Travis: Yeah!

**Griffin**: I mean, you can have big city spirit?

Travis: Yeah, that's true?

Griffin: Can't you?

**Justin**: Hello, and welcome to My Brother, My Brother and Me, an advice show for—we're having a cold open. Hello, and welcome to My Brother, My Brother and Me, an advice show—[chuckles]

**Travis**: That was not a cold open, that was a warm open.

Justin: A vice show—a vice show!

Travis: A vice show.

Griffin: A vice show?

Griffin: Dirty.

**Travis**: 'Cause it's—yeah, it's in a fantasy world—

**Griffin**: Sound of the city, baby.

**Travis**: ... Where a cop might be dirty. Can you imagine?

Justin: An advice show for the modern era...

Griffin: I can imagine.

Justin: I'm your oldest brother, Justin McElroy.

Travis: Oh, sorry, I'm your middlest brother, Detective Travis McElroy.

[chuckles]

**Griffin**: I'm your sweet baby brother detective, Griff—[coughs] Griffin

McElroy. Sorry, guys, some vapor from the subway just came up and I got—

Justin: [chuckles]

**Griffin**: I breathed—I did breathe it in.

**Travis**: That's not good, man.

**Justin**: What do you guys call your little subway there? What do you guys

call it?

**Griffin**: [in silly voice] The metro.

**Justin**: The metro—

**Griffin**: [in silly voice] Are you talking—are you... are you jabbering about

the metro?

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin**: [chuckles] Wait a minute!

**Griffin**: So, that's a—

**Justin**: Is that the native D.C. accent that you adopted?

**Griffin**: That's a sort of D.C. accent that—

**Justin**: So proud of you.

Griffin: Yeah. I didn't—and you know what's fuckin' funny, Juice? I didn't

even realize I had it, until you just pointed that out.

Justin: That you were doing it?

Travis: Yeah, man. You know what we call our subway here in Cincinnati?

Griffin: What's that?

**Griffin**: Whoa. That's cool.

**Griffin**: [in silly voice] Oh—

Travis: What?

Justin: What?

Griffin: [in silly voice] I watch Illuminati—

Justin: Okay, so, that's a D.C.—

Griffin: [in silly voice] Skull and bones!

Justin: It's turned into Scooby Doo, that's a very D.C. thing.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Griffin**: Yeah, I don't know why that was a big surprise twist.

**Travis**: That was a revelation for me.

**Griffin**: I'm just—I live very close to Joe Biden now, and we have not done a lot with that, sort of—

**Justin**: You had a—what was is yesterday? You had a... a helicopter—one of Joe's fleet—

**Justin**: [chuckles]

**Griffin**: Yeah, for sure.

**Justin**: Joe Focused. Here's a question from you, our beloved listener.

**Travis**: Joecused.

**Justin**: This one comes to us from Savannah. Beautiful, beautiful. Love it

down there, Savannah. Ah, Riverwalk? Come on. The history?

Griffin: Come on!

**Justin**: The ghosts? The taffy? Please.

**Griffin**: So many.

**Justin**: The pralines?

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis**: I just like the people. The energy?

Justin: The people! The energy of the city! It's a whole other pulse, but it's

just a straw!

Travis: Ah, Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil? Ah, it's so good!

**Griffin**: [chuckles] Yeah.

Justin: "My old roommate sent a save the date for his wedding, and he's

getting hitched on Thanksgiving—"

**Travis**: What?

**Justin**: "Should I still go?" What?

Griffin: Huh?

**Justin**: "My old roommate sent me a save the date for his wedding, and he's getting hitched on Thanksgiving?"

Griffin: Huh? Huh?!

**Travis**: Wow! Hey, that's not okay!

**Justin**: "I've been horrible about flaking every time I said I would visit him after we moved out of our apartment. And I thought no way would I let myself miss his wedding. But now, it's on Thanksgiving!"

Travis: Yeah!

**Justin**: "And I live across the country from my wonderful family. Is my roommate trying to keep the guest count low?"

Travis: Ooh.

**Justin**: "Does he know Thanksgiving is on a Thursday? I have many questions and I hope you might have some answers."

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

Justin: That's from Super Flakey in Savannah. Oof.

Griffin: This has just given me a kickass idea.

Justin: Okay?

**Griffin**: I don't care when I beef it, I wanna have a Christmas funeral.

**Travis**: Ugh?

**Griffin**: Just because... it... you're gonna be thinking about me that day, you know what I mean?

**Justin**: [chuckles] Thinking about you.

**Griffin**: Like, I'm gonna lock that one fuckin'—let's talk about me today.

**Travis**: I have many, many... just, a Travis McElroy conspiracy theory. A conspiracy of one, if you will. And one of my conspiracy theories does relate to Houdini, who died on Halloween.

Griffin: Oh, okay?

**Justin**: It's Charlie the tuna day! [chuckles]

Travis: Oh, what? Shit! I didn't get Teresa anything!

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

**Justin**: Hostess Twinkie day is today. It's... national caramel popcorn day. [laughs]

**Griffin**: Good!

Justin: National caramel popcorn day, and Twinkie day!

**Griffin**: Good!

**Travis**: Hey, Justin, look up what day November 23<sup>rd</sup> is this year. Because maybe—

**Justin**: Oh, no, that's gonna say Thanksgiving.

**Travis**: Because maybe—but it's gonna say Thanksgiving, but I guarantee, it's gonna say other things.

**Justin**: Just real quick, a few others, today is plan your epitaph day, Teflon day, and New Beer's Eve, whatever that is. [laughs] It's today.

Travis: Ooh!

Griffin: Sure.

**Justin**: Yeah, yeah—

**Travis**: Maybe it's a—

**Travis**: Part of growing up is removing people from your life.

Justin: Boy, I bet you didn't see this fuckin' twist coming when you sent this

email in, huh?

Travis: Huh?

Griffin: Huh, wow.

**Justin**: That you didn't expect us to excise this person from your existence.

But here we are.

**Griffin**: Hey, can we approach the Wizard?

Justin: Yes, Griffin, thank you!

Griffin: And just really... praise him.

Travis: Griffin, I would like to approach the Wizard with a lot of hubris, but

then learn about humility and about myself through the process.

**Griffin**: Okay?

**Travis**: If that works for this one?

**Griffin**: Yeah, sure, that works fine. You're a frog now. He did that.

**Travis**: Oh? That's gonna teach me a lot! I've seen Frog Princess, man.

**Griffin**: I think so too, yeah, sure.

Travis: Tiana actually doesn't learn a lot of humility in that movie? The

prince definitely does.

**Griffin**: The prince is the one who needed the lesson. So, how to contact yourself in a parallel universe? Thank you, Douglas, for sending this one in. This is about... "Curious how to contact yourself in a parallel universe?"

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin**: "While tapping into alternative universes, or A-use, is all purely theoretical..."

Justin: Oh?

**Travis**: Oh, Griffin's winking. He's trying to wink as loud as he can, so it plays on the mic.

**Griffin**: [mouths silly sound]

**Travis**: Oh, god, he's really going for it!

**Griffin**: "It's a ton of fun to think about! If you're in sci-fi, guided meditation, visualization, or creative exercises, jump right into this article. Here, you'll learn about exciting concepts like wormholes and a fifth dimension. So, you can see and talk to all the versions of yourself." Fuck yes! **Travis**: Thank you!

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin**: So, we're gonna start with this. "A parallel universe is one of countless alternate realities." We're gonna get kind of like... pretty smart on this one, talking about like a lot of like—

**Justin**: We can do smart things.

**Travis**: Yeah, man.

Justin: Like, can do smart stuff.

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin**: Like, we can do that, too.

**Travis**: We can do it.

Justin: It's more... more cerebral.

Griffin: Yeah, yeah.

**Travis**: Yeah, we tone it down on purpose, that's what a lot of people don't

know.

**Griffin**: Most definitely.

Travis: We could do it.

**Griffin**: "It's all theoretical science, but it's fun to think about." Stop it! Stop

touching it!

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin**: Just tell me how to fuckin'... just tell me how to everything, everywhere, please! "If the universe is limitless, then it's possibly home to an infinite amount of realities that are parallel to each other because... there's just so much space."

Travis: Sure.

**Griffin**: Cool, cool. Okay, so, how to contact yourself in a parallel universe? "Travel through space with the... de Broglie wavelength." De Broglie wavelength.

**Travis**: I've tried that!

Griffin: How'd it go?

**Justin**: [chuckles] How did I get to space? For starters.

**Travis**: Well, Justin—

travel-

Griffin: Don't even... Hey, Travis?

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: I wish you... I wish you shant.

**Travis**: [laughs]

Griffin: You shant and shouldn't.

Justin: [chuckles]

**Travis**: I wish I would step back from that ledge, my friend. [chuckles]

**Justin**: I would beg of you... I would be of you to shant. Please. [chuckles]

**Travis**: [laughs]

**Justin**: Make a brief—hey, Travis, my brother, make a brief allowance to shant, please, with this.

**Travis**: Yeah, you're right, you're right, you're right. Let me shant real quick. [chuckles]

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

**Justin**: No, you gotta shant three times on wood and then throw some shant over your shoulder. [chuckles]

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin**: [clap sings] 'Travel through space with the de Broglie wavelength!' "An A-you with a high-tech machine can deliver you to your alternate self. Reach out to another society where you have access to equipment capable of sending out a wavelength that can reach infinite realities. It'll be able to pick up your signal and bring you over to a parallel universe. A de Broglie wavelength has a very high value of kinetic energy and associated potential—" I don't' wanna read that part.

**Travis**: This isn't gonna work. And can I tell you why Griffin and Justin?

Griffin: Yeah?

Travis: My brothers—

Justin: Where to start? Where to begin?

**Travis**: My brothers in science. Because if I am traveling and were in an infinite universe situation, there are also infinite mes traveling. We're all gonna get to each other's universe and be one universe over!

**Griffin**: And no one's gonna be there, yeah. That's a fair point.

Justin: Yeah. That would be awkward.

Justin: Left. Yeah.

Travis: Nobel had to blow up a lot of stuff to find the first award, right?

Griffin: Right, exactly.

**Travis**: That's how he discovered awards!

Griffin: That's right.

**Justin**: What if he gave that to—I bet—do you—do you think he gave it to—[chuckles] Do you think when Nobel did something really good, he was like, "You know what? You deserve a break today. No one's gonna honor you, so I'm gonna do it for you."

Travis: [chuckles]

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

**Justin**: "This—this—we're gonna call this—this... ice cold Mountain Dew and a slice of pizza."

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: "We're gonna call this the Nobel Prize!"

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

**Justin**: "This is just for you, doing such a good job today!" [in silly voice] "Oh, thanks, Nobel! That's really nice!" "No problem, buddy!"

**Travis**: Now close your Nobel eyes and take a Nobel nap, and enjoy your Nobel Prize.

**Justin**: [chuckles] Then Einstein opens his window and looks and he's like, "Ah, shit! How did you get pizza?!"

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

**Travis**: [chuckles] "Can I have pizza?"

"Yeah..."

Justin: [laughs] "Nobel says you gotta do something really good!"

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin**: Like, really, really good for humanity. And Nobel, all he did was rake his lawn. But he did it to Einstein and then he was like, "Einstein, you gotta come through clutch with a real good one." And then Einstein was like—

**Travis**: "You gotta help me paint this fence!" [chuckles]

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

**Justin**: [chuckles] And Einstein's like, "No problem, buddy. Catch you in a year!" And he comes back and he's like, "A-bombs!" And he's like, "Ah..."

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

Travis: "Yeah, here you go, man!"

Griffin: "Oops!"

**Justin**: "That is good. Here is your pizza, my man."

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: "Welcome to the club!"

**Travis**: Yeah, "I was just—I was blowing stuff up with dynamite, my dude, and you invented an A-bomb? Nice!"

Justin: "I was wasting time! Thank you, Einstein."

**Travis**: Not a lot of people talk about this, but you can, still, to this day—and it says it in small lettering on the Nobel Prize, "Turn it in at a Pizza Hut for a personal pan pizza and a large Mountain Dew."

**Griffin**: Yeah, yeah.

**Travis**: Not a lot of people tell you that, but you can turn it in. Go to your local Pizza Hut, they got a stack of 'em in the back just waiting to be picked up.

**Griffin**: Huge, huge stack of personal pan Nobel Peace Prizes. "Find the distance, time and tech needed to enter an AU." So, what I like about this—

**Travis**: Sorry, can I jump back? Nobel Pizza Prize! Sorry, go on. [chuckles]

**Griffin**: Thank you, Travis. The Einstein-Rosen Wormhole works both ways, right?

**Travis**: Sure.

**Griffin**: Like, you can't just expect—

**Travis**: Einstein on one end, Rosen on the other. Yes.

**Griffin**: No, no, no, no, no, like your alternate—hey, Trav? Dial in. 'Cause this is—

**Justin**: Yeah, really, man.

Griffin: You're having a lot of fun...

**Travis**: Oh, this is the science? This is the science, okay.

**Griffin**: You're jazzing over there and we love that here. But also like, we're in a pretty heavy intellectual space right now. And I want us to try and respect that.

**Travis**: All right, let me dial in. Okay.

**Griffin**: Okay. You can't just rely on everything, everywhere, all at once, Griffin, to hit you up. So, sometimes, you have to run the formulas. Like just write down, "My alternate self will travel one million light years in one second with a special machine." And then it'll—

**Justin**: Okay, so, this is similar to very early in our run, I said that if time travel ever exists, this is the moment I wanna come back to.

**Griffin**: Right, I'm still waiting on—oh, I do have a text? Oh, it's dad. God... how disappointing. You can also—"My alternate self will instantly travel to the closest parallel universe through astral projection."

Travis: Yes, yes.

Griffin: You can just like—

Travis: Obvs, obvs.

Griffin: Yeah. "My alternate self will access the furthest parallel universe by reading a magical tone."

Travis: Wait, now hold on. So, our options so far, de Broglie wavelength...

**Griffin**: Yeah!

Travis: Einstein-Rosen wormhole.

**Griffin**: If you wanna do it quick. And dirty.

**Travis**: Yeah. Then we have astral projection. And then a magic tone? Just any...

Griffin: Yeah, a magic tone.

**Travis**: Which one?

**Griffin**: That'll help you with this next one, too. 'Cause you can also hop into an alternate reality that's 2D.

Travis: Oh?

Justin: Ooh...

**Griffin**: "So, you imagine a flat universe to see yourself as a comic book character. Think about a parallel universe where everything is two-

dimensional. For some extra fun, think about what comic book you'd like in and what type of character you'd be in this special universe."

**Travis**: Now, hold on.

**Griffin**: Hey... if I was a two-dimensional comic book character, I wouldn't be able to see any of the shit that was happening on that plane that I also solely exist on.

**Travis**: Yeah, I'm pretty sure in the comic book, it's supposed to be three—like, in their universe—we're looking at a picture—like, if I look at a picture of something happening here, I'm not—like, if I take a picture of my office and I look at that, I'm not like, "Ah, a two-dimensional world."

Griffin: No, it's not—this isn't... flat land.

Travis: I've already been him! I met him back then, that's—

**Griffin**: I already did that!

**Travis**: Sucks.

Griffin: Boring!

**Justin**: I wanna travel to meet myself, from like two years ago. I wanna say, "Justin, I know you're about to launch into a project for bending reality so you can interact with yourself. I'm here from the future to tell you, you are wasting your fucking time."

**Travis**: Yeah, man.

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] "It is pointless. It doesn't work, it doesn't—

**Griffin**: "It does work. It does work, 'cause I'm here now, talking to you. But I'm saying like not worth it."

Justin: "It's just a waste of time. It's like not worth it."

Griffin: "It sucks." Yeah.

Justin: "Just go rewatch BSG. Rewatch BSG."

**Griffin**: "That would be a way better use of your time., for sure."

**Travis**: "Are you gonna eat that? Also. 'Cause I could eat that now, and then it's future food!"

**Justin**: "Oh, we don't have—we don't have beef anymore. Sorry, I should've—"

Griffin: Whoops.

Justin: Whoops, sorry.

**Griffin**: "Fourth dimension's hard, but if you do feel confident, you can take the next step." And this is kind of the one that I'm on. Which is that you enter the fifth dimension to contact your soul.

Travis: Wait-

**Griffin**: So, you enter the fifth—the fifth—everybody's wondering, where is this thing? The fifth dimension is where the soul is. "Ascend to the spirit world and access your higher self. Find your higher self, a spiritual being that's free from pain or fear, and that only experiences pure love in the fifth dimension. **Griffin**: Yeah?

Travis: The dimensions are... height—

**Griffin**: Yeah, flat comic books, 2D.

**Travis**: [chuckles] Comic books. We got height, right?

Justin: Well, lines.

Travis: Yeah, width.

**Griffin**: We got points as one, lines as two.

**Justin**: Points as one, lines as two.

**Travis**: Then depth, right?

**Griffin**: Square is three...

Justin: Cube is three.

**Travis**: Cube is three.

Griffin: Cube is three.

**Travis**: And then time, a cube that exists for longer than a second. And then

a cube that exists for longer than, you know, an—

**Justin**: A point doesn't—sorry, a point zero.

**Travis**: Okay. Point, line, square, cube... Cube that lasts...

Justin: Right?

**Travis**: Cube that lasts that paint. Right?

Justin: Is a line 2D?

Griffin: Cube that lasts that paint is where we are on. That's like the shit

we're on. We love that.

**Travis**: A cube that lasts and paints.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis**: Okay.

**Griffin**: So, we're talking about the fifth dimension is the spirit one, and I think it might not be too late for us to change the name of the year to 20

Surf and Sea, channel the 5D. Or something along those lines, 'cause that's really the type of energy that I'm gonna wanna bring.,

**Justin**: Well, Griff, you don't have to change it, 'cause it can be true... that can be true also.

Griffin: Okay.

Travis: Mm-hmm...

**Griffin**: Surf the vibe, channel the 5D...

Justin: Different dimensions.

Griffin: Yes.

Justin: Different verses. Different multi-verses.

Griffin: Cool.

**Travis**: Yeah, in a different universe, that is—that is the—

**Justin**: In a different universe, it is channel the 5D, and has always been.

**Travis**: Mm-hm.

**Griffin**: It's always been like that, too, in my estimation.

**Justin**: I didn't think—okay, listen, I know—I don't feel like we hold wikiHow

to an especially high bar here. We can all agree on that, right?

Griffin: No.

**Travis**: No! We're very permissive. [chuckles]

**Justin**: We're very permissive.

**Griffin**: We take all sorts here, wikiHow.

**Justin**: I just don't... I don't like that there's this article—it is actually getting on my nerves that this article's like, "Just dream it!"

**Travis**: Yeah, man.

Griffin: No, okay, so, let's get back-

**Justin**: Like, you—why do you bring me here?

Griffin: You're right. Let's get back into the—into the process. Right?

**Travis**: This article is getting more stoned as we go! [laughs]

**Justin**: [chuckles] Yeah, right? I need a bullet-pointed, like, 'unscrew the lid, put the blade in the stone.'

**Griffin**: The final one is, "Write a message to communicate with your alternate self." Boring!

**Travis**: Yeah, man, you just told me to dream in different colors and reach myself that casts spells. And now you're like, "I don't know, man, write it down?" [chuckles]

Griffin: Can we go to the Money Zone, please?

Justin: Yes, let's go!

**Griffin**: I just bought a fuckin' lot of crystals.

[theme song plays]

Travis: Are you comfortable right now?

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: No? [chuckles]

**Travis**: Okay, well, we have both ends of the comfort array.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis**: Griffin, I would like to make you more comfortable by getting you

socks-

Griffin: I would love that, man.

**Travis**: Yeah. Socks that support your sport. You know how you're always

sporting, Griffin?

**Griffin**: Yeah, sure?

**Travis**: Be it regular or E. You wanna be comfortable.

**Griffin**: Yeah, sure.

**Justin**: Oh... yeah, that makes more sense.

**Travis**: It's a sentence that you read out loud with your human mouth.

Griffin: Yes...

**Justin**: Like, it's all just—everybody's just having fun. And then it feels off-paced to do another question afterwards. And you're like, "Oh, man! This show's gotta be wrapping up by now!"

**Griffin**: [groans] Oh, god...

Justin: [mouths Munch Squad riff]

Travis: Yay!

Griffin: Yes!

Justin: [continues riffing]

**Griffin**: Oh god!

**Justin**: [continues riffing]

**Travis**: Save us, Justin!

Justin: Put your glasses back on, you look so weird without 'em.

**Travis**: Whoa?

**Travis**: Wait...

**Griffin**: Wait. [chuckles]

**Justin**: Fuckin' 80% of our audience has just reached furtively for their keyboard like, "That's what they're fuckin' doing?"

**Griffin**: I don't know, yeah. One third—at least one third of this podcasting crew is doing that as well.

Travis: [laughs]

**Travis**: "This one's even—we're not even selling this one! We just had an idea for it, we know you're gonna be watching Rise of the Pink Ladies at home. This is what we're gonna be making, do you wanna make 'em at home and enjoy 'em?"

**Justin**: And I—Sonic, I'm gonna go out on a limb here and say that there's at least a portion of your audience that would not be super excited to be transported to the era of doo wops and pink poodle skirts! [chuckles]

Griffin: Sure, sure!

**Justin**: Maybe not all of us were fairing super good during that timeline, maybe?

Griffin: Yeah, in the land of... of Grease.

**Justin**: Maybe that might be—maybe they just want a refreshing beverage and the... Sonic—but that is the place to go, though. "Sonic is the ultimate drink stop, with thousands of drink combinations."

**Travis**: What?

**Justin**: "You can also enjoy half-price drinks and slushes any time with the app. And there's half price on cheeseburgers on Tuesday nights."

**Griffin**: I'm just saying, if you make and sell a special beverage, you shouldn't need 1,000 other options.

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin**: That's true, just the one special beverage.

Travis: Stand. Stand by your convictions and say, "This is it."

**Justin**: Hey, speaking of that, "What's even better than finding a new drink to enjoy alongside your new streaming obsession?" Guys, I...

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

**Justin**: I do wanna continue on here. I... You're pretty fuckin' close to not being able to enjoy these two things simultaneously. I would say like, if you drive, you're gonna have to brace, you're gonna have to tether, right?

Griffin: Yeah, for sure.

**Justin**: You're gonna have to tether on your laptop and have the—like, have it waiting to press the play button. If you drive this thing home, it's gonna be undrinkable!

**Travis**: Oh, wait, Justin, you don't have a beverage chiller in your center console for just this occasion?

Justin: Incorrect.

Travis: Ah, damn it!

**Griffin**: Some kind of hotdog?

**Justin**: "How about helping a local school?"

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

Travis: Hey, can I just tell you—

Justin: [chuckles]

**Griffin**: [laughs]

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: "I'm gonna get Knuckles to sign my backpack!"

**Travis**: "Fuck yeah!" [chuckles]

Justin: [laughs]

**Travis**: [chuckles] "Who's this guy?!"

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: "Why's his hair so fucking wet?! Where is Sonic the Hedgehog?!"

Justin: [chuckles]

Griffin: "Did Robotnik send you?!"

**Travis**: [laughs]

Justin: [chuckles]

Griffin: "Is this guy fuckin' Robotnik?!"

Travis: "Get him!"

Griffin: "It's John Travolta."

"Get his ass!"

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: That's John Travolta, the actor."

**Travis**: "Yeah, okay, get him!" [chuckles]

**Griffin**: Good!

**Justin**: "What's even better than finding a new drink to enjoy alongside your new streaming obsession? How about also helping a local school? Powered by the Sonic Foundation, Sonic donates a portion of all drink, slush and shake sales to support public education through the brand's Limeades for Learning initiative." [chuckles]

Travis: Wow!

Justin: What a powerful tool that is.

Griffin: Sure.

**Justin**: "The Limeades for Learning initiative, since 2009, Sonic has donated more than 24 million dollars to funding local classrooms, becoming one of the largest programs to support public education in the US."

**Travis**: Now, when they say local classrooms, do they mean local to anywhere? Local... local, in what way? Globally local?

**Griffin**: Globally local.

**Travis**: It's there!

**Griffin**: [chuckles]
