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Intro (Bob Ball): The McElroy brothers are not experts, and their advice should never be followed. Justin: Okay?

Griffin: I'm your sweet baby brother, Griffin McElroy. Travis, what are you doing?

Travis: Oh, sorry I just to finish beating the dark— I've been kind of— have you guys been playing Alpha Legend XVI's Fingers of the Resistance on iOS and Android?

Justin: Oh, yeah, yeah, yeah!

Travis: Oh my god...

Griffin: Yeah, I've been playing it on iOS and Android. Usually at the same time, two different devices.

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: I'm like one of those like... old retirees who walks around playing Pokémon GO on like a huge organ of 16 different—

Travis: Well, it's just the gameplay is so immersive and they have like fully customizable backpacks. And it's available now, you know, it's just 2.99 a month to play.

Griffin: Have you played Legend of Backpack, Mr. Pocket's Revenge XVI, on iOS and Android?

Travis: No, I haven't played that. I've just played Alpha Legend XVI's Fingers of the Resistance, available now, on iOS and Android.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: You can start playing now from any of your devices. And you know, I—

Griffin: Uh-huh?

Travis: I'll let you guys in on something special.

Justin: Oh, okay?

Travis: I have a code that you guys can use if you want to.

Griffin: Oh, cool?

Travis: Yeah.

Travis: No, actually, Griffin, it says— sorry, I mean, in my experience, there— you get the best one every time if you use the code Travis Power 99. That's capital T—

Griffin: You're not reading this— You're not reading this, are you?

Travis: No! No, of course not, this is just from my experience, 'cause I'm a big gamer. I love Alpha Legend XVI's, colon, Fingers of the Resistance. And it's—

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: Well, that'll happen if you're not good at games. I mean, if you're a noob.

Justin: Wait, no, but your ad said that I was supposed to hit a jackpot within 11 spins!

Travis: Yes, there was an asterisk there where it said, "If you have the skills." At the bottom, it says, "If you're not a noob and you have the skills." So, how do you— Justin, if you're being honest with yourself, and I mean really look in your heart, you got the skills?

Justin: I don't.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: Okay? I don't.

Justin: You sound like an idiot, it's free to download, Griffin.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: I'm sorry, it's free to download.

Griffin: Oh, really?

Travis: It's free to download, not pay to play. Now, I will say—

Justin: It's not pay to win—

Travis: Well-

Justin: You do earn credits while you're AFK—

Travis: It does— I'm sorry, Justin, I-I— from my experience, I'm specifically experienced to not say it's not pay to win.

Griffin: Okay.

Travis: My specific experience—

Griffin: Okay, so, when Travis has played the game, he didn't pay, 'cause he got all of his own free gems.

Justin: [chuckles]

Griffin: And he did win. So, by Travi's very limited— by the narrow sliver of light through which Travis is watching you play this game, it was cool for him, it says on the sheet.

Travis: Yeah. It says it on the sheet, it was cool for me, and kids love it.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: And another thing that you're gonna appreciate, parents, 'cause you've been there, no like gatekeeping to let kids make purchases through your phone. Right, we don't— they don't do anything of that stuff where it's just like, oh, "Prove your age before you purchase this skin."

Justin: [chuckles] It just lets 'em, it says on there, "Go ahead—"

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: Spelled out.

Travis: They also have Angry Birds.

Justin: Interesting—

Griffin: Yeah, no, on the phone, you can get 'em both.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: That's impossible, Capcom just bought Angry Birds.

Travis: Oh, yeah, no, the— Weinersoft just bought Capcom.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: From all the money they've made— I mean, from all the good vibes they've gotten from how much people love— sorry, one more time—

Griffin: Does it say 'good vibes' on the sheet—

Travis: Yeah, it says, good vibes bought Capcom because of Alpha Legend XVI, colon, Fingers of the Resistance. Fingers of Resistance, excuse me.

Griffin: It's gonna be so shitty when the FCC starts regulating podcasts.

Travis: Oh, don't even.

Griffin: It's gonna get really shitty for us from a like fungible and legal standpoint.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Please, nobody tell the FCC about podcasts. They're still like kind of— they're still like kind of in a tizzy about streaming in general—

Justin: All right. Great joke.

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: Yeah?

Justin: Sonic the Hedgehog bought Angry Birds last week.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: How much do you think— it's the studio that makes Angry Birds, and basically, it's just Angry Birds. How much do you think Sonic the Hedgehog had to pay to buy Angry Birds in this, the year of our lord, 2023.

Travis: Uh-huh. Does—

Griffin: And keep in— keep in mind, he doesn't have very much money.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: [chuckles] He just has the money—

Griffin: He's a forest animal.

Justin: He mainly has the money he started with. He is Sonic the Hedgehog.

Griffin: Mm-hm.

Travis: Does it... does it include the hit film franchise of Angry Birds?

Justin: I mean, you would own the—

Travis: Yeah, okay—

Justin: God, this cast is stacked in this flick, though! Danny McBride—

Griffin: Sudeikis.

Justin: Sudeikis, Dinklage, Josh Gad, Bill Hader, Maya Rudolph, Danny

McBride.

Travis: Damn. I'm gonna say—

Justin: I'll take it, thank you.

Travis: I'm gonna say two billion dollars.

Justin: Well, okay, you kind of messed it up. So, this—

Griffin: 160— 160 million.

Justin: No. You're both incredibly wrong. [chuckles]

Griffin: Oh-

Justin: 775 million dollars for Sonic the Hedgehog. He had—

Griffin: Dang, Travis and I almost split the uprights perfectly with our

wrongness.

Travis: Yeah—

Justin: You all were like as wrong as you could possibly be.

Travis: Now, to be fair, Justin, I'm guessing 90% of that value is all just like socks and like stress balls and shit, you know what I mean?

Justin: Unsold merch that they had lying around.

Travis: Yeah!

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: This is an advice show, we take your questions and turn them alchemy-like into wisdom. Don't forget— one more time with the code, 'cause I feel like hit the code enough, Trav.

Travis: Oh, thank you very much. Travis Power 99.

Justin: Okay. And the game title was—

Travis: It was Alpha Legend XVI, colon, Fingers of Resistance.

Griffin: You read that.

Travis: What?

Griffin: You read that. I saw you read— I know the face you make when you read, 'cause it's like—

Travis: No, I was— I was looking at a picture of myself doing a thumbs up to remind myself how much I love the game.

Justin: Okay.

Griffin: I don't think that' true. Juice, I think he was reading that.

Justin: That's okay. I want Travis to get it while the getting's good. And if that means Travis—

Griffin: But how come he gets money for this and we don't get money for

it?

Justin: That's so we don't have to take care of him.

Travis: This is for my twilight years. Griffin, this is my nest egg.

Griffin: That's true. Okay, yeah, that's fair.

Justin: That's his nest egg. Mine's these stocks. These beautiful stocks.

Travis: Nothing ever happened bad with stocks. [chuckles]

Justin: I just buy the stocks of companies I like. And the only I like is weed.

And things are going very good over here. [chuckles]

Griffin: Right.

Justin: From a monetary perspective. Kids—

Griffin: I'm pretty sure we're insider trading now. So, this is, again—

Justin: Kids, there's still time— there's time—

Griffin: Do not tell the FCC about this medium!

Travis: Griffin, are you worried that Justin—

Justin: I keep thinking I'm getting in on the ground floor of weed stocks. And then the ground floor keeps being lower than I previously assumed!

Travis: Yeah!

Justin: It's like, hey, everybody! New ground floor! You have—

Griffin: Mm-hm?

Justin: You can't get in on the ground floor again, as long as this is indeed the ground floor!

Griffin: And as long as you never sell...

Justin: Never sell.

Griffin: It's like the money's not— [chuckles] it's like the money's not gone.

Travis: It's like money's not gone, it's still there!

Justin: You can't realize the loss unless you sell. This is—

Travis: Exactly.

Griffin: Exactly.

Justin: Listen, take it from me—

Travis: This is an advice show.

Justin: This is—

Griffin: This is a real advice show that the FCC cannot and must not know about.

Justin: Welcome, welcome—

Griffin: Just buy as many stocks as you can! Eventually, it'll— brrrp! Eventually—

Justin: Welcome to Sad Money, I'm your host, Justin McElroy. And I'm here to talk to you about the stonks! Diamond hands, baby!

Griffin: Oh, good—

Justin: Come on! Stonks!

Griffin: You don't have anything else for this character. There is nothing else for this character. This character walks off screen and completely— it's like Truman Show, just disintegrates—

Justin: It wasn't a character, it was—

Travis: Oh, speaking of having nothing else for this character, Justin, it's time to play that intro!

[intro from "I Feel Good" by Pitbull Ft. Anthony Watts & DJWS plays]

Travis: I'm Mr. Nickname!

Justin: So, when I was listening to the recording of your theme song, and I heard you say, "It's Mr. Nickname!" That was in the recording.

Travis: Yeah. That wasn't me. I actually commissioned that from Mr. Worldwide himself, and he said, "Of course, anything for another Mister." And he said it to me. Now, welcome to Mr. Nickname—

Griffin: I didn't hear this intro audio, but I bet it sounded pretty cool.

Travis: Yeah, seamless. I wanna say thank you to everybody. As I'd hoped, got a lot of people writing in ideas for Mr. Nickname 2.0. So, I've just sent Justin and Griffin two halves of a list—

Justin: Wait, how did you solicit these?

Travis: Oh, remember I did a bad version of it on the episode and then I said, "So, please help me fix this."

Justin: Okay.

Travis: For Griffin, you have the names we know these people by, the commonly known names. Now, Justin, you have the nicknames to match them to. We're going to match them up. And that's because two of the names on Justin's list will match up to the same person in Griffin's.

Justin: Oh, wow, okay.

Justin: What is the—okay, I'm gonna—

Griffin: It's fucking psychotic, Travis.

Justin: [laughs] You need to walk me through that part first.

Griffin: This segment is almost becoming art, by the... the bad sort of design of it.

Justin: [laughs] I'm giving it the ol' college try, it's just this is the only time Griffin and I can not know these lists. So, you need to—

Travis: Okay. No, here's what we'll do. Griffin, you read the commonly known names, right. And then Justin, I want you to say like, "I think this one is Snoop Dog. I think it's—"

Griffin: No, but stop. But why did you need to split the information— why did there need to be—

Travis: Mostly, so that you guys would have to say these names out loud a lot.

Justin: Okay, Griffin, go.

Griffin: Snoop Dog.

Justin: Calvin Broadus [broad-us].

Griffin: I think it's Broadus [bro-dis].

Travis: Now, that's the real name, that's not the name I sent you, Justin. These are not the names I sent you.

Justin: Yeah, I know, I just— I wanted to say that's our— we're already in nickname territory.

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Okay—

Travis: Stage name is different from nickname, Justin! Stage name is different from nickname.

Griffin: Another confusing point that sort of undermines the whole point of the whole exercise.

Travis: Kind of feels like you guys aren't buying in. Keep going.

Justin: Yeah, buy— Griffin, it feels to me like you're not buying it. I'm buying— Travis, what you say— like, I'm buying it.

Travis: You're buying it.

Griffin: Okay. Snoop Dog. And then Justin says what the answer is?

Travis: Just keep going.

Griffin: Do I get to play?

Travis: Keep going Griffin.

Justin: I don't know what the answer is, but I'm gonna say... I think it's Funk Doctor Spock.

Griffin: Gen of BTS. Which is Behind The Scenes.

Justin: I'm gonna say Todd.

Griffin: Okay. Drake?

Justin: That's Champagne Poppy.

Griffin: Red Man... or Redman.

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: Mr. Shoulders. [chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles] I think what's happened here...

Justin: [hysterical laughter]

Griffin: I want you to know something, Travis. This bit is a profound success for the two people that you are currently— this bit is a deep exploration on the craft work—

Justin: It's a meditation. It's like an exploration.

Griffin: It's a meditation on the craft of developing bits for this podcast.

Travis: Yeah, it's Dada, baby. This is Dada.

Griffin: But it's good for me— it's good for me and Justin `cause it's like, this is— you are doing workplace humor for me and Justin right now.

Travis: Yes, there we go.

Justin: But... but here's the thing— here's the thing that you have to understand about Travis. Travis has the courage to take a bit into Skunkworks.

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Right.

Justin: And the only way to know if a skunk works is to do it with us, his brothers.

Griffin: Yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah.

Justin: And that people don't get. These aren't the segments...

Travis: No.

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: The segment is Travis'—

Griffin: This is the machine—

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Yeah, it's... and he— sometimes, we tell him to take the bits to the wet works. And then as he does it, he scoops it up in a little cup and then takes it outside. And then he's like, "You're free."

Travis: Okay—

Griffin: But then it does come back into the house.

Justin: Sometimes, we ask him to get Anton Chigurh in to come and use his bolt gun. [chuckles] Just use—

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: Yeah.

Travis: Okay, so, Champagne Bobby is Drake. That is correct.

Justin: There's a— there— can I tell you— can I— did you want— it says here, "Go behind the answer and tell everybody how you knew that." I very recently—

Griffin: That's crazy, 'cause my email just has like four words on it.

Justin: I recently watched an Episode of Atlanta, where they were at a party that were— she was at a party that she thought Drake was at. And the episode was called Champagne.

Travis: Now, who is Funk Doctor Spock?

Griffin: Funk Doctor Spock is—

Justin: I must have gotten that one wrong, right?

Griffin: Can I do— can I say this, I know a little bit about three of the names on this list. I do not know about Gen of BTS. So, I'm gonna say that's Funk Doctor Spock.

Travis: Incorrect. Red Man is Funk Doctor Spock.

Griffin: Shoot.

Travis: Now, who is Worldwide Handsome?

Griffin: Gen of BTS.

Travis: Correct.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: Who is Todd?

Griffin: Who is Todd?

Travis: Who is Todd?

Griffin: Snoop Dog?

Travis: Snoop Dog, yes! In 2014, Snoop Dog created an alternate white guy

persona named Todd! [chuckles]

Justin: God, that's good.

Griffin: Why, what was that for?

Travis: So...

Griffin: Was that for his Twitch channel?

Travis: I have no idea, bud. Now, one left. Mr. Shoulders.

Griffin: Drake.

Travis: No! Mr. Shoulders is another nickname for Gen of BTS!

Justin: Wow!

Griffin: I guess I got— well, now I got google these fuckin' warlocks. Let's

see...

Travis: And I wanna say a special thanks to Shay, Jaryd and Quinn for

sending those all in. I thought that went seamlessly. Seamlessly!

Griffin: Wow. Wow! Yeah!

Justin: I can't look at these... I can't look at these fuckin' kids in BTS,

they're gorgeous.

Travis: So gorgeous!

Griffin: Look at these shoulders.. These shoulders...

Travis: Oh, yeah! Oh my god.

Griffin: You could— you could— you could— wow! You could hang laundry

from these shoulders.

Travis: You could use it as a level!

Justin: He does.

Griffin: Jesus Christ... Jesus Christ!

Travis: Them's some shoulders.

Justin: These guys are handsome!

Travis: What is Gen's shoulders width? 60 centimeters!

Griffin: I would not doubt that anybody on— in BTS is handsome. It's just the— these shoulders are so huge, y'all.

Justin: Yeah, and there's a— can I say something else, just to— there's a lot of pictures of these guys online.

Travis: Yeah, people really like looking at 'em.

Justin: People like pictures of these guys.

Griffin: That's cool. Yeah.

Travis: I get it, man!

Griffin: Cool lookin' dude? Yeah! These shoulders are—

Justin: I only know butter, but it slaps. Right?

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: I mean, it's good. Every time I—

Travis: I love butter!

Griffin: Butter slaps. Hey, can we do a question?

Justin: I'd love that, Griff. Six episodes left, by the way until the devil

comes here—

Travis: Oh, yeah. Yeah, yeah, yeah, indeed.

Justin: I just wanna mention it. My office—

Griffin: We gotta stop doing the show.

Justin: Gotta stop doing the show before the devil— man, wouldn't that be

a twist?

Griffin: yeah!

Justin: That would be such a twist! Like, guys, we can't do it! It's a line we

can't cross.

Griffin: We could just put it in the— we could put it in the no-no box with

episode 420?

Justin: Oh, man.

Griffin: And then just one day, we just knock those out.

Justin: My office has an— there were— there was a certain segment of people— most people probably didn't mind that. There was a certain

segment of people that it bothered a whole bunch. I'm sure—

Travis: Which one?

Justin: 'Cause there wasn't many. The people that—where we skipped a

number.

Travis: Oh, yeah.

Griffin: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Justin: I think that' probably pretty irritating, I would guess. Okay.

Griffin: Sure.

Justin: "My office has an open floor plan of cubicles. Whenever anyone

sneezes, it's met with a chorus of enthusiastic bless yous."

Travis: Yes.

Justin: "Today, someone sneezed in the bathroom. Should I have blessed them, or do we ignore any bathroom sound making as an unspoken rule?" Let's go, that's a good one.

Travis: Thank you.

Griffin: That's a great one, actually.

Justin: That's a great one. And that's from Sneezing Season in Philadelphia. And boy howdy, is it ever.

Griffin: Oh boy. Yeah, the best part of—

Travis: What— I'm gonna— can I throw this out to you, 'cause I... this is what first came to mind when I read this question. Griffin: Have you ever blessed— Travis, have you— I know that you're not like a church guy, but have you ever blessed anyone? It's gotta be... it's from the spear— when you give a— listen, guys...

Travis: Yeah?

Justin: Yeah? Please.

Griffin: When you give a blessing, it has to come from inside. It can't come from up here where you're like, "How should I say this good?" Bless you! It's gotta be from the— like, the—

Travis: From the hip, yeah.

Griffin: Hip.

Justin: From the hip, straight from the hip.

Griffin: But it's gotta be also from the heart, so—

Travis: The hip, the heart and the head? No head.

Griffin: Not the head. No head, just hip and heart. And so, when someone sneezes and you wanna give them— a lot of people don't take this seriously enough.

Travis: Yeah, that's true.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: When I give you a blessing, you'll know.

Travis: Ooh!

Griffin: You'll remember. You'll definitely feel and experience it in the way that I intended.

Travis: You might wake up with strange bruising.

Griffin: That's part of the blessing.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: I would love— I would—

Travis: Griffin is correct in that you can't have a second's hesitation. Right, if they sneeze—

Justin: Mm-hm.

Griffin: Bless you.

Travis: And a—

Griffin: 'Cause then they can be like, "That was weird, but I guess it was reflexive."

Travis: Right.

Griffin: They sneezed and they just sort of— yeah.

Justin: Plus, at the— the moments after you sneeze, everybody's sort of like, "Whoa, whoa!"

Travis: Yeah, right?

Justin: You wouldn't notice, really.

Travis: You're barely there.

Justin: You wouldn't have a second to think like who said what or anything.

Griffin: Human instinct is as such that if they didn't reflexively say bless you, that would be weird. The ball, my friend, is in their court, of do you say thanks when you're in the bathroom stall.

Travis: Ooh!

Griffin: 'Cause now, that's premeditated. Unless you live in the Midwest, in which case, it's never premeditated and it is again like a reflexive sort of instinct. But do you say like, "That was weird that someone blessed me through a bathroom stall. They can't even see me, so how's the blessing energy supposed to even get here?"

Justin: It's just a nice way of people saying, "Hey, I'm here."

Travis: Yeah!

Justin: I mean, you didn't have to do that—

Griffin: I'm here for you.

Justin: I worked out of my house for nigh on 15 years now. I would give anything to sneeze and just hear a voice. Just hear somebody say like, "Good job." Or like, "I got you." Or like— not a— not a weird one... Maybe that's kind of what the 'bless you' is like, normal.

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Normal sneeze.

Justin: Good sneeze—

Travis: That's a thing all humans do. That's a thing. We do that.

Justin: We all do that.

Travis: It's fine, don't worry. Sometimes, I say it when people fart in the restroom, you know what I mean? Just to let 'em know—

Griffin: When you have to be-

Travis: You're safe here.

Griffin: You gotta be so— you gotta be super careful, 'cause some people's

farts sounds like sneezes and vice versa.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: Yeah.

Travis: But I think if you fart in the toilet room, which is the safest room to do it, we should be allowed to say bless you for that too.

Griffin: Which is such a like... That doesn't make any sense, that like it's okay to do it there.

Justin: Don't do a bit. I'm gonna ask a question— I'm gonna ask you a question right now. If I said to you, "Hey, you can't say bless you. But you have to communicate what you're communicating when you say bless you." What would you say instead after someone sneezed?

Griffin: I would say—

Justin: How would you— don't do a joke! How would you— how would you—

Griffin: No, no, this is real.

Justin: Okay.

Griffin: So, you sneeze.

Justin: Ah-choo!

Griffin: Heard, chef.

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: That's pretty good! Okay, honest to god, this is what popped into

my head-

Justin: Wait, hold on, ah-choo!

Travis: Nice one!

Griffin: No... that's not what a blessing is.

Justin: You don't always mean nice one, though. And you're not actually

blessing the person. What you're saying is like—

Griffin: We all know the— we all know the fuckin' etymology of it too, where it like your heart stops and so you don't want people— but that's not a fun—

Travis: I think it—

Griffin: I'm saying this for all the people who are now frustrated again by the— [chuckles] for the second time in this episode.

Travis: it might just be like 'acknowledged.' Right? It might just be like

'acknowledged.' Right?

Justin: Sneeze. Travis, Sneeze.

Travis: Ah-choo!

Justin: If I don't say this it's weird.

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: Ooh?

Justin: That's it, right? "If I don't say this, it's weird."

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: That's it!

Travis: "Ah-choo!"

"And also with you."

Griffin: [chuckles] Yes.

Justin: It's just simply like if I don't do it, you'll be mad. So, I've gotta do

something.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: And this is— and I'm not a— I know it's crazy— I know if I had to pull something to say to break the tension, I know it's wild that I would pull kind of a religious thing, considering everything else in my life. But that is what I have pulled to say to you. Bless you.

Travis: It is— there's a lot of like call and response things in like society and culture that if someone doesn't do, it's not like bad, but it is like, oh— Like leaving someone hanging for a high five, right. But this is like someone unintentionally, like as a reflex response raise their hand for a high five, and you don't high five them back.

Griffin: I guess if I were to go through my own internal thought process, the meaning of bless you, for me, when it's not coming from the heart and the hip, and it's not like an actual blessing where I like give some of my religion power to them.

Justin: Sure.

Griffin: Is like... Justin, go ahead and sneeze.

Justin: Ah-choo!

Griffin: You made a loud sound and it didn't scare me, but I forgive you.

Travis: Oh, yeah, yeah, yeah!

Justin: Nice.

Griffin: I forgive you.

Travis: I forgive you.

Griffin: That was a loud sound you just made. It's okay, though.

Travis: I'll allow it.

Griffin: I'll allow the loud sound you made. And I was scared for second 'cause I thought that like some loud killer had gotten into the room. Anytime you hear someone wind up a sneeze, to really let one rip, there is a millisecond in your mind where you're like, "Somebody's screaming... Somebody's screaming."

Travis: Mm-hm!

Griffin: Right now.

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Near me, somebody's screaming. And a lot of stuff in my body is producing sort of hormones and stuff to get my body ready to fight or run, or...

Travis: Especially if they take a big run up at it.

Griffin: 'Ah!' Yeah. 'Ah!' And for second it's like someone's yelling 'cause they're being hurt or they're in terrible danger, which means I am too. And so, when the chew comes out, a bless you is almost like, oh, thank god.

Travis: Ah.

Griffin: Oh, thank god.

Travis: The relief.

Justin: How about another question?

Travis: Now, listen, this one's long, Justin, but bear with me. There's a twist

in it that I love.

Justin: Ooh!

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: "I'm a research assistant in a psychology lab. We bring in human subjects and put them through different situations so we can make conclusions about how the mind works. Since I've begun working here about a year ago, there's a problem— there's been a frog hat sitting on a coat rack in the lobby. It's a very cute hat, it looks crocheted and it has little frog eyes on it. I look at it every day, and recently, I've considered taking it. The problem is, there's a camera watching the lobby at all times. I'm not worried about getting yelled at for stealing it, I'm worried the hat is a trap. What if this is a psychology experiment and I've become the subject? What if the entire point of the frog hat is to lure someone in? What if by taking this hat, I reassure them that all humans are inherently selfish stealers. What do I do, brothers? Should I just take the hat and become the subject of my peer's experimentation, or must I endure the torture of passing by this abandoned frog hat daily?" That's from Disastrously Distressed in Delaware.

Travis: Now, I want you guys to really think about it, really— 'cause it occurred to me, the specificity of a crocheted frog hat, right— if you're the person who owns that hat and you bring it in and you put it on the coat rack, what are the odds that you walk out of that building, unaware that—

Griffin: You passed it several times.

Travis: Right?

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Yeah. No. This is definitely a honey pot.

Travis: Like, that you never thought like, "Oh, I'm walking out the front door of the building not wearing my crocheted frog hat." Right, you'd notice?!

Justin: Yeah. That's part of your identity I think at that point, right. It's—

Travis: Right.

Justin: That's a key part of your look. It would be like Doug Funnie hanging brain. [chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles] What?

Justin: You know— [chuckles] like, no, Doug—

Travis: Yeah, if Doug Funnie walks out without his khaki shorts and he's going commando underneath, 'cause we all know he did.

Justin: Right, thank you. It was a funnier way of saying he doesn't have his pants.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: It's like a funnier way to say—

Griffin: Is that why Clam Man wore his underwear on the outside—

Travis: 'Cause he wasn't wearing it to begin with, yeah.

Griffin: Okay, I get it. I get it now.

Justin: One thing you could try is just announcing loudly that you know it's a 'xperiment.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: "The experiment has failed!"

Justin: "It's a 'xperiment and I know about it!" [chuckles]

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: "Hey, guys? Guys! 'Xperiment over! I know about it!"

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: Immunity! Immunity!

Justin: I mean, the data is fucked! The data is fucked! Your data's fucked, I know about the 'xperiment!"

Griffin: [laughs] How many— how many times a day when you are enrolled at this How to Get Away with Murder style competitive 'xperiment school.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: Are you allowed— are you allowed to just sort of blank fire, "This is a 'xperiment!" And be wrong?

Justin: If someone that's—

Travis: Oh, you get three.

Justin: If someone that's attractive for you asks to kiss you if you meet 'em at a certain place, as you're walking in, you're like— under your breath you're like, "I know this is 'xperiment. I know this is a 'xperiment."

Travis: "I know this is 'xperiment."

Griffin: Yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah.

Travis: "I know it's a 'xperiment."

Justin: It's like, you can't get me! I know it's a— if you see a chocolate bar on the ground? No way! 'Xperiment, right there!

Griffin: 'Xperiment!

Travis: Well, not even that, just fuckin' small talk if somebody's like, "Yeah, what did you think about class today? It seemed a little unnecessary, huh?" And you like, "No, experiment. Experiment. You're trying to get feedback from me!"

Justin: "I actually think Trump's starting to make a lot of sense!" 'Xperiment!

Griffin: 'Xperiment!

Travis: 'Xperiment!

Justin: It's a 'xperiment!

Griffin: Nice try, though!

Justin: You're not gonna peer pressure me into this 'xperiment.

Travis: Hey, but good— hey, good on you for still believing that the 'xperiments end when the door— at the doors and walls of this building. 'Cause man, if I were you, I'd just assume they've infiltrated every aspect of my life. So, good for you to not let it extend beyond that. Because pretty soon, you know, you go somewhere and they're like, "Paper or plastic?" And you're like, "Xperiment! 'Xperiment! No, no, no, no, no, no, no! Ha-ha-ha!"

Justin: No, no, no, no, no.

Griffin: What would you— what would happen if you fuckin' took the hat and then like there's a poster hanging on the wall that is hollowed out behind it, and John Quiñones just jumps out.

Justin: "Got you, mother fucker!"

Griffin: And he's like, "This was the longest one yet. But I fucking got you,

dog."

Justin: [chuckles] Worth it!

Griffin: People have been asking, "Where's that show, John?" I said, "I'm on a long grift right now, guys."

Travis: "I'm deeply committed!"

Justin: She's looking at the hat more every day!

Griffin: Every single day.

Travis: And then you say, "Yeah, man, it sat there for a year and the school year was about to end, and I figured they'd throw it away if nobody took it, so I took it." And Quiñones was like, "Well, damn. Yeah, no, that's fine, actually. That was a— that was cool thing to do— ah, fuck, yeah. You did it."

Griffin: You gotta be careful at 'xperiment school. Sometimes, you'll see something and you'll be like, "'Xperiment!" And then the red light will flash to let you know you were wrong.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: You can also just say, "Quiñones?"

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: And then if John Quiñones is there like doing one of his 'xperiments-slash-pranks, then that also nullifies that.

Travis: What if—

Griffin: You can get huge points for that one.

Travis: What if the 'xperiment is that it's like testing to see if anyone's brave enough to take the cool hat?

Griffin: Okay, so it's a courage thing?

Travis: Yeah, it's a courage 'xperiment!

Griffin: Wow, Travis, when you put it that way, all acts of theft are pretty courageous.

Travis: Yeah!

Griffin: Like, "What are you doing? That's not yours? You courageous little scamp."

Travis: But you're not taking it from anybody. At this point, it's been a year! That hat has been abandoned, no one's come back for that hat. Are you gonna let that hat sit there unloved? Unwanted? This is a compassion 'xperiment.

Griffin: When I was robbed at gunpoint at the GameStop for a PlayStation 3, I remember looking at the person who was doing that to me and saying, "That's very— that's— this is very— you must be pretty scared right now. This is a hugely courageous act that you are— that you are performing right now."

Travis: Now, Griffin, I would take it and turn it and say it's a little bit different 'cause no one's wearing this hat and the reader's not like— the listener's not like, "I'm gonna approach it with a knife to get this hat." [chuckles] This is more like if you had stack of PlayStation 5s sitting out in the rain for a year, and the sun and the wind—

Griffin: Okay, yeah, that's is a better— yeah, that is a better way of doing this. Here's what you can do, make the 'xperiment on them!

Travis: Yes!

Justin: Oh!

Griffin: You walk up to the hat, make sure you're on camera, and you cry for like a couple minutes every day. And then if they don't say anything, after a week you look up at the camera and be like, "This was actually the 'xperiment."

Travis: 'Xperiment.

Griffin: "I took it over. You didn't ask why I was crying at this frog hat you were trying to get me to steal."

Justin: [chuckles] "It's my 'xperiment that you're in now."

Griffin: "And here's my hypothesis, and I have proven it with a control group and other peer-reviewed research, is that Michael is an asshole."

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: [laughs]

Griffin: Can we got to the Money Zone?

Justin: Yeah, I'd love to. Come with me. Come on. Come on!

[theme music plays]

Travis: Squarespace. Yeah, let it sink in. Don't be scared.

Griffin: Soak in that.

Travis: Come in here. It's been too long since we all just allowed ourselves to sit in the Squarespace together, you know what I mean? Sometimes, we do jokes, right.

Griffin: So, I don't think that we can just sort of—

Travis: But as a business move from Big Giant Head. This was a McElroy—

Griffin: It's a business expensive.

Justin: Strategic investment, it's business.

Griffin: Strategic business.

Travis: It's biz-def, right. And the possibilities of what we could do with

disney.dad are—

Griffin: We need to now settle within the next three days, because you've now said it on our podcast that gets broadcasted out to the world.

Travis: Ah, fuck, you're right. All right, anyways, thank you Squarespace for providing the tools to develop disney.dad into what I assume is going to be a new phase of our careers.

Griffin: Phase four.

Travis: Phase four. [chuckles] Now with a new Falcon and the Winter Soldier Series.

Justin: [chuckles]

Travis: You're gonna love this shit, it's great. We're bringing it back, season two. This time, they fight Loki.

Griffin: Honda Vision. And this is the new one that's gonna make us a lot of money. [chuckles]

Travis: Yeah, E-Honda, drives a Honda, it's pretty great, you're gonna love it.

Griffin: [chuckles] It's really funny!

Travis: It's a good bit, it goes for 18 episodes and a movie.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: I don't wanna talk about this anymore. Please one of you do it. I'm... I'm off the rails.

Griffin: Yeah, I mean, you haven't really said a single copy point yet. So, we are stopping— starting from scratch here. Travis: Yes.

Travis: I've noticed that. But not at first, Griffin. I didn't notice it at first.

Griffin: Yeah, sure, no—

Justin: You're not even that old!

Travis: Yeah, if he starts doing that stuff now? 175, easy.

Justin: [laughs] I wish— that's what he says to Biden, "I wish I had gotten to you in your 40s, man."

Travis: Ah, man!

Justin: "I would've kept you alive forever!"

Griffin: [chuckles] "I'll be straight, man, I did not think you were ever gonna win president! I'll be straight with you, pal!"

Travis: "I would've started earlier!"

Justin: "I thought you were too old, honestly. But—"

Griffin: "Honestly, that was my whole thing. The age and just sort of the way that you ran, I was like, no fuckin' way, dog. But I should've gotten in early, pal."

Travis: "But hey, man, one term and out. Right?"

"What's that?"

Griffin: "What's that, again?!"

Travis: "Oh, god, I gotta step it up! Hold on."

Griffin: Holy shit!

Justin: [chuckles]

Travis: "Let me go get the plutonium!"

Justin: [chuckles] There was— so, there was a doctor that when he heard that news did have to stand up and walk out of the room!

Travis: Ugh!

Justin: Like, "Argh!" [chuckles]

Travis: "Take my name off it. Take my name off it."

Griffin: "Somebody call the secretary of nanotech. We need to elevate the game a little bit." So, showing off with subtle motions. "Do a face wipe. Is it a bit hot out today? Wipe your face with the bottom of your shirt to show off the ab muscles."

Travis: Oh, yeah, yeah, yeah.

Griffin: "Make sure you have them flexed before you lift your shirt."

Justin: Mm-hm, key.

Travis: That is important.

Griffin: Rookie mistakes. "Be careful you don't get a lot of sweat on a cotton T-shirt, or else everyone will notice a big wet spot when you lower your top." Some people like that.

Justin: Yeah. That's some people's thing.

Griffin: "This move works well in the gym when you don't have a towel handy." Or... anywhere. If you don't have a towel handy, you could just hit 'em with a... whoop!

Travis: [silly trumpet-like squeak]

Griffin: They do it with their mouth, too. They're like, "What do you want? A million dollars and be a prince? Sure." [silly trumpet-like squeak]

Travis: Not enough people use conjunctions in their wishes, by the way. "I wish for a million dollars and..."

"Ah, fuck!" [chuckles]

Griffin: Yeah, you gotta be so careful with genies, guys.

Travis: Yeah, thank you!

Griffin: "Pretend to stretch." That's interesting to me.

Travis: Why not really stretch?

Griffin: Yeah, that's interesting to me 'cause I don't know how to do that without accidentally doing it.

Travis: Yeah, right? Just really stretch, it's good for you. Flexibility is important.

Griffin: My lifestyle is as such that there are many things that stretch my muscles and bones out that maybe don't qualify as that for other more active people. Sometimes a stretch can be picking a towel off the ground.

Travis: Mm-hm.

Griffin: "Hm! Good stretch. I definitely limbered up with that one."

Travis: Griffin, did you just get a fitness notification on your watch while doing this show?

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: No, I did get a doctor's appointment notification.

Travis: [laughs] "Hey, man. It's me, Anthony. Noticed your blood pressure was rising while you were sitting there in your chair. You need to come in or..."

Justin: "Griffin, it's me, your muscle doctor. They're looking so wild, man."

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: "Almost too big, I'm worried about it ripping the skin. Do you need to come in?"

Griffin: A lot of people also don't realize that you can do the shirt fold up and then fold your arms over it to showcase more than one goods at the same time. 'Cause if I— if somebody sees me flexing my calves, they're like, "Yeah, so what? You have... you have calves that are great."

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Everybody's got that one body part that like kicks ass for whatever reason. You gotta show 'em at least two to let 'em know the kind of work you've been doing in the gym. Abs and delts. Trelts and bis.

Travis: Perfect. And can I throw this out, this is one move always works for me, right.

Griffin: Yeah.

target audience. For extra flexing, keep your fingers interlocked and flip your hands around so your palms face upward."

"Yeah! So, I was at the ol'... I was at the market—"

Travis: I don't think it's like what you're doing, Griffin. And no offense, but you look... pained when you do that thing.

Griffin: Yeah, well, that was a terrible stretch that I just did. And a tear. Sometimes those two become the same thing also.

Travis: Mm-hm.

Griffin: But it's like a casual like folding the hands behind the head—

Travis: Like this?

Griffin: And like, "Yeah, so, I was at the market yesterday—"

Travis: "Whoa, yeah! Look at that! Hey, everybody, look at my muscle!"

Griffin: "I was carrying three watermelons— " Travis, you can't actually flex—

Travis: Justin, look at my muscle!

Griffin: Hold on, Trav. Hold on, wait, wait, stop, stop, stop, stop, stop. You can't actually flex your muscles during this bit, Travis.

Justin: [chuckles]

Travis: Oh, I'm not. Sorry, that's just... I guess that's just—

Griffin: Travis, it sucks.

Travis: Some kind of twitch?

Justin: It's just us here—

Travis: Yeah—

Justin: He does it on TikTok— he does it on TikTok—

Griffin: It sucks. It sucks that you're doing this right now.

Travis: Argh! It's just, I got this pain! Right— argh!

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: Hurts so bad. Sorry, what were you guys saying?

Griffin: I posted a photo of me on the Tron Lightcycle Run Ride from Disney World, that the shadows of the virtual playscape were as such that they—the way they crested over my arm meat was exceptionally flattering.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: And I don't post a lot—

Justin: A lie! A lie! We can say, a lie.

Griffin: I don't post a lot—

Travis: Yeah, it was natural photoshopping. Go on.

Griffin: I don't post a lot on the Gram. And so, people I feel like don't have a great idea of what I look like at any given time. And I love that. That's great for me. Travis: Oh yeah, I saw this!

Justin: Did you see this? Yeah.

Travis: Yeah, man.

Justin: Joey—

Griffin: Is the Lawrences? No!

Justin: It's the Lawrences. Joey, Matt and Andy, your friends.

Griffin: They got Andy?!

Travis: Yeah, man!

Justin: They got three brothers and they're coming for our lunch!

Travis: And they all look more attractive than us!

Justin: They all look great. Their podcast is— they— their— and a thing called PodCo., I guess is their network. Which has a thing called Even More Stevens that features Christy Carlson Romano and Beans, on the podcast! That's what— that's what we're up— they could get Beans— they're one degree from Beans, these Lawrence brothers, okay?

Griffin: Guys!

Justin: I heard—

Travis: Oh, listen, if you guys wanna come on, we can help you promote your little podcast, if you guys wanna come on.

Justin: Get at us! Get at us. We're with Joel Begleiter at CAA. Get at us, bros.

Griffin: Get at us, Lawrence, the band.

Travis: Ooh!

Griffin: That could confuse a lot of people and be very good—

Justin: That would be good.
