviously had a lot of nasty gum in our youth because we had grandparents that handed out nasty gum. But I'm, I'm worried that not everybody got to experience the nasty gum phenomenon.

Justin:

I'm pretty sure this is a universal thing.

Griffin:

Is it?

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

It's, like, it's, like, for those who didn't receive nasty gum from their parents, uh, or their grandparents, it's like, um... it's like the, the gum that comes in, like, Top's baseball cards. Uh...

Travis:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Justin:

... packages. It's just crumbly-ass, terrible nasty gum.

Travis:

Yeah, you take a bite out of it and it shatters.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Uh, and disintegrates into a billion pieces.

Justin:

I kinda feel like nasty gum communicates the whole experience.

Griffin:

You think?

Justin:

Like, it's nasty gum. I mean...

Griffin:

In fact, I feel like we're actually siphoning a little bit of magic away from the, from the word [laughs].

Justin:

Yeah. You'll edit this out later, right?

Griffin:

Nah.

Justin:

Yeah, okay. Uh, "Is calling someone a nerd considered an insult? I've called a BF a nerd on several occasions and he thinks I'm downing on him, but come on! His favorites things are video games, Star Wars, and bacon. Please help a girl out."

Griffin:

I don't have a problem when, um, people call *me* a nerd or when people call other people a nerd, but when people call *themselves* a nerd...

Travis:

Oh yeah.

Justin:

Sure, yeah.

Griffin:

... Oh, I get the, I get the, the strongest douche chills.

Justin:

Yeah, it's pretty bad.

Travis:

I, I feel the same way when people call themselves a jock.

Griffin:

Yeah!

Travis:

It's like...

Griffin:

Anybody who just...

Travis:

... God, it bugs me.

Griffin:

... so forwardly just, like, picks a label and is like, "I am... slut, what's up?"

Justin:

Yeah. Or, or when it's- you know the one that bothers me?

Travis:

What?

Justin:

Regional. "I'm an Arkansas girl, what do you want?" Oh, fuck you.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Seriously.

Travis:

"That is so New York." That's... [gags]

Justin:

[gags] I feel like we've gotten off topic.

Travis:

Okay. So, is nerd an insult?

Justin:

[crosstalk]

Griffin:

[crosstalk] When you take your coffee out of the, the grinder and it's all stuck in there. Ugh.

Justin:

Ugh! Yeah! Now we're showing them. Uh, you know, if he considers it an insult, that's the- I guess that's the- I mean, like, if you know that and you keep saying it then yeah, I think you're, you're participating in this. I don't think you can claim ignorance too, too long.

Travis:

I can't formulate a sentence in which calling someone a nerd is a compliment. Like, "You're such a great nerd." Um...

Justin:

Yeah. Even when you say it with, like, the best of intentions you're still being a little condescending, I think.

Travis:

Yeah. You're putting someone- you're labeling someone and that's never, that's never good.

Griffin:

You're saying, you're basically saying the things you care about are not significant or important to the large, the larger tapestry that is our world.

Justin:

Uh, our, my advice to your boyfriend, next time Alisa says you're a nerd, look her dead in the eye and say, "[breathily] I prefer to think of myself as

otaku," and then wait for her to leave you. You'll never have that, you'll never have that problem again. Solved. Solved.

Griffin:

I'm literally shivering right now.

Justin:

I know. "I'm otaku. I prefer..."

Griffin:

That would be awesome. I wish we... hey...

Justin:

That would be rad.

Griffin:

... I don't know who your boyfriend is, but I wish we could give him advice instead of you, because we would tell him to just, like, double his nerdiness quotient.

Justin:

Double down. Make your kid's smoke and, and, and double down on it.

Griffin:

Just double down and, like, start, uh, listening to nothing...

Travis:

Eating double downs.

Justin:

... nothing but J-Pop. Like, just listen to the weirdest Japanese pop you can find. Uh, do a little cosplay. Get really into steampunk.

Travis:

Did I miss something? Since when is bacon nerdy?

Justin:

I think bacon's nerdy.

Travis:

No.

Griffin:

I think we've been... I think... yeah, we got to that I think.

Justin:

[crosstalk]

Travis:

Bacon is nerdy?

Justin:

Bacon went around the bend, yeah. Sorry. I mean...

Travis:

Oh.

Justin:

You can still, you can still be on bacon. Like, you can still...

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

... like bacon. Uh, what do, what do we have time for? Got another Yahoo on the, on the docket?

Griffin:

Sure, sure. Um, this one, uh, was sent in by Cal. Thank you, Cal. It's by- [laughs] it's by Yahoo Answers user The Christ Puncher [laughs].

Travis:

[laughs loudly]

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

Cool, cool.

Justin:

Okay, okay.

Griffin:

The Christ Puncher asks, "What is a good quick way to make money from my dog? [snorts] My dog is expensive."

Travis:

Uh-huh [affirmative].

Griffin:

"Usually we just feed her table scraps, bits of hamburger, onion rings, fries, extra ketchup packets, et cetera."

Justin:

Wait, what? Excuse me?

Griffin:

"Uh, but things are getting tight financially around my house and we need every, every family member to pull their own weight when it comes to expenses, even food. My dog is pure bred and not fixed. I was wondering how much I could make from a litter of puppies and how long they take to gestate. If this isn't a good idea, some suggestions on other ways for my dog to start earning money would be appreciated."

Justin:

I think you should just make him find his own ketchup packets, right?

Travis:

How, how fucking tight is it getting when you can't give your dog table scraps anymore?

Justin:

You just don't have them. You, you...

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

... you give your toddler a bone to gnaw on [laughs]. "Hey, get the [crosstalk]. I'm eating all of these."

Griffin:

Um, I mean the, the quickest, easiest option I guess would be to turn him into a celebra-dog, right? Like, get him his own...

Justin:

Oh sure, yeah.

Griffin:

... features. I hear that, um, George Lopez has started casting for Beverly Hills Chihuahua 2. Um, Justin give me a subtitle for that movie right now.

Travis:

Um, were you not aware that that movie already exists?

Griffin:

Does it really?

Travis:

Yeah, I shit you not.

Griffin:

I don't think it's true. To the Google! [laughs]

Justin:

Uh...

Griffin:

Beverly Hills Chihuahua... oh my fuck. Fuck!

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Yeah, yeah.

Griffin:

Fuck, it's out! It's out on Blu-Ray!

Justin:

So you could get your, you could get Beverly... you get your dog in Beverly Hills Chihuahua 3?

Griffin:

Can we stop the show?

Justin:

Tres Perros?

Griffin:

Oh, Ernie Hudson was in that film, good.

Justin:

Oh, good! Like Ernie Hudson didn't have enough to deal with on a day to day basis.

Griffin:

Cool. Ernie Hudson...

Justin:

We're gonna put him in Beverley Hills...

Justin:

... Ernie Hudson *and* Olivia Newton John?

Travis:

That's a tour de force!

Griffin:

Oh, fuck.

Justin:

Were you out in *theaters*, Beverly Hills Chihuahua 2? Did G-Lo make time for that one?

Griffin:

Oh, man!

Justin:

Tell me.

Griffin:

French Stewart was in the mix.

Justin:

Oh, French Stewart makes me so sad! [laughs] It's not funny anymore.

Travis:

Open your eyes, French Stewart! See where your life is headed!

Justin:

[laughs loudly] Stop squintin', stupid, you're running into oblivion!

Justin:

Fuck.

Justin:

Open your eyes, your agent is a fax machine. Get out there.

[all laugh]

Justin:

Stop squinting you bastard. Oh, stupid French Stewart. I miss that guy though, he probably is a listener. He doesn't think- he's like...

Griffin:

"Dear My Brother, My Brother and Me."

Justin:

"I tried to cry when you said those mean things but I can't because I'm always squinting. Love, French Stewart. I'm gonna go make Inspector Gadget 4. French Stewart." Ah, that bitch. [laughs] If I ever see him I'm gonna punch the squint right out of his stupid face.

Griffin:

Oh, God.

Justin:

This coffee is strong. [laughs] It is- I'm wired now. I'll punch French Stewart in the face. Tell me if George Lopez was in Beverly Hills Chihuahua 2 or not.

Griffin:

Oh fuck yeah, of course he was.

Justin:

What, did this come in theaters?

Griffin:

In fact I don't think that- I'm almost certain it didn't. I don't think that George Lopez, like, arranged it in any way. I think he probably just did one of the voices, but I like to imagine him as the puppet master.

Justin:

No, I, I like to imagine that they just record him saying things in his day to day life and work it into a film.

Griffin:

You think?

Justin:

Yes.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Yeah, definitely. And French Stewart's like, "No I can work with this, this is good. Uh, yeah I'll pass the salt, George." Like, it's, it's... God, man, I do hate French Stewart. He depresses me though, because he was, he was so good in- if you looked at French Stewart and Joseph Gordon Levitt on 30 Rock and said which one of these two is going places, I wouldn't have guessed Joseph Gordon Levitt.

Griffin:

Mm-mm [negative].

Justin:

But there he is. Making it big.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Justin:

Making it huge. He incepted the hell out of that movie. Inception.

Travis:

Oh, God.

Griffin:

I seriously- like, my- [sighs] my fucking...

Justin:

Chihuahua. [laughs quietly]

Griffin:

... drive to do the show, to do the show anymore is totally gone. Like, when you guys were talking for the past couple of minutes I just was, I was just reading this IMDB page.

Justin:

For French Stewart? Or for, for, for, uh, Chihuahua Dos?

Griffin:

For Bev, for Bev 2.

Justin:

Bev 2. Uh, it did, is there any ratings? Are there any user reviews? [laughs]
Can we advise people on whether or not they should see Chihuahua 2?

Griffin:

It's actually not out yet.

Justin:

Okay, thank God.

Griffin:

Yeah, yeah, it's, it's got a release date of February 6.

Justin:

I'll be there.

Griffin:

But it says...

Justin:

I'll be there.

Travis:

Oh, God.

Griffin:

... it says France on the page.

Justin:

No, no, French. [laughs] It's a common mis-

Travis:

French.

Justin:

French Stewart. [laughs] It's a common misconception.

Griffin:

None of this is usable.

Justin:

None of this is usable material. What? For the show?

Griffin:

Yes.

Travis:

Or for life? [laughs]

Justin:

[laughs] French Stewart, you're not usable.

Travis:

I think we can all learn something from French Stewart.

Griffin:

That's probably what director Alex Zamm said when he went over the final cut of Beverly Hills Chihuahua 2.

Justin:

"French, it's the Zamster. Listen, we gotta get these contracts inked. I want you as Squinty the squinting..."

Griffin:

Yeah [laughs].

Justin:

"... I want you as Squinty the seeing eye dog [laughs]. They'll be rolling in the aisles."

"Did you say... did you say rolling in the..."

"They'll be rolling in the aisles, French. It'll be a laughter unlike [laughs] you've heard in years."

Griffin:

[laughs] Or seen.

Justin:

"Not since... not since [laughs] IG 2. Not since Inspector Gadget 2 will you have heard [crosstalk]."

Griffin:

[laughs] Now, I am not the only one with French Stewart's IMDB page open right now, I think.

Justin:

Are you kidding? I know that from heart! I know, I know French Stewart's history. Third Rock, IG 2, Chihuahua Dos.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Justin:

I know his whole thing.

Travis:

Unemployment, six months.

Justin:

Unemployment. [laughs] Considering suicide, last three years [laughs].

Griffin:

It actually says all of this on his IMDB page too, which is weird.

Justin:

[laughs] it's on there... well he updates it himself. What the fuck else is he gonna do? He has this keyboard with the giant keys on it, 'cause he can't see that well, obviously. He's squinting all the time. Where's the G?

Griffin:

I, I've turned a corner. I feel bad now.

Justin:

[laughs] I feel bad for French Stewart now. I'm gonna... next week, all pro French Stewart material. It's guaranteed. [through laughter] Um, so I want to hear Griffin's-

Griffin:

We haven't not answered a question as hard as we didn't answer that question I think in the history of the show.

Justin:

It's the hardest non-answer that we've ever, um, that we've ever given. Uh, let's do one more real one before we get out of here.

Griffin:

Okay.

Travis:

Okay.

Justin:

"I finally convinced a friend to join the MBMBaM nation, so this question is for her benefit. Just recently moved from NYC to Ohio and is now being inundated with wang pics from guys that get her number now, and from several internet friends. She's shy and swears she is not soliciting them in any way. What can she do? T-Rex." Wait.

Griffin:

What?

Justin:

I don't understand this question.

Travis:

Excuse me?

Justin:

She moved from New York to Ohio, and somewhere in that...

Griffin:

She passed some cell phone tower.

Justin:

There is some tower that relayed her phone number to, to wang mailers everywhere.

Griffin:

Yes, yeah. To the shadowy organization.

Travis:

And what I love is this is not one or two wang pics, she's being inundated with wang pics.

Griffin:

Just flooded. Just flooded with...

Travis:

Just constant stream.

Griffin:

Travis:

Justin:

[laughs] Things, Things My Wang Says.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm [affirmative].

Justin:

Travis:

Chicken Soup for the Wang Pic Soul.

Griffin:

Eat, Eat, Pray, Wang?

Justin:

Eat, Pray, Wang! [laughs] This is, this is my novelty book, it's a gift book. Eat, Pray, Wang. \$18 at Borders. They're only 60 pages [unintelligible].

Griffin:

The Girl, The Girl with the Dragon Wang?

Justin:

Why don't you make a, I, I think a blog, I think a... make a Tumblr blog and then just, as soon as they send you the dick pic you send them back the URL of the blog where you just put that dick pic up.

Travis:

Yep.

Justin:

Travis:

Justin:

Just huge fans [laughs].

Travis:

Um...

Justin:

Wynne Myself, W-Y-N-N-E Myself, uh, out there. He just listened to his first episode. he started at E1, uh, Meg Balls [crosstalk] a good word.

Griffin:

Shouldn't have done that.

Justin:

Nah, shouldn't start at one, but...

Griffin:

Start at the top and work back and stop at, like, maybe six.

Justin:

But yeah, this is, this is, uh... this was a lot of fun, guys. And thank you to you two as always, uh, for, for doing the show with me. I really appreciate it.

Griffin:

Hey, you're welcome.

Travis:

You're welcome.

Justin:

Hey, Griffin?

Griffin:

It's the least we could do.

Justin:

Give me one to grow on.

Griffin:
