

MBMBaM 667: Face 2 Face: I'll Miss You, Little Sailor Man

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Intro (Bob Ball): The McElroy brothers are not experts!

[crowd cheers]

Intro (Bob Ball): And their advice should never be followed! Oh, Travis insists he's a sexpert... but if there's a degree on his wall, I haven't seen it. Also, this show isn't for kids, which I mention only so the babies out there will know how cool they are for listening. What's up, you cool babies?!

[crowd cheers]

[theme song, "My Life Is Better With You" by Montaigne plays]

Justin: Hello, everybody! And welcome to My Brother, My Brother and Me, an advice show for the modren era! I'm your oldest brother, Justin McElroy!

[crowd cheers]

Travis: I'm your middlest brother, Travis McElroy!

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: And I'm your sweet, baby brother and 30 Under 30 Media Luminary, Corporal Griffin McElroy.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: And we are so happy to finally be here in Raleigh, North Carolina! Thank you for having us!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: This venue, can I say, is beautiful. Is it newer? It feels newer to me.

Travis: Newer than what?

Justin: What?

Travis: Because we play in a lot of like vaudeville houses from 1920.

Griffin: [chuckles]

Justin: Okay, here's the thing, when we go into 'em, we always have to look around and be like, "Oh, it's beautiful. Wow." But it's old. [chuckles] And you go back and it's all old and small and bad, because they made it 100 years ago and nobody cared.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: New places, though? [chef's kiss]

Travis: Ah.

Justin: Big rooms back there.

Travis: Big bathrooms.

Justin: Big, big, big rooms.

Travis: Big, comfy bathrooms to hide your sins.

Griffin: [chuckles] Yeah, sure.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: I was in the orchestra dressing room. That was just mine. I had six toilets, no problem.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Strangely, all facing each other. Acoustics? Sublime.

Griffin: Weird, yeah.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: You know, and it's weird, Travis still found me to talk to me, even though I'd hidden myself, like the Hunchback of Notre Dame, in my bell tower.

Travis: This is the problem of Justin's pre-show, is I wanna pretend like other people don't exist. And my pre-show is, I wanna bother my brother.
[chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Yeah! It is a bad loop that we have where there are two incompletable ways of preparing the energy we require to do this for you.

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: That's why our live shows are always so disappointing.

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: This being no exception.

Travis: I was telling Justin backstage, I was talking about concerts I've been to recently. And I'm very sad about this, I went to Awesome Con last week in D.C. with Griffin and it meant missing a Matchbox 20 concert that I bought tickets for a year prior.

Justin: Whew...

[crowd exclaims]

Justin: That's tough. That's tough.

Travis: I know, it was tough. Listen, sometimes, when you're an adult—

Griffin: Is that it?

Travis: No, but the rest of it was—

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: I was gonna say, that's not very funny.

Travis: I went to a—I was talking about a Dave Matthews Band concert I went to, legit. And my favorite thing was between each song, he would talk to the audience. And basically, everything he said was the most awkward like hippy, uncle thing like, "I think my nephew and niece and you know, other people smoke weed. And I want them to know I support it, but I'm going to be funny about it." So, he would say stuff like, "I hope everybody out there is real relaxed this evening."

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Or at one point he said, "Smells like you all are having a great time."

Griffin: Now, but wait a minute, that could mean anything.

Justin: How many more clever ways did Dave Matthews have to come up with to ask you all for weed, before one person acquiesced and gave him some weed?

Travis: No, because here's the thing, when he did his encore, he played one song and then left the stage. And by the time we exited the venue, the tour busses were leaving. I don't think anyone gave him weed and he was upset.

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: "How many times did I have to ask?"

Justin: [chuckles] Wow, we are so happy to be here with you. Thank you for having us. We are an advice show.

Griffin: That's true.

Justin: And what we do is we take your questions and we turn like alchemy-like into wisdom.

Travis: But first...

Justin: Damn it.

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: That went on long enough that I thought we were gonna skate past what Travis told us was gonna happen, but here we are.

Travis: So, for a while, I've been doing—

Griffin: What did Travis—oh, yeah.

Travis: I've been doing a bit on the show called Abnimals.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Thank you. And I was doing some Abnimals research and I came across an intriguing—

Griffin: In the lab.

Travis: In the lab, with my robot, Trav Bot 5000, who looks sexily like me.

Griffin: [chuckles] What?

Travis: Don't worry about it. And I was going through Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles villains.

Griffin: Okay, I was gonna say, that's dicey territory. Their shells are ripped, but...

Travis: I came across an entry and so the...

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: There's a story—

Travis: That was Liz. Liz did my makeup tonight. Hey, Liz. Let's hear it.

Griffin: There's a story behind that, yes.

Travis: And so, Paul, if you can pull it up, please? It's Hitler.

[crowd exclaims]

Travis: So, we're gonna play a little bit... For the Millions. It's a—

Griffin: For the Millions?

Justin: No. No, no, no, no, it doesn't say 'for the millions.' It can't say that?

Travis: That's a picture of Raphael pinching Hitler in the face, that says, "Chok," C-H-O-K.

Griffin: The sound it makes when you punch a Hitler.

Travis: And he's saying, "... For the millions." I'm going to—

Griffin: [chuckles] No. Okay, you—

Justin: For the millions? Are we sure on that?

Griffin: Okay, you can judge that, Justin! You can judge that all you want, but if you turn a corner and Hitler's there and you're like, "Ah! Whoo-pa!" And you have no time to think of what to say?

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles]

Griffin: I think 'for the millions' is kind of middle of the road of the things you can yell when you—

Travis: And it makes his message clear.

Griffin: Yeah, sure.

Travis: You know what he's talking about.

Griffin: You know which side he's on, for sure!

Travis: If he had said like, "For the Doug!" You be like, "What the fuck are you—why are you—"

Griffin: Or what if he had just yelled, "Pizza time! Pzz-shew!"

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: I'd go with, "Third Reich, you're out." And then—

Travis: That's good! But you had time!

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: You had time!

Justin: Just now?

Travis: Okay, I'm going to read you the—

Justin: I had—let's say this, I didn't have as long as the person writing the comic book.

Travis: That's fair.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: I'm going to read you the entry, the description of their encounter, and I'm gonna have you guys guess the end. Okay, biography—

Griffin: Oh my god, I just read it!

Travis: "Hitler's brain was still functioning decades after World War II, and powered a time machine. Obtaining a robot body, Hitler travels back to World War II to find his past self. The Hitler from the future was destroyed by the Turtles, while the past Hitler tries to get the brain, only to be punched by Raphael."

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: See above. "Hitler points a gun at the Turtles, just as they were about to leave." Leonardo convinces Hitler what?

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Okay, is it Leonardo of Ninja Turtles fame?

Travis: Yes, convinces Hitler—

Justin: Convinces Adolf Hitler to give up on... the business. I mean, I don't know... you know, the... bad stuff, and just become an artist, full-time.

Travis: Hey, you're coming down pretty hard on Hitler there, are you sure about this?

Griffin: [chuckles] Okay.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: I just don't wanna—I mean, his job—he quit his job—quit his job.

Griffin: Quit your job.

Justin: And become a—the war job! And then become an artist.

Griffin: Pshew... that actually might be it... I'm gonna say to stop... to stop being such a fuckin' A-hole about everything.

Travis: Oh, man, you guys, no. Paul, reveal? Leonardo convinces Hitler that he is in hell and they are demons that have come for his brains. They told the dictator that they already have his soul. Hitler shoots himself in the head...

[crowd exclaims and chuckles]

Travis: So the Turtles can't recover his brain.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: I mean, they don't call 'em the world's most fearsome fighting team for nothing, guys. That's an advanced-level maneuver.

Travis: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Whew!

Griffin: Okay, all right... Demons kick in the door to your bedroom. They're like, "We got you. We got you. Don't like... we got you."

Justin: We got you.

Griffin: "But you get to pick. We get your brain or we get your soul. You get to choose." I'm gonna go brain every time, 'cause—

Travis: No, no, no, they told the dictator that they already have his soul.

Griffin: That's what I'm saying! Ah, man, this is wild. Why did they write this, Travis?

Travis: I don't know!

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: I have to assume from the art style and the general drugged-up nature of it, it was the '90s.

Griffin: Yeah, sure.

Travis: Whatever. [chuckles]

Griffin: Sure.

Travis: At that point, everybody loved it!

Justin: Okay, okay, okay, I do have to ask, was their no point during the adventure leading up to punching Hitler where Raphael thought, "I should take off my—"

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "This isn't... this doesn't feel right."

Travis: I gotta—wait, yeah, let's zoom in. 'Cause I think it says Turtle Land.

Griffin: Turtle... well, hold on...

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: I think some letters are missing. I do think it says Turtle Island, maybe.

Travis: Oh, maybe!

Justin: It's—yeah, wow.

Griffin: Cool. Thanks for sharing that, Travis.

Travis: Anyways, that's the beginning of our show.

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Let's do a question.

Justin: "A couple of weeks ago, I spilled a whopping 32 ounces of soup in my cool car. Most of it going down into the difficult to reach mechanism and upholstery under the seat." I mean, that's how soup, you know?

Griffin: That's how does, it moves into—

Justin: It's gonna go down, every single time. "I cleaned it up pretty dang good, but my car still smells like it carries the sniffles. How do I make my car stop smelling like soup?" That's from Grandma's Famous Cure for the Common Cold Mobile. P.S., it says here, this interesting. "The North Carolina summer sun famously makes cars very hot inside."

Travis: Oh?

Justin: So, that is fascinating because—

Griffin: Oh, wow!

Travis: That's a game changer, right there.

Justin: In my land, the sun does not make hot. So, I...

Griffin: No!

Travis: No, sun make—

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: In D.C., sun makes in car cold. It's weird, but—

Justin: It's a weird, kinky thing about North Carolina. Sun hot.

Travis: In Ohio? In Ohio? Sun make car wet.

Griffin: Whoa?!

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: In D.C., moon hot!

Justin: What kind of soup?

Question Asker: Chicken noodle!

Griffin: Chicken noodle, that's what we figured from the context.

Justin: Thank you. Okay, we assumed backstage, it was chicken noodle, but I'm happy to know.

Travis: Ooh, boy! Ooh, boy, that a chunky—that a chunky soup.

Griffin: That's so much soup. Why'd you have so much soup, though?

Travis: Yeah, 32 ounces, that's like 2 pounds of soup.

Griffin: Do you run a—

Travis: Is that how—wait, it's different ounces, isn't it? [chuckles]

Griffin: Did you say it was two pounds of soup?

Travis: Yeah!

Justin: Yeah, it's not—

Travis: 16 ounces make a pound?

Griffin: Probably around there, yeah.

Justin: Well, that does not track, Trav, but...

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Lots of different weights in liquid.

Travis: It was a meter of soup.

Justin: It was a yard.

Griffin: [chuckles]

Justin: A yard of soup.

Travis: One stone of soup. [chuckles]

Justin: We couldn't decide backstage. We got into a little—and I think that maybe this would be a good BuzzFeed quiz, is like, what would be the worst part to get out of your car?

Griffin: Oh, yeah.

Justin: Is it the... see, Travis said chicken, and I feel like noodles.

Griffin: All day.

Justin: The gumminess of them?

Griffin: The yucky gumminess?

Travis: No, no, 'cause they dry out eventually. Chicken dry out, get old? Smell bad.

Griffin: No ways, bad stink, I'm with Travis!

Justin: Yeah... yeah, that's true, that would be pretty gross. Yeah, that's a lot of soup. I didn't wanna harp on it, but that's so much soup.

Griffin: That's too much soup!

Travis: It's a lot of soup.

Griffin: I'll say, that's too much soup.

Justin: Carrying that much in your car, that's soupbris, is what we call that. You're just inviting it to spill everywhere.

Griffin: One time, my friend Bobby Glaser, dropped a big-ass Sprite, fresh out the drive-through from McDonald's in the backseat of my car. It was—

Travis: He was very drunk at the time.

Griffin: He was really drunk, he said 'oopsie daisy.' Which is the first time I've ever heard anyone say that in public, who's not four.

Travis: And it's also important to note, it was seconds after he'd been handed it.

Griffin: It was so soon! But that is just like—I actually let it sit in the car 'cause it was pretty late and I was extremely tired and mad. But the next

morning, I just went out there with some towels and just sopped up the good Sprite. I had no chunkage to deal with.

Travis: I don't think—yeah, I don't think Sprite smells bad over time.

Griffin: [chuckles] No, Sprite smells excellent.

Justin: There is a sticky factor, though! There's a sticky factor.

Griffin: There is a sticky factor.

Travis: Yeah, but it was in the backseat!

Justin: I... yeah, that's a good—

Travis: That's a burner seat!

Justin: That's a good point.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: That's too much soup!

Justin: If the smell is the problem, you could take up smoking?

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: That's good.

Travis: Sell it on a cold day.

Griffin: [chuckles] Before the sun has had a chance to do its dark works. I'm gonna say, if you can get some freshly baked bread in the car to get some of the good bread stink going?

Travis: Oh, I think you meant to sop it up! [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: I mean, if you need to, I guess you could do it for that. But I'm talking about getting just the aroma going in there. And then whenever people come into your car, you could like fashion your own like thing out of marker and cardboard that is like a Glade plug-in that says 'Panera Bread' on it.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Mm-hmm!

Griffin: And then people will be like, "Well, it does smell like soup in here. But it also smells like bread and it says Panera Bread right there. So obviously, it's a whole thing they're going for. They couldn't possibly have spilled two pounds of soup."

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Whenever a friend rides with you, always have a Cup a Soup in the cup holder, and they're like, "Well, that's it, that's why."

Griffin: That must be it!

Travis: "That's why it's—they wouldn't have brought 32 ounces of soup into their car and spilled it."

Griffin: Hey, at least it wasn't lentils. You would have to drive that car into a lake, it's done.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: 32 ounces is not the amount, but there is an amount of soup that I could spill in my car, where I would just... just not... I would just—

Griffin: [chuckles] Not get in there anymore?

Justin: I would just be done with it. And I don't think that looks—I need a—

Travis: What is the amount?

Griffin: Is it lower than 32 ounces?

Justin: No, it's more, more, more. More, more, more. But there is an amount where I feel like spilled, I'd be like, I can't...

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: Now, it's an art piece!

Justin: There's like—there's like—I would be kind of like a—you know one of these people, have you seen this, where they walk... places?

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: I'd be one of them.

Travis: A podiatrist.

Justin: I could be that, or I could... I could just lean into it and be like kind of a—

Griffin: Kind of a house guy, now!

Travis: Yeah!

Justin: [chuckles] I could be like a local dirt bag.

Travis: Is that—wait—is that—wait—is that how like when you're a recluse, is that how recluse happens? I'd be like—

Justin: This is what I'm saying, this is where it starts—

Griffin: You go and spill too much soup in your car—

Travis: "Yeah, my car smells too bad, might as well just board it al up!"

Justin: No, I'm saying the car would smell bad and it would be like the one keystone that's kind of been keeping me on civilization's whole thing.

Griffin: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Justin: And then I'd be like, "Yeah, I don't know, I drive a car that just has soup everywhere." [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Oh, you mean Slosly Mobile?

Griffin: [chuckles] Yeah!

Justin: That's fine. "I work an entirely outdoor job with rare opportunities, if any, to use a real toilet while on shift. What is the minimum acceptable distance from my coworkers I can be to do my business, if I don't have something like a tree or bush to break the line of sight?"

Travis: You're on the plains, we get it.

Justin: That's from Pondering Piss in the Piedmont.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: The correct answer is if there's no tree or bush, or wall, or car, or large animal, or physical object behind which you can obscure your act, then the answer is beyond the curvature of the Earth.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Second star to the right and straight on until morning.

Justin: It's hard to answer the distance—

Travis: I mean, that's if you believe that the Earth is round.

Griffin: [chuckles] Okay!

Justin: It's hard to calculate the distance—

Griffin: This would be a quick way to figure it out, just like, "Oh, where's he going?"

"Oh, he had to piss."

"I don't wanna see that?"

"He doesn't want you to see it."

"Well, where's he going? We're in the—"

Travis: "I can still see him?"

Griffin: "We're in the zero-scape, there's nothing here to guard—"

Travis: "He fell off!"

Griffin: "Whoa, no!"

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Think about the worst seats you've ever had at a concert, right. The worst seats you've ever had at a baseball game. If the cat in center field drops his pants and starts peeing, you're a really... really, really, really far way away. And I guarantee that if that person drops pants and starts peeing, it will be noticed by a large swath of the audience. And there's a lot of people out there, right?

Griffin: But hold on—

Justin: There's a whole—if he was the only person on the field?

Griffin: [chuckles]

Justin: And dropped his pants and started peeing, absolutely, 100% of the audience is gonna recognize that.

Travis: Now, wait a minute, Justin.

Justin: Yeah?

Travis: What if you're a baseball player on the field, to continue your thing—

Justin: This is already pretty fantastical, that I'm playing baseball, but go on.

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: Base is loaded.

Justin: Okay?

Travis: Two outs. What's that? A grand slam. Everyone's looking. You can get away.

Griffin: "Oh, real quick, ah!"

Travis: So, what I'm saying is, you need a distraction. This is where the drone comes in. What drone you say? That's right, Piss Boy 5000.

Justin: [chuckles] The drone you piss in!

Travis: No, no, no!

Justin: Wait, no?

Travis: A drone who goes, "Look over there, someone's pissing." [chuckles] But a different direction!

Justin: Ok now wait, hold on! Hold on! Hold on! Hold on! Hold on! Hold on!

Griffin: No, no, no, this Piss Boy 5000, a drone you can piss in.

Justin: [chuckles]

Griffin: I don't want my privacy to interface with four helicopter blades...

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: No, sorry, you're thinking about the Piss Boy 4000! That was our old model! We don't sell that anymore, for that reason!

Justin: You don't sell that anymore!

Travis: The Piss Boy 5000, shows up when you need it. He can sense it because we put nodes in your bladder.

Griffin: Right. Oh, god, I really got—

Travis: And he's like, "Ah, he's gotta piss, I get it. Hey, look over there!"

Griffin: [chuckles] If I say, "I really gotta pizz." [mouths electrical charging sound] I would look over at the person with the controls like, "Hold it fucking steady."

Travis: You don't—you don't piss in the Piss Boy anymore!

Justin: No, you do—

Travis: The Piss Boy is a distraction now!

Justin: No, you piss in the Piss Boy.

Travis: No!

Justin: Listen...

Travis: Please!

Justin: Well, then why is it called that?

Griffin: Because I'll tell you the—here's the problem—it—

Travis: For legal reason! I can't stress this enough!

Griffin: Shh, no, no, no, here's the problem with the Piss Boy 5000, that'll fool me once...

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: But then I see on Twitter like, "Hey, when everybody was looking at the Piss Boy 5000, Chris Sabo was fuckin' letting it rip out on center field!" I would be like, first of all—

Travis: We're working on the Piss Boy 6000 for that reason!

Justin: Now, wait—

Griffin: This is a stopgap.

Travis: The Piss Boy 5000 is a stopgap!

Justin: I'm saying—

Travis: Until we can fix the cut off your genitals with the blades of the fan problem!

Justin: I'm saying it's basically half drone, half bedpan. It comes down from the sky.

Travis: Wait, hold on, TM, TM, TM. You've cracked the 6000, have you been in our labs?

Justin: No one—no one—no one can judge you for peeing in a bedpan. Hospital folk do it all the time. This is just one that happens to be able to be able to fly.

Travis: Well, patience. Right, Justin? You know a Dr. Patience, right?

Justin: Yeah, man, but I bet doctors get busy, too? They get swamped with work and can't get away?

Griffin: And they need special help. Travis, I have also been in the lab and saw some early prototypes of the Piss Boy 6000. And I just wanna say like, I don't think we need it to talk.

Justin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: And if I can quibble about the 7000—

Griffin: Go ahead, Juice.

Justin: And think. That was the one where in the 7000—

Travis: They need to anticipate the need, Justin!

Griffin: Yeah, yeah, yeah, no, no, no, I love—and I love that, we love that. But like, when it comes down to me on the field and it's like ready, I don't need it to like... say stuff throughout.

Travis: Oh, you don't want encouragement?

Griffin: No, I don't think—I don't usually want that from my toilets.

Travis: His love is real, but he is not.

Griffin: And it's stuff like that, that I don't actually like very much.

Travis: When he goes, "Yummy-yummy?" [chuckles]

Griffin: He goes, "Yummy-yummy?" [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: "This is the best pee I've ever tasted," you don't want him to say that?

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] You don't want him to say, as he swoops down from the sky, "Who's thirsty?! It's me."

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: "I do this 'cause I love it, not 'cause I was programmed," you don't want him to say that? Okay, you want him to be unhappy about it? You want him to say, "I wish this wasn't my job, but in this economy?"

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: I just thought you'd want him to be excited about it, Griffin?
[chuckles]

Griffin: Nope, nope! Travis, again, four whirling blades, I want him to be as chill as is possible. Excitement, I want nowhere near this droid.

Travis: Okay, great. Change it to, "Piss in my mouth if you gotta, bro."

Griffin: No.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Just no dialogue.

Travis: Have you been watching Mrs. Davis? Love that.

Griffin: What was the question?

Travis: Can I piss in a robot's mouth?

Griffin: Yes, yes, yes, you can.

Travis: Yes, you can.

Griffin: You must.

Justin: Do you want another question?

Griffin: I would love one.

Justin: “I recently purchased a bidet and have since grown—”

Travis: A piss boy, if you will! [chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles] A piss boy!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: It’s the French model, Le Piss! Le Piss!

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Les Pissérables!

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Whew! That gave me goosebumps for real and I don’t know why.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Okay, that silence is all of us thinking of the songs in Les Misérables and trying to come up with pee-pee puns of them. The best I came up with was Do You Hear The People Pee? So, I kept my mouth—

Griffin: Shut, yeah.

Justin: Shut.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: 'Cause I didn't have anything, and neither did they, or they would've cut me off.

Griffin: No, no, no.

Justin: Next question! I recently—

Travis: Wasn't an invitation.

Griffin: [chuckles] Please.

Justin: Yeah.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: I'm sure they're great.

Justin: Okay, "I recently purchased a bidet and have grown accustomed to a certain bathroom experience. I no longer feel clean unless I use one at the end of my business. Would it be cool to bring it with me and install it in my hotel room?"

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Would it be cool...

Justin: It's not like it's hard?

Griffin: I can think of nothing cooler.

Justin: "But will they get mad at me?" That's from Bidet-Bungled in Section B. Actually A, but that isn't alliterative.

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Sounds like a bidet user.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: We all use bidets. We all do.

Travis: We all use bidets! Hey, we all use bidets.

Griffin: Can I say something? Actually, mine did not commute from Austin until, no joke, like three days ago we got a new bidet.

Justin: Wow. That's rough, man.

Travis: Wait, okay, you got a different one. Not like it was supposed to be here—

Griffin: It was in jail, in Austin, for eight months.

Travis: Like you just kept calling the new owners like, "Please, let him go."

Griffin: "Please, I need it."

Travis: "I have a certain set of skills."

Griffin: "I'm not clean."

Travis: "And one of them is not being able to poop." [chuckles]

Griffin: "I'm not clean without it."

Justin: I think the word that is causing me the most trouble here is 'installed.' Because hotels, they like you to be like—it's like kind of like forest rules, right, leave it how you found it.

Griffin: [chuckles]

Justin: Or at least not with extra things installed.

Griffin: [chuckles] Yeah, sure.

Justin: They don't really want you to install stuff.

Travis: Because if you don't know, when you're installing a bidet, there is a water hook up aspect.

Griffin: The water gotta come from somewhere, y'all!

Travis: And it ain't challenging, but there's not a zero risk of something going terribly wrong and you having to call the front desk and saying, "I don't know what happened..."

Griffin: "I fucked up so bad!"

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: What you do is you say, "I just got in here and I can't believe the state of this place. Is this the kind of business y'all run? There are wires everywhere and my underwear... there and..."

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "What a mess..."

Travis: Wait, Justin?

Justin: "And I'm bleeding on the floor from how I messed up..."

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: I pray to god you're not waiting to install it until the moment you need it?

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: I hope you're getting in there—

Griffin: Just sitting on the toilet like, "Oh, god!"

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: It's not... I did mess up my first bidet installation and that was embarrassing.

Travis: What did you bido?

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: The fitting wasn't like right and so there was a leak at the thing. And so, I had to—

Justin: Oh, yeah. Oh, yeah.

Griffin: All I needed was some plumber's tape and I wrapped it around the thing and it was fine.

Justin: Yeah, been there.

Griffin: So, it is—you can mess this up. But I don't want there to be more rules at the hotel when you go to it, 'cause we stay in a lot. I would be uncomfortable if I had to sign—I had to sign a waiver today at the hotel we went to that said that I would not vape in the hotel room. I do not want a second waiver that says I also will not plumb.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: And I'll say this, folks, we tour enough that we've stayed in the same hotel sometimes years apart. And the idea of checking in a second time, four years later and them going, "Mr... oh..."

Griffin: "Oh, fuck..." But with us, it's easy 'cause we can be like, "I'm not that McElroy, that's the other McElroy. He's a fuckin' freak!"

Travis: Oh, I need to tell you guys, today, I had costume pieces delivered for the TAZ tomorrow, be there.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: And when I picked up the packages from the front desk, as I turned, I heard one of the front desk people say to the other one, "Yeah, he's part of that comedy troop."

Griffin: Oh!

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Mamma mia! That hits so right! That's so great! We're all so funny!

Justin: It sounds more like a real job than whatever it is we do.

Travis: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: At least that's like, huh, all right.

Travis: Comedy troop, I get it!

Griffin: I know what that is!

[theme song plays]

Travis: I'm so excited to be here with my favorite podcaster, Justin McElroy.

Justin: Yeah, man.

Travis: And can I just say, I really appreciate you dressing up to meet me. Like, I didn't know what to expect, but your style game is fuckin' lit, man.

Justin: Well, thanks, man. I've never had clothes before and I decided to like just try it, you know what I mean?

Travis: Try clothes on?

Justin: Just to nail it, just try clothes on. But I didn't know where to start. I had a potato sack that I cut holes into and that was fine for a little bit, but then the itchiness started to get to me.

Travis: Oh, I thought that was like a character you're playing, like Potato Sam? No?

Justin: Yeah, le esta gustando me podcast?

Travis: Ah, yeah, muy bueno.

Justin: Muy bueno, ah, gracias. How do I do that?

Travis: De nada?

Justin: [chuckles] It's not magic. It's not magic.

Travis: Yes, yes, that's Spanish they're speaking. But these kids aren't from Spain. They're from America. Je suis las envie.

Travis: Man, I hope so.

Justin: Thanks! Double thanks!

Travis: I don't remember what happened in the past.

Justin: Well, let's move on to the future.

Travis: And beyond!

[We Got This with Mark and Hal theme music plays]

Mark: What is up, people of the world. Do you have an argument that you keep having with your friends and you just can't seem to settle it? And you're sitting there arguing about whether it's Star Trek or Star Wars, or you can't decide what is the best nut, or can't agree on what is the best cheese.

Hal: Stop doing that! Listen to We Got This with Mark and Hal, only on Max Fun.

Mark: Your topics asked and answered, objectively, definitely, for all time.

Hal: So, don't worry, everybody.

Mark and Hal: We got this.

Ad: We got this!

[We Got This with Mark and Hal theme music concludes]

[Judge John Hodgman theme music plays]

John: They can be anywhere. At your office, in your car, and they are wrong.

Guest 1: My mom says that the grey house didn't exist. But she's wrong.

Guest 2: He just does it wrong.

John: Someone in your life is wrong about something. Something small, something weird, something vitally important. Only one person has the courage to tell them just how wrong they are. 'You know what you did was wrong. But your daughter is liar who eats garbage.'

Guest 1: [laughs]

Guest 2: [laughs]

John: They call me Judge John Hodgman. Listen to me on the Judge John Hodgman podcast. If someone in your life is doing you wrong, don't just take it. Take it to court. Submit your case at mamximumfun.org/jjho.

[Judge John Hodgman theme music concludes]

Justin: [mouths awkward riff]

[crowd cheers]

Justin: [mouths Munch Squad riff]

[crowd cheers]

Justin: [continues riffing and sings] I wanna munch!

Griffin, Travis and crowd: Squad!

Justin: [continues riffing and sings] I want to munch!

Griffin, Travis and crowd: Squad!

Justin: [concludes riffing] Welcome to Munch Squad, it's a podcast within a podcast.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Profiling the latest and greatest in brand eating!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: "Burger King is revealing each state's preferences around its flagship Whopper Sandwich. And the results are clear, Americans love having it their way."

Travis: Oh gross, is preferences in italics?

Griffin: [chuckles] Hold on, I did not need a Burger King experiment and press release to tell me that Americans prefer having it their way.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "Luckily, there are more than 200,000 ways—"

Griffin: No, you go, your turn!

Justin: After you. "Ways to uniquely customize the Whopper, from adding extra crunch." And then in parentheses here—

Travis: Wait, how many ways?

Justin: There are 200,000 ways.

Travis: No.

Justin: Then it says, "From adding extra crunch," and then in parentheses it says 'pickles.'

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: "Pickles, you fucking idiot!"

Justin: "You dolt! You fuckin' pervert! What did you think we meant? You nasty dog."

"Spice (jalapeños) and tang (barbeque sauce)."

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Like, they think you're lying. Like, "Bullshit, you can't add tang."
"Wanna bet?"

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "To doubling and even tripling down on those flame grilled beef patties and more, but which states can't be topped when it comes to the most satisfying combinations? And which are purest when it comes to ordering habits? Which states are just extra and how many Whopper sandwiches can one guest order in a single visit?"

Griffin: J-dog, I don't know if you've structured it this way, I feel 100% certain if you told me the preferred toppings of the state, I could identify the state.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Ooh!

Griffin: Without...

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Can I say, you probably couldn't.

Griffin: Oh, okay, that's a shame.

Justin: But I will tell you a state and you can guess, based on what you know about it.

Travis: Can you do it the other way around? 'Cause I don't know what the toppings of a Whopper are.

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: It's like—it's not just toppings, it's like Whopper... perversions.

Griffin: Perversions, yeah.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Hey, can I also ask you this, how much money do you think Burger King has that they can do this?

Justin: Well, we—

Travis: That they have enough money to be like, "What do people get on it?"

"Do you mean like just today?"

"No, everywhere, all the time."

Justin: Fucking nobody else is paying for research, so I'm glad that Burger King is doing it.

Griffin: Yeah, right?

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Okay, so you'll just—I'll name a state and you just think about what you know about the state, and then you guess what it is.

Travis: Okay, all right.

Justin: North Carolina.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: Cheerwine?

Justin: Think about—

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Dang, I should've put diet Cheerwine on the writer! Dang it!

Travis: Fuck!

Griffin: Oh, what the—what were we thinking?!

Travis: And... barbeque sauce?

Justin: No...

Travis: Mustard?

Justin: North Carolina is... can we enhance, Paul? North Carolina is the doubler state. You order the most double Whopper sandwiches.

Griffin: Sit in that! Own that!

[crowd cheers]

Travis: How many people are like, "Yeah, I did."

Griffin: "Yeah, I sure did."

Justin: Does that seem right? Is there a few of you who were like, "Yeah, guilty."

Griffin: "Yeah, just better, taller here!"

Justin: But Montana got the most triple Whopper sandwiches, so what's up now?

[crowd exclaims]

Griffin: Listen, hey—

Travis: North Carolina, get your shit together!

Griffin: Listen, there's enough people here that we can turn the tide of this fuckin' thing.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: If all of you get a delicious, juicy, flame-grilled triple Whopper tonight?

Justin: Let's take it away from Montana.

Travis: Hey, you know what? Fuck that. Order four.

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: "But we've never done four! We don't know if the bun can handle it!"

"Cowards!"

Griffin: [chuckles] "Cowards!"

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Hawaii?

Travis: It's pineapple. Pineapple?

Justin: It's not like they make up new Whoppers, Travis?

Griffin: [chuckles] Yeah, no.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: You asked.

Justin: It's not like on Colorado where you get the Gold Rush burger, like it's just—

Griffin: Can I say something? I think a minimalist Whopper experience, I think it's singles with just ketchup.

Justin: Impossible Whoppers is number one in Hawaii. They love plant-based—

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Good for them.

Justin: One state set the record for the most Whopper sandwiches sold over the course of a single day last year. What state? Fucking Maryland.

Griffin: [chuckles] What the fuck?!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Hey, Maryland? You're not that big. Are you guys—

Travis: Wait, was the day?

Justin: Are you okay?

Travis: No, what was the day? What happened on that day?

Justin: It's like... it was the day where they said, "If you all don't eat enough Whoppers, we're gonna kill the baby panda at the zoo."

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "Get out there, eat the Whoppers, or this panda dies."

Travis: Ba-da-pa-pa-pa.

Justin: [sings] Ba-da-pa-pa-pa, we'll do it.

Griffin: [chuckles] It was actually January 6th, they got a lot of traffic through Maryland...

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: On the way...

Griffin: On the way in.

Justin: On the way up.

Griffin: [laughs]

Travis: [laughs]

Griffin: Oh, man! [chuckles] Burger King probably doesn't wanna own that!

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: "We disavow that entire hate-filled movement."

Justin: "That incredibly profitable—"

Griffin: "It was fuckin' great for us, though!"

Justin: "So good!"

Griffin: "So good!"

Travis: "Listen, yeah, there are a lot of question and you know we support a monarchy, but..."

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: There's another record, though, and it's in Ohio. One guest.. one guest from Ohio, on one day in 2022, ordered more than 700 Whoppers in a single transaction.

Travis: One guest? "I'm sorry, everybody! I was trying to do a thing!"

Griffin: [chuckles] "I thought... I thought Mr. Beast lived here."

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: I bet that guest was just beloved. I bet he was a delight.

Griffin: Oh, for sure.

Justin: Yeah, we love this cat.

Griffin: Yeah, I love when I'm in a fast-food restaurant and I'm in line and then the person in front of me makes the restaurant close down.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: "I had 700 hungry orphans with me."

Griffin: Wow.

Travis: "And I ate all of those hamburgers in front of them." [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: “Cause I was teaching ‘em about capitalism!”

Justin: Rhode Island has a fun distinction of being the—[chuckles] being the state that most frequently adds bacon to their Impossible Whoppers.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Okay.

Griffin: All right, Rhode Island.

Travis: That’s a callout, right?

Griffin: Let’s talk.

Travis: That’s a callout.

Griffin: Hey, straight up—hey, straight up, this is one large group of very ironic friends that are doing this shit.

Justin: Almost half of all Louisianans customize their Whopper sandwiches.

Griffin: Yeah, you’re fucking wild not to!

Justin: Yeah, right? [chuckles] The idea that 50 is the highest is wild to me.

Griffin: That’s so wild!

Justin: I’ve never not customized a hamburger at a restaurant, are you kidding me? What if they put pickles on there?

Griffin: Yeah, you know me better than—raw onions? You know me better than me, so go for it! What’s that? Oh, it is yucky, though.

Travis: What I am just figuring out is out of the three brothers, I'm the least likely one to feel like a problem. Like, I say, "Whatever's easiest!" And I didn't think I'd be the one out of the three of us to say that.

Justin: All right, all right, y'all, country roads, what do you think—

Griffin: Travis, what do you—sorry, hold on, real quick. When you say no onions, the press a button on the machine in front of them that says 'no onions.'

Travis: But they have to press a button.

Griffin: [chuckles] Okay.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: What if it's already done and it's already there and they just—

Griffin: Grip and rip that shit, Justin! Trying to do it sneaky

Justin: Yeah!

[crowd cheers]

Travis: I did do a sneaky one.

Justin: Country roads, country roads, West Virginia, what are topsing?

Griffin: [laughs]

Travis: What are you topsing...

Griffin: Let's see...

Travis: Most cheese added?

Justin: Smoking? Yeah, smoking, but other than—

Griffin: Least... least tomato usage.

Justin: And Travis?

Travis: I said most cheese added.

Justin: Paul!

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: Whoa!

Justin: Nearly 75% of Whoppers sold in the great state of West Virginia...

Griffin: Big cheese. Those are cheese ear rings.

Justin: Cheese ear rings!

Griffin: Fantastic.

Travis: Can I tell you how I knew? Adding cheese is free, baby.

Justin: Yeah... Floridians are most likely to throw a chair through the window? That doesn't seem—

Travis: Whoa!

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: That's wild.

Justin: I don't know why they put that in there. It seems wild.

Griffin: Through a Burger King window.

Justin: And it says here—

Travis: But from the inside out. [chuckles]

Griffin: Most Burger Kings defaced.

Justin: It says here, South Carolina's the most likely to poop its pants?

Griffin: Weird?

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: So fucking deep.

Travis: Justin, some of these people might be from South Carolina, but in a cool way.

Justin: In a cool—no, I was counting on a rivalry that may or may not make sense, I don't know. [chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd cheers]

Travis: No, they actually like each other, but fuck West Carolina. [chuckles]

Griffin: Yeah!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: The one that uses the app the most is New Jersey. I don't know what you can derive from that, but there you go.

Griffin: Just a lot of app-lovers over there.

Travis: Listen, we got a lot of great audience questions.

Griffin: All right, listen—

Justin: Yeah, you're right—

Griffin: We're gonna—

Justin: Thank you so much to Burger King for this great research.

Griffin: [chuckles] We don't usually thank the companies on Munch Squad.

Travis: Well, they did it for us.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: Okay, all right—

Justin: They had to pay a lot for that study.

Griffin: Listen, usually, we reserve a little bit of time at the end of the show for an audience Q&A. This time, we've reserved more time because we've got a lot of really fucking great questions from y'all.

Travis: Justin has taken his microphone out of the stand.

Justin: Never done this before.

Travis: Things are getting fuckin' real up here!

Justin: Never done this before, it's gonna be a long sesh with you guys.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: I'm gonna put my microphone in Justin's stand.

Justin: I'm gonna turn my chair around.

Travis: Whoa, Justin, too real!

[crowd cheers]

Travis: You're gonna—

Griffin: I would—

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: I would do that...

Travis: Justin, be careful! You're gonna convert too many people to Christ if you're not careful!

Griffin: I would do that, but I realized, on this tour...

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: There he is. I realized tonight, for the first time, that under any lights at all, this costume becomes completely transparent.

Travis: Yes.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: It's stolen valor, free looksies.

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: I've done maybe 10 to 12 shows in this garment already. Did not know it until this exact moment. So... Hi, what's up?

Abby: Hi, I'm Abby, they/them. I'm actually coming up for my husband. But the question is, how do we get our five year old toddler to stop asking him if he's gonna smoke a bowl every time he loses at Zelda.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Now, hold on, you gotta hear the rest of it.

Griffin: You gotta hear the end.

Travis: You gotta hear the rest of it.

Abby: Okay. Every time he gets frustrated by losing at Zelda.

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: Okay.

[crowd laughs and cheers]

Travis: Okay. Okay. Okay, Abby, we all have kids. So, I have to ask you this. At one point, did your husband get up to smoke a bowl because he got frustrated at losing at Zelda?

Griffin: And tell your child.

Travis: And say out loud like, "I gotta smoke a bowl, I'm so frustrated."

Justin: Or did you say he's probably going out to smoke a bowl 'cause he's very frustrated? And that's why you're up here.

Griffin: "Ganondorf just whipped his ass up and down Hyrule, he's definitely going to smoke a bowl."

Travis: "And he broke his good sword doing it."

Justin: "Jonathan, don't look at your dad, he's extremely pissed at Ganon and he's gonna go smoke a bowl." [chuckles]

Travis: "It's not about you, honey. It's not. Ganon broke his good sword. And the horse was watching and the horse laughed."

Justin: "He's gonna go smoke a huge bowl." [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "So, what happened?"

Travis: "This is just what daddy does."

Justin: "Your daddy just—"

Travis: "Daddy needs this!" Is that what happened? [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Abby: So...

Justin: What's... what the—

Justin: No. No, no, no, "I know when Daniel Tiger says to squeeze yourself nice and slow, but daddy's gonna try smoking a big, huge, fat bowl."

Travis: [sings] Smoke a bowl nice a slow.

Travis and Justin: [sings] Take a deep breath. [inhale sound]

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: And let it go!

Justin: [exhale sound]

Griffin: [sings] "It's you I like."
"We're not done yet, Daniel."
"Ah, fuck... I'm so sleepy, though."

Justin: Abby, how did we get here?

Abby: When he was younger, he used to say, "Oh, I need to go smoke a bowl." And I don't think he actually understands—

Griffin: The child or your husband?

Abby: My husband. [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Okay?

Abby: My husband said that a couple times when he was younger and he just caught on—

Griffin: How much younger? When the child was younger.

Abby: Yeah, when the child was younger.

Griffin: Okay, shwhew, I went on a whole journey of interpretation.

Justin: Griff, I don't wanna be whatever, but they were probably all younger, if I had to guess.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: It's fine.

Travis: That is how time works. Abby, one of my favorite things is—I was talking with Justin about this backstage, the number of times you try to... like, try to teach your child things, and then the things that they lock on to. There are two things that both of my children have locked onto. And one is, take your socks off before bed, 'cause sometimes, the threads can wrap around your toes and it's a problem. I don't know why.

Griffin: Wow.

Travis: I don't know who said it, but even now, if I'm lying in a bed with socks on, my daughter says, "Daddy, don't forget the number one rule."

Abby: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: And the other one is, for whatever reason, at some point, my wife told my kids, "Daddy doesn't like toilet paper with patterns on it."

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Not true. Not true!

Justin: He loves that.

Griffin: He loves it, he loves defacing art.

Travis: I have no feelings either way. But both of my kids are like, "Daddy, why don't you like patterns?" And they won't fuckin' let it go. [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: You could say... maybe, I don't know, chill?

Travis: He's way into pottery.

Griffin: No, no, you don't wanna lie.

Travis: The kid doesn't know what smoke a bowl means?!

Griffin: It could mean throwing—

Travis: "I said throw a bowl!"

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: "He's going out to the wheel."

Justin: He could probably go—he could probably go outside one time and just chuck a bowl into the woods.

Abby: [chuckles]

Justin: And the kid would be like—

Travis: “I smoked it pretty far!”

Justin: [chuckles] “Damn it’s—”

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: “Dad is pretty pissed, huh? I always wondered.”

Griffin: Take a bowl, a ceramic bowl out there and then shoot it with a gun. And be like, “Smoke that bowl!”

Justin: That would probably be—

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: You’d probably feel better about Zelda, too, honestly.

Griffin: Yeah, sure.

Justin: That’d be a healthy way of dealing with that, I think. And the worst part it, that’s a vicious cycle, ‘cause that bowl ain’t gonna make you better at fighting Ganon.

Griffin: No. [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: I’m sorry. It might make you—

Travis: There is a point where you lose to Ganon six times and he goes, “Hey man, just pause. Are you fuckin’ high? ‘Cause we can come back.”

Justin: “Are you high right now?”

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Does that help, Abby?

Griffin: Fuckin' Mario comes in, in his golden Tanooki suit like, "Let me—are you fuck—[in silly voice] Are you fucked up right now?"

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: "Time out! Time out! Time out!"

Griffin: [in silly voice] "I'm out! Do you need some help?"

Travis: "Do you need some orange slices?" [chuckles]

Justin: Does that help, Abby?

Abby: Yes, thank you.

Griffin: Thank you so much.

Justin: All right, thanks!

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Hello.

Griffin: Hi.

Justin: Hi.

Jamie: Hello.

Griffin: Hi.

Jamie: I'm Jamie, I use she/her pronouns.

Griffin: Hi, Jamie.

Justin: Hey, Jamie!

Jamie: So, like most people, I don't know a lot about bees.

[crowd chuckles]

Jamie: I know they hurt.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Yeah, yeah.

Jamie: And I know there are different types, but I don't actually really know what the different types are.

Travis: There are big bees, there are little bees.

Griffin: Sure, sure, sure.

Jamie: Yeah! But I agreed to do a bee census tomorrow.

Justin: Huh?

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Interesting.

Travis: Now, Jamie—

Griffin: Let Jamie finish.

Travis: Okay, sorry, yes?

[crowd chuckles]

Jamie: So, help me.

Justin: You...

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Oh, you thought... huh...

Travis: Huh, now, Jamie...

Griffin: Hey, Jamie?

Travis: Hey, Jamie?

Griffin: Hey, Jamie?

Justin: Jamie?

Griffin: Jamie?

Justin: Hey, Jamie, I—

Travis: What about this...

Justin: Yeah. Hey, Jamie, I got your email, I know you have a phone here. I mean, you got phone and internet, bud. That time could've been much better spent with just a super-quick bee Google.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: And sometimes, even with all the access of Google, it's hard to come up with the right search term. Kinds of bees.

Griffin: Yeah.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Jamie, who asked you to do this?

Griffin: Yeah, this is an amazing question. Why did you get wrangled into doing bee counting?

Travis: 'Cause you said yes and... someone could blame you. But someone asked you.

Justin: Right, so—

Travis: Someone came to you, Jamie, and went—

Justin: Okay, let's let Jamie actually talk.

Travis: Okay, sorry, yes.

Justin: Thank you.

Jamie: I have a friend who's an apiarist.

Griffin: Okay?

Jamie: So, he knows the types of bees. I'm just not gonna measure up.

Justin: That's a bee expert.

Travis: Now wait, hold on—

Justin: An apiarist is a bee expert.

Travis: Your friend doesn't expect you to know bees, Jamie. They're lonely. They wanna—

Griffin: [chuckles]

Justin: No, now wait...

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: No, no, no! Hear me out! They don't wanna go look at bees by themselves.

Griffin: Here's, yeah—

Justin: A lot of people—

Travis: That's your whole thing.

Justin: A lot of people act like people who love bees don't smash. And I'm here to say, it's not true.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: People who love bees can also love smashing and smooching all the time.

Travis: It doesn't—no, I don't mean that! Loneliness can be all things.

Justin: Yeah, I'm just saying.

Griffin: I did not—I did not realize there was a second balcony in this theater until just this moment.

Travis: Whoa!

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: Y'all go so high up. What's up?

Travis: Jamie, I don't—

Justin: That actually makes me a little dizzy to look at you, so I'm gonna keep it down here okay.

Travis: Jamie?

Griffin: We could piss on stage and you all would not have any...

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Jamie, I don't care what my pervert brothers say, I'm just saying that they don't wanna go look at bees by themselves. They wanna go with you 'cause they're your friend. And maybe you smash afterwards.

Griffin: 'Cause here's—shush, no—

Justin: No, no, it's not about the smashing.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Jamie, no. Here's the thing—

Justin: They might have Migirl disease and they don't wanna be around a bunch of bees without someone—

Travis: My girl disease!

Griffin: My girl disease?!

Justin: They might have Migril disease and they don't wanna be—

Travis: They caught it when they were young!

Justin: They might have Migril disease and they don't wanna be around a bunch of bees and they get stung—

Travis: "Hey, did you hear? Derek was out of school this week."
"Yeah, he my girl." [chuckles]

Griffin: "He got my girl disease really bad."

Justin: I'm talking about a safety issue, guys! This had gone beyond humor! It's about the fact that if you have Migril disease, you should be around a bunch of bees without someone to give you an epinephrine.

Griffin: I don't know—also, Jamie?

Travis: Yeah?

Griffin: I don't know—

Travis: Nora Epinephrine!

Griffin: Nora—[chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Jamie, I don't know how to tell you this, it is... if you went home tonight and you pulled an all-nighter studying the different types of bees, that would not be enough to do a good job of what has been asked of you, which is counting bees, which is to say you see one bee and you go, "One." And then you see a different bee and you go, "Two."

Justin: Unless you are eating the bees as you count them, I have no idea how you're gonna make this work.

Griffin: And then you go, "Three. No, wait, I did that one already."

Justin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Are you gonna paint it with nail polish as you count 'em?

Travis: You gonna tag 'em?

Justin: Yeah, you should fake diarrhea.

[crowd chuckles]

Jamie: Well, what about the smashing?

Justin: What? What?

Travis: What about the smashing? I get it.

Griffin: "I got—[mouths stinging sounds] I got better." [chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: "Oh, shit, you have so many stings."
"But I got better."

Travis: All I'm saying is, if your friend who studies bees asked you to go, just practice saying this in different ways, "And what's that bee?"

Justin: Yeah, they'll love that.

Travis: That's why they want you there!

Justin: Does that help?

Jamie: I can definitely be a bee appreciator.

Griffin: Okay, great, thank you.

Justin: All right, thanks, Jamie!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Hey!

Mandy: Hey, I'm Mandy, she/her.

Griffin: Hi, Mandy.

Justin: Hi, Mandy. Mandy, how can I help?

Mandy: Real quick, I don't stargaze enough. How do I stargaze more?

Justin: Yes, thank you.

Griffin: Thank you, Mandy. This is an amazing question.

Travis: When you were saying 'real quick' before that, too, Mandy like, "Real quick. I don't stargaze—" [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: I wanted to address this, Mandy, because—

Griffin: It's so good, Mandy.

Justin: It's so good, Mandy, because like... Okay, don't think about it. Quick show of hands. How many people wish they were the sort of person...

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: That stargazed more than you do?

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: Right? We all wanna be, but what's the problem? It's...

Griffin and Justin: Boring! [chuckles]

Travis: There it is.

Justin: Exactly...

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: It is why, without fail, every single one of you in this room tonight, if someone said, "I'm gonna go to a planetarium." You'd be like, "Fuckin' short cut, yes."

Justin: Yeah, absolutely.

Travis: "They fast forward through the stars and then point at them!"

Justin: "A busted down cassette of Leonard Nimoy tells me which stars kick ass and there's an arrow pointing at 'em and I love it."

Travis: "I love this thing, too, yes."

Griffin: Fuckin', I bought a telescope, when I was in college.

Justin: We've all been there.

Griffin: [chuckles] Yeah! And put it up on the roof of the apartment building I was on and looked in it. And I was—

Justin: You looked at the Moon one time.

Griffin: No, I was looking at the incredible stars.

Justin: Yes?

Griffin: And I was like, "Ah..." And then I was like, "What, is that one Betelgeuse?" And then I looked to my side and there was nobody there to confirm or deny this information! So, I was like, "Yeah, probably Betelgeuse. This is fucking boring!"

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: It's just so boring, right?

Griffin: There are so many of them! They're so far away.

Travis: So, here's what you need to do, you can't start... you can't start with a telescope. Huge investment. You gotta build up. First, you're gonna do this...

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Right? And then toilet paper tube, then paper towel tube. Then kaleidoscope. [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Then build your way up. It's gonna take 10 years—

Griffin: Then some baloney you've rolled into a tube.

Travis: It's gonna take a while.

Justin: Did you all ever have that thing where there was gonna be a meteor shower late at night, so your parents woke you up in the middle of the night? It'd be nice—

[crowd cheers]

Justin: It'd be nice to feel that kind of safety again, wouldn't it? Things were—

Griffin: Wow!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Things were simpler, I feel like, back then, for a lot of us. And it would be nice to be there in that sort of part of my life again. You know what I mean? I don't think I really appreciated it, feeling that secure, you know? Just one—just—[chuckles] I just—no, you can leave it on, it's fine. Mandy, does that help?

Travis: No, what? I flipped it down!

Justin: That doesn't do anything. Don't touch my mic. Does that help?

[crowd chuckles]

Mandy: Always does.

Justin: All right, thank you.

Griffin: Thank you. Mandy.

[crowd cheers]

Trey: Hi, I'm Trey.

Griffin: Hi, Trey. You even sound like him a little bit. What's up, my dude?

Trey: So, I use he/him pronouns.

Justin: Hey, Trey.

Griffin: Hi, Trey.

Trey: But my question, which I will also need to elaborate on a little bit—

Griffin: I don't think you will, my friend!

[crowd chuckles]

Trey: ... is how do I get people to stop asking if I'm Mr. Beast?

Justin: Yes.

[crowd laughs]

Trey: Now, the important details here are I work for a pretty big tech company.

Justin: Oh, god.

Trey: And sometimes, I have to do weird stuff like carry around a suitcase that says 'top secret.'

Justin: Oh, no.

Griffin: [laughs]

Travis: Oh, no!

[crowd laughs]

Trey: And it doesn't help that I live about an hour and a half from Mr. Beast.

Griffin: Yeah, sure.

Travis: How often? How many times like a day, a week, a month?

Griffin: If it's less than three, I'll be fucking amazed.

Trey: Since his meteoric rise, I would say four times a day.

Justin: Okay, so here's—

Travis: A day?!

Justin: Here's the thing—

Travis: Four times a day. I don't get asked if I'm Travis McElroy four times a day.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: If you don't know who Mr. Beast is—

Travis: He makes hamburgers! [chuckles]

Justin: He is a Youtuber who is very rich and very influential and looks, not kidding, exactly like the human being in front of you.

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Hey, Trey? You look cooler.

Griffin: You do look cooler, Trey. I will say that.

Justin: You look cooler, Trey.

Griffin: Jesus—

Travis: That Sonic shirt? He wishes. [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Trey... Trey... can I just say, I don't know the answer to the question. When you do find it, it will be very difficult to get there. But the good news is, and I'm sure you probably already know this, if you can figure out the answer to this question, the extent to which you can exploit that for your own personal gain... is unfathomable to the average human.

Travis: Hey, look at it this way, Trey, pretty soon, Mr. Beast is gonna be asked you, "How do I tell people I'm not Mr. Beast?" Right? You can sell that to him.

Griffin: A prince and pauper situation where you switch around. Mr. Beast for a day—

Travis: I'm President Beast! [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: You should like try to get in touch and just be like, "This is a problem for me." You'll probably end up with a suitcase with \$10,000 in it, 'cause like—

Griffin: And an airplane.

Travis: And it says 'top secret' on it.

Justin: Yeah.

Trey: Yeah.

Griffin: Hey, wait, wait, wait—

Travis: Wait, oh, you're wearing glasses. You could probably fix that for you.

Justin: Now, hey, yeah—at some point—

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Yeah... that's a good one.

Griffin: "Today, I pay for LASIK for a dude who looks a lot like me!"

Travis: "And while he was under, I put a tattoo on his face so no one would confuse the two of us!" [chuckles]

Justin: At some point, you're gonna decide that you hate this situation more than you love your beard. And then you'll fix it. You'll fix it in an afternoon, no problem anymore. But I think that you shouldn't have to change 'cause you were there first, right? You were you—

Travis: So, you're gonna have to find Mr. Beast and shave his beard.

Justin: For supremacy, you gotta shave Mr. Beast.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: You gotta shave Mr. Beast's face.

Trey: I was in fact there first.

Justin: Yes, exactly.

Travis: Wait, what does that mean?

Griffin: Hold on, wait, but hold on, wait. What's your fuckin' job that you carry around top secret briefcases, my guy?

Trey: I am the territory sales manager for Google.

[crowd exclaims]

Travis: Okay, the rest of this is now classified.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: How do you sell Google to people? [chuckles]

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: Have y'all heard about this?

Griffin: "What are you doing, Bing? Smash!"

Travis: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "Tell me a question, any question that you have." I was about to ask him to help, but I'm pretty sure like shaving—

Griffin: You look like Mr. Beast! Use it!

Trey: Yeah.

Justin: Yeah, use it for good.

Griffin: You're the best of us!

Trey: It's helped more than it's hurt.

Griffin: I bet!

Justin: There we go.

[crowd cheers]

Jake: Hi, Brothers, I'm Jake.

Justin: Hi.

Griffin: Hi, Jake.

Jake: My question was, how do I get customers in my store to stop slapping our statues of Slimer and Spider-Man on the bottom?

Griffin: Yeah.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: I'll ask you the same question I asked faux Mr. Beast, how many times? How often?

Jake: Multiple times a day.

Griffin: Yeah, sure.

Jake: The last one was yesterday.

Travis: I don't get my butt slapped—no—

Griffin: Can I tell you something—[chuckles] Can I tell you something, Jake?

Jake: Yeah?

Griffin: Spider-Man, I get.

Justin: Okay, Griffin, thank you.

Travis: Oh my god, wait, hold on!

Griffin: The things I know—

Travis: I was going the other way!

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: [chuckles] Whoa? Things I know about Spider-Man, is a human, has a—

Justin: Has a butt.

Griffin: Has a butt. [laughs] Has a defined butt. Whether or not you are attracted to Spider-Man, you can look at Spider-Man and be like, “And there’s the butt!”

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: If you could do that at Slimer with the same amount of certainty...

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Hold on, I’m gonna have to—

Justin: No, Slimer—

Griffin: Paul! Paul, bring up—Paul, bring up Slimer!

Travis: I'm gonna have to ruin my phone.

Justin: Now—[chuckles]

Travis: Hold on. [chuckles]

Justin: It’s just—

Griffin: And Paul, don't bring up one of your weird, sexy pictures of Slimer!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] It's just the hole where the hot dogs fall out, right? I mean, wherever the whole hot dogs are sliding out of his body, that's the butt.

Griffin: There are a lot of internet memes of Spider-Mans, en flagrante, smacking butts. That exists! That's out there, I get it. Slimer? Fuckin' transparent! You pass through! Okay, hold on, Travis has just found the one picture of thick Slimer that I was waiting on.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: That's his—that's the small of his back, he doesn't have a butt.

[crowd chuckles]

Paul: Guys, it's tour manager Paul. I'm really afraid to show you the first picture that I found.

Griffin: Hold on, I'm gonna vet it.

[crowd chuckles and cheers]

Griffin: Absolutely not.

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: Show—okay, wait, wait, here's what we can do, show it for like a second.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Is there any way you can put it on just the monitor?

Paul: No. But I will say this, it came from a tweet. For the last several years, there's been a brutal battle between Ghost Busters fans and replica prop companies over the accuracy of Slimer's ass cheeks.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Could you... could you put some jelly on it?

Griffin: I was about to say!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Because if you put a good—

Travis: Except! Justin Tyler putting jelly on Slimer's butt would make it more slappable! Because you slap it and you'd be like, "Yeah, exactly!"

Griffin: "That's what I wanted."

Justin: No, no, no, it would have to be—you gotta put like a smackerel of a... a red... jelly... that was clear.

Travis: Red?!

Griffin: "Oh, god! What have I done?!"

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: "Oh, god!"

Justin: Hey, guys—okay, listen—

Travis: Jelly on Spider-Man, sandpaper on Slimer!

Justin: You guys, the important thing about putting jelly on things—

Griffin: Dry Slimer out, Travis has got it.

Justin: If you—the important thing about putting jelly on things is not that—ugh... The important thing about putting jelly on things is not that they touch it and come back with jelly, because then, you've already lost. They need to see the jelly is there and then be deterred because of the impact of the impact of the jelly. If they see the goop on Slimer, they're not gonna wanna touch the bottom. They were already only dared to anyway. So, they don't wanna touch it 'cause they don't want the jelly on their hands.

Griffin: That's sweet, Justin. You're so sweet.

Travis: I love that, Justin, you gentle mother fucker.

Griffin: What other reason could anyone have for touching Slimer's butt?

Travis: Hey, do you want the actual answer?

Jake: Very much.

Travis: You're gonna put a tip jar at the front. Two tip jars. And it says, "Did you slap Slimer's butt or Spider-Man's butt?" And they're gonna walk up to it and be like, "Meh." And put money in them 'cause they know what they fuckin' did.

Griffin: They know what they fucking did.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Don't—do not—listen!

Justin: Wait, I thought it was voting. Like, which one did you like slapping better?

Griffin: No, no, no.

Justin: No?

Travis: No, no, no, this is—this is just penance. [chuckles]

Griffin: Yeah. Jake, do not put a suggested donation. You will make so much fucking money from somebody who's like, "Oh, shit. I thought I could slap Slimer's ass and be the first one. I'm gonna put 100 fucking dollars in here."

Justin: Now, you are running the risk of like if someone gets to the jar before they see Slimer and they slip a 20 in there and be like, "I will be back with you in a bit."

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "I missed that on my first go around and I've gotta avail myself of the facilities, if you'll excuse me."

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Listen, all I'm saying is in this day and age, there are politicians who can get away with anything. Imagine you watch a senator walk in and smack Slimer's ass as hard as they can and then they turn around and you see—they see you looking and you're like, "Jar." And you don't even have to say it, from my silence, it's implied. [chuckles]

Griffin: I just actually read on the news that Slimer paid \$20 to slap Ted Cruise on the ass.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Does that help?

Jake: So much, thank you.

Griffin: Thank you so much.

Justin: Yeah, thank you, thank you.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: All right. Hey, hey, this is the first—I'm really excited because—

Griffin: [chuckles] Paul texted, so long ago, 'pissaigon.'

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Like 100 years ago. Thank you so much, Raleigh, for having us. We appreciate you. Thank you.

Griffin: Thank you.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: So good.

Griffin: Thank you to the Meymandi Concert Hall—did I say that—or is it Mah-Maan? Man, I got—

Travis: Mey-maahndi.

Griffin: Meymandi.

Travis: My Mandy.

Justin: Why are you saying it?

Griffin: You shouldn't have said.

Justin: Now, we don't any idea!

Travis: Covering bases.

Griffin: We didn't all need to be wrong.

Justin: Thanks to Paul, Amanda and Rachel for making this show possible.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Thank you to Wonderful for—

Griffin: Oh, Travis, please!

Justin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: For opening for us. But mostly, Rachel. 'Cause Griffin wasn't gonna be here—

Justin: Yeah, thanks, Rachel.

Griffin: Thank you! Thank you to Rachel. Thank you to my son, Henry, who as I was coming up to do the show, the elevator doors were closing and I said like, "Bye, buddy." And as the doors were closing, he said, "I'll miss you, little sailor man." [mouths smoke bomb sound]

[crowd laughs and cheers]

Griffin: So fucking funny.

Justin: Okay—

Travis: And he said it—picture in your heads how you wish he had said it to Griffin. He did.

Griffin: Correct, that's right.

Justin: Exactly like that. Okay, are you—

Travis: "I'll miss you, little—"

Griffin: I've looked forward to this for a couple of weeks.

Travis: Oh, yeah, yeah, yeah.

Justin: Me too. Are you all ready?

Travis: Oh, thank you to Liz for doing my makeup.

Griffin: Thank you to Liz. And thank you to Montaigne for the use of our theme song, My Life Is Better With You, it's so good.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Did we say thank you to Rachel?

Griffin: Yes.

Justin: Okay.

Travis: Thank you to Amanda.

Griffin: Yes.
