MBMBAM 622: Face to Face: Leave the Cannoli, Take the Gun

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Clint: The McElroy brothers are not experts.

[crowd cheers]

Clint: And their advice should never be followed. Travis insists he's a *sexpert*, but if there's a degree on his wall-balcony, I haven't seen it.

[crowd cheers]

Clint: Also, this show isn't for kids. Which I mention only so the babies out there will know how cool they are for listening. [shouting] What's up?! You cool baby!

[theme song, "My Life Is Better With You" by Montaigne plays]

Justin: Hello everybody and welcome to My Brother, My Brother and Me, an advice show for the modern era. I'm your oldest brother, Justin Tyler McElroy.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: I'm your middlest brother, Travis Tyler McElroy.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: And I'm Xavier... Dark Mime Xavier Shadow Raven. And I am a sorcerer.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: You know, they never talk about this in the books. But like 90% of being a sorcerer is just having the confidence to call yourself a sorcerer.

Justin: This is Griffin's second night wearing a tuxedo.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: I will say, the cape is new. The cape is for you, Portland.

Justin: The cape's new.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Well... It's not new. Griffin borrowed it from our tour manager, Amanda.

Griffin: Our business manager. Amanda, thank you. And I will say that the fit is as such that it does make me look like Mr. Potter from It's a Wonderful Life!

[crowd laughs]

Travis: And it's also impressive because I don't know how he's done this, like physically. The cape is on the outside, then jacket. But the cape is connected to the vest underneath the jacket?

Griffin: Sorcerer.

Justin: Everybody looks great. I didn't see dad until right before we came out.

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: I do not know...

Travis: He doesn't run any of that by us. [crosstalk]

Justin: None of that is cleared by management.

Travis: It used to be that dad would buy a T-shirt or something at the airport, that had like the name of the city we were in. And now he's gone... I don't know.

Justin: Off the deep end.

Griffin: Fully rogue, yeah. My favorite part of his intro was when he suggested that he is paid for his services.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: I saw dad and Travis standing next to each other backstage, and it occurred to me... It looked like if there was a new Sherlock Holmes movie, and you turn it on and then five minutes in, they come on the screen and you're like, "No, I don't think so..."

Travis: Yeah...

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: Did he just say his name is Mory Farty?

Travis: That's not it.

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: That's not it.

Justin: Anyway. This is an advice show. We're so thrilled to be back here in

Portland, Oregon.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: We ordered um... how can I...

Travis: [laughs] You know that spicy lettuce you guys like so much?

Justin: [laughs] Yeah...

Travis: We haven't consumed any. Yet.

Griffin: Act two, suited and zooted is the theme— No.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: No. No, no, no. Don't-

Travis: We're cowards. There's no way we'll do it.

Griffin: There's no way.

Justin: There's no way.

Griffin: If you could've seen us tittering like school children backstage, as we legally purchased recreational drugs.

[crowd laughs and cheers]

Justin: It's just me and Travis like, "Look, this one's called Obama Care." [laughs]

Travis: That's pretty good, though.

Justin: That's hilarious.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: I like anything that sounds like the name of a Cream song, you know?

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: Where it's just like Soda Pop Dreams. And I'm like yeah, that's my thing! I wanna go to sleep 10 minutes after the show's done!

Justin: It couldn't possibly be harder to choose. Like, I'm looking at 'em and they're like, "This one's fuckin' chock full of resin." And I'm like, "Yeah, bud..."

Griffin: "Yes, yes. Good."

Justin: And then I started thinking like, is that too much resin for me? Can I handle that level of resin?

Travis: Is resin like wax? What's resin?

Griffin: I think it's demoralizing on purpose to keep the squares out.

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: I purchased weed in Texas a few times. Which I can say now 'cause I don't live there anymore.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Yeah! Good luck getting him now, Ted Cruz!

Griffin: And I would be like, "[nervously] Um, excuse me, sir. Uh... How much of it can I get for this many?"

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: And they'd be like, "I've got the newest— I've got Cheetah Piss. It's the newest strain from The Backpack Boyz."

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: And I'd be like, "Yes. Okay."

Travis: I love it. Justin and I were also like those friends at a restaurant where someone's like, "I think I'll get some fries." And like, "Well, if you're gonna have fries, can I have some?" Where Griffin was like, "Yeah, maybe we should get some..." And Justin's like, "Well, if you're gonna... Let me just look at the menu."

Griffin: We're real bad boys, doing this thing you all do twice a day. And we're cool dads.

Justin: And hopefully did before this, 'cause it will be better. I guarantee.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: And we won't... We did have a brief discussion, "Guys, maybe this is the one, where we just, second act, come out bombed out of our minds."

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: No, no, no, no, no, no, no.

Justin: [simultaneously] No, no, no, no, no, no, no!

Griffin: Listen, no. Stop, listen.

Justin: You'd think. You'd think, right?

Travis: At least one third of us, though, by which I mean me, would be so

paranoid and weird.

Griffin: Yeah, it would not be a good look.

Travis: I would say something and you guys would laugh, and I'd be like, "Why

are you laughing?"

Griffin: "What did I do?"

Justin: Um, this is an advice show.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: And we have emerged here in Portland, like our friends, the Chilean miners, who dug their way out of the ground with their own bare hands. And we are here—

Travis: They don't talk about that enough when they tell that story.

Griffin: [laughs] They borrowed out the ground with their own bare hands?

Justin: Yup.

Travis: And then they saw their shadows and went back. And it was six more

weeks of winter.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: We're gonna help you now. Are you ready to be helped?

[crowd cheers]

Travis: We're gonna fix this town!

Justin: So many of you... It feels very nice.

Griffin: May I please unbutton the vest? Please. I'm begging.

Justin: Let's take a vote.

Travis: Oh, wait.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Yes, you can.

Justin: [singing in high pitched voice] Erotic. Erotic.

Griffin: All right, there we go.

Justin: There we go, let it breathe. Okay. "Today, I saw my pup's breeder on an

episode of Judge Judy."

[crowd laughs]

Travis: Portland.

Justin: "I knew that the breeder was having issues with another breeder around dog ownership—" I mean, I didn't think they're arguing over the rights to The Matrix.

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: I assumed. "... But I didn't know the details. How can I casually bring up that I saw the episode and would *love* to know more? I grew up watching Judge Judy with my mom and would love to get some details about the judge—"

Travis: We all grew up watching Judge Judy with our moms!

Griffin: That goes without saying.

Justin: "It seems a little insensitive to ask. The episode was from last year, and the ruling was a little bit of a mixed result." That's from Pondering Pup Owner in Portland. Are you here?

Pondering Pup Owner in Portland: Whoo!

Griffin: All right.

Justin: Welcome.

Travis: I love the concern that it's insensitive to talk about the private matter of them being on Judge Judy!

Griffin: Well, it sounds like they got their ass *beat*!

[crowd laughs]

Travis: No, it's a mixed result. Which is always what you want in court. "You're both guilty!"

Griffin: "Yeah, 50/50."

Justin: "Listen, I say this in 80% of my cases. Both sides were in the wrong. Let's just come together."

Travis: "Now get out of here!"

Justin: "Get out of here, kids."

Travis: "Now, make sure to stop in front of the camera on your way out."

Justin: I can settle one thing for you conclusively. I guarantee that your dog breeder saw Judge Judy for the exact same number of seconds as you saw Judge Judy on television.

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: I guarantee. Judge Judy had five episodes that filmed that day. I guarantee Judy's not coming out beforehand like, "So, how's everybody doing?"

Travis: [laughs]. "Can I get anybody anything? Anybody need anything?"

Justin: "They give me all the pretzels I want. Come on back, we can have some pretzels."

Travis: "I got store brand LaCroix in my trailer if you guys want anything?"

Justin: [through laughter] Store brand LaCroix...

Travis: "It's not lemon and lime, it's just lemon or lime. But we can pour 'em into a big glass."

Griffin: "It's a bit warm."

Travis: "Yeah, you want that? Well, I bet we can find some ice if you want it. Hey, can we get ice? No ice? Sorry guys, no ice." I heard Judge Judy does five minutes of warm up stand up to the crowd before they start.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: "I wanna show y'all some paintings that I made earlier today."

Griffin: [laughs]

Travis: "Hey! Tell me, does this look like a dog? Woof, woof, woof!"

Justin: Yeah, "I do shadow puppet stuff."

Travis: "You guys like that? Not your thing? Okay, I'll just get up on—"

Justin: Of course, the person wants to be asked about their time on Judge Judy.

Travis: Yeah!

Justin: Hey, this will be a very specific reference. But I bet there's a few people. You guys know anybody that's ever been on Jeopardy?

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Okay. Do they wanna talk about anything else?

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: 'Cause the people I know that have been on Jeopardy make sure you know they've been on Jeopardy.

Travis: Yeah. The idea that you would ask like, "Hey, I saw your episode of Judge Judy." And they'd be like, "I can't... You weren't there, you don't understand. I signed an NDA for the thing they aired on television."

[crowd laughs]

Travis: And also, I love this 'cause it occurred to me, hearing the thing of like how often we get asked how to casually ask something. Like you would be like, "Hey, so... [clicks tongue] Saw you on... Judge Judy..." Just say like, "I saw the episode of Judge Judy!" You don't have to be casual, be excited. It's awesome!

Griffin: I don't believe Judge Judy has the power of subpoena. I don't think you can involuntarily be on Judge Judy.

Travis: "Give me five minutes with him. I'll get him to talk!"

"Judy, your methods! We can't condone this!"

"Turn the cameras off."

"Judy, no!"

[crowd laughs]

Travis: "I'll break you!" [laughs]

Griffin: "I thought this was just normal court."

Travis: [laughs] "What's with all the cameras?"

Griffin: "They put makeup on me for normal court? Oh no! It's her!"

[crowd laughs]

Justin: This is unrelated, sort of. But I accidentally watched an episode of Dr.

Phil-

Travis: You don't have to say accidentally.

Justin: I accidentally watched two episodes of Dr. Phil 'cause—

Travis: Wait. The first one's an accident, Justin.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: No, I accidentally watched two episodes of Dr. Phil 'cause it was connected to a podcast I was listening to at the time, where that episode was referenced. So, I was watching the episode.

Travis: So, on purpose. You sought out the episode of Dr. Phil.

Griffin: You're a subscriber to Phil Me In, which is...

[crowd laughs]

Justin: No. But do you know—

Travis: Doctor, Doctor, Give Me the Phil. [laughs]

Justin: No. But do you know that he has an—

Travis: Was it his own podcast?

Justin: No, no, no. he's not on the podcast. But he has his own podcast. And the podcast that they were promoting in this episode is called [holding back laughter] "Anatomy of a Murder with Dr. Phil."

[crowd laughs]

Justin: And it's just Dr. Phil like... I don't wanna go—

Travis: "[Dr. Phil impression] This is how I did it."

Justin: "[Dr. Phil impression] This is how I would've done it. This is how I break murderers." I don't think I want that from you, Dr. Phil.

Travis: Wait, hold on. So, you listened to a podcast. They referenced an episode of Dr. Phil. You watched the episode of Dr. Phil. And on that, he promoted *his* podcast? And then you listened to that?

Justin: No, I didn't listen to that.

Griffin: His podcasts are *over*.

Justin: Do you know, he does have one called like, "Phil in the Blanks," though.

Travis: Hell yeah, he does!

Justin: Yeah, he does. You wanna do another question?

Griffin: Uh-huh.

Justin: Okay. "I've recently started tucking in my shirt. I'm in my 30s, so I guess it was just time."

Travis: I've never thought about it before. But do you think when we start reading these questions at live shows, someone in the audience goes, "Start tucking in my shirt... Hah! That's me!"

Griffin: "I'm the shirt tucker!"

[crowd laughs]

Justin: I love when they dub over Samuel L. Jackson when he's like, "You shirt tucker."

Travis: [laughs]

Justin: Thanks. That was a joke.

Travis: "Get these shirts off this mother tucking plane."

[crowd laughs]

Justin: "I recently started tucking in my shirt. I'm in my 30s, so I guess it was just time."

Griffin: Yes.

Justin: "However, I work in construction. And all the bending down and moving around pulls my shirt out of my pants constantly."

Travis: Are you doing backflips?

Justin: "In order to re-tuck my shirt, I have to loosen my belt and stick my hands down my pants. Which is a weird look when people catch me with my pants undone, while I'm working on their kitchen counter tops or whatever."

[crowd laughs]

Travis: Oh! 'Cause it's like you're enjoying your genitals.

Justin: You could've found a more tasteful place to fix yourself, to get yourself situated.

Travis: You step over in to a corner, you face the corner and you do your business and hope no one sees. But if they do, at least they'll think, 'At least he's politely masturbating.'

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: "Is there anything I can say to people when I'm elbow deep in my Carhartts?"

Travis: [laughs]

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Travis: Not that, though.

Griffin: [sings in Southern accent] Well I was elbow deep in my Carhartts on a

Friday night!

Travis: [sings in Southern accent] Looking for love in my Carhartts on the banks of the Chattahoochee!

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: [sings in Southern accent] In the back of my truck bed with my hands in my Carhartts. But they weren't the only hands, if you know what I mean.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: [sings in Southern accent] Yes, ghost hands like in Ghostbusters 1. You guys ever seen that? It's weird, am I right?

Justin: [sings in Southern accent] How could they make a new Ghostbusters and not have Slimer in it? Come on, guys.

Travis: [sings in Southern accent] Slimer doesn't get anybody off in the whole movie.

Griffin: [sings in Southern accent] Are you ready for some football?!

Justin: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Travis: [laughs]

Justin: It'd be cool if that ghost kept calling him through whole movie. Like, "Hey, I thought this it meant something."

Travis: "Hey, I just never heard from you." And that's where the term ghosted comes from.

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: So, um...

Travis: That deserved better!

Griffin: No, it didn't. You guys crushed it.

Justin: "Is there anything I can say to people when I'm elbow deep Carhartts to justify or gloss over the situation? Just saying, 'I'm tucking in my shirt', feels a little..."

Travis: If your voice breaks like that at the end, yes!

Griffin: [in frantic tone] "I'm tucking in my shirt!"

[crowd laughs]

Travis: "Don't look at me, God!"

Griffin: "I'm almost finished!"

Justin: I'm 41 years old and I know I'm Greg Bradying everyone... Okay. "Just saying, 'I'm tucking in my shirt,' feels a little he doth protest too much." That's from Tucking Troubles in T-Portland.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: And it says here, "Alliteration is not my strong suit." Neither, it seems, is discretion.

Griffin: Are you here?

Tucking Troubles in T-Portland: Whoo!

Griffin: God bless you.

[crowd laughs and cheers]

Travis: I got it. You ready for this?

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: You're gonna need to sew your shirt into your underpants.

Griffin: Excellent.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: That's really good. Sew your shirt to your underpants. And make a Velcro front, so you can just rip it open.

Travis: There you go.

Griffin: And then every time you reach up to install a countertop hinge or whatever, you'd be like, "Ah!"

Travis: [through laughter] Countertop hinge!

Justin: "Ah! I'm ripping my self in half!"

[crowd laughs]

Travis: "No surprise hugs!"

Griffin: [laughs]

Travis: "That is as far as I can hug right now." Suits are not made for hugging. This is why business dads are so distant.

[crowd laughs and applauds]

Justin: The dad in Mary Poppins was a great dad.

Travis: Argh!

Justin: Mr. Banks can't physically hug his children.

Travis: Argh!

Justin: So, he makes up all these excuses. And he has to hire someone in petticoats to hug his children. That's how restrictive his tuxedo is.

Travis: He's sewn into it.

Justin: Sewn into it every morning. Um... I mean, a belt?

Travis: A belt doesn't hold the shirt in, it holds the pants up.

Griffin: No, it just gets in your way when you need to fix it.

Justin: What about like an elastic belt, where there's some tension there?

Griffin: Great.

Travis: Okay. What about longer shirt?

Justin: What about really, really, really long shirt?

Travis: Oh, yeah! Scrooge that shit!

Justin: Yeah, Scrooge it up. And then at night when it's sleepy time, you light your candle, you have a bit of potato soup.

Griffin: Loving it.

Travis: You learn a lot about love.

Justin: Put on your tossle cap and slip on off to dream land. It'd be beautiful. Um... I have great news for you. Anytime anyone has ever been in my home to do any work whatsoever, impressing *them* is my number one priority.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: Not letting them know how ignorant I am of what they're doing. And making them... I can't think of another word other than proud of me.

Griffin: Yes.

Travis: Yeah.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: I've been meaning to ask you both. Do you do this thing when someone comes in to your house to fix something, do you ratchet up your West Virginia accent like 20%?

Griffin: [loudly, with stronger accent] Oh yeah, baby!

Travis: Yeah, I do too. Like, "[stronger accent] Yeah, man. I don't know. I don't know what's happening. Yeah, I also checked that. Yeah. I mean, life, am I right?"

Griffin: To build on Justin's point. I think the answer is, whenever you are caught adjusting yourself... If they have the audacity to say something along the lines of like, "What are you doing?" Just look back at them and be like, "This is part of it."

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: "Do you want these countertops installed or not?"

Travis: "Do you want hinges on these counters or not?"

[crowd laughs]

Travis: "How are you gonna get to the sink if I don't put hinges on these counters?"

Justin: "When is a good time to tell this girl I've been talking to that I've released an a cappella album?"

Griffin: Oof.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: What's the right time? Track four.

Griffin: [laughs]

Travis: "Oh, you're liking this, huh?"

Justin: "You're enjoying this, hey? Well, surprise."

Griffin: "Check this out. [imitates a cappella] That's right!"

Travis: [laughs] I love— What if you made an a cappella track, but you just did the backing vocals? "I couldn't find anybody else to sing with me. But you get like how the rest of it would go?"

Justin: "I do all the [imitates a cappella]."

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: Don't get me wrong, a cappella—

Travis: I love when that member of Rockapella went on a solo career [laughs].

Justin: "Don't get me wrong. A cappella is pretty cool. Thus, the album. But telling someone about it? Nah, nah, nah. That's more abrasive than saying you're a Soundcloud rapping career. When, if at all, should I tell her?" That's from Connor.

Travis: You should.

Griffin: Are you here, Connor?

Connor: Whoo!

Griffin: All right.

Travis: Whoo.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: That was perfect.

Travis: What was that? Like a B, B flat?

Griffin: That was a B, for sure.

Travis: You definitely should, at some point.

Griffin: Yeah... Ah, man! It'll come out at some point.

Travis: Wait, hold on. Connor. Connor, Connor, Connor. Be honest. Is it

good?

Connor: Hell yeah!

Griffin: Hell yeah, all right.

Justin: Hell yeah, says Connor.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: I actually have a little bit of life experience with this. Many years ago, we were in Portland, here. And we got high on drugs and decided we're gonna get into Trolls 2.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: And part of the recording of that podcast, we would frequently feature our, tough as nails, mean guy—

Travis: In a different time period, gangster.

Justin: Yeah. He's like a really mean guy, and his name is Joel Begleiter and he's our agent.

Travis: He's not mean.

Justin: He's not mean, he's just a tough guy. And we found this track—

Travis: He's just tougher than us.

Griffin: Which is not saying a whole lot.

Justin: He's just tougher than us, it's a low bar... And he was in an a cappella group in college called The Brown Derbies, right. And we found Downeaster Alexa by The Brown Derbies. If you could find that on Spotify, Paul?

Travis: In which he was the lead soloist.

Griffin: Yeah!

Justin: He was the lead soloist and we were so jazzed to find this. 'Cause we were like, "We fuckin' gottem, boys."

Travis: A crack in the armor.

Justin: We finally got a crack in Joel's armor. And then we were like, "Joel. Guess what, dog? We got you." And he was like, "Did you listen to it?" And we were like, "Yeah!" And he was like, "It's pretty good, right?" And we were like, "Yeah, it was... It was good."

Travis: Yeah, "It is really good."

Griffin: The voice of a beautiful cherub angel from Jesus.

Justin: And he was like, "Yeah, so it was pretty cool that I did that, I guess. We were a great group." And I was like, "Yeah, I guess it was pretty cool." Joel, you got us. And that's—

["The Downeaster Alexa" by The Brown Derbies plays]

Justin: Wait, you gotta listen to Joel here.

Travis: Joel's gonna sue us now.

[Joel starts singing]

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Right?

Travis: So good.

Justin: It's infuriatingly good.

Travis: Just everyone shut up.

[song continues]

Justin: Thank you, Paul.

Griffin: Thank you, Paul.

Justin: God, it's good.

[song ends]

[crowd cheers]

Justin: I think if you laid down some sick shit like that—

Travis: Yeah, have it play the next time she gets in the car.

Justin: I think you do have to play it first. Because if someone told me, "I made an a cappella album and now I'm gonna play it for you."

Griffin: Oh, boy.

Justin: I would need a fucking Texas Instruments graph and calculator to figure out my facial expression.

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: I could not... No way, no how could I have the right face for listening to that. But if you're already listening to it and you're like, "This is good. I like this..."

Travis: Connor, here's my advice. You're gonna walk into this backwards. Whatever the conversation is, if it's about like projects you've worked on, hobbies you've had, whatever. You can say like, "Well, yeah... One time, I put together an

a cappella album." And then they'll be like, "You did?" And be like, "Yeah, it turned out pretty good." They are inevitably going to ask to listen to it. And you could be like, "I mean, I guess we could." Which, at that point, it's great. But if you went in to it saying, "I'm going to play this for you." You can't do that.

Griffin: No. No, no. The next few seconds between that announcement, until you press the play button, are going to be the worst seconds of their life.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: And here's the thing. Trust me from experience. *Please* don't try to stream it. 'Cause I guarantee—

Travis: Oh, god!

Justin: ... It will play two seconds and then—

Travis: "Just wait. Just wait."

Justin: "Just wait, hold on. It's just buffering. Hold on one second."

Travis: "Oh, no. I think there's some kind of... Hold on."

Justin: "Hold on. Wait, the Bluetooth isn't..."

Travis: "It's only coming through the left, so you're only getting the bass.

Griffin: "Does this sound tinny to you? Hold on, let me go get my big speakers. Hold on."

Justin: "Hold on. Wait. Wait. Wait."

[crowd laughs]

Travis: "I swear I charged this beforehand."

Justin: Oh, Paul wanted us to mention that he used to be in an a cappella group called Davinci's Notebook. If you've never heard their Shoehorn With Teeth cover

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Travis: Well, they're still in it. They just don't get together anymore. You don't leave an a cappella band, Justin.

Justin: You've probably heard them because you downloaded a LimeWire or a Kazaa version of Shoehorn With Teeth, that said it by Moxy Früvous and it turned out it was actually by Paul.

Griffin: What a pleasant surprise.

Justin: What a treat for you. Uh... Another question?

Travis: [alarm sounds]

[crowd cheers]

Travis: We got a Haunted Doll Watch.

Justin: Okay?

[crowd exclaims]

Justin: Okay? Okay?

Travis: No, sorry. Ironically, I was watching Ghostbusters: Afterlife backstage.

Griffin: [laughs]

Travis: Let me just move over to Chrome.

Griffin: Sometimes Travis watches movies so that he can tell you how he doesn't like them.

Travis: Yeah!

Griffin: A lot.

Justin: Guys, I've heard Travis... Travis has been watching Ghostbusters:

Afterlife for four days. And I have heard—

Travis: I have ADHD.

Griffin: Ooh.

Travis: "Spirit of Sky. Giggles, laughter, [sing-sing] loving."

Griffin: Can we get any more information?

Travis: Yes, we can. Welcome! May I present Sky. "She is a fairy spirit. She is quite charming. She can be silly, funny, then very serious. She surprises me all the time. She will give you vivid dreams. Always come to me during meditation."

Griffin: Whoa, the scale is so different from what I thought it was!

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: The first couple looked like a doll, and now it's on some FernGully shit.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: "... And is very responsive to any way you would like to communicate."

Griffin: I don't need that!

[crowd laughs]

Travis: "She can be very mischievous and likes to be spoiled."

Justin: Mm, who doesn't?

Travis: "Her favorite thing is to hide small items. No worries, I have always been able to find whatever she has hidden."

Justin: Because she didn't hide them. Because she's a doll.

Griffin: [laughs]

Travis: "I will send a candle, herbs from my garden, and a stone for you to welcome her into your home. The doll vessel is in a sitting position with her swing. About myself, I've been doing this for [wheezes] 40 years."

[crowd laughs]

Travis: And then there's a whole 'nother paragraph, but it does continue. This is my favorite line, "My mentor was my late great aunt Maude. Some say she was a witch. I believe she was ahead of her time. She preferred to say healer. She did not like to conform to words."

Griffin: This is a lot of images of this small figure.

Travis: End of description! So, I'll start with Griffin on this one. Griffin?

Griffin: I feel, by the way, like I'm going to get it to the penny.

Travis: Okay. How much, Griffin?

Griffin: \$13.99.

Travis: Justin?

Justin: \$39.99.

Travis: Paul, reveal! 99 cents!

Griffin: Whoa!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: That's a starting bid. That's different from—

Griffin: The shipping is \$8.14!

Justin: Well, there's a stone in the box! What do you want?

Griffin: [laughs] The stone weighs 11 pounds.

Paul: Guys, it's tour manager Paul. Just to let you know, I'm following this along live right now. In the time this has been up on the screen, the bidding price has gone up to \$66.

Justin: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: Somebody make that 69 bid real quick, come on!

Travis: Okay, Paul. Next doll.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: "Active."

Griffin: What?

Justin: That's not the name.

[crowd exclaims]

Travis: "[yelling] Haunted demonic doll, Active! Found while digging. Paranormal, scary, creepy!"

Griffin: The blue censor bar is so fucking long!

[crowd laughs]

Justin: I've never had people this close. And being able to see people recoil in terror from the dolls is really something else.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: "[yelling] I purchase and rehome haunted dolls, and items from all over the world! The paranormal—"

Griffin: "[yelling] I'm covering my wiener with a cross!"

Travis: [yelling] "The paranormal has been part of our lives forever!"

Justin: "This is the very shovel I use!"

Griffin: Wait a minute! They took a picture of themselves breaking ground like, "I bet there's a fuckin' scary doll under here."

[crowd laughs]

Justin: "My dowsing rods are going wild."

[crowd laughs]

Travis: "[yelling] This time, we brought our metal detector and struck gold. How creepy is this?!?!"

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: "[yelling] Wow, amazing!" "The doll is sold by itself."

Justin: Oh my god, it's wrapped in plastic.

Travis: "We can clean it up for you, or just leave it as is."

Griffin: [laughs] "You fucking freak! [hoarse yell] You'll never see my wiener! I died on Ash Wednesday!"

[crowd laughs]

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: All right. Guesses on price. Justin, we'll begin with you.

Justin: Um...

Griffin: Wow.

Justin: Okay, I'm gonna hit you with this. \$80.

Travis: Okay. Griffin?

Griffin: \$131.

Travis: Reveal!

[crowd exclaims]

Griffin: Jesus!

Travis: 217 American dollars!

Justin: Let's see you all rack that one up.

Griffin: Yeah!

Justin: Probably not, huh? That one's probably going unsold tonight.

Travis: Next doll.

Griffin: Oh, fuck.

Justin: Oh my god.

Travis: Show the picture, Paul.

Griffin: Don't— [yells] Nooo!

[crowd exclaims]

Travis: This is a simple description for this one. "Todd is a beautiful artist-made doll. He is 19 inches long and does great with an SLS camera in outings on paranormal investigations. He is one of a kind."

Griffin: I'll say.

Travis: Okay, Griffin. Your guess?

Griffin: I'm going to say... Woof. I'm gonna say... \$170.

Travis: Justin?

Justin: I mean, to a Jim Gaffigan collector, this would be huge.

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: [laughs] Don't mind them.

Travis: They're there for backup if you need help.

Griffin: Hello.

Nathan: Hello. Hi.

Griffin: Who are you?

Nathan: I am Nathan.

Griffin: Hi, Nathan.

Nathan: I just started a new job teaching hackers.

Travis: Hell yeah.

Nathan: I teach an online academy for hackers, and I don't know what the appropriate dress attire is.

Griffin: Ohh! Thank you, Nathan.

Travis: Okay, first off. Nathan—

Griffin: Thank you, Nathan, for this gift.

Justin: Thank you, Nathan.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: You're teaching an online hacker class? Dangerous.

Griffin: Yeah, if they show up and had to pay tuition, are you like, "You already fucking failed."

Travis: Yeah, that's it.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: Is the end of the class, "And present my social security number."

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: I mean... First, obvious question if I'm gonna plan an outfit for you, white hat or black hat?

Nathan: Uh... officially?

Travis: Oh, Nathan!

Griffin: Are you about to say you teach a dark web black hat hacker class?

Nathan: [laughs] Let's say white. Let's say white hat.

Griffin: 'Cause I've been wearing a wire this whole time.

Justin: Got you, Nathan.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: Well, first off, I assume you're already like hot gluing glowsticks to your jackets in different patterns?

Griffin: That's important, just for function.

Justin: Yeah, a bandolier.

Nathan: Oh, yeah. Absolutely. No, that's mandatory

Travis: Can I tell you what I'm realizing now, is a lot of my references are from the movie Hackers, and the TV show Reboot.

Griffin: Yeah, and that one episode of Ghost Rider.

Travis: Oh yeah, that one.

Justin: What do you normally wear?

Nathan: Well, I own a lot of shirts that are themed after breweries.

Griffin: Okay, okay...

Travis: Okay.

Griffin: Yeah, I could see that on a hacker.

Nathan: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: I say this to your fuckin' face. [laughs]

Travis: Okay, you need to get a T-shirt that says, "Typing noise, typing noise, typing noise... I'm in."

Justin: Oh, that's good!

Griffin: That's good!

[crowd laughs]

Justin: That's good.

Griffin: Can you wear like part of a keyboard on your chest and just occasionally be like, [typing noises], just when they're not really paying attention? That could be cool.

Nathan: I could probably get away with it, yeah.

Justin: Maybe a power glove?

Travis: Oh shit!

Justin: And you're like, "Here. You're not making any progress through the ICE. Give me a second." [digital noises]

Griffin: I hope you realize now that this is gonna be the whole bit. [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: Do you have or know someone who can get you access to a katana? Is that...

Nathan: I know lots of people.

Griffin: Of fuckin' course you do!

Justin: Of course he does!

Justin: He wears brewery T-shirts and teaches hacking classes. He knows any people—

Griffin: And he's at a My Brother, My Brother and Me live show!

Justin: Yeah, "I know lots of people with katanas!"

Travis: A katana... I don't know.

Griffin: Oh fuck. Okay.

Justin: I don't know, a real katana?

[crowd laughs]

Nathan: You have to go to the dark web for those.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Are there other hacker teachers?

Nathan: Yes, it's a co-teacher program.

Griffin: What do they wear? I imagine it runs the gamut, yes?

Nathan: Well, the other teacher is like 55. So, like...

Travis: Okay.

Nathan: [laughs]

Travis: Okay, Nathan. You ready for this? Whoever performs like the worst on a test or whatever, the next day wear a T-shirt with all their information printed on it.

[crowd laughs and cheers]

Justin: Oh my god!

Nathan: Said co-teacher actually did hand out his credit card information yesterday, as a dare.

Griffin: Okay...

Travis: Not a great dare.

Griffin: No!

Justin: Get a shirt with your social security number on it. That would be so cool. What an amazing—

Griffin: And just have it say, "Good luck. Find me."

[crowd laughs]

Travis: "Oh, what's that? I'm broke? Ah, man."

Justin: "Ah, man. They got everything..." Nathan, does that help?

Nathan: That helps so much. Thank—

Griffin: Hold, I'm not done.

Nathan: Oh!

[crowd laughs]

Justin: Thanks, Obamacare.

Griffin: Can you have it just be like a word jumble that says the word 'internet'. And the first student that gets it right, be like, "That's an A+ right there! Everybody else fails. You solved my jumble."

[crowd laughs]

Justin: You made me stop for that?

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: Okay... Does that help, Nathan? Just walk away, okay? I can't be

responsible for him.

Nathan: Less so now, but yes, overall.

Griffin: Thank you, Nathan.

Travis: We actually anti-helped.

Justin: We made it worse! Thank you, Nathan.

Travis: Hello.

Zaza: Hi, my name's Zaza.

Griffin: Hi Zaza.

Zaza: I was the one with the Shrek and Godfather question.

Griffin: Yeah, you did—

Travis: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Justin: Let's get into it.

Griffin: Let's hear it.

Zaza: So, it is my partner's sense of pride that he has never watched the movie

Shrek. And it is my point of pride that I have never watched the movie The

Godfather.

Travis: Why don't you all wanna watch good movies?

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: Sorry, Travis meant to say, "Exactly, precisely, equally good."

Zaza: Well, why doesn't he wanna watch Shrek? Shrek is a good movie.

Griffin: Yeah, sure.

Travis: Yeah, basically the same as Godfather.

Zaza: "Yeah, sure?" Come on...

Justin: Yeah, they're both good movies.

Zaza: They're both good.

Griffin: So, you're saying you wanna do like a movie swap. Except you don't have to watch The Godfather in the exchange.

Zaza: Yes.

Griffin: Okay, yeah, sure.

Travis: No, but usually if someone says as a point of pride it's like, "I've never sharted," or something.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: But the idea of like, "As a point of pride I refuse to watch a film that now everyone is trying to emulate in cartoons..." Or a film that everyone's trying to emulate [crosstalk].

Griffin: Hey, you know what's fucked up? I bet you there's... I bet you everyone on Earth has either seen Shrek or The Godfather at some point.

Zaza: Right? Yeah.

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: I bet you there's not one person...

Justin: Okay, obviously, quick poll. And be serious.

Travis: Everybody, hands up. This will be the easiest way to do it.

Justin: Okay, everybody put your hands up.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: Sorry, sorry, sorry. No, not in the cool way.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: One hand up. Now, drop your hand if you have seen The Godfather.

Griffin: And don't fucking lie! If you've never seen The God—wait.

Travis and Justin: If you've seen The Godfather, put your hand down.

Griffin: If you've seen The Godfather, put your hand down. [crosstalk]

Justin: Whoa... Okay, if you've seen the movie Shrek, put your hand down.

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: There's like, four.

Justin: Four soon to be best friends.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: Oh, it's a tontine! The last person to watch either Shrek or The Godfather, or die, gets all the money.

Zaza: [laughs]

Justin: Hey, listen. Here's what you do. You send him TikToks from the movie Shrek, until you've sent him every scene in the movie.

Griffin: Yeah. Legally, if he's seen 51% of Shrek, he's seen Shrek.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: Right. If I go to the bathroom during a movie, I still say I've seen the movie. I got up three times during Top Gun: Maverick 'cause I was bored.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: Whoa...

Justin: It's not the movie, it's me. I sat down 10 minutes in and I'm like, "I don't fuckin' like planes..."

[crowd laughs]

Justin: That's my fault, I went and saw it. Anyway, if you've seen—

Travis: No, no, Justin. Please, continue on with your full review of Top Gun: Maverick.

Zaza: [laughs]

Justin: If you send him enough TikToks to where he's seen 50.0001% of Shrek...

Travis: But don't spoil the ending. That's the best part. The twist? Ah, it was Donkey the whole time.

Justin: Then he's seen Shrek.

Zaza: Neither of us have TikTok.

Justin: Okay... You should've warned me about that. What? Is there other places with videos... Um... YouTube? I guess you could send him YouTube videos of Shrek until he's probably seen over half of Shrek.

Griffin: You could take Nathan—[wheezes]

Travis: No! Just start it— find Shrek on YouTube, and start it with like, "You've gotta watch this hilarious video."

[crowd laughs]

Zaza: [laughs]

Travis: [crosstalk] Keep going.

Griffin: [crosstalk]

Justin: Hold on, hold on.

Travis: No, [unintelligible].

Griffin: [crosstalk]

Justin: You probably would only need to clear 47 minutes or so. If you could keep that grift going for 47 minutes.

Griffin: You could take Nathan's hacker class, and then just drop clips of it in an email.

Zaza: Combine two, okay.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: Does that help?

Travis: Yeah, just every time your partner tries to call their mom, it's Shrek. [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: Are you serious about getting out of this? 'Cause I have a 100% foolproof way.

Zaza: Oh, yeah.

Justin: Watch The Godfather: Part II.

Zaza: Are you seri—oh, the Part—the Part II, where it's the director's granddaughter?

Justin: Watch Part II and then tell him, "Hey, I watched The Godfather: Part II. I didn't really get it. I guess I don't really..."

[crowd laughs]

Justin: They'll be so furious that they will drop the entire enterprise. I guarantee it.

Travis: You can also do this. Start Godfather and like, "Oh, no. Actually, I think I have seen that. It's like with the whole mafia thing?"

Justin: "Oh, actually I did see it."

Travis: [crosstalk]

Griffin: "He shoots the guy..."

Travis: And like, "Oh, yeah. He's the..." Reference "Leave the cannoli." Oh—leave the cannoli? And like, [crosstalk].

Justin: "Leave the gun, take the cannoli."

Travis: Whatever it is. Something about cannoli.

Griffin: Why would he leave the cannoli?

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: We just did a murder and I'm gonna tell you to leave the cannoli right there?!

Travis: Why would he leave the gun?! Why would he leave the murder weapon?!

[pause]

Griffin: Yeah, Trav!

Travis: So, which one is he leaving?

[pause]

Griffin: He leaves the gun and takes the-

Travis: The murder weapon! He leaves the murder weapon at the scene of the

crime!

Griffin: Yeah, 'cause what's he gonna do? Leave cannoli in the sun?

[crowd laughs]

Justin: No, they're going somewhere else. And... I don't think *I've* seen Godfather... Listen—

[crowd exclaims]

Justin: Here's what you do. You watch five minutes of Shrek, five minutes of Godfather. Five minutes of Shrek, five minutes of Godfather.

Griffin: Yes.

[crowd applauds]

Travis: Until eventually it's one movie.

Justin: It's one movie, you're watching it on two screens. Can you watch them at the same time?

Griffin: Yes! Get like a stereoscopic—

Travis: Yes! Opacity 50%! No, one TV 50% opacity Godfather—

Griffin: Left channel Shrek, right channel Godfather!

Zaza: A dual screen moment? Okay.

Griffin and Travis: Yes.

Zaza: I can get behind that.

Travis: No, one screen!

Zaza: One screen, just randomly switching?

Griffin: Watch one, listen to the other. Then switch!

[crowd laughs]

Zaza: Okay, okay!

Justin: [laughs] Does that help?

Zaza: Yeah, that helps so much.

Griffin: Thank you very much.

Zaza: Thank you, brothers! Love you guys.

[crowd applauds]

Travis: I'm starting to feel like this is our greatest live show ever.

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: Alright, I wanna—Amanda just said no. [wheezes] Thank you, Amanda.

Okay, hello.

Kate: Hi.

Justin: Hi. We're a podcast. What's your deal?

Kate: So, I'm Kate. I sent in the question—

One guy in the crowd: Yeah!

Kate: [laughs]

Griffin: [laughs] Hi, Kate.

Justin: Some Kate-heads in the audience.

[crowd laughs]

Kate: I sent in the question about rabbits?

Griffin: Yeah, yeah, yeah. [crosstalk].

Justin: Oh, thank god. Go ahead, Kate.

Kate: Okay. So, I—

Travis: And also, let this be a lesson to you if you ever come to another live show and you're like, "I think my question will get answered." This is the new baro—like, this is the new...

Griffin: This is the bar. No pressure, Kate.

Kate: Yeah, for sure. So, I volunteer at a 4-H County Fair every year. I'm the rabbit superintendent.

[crowd laughs]

Kate: And this year, I got to attend as the rabbit judge.

Justin: You were the super attendant.

[crowd laughs]

Kate: And so... [laughs]

Kate: Um... The problem is that today was the breed class and I had to judge all these rabbits.

Travis: Today?

Kate: Yeah.

Travis: Oh, wow.

Kate: So, I had to pose them all. And you have to go through every animal in the barn. And there was a problem that arose. Because when you're handling all of the female rabbits, and all of the male rabbits, the male rabbits smell the female rabbit... And they start sort of just going to town on your hands, arms, body.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: Hey, Kate, you've showered since then, right?

Kate: Yes. Very, very, very much. I mean, I don't have dirt all over me, so you can also tell from that.

Justin: Okay...

Griffin: I'm sorry that you had to say that. [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Kate: [laughs]

Justin: Actually, from now on, if you're at one of our live shows, I would like everyone to just mention, "I don't have dirt all over me." Anyway, I'd like [crosstalk].

Travis: It's an audio medium. Everyone might not know.

Justin: Yeah. If you're listening to this later, I do not have dirt all over... [wheezes]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: So, what... I mean, the rabbits are getting down. Is that the problem?

Travis: Well, to completion. If I remember the question correctly.

Justin: Are they going to completion?

Kate: Yes. Multiple times throughout the show.

[crowd exclaims]

Travis: Wait, multiple times per rabbit?

Justin: Kate...

Kate: It's what rabbits are known for. Um...

Justin: Is how many jizzes they do?

Griffin: They like carrots! They like carrots! They give me eggs on Easter!

Travis: Thank you for clarifying!

Griffin: There are a lot of other things I know about rabbits, other than they like to jizz a bunch.

[crowd laughs]

Kate: Yeah. So, basically... I mean, there's a whole show circuit and there's like people who do judging and stuff. But I figured—

Justin: I thought you were about to say there's people who whack 'em off. [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: "He can't show right now. No one's whacked him off yet. Give me a second. Jerk off this rabbit!"

Travis: Kate, Kate. Kate, I'm sorry to ask this question, but I have to know. Do you deduct points when that happens? Or do you add points?

Griffin: Or is it bonus points? [laughs]

Justin: [laughs] "I'd give him a blue ribbon, but I'm afraid he'd jizz again from excitement!"

Kate: I did give all the rabbits that finished... I did end up giving them all blue ribbons. It's how it worked. I didn't deduct points. They were all good rabbits. What can I say?

Justin: [through laughter] I hope you are locking this in your memories, in amber. 'Cause no one will hear it again after tonight!

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: Oh, god... Okay, hold on...

Kate: Okay, so my big question, of course, I thought-

Justin: Yeah, what question do you have about this?

[crowd laughs]

Kate: How do I stop the rabbits from jizzing on me?

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: Yeah, for sure.

Justin: For sure.

Griffin: But hold on. Is there a...

[crowd applauds]

Griffin: Is there a how high does the bunny hop contest as part of this?

Kate: Not as a part of this.

Travis: That's at 4-H Afterhours. That's where the betting begins.

Justin: Yeah, back alley.

Griffin: Can you give me one of the other criteria that they are judged by?

Justin: Coat shininess?

Kate: It's like a dog breed show. So, like you know, look at the shape, the density. You know, things like that.

Griffin: Okay...

Travis: Wait, how dense is the...

[crowd laughs]

Justin: You like a thick boy.

Travis: Oh, the bunny. Okay. Not the...

Kate: The rabbit, the rabbit!

Justin: By the way, if you're listening to this later, there are people close to us who have physically turned their bodies away.

Travis: They are recoiling.

Justin: They're no longer oriented towards us performing. They're orientated away from us to other directions.

Griffin: That's good.

Justin: I love that.

Griffin: If there was a how high can the bunny hop contest, do you think there would be a judge stopping the bunnies from hopping so high. And saying, "Don't hop so high, bunnies."

Kate: Well, of course not.

Griffin: This is a... Sorry. Y'all invented what is essentially a jizzing contest.

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: You cannot... We have to stop talking about rabbit jizz now!

Travis: Hey, Kate. Next time, judge the boy bunnies first. Does that help?

Justin: Kate, does that help though?

Kate: Sure.

Travis: Nice.

Justin: Yeah, okay. Thanks. Everyone, big hand for Kate.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: Hello.

Owen: Hello. I'm Owen.

Justin: Hi, Owen.

Griffin: Hi, Owen.

Owen: How are you?

Griffin: Uh... All right.

Owen: [laughs]

Owen: I sent in a question about getting permabanned from a bar in Portland.

Griffin: Yeah, yeah. For sure.

Justin: All right, Owen. Give us the story.

Griffin: From the 4-H rabbit show.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: I guess chanting's not allowed.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: First, what's the name of the bar?

Owen: Space Room. It's over on Hawthorn.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: Well, hold your horses!

Justin: Now, hold on a second.

Griffin: You don't know this tale of woe.

Justin: Owen, what happened?

Owen: My birthday was Wednesday.

Justin: Congratulations.

Travis: Happy birthday.

Griffin: It was so recent.

Owen: So, I went out and drank with some of my friends.

Justin: Cool.

Griffin: Yeah.

Owen: Ended up at the Space Room. End of the night comes around, last call happens. My friend, Charlie, decides to whip his pants down in the middle of the bar.

Travis: Wait, no! It's not as bad as you think. Go on.

Griffin: Still pretty bad.

Owen: And I end up getting super fucking in trouble.

Travis: Hey, Owen. You have to finish with like, they mooned you. Not just whipped their pants down in the middle of a bar.

Griffin: Yeah, there's two sides to that interaction.

Owen: Oh, he full dumped it out, like in front of our table.

Justin: Full pressed ham, mooning. Okay.

Owen: Yeah, no. This is very Charlie.

Griffin: Dumped it out could also... I'm just saying...

Justin: It's just like a tasteful mooning.

[crowd laughs]

Owen: This is not the first time he's done this either.

Justin: Okay, yeah...

Owen: This happens in a lot of bars.

Griffin: Is he here?

Owen: No, he's not.

Griffin: Oh, thank god. 'Cause I'm gonna say some mean stuff about him.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: Wait, but that guy... You, permabanned. The target?

Owen: Not permabanned.

Travis: Not you?

Owen: I'm permabanned.

Travis: This is what I'm saying.

Justin: This is what I'm saying, that's messed up!

Travis: That's not fair, you didn't do anything. You were the recipient.

Owen: How do I get unbanned?

Griffin: Did you... Hold on.

Travis: [yelling] Take 'em to Judge Judy!

[crowd laughs and cheers]

Griffin: Did you... Did you laugh, though?

Justin: Owen...

Owen: Of course I did.

Justin: Of course you did.

Griffin: See...

Travis: Now, I also think the context that it was last call actually should provide some leniency. 'Cause if that happens at 9:30PM, that's a permaban. 2:30 in the morning? Like yeah, we've all been there.

Justin: I mean, did this bar serve Charlie?

Owen: Yes.

Justin: You could make the argument then that they are culpable. Right?

[crowd laughs]

Justin: Like, "You gave this person so much booze that they're mooning people. You gotta cut off..."

Travis: "You provided windows!"

Owen: [laughs]

Justin: Right. How do you get permabanned? Have you tried to just walk back

in?

Griffin: Yeah!

Owen: Sure have!

Griffin: Wait, wait. Hold on. This is a development.

Justin: [crosstalk] Is there a picture of you or something? What's the story?

Owen: All of the bartenders know me. I used to live like two blocks from the Space Room.

Justin: Okay, all right. So... All right.

Owen: It's also the—

Travis: Is it like a fun banning where like, "Ah, you get out of here!"

Owen: No, it's the not fun. Not fun.

Griffin: Apparently, they don't know you well enough to know you're not a butt

weirdo. Your friend is.

Owen: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: Have you tried wearing a mask that says like, "Not a butt weirdo."

Owen: I could.

Griffin: It's important it's a mask, for some reason.

Travis: Well, otherwise it's just written on your face, Griffin!

Justin: You could bring a tray of my mom's world-famous chess bars?

Travis: Oh, that's gonna get you back in, yeah.

Justin: That would be nice. Bring a nice baked good in and then just be like, "I'm sorry about all the butt—"

Griffin: Fuck that, no! What are you gonna write on the card? Sorry my friend showed me his butt and you kicked me out of here forever?

Owen: [laughs]

Travis: That's fair. If that was a stranger who mooned you, then they're not gonna kick you out. So, it's your friend? That's a problem.

Justin: Wait. Travis was joking about Judge Judy, but I'm starting to think it's the appropriate venue—

Griffin: This is kind of it.

Travis: I wasn't joking!

Justin: Yeah, I think it might be the appropriate venue for this.

Griffin: She would love to get her hands on this one.

Justin: "All right, so let me get this straight. Hold on, let me put down my pretzels. Let me get this straight..."

Travis: "So, you're telling me this isn't a custody battle and they didn't like paint your car weird? Thank you, Christ!"

Owen: [laughs]

Justin: Um... Ah...

Travis: I don't know why our Judge Judys sound like that.

Griffin: We're so shitty at sounding like Judge Judy.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: Owen, do you like the bar?

Owen: I do!

Griffin: It sounds like a cool bar the way everybody cheered at it.

Justin: Yeah...

Griffin: Wait a minute...

Owen: There are definitely worse things that have happened there too.

Griffin: Can this be one of these times where we abuse our power as taste makers?

Justin: And so, if you go into this bar, just be like, "You should really let Owen back in. It was not Owen's fault that Owen got mooned."

Travis: Yes!

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: Tonight... I'm just saying, not tonight. 'Cause I don't wanna be associated with it in any way.

Justin: I wanna be in San Diego, California.

Griffin: When you lead a Les Misérables style revolution down the streets of Portland.

Owen: [laughs]

Justin: [singing] Do you hear the people moon? Singing the songs of angry men.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: Owen, does that help?

Owen: Yeah.

Justin: All right!

Griffin: Thank you, Owen.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Hey, right off the bat, I wanna say thank you to Tyler Reed for the beautiful poster.

Griffin: Yes!

Justin: Yes!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Thank you to the incredible Rachel Jacobs for making the trip all the way out here to record us. Thank you, Rachel.

Travis: Rachel is covering her mouth, in a I might throw up kind of way, maybe? Yeah, okay... We're getting a thumbs up.

Justin: A thumbs up for Rachel.

Griffin: Thank you to Emily and Michael, our ASL interpreters.

Justin: Yay!

Travis: Yay!

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Wait, hold on. Sorry. What is that sign? I love it. What's that?

Griffin: I think that's applause, Trav.

Travis: Oh. Hey, yeah!

Justin: Thanks to Paul Sabourin.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Thanks to our dad. Our dad, Bill from True Blood.

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd laughs and cheers]

Griffin: Thank you to Amanda for managing our business and cleaning the microphone, and letting me borrow this great cape.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: And you know what? Thank you to Montaigne for the use of our theme song, My Life Is Better With You.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: And Griffin, real quick...

Griffin: And thanks to the Arlene Schnitzer Concert Hall, for accommodating us here.

Justin: Oh, this is a beautiful place.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Real quick, Griffin. We always close with a celebrity impression.

Griffin: Sure, man.

Justin: I would just love to hear your impression of a rat jizzing.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: A rat?! Wait, hold on! You ch—

Justin: A rabbit.

Travis: That was my favorite part of Ratatouille.

Justin: I misspoke.

Griffin: "What is this, a mushroom? Geee!"

Justin: A rabbit jizzing.

Travis: [laughs] No, hold on. More of that, Griffin.

Justin: No, no, no. I wanna hear a rabbit jizz.

Griffin: That's just my Patton Oswalt impression.

Justin: Let's hear a rabbit jizz.

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: Do I... have to?

Travis: "Ah, what's up? Ooah!"

Justin: Travis, don't help him.
