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Intro (Bob Ball):

[theme music plays]

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Yeah. Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Now it's time to party and we will party hard.

Travis:

Party hard.

Justin:

Let's get a party going, let's get a party going, when it's time to party we will always party hard, party hard.

Griffin:

[everybody overlapping] Party Hard, party hard.

Justin:

Party hard, party hard, party hard.

Travis:

Party hard, party hard, party hard.

Justin:

Let's do our show, this is My Brother, My Brother and Me, an advice show for the modern era, undaunted by terrorism, I am your oldest brother, Justin McElroy.

Travis:

I am Travis McElroy

Griffin:

I am Griffin McElroy. You know what's a shame?

Travis:

What?

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

You know what's a real shame?

Justin:

We just talked about it, it was a huge tragedy.

Griffin:

But also, I'm looking at the, I'm looking at the observances, because we forgot to do them last week and spoiler alert we are going to do them later this show, but looking at the daily observances...

Justin:

[laughs].

Travis:

Uh-huh?

Griffin:

And September 11th has Patriot Day and Remembrance Day, which make sense. September 11th...

Justin:

Depending on how, depending on your political affiliation presumably.

Griffin:

September 11th is also national Hug Your Hound Day and I feel like people, I feel like there's a lot of unhugged hounds out there, I feel they get lost in the shuffle.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Yes, um—

Travis:

Is it also called 9/11 day. Am I making that up?

Griffin:

No, I think Patriot Day's...

Justin:

Wait hold on, hold on...

Travis:

I feel like I've heard it called 9/11 Day.

Justin:

Wait, [laughing] are you suggesting to me that September 11th is also colloquially or officially referred to as 9/11 day?

Travis:

This might only be at my local supermarket where they're offering 50% off American flags.

Justin:

[laughs].

Griffin:

Still doing that, huh?

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

Still doing that thing?

Justin:

Still doing that thing.

Travis:

And you know what? I think what I hate most about 9/11 day is how commercial it's become.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Sure.

Justin:

You really used to, it's just run by the greeting card Taliban.

Travis:

And tiny American flag companies.

Griffin:

Here's a fun fact, um, uh, This is... one of those crazy years where September 11th is also national Grandparents day, it's the first Sunday after Labor Day. It's today, it's September 11th and, uh, I feel like hounds and grandparents are going to be underappreciated on this, on this most faithful day.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

I think that's probably... I would say you know what, take your time, uh, think about, uh, the people we lost on that day and go hug your grandpa.

Travis:

Or go hug your grandpa's dog.

Griffin:

Pee-pums, I love you

Justin:

I love you.

Griffin:

I love you Pee-pums but my mind is in other places, uh—

Justin:

It's elsewhere.

Griffin:

... Baxter, which is the name of my hound, I am also sorry to you that, that I just don't have the bandwidth.

Justin:

People are listening to this...

Travis:

I feel like...

Justin:

On September 12th and in a way I feel it's, where, they try to cauterize today, expiration, opinion, fears, get it all out and today we are like reopening it, like we are digging around in there.

Griffin:

Well, guess what?

Travis:

Well, now they feel bad because they didn't hug a dog.

Griffin:

Good news tomorrow people, it's national Boss/Employee Exchange Day.

Justin:

Can we take a moment to talk about the show Tomorrow People.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

The Tomorrow People...

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Today is an actual Tomorrow People Remembrance Day.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Agreed, I remember that that was a pretty good show.

Travis:

God, it was a wicked show!

Justin:

It was a good show, this is our show is neither a September 11th memorial or a show about features 13 second travel to travel space. Uh, it's an advice show for the modern era and, uh, let's get into our first question.

"I've started seeing this guy, I like him a lot and everything is going well, but it's only been about two weeks so it isn't very serious yet, his birthday is in a couple weeks and I'm not sure what the expectation of me is this early in the relationship, Do I buy any gift? Take him out to dinner? Bake him a cake? I am still in school so my budget is limited and I don't want to freak him out with something overly extravagant. Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

Yeah! Don't start dating someone two weeks before their birthday or two weeks before Valentine's Day.

Justin:

Or two weeks before Patriot's Day.

Griffin:

And Christmas.

Travis:

Yup, it's a mistake.

Griffin:

Um, Christmas is the worst because then there's all these expectations to like, are you going to come over? And like...

Travis:

Oh, yeah...

Griffin:

Chill with my fam, my peeps.

Travis:

Then you have to worry about getting their family presents.

Griffin:

Yeah

Travis:

and it's all a stick in your ass.

Justin:

This is my something.

Griffin:

And it's like "Hey, I've had exactly 14 minutes of contact with you so, uh, I got you A Walk in the Clouds on DVD."

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

I think that, don't take him to dinner because he's probably already got other plans, uh, give him a gift. A gift it's fine.

Justin:

That's cool, that's a cool bet [laughs].

Travis:

Well, you don't think he's going to do like a party or his friends want to take him to drinks and if he blows off his friends...

Justin:

I am betting—

Travis:

...to go out with his two week girlfriend.

Justin:

Well

Griffin:

"How was your birthday, Martin?"

"Uh, It was okay, I'm super hungry, I'm just the most hungry because all my friends thought that the other friends were going to take me to uh, take me to Applebee's."

Justin:

"Pretty cool birthday, I stayed in and, uh, I heated up a Marie Calendar's stuffing and chicken and gravy, uh, in my stove, and I ate it and I watched, uh, like half of Miss Congeniality 2.

Travis:

To be fair, a Marie Calendar pot pie is good at any time. Um...

Justin:

Except when it's your birthday and you're alone.

Travis:

Except when it's your birthday and you put a candle in it unlit and cry.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Oh, man.

Justin:

Oh, god.

Travis:

Um, I think, Well okay, let's set a price point of gift, what's the most you should spend on a two week boyfriend?

Griffin:

\$30.

Travis:

You think \$30?

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

\$30 is too much. \$20.

Justin:

\$30 is too much?

Travis:

Yeah, I would say a new-release DVD, nothing more than that.

Griffin:

This is awkward, Travis, because you just added the fact that I am rolling in so much mad scrilla.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

And you got some, you're working with table scraps.

Travis:

Listen, it ain't about your budget, it's about the statement you are making with the present.

Griffin:

It is wholly and entirely about your budget.

Travis:

No, if you go and like buy a really nice present that they're not expecting, well... No way, I take that back because it's different because you are not exchanging presents.

Justin:

If you are a rich dude and you spend more on your free range toilet paper than your gift for your two week girlfriend, you are an asshole.

Griffin:

It's torture free, torture free toilet paper.

Justin:

Torture free TP.

Travis:

I am going to say...

Justin:

Use your washbowl, it's better for the—

Travis:

... set a precedent, if you set a precedent and you spend a lot of money then next time it's his turn to give you a present, you've set the precedent to get each other awesome things.

Griffin:

Oh, man that would be terrible. No wait, it wouldn't. "Honey, I got you the Zune HD for Easter."

"Holy shit, it's Easter!"

Travis:

[laughs].

Griffin:

"I just ate some Cadbury Eggs and you busted out a Zune HD, you're the best."

Travis:

That's what I am saying, this is an awesome idea, so go nice, do something awesome.

Justin:

Yeah. Go, like, really good, I don't think anybody feels... Like okay, listen, what's your worry? The worry is that if you have to split up, It would be weird. Is that the thing? Like...

Travis:

I think our worry is that she's going to get him something too awesome and he's going to realize she likes him a lot, like really that's what it is.

Justin:

Oh, fuck it. Just throw your hat over the fence and go buy him a Zune HD.

Travis:

Yeah, dude.

Griffin:

[Laughs]

Travis:

Draw a line in the sand and say this is for serious.

Justin:

"Hey, I bought you this discontinued touch pad."

Travis:

Oh.

Justin:

"It's a \$100." That's good because that says nice gift but, "Hey, I'm budget conscious."

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

You know?

Griffin:

I am all about charging forward as fast and, uh, um, recklessly as he possibly can.

Justin:

Sure.

Travis:

Buy him a house.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Buy him House on DVD.

Travis:

[Laughs]

Justin:

That's good stuff. "Hey, I'm really friendly and I like to make lots of different friends. I consider a lot of people my BFF," that's, uh, logical fallacy, "but my mom says that it is not possible for me to have so many BFF's. How many can I have without being excessive?" And that's from your BFF, Sarah.

Travis:

Two.

Justin:

What?

Travis:

That's how many you can have when you start to get excessive.

Justin:

BFF is best, that's a superlative. Best friend forever. You can literally, literally, only have one BFF because even if you had a BF that you eventually fall out with, you are going to replace it with another BF at some point in your life. This is your BFF.

Travis:

Unless...

Griffin:

You are saying that, that the forever part is what is what makes—

Justin:

If you declare someone your BFF, you are, cryo-locked.

Griffin:

Locked in.

Travis:

I think, what I do to get around that, the loophole I use is to qualify everything is, like, this is my best Cincinnati friend, this is my best Huntington friend, This is my best friend since second grade, this is—

Justin:

And I'll tell you at someone who has been on the receiving in one of those compliments, they go down really smooth.

Travis:

Oh, no, it ain't about them, this is about me, just making myself feel better.

Griffin:

What were you?

Justin:

I was his favorite brother in Huntington. Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

Okay.

Justin:

This person isn't talking about geographic locating friends they're just, can they have more BFF's?

Travis:

And I am going to throw this out.

Justin:

They literally can.

Travis:

I think the problem is that it's something we talked about before and that we throw out words without really thinking about what they mean and it's probably that you like these people, that they are your friends but are they your best friend?

Like that seems like a stronger commitment than you are really making here, like people that say, "I love my friends, I love that guy. I love this person," and you are not thinking about what love means, I think that your best friend is a very special, like, upper echelon shown thing that you should save for someone who is really important to you.

Griffin:

What I have done as I grow older is I have sort of moved the goal post back a little bit.

Justin:

Hmm.

Griffin:

Uh, in that I don't have that many friends, I have many social acquaintances.

Justin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

Oh, yeah?

Griffin:

I have, I have peers and cohorts and contemporaries, but I don't have, uh, I've got maybe like five or six friends, and when it comes to, like, best friends, like I, I mean, man, If I had to pick that would be though, a BFF, I don't even think I am old enough for that kind of commitment.

Justin:

No, It's a huge commitment.

Travis:

Yeah, you got to live in the world for at least 30 years before you know what's up.

Griffin:

Yeah, just let's get less friend everybody, I think it's the trick.

Justin:

I just, you can't... I don't care how many friends people have, I don't care about telling people you love them even. I would rather someone get divorced and make those vows and then break them than to have the English language just sort of bandied about like a play thing.

If you say someone is your best friend forever, you can never have another best friend and you can never like someone, like, the use of the word forever supersedes any sort of, um, future relationships that you may have; that's forever.

Travis:

And why can't people just be your friend? Like, who's sitting there going, "Oh, so I'm just your friend, not your best friend, I see how it is."

Griffin:

"And you can't, you are not going to be my best friend into infinity?"

Travis:

"Oh, okay. Fine. Whatever. See if I loan you any DVD's again."

Griffin:

Um, Justin I'm interested in a thing that you just said about BFF's being stronger than, uh, um, a matrimonial bond. Is there any way that we can incorporate that into the terminology of, of marriage?

Justin:

Oh, you mean...

Griffin:

Can, can for instance would you consider Sydnee, uh, to be your best wife forever?

Justin:

Yes.

Travis:

Oh.

Justin:

Well Sydnee is also my BFF, I made that commitment, I bought her a second BFF ring that she wears.

Travis:

And when you put them together...

Griffin:

Well, not everyone—

Travis:

... it spells best friends forever, and you have half of the heart and she has half of the heart?

Justin:

Exactly. Yes.

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

You should marry your BFF, that's what I'm saying don't throw these words around like they don't mean anything, they do.

Travis:

I think you should be forced to marry your BFF, whether it is your partner or your friend.

Griffin:

Oh, man. That's so good.

Justin:

She would love that.

Travis:

There should be a ceremony with a priest and like, you get a license and everything.

Justin:

Some establishment—

Griffin:

So, like, at age 13 you're like, "Oh, Michael, you are my BFF," and then like 20 years later it's like, "I got to marry Michael."

Travis:

Yep.

Griffin:

He's a bro and I'm a bro, and I'm not down but, like, sorry Mike.

Justin:

But then, but then the nice thing is you get all of the wedding presents, um, and you know, you have a really nice reception, um...

Griffin:

Sure, and you know what? Maybe Michael is the one.

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Yeah. Maybe that's what you learn, maybe that's what you learn about yourself.

Justin:

Everybody's best friend is Jesus, that's what I'm saying to you...

Griffin:

Yes.

Justin:

... is your best friend forever is Jesus. The only reason why you should say someone is your BFF is if you are trying to show off like, if you say, like, I don't think BFF is something that I would say to make that person feel special but I would tell it to somebody else, to make myself feel good, like, "Oh, hero pilot Sully Sullenberger, He is my BFF."

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

And they would think...

Travis:

Oh, John Stamos?

Justin:

John Stamos.

Travis:

He's my BFF.

Justin:

He is my BFF.

Griffin:

My bestest best friend forever ever.

Justin:

Yes, he is my B-B-F-F-E-E

Griffin:

I love John Stamos so much. Hey do you guys want a Yahoo?

Justin:

Always.

Travis:

Yes.

Griffin:

Uh, this one was sent in by... This one, this one was sent in by Jesse Thorn. Thank you Jesse. It's by Yahoo Answers user, Miserable Little Smug Bastard.

Travis:

Oh. Oh my.

Griffin:

Who asked, "Ladies..."

Travis:

[laughing] Already winning.

Griffin:

Ladies, If someone paid you \$300,000 or pounds to sit on a real human skull, would you sit on it?

Justin:

[laughing].

Travis:

What?

Griffin:

"Would you cross your legs? If you did you would get an extra \$300,000. I have actually asked this question before."

Justin:

[laughs] Sincerely Skeletor.

Travis:

[laughs] Love, Jack Skellington.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

So many questions, first off. Ladies if you pick the \$300,000 above the 300,000 pounds then you are a Rube.

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Yeah, I was going to say conversion rate. I think maybe that's it, it's like a deal or no deal thing, like you could take the \$300,000 or...

Griffin:

Or the \$600,000 if you cross your legs while you do it.

Travis:

Or, you can get it in pounds and have to spent 10 minutes getting it converted in the bank.

Justin:

Yeah, but that's an awkward story to tell the cashier.

Griffin:

"Hey, how did you get this 600,000 pounds?"

"I sat on a real human skull."

Justin:

[laughs] They smell like calcium and taint.

Travis:

Are you one of those bone jockey's?

Justin:

Are you a bone jockey?

Travis:

Ugh.

Justin:

Ugh. Your people sicken me [laughs]. "Hey, Carl. We got another one."

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

"Look at this one. She sat on a human skull."

Travis:

She got boned.

Griffin:

She got boned.

Travis:

And then they all chuckle.

Justin:

Chuckle.

Griffin:

There are so many questions.

Justin:

God damn it.

Griffin:

Is this skull inside of skin and muscles of a living human being?

Justin:

I can't imagine—

Travis:

Is it the last request kind of thing?

Griffin:

Is this how someone wants to get buried is what I'm saying?

Justin:

Is this a Devo video?

Griffin:

Are we talking about a Devo?

Justin:

Is this a Devo right now? Are you pulling a Devo on us?

Griffin:

How much?

Justin:

Are you pulling a body Devo?

Travis:

Why, why does the price point started out at \$300,000?

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Why wouldn't you haggle up?

Griffin:

[laughing] I just noticed in the related questions on the side bar, this question, by Miserable Little Smug Bastard, "Ladies if someone paid you \$100,000 or pounds to sit on a real human skull, would you do it?"

Travis:

[laughing]

Justin:

[laughing] He's driving a hard bargain.

Griffin:

"If you are offended by this question—"

Travis:

"What do I have to say to get you on this skull before you leave today?"

Griffin:

"If you are offended by this question then ignore it, would you cross your legs? If you did you will get extra, it will be the skull of the serial killer."

Travis:

What? You left that out when you brought it to \$300,000.

Justin:

Who? He's trying, he's driving a deal, he's trying to make this happen. Griffin, what is his username again?

Griffin:

Um, Miserable Little Smug Bastard.

Travis:

Oh. Okay.

Justin:

Miserable Little Smug Bastard, he's like, he's been negotiating this, his, for all of his foibles, he is a pretty smart negotiator. He started low and maybe the serial killer's skull. He's like, uh, Ron Pubill. Like, okay. "I'll take out, it's no longer a serial killer skull, just a regular skull."

Griffin:

Just a real human skull.

Travis:

And also this set of ShamWow's.

Justin:

Yeah, I would throw in a solid flavor injector.

Travis:

[laughing] Oh, God.

Griffin:

"Would you slap chop a real human skull for... I am going to bump it up to 400k."

Travis:

[laughing]

Justin:

You do have to sit on it before, but afterwards you'll slap chop it in the non existence, there will just be dust.

Griffin:

I would sit on two horse skulls for 50k.

Justin:

You know, that's a good deal.

Travis:

You know, I am not going out on my limit here and say this is one of those circumstances where I would rather that this would not a hypothetical question because if he had some purpose behind this for some reason that makes it okay than him just sitting around wondering.

Griffin:

Travis the amount of work that he has put into negotiating, just yelling into the internet, it has to have been resolved, right? It has to, it has to have happened.

Justin:

It has to have. It has to have happened by now.

Griffin:

Do you realize how much money \$300,000... What would I not do with 300,000 dollars or pounds? Because sit on a real human skull...

Travis:

Yes?

Griffin:

... ain't on that list.

Justin:

Yeah, I would make the skull.

Griffin:

I would, yeah.

Justin:

I've been waiting.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

I would turn the person into a skull, that's what I'm saying.

Griffin:

I am such a fucking sucker though, because, uh, that first time around when he's like a hundo-K, I would've jumped at it.

Travis:

You would've taken it?

Griffin:

I wouldn't even have thought to hold off.

Travis:

You got, you got to check the trade magazines.

Justin:

[laughs] What's the going rate right now?

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

Like...

Justin:

For a, uh... You know, I actually got a Groupon, for uh, sitting on a human skull, yeah. A bunch of my friends and I were going to do it for 15K.

Griffin:

The problem is...

Travis:

The same skull?

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Yeah, it's the same skull so there's always a huge line, you really got to...

Travis:

And after a while, you know.

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

It gets warm.

Griffin:

That skull is pretty rowdy.

Travis:

The thing is he doesn't even clarify and say, like, you have to be nude or it has to be, he just wants you to sit on it cross your legs and get off and leave.

Griffin:

Can we? Let's talk about the crossing the legs thing is he wanting us to incubate the skull, like a momma bird?

Justin:

Uh...

Travis:

Keep it secret, keep it safe, you get \$300,000.

Justin:

Uh, ah, but he doesn't say naked.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

So what he's saying is to just sit on, just...

Travis:

Just roll up in your mom jeans, sit on it.

Justin:

Sit on it.

Travis:

Cross your legs, get up and leave, get out of here.

Justin:

Okay, I need to know, can a human skulls support the weight of a fully grown adult woman?

Griffin:

Fuck, no. It takes like 40 pounds of pressure, we are just skeletons with, like, a big egg on top of our necks.

Travis:

Uh-huh.

Justin:

Uh-huh. So it's just a big egg in there?

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

It's just like a big stupid egg in there and it's if a human being. If it was like a tiny, if it was like a baby maybe but...

Travis:

Oh, maybe he's doing that like age old, like, seventh grade time to experiment, where you have to like, uh, build a bridge to like save an egg, you know what I mean? And you have to walk across it and see if it destroys the egg.

Griffin:

Travis, there is so much god damn dumb stuff in that sentence you just said, it would take us a week to tear it apart.

Justin:

[laughing] It was the seventh layer bar of dumb shit.

Griffin:

You know, an egg bridge.

Travis:

You know, egg bridge.

Travis:

Yeah, I saw it on a, uh, Mr. Wizard.

Griffin:

An egg bridge volcano.

Justin:

You literally just mentioned, like, five different science projects. "You know an egg bridge and then I would out baking soda on it."

Travis:

And it's a volcano.

Justin:

"It's a volcano." I'll never forget the events of September 11th, 2001 when a volcano bridge burned down an egg [laughs].

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs] "Jimmy, your book report sucks."

Travis:

[laughing]

Justin:

[laughing]

Justin:

A book report? What book is he...?

Griffin:

"Your book, Jimmy your book report on the 9/11 commission is the worst that I've ever read."

Justin:

"Did you even read it? You didn't, did you?"

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

I did not. Myth and legend. You know the, in like a 100 years myth and legend that's all, there won't be no extra records, there would be so open to interpretation, I've seen enough futuristic movies to know.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Oh God, damn it.

Griffin:

Let's stop talking about sitting on skulls 'cause it's literally making my grundle uncomfortable. Like, just the thought of trying to perch myself on a cranium, I don't think it would feel good.

Justin:

No, I wouldn't think so.

Griffin:

But you, but you know what would feel great? I could buy myself a new grundle with 300K.

Justin:

[laughs] Or 300,000 pounds. Jesus Christ. This guy, this fucking guy. Do you think he's normal in his day to day? Do you think it's someone really nice and well-respected. Do you think it's Tom Hanks?

Travis:

Ooh.

Justin:

Wouldn't you believe it? Somebody's, like, "Yeah he's a great actor and like he's a real sweetheart, he's got just one thing."

Travis:

"My wife and I have a four month son, who'll seem to be celebrating his first Halloween and we are in disagreement as to what kind of costume our child should wear, my wife wants him to be dressed as an animal such as a turkey, a skunk or a monkey. I would prefer to dress him as something cool and nerdy. This is where I need your sagely advice. Could you give me some cool and nerdy costume ideas with which to put this argument to rest." And that's from Kevin.

Justin:

I got a cool nerdy one. Do a genetic hybrid of all three of those animals, go as a moskurkey.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

This is my son Skyler, he's dressed as the most moskurkey.

Griffin:

Justin, that is a... I almost made a furry joke and I didn't.

Justin:

Would you say—

Griffin:

Are you happy with the level of restraint that I've adopted since I started doing this show?

Justin:

Yeah. We made a 9/11 joke 30 seconds ago, we won't make a furry gag. How is that?

Travis:

You're welcome

Justin:

How is your sensitivity?

Griffin:

Not great.

Justin:

[laughing] I'd sit on a moskurkey skull for \$300,000.

Um, a ninja turtle. That is a... That's an animal.

Justin:

I, um...

Travis:

You could go as a Biker Mouse from Mars.

Griffin:

Loving it.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

You could go as a llama but also it's Doctor Who.

Griffin:

Okay. So hold on let's explore it, is this a time king?

Justin:

Is it, [laughing]. Yes, it's a time king

Griffin:

A time king llama.

Justin:

Time king is a... No, uh, no, a regeneration. Okay. Doctor Who...

Travis:

Okay so like Matt Smith Doctor Who dies—

Griffin:

Matt Smith dies.

Travis:

He returns as a lama.

Griffin:

And then he, he...

Justin:

He funnels the regeneration energy into the llama to try to cast it off, and it becomes a time lord llama and you dress your baby like that.

Travis:

Does the llama speak English?

Justin:

Well, if it's near enough to the Tardis, of course.

Travis:

Okay. Great.

Justin:

Can translate all languages.

Travis:

Does it remain on two legs or does it, like, or become, like, four-legged Doctor?

Griffin:

Are we talking about a Joe Cool?

Justin:

Does it need to... Well, it depends on how much ground it need to cover him, he needs cover ground quickly, it will run around on all four legs.

Travis:

I hope someone, somewhere, at BBC is listening to this because we've just figured out the next series.

Justin:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Yeah, I've always thought that that show needed a little extra spice.

Travis:

It's llama

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

A time king llama.

Griffin:

And that spice is apparently, uh, a desert pack mule.

Justin:

Yeah, I think it'll go great, uh, here's a fun suggestion, I think is fun for the whole family, uh, dress your kid, like a, um, doggy...

Griffin:

Mm-hmm?

Justin:

And then put him in a cage and the leave it home and go get drunk.

Griffin:

What?

Travis:

[laughing]

Justin:

[singing] Party for Halloween, the spirits are out tonight.

Travis:

What if you...

Justin:

[singing] Me and mom, going out, and you're gonna be alright in your cage we made for you.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Just throw some candy in there, it will be fine.

Justin:

[singing] Throw some candy in the clothes hanger cage that we made for you.

Justin:

You just rebend them, and just bend them into bars, babies aren't strong, it won't take long, just go get drunk, come on. You guy deserve it, you've earned a night out—

Travis:

[laughing]

Griffin:

[laughing]

Travis:

It's 10 PM, do you know where your baby is? Yes, in a cage.

Griffin:

He's in the baby dog... It's okay, he's, like, dressed up like a dog.

Travis:

He's a baby dog, that makes it better.

Justin:

The kind of irreparable harm you've done to your relationship by arguing about costumes, you got to get on a retreat and by retreat, I mean go to Shakey's and get you drunk.

Travis:

Make sure you take lots of pictures of that too, so that when your kid turns 18 and kills everyone he knows, you are going to show those pictures to the—

Griffin:

Just throw some Alpow in the cage and go get your drunk. Get that drunk.

Justin:

"Mr. Stevenson, I'm sorry, I'm placing you under arrest, your son was locked in a cage unsupervised."

"What the fuck, that's a dog."

Griffin:

That's a dog.

Justin:

"That is actually your child in a dog..."

"Well, color me embarrassed, officer."

Griffin:

Look at his nose, I've painted it brown like a dog's nose is brown.

Travis:

Officer, you are terrible at improv games.

Justin:

All right, yeah, you're supposed to say yes.

Griffin:

Yes and...

Justin:

Yes and... Yes and my baby is a dog in his cage.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

Yes and do you want some of this beer, I have extra because we have so much in us.

Griffin:

[laughing]

Justin:

Do you want a brewsky and we will forget about this and also forget about the kid, he's fine for another hour or so.

Travis:

Let's go play so foosball.

Justin:

Lets go play, let's go foos it up, copper. And then it turns up that the cop is a baby dressed as a cop.

Travis:

Oh.

Griffin:

Oh.

Travis:

Incepted.

Justin:

Baby police, you just got boosted by the highest authorities in the land.

Griffin:

[laughing] Baby police?

Justin:

Baby police is the highest authority of the land, sentient babies.

Travis:

We are under baby martial law.

Justin:

[laughing] It's adorable and also restrictive.

Travis:

[laughs] This is a baby police state.

Justin:

All TVs will watch Nick Jr..

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

All things will go boing when you hit them [laughs].

Griffin:

[laughing]

Travis:

The cow says, "Moo." You say nothing.

Griffin:

Oh, fuck.

Justin:

I snap my fingers, you pull out a tit, this is baby law.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

We're running things now.

Travis:

You know I would watch a legal drama, called Babies Law where it's just about baby lawyer.

Griffin:

Baby law on Baby Order?

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

No, if we don't need... [laughing] Okay, if there is baby martial law, Baby Order doesn't have any place in it.

Travis:

Mm-hmm, how about Baby Chaos?

Justin:

Um, Baby Chaos? That, you know, you mean babyarchy?.

Travis:

Babyarchy?

Justin:

Babyarchy.

Travis:

Yes, thank you.

Justin:

Um, babies, don't grow up to be adults because this is what you do, you think about baby anarchy.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

And, um...

Travis:

Which is adorable and terrifying at the same time.

Justin:

Hey. But, uh, can we, uh, I want to take a brief hiatus here to talk about the text that I just got from my father, our father.

Griffin:

As did I.

Justin:

Did you guys...

Travis:

Me too, yes.

Justin:

Okay so he just sent us, um, a text that says in quotes, "What day is it son, what day?" What could that... Is that a reference to the hit film We are Marshall?

Griffin:

I think it is.

Justin:

It has to be.

Griffin:

Oh, but it's—

Justin:

I think the response is Football Day or something?

Griffin:

No, listen, listen lets explain this because people are going to think our dad is some of crazy 9/11 guy. I don't think he knows its 9/11.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

I figured the three of us should probably text him...

Justin:

I'm texting right now, and asking him if he means September 11th?

Travis:

Okay, hold on, let's all take a moment.

Griffin:

We need to text him back because I don't want our dad, like, walking through the day with a spring in his step.

Travis:

[laughs] It's game day!

Griffin:

Hey everybody. Are you excited?

Travis:

Okay. My message is sent.

Justin:

I've been looking forward to today, for so long.

Griffin:

Yeah, seems like it has been 10 years since this last happened, by which I mean football [laughs].

Justin:

[laughing] I love football getting the points, scoring points. I, I...

Travis:

Look at all the points.

Griffin:

Should we even address the fact that we are in a family football pool. It seems like such a ridiculous...

Travis:

Oh my god. No one will believe it.

Justin:

If someone could give us some advice on, on what teams are going to win each game.

Griffin:

Travis:

Justin:

Griffin:

Griffin:

Griffin:

Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Griffin:

Don't move. It is important...

Travis:

Please don't roll over [laughs]

Justin:

I had the weirdest dream.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

You can not imagine the dream I had. "Hey, I love you."

"I love you, too."

"Uh, do you want to fall a sleep in this manner?" I would just advise there's no love that great, there's no love...

Travis:

No, it doesn't even seem, like, sexy at all, it's just seems like you utilitarian, like, put it in and let's go to bed, like, what?

Justin:

What?

Travis:

That's weird.

Justin:

Griffin:

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Tony Hawk. Uh, you know what did it for me, on my drive from Chicago from Austin was just podcasts. I... My friend was in the car and we just listened to podcasts pretty much the entire way down and like, I am not saying listen to our podcast, I am saying listen to...

Travis:

I am saying this, I am saying listen to our podcast.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Well, and now Travis, Travis went to, uh, when Travis went to Louisville to the Pointbreak Live with me, uh, what podcast do you listen to help pass the time?

Travis:

Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Griffin:

Travis:

Justin:

Justin:

Travis:

Also, trail mix.

Justin:

[laughs] It's a great snack for the road. When you are on the trail, the modern day trail, the highway mix... corp. Corp's delicious.

Griffin:

Can I do another Yahoo?

Justin:

Uh, yeah

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

We have a lot more ground to cover but let's just burn into this Yahoo because I feel, you know, it's important, this one was sent in by ECMendonHaul, thank you, EC. It's by Yahoo Answers user, uh, Anonymous, okay. Who asks, "What are some really sassy baby names?"

Justin:

[laughing]

Griffin:

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

You want me to go on that list and...?

Justin:

That's not sassy.

Griffin:

You want to hear some of the suggestions that Yahoo has provided.

Justin:

Yeah, I guess.

Griffin:

Um, Eden.

Travis:

Because she's a cutie patootie.

Justin:

Cutie.

Travis:

Cutie patootie.

Griffin:

Sadie, Jackie, Jamie, Maddie, Brooke. Brooke is good.

Travis:

This are all regular names.

Griffin:

What about Sarsy?

Travis:

Oh.

Griffin:

Hey, guys...

Travis:

How about SARS?

Griffin:

You can't, you can't take the adjective and then like throw an R in it.

Travis:

This is my baby, she is a diva, her name is Derva.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

I need a melancholic child name, call her Melon Corlik.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Crystal.

Justin:

Bristol?

Griffin:

Crystal.

Justin:

Alright. What about Bristol?

Griffin:

Chloe.

Justin:

What about—

Griffin:

Sylver. Gisele.

Travis:

Wait, jump back. Silver?

Griffin:

With a Y.

Travis:

Like the horse?

Griffin:

But they've spelled it with a Y.

Travis:

Yeah, because that's not going to have any jokes about it, whatsoever in grade school.

Griffin:

What about, uh like, what if you called your baby, called your baby like, Bitch Patrol?

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

That's sassy, ain't it?

Justin:

What about? This is my daughter, No Scrubs.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

Don't even trip

Griffin:

This is my baby, Creeping.

Travis:

This is my baby TLC.

Justin:

Wait, I don't think...

Griffin:

The name of that song wasn't Creeping, was it? It was just—

Travis:

It was just Creep.

Justin:

It was just Creep.

Travis:

If you name your baby Creep...

Justin:

This is my baby Radiohead.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

She's a sassy.

Travis:

What if you name your baby after like sassy women who had gone before, and you're, like, this is my baby Joan of Arc.

Griffin:

What if you just called your baby Uh-uh.

Justin:

Not on my watch.

Griffin:

Mm-mm.

Justin:

The important thing is that...

Griffin:

No sir.

Justin:

What if you name your baby... [snaps fingers] That was it.

Griffin:

Was that three snaps?

Travis:

Just three snaps.

Justin:

If you make your baby, if you want a sassy baby, give her a name that humiliates people to pronounce, so if you said, my name is Destinee [extends the name] and it's got 40 E's at the end.

Travis:

And some of them are capitalized and some of the are not and you have to voice that.

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Travis:

Justin:

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

Destinee.

Griffin:

You know what I am not going to undersell Destinee, and I'll tell you why, I don't think her name is going to prevent her from achieving the goals she wants in life, I want her to be the first lady President of the United States of America.

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

Wow.

Griffin:

Madame President Destinee, I'm a ghost.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

"Hey, uh, so, did you always think you would be president?"

"Uh, yes, I always assumed that I would."

"So, what would you say that is? What is...?"

"I guess it was my fate, my fate to be..."

Travis:

It was predispositioned?

Justin:

No, I mean like if you thought you were always going to be it, it would be like your calling.

Griffin:

My destiny with a Y? I don't understand.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

[laughs] I don't understand.

Griffin:

Um, do you guys know what day it is?

Justin:

Game day?

Travis:

Game day?

Griffin:

It's the first week of September.

Justin:

No.

Travis:

No.

Griffin:

And as it is that, as is our calling, we are going to do things and we are going to talk about it.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

And we are going to talk about the things that are important this month and we are going to talk about them.

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

It's Fall Hat Month.

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

What?

Griffin:

It's also Happy Cat Month.

Travis:

Alright.

Griffin:

Now I know about that saying, Happy Cat Month everybody or your cat was bummed. Uh, it is National Coupon Month.

Justin:

Obviously.

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

It is...

Justin:

Can we talk about coupon, when was the last time you guys used...? Do you guys use coupons? I've used them once.

Travis:

Coupons are the worst thing that ever happened to our economy.

Griffin:

I literally used one last night to buy a chocolate cake at HEB.

Justin:

Really?

Travis:

Justin:

Travis:

Justin:

Travis:

Justin:

Travis:

Justin:

Can we make a combo month?

Travis:

That's what I'm saying.

Griffin:

Pleasure your Fall Hat Month.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

Really get in there.

Griffin:

Really get in there.

Travis:

Uh, when they say Fall Hat, is that like putting some fake leaves all over it?

Griffin:

Go wild during California Wild Rice Month.

Justin:

Okay.

Griffin:

Hey don't tell me how to fucking celebrate my fucking month, September.

Justin:

[laughs] Hey September, you're... Apparently no one wants this month anymore, I can imagine why, it's not like it's been ruined for celebrations.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

It's my grandpa's.

Travis:

10 years ago your birthday was ruined forever.

Justin:

Your birthday is actually ruined forever. Would you rather have a September 11th birthday or Christmas birthday?

Travis:

Christmas birthday.

Justin:

Really? At this point?

Travis:

At least there's, like, presents going around everywhere, everyone it's in a good mood and there's decorations and it's a happy time.

Griffin:

Guys, it's Pleasure your Mate Month and you know what that means, here at MBMBAM.

Justin:

What? I don't know actually, I am kind of afraid.

Griffin:

Justin:
