## MBMBaM 647: Share the Holes

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**Intro (Bob Ball)**: The McElroy brothers are not experts, and their advice should never be followed. Travis insists he's a sexpert, but if there's a degree on his wall, I haven't seen it. Also, this show isn't for kids. Which I mention only so the babies out there will know how cool they are for listening. What's up, you cool baby?

**Justin**: Hello everybody, and welcome to My Brother, My Brother and Me, an advice show for the modren era. I'm your oldest brother, Justin McElroy.

**Travis**: I'm your middlest brother, Travis of McElroy.

**Griffin**: I'm your sweet, baby brother, Griffin Andrew McElroy, 30 under 30—

Travis: Guys, what a time to be a basketball fan.

Justin: Thank you.

**Travis**: LeBron James just beat Kareem Abdul-Jabbar's all-time scoring record. And my favorite thing about it—I didn't watch it, but I saw clips later while I was at the gym, I don't wanna brag. But they kept a camera—[chuckles] Kareem was in the—was in the stands.

Griffin: Oh, they made him watch?

**Travis**: They made him watch.

Justin: Made him watch.

Griffin: Oh, man.

**Travis**: And the two—I don't wanna talk about LeBron James' mindset. 'Cause of course, he's probably elated and like chasing that bliss. I wanna talk about two mindsets. And that's the mindset of Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and the mindset of the other team, who's still trying to win a basketball game. [chuckles] As there's a big counter like, "Will he do it?!" And they're like, "I would like him to not score points, because we're trying to win a basketball game."

**Justin**: I gotta say, from what I know of Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, which is close and intimate and personal, by which I mean—

**Travis**: Do you mean author of Sherlock Holmes books and Mycroft Holmes books, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar?

Justin: Yes.

Travis: Okay.

Griffin: The best.

**Justin**: Kareem Abdul-Jabbar. This is the same Kareem Abdul-Jabbar that sold his championship rings so he could give all the money to charity. 'Cause he's like, [laughs] "I don't want these. What am I gonna do with these?"

Travis: "I'm done. Yeah, I'm cool, man."

**Griffin**: "What am I gonna do—These are so—These are so big. These rings are huge."

Travis: "I starred in Airplane, I don't need this."

Griffin: "Thank you."

Travis: "I'm fine, guys."

**Griffin**: Do you think... I would've... I don't watch basketball. I probably would've if I found out that Kareem Abdul-Jabbar threw on the jersey of the opposing team and was like, "Okay, let's make it... let's make it interesting. Now, we gotta go one for one."

**Travis**: "You know what? I'm coming out of retirement. We're gonna make this a race! I'm gonna keep scoring points, and then he'll have to come back and score some more points." As soon as LeBron retires, Kareem's coming back. Oh, what a fart in the face that would be.

**Griffin**: We are describing the plot of the Bernie Mac classic, Mr. 3000. This is our sportsiest fuckin' episode yet. This is...

Travis: Wow.

**Griffin**: This is pretty wild so far. Juice, keep the streak going.

Justin: Normally, I would—

Griffin: What hot in-

**Justin**: I mean, normally I wouldn't. But we're talking about—Anytime I can talk about Veronica Mars co-producer Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, I'm gonna do it.

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

**Travis**: A true Renaissance Man, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar.

Griffin: Mm-hm.

**Justin**: Yeah, he wrote and episode—did you know this? He wrote an episode of Veronica Mars.

Travis: I didn't know that?

Griffin: No?

**Justin**: Dolly Parton was a producer on Buffy the Vampire Slayer.

**Travis**: Yeah, the world—

**Justin**: It's all out there, everything's out there.

**Travis**: The world's topsy-turvy.

**Griffin**: It's all—

Justin: It's all out there.

**Griffin**: It can happen for any of us.

Justin: It's all out there.

**Travis**: And meanwhile, we're here doing our stupid podcast.

Justin: Stupid waste of time.

**Griffin**: What are we gonna get—yeah?

**Travis**: I'm worried that somewhere out there, there's like a 12-year-old dreaming of podcast dreams, who's gonna beat my record for most canceled or given up podcasts. And I worked hard to get that number. The cemetery of my podcasts is vast and deep. I had to bury some of 'em on top of other ones, 'cause I ran out of room.

Griffin: You will know, Travis, by the trail of pilots.

Travis: I'm so worried. I'm so worried.

Justin: You have—Some podcasts, you've canceled more than once, right?

Travis: Yeah!

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: Yeah, man. And you know what? If I have to-

Justin: They got back up and you were like, "No, get down!"

**Travis**: I'll cancel 'em again if I have to. You know what I mean? I'm not giving—I'll cancel this one. If this puts me over the top, I'll cancel this one! No baby beats the old man. [chuckles]

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

Travis: I'm the quitting-est guy in Hollywood and I won't stand for this!

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

**Justin**: Of brother podcasts, this is probably the longest, right? Of brother podcasts?

**Griffin**: No, I don't think so. I think Hank—I think Hank and John probably got there—

Travis: No, we started before them.

Justin: No, no, no, no-

**Travis**: They did video shit, we can't step to that. But Dear Hank and John came later.

**Justin**: I think you could narrow the parameters enough so that we'd start to get into records and entertainment. [laughs]

Travis: Yeah!

**Griffin**: Guys, what if... what if this episode was just us sports and shit talking other people in the biz, and it would just be our most sort of aggressive Aggro Crag episode to date.

**Justin**: The sports segment is done though, right? [chuckles] So, that was all the sports—

**Travis**: Yeah, we had five minutes, and that's already the most we've ever talked about sports. And then 55 minutes of just like, "And fuck that guy! Oh, them? Bleh!" Or whatever.

Griffin: Yeah... But the Supper Boil is happening this Sunday, isn't it?

Travis: Oh, is it?

Justin: Oh. [chuckles]

**Griffin**: Yeah, that's a big one for me.

**Justin**: Do you guys think—I think one of the wildest things—Like, there's a lot of stuff that would be hard to explain to visitors from another land.

Travis: Mm-hmm?

**Justin**: Probably the weirdest thing that we do is that we—the biggest sports event of the year, but no one is allowed to say it by name. [laughs]

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin**: But no one is allowed to say the name of it. That's wild. That would be hard—Like, why can't—Everyone calls it the Super Bowl, right? Yeah. It's just a thing that happens, yes. But you—So, you can say the name—No, no, no, no, no.

Travis: No...

Justin: Don't say it.

Griffin: J-dog.

**Travis**: "No, legally, you cannot." "What?" "Yeah, legally. If you give free advertisement to them, they get really mad at you." [laughs]

**Griffin**: They hate it. Also, J-dog, do you think if aliens came to our planet, they would even take a beat to get to know us and our steez? Or would they just start blasting?

Justin: [laughs] Start blasting!

**Travis**: Well, Griffin, most sitcoms about aliens have taught me that we're fascinating. They're way into us.

**Griffin**: No, man. Third Rock From The Sun, if that was a documentary, French Stewart would've come down in his bio-pod and just started blasting. They are not gonna ask us about sports. No way.

**Travis**: You don't think they'd come down and help us build like new Wonders and like teach—

**Griffin**: They're not gonna teach us a magic language that gives us prophetic visions.

Travis: Ah, man...

Justin: [laughs]

**Griffin**: They're not. They're just gonna come down and John Lithgow's just gonna start fucking blasting.

Justin: [chuckles]

**Griffin**: Joseph Gordon-Levitt is gonna put a hole in my house with his giant ray beam.

**Travis**: He might do that anyways.

**Griffin**: He may. I've said some stuff about him.

**Travis**: Yeah. Even if he's not an alien, he might be coming for you.

Griffin: Yeah, sure.

**Travis**: I think Joseph Gordon-Levitt and Elijah Wood have plenty of reason to team up together to stop Griffin McElroy. I'm just saying, like between the two of them, one—Griffin I feel like is always being compared to Elijah Wood. And I imagine vice versa, he's probably getting that too.

Griffin: Day in and day out, from his closest and most renowned friends.

Justin: He's sick of hearing it!

Griffin: He hates hearing it, man!

**Travis**: Yeah, it's why Griffin had to move away from Austin. 'Cause people kept saying like, "Didn't I just run into you yesterday?" And it's like, "No, that was Elijah Wood." And vice versa. And then Joseph Gordon-Levitt, there's just—I mean, there's vitriol there, obviously.

Griffin: Yeah, sure.

Travis: Obviously.

**Griffin**: No, my—I have a pretty long list of enemies. The detectives would never solve my murder, 'cause it could be—

Travis: But you gave 'em all the clues?

Griffin: No, I gave 'em too many clues for too many people!

Travis: Oh?

**Griffin**: They were like, "This is too... this is actually too... you can have too many clues."

**Travis**: Oh, and maybe it's a thing where like 15 different people teamed up to all kill Griffin? And it's like, "Oh, the clues are pointing us in so many different ways! Let's just call this one." [chuckles]

**Griffin**: Was there ever a Sherlock book—was... Did Kareem Abdul-Jabbar's Sherlock book, did it have like a criminal who just scattered clues hither and yon about the crime scene, as they ran out of it? And then Sherlock was like, "Ah-ha, I see a cigarette butt." And it's like, "I don't think that's a real one, Sherlock."

**Travis**: "Wait, there's 16 cigarette butts here. Fuck! How long was the guy here?" [chuckles] "Yes."

Griffin: Hey, Juice.

Justin: Yeah?

Griffin: How you doing?

Justin: Would you like a question?

Travis: Are you looking at sports?

Griffin: I would.

**Justin**: Hm? No, I was curious what the name of Kareem Abdul-Jabbar's Sherlock Holmes novel is.

**Travis**: It's Mycroft Holmes, it's Mycroft, if I'm not mistaken.

**Justin**: It's great. It's great. It's his first adult novel. I love Kareem. Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, what a guy.

Travis: Has he written... has he written young adult novels?

Justin: No, he's written elderly adult novels. [laughs]

Travis: [chuckles] Okay?

Justin: They're just... they're for old people only. You won't get it.

Travis: You won't get it. Only 1890s kids will get this.

**Justin**: "My partner has been hinting to me increasingly that she would very much like for me to start making use of mood music to romance her."

Travis: Mm-hmm.

## Griffin: Whew.

**Justin**: "It has been pretty straight forward picking out some romantic music for a play list, but I have no smooth skills. The question's this; how do I smoothly integrate this new music into a dinner date some time? Raise my eyebrow seductively as I hit play? Figure out a way to already have it playing when she walks through the door? Slowly fade up the music as dinner progresses?"

Travis: Yes!

Justin: That's from Almost Smooth As Silk in Cincinnati.

**Travis**: But you already got the answer, slow, very prolonged fade up.

## Justin: Okay?

**Travis**: To the point where like it starts from zero, and over the course of 20 minutes, gets to like 50%.

**Justin**: There's gonna be multiple like, "Are you hearing that? Like, do you hear something?" Like they're wandering around the house looking for where the sound is coming from.

**Griffin**: Minutes four through eight are gonna be confusing. 'Cause only dogs will be able to hear it at that volume, correctly.

Travis: "Just enjoy your spaghetti carbonara. Don't worry about it."

**Griffin**: If had—If I attempted this or any similar maneuver, at this point, if feel like I would need to hire an intimacy coordinator to make sure.

Travis: Mm-hmm?

Griffin: Maybe if it's just a DJ—

**Justin**: So outrageous would it be—Yeah, it would just be so out of left field, you attempting to use romantic music.

**Travis**: "Alexa, classical Italian dinner music. No, no, Alexa—No, Alexa, stop. Alexa, stop. Alexa!"

Justin: It's so vulnerable. If feel so-

Griffin: It is.

**Justin**: It so revealing to just start and it's gonna be like, "Is this right? Is this the right mood? I don't know?"

**Griffin**: It's honest—

**Travis**: I just wanna say, good on you, question asker, for already having the songs picked out. 'Cause that for me would be the biggest stumbling block. If I figure that out, the music would never stop playing in my home. I

would... I would do it, and then I would cover up the microphone on any device, so no one could ever stop it playing. 'Cause I'd be like, "No, I'm bragging. I've figured it out. We're always romantic now."

**Griffin**: I just... Picking any song for any situation, I don't think I have the gumption to do it anymore. I don't think that—

**Griffin**: Except for when Carly got a new album out, and then usually we'll bop to that, for the—around the release window of it. And then it's about right back to Grillin' Time.

**Travis**: Or if it's—if it's a Dadlands show. And then it's just like all `70s and `80s dad rock.

Griffin: [sigh] Boy...

Travis: I don't know, man.

**Justin**: It's just, I've never done—guys, I—this is too—we don't normally get so personal on this. I've never done this in my entire life. I would have no way, no way of answering this question in an effective manner.

**Travis**: You could do a silent disco kind of mood setting, where you have headphones on and you're listening to it. And then your partner's like, "What are you listening to?" And you're like, "Put these on." [chuckles] "Put these on and come with me on this quiet journey." And then if anyone walks in the room like, "Why are they staring at each other so sexily? What's happening? It's just completely silence as they eat their garlic bread." Yeah, the sexiest food, garlic bread.

**Griffin**: It's important that you—

**Travis**: Happy Valentine's Day.

Griffin: Happy Valentine's Day, everybody.

**Justin**: Happy Valentine's Day, I couldn't do this.

**Griffin**: Take it from us, take it from the McElroy brothers, keep it chaste, keep it pure, keep it secret, keep it safe.

Justin: [chuckles] Keep it chaste.

**Travis**: Sometimes it surprises me that we have six kids amongst the three of us.

Griffin: Yeah, for sure.

**Travis**: Like, that, statistically—based on how we speak about intimacy, statistically unlikely. [chuckles]

**Griffin**: Would not think it possible, yeah. I have a wizard, and he's been banging down my—kicking down my fuckin' door with his—

Travis: You have a wizard?

Griffin: I have a Wizard.

Travis: Okay?

**Griffin**: He's been kicking down the door of the room that he lives in. And he likes it in there. Like, I've recreated his magic environment pretty good. Like, there's—

Travis: Then why is he kicking it down?

**Griffin**: He wants out. There's toad stools and stuff in there, though. And like his tower, part of his tower. And some of his brooms. So like, he's happy.

Travis: It doesn't sound like he is, Griffin?

**Griffin**: I slide some chicken nuggets in there sometimes. They're frozen still, but he has fire magic. Anyway, this is how to get revenge on your siblings.

Travis: Oh, boy. Oh... Huh? Weird that you would bring this to us, Griffin.

**Griffin**: And this—these are gonna prank you guys pretty bad. So, I want you to be ready. I mean, April Fool's Day is just around the corner. And when it gets here, I'm gonna fuck you guys up with some of these great methods of getting revenge.

Travis: Whoa? Okay, go ahead. Griffin, revenge us.

**Griffin**: Yeah. So, the first one... Maybe we could also sort of give these each a rating of how bad they would actually be for us in our current modern lives too?

Justin: Okay?

Griffin: Just, you guys do that for me, so I know.

Travis: Bad? Bad in what way?

**Griffin**: Bad just in any way that a thing could make your life worse, conceivably.

Travis: Oh, okay.

**Griffin**: Like this first one, "Set their clock four or five hours ahead." That is a—

Travis: Four or five hours?

Justin: Four or five hours?

Griffin: That's a war crime. That a bad one. That's rough stuff.

**Travis**: Also, I would argue, for some people, not that effective, though? 'Cause like, I... thanks to my human alarm clocks in the form of my children, I get up at like 6:45 to 7AM every day anyways. Like, that's not an option.

**Justin**: I wish I could sleep in. I can't sleep in anymore.

Travis: Yeah, it's the worst.

**Griffin**: There's so much purpose, though, that to—This is the next one, and this one, "Torment them with—"

**Travis**: Well, it also is impractical because like, who's relying on like even digital clocks? Like, I have a phone? You can't fix that—you can't change that shit? Can you?

**Justin**: My wife uses an alarm clock from the mid-1990s.

Travis: Oh boy.

**Justin**: That she has kept since middle school. It is... sounds like hell being drowned in a toilet.

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

**Justin**: And it's the worst thing that happens to me whenever it goes off. Also, when the power goes out, the hour button doesn't work. So, you have to push it really, really hard. Travis: Okay.

Justin: Yeah.

Travis: So, I'm gonna say seven.

Justin: Okay.

Travis: Huh?

**Justin**: That's actually pretty mean. 'Cause I would feel really guilty about throwing away a big pile of potato salad.

Travis: Now, you—

Griffin: [chuckles] The end.

**Justin**: The end, no more mayonnaise for you, it's at halt.

## Justin: Okay?

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: Now, that—

Travis: Not my pencil case!

Justin: [chuckles]

**Griffin**: "Try taking only one thing every day. Something that they won't notice right away, like a pen. Hide it in your room to make sure it blends in with your stuff. Or simply hide it in your closet. Keep making the things you—" I swear to god, someone could be doing this with wash cloths in my house, and I still would have no idea.

Justin: Or nail clippers?

**Justin**: Where do they go?!

**Griffin**: What are we doing?

Travis: Thank you!

Griffin: Thank you!

**Travis**: That is mean.

Justin: Wait-

**Griffin**: "If you wanna be—"

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: It's been a rough one. [chuckles]

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

**Justin**: "It's a rough one, someone glued all his deodorants closed and it's been... You don't wanna be draped on this guy right now. It's tough."

**Griffin**: "Spray whipped cream in their hands while they're sleeping." That's...

Justin: Delicious.

**Griffin**: Here's the thing about this prank, it's never worked one in the history of mankind. But there is something to waking up and my hand has whipped cream in it. That's sucks already, that sucks enough. It doesn't have to be on my face for me to not be stoked about there being whipped cream on my—

Justin: Yeah, it's an issue, regardless.

**Justin**: All right. Right this way, take my hand. Second star on the right, straight until morning.

**Travis**: Oh, wait. This is Neverland.

[theme song plays]

**Travis**: Hey, Griffin?

Griffin: Yo?

Travis: How's your stitch?

**Griffin**: Oh, baby. It's... it's coming so correct. I live in a different like parallel, a different longitude now.

Travis: Yeah?

**Griffin**: And the weather's different. And so, I had to get rid of all my clothes.

Travis: Oh?

Travis: Yeah?

**Patton**: Could I get a balrog burger and some Aragorn fries? Thank you.

Jordan: And Kumail Nanjiani.

**Kumail**: I've come back with cat toothbrushes, which is impossible to use.

**Jesse**: Come get stupider with us a maximumfun.org.

**Griffin**: [laughs]

**Justin**: [chuckles]

**Griffin**: Oh, yeah. We crushed that one.

Travis: [laughs]

**Justin**: Yeah, we helped with that one. It's not your fault.

**Griffin**: It's not your fuckin' fault, man. If they try to go to somebody to complain, if they try to slander your good name by going to other people and saying like, "Yeah, they ate my fuckin' donut holes." The person they are telling that story will just say like, "Hold on, wait, wait, wait, wait."

## Travis: What?

Justin: [mouths Munch Squad riff]

Travis: Ooh?

Griffin: Yeah!

Justin: [continues riffing]

Griffin: Mm-hmm!

Justin: [continues riffing and sings] I wanna munch!

Travis: Squad!

**Griffin**: Squad!

Justin: [continues riffing and sings] I want to munch!

Travis: Squad!

**Griffin**: Squad! Justin, there's a certain creature of the night that I would love to hear from right now.

Justin: Oh, okay? About what?

Travis: Donut holes.

Griffin: Just about donuts.

Justin: Oh, yeah, yeah, yeah. No, I don't-

**Travis**: And how they should be called donut plugs, because the hole's already in the donut.

Griffin: Yes!

Justin: Yes-

**Griffin**: Or just nut plugs, to make it shorter and easier to say.

Travis: No, please. [chuckles] 20 Sun and Sea, share the nut plugs.

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

**Justin**: Do you guys wanna hear—Okay, this week's Munch Squad is interactive.

Travis: Ooh?

**Justin**: Do you wanna hear about National Bros Day? Do you wanna hear about the oldest person that works at Arby's? Or the cheesiest blockbuster returns?

Travis: Oh boy-

**Griffin**: Nah, man, I've gotta hear about the oldest Arby's employee. Are you kidding me?

Travis: Yeah, me to.

Justin: Okay. So, it's-

**Travis**: They were there when roast beef was invented.

Travis: [gasps]

Travis: What?

Justin: Yeah, you heard me right.
