## MBMBaM 734: Twelve Volumes of Ichor

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**Intro (Bob Ball)**: The McElroy brothers are not experts, and their advice should never be followed. Travis insists he's a sexpert, but if there's a degree on his wall, I haven't seen it. Also, this show isn't for kids. Which I mention only so the babies out there will know how cool they are for listening. What's up, you cool baby?

[theme song, "My Life Is Better With You," by Montaigne, plays]

**Justin**: Hello, everybody, and welcome to My Brother, My Brother and Me, an advice show for the modren era. I'm your oldest brother, Justin McElroy!

**Travis**: What's up, Trav Nation? I'm your middlest brother, big dog chasing a car, just want to watch the world burn, woof-woof, Travis McElroy.

Griffin: I'm Griffin McElroy. My fellow Americans...

Travis: Oh?

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: I come to you this morning with excellent news. We got 'em.

**Justin**: [chuckles]

**Griffin**: He has eluded us for decades, and the whole time running amok. I would say, causing a lot of—

**Travis**: Yeah. Running several moks, really.

**Griffin**: A lot of amoks, just senseless. Just chaos all over the place. And really—just a really all around shitty guy. But we got the Joker for real, for real. This time, we took him down. And I think I played my part. I think we all played our part.

**Travis**: The clown is down.

**Justin**: We wanted you and the rest of our listeners to be the first to know that we killed the Joker for you today, captain. [chuckles] And we just want to salute you, captain. Our fighting forces finally brought him down.

Travis: Are you proud of us now?

**Griffin**: It's like a V for Vendetta thing. We can't—you can't kill the Joker by stabbing him with a knife in the heart, or shooting him with a gun. You know why? He's an idea.

Justin: He's an idea.

Travis: That's true.

**Griffin**: He's an idea.

Travis: You can't kill an idea.

Griffin: Except you can, Travis!

Travis: Oh?

**Griffin**: If you come out and you're like, "Hey, what's up? I'm Joker. I got new ideas." And everyone on Earth is like, "I think actually we're good. I think we've had our fill of Joker."

Justin: Yeah.

**Griffin**: "Thank you so much!" Then the idea just kind of prrr-beep-beebeep.

**Travis**: I was about to say, you know, I'm having a hard time because I haven't seen it. But then it sounds like that's what a lot of people could say? [titters] A lot of people maybe could say, "I haven't seen it."

**Justin**: Yeah, I did have that moment of like, Trav, in my more—I do have— we're cultural critics, if nothing else.

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin**: I feel an impulse to be culturally relevant with my finger on the zeitgeist. At this point though, I'm not sure if it's more zeitgeisty to not see the Joker. [chuckles]

Griffin: Exactly, yeah.

**Justin**: I think I'm more plugged in.

**Griffin**: We're sheep. We're sheep by doing nothing. By doing nothing, we have made the choice not to support the Joker.

**Justin**: I'm more plugged into like the public consciousness having not seen the movie, the Joker.

**Travis**: The rebellious act now would be to go spend money at a movie theater and watch a movie. I think that would be—

**Griffin**: Yeah, only I really don't—and I wonder if this is how other people feel, I really don't want to. I really don't want to see—

Justin: That's the other problem with it, isn't it?

Griffin: It could have tomorrow's winning—

Justin: The eternal struggle. [titters]

**Griffin**: It could have tomorrow's winning lottery numbers in it. I don't think I'd want to go see Joker: Folie à Deux.

**Travis**: The thing is, I'm a fairly plugged-in, you know, person, young man. About town, bon vivant. And I know I've seen previews for Joker 2. I know I have. I've seen coverage. They're covering it so much. I couldn't tell you what happens in the ding-dang movie!

Griffin: Yeah. Yeah.

**Travis**: I know Joker's there. And I think Stephanie's there as Harley Quinn.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis**: And that's about all I know. I don't know any action or plot. I couldn't even tell you—at least for the first one I could have told you, oh, he dances down some stairs.

Griffin: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

Travis: In this one, all I know-

**Griffin**: I don't know what happens in this one. Yeah, for sure.

**Travis**: Yeah, all I know is that they've got the two of 'em in it. They got 'em.

**Justin**: Was I right about the Joker, and then everyone else just had to catch up? Is the rest of America now realizing that we, the people who said this is actually not in fact a good film, are we now being proven right? [chuckles] Is it—I know taste is subjective, but once history gives you these things to work with and build on, I feel like it is conclusive now that Joker was the pits. [chuckles]

Travis: A mistake?

Griffin: Sure.

**Justin**: You know what I mean? It must be a bad movie.

**Griffin**: I think we have to support our troops that have been active in this battle for a long time. We had a brave agent undercover in this one, Lady Gaga, working to take the machine down from inside the machine!

Justin: We got him. Lady Gaga got him.

**Griffin**: She knew exactly what she was doing. She said, "I don't know if I want to be in this one. But if it means I can take down the Joker by being a secret sleeper cell undercover agent, so be it." And so, I mean, congratulations. It must have been really hard to be in Joker 2.

**Travis**: When she showed up and they were like, "Hey, Lady Gaga, we're going to be filming a movie called Folie à Deux. We'd love to have you in it." And she says, "Oh, that sounds very fancy."

**Griffin**: Oh, so cool.

**Travis**: A then she shows up first day, and there's the Joker. And she's like, "Ah, what the fuck? You guys didn't tell me—"

Griffin: Well, she probably saw Joaquin first. And she probably saw-

Justin: She probably saw Joaquin-Joaquin.

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Damn it, Juice, you did it right as I was gonna do it!

Justin: Ah, I'm sorry–I'm sorry, Griff!

**Griffin**: It's okay, man, we have the same brain. I don't—it don't—doesn't bug me.

Justin: Going right into it, I wasn't trying to rob your-

Griffin: Doesn't bug me at all.

Justin: Sorry...

**Griffin**: She probably saw Joaquin and was like, "I wonder what kind of Joaquin I'm gonna get in this film. A soft, sensitive, her-type, or like a crazy, dangerous, crazy man?" And then he walks in in his Joker makeup and she's like, "Ah, man, I'm in a Joker movie." That must have been really tough.

**Travis**: "Ah, beans."

**Justin**: "Ah, the Joker." Okay, a couple things that I've enjoyed about the interview circuit for Joker: Folie à Deux, that have nothing to do with the film itself. The number one is Lady Gaga asking Joaquin Phoenix questions about Lady Gaga music, mid-interview with other people.

Griffin: How was that?

**Justin**: And pretending he's a very big fan of Lady Gaga music, and then asking questions about Lady Gaga music. It... ripped ass.

**Griffin**: [laughs]

Travis: Oh, so kind of, it-

**Justin**: That man—hey, listen, Lady Gaga made Joaquin Phoenix so uncomfortable in that moment.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin**: It almost made up for how uncomfortable Joaquin Phoenix makes me every single day of my life every time I see him.

Travis: So, Justin, it was kind of Gaga-tcha journalism?

Justin: Yes, it was Gaga-tcha journalism.

**Griffin**: They're heating up! One more of those, guys, and we're gonna be dunking fire.

Travis: [laughs]

**Justin**: [chuckles] The other interview I liked about this is when Joaquin was like, "I don't really wanna talk a lot about my diet for the Joker." And he's like, "I was watching interviews for the last movie, and I just talk all the time about how little food I ate to be so skinny for the Joker. And I'm just so

boring and I was so annoyed, that I was annoyed with myself. So, I just don't want to talk about it, because it's like who cares?"

Griffin: That's good. You gotta-

Justin: That's good, Joaquin!

**Travis**: If they make him do a third one, the natural extension of that is him going, "I don't want to talk about this movie."

Griffin: You're confused. They won't make a third one. We fuckin' got 'em!

Travis: We got 'em.

**Justin**: We got him.

**Griffin**: We got the—we got the Joker.

**Justin**: Yeah, there's not gonna be a third one. I will be surprised if they ever mentioned the Joker again. [titters]

Griffin: I think he's done.

Travis: Well, he'll come back in the next Affleck Batman, right?

**Griffin**: No, Trav!

Justin: He's done, man.

**Griffin**: Because do you remember who the Joker was in that sort of modern universe? That was Jared Leto, which started the descent.

Travis: Oh, no.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Which started the decline.

Travis: That can't be it?

**Justin**: Did it? I say Cesar Romero did when he refused to shave his mustache.

**Travis**: That's a very Joker thing to do, though!

Griffin: That's so huge.

Justin: It is very Joker though, isn't it?

**Travis**: I'm excited to see—do you think that they'll included the Joker man in the Robert Battinson... the Batman movies?

Griffin: Oh, that's good. I guess there is a-mm-hm, yeah. I don't-

**Justin**: They're in a separate—they're separate little side pockets of the DC Universe. They're not the same—

**Travis**: Oh, no, wait, they did! They included the one from Gotham! The Gotham man was in the end of the Batman!

Justin: This is too stupid to talk about anymore.

Griffin: It's actually too-

**Justin**: I don't want to talk about this anymore. I don't want to talk about Batman. It's too stupid. The Joker, I think what everyone is realizing is like, this is all silly. You know what I mean? Like—

**Travis**: It's a comic book—he's a cartoon. [titters] It's a cartoon.

**Justin**: He's a cartoon. I'm not afraid of him.

**Griffin**: And it's like on Marvel's side, like you got a cartoon man who does deadly pranks. Great. They got a fuckin' purple alien who's jacked as fuck, and he can kill half the universe in one snap. And what's your guy do? He

has a little gun that squirts out laughy juice? Oh, that's great. Great. Great. Our guy can snap his fingers and kill everyone.

**Travis**: And he's a little politically incorrect? Ha-ha!

Griffin: Uh-oh, whoops!

Justin: Oh, wow.

Griffin: God, I love Thanos!

**Travis**: [laughs] More Thanos! Bring him back.

**Griffin**: Please! Bring Thanos back! I'm ready for more.

Justin: People make this-

Travis: Played by Robert Downey Jr, it's Thanos!

**Justin**: Hey. People talk about this sort of like going back and talking to one's past self a lot. But I do think it would be—if I could have one 30 second conversation with my teenage self, I think I would drop on him just like, "Hey, J-Man, just want to let you know, that Joker musical is dropping this weekend in movie theaters, and you're probably not going to go watch it. Okay, bye!"

**Griffin**: [laughs] If you tell that to you probably six months ago, and you'd be like, "Fuck, a Joker musical? No fuckin' way! I'm there day one!"

**Justin**: [chuckles] Here we are.

**Griffin**: Here we are.

**Justin**: Yet here we are recording this podcast, missing yet another showing!

Travis: Yeah, we could be there.

**Justin**: Of Joker. [chuckles] Perhaps several showings simultaneously of Joker.

**Griffin**: Yeah, the flick is 40 minutes long.

Justin: Folie à Deux.

Griffin: It trucks.

**Justin**: It is a—yeah, that's the other problem, is it is about as long as a Silly Symphony. [titters]

**Travis**: It actually, yeah, it plays at the beginning of the new Pixar movie.

Griffin: [guffaws]

**Travis**: You just watch the Joker, and then we're straight into Toy Story 6 or whatever.

Griffin: Yeah, yeah, yeah.

**Justin**: I think this is the new standard of cinema. A movie is good or bad depending on if it would be better if Deadpool appeared in it.

Griffin: Oh, sure.

**Justin**: By which I mean this; wouldn't it be good if Deadpool appeared in the Joker?

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: Even for just a moment?

**Justin**: Yeah. But if you think of your favorite films, would they be improved by Deadpool?

Griffin: No, probably not.

Travis: But Deadpool is already in Deadpool, Justin? So I don't know...

**Justin**: [titters] That's a really good point, Trav, thank you. "I'm currently planning my Halloween costumes for this year. I liked—" I'm gonna be Deadpool. "I like to be fun and creative. For example, one of my ideas this year is Jeff Probst Blue Ribbon."

Travis: Like PBR?

Griffin: Say it faster. Try to string it-

**Justin**: I'm gonna say it faster, but I don't know that I'm gonna be able to help it much. Let's try again. Jeff Probst Blue Ribbon. TM, TM, TM.

Griffin: That's good.

Justin: Jeff Probst Blue Ribbon

**Griffin**: That's really good.

**Travis**: Jeff probes loo—Blue Ribbon. That might just be hard to say.

**Griffin**: I would just—and just dress up like Jeff Probst, but just call it probes blue it Probst Blue Ribbon. You don't have to say the Jeff part.

Travis: Yeah, there you go. Yeah, don't say Jeff.

**Justin**: There we go. "The problem is that I absolutely dread the inevitable, 'So what are you supposed to be?'" Okay, you're not making it easy for yourself with Jeff Probst Blue Ribbon, my friend. Just a warning. "And the subsequent middling response at best, or blank stare at worst. Should I stop trying to reinvent the Hallowheel? Or should I just try to chase my bliss?" That's from Get It? In Minneapolis.

**Griffin**: You have a creative heart, and the spark, and the muse is inside you. You have big power, and you are channeling it all the time. And you make things harder for yourself. You make things harder for yourself. But when you confront that muse and you grab that big magic, sometimes you

do have to do hard things. I support your vision fully and completely. I think it's fucking killer.

Travis: Live, laugh, love.

Griffin: Yes, yes, yes. No, not that one.

Travis: Oh?

Griffin: That's not what it is.

**Justin**: It's vulnerable—it's a vulnerable time, Halloween. You're opening up yourself, your heart, and you're saying that this is some part of yourself you'd like to explore, I think.

Griffin: Sure.

**Justin**: This is a vulnerable thing. And I think that if you have a gag costume or a punny costume, you've sort of, I think you've defaulted on that contract. I don't think you've revealed anything about yourself, except that you like to use cleverness to hide behind.

**Griffin**: But that's a pretty big one to reveal about yourself, Juice, what you just said.

Justin: It's true.

Travis: Here's-

Justin: It's true.

**Travis**: Here's the thing. And I think the reason you get a weird reaction when you say like a Jeff Probst Blue Ribbon, is because part of the fun of Halloween isn't just your costume, it's the solve—it's the little solving of the mysteries the people who see your costume get to do.

Griffin: That's it.

**Travis**: They get that little dopamine bump of like, "I figured it out!" And when you say Jeff Probst Blue Ribbon, and they think, "Well, there's no way I was gonna get that." Right?

Griffin: No.

**Justin**: It feels bad. And it's not—it shouldn't be a riddle. You're wrong. No one wants a riddle all the time.

**Travis**: I'm not saying it's a riddle! I'm not saying it's a recognition.

Justin: Okay, yeah.

**Travis**: It's like, oh, you're this, you're Deadpool. Oh, you look great.

Griffin: Okay?

**Travis**: And if they don't get it, they feel stupid.

Griffin: It feels—okay, but—

Justin: It's a trap. Yeah, of course. Like all jokes.

**Griffin**: Can we call role play for just a second? Hypothetical, you guys are at a bar on Halloween night.

Justin: [in a silly voice] "Greetings, Griffin. Welcome to mein parlor."

Griffin: Yeah...

Justin: We're role playing, I didn't know-

Griffin: No, but that's not typically how we do it. Like we'll say like—

Travis: "Hey, what do you have, Mac?"

Griffin: Okay.

Travis: "Come on in."

Justin: "Oh, welcome to our parlor."

Travis: "Looks like you've had a rough day! Come on in."

Justin: "Massage and burgers."

Travis: "Have a seat at the bar. I'm Sam from Cheers!"

**Griffin**: So I guess I was thinking more like you guys are yourselves. Like you guys are yourselves.

Travis: "'Ey! I'm bartending here!"

**Griffin**: You guys can be the other characters too, but you're splitting roles here.

Travis: "And I'm Davey, who's still in the Navy!"

**Griffin**: Travis is there, though.

Travis: "And probably will be for life!"

Griffin: Can you give me Travis? Can you give me some Travis?

Travis: Okay, let me see...

Griffin: Just talk. I'm so excited for-

**Travis**: Yeah. Oh, hi. I'm making love to my tonic and gin.

Justin: [chuckles] Okay.

**Griffin**: Gross. Making wet splashes everywhere on the table. Thank you so much.

Travis: Yeah, dipping my balls in it.

Griffin: Thank you so much. And Justin, you're also there.

Justin: Yeah, I'm just listening now.

**Griffin**: There's these other big characters that you guys have created, and I love them, and I love all the work you did.

**Travis**: [sings] I'm the piano man!

**Griffin**: Okay, so it's actually Billy Joel1. Okay, so. you hear the ding-a-ling from the chime over the bar door. And in walks someone dressed up as Probst Blue Ribbon. They're dressed up like a PBR, but they have like the survivor hat, maybe a buff, maybe an immunity necklace to really sort of like send it through. Maybe they've got Jeff's fucking knife that he doesn't stop carrying around and stabbing things with all season long? I don't—

**Justin**: Is he the only TV host on network TV that is carrying a knife at all times, while on camera?

**Griffin**: And he gets stoked every time he—

Travis: Is Steve Harvey on network TV?

Griffin: Steve Harvey definitely has a big bowie strapped to his thigh.

Justin: [chuckles]

**Griffin**: But Jeff is just like, he looks for any opportunities. Bag of rice? Stab. Better hurry, rice is pouring out. I'm gonna do a few more stabs because of how good it feels. Anyway, they walk in. They walk in. Maybe you figure it out. Maybe you don't. But they reveal to you, "Oh, yeah, I'm Probst Blue Ribbon." You're telling me your response would be like, "Eh." I think all three of us would be like, "Oh, that's fuckin' great." You don't have to laugh. Like funny isn't really—

Travis: No, I'll show you exactly—

**Justin**: No, if I don't get it, what I'm gonna feel is shit.

**Travis**: This is exactly my response, Griffin, this is no joke my response; "Oh, okay!"

Griffin: Oh, man, not me. I would hit—I would hit you up—

**Justin**: If I got it, I would feel great. If I didn't get it, I would feel bad all night. Because if I don't get it, I failed them. If I don't get Probst Blue Ribbon and I'm me? I've really let the ball drop.

**Travis**: Here's what I would recommend—this hasn't been helpful, so let me make it helpful for a second. There are two avenues for you to go down. Okay, Justin, I'll come back to you.

Justin: I didn't say anything?

**Griffin**: [guffaws]

**Travis**: Okay. [titters] No, you made a face about it not being helpful. I get it.

Justin: [chortles]

**Travis**: There's two avenues you can go down with your Halloween costume. One is creativity, right? You're going to think of something no one else is going to think of. But the other one's execution.

Griffin: Oh, sure.

**Travis**: Or the detail you—like, oh, you even got that, you know, that pin on the jacket that they have, right? Maybe start funneling your energy that way. Because like yeah, like if it's three years ago, everyone's going to be doing Ted Lasso or whatever. But maybe yours is the best Ted Lasso?

Griffin: Don't be Ted lasso this year, gang.

Travis: Not now!

Griffin: Please don't be Ted lasso this year, gang. It's-

Justin: Just, what is the number of years before Ted Lasso is hysterical?

Travis: Three more.

**Justin**: Is it three?

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: I feel like the movie will be out in three, right?

**Travis**: Oh, yeah, you gotta do it before that.

**Justin**: You beat the movie relevance.

**Travis**: I want to hear it for the people who like do Beetlejuice this year. Because you know they're not the only Beetlejuice at that party.

**Griffin**: Oh, they've been sitting on that. Yeah.

Justin: But so what!

**Travis**: This is what I'm saying.

**Justin**: This is what I think—I feel like there's a problem with costumes, and it hits around college. Where everybody just starts to want to look either like it's about being a sort of like more sexualized version of yourself, or being like kind of... having a cute, sort of fun, clever costume. And I think what we lose is that some people—like just the people that just want to pretend to be a different person.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin**: This Halloween—

Griffin: Like Beetlejuice.

**Justin**: Yeah! They just want to pretend to be Beetlejuice for a night.

Travis: Or just attend a party. They just wanna be there!

**Justin**: This Halloween, you know what I'm gonna be? Deadpool. You know why? So I could pretend for one night that I'm the merc with the mouth that everybody loves.

Griffin: Sure.

**Justin**: And I'm gonna have a helmet that I made, from 3D printing. And I'm gonna have a gun I made, and swords. And I'm gonna be Deadpool. You know why? So I can pretend to be Deadpool.

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: For once.

Griffin: Kicks ass, cool.

**Travis**: And this year, Teresa and I, I'm gonna be Paula Hollywood, she's gonna be Prue Leith. And you know why?

**Justin**: There we go.

Griffin: Why?

**Travis**: Because it's a costume I can wear that I don't have to shave my beard for.

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: Will you dress one of your kids as Noel Fielding?

**Travis**: Oh my god, would I love to. Oh my god.

**Griffin**: That would be great. We're gonna do the—I think we're gonna do the whole Mario family. Which has like really wild connotations to it. Because Henry really wanted to be Waluigi, and then Gus was like down for Wario. And then me and Rachel are probably gonna be Mario and Luigi. Which is like, wait a minute, did Wario and Waluigi, are they the babies of Mario and Luigi?

**Travis**: Well, obviously not, Griffin. For a lot of reasons.

**Griffin**: Okay... just something to think about.

**Travis**: They're the clones of them. They're the evil clones of them.

Justin: Wait, Could they be their evil sons though?

Griffin: Their evil, baby sons.

Travis: From separate mothers?

Justin: Separate evil mothers. [chuckles]

Griffin: [guffaws]

**Travis**: Evil. They're half evil. They're evil on their mother's side.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin**: Yeah, they're kind of like... that's like how Party is half good and half evil. That's Wario, right?

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin**: He's not all evil. His mom was all evil. Half of him is plumber, half of him is evil.

**Travis**: If he was all evil, they wouldn't invite him to go go-karting with them and be in like Mario Party and Sports and stuff.

**Griffin**: Yeah, also, I'm a bit uncomfortable with the idea of there being an evil gene. I feel like that starts to get into some—

Justin: No, I just think we can-

**Travis**: We didn't raise it that way, Griffin! It could be.

Griffin: Choppy waters.

**Travis**: It could be an evil religion that he was raised with. You don't know, Griffin. [chuckles]

Griffin: Okay, okay, okay.

**Travis**: It's not an evil gene, that would be... problematic.

**Griffin**: I got a cool idea for the PBR costume, is if you get there dressed up like this and people are confused, and you don't like how it's feeling, you go to the bathroom and you can change. And you can either be a regular old can of PBR, or Jeff Probst who is mostly nude I imagine if the PBR can has been shed. A mostly nude Jeff Probst. Which is a state that, you know, I think he's probably comfortable with.

**Justin**: I just think if you're gonna go pun, both parts of the pun have got to be immediately recognizable.

Travis: Yeah, like Bart Varder.

**Justin**: That's where it's breaking down for me. Jeff Probst Blue Ribbon is good, in 2000 when everyone has Survivor fever.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin**: I just don't think the iconography of a Jeff Probst in this landscape, right? Now obviously to me—

Travis: In this economy?

**Justin**: Is gonna hit. Obviously it hits for me. I got a standee of—I got cardboard standee of Jeff Probst that I got for Father's Day that's in my living now for five months now. Like that's—of course I know who you are.

Travis: Now, what about Greg Proops Blue Ribbon?

Justin: What?

Travis: Greg Proops.

Justin: Greg Proops Blue Ribbon... is good.

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin**: Sorry, you're saying Greg Proops is more recognizable than Jeff Probst?

**Justin**: No, but it's sweatier. So when it's explained to me, I have a good laugh about it. Because there's no way I would have gotten Greg Proops Blue Ribbon.

Griffin: See? But that's what I'm saying!

**Justin**: That's funny.

**Griffin**: Yes. We've been on the opposite end of this question this whole time. Because I think if someone said Probst Blue Ribbon, my response would be, "That's really fucking good." That's really, that's very amusing. I'm not gonna laugh at it, but it's like—

**Justin**: Yeah, of course. If you have to have explained to you, you'll never laugh.

Griffin: But I can enjoy it. I can be entertained by it.

Justin: Pleasurable. It's pleasurable.

**Travis**: You can be Greg Proops, but also some elements of a ghost, and some elements of ice cream. And you're Proops Boo Robins. And just leave it, there's no way they're gonna get that.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin**: Just don't get hung up—everybody at the party. Don't get hung up on can you guess my costume? Just tell people what you're at, and let's skip to the enjoying it. Right? Let's skip to the pretending we're a sexy root beer, or whatever you're wearing this year. I don't know—

Griffin: I have-

**Travis**: There's only one good joke costume, in my opinion.

Justin: The Joker.

**Travis**: Yeah, you come and you're just wearing your jeans or slacks or something. No top. And then they say, "What are you?" And you say, "I'm premature ejaculation, because I just came in my pants." And that's the best one that there is.

**Griffin**: Trav, I'll be honest, I heard that joke from you in maybe the year 2007. And I do not think it's aged well over the last 17 years.

**Justin**: I think it sucks.

**Griffin**: I think if someone comes up to me and says anything about their cum? I'm good, dude. Thanks so much.

**Justin**: Another thing that's bad is that you said there's only one good joke costume, and I said, the Joker, and you said yes. [titters]

**Griffin**: And then you did a different one.

Justin: You agreed. You agreed that I was correct and then moved on.

**Travis**: Well, can we agree the Joker would come to a party as premature ejaculation? Because that's a chaotic thing—

**Griffin**: No, he'd come to the party, and he would blow it up with a bunch of bombs, because he fuckin' sucks!

Justin: [laughs]

Travis: He kills people.

Griffin: He kills lots of people, for no reason!

Travis: But the Batgirl movie gets canceled!

Justin: Come on.

Griffin: Thank you.

Justin: Yeah?

Travis: She doesn't kill people, does she, Justin?

Justin: Can I get one Skeletor origin story? No.

Griffin: No... No, thank you.

Justin: I want to see when he had flesh. So what?

Travis: I want to see him when he was just Greg. Just Greg. [chuckles]

Justin: I just want to see him before he was all bones.

Travis: Because they didn't call him Skeletor when he was a man?

**Justin**: I accidentally made a sideways reference to He-Man to Cooper this week. And she asked like, I mean, completely no awareness of the He-Man franchise at all. And I was trying to find a way to start to back into describing He-Man.

Griffin: Oh, dude.

Justin: That is not just like the dumbest shit on the plant.

Griffin: [laughs]

**Justin**: [chuckles] Like there's no part of it where you can scoot in and be like, "So there's this fuckin' skeleton—" I don't know, he's like—

**Travis**: He's a skeleton—

**Justin**: I know he looks like a big, strong prince, but he gets differently strong, I think?

**Travis**: Yeah, he gets bullied a lot? I think people think he's a nerd and a coward, even though he's built like—

**Justin**: But he's like so strong and he's the prince. But he needs a sword to get even more powerful.

**Travis**: And he's got a giant tiger that's a coward for some reason. The tiger is afraid of things.

Griffin: So wild.

**Justin**: And they're not—neither he nor Skeletor I are trying to do anything. They just don't—

Travis: Yeah, they don't have any wants.

Justin: Like each other—

Travis: Yeah!

Justin: Very much.

**Griffin**: That's pretty much it

**Travis**: I think they maybe have different views on, I don't know, whatever, and it brings them into conflict sometimes. And then there's a guy called Master-At-Arms, but he's only got the two arm. I don't know, man.

Justin: It's great.

**Griffin**: My boys have stumbled into the He-Man universe also, but only because Henry found the He-Man singing What's Going On meme from like the year 1999.

Travis: [chortles] Ha!

Justin: Fantastic.

Griffin: That's all he really needs. I have a wikiHow, if we could-

Justin: Oh? Excellent.

Travis: Please, yes.

**Griffin**: For just a moment. Lots of people have sent this in. And in fact; we did this wikiHow in the reverse wikiHow game that we sometimes play at live show.

**Justin**: Oh, isn't that interesting?

Travis: So now it's an Uno reverse-

**Justin**: Using all parts of the proverbial animal here.

**Griffin**: That's right. But in reverse wikiHow, we don't actually get into the subject matter. And I'd like to get into the subject matter. Lots of people sent this in. The subject matter is; what does it mean when you see a dead bird? "Discover what dead bird dreams and encounters are telling you. If you've stumbled across a dead bird or you've witnessed a bird's death in your dreams, we're here to help you figure out what the universe is trying to tell you."

**Travis**: Okay, so this isn't like a crime scene investigation, what does it mean when you found a dead bird? Who did it?

Justin: No.

**Griffin**: I think it's cheating if you kill a bird, and then you put it on the ground, and you leave the room and come back in.

**Travis**: I didn't say that, Griffin.

Griffin: Oh.

**Travis**: I didn't say I would kill a bird.

**Griffin**: Well, I'm just saying if you figure out that like dead birds in this scenario, when I see them, is a forebear of great fortunes. You can't then start killing birds to like create this, to, you know, put a hand on the karmic wheel.

Travis: Mm-hm.

**Justin**: That's true. If you see a dead bird you killed, the only thing that means is that you—mission accomplished.

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: You did it.

Griffin: Or uh-oh! You may have done an accident—

**Justin**: Not again, too—

**Travis**: There might be a lot of carbon monoxide around.

Justin: These darn muscles!

**Travis**: There's carbon monoxide, the parrot, you know. It wasn't a parrot, was it? [chuckles] That would have been costly.

**Griffin**: That would suck. I think we can all agree, there is types of birds where if I saw a dead one on the ground, I would be like, "Ah, man!" Like a beautiful condor. Ah, a beautiful parakeet? Ah, dang!

Travis: A cockatoo? A cockatiel?

Griffin: Or just a sort of bog standard, you know, bird. That sucks, but-

Travis: Yeah...

Griffin: Anyway, dead bird-

**Justin**: I saw a dead—I get a bunch of vultures up around my property. Because we got dead wildlife dying there, and they always circle around, these terrible vultures. And then this past week, I saw one vulture lying dead on the ground, and the other vultures circling it as if wondering, "What the hell do we do about this?"

Travis: "What's next steps here, boys?"

Griffin: [chuckles] Someone-

Justin: "Never in all our days!"

**Travis**: "They never covered this in the manual, fellas! Do we need to talk to their partner first? Or..."

Griffin: "Somebody call the jackal! We need a fixer!"

Justin: [chuckles] "The literal jackal!"

Griffin: "The literal jackal."

Justin: "That we know, that will eat him, so we can leave!"

**Griffin**: Dead bird interpretations. "You're on the precipice of a big change in life. One chapter is ending and another is beginning. At least, that's the most common interpretation of a dead bird." Who's been discussed—who's been discussing this? And how did they come to any kind of consensus?

**Travis**: Can you imagine, if you had never heard that bit of information. You're walking with a friend, there's a dead bird on the sidewalk, and your friend just turns to you and goes, "Hm, big things coming." Like, I would be so scared in that moment of my friend! [chuckles]

**Justin**: Big changes. In order to discern any meaning from it, I think we can't have any idea about why the bird is dead, right?

## Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin**: Like, if you—aside from killing a bird, we all agreed, we're not gonna kill the birds.

**Travis**: We're not gonna kill the birds.

## Griffin: Yeah.

**Justin**: We're not gonna kill the birds. But if you see a bird fly into a plate glass window and then die right there, which has happened to me many times, I can't derive meaning from that, right? Like other than like clean glass—

**Griffin**: No, you gotta let someone else find that. If you see birds being killed by flying into a stained-glass window, I don't think it counts if you—

**Travis**: Not stained glass! Not a stained glass window, Griffin!

Justin: Now this is where it gets interesting, though.

Griffin: Yeah. [chuckles]

**Justin**: This where it gets interesting to me. If I can, through a series of clues, derive how the bird was killed, conclusively—

**Travis**: You could solve the murder! So this is crime scene investigation!

**Justin**: Air-tight! If I can solve the murder of the bird, it no longer has symbolic meaning.

Griffin: Right.

**Justin**: The symbolic meaning can only be present if its means of death is not discernable by me.

**Griffin**: It's gotta be a secret. Because otherwise the other option is, you're at church, everyone knows that dead birds being a good omen. And then a bird flies into the stained glass window. Everyone hops out of the pews and races to get outside to be the first one to see this dead bird! I'm trying to turn my—

Travis: Wait, it has to be the first one to see it?!

Griffin: Yeah, first one to see it gets the power-

Travis: And like it gets used up?!

**Griffin**: First one gets the power. Because the bird's soul makes the wish come true.

Travis: Okay, okay. Okay, only one at a time, got it, got it.

Griffin: But only once! Only once. [titters] Anyway...

**Justin**: But if you have a detective waiting outside the church and he's like, "There you have it." There's no power at all. [chuckles]

Travis: "I saw the whole thing."

**Griffin**: I do actually think there is a situation where you could be on the precipice of a big change in life if you saw a dead bird. And that is if the bird was 200 feet long. [chuckles]

Travis: [laughs]

**Griffin**: And then you were like famous because you're like, "This guy found the giant albatross. He was technically a dinosaur, and they were real, and this guy found 'em! Let's shower him in praise and money!" Huge change for you. So dope that you found the 200-foot turbo bird. It could also mean you're receiving a warning about a future obstacle. Gotta step over this bird. [chuckles]

**Justin**: Yeah, that's not a future warning. I mean, right now. Hey, dead bird.

**Travis**: So, it could mean a big change is coming.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis**: Or you're gonna have to deal with a huge obstacle.

Justin: Mm-hm...

**Travis**: I'm just keeping track of my options here.

**Griffin**: It's one of those two.

**Travis**: Because now I'm fighting. Because if I'm getting outside of the church where the bird is crashing into the plate glass window, I see the bird first, could mean big change. But it could also mean obstacle. So do I want to let Drew see it first?

**Griffin**: Well, if you saw it die—if you saw it die, you wouldn't get the power. We covered this.

**Justin**: When I was a kid, I used to think about a floor that I would be stuck in the middle of that was completely covered with dead birds. So anywhere—

Griffin: Normal.

Justin: That stepped, I would be-[titters] I would be-

**Travis**: Oh, okay. For some reason, Justin, I thought your body was halfway through the floor? You were like at waist level stuck in the floor.

**Justin**: No, it's like—no, imagine like the floor is covered in like different dead birds, like carcasses of dead birds. Anywhere you step, you'd step on a dead bird.

**Travis**: Hey, Justin? So far, you've talked about how there's a lot of dead creatures around your house, and vultures circle it. And then there's a dead vulture, and you've seen birds crash into their plate glass windows a lot.

Justin: Yes, yes.

Travis: Are you okay? Is everything all right?

**Justin**: Yes, Travis. Thank you for wandering into the ad. Master of Terror, Justin McElroy has been scaring you for decades. And now, with this new collection—

Travis: [laughs]

**Justin**: Exclusively through the mail, you can get all of his scary, spine-tingling tales.

**Griffin**: Did you—

**Justin**: Yeah, I'm this Halloween season, I'm bringing all my scariest tales to this thrilling new collection—

Travis: Mostly dead bird related.

Justin: Justin McElroy's Spooky Stories.

**Griffin**: Justin stole a canopic jar from the museum and he poured it into a Tervis Tumbler and drank it all up. And now he's got a real bird problem on his hands.

**Justin**: I've turned my ichor into a 12-volume series, available for a low monthly fee. [chuckles]

Travis: Yes, it is available for digital download!

Justin: No, but it's handsomely bound and suitable for presentation!

**Griffin**: I'm skipping around this article, but I do want to just quick go back to the additional matter on these first two pieces. The first one, you're on a big precipice of a change in life, it adds, "Alternatively, the bird could be an omen that changes coming for you regardless of the choices that you make. Birds die all the time because of things they have no control over, and perhaps a big change is coming for you." That's really true about birds.

So, "You're receiving a warning about a future obstacle. On the flip side, a dead raven or crow may specifically indicate a good fortune. Crows and ravens are often symbols of death or bad news." Sucks for the crows and ravens, I bet! That we walk along and we're like, "Yes! Awesome."

**Travis**: Wouldn't it be—first of all, I believe it's the raven, is a—is way bigger than you're picturing right now.

Griffin: Huge. Huge bird. Yeah.

**Travis**: If I'm walking down the street and there's just a dead raven lying on the ground? I'm running away so quickly.

**Justin**: They're so big that when you are come upon one, a lot of times it feels like perspective must be off.

Travis: It must be wrong.

**Justin**: Like, "Oh, this can't be right? That's huge! Look at that. He must be closer than I thought he was, because he's gigantic."

**Travis**: Also, wouldn't it be wild if this article revealed to us that actually birds only die by choice? That birds never die from circumstances beyond their—

Griffin: "I'm ready! Tweet-tweet-tweet!"

Travis: [chuckles] "Well, that's it! I've flown enough!"

Justin: "I'm going to the birdie side layer, good bye!"

**Griffin**: [chuckles]

Travis: [titters] They just make the decision.

Justin: "Whee-ee!"

Griffin: If you're experiencing-

**Justin**: It's because it's heaven, Trav! They just have to go up. They're birds.

**Griffin**: [chuckles] That's all they do.

Travis: [chortles]

Justin: They're birds.

**Griffin**: You don't see a lot of dead birds, we should be seeing way more. It's because when they're done and they've fulfilled their mission, [blows raspberry], fly right on up.

**Travis**: They just fly up there.

Justin: Up!

Griffin: Up-up-up-up!

Justin: Top floor.

**Griffin**: And if their spirit is clean enough, and they don't have any sense, they can make it. Space birds.

Travis: And what would a bird do that's so bad?

**Griffin**: So, it could also mean that you're experiencing the end of a relationship. "If you see a dead bird in the middle of a tumultuous time with a partner, friend or family member, it's a sign the relationship has past—"

Justin: [titters] Or a pet bird.

Travis: Yeah, especially if the relationship was with the bird! That's done! "Oh, man, I guess me and that bird broke up."

Griffin: "I don't think it's gonna work out, bird."

**Justin**: [laughs] "Hey, bird, I don't know what tumultuous was, but I think we're tumultuous."

Griffin: [chuckles]

**Justin**: "I read in a book that I think we're tumultuous, because you're dead." [titters]

**Griffin**: But also, if you are struggling in your relationship and you have to run to the post office. Life hack, just look up the whole way. Only alive birds up there. No dead birds up in the sky.

**Justin**: [chuckles] Too true.

**Travis**: Now, are we to assume, Griffin, that in every one of these circumstances, if seeing a dead bird means this thing, seeing a live bird means the opposite? Like when I see a live bird, is it a sign that nothing's ever gonna change in my life again?

**Griffin**: I don't think so. Because live birds, there are so many of them. Who cares?

**Justin**: Live birds... live birds is interesting because they are not meaningful until you see enough of them that there's something in your human-animal brain that you're like, "Oh, fuck."

Travis: Yeah.

**Justin**: When I see 100 birds, I'm done.

Griffin: That sucks.

**Justin**: Like there's something wrong. Something's bad. I don't like to see a lot of them all together.

**Griffin**: "You're being visited or blessed. In some spiritual traditions, a dead bird is a sign that someone or something is coming to say hello. If you've recently lost a loved one, maybe they're using the bird as a way to get your attention." I would have used in a live bird!

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: [titters] Yeah.

**Griffin**: I'm not gonna—

**Travis**: I can't stress enough, wikiHow article, that's what it could mean if there's one dead bird outside my house. If there's 100 dead birds outside my house? Something's coming.

**Griffin**: I don't know— I don't know that many people.

Travis: Something's coming!

**Griffin**: I don't know that many people in heaven. So, I don't know why the—if this is part of some other culture or religious practice, I'm not going

to criticize it. I'm just saying personally, I would have been an alive bird to visit.

Justin: Yeah.

Travis: Yeah.

**Griffin**: Because like if I passed, you guys would be bummed. And then you're like, "Oh, Griffin sent his spirit down in a vessel to say to what's up." And it's a dead bird? You guys are gonna be like, "It's just another dead Griffin. This sucks! We already have one of those. This sucks!"

Justin: "Thanks for nothing, dead Griffin." [chuckles]

**Griffin**: Let him fly around our little heads and land on our fingers and like tell us how chill it is in heaven. Not another dead Griffin? Yikes! Now we got two!

**Justin**: I want to know how more he's doing. Something.

**Travis**: I do want to know how more he's doing. And I believe—what's the dog's name? [titters]

Justin: Marley.

Travis: Marley?

**Griffin**: Does Marley die at the end of—

Travis: No, Marley was dead to begin with.

Griffin: Does-

**Justin**: No, Jake—oh, yeah. Right, that's good. So, Griffin, what else could a dead bird mean? A lot of these—

Travis: Good eatin' tonight! [titters]

**Griffin**: A lot of these are really repeating. "You're in for a bit of bad luck." Yeah, I saw a dead bird, that sucks. "You're going to experience a loss soon." Yeah, my bird. We're doubling up on a lot of this. Now, this one's interesting. "You're being warned to avoid taking a certain path." Now, this could be prophetic, or it could be there's a bobcat out there, down that path—

Travis: Mm-hm. Quite literal.

**Griffin**: Of the jungle, who wants nothing to fuckin' do with you. He puts the dead bird there, as if to say, "Don't even step. Don't even try it. Look what I did to this thing. I will do that to you. Kill you, graveyard dead. Even though I'm just a little fuzzy guy. I will fuckin' kill you dead if you come in my territory. I've left this dead body here as proof."

**Travis**: This is interesting, because I look at this as like one dead bird, random. Two dead birds, warning. Three dead birds, now we're starting to build a little breadcrumb path here.

Griffin: Okay.

**Travis**: Someone wants me to follow these three dead birds.

Griffin: Yeah.

**Travis**: Now the question is, is it—do they need my help, and maybe they don't have anything except dead birds on them? Or is this a scary thing and I shouldn't follow it? I don't know. But now, whoops, I'm nine dead birds deep. And it's gotten dark and I can't see the beginning of the trail anymore.

**Griffin**: Yeah, that's when they get you.

**Travis**: Oh, what's that? Oh, no, I found a 12 book series of scary stories written by Justin McElroy?

Griffin: [laughs]

Travis: Is this how I... Is this how I get it?

Griffin: You're in one. You're in one, dude.

Travis: Ah, man...

**Griffin**: I believe it was Robbie Frost who said like, don't take the easy road, always take that hard, bumpy road.

Travis: Yeah, look for the one with dead birds.

**Griffin**: I think that's exactly how the poem goes. And so maybe you see the dead bird on that path and you're like, "I guess this bird couldn't hack it." You say, "Wow, this road is a tough one! Robbie Frost was right, I bet there's treasure at the end of it." That's the meaning of that whole poem. And then you walk on that one, and you get the treasure maybe. I don't know.

**Travis**: Well, what if I find a bird at a crossroads? Which one of those paths am I not supposed to take?

**Griffin**: You spin the bird, go the way it lands.

Travis: [chuckles]

Griffin: It's not great. Like I'm not loving talking about dead birds much.

**Travis**: We're not advocating for it.

**Griffin**: No, I don't—I love—I do like birds and... there's a lot of them, and you do see quite a few dead ones when you're just like out strolling around.

Justin: Mm-hm.

Travis: So many.

**Griffin**: But this practice, you do have to pick up the bird and spin it around a little bit.

Justin: No problem.

**Griffin**: I would probably just actually just turn around and go back home.

Travis: What do you think a bird feels when it sees a dead us?

Griffin: Wow.

Justin: Whoa!

Travis: Yeah, man. Think about that.

Griffin: [titters]

**Justin**: Let's go in the Money Zone.

**Griffin**: [guffaws]

[theme music plays]

**Griffin**: I think that the scariest things in life is the real—the real shit. My health, my ability to defend my family with my strength and sound mind. But it can be hard to find the specialist that I need to build my health, strength and sound mind. Especially living here in Washington, DC. Fuckin' bureaucracy town—

Travis: Red tape.

**Griffin**: They may as well call it. All this red tape tying up my ankles and my hands. But luckily, Zocdoc is carrying the sword of liberty to free me from my imprisonment, and help me find the specialist that I need for my care.

Justin: Okay.

Griffin: What's wrong?

**Justin**: No, I just want to hear all about this. This doesn't sound right. Is it an app?

Griffin: No, do I look like I'm about to cry?

Justin: No, it sounds like you're gonna-

**Travis**: It's just you have a lot of medical specialists and—

**Justin**: It just sounds like you're gonna cry about Zocdoc because you love it so much.

Travis: Get 'em.

Griffin: No, I don't think I'm gonna cry? I'm just enthusiastic about it.

Justin: It just sounds like you're gonna-

Travis: You could marry it.

Justin: Cry about it because you love it so much.

Griffin: Okay.

Travis: Will Zocdoc marry you?

Justin: [titters]

Griffin: That's weird, man. It's weird to do ths-

Travis: Because you love it so much.

**Justin**: [laughs] It just sounds like you're gonna cry, and I thought you were gonna cry about Zocdoc.

Justin: I was trying to support your energy, Griffin. I was yes anding-

Travis: We did not mean to Zocdoc jock block you, Griffin. I 'm so sorry.

**Griffin**: When I stand up, you're gonna hear a jingle-jangle sound from my jock getting smashed.

**Justin**: I was supporting you.

Travis: [chortles]

Justin: [titters]

Griffin: I gotta find a doctor for my-

Travis: The pieces of your jock!

**Griffin**: I gotta find a doctor, because my fuckin'... my ding-dang penis got smashed while trying to do this fuckin' ad! Zocdoc is where I'll go!

**Justin**: Don't get fuckin' mad at me for trying to 'yes, chef' your stupid bits. [titters] I had your back!

Travis: Ooh!

**Travis**: I'm from the future. And I've been meaning to tell you guys this for a while now. And I keep forgetting to mention it. That's why I was here for episode one. And I came back to tell you guys that soon, the robots are coming.

Justin: Oh, cool.

Travis: But-

Griffin: Get to the point!

**Travis**: As long as you have a Squarespace website, they'll spare you, is what I heard.

Justin: Whoa?

Griffin: Wow?

Travis: Yeah. That's what I heard.

**Griffin**: Do you think that—okay, I'm checking the ad copy here. It does say to overtly threaten your listeners.

Travis: I'm not threatening anybody, Griffin!

Griffin: Yeah ....

Travis: The robots are.

Griffin: Okay.

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: But it's also kind of—but it's also—hey... also kind of you, right?

Travis: No, Griffin, I would never.

Griffin: Okay ...

Griffin: [spoofs sleeping and snoring sounds]

**Justin**: [chuckles]

Travis: So that makes it easier.
