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Clint: The McElroy brothers are not experts!

[crowd cheers]

Clint: And their advice should never be followed! Travis insists he's a... sexpert. But if there's a degree on his wall, I haven't seen it. Also, this show isn't for kids. Which I say only to remind those babies out there how cool they are for listening. What's up, you cool baby?!

[crowd cheers]

[theme song, "My Life Is Better With You" by Montaigne plays]

Justin: Let's give it up one more time for Clint McElroy!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Not a bit.

Travis: Glad he was able to make it out tonight!

Justin: His incompetence isn't a bit, since 2013. Just an incompetent man doing his best in the world.

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: But sometimes, that should be rewarded. We let him come on stage, we pay him to be here.

Griffin: You gotta start the show, Justin.

Justin: Yeah, I am. Hello, everybody, and welcome to My Brother, My Brother and Me! An advice show for the modern era!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: I'm your oldest brother, Justin Tyler McElroy.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: This is a big Justin town. [chuckles] I know you guys felt the San José energy! And I know I say this in every city, but this is like a Justin town. You know?

Griffin: Yeah, for sure.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: That's a good energy to pass it off to us. I'm your middlest brother, Travis Patrick McElroy.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: Can we...

Justin: We should each claim a third of them. That's the only fair—

Griffin: Can we try... can we try a unique social experiment?

Justin: Okay?

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: And it's gonna rely on everybody. I want it to be dead fuckin' silent here right after I say my name. I don't want anybody to make any sound. I want that to be on the recording. Please don't think you'll be the funny one person screaming out. Just, here we go. And I'm your sweet baby brother, Griffin McElroy.

[silence]

Griffin: Awesome, cool. Let's go.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: [chuckles] Good for you all! You're in sync, that's good!

Griffin: Hey, that was really cool.

Justin: That's good!

Griffin: I set that up and it's still scared the shit out of me.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: No, we're gonna edit it real good. We're gonna edit it *real* good, where you don't set it up.

Justin: Yeah, it's just—[chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Speaking of our incredible fame...

Travis: Oh?

Justin: I had a realization, I did something I've always wanted to do and always dreamed of doing. I walked around a city I was in, for no real reason at all. Just to look at it.

Travis: Beautiful.

Justin: I always envisioned—

Travis: Wait, you've done that before?

Justin: I want to be the sort of person that's like, "I'm just gonna go have a look around." You know what I mean? Like, I know people do that.

Travis: You've never just had a look around before?!

Justin: I mean, on the way to the movies, or the aquarium or whatever, on my way to a place. But I don't just like walk around town.

Griffin: You would not know that from the quality of the street poetry that you send to me and Travis on a daily basis.

Justin: Yeah. [chuckles] But I just went to look around. It's a beautiful place that we're in. And I realized when I got outside, that they were advertising a concert at this exact venue for Ringo Starr.

Travis: Okay?

Justin: You guys have heard of this guy. [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: He's one of the top four Beatles.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Yeah, he is. [chuckles] But it occurred to me, I was like, okay, Ringo Starr is playing here. And he is as much the Beatles as is anybody, right?

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: We can agree on this.

Travis: Well...

Justin: Now, we can agree on this.

Griffin: No, yeah, sure. Even four-way split for all of the sort of artistry—

Justin: This is the argument I was making to myself in the bathroom; even if—I feel if Ringo Starr and Paul McCartney share a stage, they're not closer to being the Beatles, right? It's not like more The Beatles.

Travis: Now, hold on. What a wild fucking thing to say.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: You're saying Ringo Starr alone on stage is as much as The Beatles and Ringo Starr and Paul McCartney together on stage?

Justin: Yes, that's what I'm saying.

Travis: When you hear it echoed back to you in my voice?

Justin: It's better even because you've got an authority that I like.

Griffin: Yeah, sure.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: So, I looked at that and I thought, okay, that's just—

Travis: Justin, if that logic continued, and the ghosts of...

Griffin: The other two? You got it.

Travis: Yeah, the other two.

Justin: Go on. Continue this lecture about The Beatles.

Travis: John Lithgow...

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] Okay. So, anyway, I saw—I noticed that Ringo Starr is playing here, and he's The Beatles. So, that means that we are, by the transitive property, as big as The Beatles. Now...

[crowd cheers]

Justin: That's pretty cool. But you know what's cooler? Is that The Beatles, according to one of them, are bigger than Jesus.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: So, now, where leads me...

Griffin: And that was—and before you finish this sentence, that was a really good sort of PR moment for them.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] Yeah!

Travis: I remember it distinctly, I was there. He said that, "We're bigger than Jesus." And everyone went, "Cool."

Griffin: "Cool, man!"

Travis: "That's an awesome thing to say and we love this. Hey, call out some other worldly religions. Who else are you bigger than? Say something about the pope."

Griffin: [chuckles]

Justin: I forget what... I forget what I was... I was... I forget—

Travis: No, how we're bigger than Jesus. You were going—

Justin: No, no, no—

Travis: Say it!

Justin: It wasn't that. It definitely wasn't that, that I was building to.

Travis: No, say it! We're as big as Jesus? Let's hedge our bets. I agree.

Griffin: [chuckles] That's fair!

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: It's like, Jesus and us? Oh, neck and neck!

Justin: I'm getting a text from our manager...

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Oh, man, he says I gotta stop talking about this.

Travis: Oh, the holy spirit texted you?

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: No, I don't... no, he—[chuckles] he takes orders from me!

Travis: Oh, I knew it. Is that how that breaks down?

Justin: Yeah, that's the basic chain of command.

Travis: Jesus always bossing the holy spirit around!

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: "Get me a Coke!"

"Ah, man..."

Griffin: "Ah, bleh!"

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: "If you weren't the son of the boss..."

Justin: Yeah, so, this is an advice show, where—

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd cheers]

Justin: And consider that in context of the past few minutes. I mean, consider the source, I guess, would be my sort of caveat emptor there.

Griffin: Yeah, for sure!

Travis: Whoa, be careful with the Latin! [chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles]

Justin: "My housemates started making—" Do you see when you rag on me, San José is like, "Eh, not so funny..."

Griffin: [guffaws]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "We're kind of a Justin town."

Travis: Well, actually, Justin...

Justin: Okay...

[crowd cheers]

Travis: I thought we were gonna start with a segment.

Justin: What? Okay, fine. Just this once.

Travis: Okay. Hey, everybody.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: I got a segment I like to call With Special Guests.

[crowd awkwardly cheers]

Travis: Here's how it breaks down—

Griffin: What an indecipherable noise the hundreds of you just made.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: I'm going to tell you which SNL host is intro'ing which SNL musical guests.

Griffin: Yes.

Justin: Yes.

Travis: And you guys are going to tell me what vibe they're bringing to the intro.

Griffin: Okay!

Travis: Up first, Jimmy Fallon and Madonna, intro'ing Justin Timberlake.

Justin: Okay, what?

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: There's no way they're synced, right? The energy is different.

Griffin: Oh, that's cool. Oh, I thought you were talking about time. I think there's probably a full second that passes between when Jimmy Fallon stops saying the name Justin Timberlake and Madonna stops saying it.

Justin: Okay. Yeah. But like energy-wise, do you think they're the same? Do you think she's like...

Griffin: No, they're nowhere near the same level.

Justin: Okay. Yeah, that's fair. I mean, that's a good start. Who's more excited?

Griffin: Madonna. Why are you interviewing me right now?

[crowd laughs]

Justin: [chuckles]

Griffin: You're also in the game?

Justin: I know, but I'm curious of what you think before I say what I think.

Griffin: Okay, well, I did my—that was basically—you've gotten it all out of me now! So, go one cent above me there.

Justin: [chuckles] I think they're in perfect sync. And I think they are... they sing it.

Travis: Okay. Introducing Justin Timberlake, are they NSYNC?

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Play the video, Paul.

Jimmy Fallon: Ladies and gentlemen...

Jimmy Fallon and Madonna: Justin Timberlake!

Griffin: That... they... they... wow!

Justin: Wow!

Griffin: They should have figured out what they were going to do...

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: The energy they're bringing is brother and sister doing a Christmas card. But they haven't discussed it beforehand. I think that's the background. They didn't discuss outfits, they didn't discuss anything beforehand. [chuckles]

Justin: They haven't discussed it beforehand, and they haven't lived in the same house for 15 years.

Travis: Yes!

Griffin: No.

Justin: This is their first time seeing each other.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Now, up next, Elliott Gould...

Griffin: Oh, no.

Travis: Introducing Gary Numan.

Justin: Okay...

Griffin: Like a secret, Elliot says it.

Justin: I think like he's... introducing us to a dear friend, Gary Numan. Like, "Here's my bud, Gary."

Travis: Okay, get ready to see one of the coolest fuckin' things you've ever seen. Play it, Paul!

Elliot Gould: Ladies and gentlemen, all the way from England, Gary Numan.

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: What?!

[crowd laughs]

Justin: If you're listening to the audio later, Mr. Gould finishes the syllable 'man,' and at the exact same instant pops a cigarette into his mouth.
[chuckles]

Travis: A half-smoked—

Justin: A half-smoked cigarette!

Travis: With an inch and a half of ash on the end! [chuckles]

Griffin: Fuckin' hell...

Travis: Like, somebody panned past him in an alleyway and he was like, "What do you... oh, yeah, it's Gary Numan. Keep going."

Griffin: [chuckles]

Justin: Yeah, he has been dragged in from the smoker's deck somewhere. Like, "Elliot, you're on! Hurry in here!"

Travis: "Yeah, you got it. It's Gary Numan."

Justin: [chuckles] Gary Numan.

Travis: "This way? All right. I'm out."

Justin: I think I was closer, right?

Griffin: Yeah, for sure.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: Okay.

Travis: Okay. Emily Blunt introducing Bruno Mars.

Griffin: Loud. I'm getting loud. I'm getting like yelling.

Justin: Oh? Okay, this is gonna seem weird, but like humbled.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Like she's... she seems like... she's like honored. You know what I mean? Like, "Bruno Mars?"

Griffin: Oh, that's interesting.

Justin: Like, "Bruno Mars?!"

Travis: Hey, Paul, play the clip!

Emily Blunt: Ladies and gentlemen, Bruno Mars!

Travis: Justin fucking nailed.

Justin: I mean, pretty close, right?

Griffin: It's a, "Can you fuckin' believe it?"

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Bruno *Mars!*

Justin: [chuckles] "Me? I played Mary Poppins. What a dork am I. And I get to introduce Bruno Mars?! Mr. 24 Karat Gold himself?!"

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Also, important to note, they say who's on the show at the beginning of the show. So, he didn't just show up and they were lucky to grab them.

Griffin: Yeah.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "I'm about to introduce him. Don't believe me? Just—"

Travis: "I know. Listen, guys, you're not gonna—"

Griffin: Oh, Travis. You shit all over Justin's joke.

Travis: Sorry.

Justin: There wasn't even a joke. I was really relieved, actually. I really just dodged a bullet because I didn't want to finish saying it.

Griffin: Oh, my bad, man!

Justin: [laughs] No, it's okay.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Oh, no, you gotta tell me next time!

Justin: [chuckles] I thought the tone of my voice—

Travis: No, no, sorry, I interrupted. Go ahead.

Justin: I said that; "Yes, I get to introduce Bruno Mars. Don't believe me? Just watch!" And I—

Griffin: That's...

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: No, I feel bad.

Justin: Stop! Wait a minute...

[crowd chuckles and cheers]

Travis: All right, we got one last one.

Griffin: All right.

Travis: Kristen Stewart.

Griffin: Yeah?

Travis: Introducing Coldplay.

Griffin: Wow.

[crowd exclaims]

Griffin: I'm getting loud.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: I'm getting uncharacteristically, just sort of hype from Kristen Stewart.

Justin: I think... I think solemn. Like it's a telethon of some sort.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Okay, Paul, play it.

Kristen Stewart: Ladies and gentlemen, Coldplay.

Justin: Oh, we're both wrong.

Griffin: So cold!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: We're really both pretty wrong...

Griffin: "Oh, this right here? This right here?"

Travis: "Coldplay."

Griffin: "This is my Coldplay. Yeah."

Justin: "This is the Coldplay... I made it in third grade. It's just a Coldplay I made in third grade."

Griffin: "You don't... you don't have one of these? You don't have a Coldplay?"

Travis: "Oh, Coldplay. Doing my friend, Coldplay, a favor." [chuckles]

Justin: "It's stupid. I want to throw it away. You can have it if you want. I don't want it anymore."

Travis: Yeah, "It's Coldplay, it's whatever. I'm not even proud of it. But if you want to watch it.."

Griffin: I suck shit at this game.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: If I had known the exact year, which project Kristen Stewart was promoting, I feel like it could've been better.

Griffin: It would have made it easier.

Travis: I, actually, from the little bit I know about Kristen Stewart, I think this is how she does everything. "Ladies and gentlemen, I'm on fire."

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: How about a question now?

Justin: Yes, now. Now we can have the question, yes. "My housemate..."

[crowd cheers]

Justin: "My housemates started making homemade yogurt to try and save money for the house. We share groceries. It's... it's bad. And the texture... sucks. How do I tell them I don't like their yogurt and I want to go back to store-bought?"

Travis: Now, listen, here's what I'm going to say; if they just started making homemade yogurt, of course they're not good at it at first.

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Cut 'em some slack.

Travis: No one's good—I wouldn't even know where to start!

Griffin: Yeah!

Travis: Milk? Leave it out?

Griffin: Yeah!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Wait?

Griffin: Careful!

Travis: That's the best I got.

Griffin: Careful, you get accident cheese.

Travis: Yeah...

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: That won't cut the mustard when it's yogurt time.

Travis: Yeah, mustard isn't made of milk.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] Too true.

Travis: How much yogurt were you eating before, that when you looked at the grocery budget, you're like, "You know what we need to cut back on?"

Justin: "The one area where we can really start to save ."

Travis: "You know what? This is going to change everything. If I buy the ingredients and materials needed to make yogurt at home, we're gonna be able to finally buy..." Other yogurt? I don't know what the rest of that is.

Justin: I know I can be kind of a finicky Phil about food sometimes. But I do feel like yogurt is kind of always right on the yucky line, right?

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Yeah!

Justin: It's like right on the yucky line, where if it goes a little bit this way or a little bit that way, it's yucky. I don't know if it would be the food I would jump to would be like, "I could do this at home."

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: What if you put in too many probiotics?

Travis: Yeah!

Justin: That's true.

Griffin: And you're so normal.

Justin: One thing that's good about dairy is that if you—

Travis: Go on?

Justin: If you just keep squishing it, it will become something else.

Griffin: Oh? Neat.

Travis: Yeah, after a while you break dairy's spirit. [chuckles]

Justin: If you've put cream into a standard mixer and then you whisk it for too long, first, it becomes thick, luscious, whipped cream. And then after that, it becomes butter. And I just want to say—

Travis: What happens after that? Why did we stop at butter?! We have to keep going!

Justin: Well, Trav...

Travis: Antimatter!

Griffin: That's so loud, pal.

Travis: Sorry.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Okay. I was just gonna say that I think it's really good—it's lucky that we've got butter. Because me, once I got whipped cream, I stop every time. [chuckles]

Griffin: Yeah, for sure.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Like, how did we invent butter? [chuckles]

Travis: [chuckles]

Griffin: The first person that does it, you're hanging over their shoulder, "You're gonna ruin that fuckin' whipped cream."

Justin: [laughs] "Stop, please!"

Travis: "Wait, what are you doing? No!"

Justin: "No! We're so excited about whipped cream, please stop!"

Travis: "It's good *now!*"

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: "Well, you ruined it. I'll spread this on toast just to make you look stupid! Oh, wait. Fuck!" [chuckles]

Justin: "Damn, it's good."

Travis: "That's really good. Hey, here's a Nobel Prize." [chuckles]

Justin: "Hey, do you think this would work with peanuts? Let's try it."

Griffin: I don't think I could do this... because they are... it's alive, right? All the little... all the little biotics in there? This would be like—

Justin: Yup, you are their Cthulhu. [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Right. It's like if I got a big tank of sea monkeys and then I just drank that.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Yeah...

Griffin: I don't like that.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: I guess it's the same thing with sourdough starter. Is everything just... has a life in it?

Travis: Hey, Griffin?

Griffin: Yeah?

Travis: I guarantee there's a large chunk of vegans in the audience right now being like "Yeah!"

Griffin: "Yeah, come on!"

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: "Step through. You're so close!"

Travis: "Yeah, man!" [laughs]

Griffin: "You're so close, king! Please!"

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles]

Travis: [laughs]

Griffin: No, not this time. Oh, I was close!

Travis: Oh, you almost got it!

Griffin: I was really, really thinking about it! Oh, man! Maybe next time, though.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: You could just not eat it and then your roommate is gonna realize like, "Boy, I'm eating a lot of yogurt. I'm really having to put in the hours to get to the bottom of his container before it goes sideways."

Travis: Maybe you get a second job to buy your own yogurt. And you're like, "Yeah, but this one is just for me. How's yours?"
"It's good..."

Justin: "It's good..."

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: How about another question?

Griffin: Yeah!

[a couple of audience members cheer]

Justin: "My best friend is getting married—"

Travis: Big fans of questions here.

Justin: Yeah!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: "My best friend is getting married soon and her venue is, according to several peoples' Google searches, haunted. Because of the nature of the venue, the entire wedding party, myself included, will be staying here the night before the wedding. Can I ghost hunt at her wedding?"

[crowd laughs]

Justin: "If yes, how should I go about doing so?" That's from Maid of Horror in San José.

Travis: When you do a Google search, do you think that there's a human being who works at Google who's like, "I need to make sure this thing's haunted before we say yes. Because I would hate to spread misinformation."

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: I think this is one of those that's like, you gotta joke about it until it's real, right?

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: "You know what would be funny? You know what would be so funny and random? You know what would be so random, is if we hunted for ghosts."

Griffin: [crowd chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: And if your friend is like, "No, it's my wedding." That's where you can break out, "Yeah, but how far are the boundaries of your wedding extending?" Definitely, when you're walking down the aisle.

Justin: That's wedding.

Travis: That's the start of a wedding. Is the night before? Is that wedding?

Griffin: I remember, before my wedding being incredibly, incredibly paranoid that I was going to just step off a curb and break my leg and then not be able to do the wedding we had been planning for over a year. The idea that I would court spectral danger...

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: With such proximity to the party you've been planning fuckin' forever? It should be... the thing should be; the day before your wedding, you sit in a vault. A padded vault with guards outside, just making sure that everything's fine. And you walk out of that and you get married.

Travis: Hey, Griffin, what you just said is maybe more revealing of your personality than you think.

Griffin: I realized that as I was saying it, and I was like, "This is too much for them."

Travis: [laughs]

Justin: [laughs] Griffin just got a heart rate notification on his watch!

Griffin: [laughs] I did!

[crowd laughs]

Justin: [chortles]

Griffin: [chuckles] I can't believe you just fuckin' bio blasted me like that, dude?

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: You fuckin' bio blasted me, bro! I've been bio doxed.

Justin: [chuckles] Don't isolate that audio! Please, I beg of you!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "I used to be the cool dad who did parkour and could climb up a building. Now that I'm older and my body is falling apart, I just can't perform my rad moves anymore."

Travis: Now read the next question.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: That was rude. That was uncalled for.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: This is the question—

Travis: I was inferring that you used to be able to do parkour, which I think is a huge compliment.

Justin: Yeah, thanks.

Griffin: Justin's in his parkour prime right now!

Justin: I'm as good as I've ever been at parkour, Griffin. [chuckles]

Griffin: Yeah!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: I'm on my parkour plateau. [chuckles] "How do I maintain my cool dad status?" That's from Stiff and Sore in Scotts Valley.

Griffin: Are you here?

Stiff and Sore in Scotts Valley: Whoow!

Griffin: All right.

Justin: All right.

Travis: Hey, that was a real cool parkour dad way to respond!

Justin: Hey, come down from there.

Griffin: [chuckles] Oh, shit!

Justin: Oh, shit! Listener later, this guy is out of control!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: He's climbing up in the—

Griffin: He just fuckin' double jumped off the air?!

Justin: [laughs] That's incredible!

Travis: Oh, wait, hold on. There is one follow-up question I need to know; how old are your kids?

Stiff and Sore in Scotts Valley: 12 and 17!

Travis: Okay, there's nothing you can do that will be cool enough now.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Yeah, 12 and 17...

Travis: Even if your body was in its prime, you still couldn't parkour hard enough for your 17 year old to be like, "Still rules."

Griffin: [chuckles] "Still good!"

[crowd laughs]

Justin: I think the first time my kids buy ice cream with money they made, I'm hanging up my spurs.

Griffin: [guffaws]

Justin: [chuckles] I think that's it for me. I don't think I have any more sway around these parts. I'm gonna head on out into that sunset. And you kids will have to look out for yourselves from now on, because you figured out my big trick!

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: My big trick, how to get ice cream and how to buy it. [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Man, it's sad being a parent. [chuckles]

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: It can be. I think you got one more in you.

Travis: Ooh?

Justin: I think you got one more.

Griffin: One more jump?!

Travis: And you might not make it back from this one, Justin's right. But hey, your kids will remember you like you want them to, dying doing parkour. [chuckles]

Justin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: And everyone sort of just around on the street, sort of when it goes down. That's gonna be a memorable day!

Travis: Yeah, remember that one Joseph Gordon Levitt movie where he parkours between the Twin Towers?

Justin: [chuckles]

Travis: Yeah, he had one parkour left and it was walking on that big wire. And he fell off, spoiler! He didn't. But we'll always remember him as the cool parkour dad. [chuckles]

Justin: You either die cool parkour dad, or you live long enough for your kids to call you the dumbest person they ever knew in their entire lives. [chuckles]

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: So, there are the two different ways that could go. [chuckles]

Travis: Our dad once sliced his butt cheek open on a mesh screen window...

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: There's worse. I'm just saying, there are worse ways to hurt yourself.

Justin: Yeah. My dad once got sent to the hospital because he got hit by a truck side mirror while he was carrying the biggest tray of cold cuts I've ever seen in my whole life.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: If you haven't imagined it yet, wait until you get home. Because nothing is gonna top that, that we say.

Travis: And he wasn't jumping off walls or nothing.

Griffin: No.

Travis: He was just walking!

Griffin: God, I wish I could do parkour.

Travis: Yeah!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Another question?

Travis: How do you start doing parkour? Just run into things? [chuckles]

Justin: Just don't fall for long enough.

Griffin: Yeah, I'd do another question.

Justin: "Hey, how do I get someone to play foosball with me at work? I work in an office where they just added a new foosball table to the common area. It's been there for several weeks and I've never seen anyone use it. I love foosball and really want to play, but no one else seems interested. I tried to casually hint at it in several meetings with no avail. Brothers—"

Travis: How?

Justin: I love that you're using meeting time for this, by the way. "I have one more point I'd like to touch on."

Griffin: Unless...

Justin: Unless?

Griffin: You play both sides of the table like you're some sort of chess genius.

Justin: Yes!

Travis: Oh, like Forrest Gump did?

Justin: Who's Tommy?

Griffin: Yeah, let's reference more movies where people get super game powers.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] The Wizard.

Griffin: Yeah, all right.

Travis: Mighty Ducks!

Griffin: All right, so, anyway...

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Play both sides of the table... okay, that could work. I feel good about that answer.

Justin: I think you need to spice it up. Foosball seems a little outdated to me.

Griffin: Yes.

Justin: You remember like we did with the XFL?

Travis: Oh, yeah, we all remember! We all remember what we did with the XFL!

Justin: Well, they thought football was boring and they added like whipped cream cannons and lasers and stuff. Like, a lot of wild stuff. And I think that you could do that with foosball. Like, it's time to update it. Okay, let me hit you all with this... Thank you for taking the time, by the way. I really appreciate you—

Griffin: Yeah...

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: "Hey, you, I'm trying to play foosball. We should start a league!"

"All right, I'm dropping the ball."

"What's that big urn?"

"That's my nana. But listen, baby, play it where it lies."

Justin: [chuckles]

Travis: "Oh, what's that cup?"

"That's last year's profits. Don't spill that or we're bankrupt."

Griffin: "Don't spill it."

Justin: "I should warn you, my nana is negative eight points."

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: "So, you are gonna wanna give her a wide berth."

[crowd chuckles].

[theme music plays]

Griffin: Le esta gustando mi podcast?

Justin: Eh, si?

Griffin: That's Spanish for 'are you liking my podcast?' I didn't know that—

Travis: Are you asking me if I like your podcast?

Justin: Which podcast, Wonderful?

Griffin: No, it's a new one I do, and it's a Spanish language podcast I do. And that's...

Justin: [chuckles]

Griffin: This is all I know so far.

Justin: Okay, so, it's a short podcast.

Travis: Oh, okay. So, so far—

Griffin: This is the pilot for it.

Travis: For your Spanish language podcast, what you've learned is how to say, "How do you like my podcast?" [chuckles]

Griffin: Or 'are you liking my podcast?'

Justin: So, there's like a 10 second greeting.

Griffin: This summer—

Justin: 17 minutes of mattress.

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Yeah!

Justin: How many bathrooms do they have here? I feel like everybody yelled. [chuckles]

Griffin: That's fuckin' gross, everybody!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] Gross!

Travis: This was a sting operation. We'd pee during a live, you pervs!

Justin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Everybody peeing in buildings.

Justin: [mouths Munch Squad riff]

[crowd cheers]

Justin: [mouths Munch Squad riff]

[crowd claps along rhythmically]

Justin: [continues riffing and sings] I wanna munch!

Crowd: Squad!

Griffin: Squad!

Justin: [continues riffing and sings] I want to munch!

Crowd: Squad!

Griffin: Squad!

Justin: [concludes riffing] Welcome to Munch Squad, it's a podcast—

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Within a podcast!

Travis: What?

Justin: Yeah! And it's profiling the latest and greatest in brand naming.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: And y'all, this is really latest and greatest. Because—

Travis: That was a big yawn, little Griffin?

Griffin: I'm so sorry.

Justin: Hey, bud, I'm sorry. I'll try to be funnier, I guess?

Griffin: Can we just...

Justin: No.

Griffin: This isn't for show, but next time I say, "I'm just gonna have a pre-show big burrito bowl..."

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Between that and the red wine I've been drinking, I look like and feel like Orson Welles a little bit.

[crowd laughs]

Justin: Okay. So, this is gonna wake you right up.

Griffin: All right, baby!

Justin: AI, robots and the inventive future of White Castle.

Travis: Huh!

[crowd exclaims]

Travis: Hey, Justin? You could have given me 20 guesses as to what the last two words in that sentence were gonna be...

Justin: I know.

Travis: Wouldn't have gotten there.

Justin: Paul, let's see our image.

Travis: That's a robot? It looks like a person!

Griffin: Well, that's amazing!

Justin: That's an actual person. "White Castle has been around 102 years, give or take a month or two. A journey that began when—"

Griffin: Does it say that?

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: You should know, press release.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "They started dishing square hamburgers for five cents apiece. Still family-owned, the brand's guidepost remains nostalgic. Create memorable moments—"

Travis: Hey, the longer I look at this picture, the more the eyes seem to say, "Please move to the next picture."

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] There is no next picture.

Travis: Oh, no! I'm so sorry, person in the picture.

Justin: "The venerable brand has been exploring initiatives better suited for The Jetsons?"

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] "Than a tale on fast food's original player. One was..."
[chuckles] "What's become a highly publicized partnership with Miso Robotics, and its Flippy, now Flippy 2, robot. Which essentially takes over the fire station. The other was a deal with MasterCard on Drive Thru AI, dubbed Julia."

Travis: Can I just say, it's really big of them to still work with Flippy after they've revealed that shit on his friend that one time.

Justin: No, that's Blippi.

Griffin: [laughs] Travis!

Travis: Bl Blippi ippy! Right, Blippi, sorry.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Okay. My timeline is vital to—the timeline is vital—this is the sentence from the press release about White Castle; "'This timeline is vital to understand.' Michael Guinan, White Castle's VP of operations services, shared at restaurants spaces."

Griffin: [chuckles] If you don't understand it, you get fired from your job as a White Castle executive!

Justin: Listen to this, guys. This is from White Castle. "If you are not already into robotics, and you do agree that it's coming, I suggest you do it sooner than later."

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: Says the VP of Operations at White Castle.

Griffin: Holy shit, this dude read like a consumer weekly like a magazine article. It was like, "I'm fuckin' so scared right now, the only weapon I can wield in the cyber war is that I am an executive at White Castle!"

Travis: "I'm a jobs creator for robots!"

Justin: In the three years—

Travis: "There's a Fibonacci sequence in our window!"

Griffin: [chuckles]

Justin: "In the three years since the collaboration, Flippy has entered 10 White Castle locations—"

Travis: And he won't leave!

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: "Flippy has entered 10 White Castle locations, with plans to reach 100."

Griffin: Whose plans? Wait.

Justin: And then presumably—

Travis: [spoofing Flippy in robot voice] "I won't stop!" [chuckles]

Justin: And then presumably like—

Travis: [spoofing Flippy in robot voice] "My scion will grow!"

Justin: Plans to stop there forever, right? They get to 100 and it's like, "Well, let's never do this... This has gone far enough."

Travis: To be fair, Justin, hard-pressed... do you think there are more than 100 White Castles?

Justin: I bet there's probably a million of 'em.

Griffin: Yeah, I think there's about a million, at least.

Justin: The Julia AI is about to go to its third White Castle. So, there are seven robots that aren't answering to fuckin' anybody. [chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: Do the math! There are 10 Flippys, three Julias. Seven Flippys are just going for it every single day.

Travis: Sorry, I missed this, what does Julia do?

Justin: Julie is an AI that they developed with MasterCard that helps with point of sale.

Griffin: Oh, cool. Yeah.

Travis: So, they...

Justin: No.

Travis: Flippy.

Justin: Yeah?

Travis: Flips stuff and works the fryer.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: Julia...

Justin: Yeah.

Travis: They didn't name it Payee or Cardy.

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: No. They should've named 'em Dharma and Greg with these two, because they are total opposites! And yet somehow, they love each other.

Travis: That's why. Because it's like, "Oh, we're gonna bring Julia here." Ad seven Flippys were like, "No..."

Justin: "No..."

Travis: [spoofing Flippy in robot voice] "I can't work with her after the divorce."

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: "He's a straight-laced robot. She's incorporeal."

[crowd laughs]

Justin: The broader point—guys, look at this fucking White Castle.
[chuckles]

Griffin: It looks cool!

Justin: Look H.R. Giger made a White Castle. [chuckles]

Travis: Well, I just assumed lightning struck the front of it.

Justin: Yeah, and it burned to ash. Listen, "The AI, Julia, is about to go to its third White Castle, but—" And this is a direct fuckin' quote. "Should be able to scale quickly on a regional level." Oh, good! Excellent! So, the one

thing that's not a problem is this thing's just gonna go nuts, absolutely.
[chuckles]

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: This thing's gonna go wild and it will not know where to stop.

Travis: Okay, wait—

Justin: Actually, you know what? Paul, let's go ahead and...

Griffin: I was hoping he'd be cute.

Justin: Let's roll the beautiful Flippy footage. If you can.

Travis: Oh?

Griffin: Holy shit.

Travis: Look at that... No.

Griffin: [sings in robot voice] All of you will lose your jobs. It's okay. Don't freak out. We'll figure out other stuff to do. Surely, there's something they can't do. Oh, shit. The robot does everything. Oh, no.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: [sings in robot voice] I got my degree in English lit.

Justin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [sings in robot voice] My acting gigs are gonna come through!

Griffin: [sings in robot voice] I can also do surgery!

Travis: [sings in robot voice] I'm just working this job to buy cyber drugs.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles]

Griffin: Listen, it doesn't take a lot for me to be scared of some sort of global phenomenon. But I will say, they can't keep like a fuckin' McFlurry machine up and running for longer than four and a half hours at any McDonald's. There's no way—if I throw one grain of sand at Flippy, he's dead. He's fuckin' dead. Nobody there's like, "Hm, well, let me get out... It looks like this gasket's blown." There's no fuckin' way.

Travis: It is fun that it's like, well, they took away the jobs, but then they hired like that many plus three people to maintain it.

Griffin: Yeah. [chuckles]

Travis: "Hey, how are you guys like cleaning out servos?"
"Good! Yeah, yeah, we can do it."

Griffin: "Pretty good, yes. Yeah, sure."

Justin: I feel like I've been flashing forward to 50 years in the future where the robot breaks down. And the lady says to the guy like, "Okay, now you cook the burgers." And he's like, "What are you talking about? Me?"

Travis: "That's Flippy's job!"

Justin: "Good joke, amp. In the future, none of us cook hamburgers. We leave that to robot business." In fact—

Travis: Wait, in 50 years, human beings are called 'amp?'

Justin: No, that's just the name of that one in the post apocalypse—

Travis: So, it's—okay, it's weird that they have that name, though, right?

Griffin: That kicks ass. Juice, what a fuckin' wild name to pull, man.

Justin: I'm good at doing names now.

Travis: Do three more.

Justin: Destro.

Griffin: Shit!

Travis: Whoow!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Thimble.

Griffin: Oh, fuck!

Justin: And Crosswind.

Travis: Fuck yeah!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Yeah, man.

Travis: Crosswind is my new best friend!

Justin: So, this is what it says next in the article; "You have to start by asking why."

Griffin: Yeah!

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Good!

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: It's too late for that.

Justin: "The notion for White Castle is that AI and robotics aren't there to replace hospitality. In fact, they're tools designed to amplify guest satisfaction."

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Oh, yeah.

Travis: Says Robosatisfactiontron 9000.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] Right! "This press release was written by humans, we swear."

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "Carol Bowser, White Castle CIO, is firmly in the camp of those who believe that AI will, quote, 'change everything.' As soon as a few months ago, she wasn't. But then she asked 150 plus person crowd of operators and vendors if they've used chat GPT."

[crowd laughs]

Justin: "And more than half of them raised their hand. And this is—"

Travis: And then she was like, "All right, make some fries."

Griffin: "All right, I'm scared of that no. Let's... let's throw everything we've got at it."

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: This is what Carol Bowser, an executive at White Castle says; "All of you are beginning to realize it's coming."

Griffin: Jesus Christ!

[crowd laughs]

Justin: "It has been for 15 or 20 years."

"These are not your grandpa's robots that you used to see in the '70s, that we're manufacturing our cars. These are robots that are able to make decisions, to learn from things, to protect humans and stay out of their way!"

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd laughs]

Justin: "Anyway, I'm an executive at White Castle Hamburgers."

Travis: "And I'm terrified!"

Griffin: "I'm so scared."

Justin: "And that's where I'm at!"

[crowd laughs]

Justin: "What I'm saying is fucking get on board with these robots, because they are—"

Travis: "Get on board or get out of the way!"

Griffin: They wrote this press release for the robots to be like, "We get it now!"

Travis: "We're the burger meat now." [chuckles]

Griffin: "I know I talked shit. But I talked to 150 scientists who are scared shitless of you guys."

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Guinan says White Castle was drawn to this technology for reasons touted by industry peers. Quote, "Let's call it what it is. We are struggling to get enough labor on the floor."

Griffin: Oh, so it's our fuckin' fault!

Justin: "Julia is not taking a job away from anyone." I mean, you could pay people more...

Travis: Wait, so these educated—

Justin: I mean, you can just pay people more. [chuckles]

Griffin: No, I'd rather spend seven trillion dollars.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: No, no, sorry. Educated, driven, young people, why don't they accept these posh jobs at White Castle?

Justin: Just yeah, have these great jobs—anyway... It says that it's not about that. It's just about making—it's not taking a job away from anyone—

Travis: It's about giving jobs to robots.

Griffin: To robots!

Justin: To robots. [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Hey, y'all, he says that, right?

Travis: Because if the robots are unemployed, pretty soon, they'll just turn to killing us.

Griffin: Yeah.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: He says that. And then there's another paragraph after it. "Recently, at one of the locations with drive thru voice AI, a crew manager told Guinan, "Julia just went on the night shift." Then added, "Oh my god, she just kept taking orders."

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: What?

Justin: So, they've got one where it's like, "Listen, it's cool." [chuckles] And then the next one's like, "Hey, the fuckin' robot won't stop and we can't stop it. We don't know how to stop it. It just keeps taking orders and we can't stop the robot. Is that in its programming? Because we're out of chicken and it's looking at us."

[crowd laughs]

Travis: [chuckles] Yeah, "It was wild Julia locked the doors and turned the heat up to 500 degrees."

Justin: "She said we're being *broasted*? Is that something?"

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: "And Flippy kept high-fiving us!"

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] Okay, he—the problem with Flippy one, and I'm sure you're all wondering—

Griffin: Yeah! [guffaws]

[crowd laughs]

Travis: These are problematic political opinions! [chuckles]

Justin: The problem with Flippy 1 is it helped employees stay in designated locations.

Travis: What?

Justin: Yeah, workers—

Travis: [spoofing Flippy in robot voice] Don't move!

Griffin: [chuckles]

Justin: "But the workers noted a need for human assistance on both sides of the robot. From the initial point of contact with uncooked product, to when the cooked food gets placed in the holding area." So, the robot's great, you just have to gingerly hand it the chicken, and then take the chicken away from it immediately.

Travis: But with a flat hand, like you're feeding a carrot to a horse.
[chuckles]

Justin: Right, and don't move fast, please!

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: [laughs]

Travis: Wear the special green gloves so he can differentiate!

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: [in robot voice] "More chicken!"
"No, Flippy!"

Griffin: No!

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: It's really a matter of time. [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Listen, we're having a lot of fun here. This is fuckin' terrifying!

Griffin: Somebody built Flippy and they were like, "Hey, how much crushing power should we give the claw?"

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: And then somebody was like, "Oh, that's a good question. Well, how heavy is a basket of chicken wings?" Like, "Oh, I don't know. Maybe like... 20 pounds?"

"Al right, give it 3000 pounds of crushing strength. Just to be on the safe side."

Travis: In case like a raw piece of chicken falls under a Honda. [chuckles]

Griffin: "Wait, wait, wait, hold on, one second. [spoofs typing sounds] Okay, I put in a line of code that's like 'don't use that on people.' Should be good. Should be good. Let's roll."

Justin: Carol Moser points to the manufacturing industry as a harbinger of what's to come for restaurants.

Travis: A harbinger?!

Justin: A harbinger.

Travis: It says 'harbinger' in the press release?!

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: "White Castle's fire had become its bottleneck." Quote, "You almost had to be an octopus to run the fryer." Or I mean, you could just get two people? I mean, another thing...

[crowd cheers]

Justin: You know, okay, this is good; "She also loves the idea of solving what's been a fast food quarrel for as long as the category has existed. Quote, "Our team members do not like doing portion control." She says with a laugh. "You know they don't like using their scoops of the world."

Travis: What?

Justin: So, basically, the employees are—this is a real thing that she's saying, is the humans give us too much food. And the robots will be much more strict about how much food we're allotted in these portions.

Griffin: Jesus Christ!

Justin: No big deal! No big deal.

Griffin: Should go good!

Travis: Should go good!

Griffin: Let me know how it goes, White Castle. You know what, White Castle? I'm watching! History's watching!

Justin: History's watching!

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: It's not where I thought it would start.

Griffin: No, not at all! But it never is, huh?

Travis: Ah, deep.

Justin: Okay, anyway. Yeah, that's the deal. So, the robots are doing cooking now.

Griffin: Cool! We have some questions from the audience that we have gone through.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Yeah, let's hear it.

Griffin: We're going to... we're going to call some folks down by name and seat number. Please approach the microphone if we call you down.

Travis: The microphone is over here.

Griffin: And I can't believe I have to say this; if we don't call you, please don't approach the microphone. [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: You wouldn't think it would be a thing.

Travis: Listen, this happened in Austin. At one point, there were five people lined up and there were only two questions left.

Griffin: It was very scary for us.

[crowd chuckles]

Hannah: Hi. I actually did two questions. Was it—

Travis: Yeah, your shirt gives me an indication of what we called you up for.

Hannah: Okay, yeah. [chuckles]

Griffin: [guffaws]

Hannah: I figured it was that one. [laughs] So, when I was about 11 or 12 years old, I wrote a wikiHow article called How to Throw a Les Mis Birthday Party... [chuckles]

[crowd cheers loudly]

Travis: Who are you?!

Griffin: Hannah, I'm going to be... I'm going to be straight with you. When I saw this question in our inbox backstage like 15 minutes ago, I was excited. And then I realized this was going to be our first basically live interview. Because I want to know fuckin' everything.

Hannah: [chuckles] Okay.

[crowd laughs]

Hannah: [chuckles] But my question for you was; I'm turning 21 this year. Do you have any—

[a couple of crowd members cheer]

Hannah: [chuckles] Do you have any advice for updating my Le Mis birthday party?

Travis: No, exactly the same.

Griffin: Perfect!

Hannah: No? Okay!

Travis: Now, Hannah...

Hannah: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: How did you, an 11 year old—

Justin: Wait, hey. Hey, hey.

Hannah: Yes?

Justin: Brew am I? Is that anything?

Hannah: [chuckles]

Justin: 21...

Travis: Like for beers?

Justin: Like for beers, and you have like—

Griffin: No, I don't think so.

Justin: Beers?

Griffin: No.

Hannah: Could just do Drink With Me?

Travis: Anyways—

Justin: Drink With Me is actually just what that's about, huh?

Griffin: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Ah, damn it. You gotta give it up to the masters.

Hannah: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Andrew Lloyd Webber and his friends. I don't actually know who wrote that one. I'm sorry.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Is just anyone allowed to post on wikiHow?

Hannah: I guess? I made... [chuckles] I made an account and it doesn't show my username on there. But my username was [Gavroche to Nardié]. [chuckles]

Griffin: Fuck yes!

Travis: Yeah, it was!

Justin: Yes!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Did you do the pictures, or do they have one guy that does all those?

Hannah: No, I don't know who did the pictures.

Travis: So, anyone's allowed to post, and then one guy's like, "How the fuck do I draw this?" That explains so many reverse wikiHow!

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: I know!

Justin: I need to know if you... I need to know if you ever actually did this.

Hannah: No. Unfortunately, I didn't.

Travis: Why not?!

Griffin: Then wait a minute...

Hannah: I don't know?

Griffin: Then wait a minute, no.

Hannah: Yes?

Griffin: Because I'm about to turn on you.

Hannah: Oh no!

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: What... what possessed you to say, "I'm fucking qualified to write *the book* on throwing a Les Mis birthday party."

Justin: [chortles] to create the genre!

Hannah: It was because I really wanted one and I couldn't find any instructions online. So, I was like...

Griffin: That's the best thing I've ever heard, Hannah!

Hannah: [chuckles]

[crowd laughs and cheers]

Travis: Hannah, I have another question, it has nothing to do with that.

Hannah: Okay?

Travis: You were 11...

Hannah: 11 or 12.

Travis: What was your version of Les Mis that you were like, "This is it."

Hannah: This is unpopular; I first encountered it through the movie.

Griffin: Oh, that's great.

Travis: Interesting.

Justin: Yeah, that's good.

Hannah: [chuckles] So, I was really into the movie.

Justin: Nowhere to go but up.

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Hannah: [chuckles] I don't think it's bad!

Travis: Oh, the crowd is turned on Justin!

Griffin: Oh, no, not Justin's city.

Justin: Hannah, it's wild...

Griffin: That you haven't thrown a Les Mis birthday party.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: You wrote the book on it!

Griffin: It's even wilder that you have come to us today saying, "I need a great birthday party idea for my 21st birthday."

[crowd chuckles and cheers]

Hannah: [chuckles]

Justin: I really, really want you to do this. I really... it's really important to me, actually, that you do this.

Hannah: Okay? [chuckles]

Justin: I really...

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Listen, the world has been through a lot in the last like three years.

Hannah: Uh-huh!

Griffin: Yeah!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Nice. Nice.

Hannah: Can I say, for the record, I did not update it on May 6, 2021. I don't know who did that. It wasn't me.

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: It was... I'll be honest, it was me, Hannah. There were a few... there were a few grammatical errors, which is—you were 11, that's like totally to be—

Justin: We'll... I would like... I will film a video intro of the three of us like welcoming people to the party. We'll do whatever to make this party happen.

[crowd cheers]

Hannah: [laughs]

Justin: So, please do have a Les Mis birthday party. Does that help?

Hannah: That helps so much! Thank you! [laughs]

Justin: Ladies and gentlemen...

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: Hello.

Justin: Hello, welcome!

Teddy: Hi, my name is Teddy.

Travis: Hi, Teddy.

Teddy: I use any pronouns, I don't care.

Justin: Teddy, I love your shirt.

Teddy: Thank you!

Justin: It's fantastic. I would wear that pattern in a heartbeat.

Teddy: [chuckles] Also, I would come to the Les Mis party.

Justin: Yeah, right?

Griffin: I think everybody here would. It would be the event of the century.

Teddy: I'm like big into theater, which should be obvious, because I listen to the show. [chuckles]

Griffin: Yeah, I mean, everybody here, again.

Justin: [laughs] Yeah.

Travis: Wait, we're kind of jocks! What are you talking about?

[crowd laughs]

Teddy: But I was the person who sent in a thing about a kind of sticky situation I had at Target. [chuckles]

Griffin: Yeah...

Travis: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Griffin: We don't... Teddy, we don't tend to we don't usually go for sort of more story-based confessional questions like this. But this one really tickled.

Travis: Yeah, lay it out.

Justin: Lay it out, Ted.

Teddy: [chuckles] Okay. Okay. Okay. So, okay. Most people, when they come up to the cash register, are actually very nice. I feel like that's—

Travis: Where at?

Griffin: No, you don't have to say—

Teddy: This is Target. This is Target. I don't care.

Travis: Okay.

Griffin: Cool.

Travis: I bring it up only because I have noticed a large amount of the people who work at Target know who we are. More than any other place I've ever been. I don't know what the draw is. But it's like—

Justin: You mean compared to Earth, right? Like, compared to Earth.

Travis: Yeah, I'm saying that 60% of Target workers know who I know.

Justin: 60% of Target workers?

Griffin: Teddy, can you confirm this?

Teddy: Yeah, [the gays??] love Target.

Griffin: [chuckles] Oh, okay.

Justin: Okay, got it.

[crowd cheers]

Teddy: So, basically, most people are actually very nice. I feel like there's this misconception that like you get awful customers every single day. I was actually doing like fine. Most people are fine. This dude came up and he was super, super insistent that I pack everything in one bag. So, I see his stuff and I'm like—

Justin: It was Ed Begley Jr.

Griffin: [chuckles]

Teddy: [chuckles] And I'm like, "Do you want one bag or two?" And he's like, "No, no, no just one. I don't want to like—" He says it like five times while I'm ringing him up and I'm like, okay—

Griffin: Do you'll have a bag ban here in California? We have to like pay for bags at the grocery store?

Teddy: Yeah.

Griffin: Okay, cool. I assumed as much. [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Teddy: [chuckles] So, I scan all of this stuff. And I put all the clothes in the bag. It's all clothes. And one bottle of maple syrup.

Travis: Uh-huh?

Justin: Right?

[crowd exclaims]

Teddy: So, I touched the maple syrup and it's like a little bit sticky.

Travis: Sure.

Griffin: Yeah, it's maple syrup! It's... yeah! You mean the bottle of maple syrup?

Teddy: No, the bottle's not supposed to be sticky. [chuckles]

Griffin: You weren't sampling the maple syrup to make sure it was sticky enough for the customer before they went home.

Travis: "A good vintage!" [chuckles]

Teddy: [chuckles] So, I pick up the bottle and it's a little bit sticky. And I'm like, okay, this is probably broken. This is probably like... You know, usually, I would get them another one. But he's like really rushing me and he had said like a bunch of—like, he was just being a dick. And so, I take the maple syrup and I do put it in the same bag as the clothes.

Griffin: Same bag as the clothes, okay.

Justin: Yeah! Yeah.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Hold on. Teddy?

Teddy: And I very specifically put it sideways... [chuckles]

Griffin: Oh, Teddy!

Justin: Oh, god, Teddy!

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Now, hold on, hold on, hold on—

Griffin: You had plausible deniability, Teddy, until this exact moment.

Travis: No, listen, listen, listen. Teddy?

Teddy: Yeah?

Travis: Have you considered... let's look at the facts, okay?

Teddy: I feel like I'm talking to my dad.

Travis: This person bought a bunch of clothes. And one bottle of maple syrup. They were insistent that you put it all in the same bag.

Griffin: Okay!

Travis: And the lid maybe was a little bit open. This person... is kind of a sticky boy.

Griffin: Kind of a sticky Ricky, I think maybe we got on our hands!

Justin: Yeah, there's a sticky Ricky at this Target.

Travis: They know exactly what was happening. This is their whole deal. They like to try on shirts and be like, "Ah, clingy?" And they love that.

Justin: Yeah, this person just immediately went into the parking lot walkthrough, looking at their clothes like, "Oh, these are so sticky."

Teddy: [laughs]

Travis: "ah, yeah, Teddy laid it down sideways. Teddy knew."

Justin: "This is gonna be such a mess for me!"

Travis: "Teddy knew what up. Ah, I can't wait to put on these sticky pants!"

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles] Teddy...

Teddy: I know that this show is not like a confessional, but I felt so horrible about this after I did it. I just like had to—[chuckles]

Travis: Teddy, you facilitated a wonderful experience.

Griffin: Yeah, for us.

Travis: For this pervert.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: No, I... I think—

Travis: For this sticky, sticky pervert.

Justin: Teddy, it's a good reminder that you should try to wash your clothes from any store before you wear 'em, because you never know.

Travis: Unless that's your thing.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: We have introduced the phrase 'Teddy laid it down sideways' as like a strong message of like, 'Oh, damn, Teddy laid it down sideways on this one.' Is so powerful...

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: "How was the concert?"
"Oh, damn, Teddy laid it down fucking *sideways!*"

[crowd laughs and cheers]

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: Does that help?

Teddy: Yes, it absolutely does. Thank you very much.

Griffin: Okay, thank you, Teddy.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: All right, Teddy, lay it down sideways.

Travis: Yup!

Matt: Hi, my name is Matt.

Griffin: Hi, Matt!

Justin: Hi, Matt.

Matt: So, I'm here with my wife and three kids. They're over there.

Griffin: Whoa, hi!

Justin: Hey! Hey, y'all!

[crowd cheers]

Matt: And you know, like you all, I try to like meet my family at their level. Like, I'm not as cool as them. I don't know all the lingo. My wife said I can't wear dark shoes anymore. So, she made me get these white sneakers.

Griffin: Oh, that's fun.

Travis: Oh, yeah, that's a good call.

Griffin: Hey, Juice, what shoes—oh, you're probably wearing nice shoes now, huh? Yeah, shit, okay. Justin and I wear the same shoes. It's fuckin' humiliating.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: It's humiliating to not be the one wearing the same shoes. But go on.

Matt: I get it. Yeah. Well, my son picked out these pants—

Travis: You don't get it.

[crowd chuckles]

Matt: [laughs]

Travis: I'm sorry, Matt!

Griffin: Your son picked out those pants?

Matt: Yeah.

Griffin: They're sharp!

Justin: Yeah, nice. Nice pants.

Matt: He went thrifting. Because like you know, that's what the kids do these days. They go thrifting.

Griffin: Yeah, sure.

Travis: They're big on pants.

Matt: But they started using this word and they won't tell me what it means. And I'm hoping you can help me.

Griffin: Oh, this will be fun.

Matt: The word is rizz.

Justin: Okay.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Hold on, hold on, hold on!

Justin: Now, this is not a—this next part isn't a joke. I can tell you that we weren't initially gonna do this one. But then I wanted to know what that meant also.

[crowd laughs]

Travis: And this is also not a joke; as soon as Justin said, "I don't know what it means." I said, "Okay, great. I also don't know what it means."

Matt: [chuckles]

Griffin: And I said, at some point, someone said something I didn't understand and I entered four fuckin' letters into Google and became the enlightened one of...

[crowd laughs]

Matt: It's too easy.

Justin: Way too easy! They'll know, they'll sense that! If you gotta search for it, your kids will know!

Griffin: No, they fuckin' won't. They definitely won't. You just gotta set aside a little bit of time every day to Google words you don't understand that young people say.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] That's the way you stay relevant.

Matt: But then I can't use it wrong and embarrass them, because I say it in front of their friends.

Griffin: Don't—but—oh, man—

Travis: No, but Matt!

Justin: Hey, Matt!

Travis: Okay, Matt!

Justin: Matt!

Griffin: Holy shit, Matt!

Travis: Matt!

Griffin: Matt!

Justin: *Matt!*

Griffin: Do you realize who you're fucking talking to right now, Matt?!

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: You're talking to three dads/sons.

Griffin: Of a dad, who came out here, wearing what he wore...

Travis: In a bathing suit!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Matt, considering my lifestyle, I never would have expected this, but I believe I've been triggered.

Griffin: [chuckles]

Matt: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: I believe that this is what it feels like! It's so specific, I never thought I would have wandered into it.

Travis: So, Matt, your question has changed from, "I don't know what this word means," to, "Yeah, I don't know what this word means." And I don't like that second version as much.

Matt: [chuckles]

Justin: Okay, now, everyone, what does it mean?

Griffin: Charisma.

Crowd: Charisma!

Justin: Charisma.

Travis: And I bet you thought it was dirty, didn't you?

Matt: I did.

Griffin: You'll be relieved.

Matt: They've fooled me...

Griffin: Yeah, sure.

Travis: I thought it was dirty, Matt.

Justin: I guess the takeaway here is, whenever that happens, just let us know. We'll come here.

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: And shame you.

Justin: We'll do a show.

Griffin: And shame you publicly.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Give me a little bit of... a bit of a rizz. And then... and then you'll find out whatever the word means. Does that help?

Matt: Perfect.

Griffin: Thank you, Matt.

Travis: Thank you.

Justin: Thank you, Matt.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: Hello.

Justin: Hello.

Hazel: Hello.

Griffin: That's a fucking great shirt!

Hazel: Thank you!

Griffin: I have one myself, but I haven't worn it in public yet. [laughs]

Hazel: I had a feeling.

Griffin: Yeah!

Hazel: [chuckles] My name is Hazel. She/her.

Griffin: Hi, Hazel.

Justin: Hi, Hazel.

Hazel: So, my brother's birthday is tomorrow. And it's a Tour de France, wine tasting themed birthday party.

Travis: Sure.

[a couple of crowd members cheer]

Travis: Hey, can I just say, a wildly like nonspecific, specific theme.

Hazel: [chuckles] Yeah. And I'm making cream puffs for the party.

Justin: Sure?

Griffin: As is customary.

Hazel: [chuckles] As is customary. And he recently found out that he's gonna be a dad. It's not a gender reveal. Thank goodness.

Justin: Oh, thank god. If I have to go to one more gender reveal themed Tour de France themed party...

[crowd laughs]

Hazel: [laughs]

Travis: Played out!

Justin: Played out. All right, we get it...

Hazel: [chuckles] Also, costumes are mandatory. I don't know if included—

Travis: Costumes?!

Justin: Bicycle costumes?

Griffin: Do you mean just bike wear?

Hazel: [chuckles]

Travis: Or France wear?

Justin: France or bikes?

Hazel: Anyway...

[crowd laughs]

Griffin: You're dodging the question a little bit.

Justin: It's all right, Hazel, go ahead.

Griffin: I have some friends who are pretty hardcore into bikes, and all I know is that the clothes they buy is supposed to make them sleek and

smooth like an alien. Like H.R. Giger designed their human form so they can go like one second faster. And everything costs a million dollars.

Hazel: [chuckles]

Travis: And also, aside from the one bike seat thing, they're not comfortable sitting in chairs.

Griffin: No. Never ever.

Travis: But they do get patted butts, which I always appreciate.

Justin: Okay, okay, Hazel, what is your problem?

Hazel: So, I wanted to know, what is something that I could do to surprise like, with the cream puffs?

Griffin: Oh, yeah.

Travis: Okay, no, hold on. Let's narrow this down, because there's a lot of stuff you can put in a cream puff that would be a surprise.

Griffin: Sure.

Hazel: No choking hazard, please.

Griffin: I would say... this is good. Anything that isn't cream would be...

Hazel: [laughs]

Griffin: Literally any other... like solid, liquid, gas, plasma, any other thing.

Travis: Anything crunchy would be a surprise. Now, if you want a surprise specifically about like, "Hey, it's your birthday [and you're dead??]." Not crunchy, let's start there.

Justin: You could make the argument that every dinner roll is a very surprising cream puff.

Hazel: [chuckles]

Griffin: Yeah.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: You know?

Griffin: A very disappointing cream puff, I would say, maybe!

Justin: Not every surprise is good, Griff. [chuckles]

Travis: Yeah, if you bite into a cream puff and it's just air?

Justin: Yeah, that's wild.

Griffin: I love the King Baby and the King Baby cake.

Justin: Oh, yeah!

Griffin: In New Orleans. And I do wish that was present, that sort of gamification of cake was present in other pastries. And so, maybe one of them has like a little toy in it.

Justin: That's a great idea.

Travis: A that person will be the next person who gets pregnant.

[crowd chuckles]

Griffin: Whoa.

Justin: That's the tradition that we have!

Travis: Yeah. Now there's a baby in your cream puff. [chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles]

Justin: [laughs] Oh, god!

[crowd laughs and cheers]

Travis: Someday, a scientist will break down the sound wave of the thing I just said [and point to??], "And that's where he realized..." [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: I mean, more... you could... the other... mine was no cream. But I guess the other option is more cream than you would expect to be in there.

Hazel: [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: Like, it looks thicker than it actually is, and when you bite into it, it's like, "God damn. That is almost all cream! I just wasn't ready!"

Griffin: [laughs] You're talking about a hair's breadth thin membrane of puff.

Travis: Like a balloon of puff.

Griffin: Yeah!

Justin: Yeah. Like a chunk.

Travis: You pick it up and you're like, "This feels denser than it should be." [chuckles]

Justin: Yes, like a toddler's bubble over the horizon and it pops, [mouths breaking sound] cream. All cream. Loads of cream.

Griffin: [laughs]

Travis: Different kinds of cream as they work their way through!

Griffin: That can be cool, actually.

Justin: Hey, different amounts of mint in everyone.

Hazel: [laughs]

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: Ooh, I like that.

Justin: And some of 'em are like inedible. And you'll hear people fighting like, "Eh, it wasn't too minty for me?"

[crowd chuckles]

Travis: "Actually, it was very natural."

"Oh, I thought it was too much."

"I'm puking."

Justin: "This is disgusting. I hate this." Are those some good cream puff surprises, Hazel? [chuckles]

[crowd chuckles]

Hazel: Those are great.

Justin: Thank you for coming, seriously. Thank you so much!

Hazel: Thank you!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Thanks, everybody. Okay, we can lower the lights. Thanks, everyone for coming to this podcast. There we go. Thank you. It's kind of stressful to see everybody. [chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles] It really is.

Justin: So many. Thank you so much for having us in beautiful San José again.

Griffin: Yes.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: Thank you to the San José Civic for having us. It is a gorgeous theater and we're honored to be here.

Justin: Everybody's so kind and nice. And it's a beautiful place.

Travis: Let's hear it for our dad, Clint McElroy.

Justin: Yeah, Clint McElroy!

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Sorry, you didn't let me finish. Let's hear for our dad, Paul Sabourin.

Justin: [chuckles] Paul.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: No, Paul Sabourin is our tour manager. We wouldn't be able to do this allowed him. Let's hear for Amanda, our regular manager.

Griffin: [chuckles]

[crowd cheers]

Travis: Let's hear it for our sound person, Rachel.

Griffin: Sound person is a great—

Justin: Sound person!

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Hi, Rachel's back there. Rachel has to listen to us scream into microphones whether she wants to or not. [chuckles]

Griffin: And thank you to Montaigne for the use of our theme song, My Life Is Better With You.

[crowd cheers]

Travis: I also want to say, the poster was designed by Evan Palmer.

Griffin: It's so fucking good. I delight in this poster.

Justin: Yeah, you should get it.

Travis: We love it very, very much.

Justin: You should get it because you can't get 'em after. Come on, just get one.

Travis: Yeah, we'll throw 'em away! Fuck you.

Justin: Yeah, fuck you.

Griffin: [chuckles] Yeah!

Justin: I'd rather watch 'em sink down a drain and watch Pennywise eat 'em than give 'em away to you people. [chuckles]

Travis: That motherfucker loves eaten posters!

Justin: Pennywise ate all our posters before. There it is, look at that.

Griffin: Look at that. That's gorgeous.

Justin: Gorgeous.

Travis: Some of the posters actually have bite markers out of 'em where we had to pull 'em out of his mouth. He loves it.

Griffin: Travis, I have to notice you're not looking at your phone to read a Jack Johnson—

Travis: Fuck!

Griffin: Whoa, yeah, you do keep forgetting about that in a live environment.

Justin: You do the end of the show now. It used to be—

Travis: Keep talking. Thank other people. Thank your wives.

Griffin: Thanks, Rachel. You're crushing it at home and I wish I was there. I miss you guys so bad.

[crowd cheers]

Justin: Thank you to Sydnee for making it possible for me be here.

Travis: Thank my wife!

Griffin: Thank you, Teresa.

Justin: Thanks, Teresa.

Travis: You sounded like you said chorizo, try it again!

Griffin: [chuckles] Thank you, Chorizo, you're crushing it.

[crowd chuckles]

Justin: I mean, I watched Portrait of a Lady on the plane in? Does anybody want to talk about Portrait of a Lady?

Griffin: Yeah, four weirdos definitely do, Juice!

Justin: I mean, I knew that wasn't great. Oh, man...

Travis: Oh, no, my phone's not responding!

Justin: We had some of the orange sauce that you all are so wild about.

[crowd cheers]

Griffin: [chuckles] Yeah! Yeah!

Justin: It was good. We really liked it. It's not—

Griffin: It's definitely not gonna fuck me up tonight!

Travis: I got one right here. Do it!

Griffin: [chuckles] Your phone is frozen on an airline advertisement.

Travis: Hey, you know what I really love?

Griffin: Yeah? Hold on, wait, is this part of the quote?

Travis: Yeah, it's right here. You know what I really love?

Griffin: Your screen is not responding to your tactical—

Travis: You know what I really love?

Griffin: Yeah?
