Travis:

Folks. E3 is off and popping. I'm sure you saw a lot of the big announcements later today.

Justin:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.


Travis:

Justin:

[laughing]

Travis:



What do you g—

Griffin:

Think about them all day gaming.

Justin:

All day I dream about gaming.

Griffin:

Soccer video games.

Justin:

Soccer video games. What, guys-

Travis:

Yes.

Griffin:

Guys, what do you—

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

Think has been the biggest bombshell of—

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

This year's E3. That is definitely happening now and not several days of the future and not us recording on the Wednesday before.

Travis:

Yeah, it's a good question. And one that made a lot of, uh, sense coming out of the—

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

Of the mouth. Um, for me, I mean, during the Sony press conference, Crash Bandicoot's weird shorts fell down and we saw his big fuzzy balls.

Griffin:

[laughing]

Justin:

[laughs] Wait, and that was your biggest E3, like reveal do you think that the—

Travis:

That's my most, that was my most anticipated reveal and I gotta say—

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Sony as they always do. They fucking follow it through with those—

Justin:

Yeah and... [laughing]

Travis:

Shorts falling down. Show me the big furry nuts.

Justin:

Those nuts really delivered too.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

That's fu—those are not the nuts of a young Bandicoot. [laughing] These are age appropriate.

No, no, no. He's-

Justin:

Well aged nuts.

Travis:

He'd been around the block. Big, big, beautiful nuts. The—

Griffin:

I didn't, I didn't like when the nuts were revealed and Banjo, `cause he from the side of the stage just yelled. They both in use and just yelled like nice nuts.

Justin:

Nice nuts.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

You know the funny thing about it is it really put the games in a new perspective for me because—

Travis:

Sure.

Justin:

The way he is spinning and [laughs] stipulating and jumping and, and running that can have provided ball comfort.

Travis:

Yeah. [laughs]

Justin:

And that had to be really a pleasant for the balls.

Griffin:

They tried to do a fun thing where his mask friend floated down to like try to cover up the nuts, but it wasn't fast enough. I definitely saw the nuts.

Justin: [laughs] Travis:

I thought what was weird. What was weird about the whole experience is that Harris Randy could, didn't even like seem fazed.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Like if not to reveal then, he just stood there, like kind of shrugging, like yep.

Griffin:

The, the hardest part about it for me was not the reveal of the nuts because—

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

I thought that was tasteful and on brand. But wh—for the, when he went for 20 minutes afterwards, just going, eh, eh, eh, eh.

Travis:

What do you think?

Justin:

What do you think?

Travis:

I mean the audience, the audience said it up though. And I did think it was a little bit sad maybe, uh, when later Ratchet and Clank came out there and then Clank revealed like big metal nuts.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Um, and not like, sorry, it's not like a fun sort of hardware nuts, but actual like metal balls, like testicles.

Griffin:

They were, but they were, are made in a lab.

Travis:

They're made in a lab—

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

In there, but then Clank was just like, is this what you got? Is this whatev, does everyone like this?

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

And then, um, Sony in uh Shenmue four.

Griffin:

[laughs] Yeah. Which is wild.

Justin:

It was so sick. I was so excited. This one's—

Griffin:

Also S-

Justin:

All forklifts

Griffin:

Also Sonic the Hedgehog origins, um. In which she is, is very slow for the first 90% of the game—

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

When he gets hit by lightning or something.

Justin:

Something we don't know. We don't know. We don't know.

Travis:

What I thought was great was at the end.

Justin:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Remember the screen went black and you're like, well, that's it. And then they were like, just one more thing and then craders a show craders and he was like, "I've gotten nuts too."

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

And he started to peel it away. And then it was like black screen coming in 2018. And it's like—

Griffin:

Yeah. Yeah.

Travis:

I yeah, I'm on board to see Craders's nuts. [laughs]

Griffin:

In 11 years. Yeah.

Justin:

11 years.

Travis:

You know what, it's coming in a long—

Justin:

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If in a while.

Justin:

Travis, when do you think 2018 is Travis?

Travis:

Oh, I thought you said, for some reason I heard 2028. I don't know why.

Griffin:

No, it's different.

Travis:

That would be quite the dev cycle. [laughs] Well, Justin, it takes a while to get the right texture mapping. Do you want half-ass balls?

Justin:

Is that what—

Travis:

I'm sorry, Justin, do you want half-ass balls?

Justin:

Is that what is going on with, with Gordon? With my man Gordon is Gabe—

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Just trying to get the balls, my new Gordon this one is balls. He just got perfect physics Leyden balls

Griffin:

Worth the weight.

Travis:

And what's weird is they also revealed, uh, Saints Row 5—

Justin:

Oh.

Very tasteful, no nudity, no balls. They were like, now everyone's doing balls. So like—

Griffin:

It's in a, it's a children's edgy game. It fucking weird.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

It's so weird. They were like, you know what? We've pushed the boundary. We've come back around the other side. Now, very very tasteful, uh, like a Downton Abbey ask kind of game from the people at Saints Row. Um—

Griffin:

And what's, and it's great. The next dragon HJ announced that too. They're doing like Pokemon Red Blue version one where there's a, a version with lots of huge balls on all the dragons and on everybody.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

And then there's one where it's more, um, pure, I guess.

Justin:

And the-

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

Balls are much smaller.

Travis:

Much more tasteful balls.

Griffin:

Any funny, other funny things we can say about video games balls?

Travis:

Something about Mario's balls.

Griffin:

Uh-

Justin:

I think that's pretty... That's well tried at this point, he has those things out for anybody that'll ask that wouldn't have—

Griffin:

S-

Justin:

Been a reveal at all.

Griffin:

Um, so I have yeah. Video games are—

Travis:

What I didn't like with seeing Madden's balls again—

Griffin:

Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Travis:

It's like every year, we have, it's like yeah it feels like they have to show us Madden's balls and it's like, we get it. They're the same balls as last year, but they look a little bit better.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

[laughing] Now I don't know how that arc is working by the way, whatever Madden is doing for those bad boys is working for him. Uh—

Justin:

I, I will say I did appreciate that they finally just like, you know, just admitted the truth and just called it what it is and announced the new ball of duty game.

Griffin:

Okay. And that's it.

Justin:

I love it. That's it. That's it.

Griffin:

That's the logical determiners.

Justin:

There's our stop, boop, boop. Everybody off, [laughs] uh, on this show, we talk about video game characters balls, but also sometimes give advice in between. So I'd like to get right to it. About a year ago, I went to a party at my friend's new place during the event, I walked straight through the screen door. Uh—

Travis:

Oh man.

Justin:

Oof, about 20 minutes later. Another party goer did the exact same thing and the door was ruined.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

That's str—okay, hold on. Uh, I, I'll get to the sign a second. The door's ruined now. One year later, my friend's roommate is asking me to pay for the replacement of the door as they move out. What should I do? I caused the damage, but so did the other guy, isn't this past the statute of limitations and that's from egregious door smasher in Everett, Washington. Okay. So what I don't understand is how you walk through the screen door yet left enough—

Griffin:

More enough for somebody else to penetrate. Like—

Justin: My—
Griffin: You took down, you took down a couple cubes of the Don't Break the Ice, but then somebody else came in and finished the fight. It sounds like maybe a little bit—
Travis: Per perhaps person A the question answer is on the shorter side. So when they walked through, they tore out like one side and the bottom—
Griffin: I see, I see.
Travis: And person two is much taller and they took out the top section.
Griffin: Um, I will say if two folks in one night walk through the same screen door that is a design failure on part of the door. Maybe the mesh was too fine.
Travis: Mm-hmm.
Justin: Mm-hmm.
Travis: You're lucky. It didn't just like grate you, you could have walked into it and just come out—
Griffin:

Oh.

Travis:

Griffin: Fuck.

The other side—

Like Play-Doh spaghetti.

Griffin:

Cube two hyper cubed right there—

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

All over the floor. And then that's another thing they have to pay. That's coming outta the damage deposit is that there's just cubes of Brian all over. Um, I, I, as, as far as the statute of limitations, that gets so tricky because this is the type of thing that like it happens and it's at a party and you had a few Bev— Beverlys and you look over and your friend a fucking Kool-Aid Man smashes through your screen door. And it's very, very funny. And then when it's time to move out, you look at that same screen door and you're like, "Oh yeah, we have to pay for that." And so I think it comes up again. Um—

Travis:

Well, but Griffin, I would say the, that the statute of limitations for this is the 20 minutes it took for the next person to walk through it because—

Griffin:

Oh, I see.

Travis:

If you separated that out longer, if you're like, "Yeah, I ran into my friend's screen door." And then three months later, someone else did it. And like, it was completely demolished at that point. You wouldn't be like, okay, well you're both responsible now. I would say like, wait, hold on. That per, that person's responsible. I may have started it, but they definitely finished it.

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

And I think-

Justin:

But you could make the argument that it was you who necessitated the fixing in the first place.

Griffin:

You normal, you normalized the process of cool, of Hulk smashing through the screen door.

Travis:

All right. That's—

Griffin:

Your friends saw you do it and was like, I, well, I guess it's okay. I guess everybody smashing through the screen door.

Travis:

'Cause this is policy here.

Griffin:

Um fuck. At the same time though, I can't imagine how funny this was. And I think that that pays for itself, like, yeah. It's I gotta, you know, I gotta dish out like 70 bucks or whatever to fix the door, but, um, I, I had 70 bucks worth of laughter and funny story. Do you do y'all remember when I did this?

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

At uncle Dave's, uncle Dave's house, we were, we were over at our uncle Dave's house down in Florida. And, um, this was a, this was a fucking decade ago and I saw a golf cart out in his driveway and I saw it. And I guess I thought in my mind I was gonna go and hop in the golf cart and like do a few laps around the community. Uh, and I said out loud, Grant Theft Auto and look at referencing the game, not the crime. And I just went right through the fucking thing.

Travis:

[laughing]

Griffin:

And to me, it was really, really funny and that, but uncle Dave got pretty upset. And then later on, I called, I called uncle Dave to apologize, but I

could not stop laughing over the phone and said, I do not think the apology it was accepted or believed.

Justin:

Yeah. I did that.

Griffin:

It's very funny to watch somebody do this. 'cause it's a door. Doors are supposed to keep this from happening. And when it doesn't is very, very hysterical.

Justin:

Yes. We'll pay for it. Fine.

Griffin:

We'll do it. Fine. Send a bill.

Justin:

Send invoice and we'll and we'll take care of it. Uh—

Griffin:

Fine.

Travis:

Clarify Justin, cla—itemized. We need an itemized invoice.

Justin:

Itemized invoice, labor, not too expensive. Get somebody who knows what they're doing.

Griffin:

Can I do a real quick Yahoo and then a better Yahoo?

Justin:

Yeah. I'd love that.

Griffin:

This quick one is like, it took me on a journey. It was sent by Seth Carlson. Thank you, Seth. Yahoo Answers, user XI nine, who asks? Um, I thought Obama was supposed to make the commercials on TV be the same volume as the shows. What happened to this? Commercials—

[laughs]

Griffin:

Commercials are still like twice as loud as shows. To me this makes him a lame duck president.

Travis:

[laughs] Wow.

Griffin:

Pretty busted, um, metric. This is very funny. Huh? So the FCC actually did a thing. They passed a bill in 2010 called the CALM Act. The Commercial Advertisement Loudness Mitigation Act where you get a penalty. If you, if you fucking go from like, "Oh Deborah, oh my mom's come over again." We got new spaghetti, come on down and get the spaghetti. If you do that, you get fined like a bunch of money.

Justin:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

But it doesn't seem to, I, I guess this is one where they're just like,

Justin:

How do you enforce that?

Griffin:

I think one, if somebody records it on their TiVo and then they send you the TiVo recording of the—

Justin:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

Spaghetti crime and then the channel gets, the channel gets blasted.

Justin:

They must be just the profit margins on the spaghetti. Must just be so good. It's like—

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Whatever it takes, just blaze it.

Travis:

I would also—

Griffin:

That's—

Travis:

I would also just like to jump in here, um, before anybody tweets or anything, that's also just not what lame duck means in any kind of—

Griffin:

No God.

Travis:

Political content. It's not just because you didn't accomplish something. [laughing] Doesn't make you a lame duck. That's a very specific thing. Um, anyways, just wanted to clarify that. I like this idea of like I thought he said he was gonna clean up the streets. Well, lame duck mayor.

Griffin:

This is, this is since having a, a, a baby who goes to sleep at like six o'clock. This is my, this is probably the most pressing concern for me now. Which is me and, me, me and Rachel are watching The Big Bang Theory, just like quietly chuckling, like fighting the urge to just scream a good cackle out.

Travis:

What did he say about the flash?

Griffin:

Yeah. So he is like, he's like, he's like, uh, Captain Picard and Cling On and then Doctor Who and board games. And then it's just like Pepsi got it. Just like scream, like, like fucking Tyrese, just like shows up a, on the, on my screen for Pepsi. And he's just like, Pepsi's got it. Screaming and it knocks all of the pictures off my walls of my house and all, I just replaced all the windows in the house and those have exploded. And the baby—

Justin:

Griffin—

Griffin:

The baby's crib, like collapses like a—

Justin:

We-

Griffin:

Cartoon, like all the wood falls up part.

Justin:

We, I believe have touched on this in a previous episode, but I'd love to circle around about it now that you all are in this situation, how miserable are TV shows and I'm looking at you Twin Peaks. I hate to, to drag you on this, how miserable are TV shows, where dialogue is mixed to the quietest possible volume and every single footfall is like—

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

A thousand megaton ball.

Travis:

Justin, I just, I do wanna say it's interesting that you would single out Twin Peaks where the dialogue to no dialogue ratio is like—

Griffin:

It's pretty too astounding

Travis:

One percent dialogue. But yes, I do agree that especially if there's any kind of supernatural or fantasy element fucking dragons are the worst. Like, can we please elevate those dragons please?

Griffin:

When we, when we were we're rewatching Buffy, we're almost done thank Christ. Um, every time she smokes, one of those vampos that sound effect was Jo— Josh was in the studio. Just like crank that shit. Did the just sound effect—

Travis:

Fuck.

Griffin:

Fucking pump that shit.

Travis:

I hate vampires, fucking crank it.

Griffin:

It's like, I'm gonna, I'm gonna kick you really hard vampire. Ah, let's see about that. I'm gonna bite your neck first stab, like, come on guys, please.

Travis:

I think about at Theresa Night we watched Parks and Rec just like on loop. And it's always the same thing with the intro music. And it's like, hey local local government joke, local government blah, blah, blah. [laughs]

Griffin:

Let's, let's so what do, we do we need the sequel to the CALM Act, the calmer act as proposed by the McElroy brothers so that their babies. So their baby's cribs don't explode when the Pepsi commercial comes on.

Travis:

Let me, let me propose this. What if it said there's just a service where like somebody comes to your house and they just ride the volume button. Like they're just there. They're not enjoying the thing and all they're just like mute. Ah, Yes.

Griffin:

Ah, damn it. Um, anyway, this is the thing I thought I saw this question. I was like "Another goofball on Yahoo being a silly Billy." But no, I mean, this wasn't Obama's jurisdiction. I don't think, but there was, there's a law about this—

Travis:

T—

Griffin:

That apparently this is just one of those laws, like many laws. So you can just be like, no, we're just gonna keep doing, doing it the regular way.

Travis:

I have an idea. I have an idea. You're gonna love that. Everybody's gonna love this. It's a way more enforceable law. Pass a law, all commercials, the voiceover work has to be done by Roman Mars.

Justin:

Okay, I love this.

Travis:

You're welcome. I was just telling Roman Mars yesterday that I'm gonna load up like an MP3 player and just play it like on a loop, uh, of 99% invisible in my baby's room so that she will both learn, um, to speak eloquently, but also like not get woken up by big spikes of like yelling. Um—

Griffin:

I gotcha. I gotcha. Can I pitch you a different idea?

Travis:

Yes.

Griffin:

A new law that says that every line of dialogue on every TV show from now on [laughs] has to be screamed at the top of your lungs.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

And because then even that would normalize it—

Justin:

Yeah. Anything.

Griffin:

Even then I could see, I could turn my volume down to a regular volume so that when Tyrese is like, "Pepsi's got it." And then it and then gets back and it's like, "Mike, did you drop the car off with the mechanic? No, Molly. I forgot. Damn it Mike." That's from Mike and Molly. Uh, classic scene from Mike and Molly classic.

Justin: Classic. Griffin: I think that would solve the problem too. Travis:

Okay. Wait, wait. Alternate, alternate, go ahead. Next up. It's a nice show. We got the Weekend. How about all commercials are voiced by Roman Mars, but also all parts at all TV shows are played by Roman Mars.

Griffin:

[laughs] I would do that 88, some Mars ADR.

Travis:

No, no, no. He plays every part.

Griffin:

Oh.

Travis:

Um, uh, the one who knocks.

Griffin:

[laughs] Um, all right.

Travis:

He's gonna be busy.

Justin:

He's gonna be very busy.

Griffin:

Uh, here's another question. I park about 15 minutes away from work, but I don't mind cause it's a nice walk through a field. Last week I saw a teen planting, a five foot conifer. When we made eye contact he got rather weird and hid.

Justin:

Oh God.

Griffin:

Around to the other side of it. You gotta help me through this. I walk past it every day now and I don't know why he hid. Ideas? That's from confused about the conifer. Holy shit.

Justin:

Three possibilities.

Griffin:

Okay.

Justin:

And y'all tell me what you think. Nymph, dryad—

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Or some sort of saddle. It's one of the, it's definitely one of the three.

Travis:

It's definitely supernatural.

Griffin:

Definitely supernatural. It's a nyp and it's a nymph it's a dryad or it's a saddle.

Travis:

It was the spirit of this tree one way or the other. I mean, whatever the, the form it took is I think we can all agree that there's definitely you. Um, this is a Narnia ask Mr. Tumnus like invitation to go on our fantasy world, but you had to get to work.

Justin:

Definitely Tumnus.

Travis:

Definitely Tumnus. We're looking at a tree. Find Tumnus.

Justin:

Find that tree, got a hole, put your head in the hole. There you go down you go to the other world to the other one, follow him, follow the Tumnus, always follow the Tumnus. You always have to stop, just what you're doing, drop what you're doing and follow the—

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Tumnus. A 100% of the time.

Travis:

Got to follow the Tumnus till you read the Tumnus. That's what I've always said.

Justin:

Do you know how many Tumnus opportunities like how many people get Tumnus opportunities in this life? Not many. Not many. I've never—

Travis:

I—

Justin:

I've never fucking had one, but if I did, you can bet I would drop what I was doing. Stop what I was doing and go get that Tumnus. That's it.

Travis:

I did. I did once.

Justin:

Oh shit.

Griffin:

Oh, yeah.

Travis:

Yeah. I mean time didn't pass the same for you guys. So I, yeah, I was only gone for like five minutes, but from my view, I was gone—

Justin:

Yeah.

For 25 years and that's um, when I learned French, um, and, and cross stitching, um—

Justin:

And you forgot the, you forgot the French.

Travis:

I forgot the French part. Um—

Justin:

It's tricky, It's a tricky language.

Travis:

I didn't learn it great. I learned it like high school learned it, you know—

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Enough to pass. Um, but that was it. I actually, um, now looking back in retrospect, I probably could have spent more time away from Tumnus exploring Narnia. Mostly I just hung out with Tumnus cross stitching and speaking French.

Griffin:

So on the, on the off chance, this is an Tumnus scenario. The on only other explanation is that look when you're a teen, you're almost always looking for places to make out or smoke weed.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

And so this person was probably planting a lovely tree just to have one more spot in the world where they could go and have some, some sneak, some sneak time, a little bit of sneak time.

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

Like there's, there's not enough places. There's not enough little shadowy spots and, um, you know, elements to break line of sight in this field—

Justin:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

That he likes to get blazed or make kisses in. And so they planted this tree to have like a little zone, a little VIM zone.

Travis:

I really like this forward thinking that you're pitching here, Griffin, where they planted, uh, a five foot tall tree.

Griffin:

Yep.

Travis:

And, and thought, man, in a hundred years, I'm really gonna enjoy smoking weed behind this.

Griffin:

Well Tra—well, Travis, what are, what are they gonna do? Carry a, a massive Redwood into this Vietnam. No, they're a teen.

Travis:

You're right. You're right. You know what? I was wrong. And you were right. Um, I do also wanna say question, ask her. It's also quite possible that what you were witnessing appeared to be a teen planting a tree, but was in fact, a teen contemplating stealing a tree.

Griffin:

Maybe.

Justin:

That's Tom.

Travis:

And you foiled it.

Griffin:

I wanna, I like to, I'd like to go back and pitch the visual, mental picture of an 80 year old person taking another person into a big field where a big, tall, proud conifer is there. And he goes up and puts his hand on the tree and tells the story of how he planted it and how he always he's been waiting for this moment more or less his entire life. And then he just pulls out the biggest duper and is like, "All right. Let's party."

Travis:

Let's party grandson.

Griffin:

It's time, it's time to do this damn thing.

Travis:

I planted this smoke tree for you

Griffin:

For us. For now.

Travis:

This is our family legacy.

Justin:

Um, I was so hoping.

Travis:

Whoa, we got a Haunted Doll Watch.

Justin:

Oh, it's been forever. I feel like Haunted Doll Watch has been thoroughly munched by the Munch Squad.

Travis:

Munch squad.

Griffin:

Let me blow the dust off the tomb.

Justin:

Yeah. Haunted Doll Janet. Very high EMF. Uh, I'm gonna go ahead and Skype you all a link.

Travis:

Oh.

Justin:

If you're playing all at home, you can feel free to Google. Don't read ahead, please. I would ask you can just enjoy the pictures of Haunted Doll Janet—

Griffin:

All right.

Justin:

Very active high—

Griffin:

Uh, I gotta say she's got, um, a lot of, just a lot of hair and what looks like some Mardi GRA beads sort of binding her.

Justin:

That's, the first fun thing is that she's been bound by Mardi GRA beads in this one. Janet is an active essence.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

She's enjoyed mostly in the early morning hours at a—

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Just at sunset. Then ill the tilapia. May I recommend a Janet? This one has been aged for many years. She prefers to be away from—

Griffin:

Babe why do you, babe, why do you like run out of bed every morning? You don't understand. My Janet is best in the early morning hours and also turns—

Oh, you wanna catch Janet? You gotta get up before sunrise.

Griffin:

The early bird gets the spooky doll.

Justin:

She prefers to be away from a window, but what's a view to the outside.

Griffin:

Fucking hell Janet.

Travis:

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

So natural.

Travis:

What does that mean?

Justin:

It's natural.

Travis:

It was sweaty.

Griffin:

Janet, are you feeling this?

Justin:

I gained my in—

Travis:

This early morning vibe?

Griffin:

I gained my insights by sitting with her over a L—O—N—G hyphenated period of time. It's hy— it's, it's heightening the longness of this period of

time and allowing the conceptualization to in enter my consciousness with my other dolls. The feeling I got from them was singular. I would get a strong feeling over time, much like you sit quietly in the wilderness and begin—

Justin:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

To hear sounds that you did not pick up immediately.

Justin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

Justin:

What?

Griffin:

In which this doll—

Justin:

Wrong.

Griffin:

It's five feet tall.

Justin:

What the fuck.

Travis:

There's a picture of, there's a picture of it standing next to an a thing of incense that it is as big. Is this a five foot Novelty Incense Stick?

Griffin:

Well, I do want, okay. Two things, one go to this and look at the pictures because what I love is you get a one picture doll by yourself and then two separate pictures of the, uh, incense candle picture as if they're like, Which one of these do you think is best? You know what?

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Travis:

Justin:

Uh, can I share with Griffins? Absolutely not. What a—

Griffin:

No, no.

Travis:

Dump question.

Justin:

Uh, so I slid down a water slide and at the bottom of the water slide, I forced myself and I landed in the splash pool. [laughs] I forced myself to take a big gulp of water. Just a lot.

Griffin:

Oh my God, this is the most viscerally upsetting. Like I'm not joking. The most upsetting thing that has been discussed on this episode so far and more so than Travis's like butt hole modifications.

Justin:

Now let me ask—

Griffin:

This is a lot.

Justin:

Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Thing. Justin, have you thought about that your entire life after drinking from the wave pool has been a lie, a few fever state brought on by the consuming of that horrible poison and everything now is your, is like your brain just giving you images to cover up for your like pool water coma.

Justin:

Like I'm still there in the pool.

Yeah. And all of this has just been like kind of an Oracle at Delphi kind of warp forward. Like you're, you breathed in the vapors and now you're able to see time in all of its many forms and facets.

Justin:

Well, I mean possible, but you have to assume then at that point that I've been kept alive in stasis in the wave pool this entire time.

Justin:

Justin:

Griffin:

What did he say? What is he saying? [laughs]

Travis:

I couldn't hear him over the water slide. It's only it's a precog, but he only can sense, um, uh, water slide park crime.

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

So it's like that there should be more cheese in there. It's supposed to be three fourths the way filled up on those nachos. [laughs]

He's starting to wake up out of it, but we haven't solved this crime. Here quick give him that gross bottle of water and get them back into it.

Travis:

It's a re—, that's a, that's a refill collectible refill mug that he brought from home. He didn't buy that today. I'm a senior in high school. My class has been pretty lame with the pranks. Griffin:

Griffin:

Yeah, you'll be turned to stone. Um, should we do one more Yahoo or no, just a real quick one. Well, I got two. This one was, I'll do, I'll ask both this one was sent in by Amelia burger. Thank you. Amelia. It's Yahoo answers user Kevin Zack, who asks, how do we make apple juice more relevant to adult consumers?
