Justin: [laughs]

**Travis**: I'm never good— It's the time where everybody starts changing their names on social media and stuff to be like their spooky like Halloween version of their name. And I never come up with a good one.

**Griffin**: Yeah... our name is difficult to terrorize, has been my experience.

**Justin**: I haven't really thought about this in a long time and it gets... It's like trying to pick it in August 'cause it's instantly sweaty. It's just, as soon as you come up with something, it's...

**Griffin**: One time at church camp, someone called me Gryffindor macaroni. And then I realized I would never scare anyone.

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: Yeah...

**Griffin**: I would never be scary or imposing or impressive.

**Justin**: The mirror wasn't what tipped you off to that. It was the Gryffindor McElroy moment.

Griffin: No, Justin. Gryffindor macaroni.

**Justin**: [laughs] I just wanted to make you say it again.

**Travis**: Is Travis Smack-Elroy anything? Is that scary? I don't wanna get smacked.

Griffin: I'm afraid of being smacked.

Travis: I don't wanna get smacked.

**Griffin**: I got smacked one time by a friend in middle school `cause I kept slapping the bottom of his disposable camera to make the flash go off. And he was worried I was gonna overexpose the film. And he slapped my face.

Travis: [laughs]

Griffin: And I pointed at him and I said, "Don't ever touch me again."

Justin: Woah.

**Griffin**: And then I walked out of the locker room where this conflict happened. And I just wanna say, Mike, if you're listening, name the time and place. Mother fucker. [laughs]

Travis: [laughs]

Justin: Woah. That is something I never expected from you, yeah.

**Griffin**: Name the time and place. Nah... I've been sitting on this one for 23 years and I'm ready for him.

Justin: What else do you remember about Mike?

**Griffin**: Well... he did show me a pornographic magazine that belonged to his father. We were in middle school and I don't... I'm not going to give the brand of the magazine free publicity.

Justin: [laughs]

**Griffin**: Safe to say that it was not the smoothest transition into my sexual awakening that—

Travis: [laughs]

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: There was possibly other-

**Justin**: A bit of a bumpy road there.

Griffin: There was other reading material that-

**Justin**: Yeah, skipped to kind of an advanced level of pornography it sounds like [laughs].

Travis: [laughs]

**Griffin**: There was an anatomical realization that came before the erotic one. And the two got real confuddled up in my 13-year-old brain. Anyway, Mike, I'm—

**Justin**: They were kind of on the roundabout of your psyche and then it just sort of took wrong turns into different roads that they weren't supposed to head down.

**Griffin**: Mike also gave me a heads up that I was being cheated on in collage one time. So, I think we're square. Mike, keep on going strong. We don't have to fight. What were we doing? What are we doing?

Griffin: What are we doing?

**Griffin**: Guys, I love Millennial Seinfeld as much as the next guy. But um...

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: Hey, Griffin, are you just realizing that's what the show is?

Griffin: Hey, Trav... I fucking refuse to accept that.

Travis: Okay.

Griffin: There's no way.

**Justin**: Okay, let's talk about it. Griffin's in a mood where— Travis and I find Griffin in this mood sometimes where it's like, "I don't like that joke." [laughs]

Travis: [laughs] "No."

**Justin**: "I'd prefer another joke. But I don't have an alternative joke." It's just like [laughs], "What other jokes are on offer?"

**Griffin**: I got one. I have this to say about Halloween. The best Halloween innovation in the last decade has been the big skeleton.

Travis: Yes.

**Griffin**: That people I guess have been buying at... I don't know where you get a big skeleton.

**Travis**: It's gotta be Spirit of Halloween. I don't think they have 'em at your local Costco.

**Justin**: At Lowe's yesterday, there was a sign that was like, "One giant skeleton per customer please."

**Griffin**: It's a real issue. So, I do think that... Mr. Biden, if we could get one of those sent to every American household.

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin**: And then there would be a date prescribed by the government that you do put your big skeleton out. And then as you walk around the neighborhood, it reminds you that trick or treat is coming. Costume kids are coming. The grave... Just to keep that presence.

Justin: Yeah, Draculas.

Griffin: Scary grave...

Justin: Draculas, all that stuff.

Griffin: That's a holiday I can get in to.

**Travis**: I would also say I think Biden should pass an amendment that says like when you get your big skeleton up, no adorning it with any political statements or anything.

Griffin: No.

**Travis**: We don't want him holding a sign or wearing a hat. If you know what I mean?

Justin: Yeah, I gotcha.

**Travis**: Like, this is a purely a-political stance on skeleton awareness.

**Griffin**: Maybe in Christmas there's a sort of skin wrap you can put on it to make it look like a Santa Claus.

**Travis**: Well, then it's a Jack Skellington. You put the beard on it, you put the hat on it...

**Griffin**: No, I'm talking about a full epidermis... Sort of like a real— When I say skin wrap, I don't mean a costume you put on the skeleton. I mean, you make it a real boy, but a Santa Claus that's eight feet tall.

**Travis**: Do you think that there was an original draft of Nightmare Before Christmas where they were like, "Well, I think Jack Skellington knows that Santa should be like rotund. So, what he's gonna do is he's gonna pop Santa's skeleton out of his butt. And he's gonna climb in there and wear a Santa suit." **Justin**: Here's what I'm thinking, guys.

Travis: Okay?

Travis: Okay, woah, woah, woah.

**Justin**: Yeah, I know. Big Santa is something I do sometimes.

Travis: Sure.

**Justin**: Big Jack Skellington is something I do sometimes, right?

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin**: But what about like... like just, what if the skeleton could just be a different big man.

Griffin: For every holiday. Yeah, sure.

**Justin**: Right. So like, you have big skeleton.

Travis: Uh-huh?

**Justin**: And that, it's spooky, right? Christmas, I mean, makes its own gravy. You wrap the Santa suit on him. Done.

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin**: He's good.

**Justin**: Huge robe, beard, scythe, father time, new year's.

Travis: Sure.

Griffin: Awesome.

**Justin**: Or you do like a diaper on the skeleton, he's like a new year's baby.

Travis: Well, no. Save the diaper. Diaper, wings, bow.

**Griffin**: At midnight, you rip the toga off the skeleton and it's wearing a diaper now. And now it's a baby.

**Justin**: Yeah. But it's just like... why do we have so many different huge men? Let's have one huge man that you dress up for any holiday you want.

Griffin: Veteran's Day, make him a soldier. Memorial Day-

Travis: Now, but is there always a skeleton underneath?

Justin: Memorial Day back to-

**Griffin**: Yeah, Travis. That was gonna be my joke before Travis did make sure to jump right in there and cut that off right at the pass.

**Travis**: Sorry, I wasn't even making a joke. I'm imagining the transitional period where between each holiday, you do have to strip it back to a skeleton and then dress it.

**Justin**: You are legally not allowed to do that while people are awake. You have to go door to door and knock on everyone's door and say, "Are you guys out?" And they'll say, "Yeah." And then you can go and do this thing.

**Griffin**: Yeah. And you say, "Tonight's my skeleton night. So, don't come out and do you skeleton. 'Cause we can't see each other do it."

**Justin**: These are Biden issued. [laughs] They call 'em Bidey Bones because Biden said, "The pandemic's over. I got all this money. We're gonna do Bidey Bones." [laughs] And then everyone says, "All right, I'm

ready." And then the Bidey Bones just start showing up by the truckload. Every household gets a Bidey Bone.

Griffin: Preassembled.

**Justin**: Multifamily housing? Every family gets a Bidey Bone. And it's just a yard of skeletons outside.

Griffin: That's fun.

**Travis**: Now, I do like it being preassembled. And maybe like it's still kind of warm and the bones are moist and hot like real bones. And Biden's like, "Don't ask questions. I got resources."

Justin: "Don't ask questions about the Bidey Bones."

**Travis**: "But let's just say I got a lot of these laying around in a certain area in the desert."

Griffin: [laughs]

Griffin: Justin, you are making me so hugely uncomfortable.

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin**: Not because you're standing, but because you're kind of rocking back and forth.

Justin: This is the way I stand?

**Griffin**: Yeah, no. You look like you're a new judge on Shark Tank who very publicly does cocaine immediately before each taping.

Justin: [laughs]

**Travis**: And maybe has also made some bad investments and really needs this one to work out.

**Justin**: Where is that episode of Shark Tank where you get the basketball player who's like, "This wealthy b-" But he really needs one of these to work.

**Travis**: "And you say it's a sure thing? It's a sure thing? People will definitely want this?"

Justin: "It's a sure thing!"

**Travis**: "All right I'm willing to invest 20 million dollars in your frog warmers!" And the other Shark's like, "Don't do— No, hey... You can't do this."

**Justin**: "They can't accept that much money." It's like, "But if this is a sure thing, I gotta..."

**Travis**: "It's a sure thing, they said so! Everyone's gonna want a frog warmer."

Griffin: "I'm giving you 20 million dollars for 500% of frog warmers."

Justin: [laughs] "Let it ride."

Travis: [laughs]

Griffin: "Let it ride, baby. Let's see where this thing takes us."

**Griffin**: It doesn't have to be a big thing.

Travis: Yeah, don't make like an issue out of it, okay?

**Justin**: "I'm currently studying elementary education. And I have a lot of experience working with kids on reading/writing. In July, my coworker and I began discussing the possibility of me tutoring his son in reading. He kept setting dates for us to meet for a tutoring session and then changed the date at the last minute.

Travis: Justin, what are you looking at?

**Justin**: I was thinking about a story that is related to this that I wanted to share with y'all. I don't cut my own grass. I do most of the things in my house, but that is one thing that I decided like I'm gonna pay somebody to cut my grass. 'Cause I hate cutting grass. I hate it.

## Justin: [laughs]

**Justin**: I had got to a point where I almost asked if I could borrow his lawnmower so I could do it. But then I worried there was a reality in which he's like, "That was real good. I have one other yard that I'd love your help with." Travis: [laughs] "Are you looking for a side gig?"

**Justin**: And then it's like, I'd do three or four yards 'cause I'd feel so guilty. And then it's like, "Wait a minute. I think I work for this guy now."

Justin: You guys want another question?

Travis: You know what? I really do.

**Griffin**: Eric sent this one in and it's how to find an interesting name for your band.

**Travis**: Wait, it can't be The McElroy Brothers 'cause that's actually taken, I found out recently. There's like three McElroy Brothers who do, I believe it's called commercial rock or something? Which doesn't seem like a thing.

Griffin: Well, we do kind of commercial rock.

Travis: Do we?

**Griffin**: Well, we have sponsors on the show and I think that our comedy style really rocks dudes.

Travis: Well, we've covered scatting, we do jingles.

Griffin: Yeah?

**Travis**: We've done some musicals.

**Griffin**: Yeah, but we really shred these jokes. "Are you looking for a catchy name for your band? The name your band chooses can make the difference between success and failure."

**Travis**: A lot of syllables too.

Griffin: Or just The Peppers.

**Griffin**: Et Cetera. "Make your name SEO friendly. These days, you want your name to be easily findable when you search it on the internet. Names are too common— "

Justin: Hoobastank.

**Griffin**: Hoobastank. I'm pretty sure every one of these bits in this question or wikiHow article, we could just say Hoobastank.

Travis: Yeah, Hoobastank.

**Justin**: Well, it's like a good name for a band. Like I don't know anything about the bank, but it's a good name for a band.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis**: Assuming you know that. In this day and age, Griffin, you can't assume people know. **Griffin**: "Find a name that's fresh. You wanna avoid band names that are cliché now because they were trends a long time ago. It's passé to add a number to your name. Boys 2 Men seems so not now. Acronyms are out. Think NSYNC. Putting an exclamation point at the end of your name will date you too. Adding an extra D or T on the end of a name is kind of cliché, avoid it. Think Ratt." Rat-t.

Justin: Rat-t-t.

**Griffin**: Ratat-t-t-touille. "Develop a vision for you band." That one we've already done. Pop, young, spirited.

**Travis**: Hip, now, with it, sexy.

Griffin: And these are words that we can take and fold into.

**Travis**: Oh, sorry. I was saying that for the band name.

**Griffin**: Yeah, no. That's what I'm saying. So, Sexy Coldplay would be a good one, a better one than just regular Coldplay.

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: Hip, Young, Fresh, Sexy Coldplay. Too many words?

**Griffin**: Coldplay lets you know that it's gonna be pop `cause this band has Coldplay in it.

Justin: Koldplay with a K, is that anything?

Griffin: Mm-hmm!

Travis: Hot Play, Hot Work.

**Griffin**: We've talked about Hot Work before. We have made that exact joke.

Travis: No way.

Justin: Yeah, we've said exactly Hot Work.

**Griffin**: We have made that exact joke. So, "Find a word with meaning to you. Combine it with something, perhaps. Your favorite candy bar, the name of your girlfriend from high school, your home town. All these are words you could add to a band name or just use as one."

**Travis**: Now, I assume when it says the name of your girlfriend from high school, it doesn't mean like full name [laughs].

Griffin: Samantha Davis Three Musketeers.

Travis: [laughs]

**Justin**: [laughs] Sydnee Skor. Sydnee Skor is not a bad name for a—Love a Skor Bar.

Griffin: I thought that was a dipping tabaco?

**Justin**: It's like a thinner Heath Bar.

Griffin: Oh, that does sound fun.

**Travis**: What's the one that— Oh, Zero. That's what I was thinking of. With the nougat and the white chocolate.

**Griffin**: "Use a pop culture or literary reference."

Justin: Ooh.

**Griffin**: "Mikey Way was working in a Barns and Noble and saw the book by Irvine Welsh intitled Three Tales of Chemical Romance." And then he came up with the name of the band, Coldplay.

Travis: "This is my band, the So-So Gatsbys."

**Justin**: That's a pretty good name for a band, Travis. Damn it.

**Travis**: Thank you, thank you. I can't decide if they're emo or punk. But they're one of those two.

**Justin**: Can you do screamo? I always thought that was the funniest genre.

Travis: Oh, fuck yeah, I can, dude.

Justin: Yeah, screamo. That's perfect.

**Griffin**: "Get inspiration from common products or things. Flowers, food, sewing machines, you name it. Look around the house, you'll find a lot of common things with interesting names. AC/DC got their name from a sewing machine. Food names can also make good band names— "

Justin: Preparation Hoobastank.

**Travis**: That's what it's short for. Not a lot of people know that's what the H stands for.

Justin: [laughs]

**Griffin**: "Food names can also make good band names. Think Black Eyed Peas or Red Hot Chili Peppers." So, which one is it, wikiHow?

Justin: [laughs] Which one of those is a good name?

**Griffin**: Can we take a step back? Because right now you're telling me that Red Hot Chili Peppers is a good band name. But let me... Red, hot, chili, peppers... That's four fucking words.

**Travis**: Are you sure red hot's not one word? Isn't there a candy called Redhots and they're just the one word?

**Griffin**: Oh, that's right. And Anthony Kiedis dated somebody named Chili Peppers in high school.

Justin: [laughs]

**Griffin**: "Pick a random name." Thanks, that's nothing.

Travis: Sure...

**Griffin**: "Use your own name or your initials. This is always a possibility, especially if your band has a front man. For example, The Dave Matthews Band is simply based on one of the band members' names." [laughs]

Justin: Oh my god, that makes so much sense!

Travis: It's never clicked for me before!

Justin: So, wait. His name is Dave? There's a real Dave Matthews?

**Travis**: I thought it was like Hootie & the Blowfish. Do you think that there was ever a moment when they were coming out and he was like, "What if we just called it the Dave Matthews Band?" And they were like, "Uh... Dave. I'm not sure. We were talking about a bunch of cool names?" "Yeah. But wouldn't it be simpler if we just called it Dave Matthews Band?" And like, "I don't think it would, Dave."

**Griffin**: So, make up a new word is another one and they give the example, "Metallica is an example of a band with a name that is a madeup word. German, Lars Ulrich, made it up while thinking about a metal magazine." I wish I could live inside that man's wonderful fuck'n imaginarium of fuck'n Doctor Parnassus mind palace that he's got going on in there.

Justin: [laughs]

**Griffin**: It also says, "Create a new word by misspelling a common word like Korn. But that's taken." Unless we wanted to do like K-A-U-R-N. And then... this is the name of our band, it's not...

Justin: Okay, what about this... What about Corn with a C?

Travis: Ooh.

**Griffin**: [laughs]

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: Ooh, I like that.

**Griffin**: [in silly gravely tone] "What's up everybody? We're Corm!" Did you say Corm?

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: Zing zappa zee, ziba ziba!

Travis: "This is my band, Poobastang." [laughs] "Excuse me."

Justin: [sings] "Are you teady?" Like, "What? What did you say?"

Griffin: [laughs] Ah, man.

Justin: [laughs] Corm.

Travis: [laughs]

**Griffin**: "Make sure someone else doesn't have your name. It would be a nightmare to— "

Justin: Hey! Hey! Hey, nobody take Corm! [laughs]

**Travis**: TM, TM, TM!

Justin: "Me and Jerry got Corm." [laughs]

**Travis**: "Wait, which one did you say?" "I said Corm. Can we be Corm?"

Justin: "With a C! With a K!"

**Travis**: "How are you spelling it?" "With a K." "Yeah, that's fine. I can't see how that would be confusing at all."

**Justin**: That was a competing band. Johnathan Davis started Korn and a friend of his started Corm [laughs].

**Travis**: And Korn was already on the rise. Korn had been on the scene for like two years.

**Justin**: Corm had a C in the beginning but an M at the end. And they were heading up and Johnathan Davis was like, [scat sings] "I guess the thing that you need is for your band to be named after Korn."

**Griffin**: [laughs] Juice, I'm sorry for this one, "Determine if the domain name is available." So, corm.gov?

**Travis**: Is hoomastank.com taken? It's gotta be, right.

**Griffin**: Corm.com is available. That's gonna be a big ask, though. 'Cause it does look a lot like corn.

**Travis**: I can't imagine how it can be confusing. It's corn with an M.

**Griffin**: It's different in every way. "Develop more than one band name." No, fuck you. No. We struck gold here. "And then trademark your band name with the United States Patent Office." I don't— Is that—

[isolated scat singing section from Korn's song, Freak on a Leash plays]

Travis: Thank you, Justin.

**Griffin**: it took you a while to find that button. 'Cause I know you did program that last time that we talked about Korn.

**Justin**: I did program it last time but I had switched the pads over. I know, isn't that sad? I feel like if we're gonna continue to orga— Now that, that came organically. Like, do we just maybe think about that part in Freak on a Leash a lot more than other people do?

Travis: Or are we just the only one willing to talk about it, Justin?

**Griffin**: The band... It's 2022, so much stuff, bad stuff, has happened since Korn came on the scene. That it makes the fact that there was a band called Korn that had a song that sounded like [scat sings] really, really funny to me. It's like we look back and it's like, "There were some bad times in there. And then right before, there was a band called Korn."

**Travis**: It's like when people had to sit through hippies and stuff and they were like, "I miss when music was like [melodically boops intro to The Chordettes' song, Mr. Sandman]. Except now for us it's, "I miss when music was like [scat sings]."

**Griffin**: It's not even the music that I miss, Travis. It was a more whimsical time.

Travis: Oh, yeah.

Griffin: A simpler and better time.

Justin: I wanted to make an announcement about the band Korn.

Travis: Okay?

**Justin**: Last time we talked about Korn, which I'm sure it's been months.

Travis: Now, sorry. Which band, Justin? Korn or Corm?

Justin: Sorry, this is about Korn and it is from last week.

Travis: Okay.

**Justin**: I mentioned Heady but the bassist of Korn is named Fieldy. As several listeners kindly corrected me. A lot of real Kornos in the audience and I did not know that. A lot of Kornographers. And I'm so sorry to run afoul. My. Fieldy, if you're listening, I'm so sorry.

**Griffin**: There's no way anyone in that band listens to podcasts. Not one of 'em.

**Justin**: There's no way anyone in Korn listens to podcasts? Korn with a K I'm talking about now. You understand that? Not Corm.

Griffin: No. There's no way. Those dudes are way too fucking cool.

**Justin**: [laughs] Let's go to the Money Zone.

Griffin: [laughs]

[theme song plays]

**Justin**: Hi, everybody. Sorry to interrupt. Brief programing note, the Rapture did happen and only Travis was scooped up.

**Griffin**: I miss him so much. And when we say only Travis, we mean in the world, he was the only one with a pure soul.

**Justin**: Yeah, it was the Travis-ure, they got him.

**Griffin**: It was the Travis-ure. I was hanging out with Kirk Cameron when it happened and he was like, "Wow, really? Not me? Huh, that stinks."

**Justin**: "Unbelievable..." Hey, you wanna save a little cash? You know, it's about to be the holiday season and you're gonna be buying gifts for people. Maybe you're trying to get out ahead of it. This would be really, really ahead of it and I do doth my cap to you, milady.

Griffin: [laughs]

**Travis**: Also, I would find myself immediately as soon as like their back was turned or I could get away from them, googling like, "Is eating trail mix slang for something?"

Justin: "Is eating trail mix bad to do now?"

**Travis**: "Is this like from a meme where there's like a carton squirrel that eats trail mix and then like shits themselves? What is this in reference to?"

Justin: "Did I like run afoul of some meme?"

Travis: "It can't just be trail mix. Right?"

Justin: "It can't be. No, certainly not."

**Travis**: "I've always thought of trail mix as a very neutral food. Like, who wouldn't enjoy trail mix? There's something for everyone in there. How could it become a bad thing? Is it about nuts? It's gotta be something about nuts, right? Nuts are in there."

**Griffin**: "Are they saying that I like to have nuts, like testicles— Is it a testicles thing, guys? You gotta tell me— "

Travis: "It's gotta be testicles."

Justin: "You hitting me with a testicle thing?"

**Travis**: `Cause it can't be the chocolate candy part. Everybody loves that, that can't be it.

Justin: No, everybody loves that.

Griffin: Everybody loves that, they love raisins. They're not telling me-

Justin: I bet it's the seeds. It the seeds.

Travis: You think it's the sunflower seeds?

**Justin**: It's weird to have seeds in the thing. 'Cause you plant those, you're not supposed to eat 'em. "How stupid, why have I been eating seeds for so long? Idiot."

Travis: "Fuck, fuck, fuck, they're right, they're right, they're right."

Justin: "They're right."

Travis: "I should expel them before anyone else finds out." [laughs]

Griffin: [laughs] "Expel them before me secret gets out. Seed eater."

Travis: [laughs] "Never come back to this school again."

Griffin: "You just couldn't wait, could you? Seed eater."

**Justin**: Got a plant in his belly like a sloppy little monster who loves his seeds. You look like you eat trail mix.

**Travis**: Fuck. It does hurt because it's so— There's no implication whatsoever, so the mind just reaches for the worst things. [laughs]

**Justin**: Yes, it's an insult that is like... it impregnates itself like... I don't know, what's the worst thing you think about yourself?

Travis: Yeah, right?

Justin: That's what trail mix indicates.

**Griffin**: [laughs] Have you considered that you eat trail mix, being the worst thing about yourself? 'Cause I'd like you to.

**Travis**: "You look like you eat trail mix." "I do have commitment issues!" [laughs] It's like, "What? How did you get there?"

**Griffin**: Okay. The best I can figure is that you have a crunchy aesthetic. By which I mean not because of all of the toothsome legumes that you're shoveling into your mouth during your lunch hour. But I'm more talking about sort of your hiking— You eat trail mix because you find yourself on trails a lot.

Justin: Oh! You're just like kind of a...

Griffin: A trail junkie.

**Travis**: But it can't be that you actually have that lifestyle. Like, you're not bringing your hiking backpack to class `cause you're hitting the trails

afterwards. It's like you wore a flannel and a knitted beanie once and they're like, "Oh, okay."

**Griffin**: Travis, I like this idea in your head where when a teacher comes to school, they leave no hints whatsoever of the type of person that they are outside of the school bubble.

Travis: Are you kidding me? That's all I would do.

**Griffin**: Yeah. That's what I'm saying, Travis. You're saying you would cloak your shit so that your kids would never know anything about you?

Travis: Yes.

Griffin: How are you supposed to connect and make a soul connection?

**Travis**: Griffin, we've already established the idea of c— Maybe that's it. It's like you've cloaked your shit so good, the best they can infer is like—

**Griffin**: The best they can get.

**Travis**: ... "I don't know, trail mix? Something about trail mix? I think I saw him eating M&M'S once and it reminded me of trail mix. I don't know, man." Because here's the thing, Griffin. As soon as they know any aspect of your life, you've given them so much ammunition. Where they see you and they're like, "Hey, cat mom." And you're like, "God damn it!" [laughs]

Griffin: [laughs] "Got me ... "

**Justin**: To me, I feel like if they said that to me, I would think about the only times I eat trail mix is when I'm like traveling and I'm really worn out. And it's like, you deserve a little treat. It's been hard for you. And it's like, they see me as this like little baby that needs to have his bottom powdered. And it's just like a little wimp who needs... [in silly voice] "Oh, you need energy. Oh."

Griffin: Actually, hey.

Justin: Yeah?

**Griffin**: The only time I eat trail mix is when I am flying to one of our many sold out entertainment engagements. Tickets on sale right now for the shows this week.

Travis: If there's any left.

Justin: If there's any left.

Griffin: There're so many left.

**Justin**: [whispers] There are. Please buy tickets to our shows.

**Griffin**: The only time I eat trail mix is when I am jet setting.

Travis: That's true.

**Griffin**: From one city to the next. Leaving crowds of people stupefied with my great jokes. And so, trail mix is not the food of some crunchy wasteoid.

**Justin**: That's someone who has so many other great comedy shows to do, they only have time for a handfull of food. So, it better have a little bit of everything in there.

**Griffin**: If I was a crunchy wasteoid, I'd call it gorp. Because I am a business man, essentially, who easts trail mix because it has the protein I crave. It has the carbohydrates and sugars that my body needs to like get me to my next sold-out business entertainment engagement. This is a power food for powerful people.

**Travis**: The only trails that Griffin's worried about is chem trails. The ones being left behind the plane that he's flying in to get to his next thing. Maybe that's what they're saying is you look like a government shill.

Griffin: Maybe, maybe.

**Travis**: Now see, I think I was going a different way where the only time I eat trail mix is like I rip it open and I slam it back like it's some kind of power pills from a video game that's filling up my energy bar. And so, maybe what they're saying is you look like you move too quickly from thing to thing. You're not taking time for you.
Griffin: That's what it is.

**Travis**: Maybe this is a — They're worried about you.

**Griffin**: They're worried about you.

Travis: "Hey, you look like you're eating trail mix. You need to sit down."

**Griffin**: "Why don't you settle down. Make a meal. Make yourself a knife and fork meal."

Travis: "You deserve it."

Griffin: "Eat some knife and fork food sometimes."

**Travis**: "Don't just rip open a plastic baggie and slam it like some kind of on-the-go machine. You're not a machine. You're a person, you have needs."

**Justin**: You're not a machine. You know what? Just take the time, get a plate. Separate the trail mix bag.

Travis: Yes, thank you.

Justin: Into different piles. [laughs]

**Griffin**: Use a fork.

**Justin**: So, that's a meal. That's a meal.

**Travis**: Well, you're gonna use a spoon on the peanuts. Definitely a fork on the raisins. That's where you're gonna feel it.

Griffin: That's great.

**Travis**: What's that? Oh, you've melted the chocolate candies into some sort of fondue that you can dip some— That's great, you're doing it.

Griffin: This is a sort of deconstruction of trail mix. I call it trail.

# Travis: [laughs]

**Griffin**: It's not mixed at all. It's just... It's sort of composite... you're gonna love it. Eat one thing and go in a clockwise order around the plate. This is my artist's intent. This is what I wanted.

**Travis**: It's \$150. It took me a lot of time to separate the whole thing. It's very labor intensive. You're paying by the hour.

**Justin**: I have another question. "We just moved to the country and I pass by a little farm every day that has a trailer at the edge of their property, next to the highway. That trailer is full of beautiful, plump pumpkins of all different sizes and colors."

## Griffin: Plumpkins!

**Justin**: "There's no sign indicating if the pumpkins are free or not. Can I go take some? Or are they a decoration?" That's from Pumpkin Perplexed in Minnesota.

**Griffin**: This will be quick. Hey, Peter Cottontail, calm the fuck down. You need to chill the fuck out, dude.

**Travis**: I know you're new to the country. It doesn't work like that.

Griffin: It doesn't work like that.

**Justin**: There's no sign saying if they're free or not. You know what that's applicable to? All things, pretty much. Like, all things. My car doesn't have a sign that says, "This big, beautiful Buick is taken." Like, what would be the alternate sign, "Do not steal"? I think if you don't see an, "Is free" sign, the assumption is, the base case has to be do not steal.

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Now, but unless...

Travis: Unless...

Justin: Unless...

**Griffin**: We've all had that thought where we've driven past a corn field and seen these beauties. These golden beauties just shimmering in the sun and thought like, "If I just grabbed one of those..."

Justin: One beauty...

**Griffin**: "One beauty... Then there's no way that I would get caught. There's no way they would notice. It's one corn."

Travis: You wanna steal from farmers?

 ${\bf Griffin}\colon {\rm I}$  think that the subsidies that my tax dollars provide allow me to—

Justin: Woah.

**Griffin**: No, no, on, listen... Steal from farmers as much as I fucking want to.

Travis: Oh, okay.

Justin: Oh [laughs]. Okay.

**Griffin**: You didn't let me finish the thought.

Justin: Yeah, you're right. I'm sorry, Griffin. That's true, yeah.

**Griffin**: And it's not stealing because I'm the only one that's doing it. So, nobody— They're not gonna know— It's not like I'm telling everyone to steal from farmers. I'm saying I should be able to steal one thing from every farmer.

**Justin**: [laughs]. It's statistically a victimless crime.

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin**: It's basically a rounding error.

Travis: In the grand scheme of things...

**Justin**: In the grand scheme of things, it's basically a rounding error at that point.

Griffin: Now, I will say. Aside from the humble watermelon f-
