## MBMBaM 678: Travis-Level Funny

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**Intro (Bob Ball)**: The McElroy brothers are not experts, and their advice should never be followed. Travis insists he's a sexpert, but if there's a degree on his wall, I haven't seen it. Also, this show isn't for kids. [theme song, "My Life Is Better With You," by Montaigne, plays]

**Justin**: Hello, everybody! And welcome to My Brother, My Brother and Me, an advice show for the modren era. I'm your oldest brother, Justin McElroy!

Travis: I'm your head coach, Travis McElroy!

**Griffin**: [spoofs entrance trumpets] I'm Griffin McElroy, here to bring the fuckin' football heat! Pigskin Pete is what they call me. And Grid Iron Gritty. Grid Iron Griffin always hits the griddy.

Travis: Grid Iron Griddy. Justin, I have a question for you. Justin?

Justin: Yes?

Travis: Are you ready for some football?

Justin: Well, Travis...

**Travis**: That was a trick question, because it's here! Whether you're ready or fuckin' not, coward!

**Griffin**: Yeah, every day of the week, we're playing football on the professional level, in the National Football League.

Travis: Mm-hmm!

**Justin**: I am proud to announce that my dad has guilted me into joining the fantasy football league because he couldn't find anybody else to join it, for the fifth consecutive year!

Travis: [spoofs entrance trumpets and laughs]

**Griffin**: Yeah, and he has stopped—I don't know what it means that he has stopped asking me! [spoofs entrance trumpets] What does that... Am I out of the will or what... what does that mean? Why am I so far from the light of our father?

**Justin**: You know what? I actually said, you know, I'm gonna make a run at it this year. I'm gonna make a run at the crown this year.

Travis: Oh, yeah?

**Justin**: I'm gonna pay attention when draft time comes around. So, I sat in, I logged in for the draft. We did have to restart the draft because the very old people in this league could not figure out how to get it all running...

**Griffin**: Hyperlinks, man! They're fucked up. They got all kinds of letters and symbols in 'em. It's crazy!

**Justin**: Yeah, so we... so yeah, we had to do it twice. And then I got to the draft. And then and here's where I kind of—

Travis: Yeah, yeah? Break it down, Justin!

Justin: [chuckles]

Griffin: Rambo Leap, my big man out there in unpopular opinions. Yes!

Justin: [chuckles] And big thoughts, right?

**Griffin**: Big thoughts, big ideas, big dreams.

Travis: Big thoughts, big dream, big points. You know?

**Griffin**: Big points. But when he dons the golden and yellow, and he goes out there and throws that beautiful god damn orb down the field, everybody's cheering and yelling. And I'm cheering and yelling because I'm looking at my points rack up on the fantasy league.

Justin: Yeah.

Travis: Okay.

Griffin: Whoa!

**Travis**: And until this strike's done, I will talk about how Tom Brady fucks mattresses every episode of this podcast. That's my protest. Griffin: Okay, Aaron Rodgers, pretty anti-vax. Also, doesn't play for the Packers anymore. He plays for the Jets. Well, I bet he doesn't play for anyone—

Justin: Will you please tell him what I did?

Griffin: Yeah, I will let him know that Uncle Justin-

Justin: What Mr. Holmes did, what everybody did, together.

Griffin: Yeah, yeah, for sure.

**Justin**: This is an advice show. I mean, yeah, most of it's sports advice. [chuckles]

Griffin: Yes.

Travis: Yeah, yeah, it's all we know!

Justin: It's all we know!

**Travis**: You come here for two reasons. One, fantasy football advice. Two, a recap of the Tom Brady commercial where he fucks a mattress in a vault. Those are the two reasons you come here every week! Week after week, I see it. I see people, they still X about it, left and right! They're Xing. They're Xing over here. They're Xing over there. Everybody's Xing about fantasy football advice.

**Justin**: Or like a football... an amateur football radio show that is broadcasted to 20 to 23 mid-market radio stations, every single month.

**Travis**: That's right!

Justin: Then that is Skin Pigs.

Griffin: Coming at you, Columbus! Skin Pigs live, in Columbus!

Justin: Hey Des Moines, coming at you live! It's Skin Pigs!

**Travis**: Oh, Boise, it's Skin Pigs! You can just use those tags.

**Justin**: Yeah, you could just use those tags. Hey, what's up Petaluma? We're coming for you! This week, the Skin Pigs are broadcasting live from the Señor Frog's.

**Griffin**: [spoofs honk sound] This is Hog Flesh, we've pirate radio taken over the feed! On Hog Flesh—[chuckles]

**Travis**: Wuddup, it's Oink Meat! It's Oink Meat here! Oink Meat's taken over from Hog Flesh!

**Griffin**: Got the fuck out of here, Oink Meat! This is Hog Flesh's time in the studio!

Travis: [in silly voice] No, it's Oink Meat!

**Justin**: [laughs]

Griffin: Oink Meat, Skin Pig and Hog Flesh. [chuckles]

Travis: We're the three hosts of fantasy football. [chuckles]

**Griffin**: The three demon hosts of this football podcast.

Travis: Welcome to Football Boys with Oink Meat, Hog Flesh and Skin Pigs!

**Justin**: I used to love Oink Meat. It's mainly incantations now. And that is troubling. They're trying to summon dark fortresses into our world.

Griffin: Mm-hmm.

Justin: This is an advice show, please! [chuckles]

Griffin: Yes.

Justin: "I sell mattresses and a common question-"

Travis: What?!

Justin: Not everything's a joke! Your joke senses are too fired up!

Travis: I know.

Griffin: Wind down.

**Justin**: Just wind it down. Sometimes there are funny parts in this show, and sometimes there's not. Ask Reddit. Listen, "I sell mattresses, and a common question I have to ask people is; do you sleep with a partner? If the answer is no, usually, if it's a guy, shit gets awkweird! have. [chuckles]
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Griffin: [chuckles] Yeah, that's a good point.

**Justin**: This is my question, right? I know if I sleep with a partner, in what reality am I looking at a twin and they're like, "Do you sleep with a partner?" And I'm like, "Yeah, I do." And then I'm like, "Oh, fuck, actually, this one's too small!"

**Travis**: "We were just gonna sleep stacked up! But now... now that I think about it!"

Justin: "I do have to get a big enough bed!"

**Griffin**: "We do a We Bare Bears in bed. Is that weird? That's normal, right?"

Justin: "Should I get a bed big enough for both of us?"

Travis: You'd think.

Justin: Yeah, I think I do!

**Travis**: "I could just get two of these and glue 'em together? Is that what people do?" [chuckles]

**Griffin**: We had a great mattress buying experience when we moved to D.C. and we wanted to get a big bed for me and my wife. Whose name is Rachel. And we went to the mattress store and we are trying some out. And our... I'm trying to decide if I want to say the name of the mattress salesman, because it's a—

Travis: It's Rachel.

**Griffin**: It's a really good name... But I don't know if I want to give out information like that. Maybe I'll say it to you guys, so you can appreciate it.

Travis: Yeah, we'll bleep it.

**Griffin**: Yeah, it's [bleep] the third, was his name.

Travis: Hell yeah.

Justin: Heck yeah.

**Griffin**: And he was great.

Justin: That's outstanding!

**Griffin**: We were trying out, you know, a little Tempur-Pedic action and he was like, "What's great about this is that you can get in and out of bed without bothering your partner, because it doesn't—it distributes the weight in a way that—here, let me show you." **Justin**: They don't like being hunted.

**Griffin**: It's probably also one of the worst places to do a hide and seek game, because I can't think of a building with more boogeymans per square inch than a mattress store.

**Justin**: [chuckles] Yeah, yeah, yeah.

**Travis**: You guys, you remember the Howie Mandel, Fred Savage movie, Little Monsters right? Where under the bed is the entry into the dream

**world** of monsters. And Fred Savage gets trapped under there. You gotta imagine in a mattress/bed store, that's just... that's trouble!

**Griffin**: It's non-stop portals and boogeyman. It sucks.

**Travis**: That's just trouble waiting to happen.

**Justin**: Is there a workplace comedy in there somewhere? About like different specters that are staying in a mattress store, like a hostel?

**Griffin**: There's a pilot. There's a pilot.

**Justin**: There's a pilot.

**Griffin**: It won't get picked up, but there's a pilot.

Justin: There's an un-greenlit pilot. There's a pilot's script that's sit—

Griffin: There's a read/written pilot.

Justin: [laughs]

**Travis**: As long as we can recapture the scene in Little Monster where Howie Mandel pisses in bully's Coke drink. That would be amazing, yes.

**Justin**: That would be amazing.

**Griffin**: So funny.

**Justin**: Hey, friend who sent in this question, I really hope that helps. Because I feel like—

**Griffin**: We said nothing helpful. There has to be—hold on, we can—I feel pretty confident that we can actually help. There has to be a way to ask if someone else is going to be in the bed with you. How many people will be sleeping in the bed? How many occupants?

Justin: How many will you be enjoying?

Griffin: How many people will be enjoying the bed today?

Justin: [chuckles]

Travis: "I'll take the California king."

"Really? With that outfit? Nah, man." [chuckles]

Griffin: Nah, man, I don't think so.

Travis: No way.

Justin: At my mattress store-

Travis: Yeah? Go on.

**Justin**: I'm gonna have a twin bed section. And there's going to be cocktails and light aperitifs.

Griffin: Oh, I like that.

**Justin**: And some festive lighting, some chill lighting.

Travis: A little mattress mixer.

**Justin**: And when you go to the twin bed—you may come in for a twin bed, but you may leave with that special someone that wants to share. And then you're like, "Actually, they cost more. It's more expensive." [chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles] Yeah.

Justin: "The bigger beds cost more than two small beds. Sorry."

**Travis**: "But if you two wanna split the cost and have that weight on your beginning relationship, that would be amazing. Yeah, yeah, yeah."

**Justin**: The best first thing you can do in a relationship is buy a bed together.

Travis: Yes, correct.

Justin: Easy.

**Griffin**: What we have here is another red-lit pilot for, this time, a reality competition show.

**Justin**: Okay?

**Griffin**: And it can be called Pillow Talk.

Travis: Pillow Talk's pretty good.

Justin: Pillow talk is not bad.

Griffin: Mattress Makers. Mattress Matchmakers!

Justin: Mattress Matchmaker.

Travis: Mattress Mixer.

Griffin: Match-ress... Match-ress Makers.

Justin: [chuckles]

Travis: Match-rizz Makers.

**Justin**: It's called You Made Your Bed. You know what I mean? Because then it's like—then you have to lie, and so it's like you have to be—

Travis: Yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah, yeah?

Justin: That's good. That's good. I wish there was still TV because—

Travis: Sleep On It.

Justin: We'd be rich. Sleep On It's good, too.

**Travis**: Wait, wait, boys, boys. I'm very excited, we've got... it's a brand it's a new segment. This is the second time we're going to play Am I The Asshole? But this time, it's listener submitted. I got it here, it was sent in by Hank Green. Who, as you guys knowGriffin: Hank Green! Crank Green is in the mix!

Travis: As you guys know, that's John Green's brother. And...

Griffin: [laughs] He's the best.

**Justin**: He loves that. He loves that. He loves that.

**Travis**: Now, here's what—I'm gonna take it and turn it a little bit, right. Because last time, the point system, I realized a flaw, right. So, on this first one, you can lock in your answer. And if you get this right, you get four points. But if you get it wrong, I deduct four points.

Griffin: He's a silencer, but he's also kind of a trickster sometimes.

Travis: That's true.

Justin: That is, that is. Yeah.

Travis: Yeah, okay. So, no guesses here?

**Griffin**: No, because I—we did the thing last week. We know the trick.

Travis: I am usually surrounded by hair.

Griffin: All right...

Justin: Okay.

Griffin: Hold on, this really narrows it down.

**Justin**: All right, Hank.

**Griffin**: Now... god, I wish we had Hank here, because I would ask if this includes like, what is it called? Cilia—

Travis: Eh.

**Griffin**: Okay. Cilia... what's the stuff, there's like little hairs that are like flesh hairs in your body...

**Justin**: Interesting. Yeah, the cilia, they're little flesh hairs in your body.

Travis: Cilia hairs, yeah.

**Griffin**: I think they're called cilia.

**Justin**: I'm a medical podcaster and they're little hairs.

**Griffin**: And they tickle the food. When you eat food, it tickles it down.

**Justin**: Scoots it down, tickles it down to your throat.

**Travis**: Yeah, tickles it down like they're hands.

Justin: Bodies are weird. Bodies are weird.

**Griffin**: I'm gonna say no. I'm gonna say—and here's the other thing; if you're like me... and you take care of your shit, and you have a group of talented... aesthetician, then this would not be true, necessarily. For what Travis so crudely refers to as the asshole.

Travis: Now, little Hanky Green-

Griffin: He's Crank Green, listen-

Justin: You're the name now, Stank.

**Griffin**: Listen, with his new look, he looks like nerdy Jason Statham. It's a good fuckin' look. He's Crank Green for life. That's the only way I'm referring to this man from now on. Except for when I admonish him, right now. That's gross, Hank.

Travis: Okay, so, Justin, you ready for a guess?

Justin: I got any more clues?

**Justin**: I think it's a pupil.

Griffin: Oh, wow? Yeah.

Travis: Look at that beautiful eyeball!

Griffin: That is an incredible—that is—that's amazing. That's so—

Justin: Hank, you have beautiful eyes.

Griffin: Hank, you have-

Travis: Yeah, like the amber-

Griffin: More like Hunk Green.

**Justin**: No, no, no, I know this is not part of his—this isn't like Clooney doing Nespresso ads so he could buy satellites to spy on warlords. Which is... true. That's just a true thing that happened. [chuckles]

**Travis**: J-Man, if I may, and I don't want to put you on blast, I love you very much. But with Munch Squad and other things we talk about on the show, you might not do free ads for things you love. But you definitely do free ads for things you find distasteful.

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: Protracted 11 minute long ads for things I'm ambivalent?

Travis: Yeah! [chuckles]

Justin: Or actively hostile to? [laughs]

Travis: Yes!

Justin: Oh, no, I'm a sham!

**Griffin**: Oh, shit, guys, the house of cards is trembling right now. We need to take a big step—

Justin: Hoisted by my own fuckin' petard!

Griffin: Big step away from the sand castle, guys... the tide is coming in...

**Justin**: [chuckles] Yeah, the tide's coming in, that's it. That wraps up the entire—maybe it is time to sunset this... No. God, if we can't talk about movies and TV, we have to—

Griffin: We can't talk about movies and TV, if-

Justin: Please—

**Griffin**: Listen. Bring back Yahoo Answers. This is our hour of greatest need. Please.

Justin: Please. Yeah, keep the comedy burgers coming, folks. It's all...

Travis: We could do like another question?

Griffin: Yes.

**Justin**: "Hi, my three and a half year old son wants to be the Titanic for Halloween." [chuckles]

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: Yeah, of course he does.

**Justin**: "Obviously, this is a tough subject in many instances. So, do you think it's appropriate? If so, do you have any ideas on how to create a Titanic costume? He does love Jack from the movie. So, I thought he could be him. But he's really just fascinated with the boat and how it breaks apart.

Any advice is much appreciated." That's from Never Let Go in Oklahoma. What a delight.

**Griffin**: Tragedy. tragic event, of course. I'm talking about the OG Titanic.

**Travis**: No, the movie was a triumph.

**Griffin**: The movie was a triumph. The OG Titanic... fatalities that happened, tragedy, tragic event. The way the boat broke apart? Unarguably very cool. Like super-duper, duper-super cool. It fuckin' got shook like a pistachio, cracked in half, bobbed up and then shot down. That shit rules. That's cool, the way that boat exploded.

**Travis**: I would say, to that point, not an obscure interest. Right? Like... a lot of documentaries, a lot of money's been spent on like how cool the Titanic was and is.

**Griffin**: Well, a lot of that, I think you can make the point of like, from a historical standpoint... Or like there's a lesson about hubris and excess that is valuable for us humans in the current, modern age to understand and wrap our heads around. But then I would also say that there's some of us who just really liked the way the boat breaks up and breaks apart and explodes and falls down.

**Travis**: If I saw a three and a half year old trick or treating as the split, wide-open Titanic, I'm dumping the whole bucket in that bag.

Griffin: You get a bucket full, for sure.

Justin: The bucket that they have is half of the Titanic, right?

Travis: Oh, yeah.

**Justin**: Like it's half of a titanic model they've hollowed out, and they're putting...

**Travis**: Oh, wait, hold on. I was gonna say that this was like—it's been so long since Titanic, but this is probably about that homemade submarine that exploded, isn't it?

**Griffin**: Well, no, but here's the thing, Travis; you gotta look at it through the innocent light of a child's eyes, that it's probably not about OceanGate's Titan submersible. That did have a pretty... headline-making accident earlier this year.

Travis: In the ocean versus man rematch.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Yes.

**Justin**: Speaking of, and for no particular reason, I gotta run up the spirit of Halloween real quick, because I just got a killer costume idea.[chuckles]

Griffin: No, see-

Justin: For this year's observances. [chuckles]

**Griffin**: Justin?

Justin: Yeah?

**Griffin**: That's not what this is about. This 3.5 year old probably doesn't even know that the lessons of hubris that the Titanic originally ran afoul of—

**Justin**: He doesn't know about the Two-Tanic.

**Griffin**: The Two-Tanic, didn't even know about that. This is about the innocent light of a child's eyes. You're laughing in a bad way.

**Justin**: You're right.

**Travis**: Oh my god, check this out. Check this out. Check this out. Check this out. this out.

Griffin: Yes? Go ahead.

Travis: Okay. Got two-eh... you need three people. Right?

Justin: [chuckles]

**Travis**: So, at least person writing the question, you're gonna have two halves of the Titanic. You guys are walking together. Third person, dressed as Iceberg—

Justin: [chuckles] The confidence by Travis...

**Travis**: Comes in. Hits Titanic. And then the two people, the two costumes break apart, cleanly.

**Griffin**: You got it. Travis has it.

Travis: Everybody's gonna love that!

**Justin**: Travis is so enamored by his idea, he just sprinted up and spin kicked the conch shell right out of Griffin hand. And he just went for it.

**Griffin**: No, that's good. No, because you were grabbing the conch shell, Justin, and you were making rude sounds with it. [chuckles] You were—

**Justin**: No, no, no, I handed the conch shell to a friend and excused myself—

**Travis**: After you farted in it. [chuckles] You farted inside the conch shell and handed it back!

Griffin: Yeah, this conch smells like farts!

**Justin**: They say tragedy plus time, they don't say how much time, period. End of conversation. That's not germane to the conversation at all. I'm just mentioning a fact. **Griffin**: Sure, sure. Yeah, no, for the original Titanic—I mean, I don't know if we've actually hit the point for the original, for the OG Titanic, where it's like hysterical yet.

**Justin**: I don't think that you can convince people that this is actually your child's idea. That is what's hard, right? If I see a kid in that costume, I think some parents are having some fun with kind of a tasteless gag. I think it's got to be... a fully-assembled Titanic. That's like, what if? You know what I mean? Like a sick, like—

**Travis**: And then you're holding up a sign behind him that says like, "Don't tell him." [chuckles]

Griffin: Or it can be a costume-

Justin: "He only made it halfway through the flick."

Griffin: A costume of the Titanic, safely pulling into port in New York City.

Travis: [sings] Ship of dreams.

Justin: Okay.

Griffin: That could be cool.

**Justin**: That's good.

**Griffin**: You need a fourth person dressed as—okay, so, two people in the Titanic costume. One is the iceberg. They're gonna go right past 'em. Then you need a fourth person dressed as the port of New York City, that they come into. This is going to tell a story, these for Halloween costumes.

Travis: And maybe a fifth person dressed as a time traveler. Right?

Griffin: That's cool.

**Travis**: And like, and they have like a big fan. And they're gonna blow the iceberg out of the way. And then wave as they go by. "What's that? It's Doc Brown, he saved them!"

Griffin: Cool.

**Justin**: Listen, this is probably the time for us to mention that we had great, great, great uncle who was the purser on the Titanic. So, this is like, we are allowed to... do this.

Travis: Yeah, we're really allowed to. Yeah, man.

Justin: We're allowed to because it hit us... hardest. Among the hardest.

Travis: And I've been on a boat before. Right?

Griffin: Sure.

**Justin**: If look up Hugh McElroy, you're gonna see the original, least hilarious McElroy brother. Who dad delights in every conversation about the Titanic.

**Griffin**: Not just the purser, the chief purser.

**Justin**: Thank you, Griffin. You say it because it matters. Thank you.

**Travis**: And was he the person who yelled, "Every man for himself," maybe. That's in one story.

**Justin**: Dad says that he's the one that shot—dad says—dad swears up and down that the one guy in the Titanic who holds up the gun when all the men are trying to get on the boat and shoots the gun, he said—he just told my daughter this like a month ago. And that was our great-great uncle, Hugh.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: Like, you're... you think, dad? They didn't-no one called 'em?

**Travis**: Now, also pointed to the screen and said, "And that's our cousin, Billy Zane." Which is really confusing and kind of undermines the first point. Yeah, I don't get that.

Griffin: He said, "That's my best friend, Kathy Bates."

**Justin**: [chuckles] Hey, guys, I know we're trying to—we're supposed to wrap up the show. But I heard an anecdote that I've been meaning to share with you guys. And this isn't part of a bit, it's just something funny that I wanted to put in the podcast.

Travis: Go on.

Justin: Because I heard it.

**Griffin**: Good. That's what this show's for, man.

**Travis**: I'd love to put something funny in the show.

**Justin**: After the passing of Jimmy Buffett, there are a lot of... like remembrances popping up on the various like services, you know what I mean?

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin**: All the various like TikToks or whatever. And one popped up from... Jay Chandrasekhar, of Club Dread and—

**Griffin**: Oh, yeah!

Travis: Yes. Yeah, yeah, yeah. From the Broken Lizard crew, yeah.

Griffin: I watched this particular TikTok.

**Justin**: So, he says—he tells a story about they make Club Dread and it kind of has a Jimmy-Buffett-adjacent character in it named Coconut Pete, who is played by Bill Paxton. And they invited Jimmy Buffett out to like

watch a screening of the movie. And he came out and he loved it, and they're watching it and everybody laughed and had a good time.

Justin: [laughs]

**Travis**: [chuckles] Trickle ouroboros economics. It's all a cycle.

**Justin**: What if we have been doing that entire time? Obviously, we couldn't have cut 20 bucks. Like no way, right?

Griffin: No way.

**Justin**: But I could maybe have some fivers on me from time to time.

**Travis**: And you can't increase it over time, either. Because then one day, you break off a 10 and they're like, "Oh, no. Oh, something's going bad, he was up to fifties. Ooh... Oh, boy-o."

**Justin**: Bill Paxton then admonished the rest of their crew for not having a gigantic roll of twenties that could choke a horse, on him, on his person at all times. Rest in peace, Bill.

**Travis**: This is like—isn't there a Joe Pesci story? There's a Joe Pesci about a kid coming up to him and the kid's like, "Oh my god, Joe Pesci." He had just seen him in Home Alone. And Joe Pesci says, "Who's your favorite actor?" And the kid said, "You are, Joe Pesci!" And he said, "That's right!" And handed him a \$100 bill.

## Justin: [laughs]

**Travis**: And that's another one where I'm like, that—I fully believe that story is true. But I also have a hard time believing that is a repeatable—was Joe Pesci just dealing out \$100 bills to any kid who said that he was his favorite actor?

**Griffin**: Now, that's a one star fish on the beach type story, of to that one kid, Joe Pesci is a fucking legend.

**Travis**: I think it's great if Joe Pesci walked away and was like, "You know what? That kid was really happy I gave him a \$1 bill." And his like— whoever's with him is like, "Joe, that was a 100." And he's like, "What?! Fuck! Ah, fuck!"

Griffin: "Oh, shit."

**Justin**: "I'm ruined! I'm ruined, I'm broke! Call Griffin, we gotta move in together! Joe needs a roommate, we're gonna buy a mattress together! Me and Griffin and Joe Pesci!"

Griffin: Yu-ya-yu-ya-yu-ya-

Justin: Aah-mah-mah-mah-mah-

**Griffin**: Yu-ya-yu-ya-yu-ya-

**Justin**: Mah-mah-mah. My name is Justin McElroy.

Travis: I'm Travis McElroy!

Griffin: I'm Griffin McElroy!

**Justin**: This has been My Brother, My Brother and Me. Kiss your dad square on the lips.
