

MBMBaM 84: Face 2 Face 4: Sippin' on Chillerz

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Intro (Bob Ball): The McElroy brothers are not experts, and their advice should never be followed. Travis insists he's a sexpert, but if there's a degree on his wall, I haven't seen it. Also, this show isn't for kids, which I mention only so the babies out there will know how cool they are for listening. What's up, you cool baby?

[theme song "(It's a) Departure" by The Long Winters plays]

[audience cheers]

Griffin: Didn't want to interrupt the flow, you know?

Justin: Yeah, well, I was kind of counting on the whole thing playing out, because that's the first physical exertion I've done in a decade or so.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: That's the most exercise I've gotten. Hi, everybody! This is My Brother, My Brother and Me, an advice show for the modern era. I'm your oldest—

[audience cheers]

Justin: Most winded brother, Justin McElroy.

Travis: I'm your middlest brother, Travis McElroy.

Griffin: I'm a sweet baby, Griffin.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Guys... I got presents.

Justin: Candlenights presents.

Griffin: I got Candlenights presents for everyone who is sitting at this table. And nobody in the audience, I'm sorry.

[audience laughs]

Justin: Just this—from here—Candlenights celebration—

[audience laughs]

Griffin: It's our swag from Genesis Today.

Justin: Now, what have you got there?

Griffin: I got you the gift of health!

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: I got you an acai berry shooter.

Justin: Okay. I'm not gonna drink that right now.

Griffin: I got you super fruit omega three gummies.

Justin: Wow! All for me?

Griffin: I got you some goji. I don't even know what that one is, never heard of it before!

Justin: I think that's the one that makes you do back flips real good.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: I was just thinking...

Justin: Tell me.

Griffin: There's a second back—I was just thinking, since we just did another show, an hour of goofs, and we never tried to do two hours of goofs in the same day, that we need all the energy that we can get. And these have lots of B12 in 'em!

Justin: So, we got gummy vitamins. This is super fruit.

Griffin: We got five-hour energy drinks, which are not from Genesis Today, but I figured they'd get the job done too. Also, at the Walgreens, where I purchased some of this stuff, they had these at the counter, they're called Tropic Chillerz. They're seventeen percent alcohol by volume.

[audience laughs]

Griffin: They come in these delightful little spheres.

Travis: They're little alco-bombs!

Griffin: They're little alco-balls, and we're—we should drink 'em, and get—

Justin: That translates to seventeen percent funnier for you, the people.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: Let's do it!

Griffin: Oh, Jesus.

Justin: I really don't wanna.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: How is it?

Travis: That's straight gross!

Griffin: It's miserable!

[audience chuckles]

Travis: Wow!

Justin: Oh my god!

[audience chuckles]

Travis: That tastes like radioactive urine! [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: It tastes like the bad part of vodka night, like towards the end, when it like comes back to you.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: Mine actually tastes like someone was floating like apple slices in gross vodka, and then someone vomited in it.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: I spilled tropic chiller—

Justin: [exclaims] Ah! Oh-ho-ho!

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles] I spilled Tropic Chillerz with a Z all over my papers, and now I can't read 'em.

Justin: [laughs]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Oh, gross.

Travis: We'll combine that with the five-hour energy!

Justin: I don't want to do that. I think the gag was initially that we would like jam 'em. Like, "Ah, look at us!" They're disgusting. I'm not doing that.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: It's repellent. I will drink a five hour—and I want you guys to have the most pumped-up...

Travis: Can we start a clap? Can we start a slow clap for Justin?

[audience starts clapping]

Travis: Slow clap, people! A slow clap!

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: I know that—

[audience claps rhythmically with increasing frequency]

[audience cheers]

Justin: Holy shit.

[audience cheers]

Justin: He's gone mad with power. Don't encourage him.

[audience laughs]

Griffin: Oh, fuck! These are really bad.

Justin: They're really brutal, right?

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Let's get right into the advice. I feel like we've stalled—

Travis: [laughs]

Justin: Long enough. First bit of advice, don't do any of the things from the last three minutes or so.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Just don't do that, and you'll be good to go. First question comes from The Holiday Hater. Are they here?

The Holiday Hater: Yeah.

Justin: The Holiday Hater. Hey everybody, there's the hol—hey, hi!

[a few audience members boo]

Travis: Hey...

Justin: Well, come on, guys!

[audience laughs]

Justin: Fuck, that turned—

Travis: Well, hey!

Justin: They turned dirty quick!

Griffin: We haven't gotten to do a live show where the audience turns on each other before they turn on us.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: But we will encourage that behavior.

Justin: Yeah.

Travis: Hey, everybody, turn on that guy!

Griffin: Yeah!

Justin: Yeah!

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Just go straight Hunger Games in here.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "The candidate from [unintelligible]..." Okay, so, he says, "I'm a Grinch. It doesn't matter what holiday it is, Christmas, Thanksgiving, Halloween, Fourth of July—" He did not include Candlenights, but I'm assuming. "Or anything else. Just can't get excited for 'em. I want to get excited and enjoy the holidays, but I just can't seem to. How can I stop being a Grinch?"

Griffin: Like things.

[audience laughs]

Justin: Okay. Normally, we try to cut a little deeper to the bone here on our show, but I guess "like things" is a perfectly suitable answer.

Travis: Like every holiday? Like Columbus Day and like Canadian Thanksgiving and stuff?

Griffin: What about the—what about... [eating sounds] what about Independence Day, when we beat all the aliens?

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Can you not eat super fruit gummies during the show?

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Sorry. [chuckles]

Justin: You sound like my... [chuckles] this is my chaw-addicted brother, Griffin. He loves two things, bad advice and smokeless tobacco.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: No, but really, Independence Day, not a fan of that? It's just fireworks and hot dogs. How can you not get into things exploding, and also, there are hot dogs there?

Justin: Wait a minute, is every day of your life a holiday? Are you Tim McGraw, Live Like You Were Dying style?

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Every day out there, skydiving, Rocky Mountain climbing? No? Well, you're here, so I can tell that's not true.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: Hey, I'm sorry. I want to say that. I love the holidays. Why don't you like them?

Griffin: Wow.

Justin: What do you have against—let me say this, do you have anything against them? Or is it just like, "Eh..."

Travis: "Eh, I don't feel it."

The Holiday Hater: It's mostly eh...

Travis: Oh, welcome to adulthood!

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: [laughs]

[audience laughs]

Griffin: Guess what? Nothing's as good as it used to be!

Travis: You turn like sixteen, and people stop giving you candy and sparklers, and it's sad, from now on!

Justin: Yeah, you have to—

Travis: And you have to drink chillers and five-hour energy drinks just to to feel!

Justin: Yeah.

[audience laughs]

Justin: We have a cure for your problem, it's called alcohol. [chuckles] Get on the bus.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: They sold these like next to the Paydays and 3 Musketeers, at the Walgreens!

Justin: I ca—I guaran-god-damn-tee you, parent—hurried parents have picked these up as a treat for their young ones. "Here!"

Travis: Oh, they're like, "This is bright green. They'll love it. They love juicy stuff."

Griffin: I'm not even fucking anymore! This is a grossest thing I've ever drank in my life.

Travis: Yeah!

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "Hey, Frank, I know He's our son, and I know how this sounds, but for the first time, I was able to really just chill with Dylan."

[audience laughs]

Justin: "He just fuckin' hung out."

Griffin: "Me and Brian got some serious hang time on the books."

[audience chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] "It was really good. We went and hit the jukebox, played all the Toby Keith songs, flipped a table and left."

[audience chuckles]

Travis: What I found in my adult life is, all the holidays that I loved as a kid, like Halloween and Christmas and stuff, I had to give those up to appreciate holidays like St. Patrick's Day and—

Griffin: So you're saying—

Travis: Columbus Day.

Griffin: Sacrifice a few holidays so that the other ones mean more.

Travis: No, I'm just saying like, I've learned to appreciate, I don't have to go to work today days. And I get to drink all day day!

Griffin: How do you not like those days?

Travis: And flag days!

Griffin: [yells out] What's wrong with you?!

Travis: [chuckles]

[audience laughs]

Justin: I think you're too broken for our help. But, sir, I'm sorry, you will be issued a full refund at the door.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: You will not.

[audience laughs]

Griffin: I have a Yahoo.

Justin: A Yahoo, you say?

Griffin: I have a Yahoo Answers.

Justin: From the Yahoo Answers service.

Griffin: From the Yahoo Answers platform.

Justin: Okay.

Griffin: That was developed.

Travis: I can't stop drinking it, even though—

Griffin: I know, it's like an experiment now. [chuckles]

Justin: You have to stop drinking it.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: It's like mouth art, for your mouth.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: This one was sent in by Alethia Eckhart. Thank you, Alethia. It's by Yahoo Answers user Nevaeh, who asks—

Justin: Heaven backwards.

A Lady in the Audience: Yeah!

Justin: Hey, everybody, by the way, cheese it with that. All right?

Travis: [chuckles]

Griffin: Who—

Justin: Unless your name is Nevaeh and you're here, in which case it's lovely.

Griffin: Who asks—

Travis: It's a lovely name.

Griffin: "What can I get a horse and dog for Christmas? We're having a Christmas party on this Saturday, and we're doing Secret Santa, and I got a horse named Daisy and a dog named Bandit."

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: "Which, Bandit is kind of old and only has twenty percent vision, so I can't really get him toys. So what else can I get a dog that only has twenty percent vision?"

Travis: Euthanasia!

Griffin: *Aah!*

Justin: [chortles]

[audience exclaims and laughs]

Griffin: "And what do you buy a horse for Christmas, besides treats? Horse treats; apples, sugar."

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Hey, guess what? That's the only thing that horses give a shit about! And not being—those three things, and not being kicked in the sides.

Travis: [laughs]

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Those are the four things that horses like.

Travis: "I got you this necklace of roses."

Griffin: "I like oats and not having a man on me."

Justin: [laughs]

[audience laughs]

Travis: Maybe you could get 'em a smaller horse and a smaller dog?

Justin: But you know what? Even those horses give a shit about holidays. Just saying.

Griffin: Hey.

Travis: [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Just saying.

Griffin: Get it together.

Justin: They get a little extra trot in their gallop, right around Thanksgiving and stuff. [titters]

Griffin: I don't know what horses like anymore.

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: In my day, horses, you do a favor—

Griffin: I feel like I used to have my finger—

Travis: They appreciated the simpler things, like Smucker's Raspberry Preserve!

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: I used to have my finger on the equestrian pulse, and nowadays, I just feel so divorced from it.

Justin: You know what you could do? You could get the horse a dog present, and the dog a horse present, and then they swap 'em, Gift of the Magi.

Griffin: [laughs] Why?! That's—

Travis: And they become best friends!

Griffin: That's not how Gift of the Magi works!

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: "Thanks for the watch chain, it's yours now!"

Travis: Gift of the Lazy Guy!

Griffin: A swaperoo!

Justin: News flash! If you're a horse, you don't fuckin' know that!

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: You just take it for granted! Somebody tells you to run in a circle and you're like, "Okay, boss."

Griffin: "I guess thanks."

Justin: "Okay, boss."

Griffin: "I hope I get oats for this!"

Justin: [chuckles]

Travis: We've gone, I don't know, five minutes without addressing the fact that someone got a horse and a dog in a Secret Santa.

Griffin: [guffaws]

[audience laughs]

Justin: That's how this show—

Travis: What kind of fuckin' Secret Santa is this?!

Griffin: What kind of Secret Santa is there where you draw a human being saying like, "Oh, *whew!* Dodged a bullet there!"

Travis: [yells out] "Thank God! Someone that wears shoes and pants and stuff."

Justin: Yeah, "I got the short straw. Looks like I got the horse." Good news, you can give the straw to the horse.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] He will enjoy that very much.

Griffin: Can you get—

Travis: Why is your response not, "This is a horse."

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "I think there's been a clerical error."

Griffin: "Pardon, excuse me, you have written Bandit."

Travis: "No, I entered the *human* Secret Santa."

Justin: "I'm a human and I have a horse."

Griffin: Is the horse in [unintelligible]? Do they have to get—

Travis: [laughs] What the fuck is that horse gonna get?!

Griffin: I got you—

Travis: "All I got is these shoes and like an apple!"

Griffin: "Do you want this eaten apple?"

Travis: "Steven the human isn't gonna like this apple!"

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "Bad news for Dorothy in accounting, you're not getting anything this year."

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: "Don't even buy a gift. You're going home empty handed."

Travis: How did the horse write their name on the slip?

Justin: There's a lot of questions, a lot of—why are horses even involved in the Secret Santa? This—

Travis: The horse doesn't give two shits about Secret Santa!

Justin: This is a person—someone's having a laugh at the office, I think.

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: Yeah, "Hey, Kristen, we're doing Secret Santa this year."

Griffin: The Horse office! The office where horses are.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: This whole thing is taking place on Hey Dude, the television show.

[audience laughs]

Travis: Unless this question is written by someone named like Steven the Weasel...

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: Oh!

Griffin: You're saying that this is—

Travis: It's like an Orwellian like Animal Farm kind of thing!

Justin: Right, it's another animal getting presents for that animal.

Travis: On the internet. Wait, it all fell apart.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: [titters] They can't—

Griffin: Can you get the dog an iPad 2?

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Everybody wants one of those. They're the hottest gift this year.

Travis: "I got you Never Say Never."

Griffin: Can you get it some Genesis Today super fruit gummies? Immunity boosting variety.

Travis: For the horse on the go!

Griffin: Horses need immunity. That's what I'm saying.

Justin: Hah... I have another question here.

Griffin: Thank you.

Justin: Is Sam Panky here?

Sam Panky: Yeah.

Justin: Sam—where is he? Sam?

Sam Panky: Right here.

Justin: Hi, Sam!

Griffin: Hi, Sam.

Justin: Thank you for coming. Sam didn't create a clever nickname for himself, for himself for reasons that will become evident soon.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "My name is Sam Panky, and I've been blessed with a pretty wicked last name. All my life however, I've received the exact same nicknames and

variants; Spanky, Pankosaurus, Pank—" I'm going to call bullshit on that one, by the way.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: No one's ever called you that. "Pankanator, and my personal favorite, Pankydoodle. These are—[titters] these are all great, but I'm looking for something with a little more pizzazz, and one that might reflect my life as a jazz bassist living and working here in Austin, Texas."

[audience cheers]

Griffin: Whoo! [chuckles] That's the name of the city we're in.

Travis: What about Pankreatitis?

Justin: Okay.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: It's a good start.

Griffin: That's pretty good.

Justin: You gotta start somewhere, I guess.

Griffin: You've never gotten Hanky Panky? That seems like the most obvious.

Sam Panky: Every day.

Griffin: Every goddamn day, huh.

Travis: Stanky Panky.

Griffin: That's not good.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Has anyone just ever called you Sam, by your first name? Mr. Sam.

Justin: Excuse me, Sam? Samuel?

Griffin: "Excuse me, Samuel Panky? Is that you?" Never that?

Travis: What about two in the Pank, one in the stank?

Justin: No, come on!

Griffin: Jesus!

[audience laughs and applauds]

Travis: Whoa! And now I'm the asshole!

[audience laughs]

Justin: Can you—[chuckles] can you not—like can you not? Could you...

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: There's a hundred people here.

Travis: I regret nothing!

Griffin: Okay.

[audience laughs]

Justin: You've had as much of your tropical chiller as I have. There's really no excuse.

Travis: "I'm sorry, Mr. McElroy, I'm cutting you off."
"I'll tell you when I've had enough tropical chiller!"

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "I'll tell you when, it's exactly when I say two in the Pank, one in the stank."

Griffin: [guffaws]

Justin: "That is the specific moment in which I have had enough."

Griffin: "That is my alcohol safe word!"

Travis: [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Ugh!

Justin: You're still drinking it!

Griffin: I can't stress enough how bad these are. Don't drink beverages with Zs in the tile anymore, guys.

Justin: [chuckles] How can I have Zima?

Travis: [laughs]

Griffin: [laughs]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Sam, what about Dr. Bass? Now, stay with me. You play bass, right?

Sam Panky: Yes.

Justin: You're a medical doctor.

Travis: Are you good at it?

Griffin: [laughs]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: What about Good Bass—

Travis: How about—yeah, how about Bassist?

Griffin: [laughs]

[audience chuckles]

Travis: And then if you're—if you have like a really rockin' night, they're like, "No, he was Above Average Bassist." And that's good press! You can't buy that kind of press.

Justin: Yeah. Set the bar nice and middle.

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: You can jump right over that with just a few, "Bu-bum, bu-bum, bu-bum."

Travis: [chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles]

Justin: So it sounds like—that's what a bass sounds like.

Griffin: Yeah. Just play the phrase—

Justin: You can't see my mouth move, it's like "ba-bum-bum-bum."

Griffin: Can we get a nickname started for you that has nothing to do with any of your real names? Like the—like the—like Burger Master, or something.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Now, are you good at making hamburgers, Sam?

Griffin: Sorry, do you eat a lot of hamburgers, or are you good at making them?

Travis: Do you talk about burgers a lot?

[audience chuckles]

Sam Panky: I ate a hamburger just before this.

Griffin: Okay!

Travis: Oh, there it is!

Justin: Burger Master.

Griffin: What's up, burger—

Travis: Oh, Burger Sam, they used to call him!

Justin: Burger Sam! [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Nobody loved it. It was him—

Travis: The Sam-burglar!

Justin: Him and...

[audience laughs]

Travis: Take that to the bank!

[audience applauds]

Griffin: There you go.

Travis: To the Panky banky.

Justin: You monster. See, you go down to the *bottom*! And while you're down there, you find this "with two in the Pank." And while you're down there, you find an oyster, you crack it open, there's a pearl like that. That's why working with—

Griffin: That was beautiful—

Justin: It's like, yeah, I know.

Griffin: An analogy you just weaved.

Travis: Get down to the bottom of the oyster, and you find the pearl.
[chuckles]

Justin: It's so unpredictable, it's like—it's like working with Flea in his prime, it's like...

Travis: [titters]

Justin: It's hard to know when he's—Flea is a bassist.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Do you want a Yahoo to get out of—get us out of this?

Justin: Wait, did—I heard somebody—did Flea die or something that I didn't—oh? No, he's still cool? Okay.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: Flea still kicking?

Justin: Flea still cool? All right.

Travis: Yeah!

Justin: Go ahead, Griffin, we're cool on Flea.

Griffin: Thank you, Flea. This one was sent in by Nefariousity. Thank you, Nefariousity. It's by Yahoo Answers user D, who asks—

Justin: D!

Griffin: "An old woman keeps trying to get into my garden. What should I do?"

[audience laughs]

Travis: Does he mean a secret garden?

Griffin: I think so. "She is not violent, but she is very persistent. She seems healthy and of good spirits."

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: This after—additional details—

Travis: She seems of a healthy stock!

Griffin: "Additional details, this afternoon, she tried again, but she was wearing lipstick this time. Does this change anything?"

[audience laughs]

Griffin: It changes *everything*.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: So, wait—

Travis: Wait, what color lipstick? Red? It's a game-changer.

Griffin: Yeah. She's obviously trying to get all up on your arugula.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Is that a thing people grow in gardens?

Justin: Do I—do I—

Travis: Griffin, describe arugula.

Griffin: It's a purple fruit? Like eggplant.

[audience laughs]

Griffin: I've never—I know I've never eaten it. Is it a flower?

[audience chuckles]

Justin: I can't. So, if I understand the situation properly, this man is looking out his garden window, and—

Travis: Cautiously.

Justin: Cautiously. I can't—he's afraid he'll see her again. And there's an old—is she like rooting through his vegetables? Or—

Travis: No, *trying* to get in his garden. She can't figure out like the gate.

Griffin: Yeah.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: But don't worry, she is very persistent.

Travis: [chuckles]

Griffin: She'll crack that case eventually!

Justin: Yeah, she'll dig underneath it.

Travis: Not violent, though. She's not one of those violent garden crashers—

Griffin: And I get a—

Travis: Like you read about.

Griffin: "I gotta say, this afternoon, she tried again, and she was looking *good*."

Justin: [chuckles]

Griffin: "Lip-wise, I mean."

Justin: Like really hot, really hot—

Travis: A real foxy grandma!

Justin: Everyone knows that old people keep away crows. That's just a fact of life. If you don't have an old people there, a weasel will come and eat your rutabagas.

Griffin: [laughs]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: That's—have you ever seen Rikki-Tikki-Tavi? It's about that. Rikki-Tivvi-Tavi, and my Nonnee.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Nonnee is our grandma's name. Backstory.

Travis: Ah, the age-old battle of the Mongoose and the Nonnee. [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: A few Yahoo—there are fifty-three answers to this question.

Justin: Fuck you, internet!

Travis: [yells out] Whoa!

Justin: Fuck you, internet!

Travis: Because the first one couldn't handle it! [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: I'm going to summarize the thesis of about twenty of them, who say—

Justin: Summarize the thesis?

Griffin: They say, "Let her look."

Justin: [chortles]

[audience laughs]

Griffin: "Just fuckin' let that old fuckin' lady into your garden! What are you doing?!"

Justin: What are you—what's so important—

Griffin: "Hey! You get out of here!"

Travis: Okay, wait, that is a good question. What's your end-game worry?

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin: Right.

Griffin: She's a carrot thief, maybe, I don't know?

Travis: She's just gonna start Godzillaing it all over your garden. "Ah! Ah! Ah! Grandma smash!"

Justin: "I hide all my butterscotch candies in there, and she's gonna take 'em all!"

Travis: [chuckles]

[audience laughs]

Justin: "She'll find my stash!"

Griffin: I mean, lock your garden, I guess? Like, what actionable advice can we possibly give this human being?

Justin: It sounds like the problem is resolving itself. She can't get in!

[audience laughs]

Justin: You're cool! Unless you're worried about—

Travis: No, she's like the velociraptor. She's checking every point of the fence.

Justin: "Clever old girl!"

Travis: Clever—[chuckles]

Griffin: She's trying to dig under it.

[a few audience members laugh hysterically]

Griffin: This is great.

Justin: Yeah. It is really good.

Travis: Where's the goat?

Griffin: Just stick it out, she'll—

Justin: Wait, wait, is it a goat?

Travis: [laughs]

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: Because I get confused—

Travis: "This goat in a dress keeps trying to get in my yard!"

Justin: Because if the goat is wearing lipstick, it has changed. The game has—the game—

Griffin: That's—[laughs]

Justin: The rules that you had before are evaporated!

Travis: Get the horse and the dog lipstick!

Justin: Yes!

[audience cheers in agreement]

Justin: That's like—

Griffin: Let's get these barnyard animals sexy, everybody.

Travis: [chuckles]

[audience laughs]

Justin: It's like a key to any garden—

Travis: They gotta get their sexy right.

Justin: Yeah! Ah, shit...

Travis: Ah...

Justin: Augh...

Travis: Eh...

Justin: *Uah*. Sam Panky... maybe the lipstick-wearing old lady? That's a good nickname.

[audience laughs]

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: Lipstick-wearing old—lipstick G-ma.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: No?

Griffin: I don't like it, no.

Justin: You don't like it? "Hey, one of my women—" Hold on, is Leviticus here? Boom, Leviticus.

Travis: Front row.

Justin: Front row. This is gonna get awkward, but—

Travis: Sweet sweater vest.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Stay with us, okay?

Travis: It's nice. Is that argyle?

Leviticus: Yeah.

Travis: It's lovely.

Justin: Oh, god... "One of my—"

[audience chuckles]

Travis: We'll talk more after the show. Don't listen to these—

Justin: They will too, it's not a gag.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] "One of my friend—"

"Did you go to the My Brother, My Brother and Me show?"

"Yeah, it was good. For like three minutes, they talked about old ladies and it was funny. And then for forty-five minutes, they talk about argyle sweaters."

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "It got weird. I asked for my ten dollars back. They refused."

[audience chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] "One of one of my friends is trying to introduce me to a co-worker of her—" I feel like I should direct this at—he's close enough that I can just stare at while I—I should just have him read it.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "One of my friends is trying to introduce me to a co-worker of hers that she thinks I'm—" Please don't look at him.

Travis: I wasn't.

[audience laughs]

Travis: I was actually just looking at you really closely.

Justin: If I'm gonna divorce myself from him enough to goof on him, I need to not—

Griffin: Do you want some acai?

Justin: Yeah. If you could just super fruit me.

Travis: Do you want one of these?

Justin: I'm not... yeah, cool.

Travis: You gotta come up here. I can't throw.

Justin: Hey, everybody, Leviticus, everybody.

Griffin: Hey!

[audience cheers]

Griffin: He's getting his goji on!

Justin: He's becoming too real to me! I can't goof on him if you keep reminding me he's there!

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "One of my friends is—" I need to switch seats. "One of my friends is trying to introduce me to a co-worker of hers that she thinks I might be romantically interested in. I don't know much about her, other than she seems nice, and then I think we might share similar interests. When asked if I had any deal breakers, I said smoking. And it turns out, she does smoke. Should I completely rule her out based on this one condition, or should I quit being stubborn and just accept someone as they are? I've been single for a long time, and I don't want to keep missing out." That's a really good instinct, everybody. Minutes ticking away.

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: Time to pair off.

Travis: Your biological clock is ticking!

Justin: My—yeah.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Noah's Ark style, two—one by one.

Travis: You gotta pair off to die!

Justin: Pair off and die, everybody. Hey, are you sure she really smokes, and she didn't just hear that's a deal breaker? Maybe she's trying to get—she's trying to—

Griffin: [chuckles] Do you say— "I guess I smoke now!"

Justin: "I guess I smoke now!"

[audience laughs]

Griffin: "Mm! Yum! I love—"

Travis: [yells out] "Smooth!" [spoofs coughing sounds]

Griffin: "This is—this is the fresh-baked tobacco leaf! I love how crisp it is in my mouth."

Travis: "Pick this up for my buddy, Joe!"

Griffin: "Mm, yummy! Thank you, Joe Camel."

Justin: "Ah, flavor country, resident me."

[audience chuckles]

Travis: You know, there is a middle ground between being stubborn and accepting her for who she is, and that's changing her to the person you want her to be.

[audience laughs]

Justin: You could do—you could do, like my wife did, start dating a non-smoker, and then convince them that they're not, in fact, a smoker.

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: Three years clean, everybody.

Griffin: Flip it. You're saying... I'm gonna go back to what Travis was saying, because it was funnier.

Travis: [laughs] Funnier and less real.

Griffin: You want to flip it Eliza Doolittle style, My Fair Lady style.

Justin: Did you say Eliza Dushku style?

Griffin: I want—you want to flip it Eliza Dushku. Is she here?

[audience chuckles]

Travis: Eliza?

Justin: Eliza—

Travis: She was at the seven.

Justin: She was at the seven.

Griffin: She was at the seven, you guys missed her.

Travis: You guys totally missed it. Ask everyone who was at the seven, they'll attest.

Griffin: Striking young—

Justin: Who was at the seven o'clock show?

[a few audience members cheer]

Justin: See? They voted. She was here.

Griffin: None of them were Eliza Dushku.

Justin: No. She had to go.

Griffin: I think that you can't... I don't think you should try change her. I think you gotta change yourself.

Travis: No, this is all it takes, this is all it takes. [clears throat] "Eh-ehehe."

Griffin: No, don't be—

Travis: A couple of those! You throw like eight of those, and she gets self-conscious.

Justin: "Did you enjoy the date with Leviticus?"
"Yeah, he's kind of coughy."

Griffin: "He coughs a lot."

Travis: "He has rheumatism."

Justin: "Yeah, I think he's got room..."

[audience chuckles]

Travis: "He's got TB."

Griffin: "A touch of the consumption."

Travis: "He's a lunger!"

Justin: "He was a lunger! I didn't enjoy the time I spent with him. We tried to watch a movie and he kept coughing." I'm sorry, he's right here, and I feel so bad.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: This is what's important to note; the fact that she smokes now is not a concrete thing forever.

Justin: Right, you gotta change.

Travis: It's not like she has blue eyes.

Justin: Right.

Travis: This is like, yes, she smokes. That doesn't mean she's always going to be a smoker.

Justin: She's going to want to change your taste in podcasts.

Griffin: [chuckles]

[audience laughs]

Justin: It's going to be—it's going to be a give and take.

Travis: She's going to insist you stop calling yourself Leviticus.

Justin: Yeah, right, there's going to be a lot—there's going to be a lot of... a lot of changing on both sides. And that's what relationships are, people. Finding out—

Travis: Yeah, just caving into each other. [titters]

Justin: Right, finding out what you need to change about ourselves.

Griffin: It's all—it's all about... negotiation. Can you get her to cigars? Can you get—can you flip it and get her to smoke cigars? And then when you kiss her, it takes like your grandpa now?

Justin: Can you start dipping, and then tell her, "I'll give up dip if you give up smoking."

Griffin: That's great.

Travis: "In between vomiting."

Justin: [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Do you—

Travis: "Hold on, I need a moment."

Griffin: Can you—can you take up snoosing?

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Can you snoose—

Travis: Or Seussing!

Griffin: Can you—

Travis: Where you just say everything in rhyme!

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Can you talk about The Secret a lot?

[a few audience members chuckle]

Griffin: [chuckles] I don't understand?

Justin: What? The Secret? The book, The Secret.

Griffin: Is The Secret that you do snews?

Justin: No, there's no—

Griffin: Am I saying that right? Is it an umlaut over the U?

Justin: If you—if you—

Travis: *Snews!*

Justin: Tell him you're gonna reinforce—

Travis: It's a liquid U. *Snews!*

Justin: Snoos!

Griffin: I don't like how it sounds when you say it.

Justin: Griffin...

[audience laughs]

Justin: Griffin, save me.

Griffin: Here's a Yahoo, that has nothing to do with snews. It's by Yahoo Answers—or sent it—sent it by Nefariousity. Thank you, Nefariousity. It's by Yahoo Answers user Question Mark, who asks, "What do angels eat for my book?"

[audience chuckles]

Travis: How to Cook for Angels.

Griffin: [chuckles] I am—

Justin: [laughs]

[audience laughs]

Justin: [chortles] I'd read it.

Travis: [laughs]

Justin: I would! I'd read it.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: That Shiner Bock is so good after drinking that orange jizz for thirty minutes.

Travis: [laughs]

Justin: That's because—

Travis: With two Ss!

Griffin: [chuckles] Jiss. *Jiss*.

Justin: 'Cause you're in Austin!

Griffin: Whoow!

[a few audience members whoot]

Justin: Guys, you gotta keep give—stop giving into him like that.

Griffin: "I am writing a book, and the girl in my book is pregnant with an angel, and I want her to have something to crave. Help!"

[audience chuckles]

Travis: Unfortunately, it's a biography.

Griffin: [guffaws]

[audience laughs]

Justin: You're not writing a book, let's be honest.

Travis: [laughs] You're justifying to your dad.

Justin: Yeah. [laughs]

Travis: "Daddy's angel!"

Griffin: "Trust me, it's an angel baby."

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "I'm trying to win a bet with my stupid friends."

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: What do angels eat...

Griffin: Two different people in the Yahoo Answers platform wrote angel food cake. Good one, guys.

Travis: [chuckles] Quality, good goof!

Griffin: Nobody said angel hair pasta? Couldn't get another angel-based foodstuff?

Travis: What about Devil's Food Cake? Aah—

Griffin: *Waah!*

Travis: *Aah!*

Justin: [blows a raspberry]

Griffin: Can you believe it?

Justin: Travis, if you make the jokes that are as bad as the jokes that are in there, then people don't have to listen.

Travis: No, I said it an internal voice like I'm mocking them, but it's all I could come up with.

Justin: If we just said bad jokes snidely for thirty minutes, would you guys be cool? [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Travis: I think... like anything?

Griffin: I guess—

Justin: Anything they want to, obviously, their teeth are made of metal.

Griffin: [laughs]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Roma Downey's teeth are made of metal, fuck you if you don't believe me, it's true.

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: I had a—I had a brief fling with her. Her and... what's the other lady on there called?

Travis: Angel Baby.

Griffin: Mama Angel.

Justin: Mama Angel.

Griffin: I don't know. I didn't watch it. Angels, I'm pretty sure, only eat cloud-based foods.

Justin: So like cloud burgers.

Griffin: Like cloud burgers, mostly.

Justin: Right.

Travis: Do they eat like tacos?

Justin: Cloud tacos.

Griffin: They can eat cloud tacos, they're not... they're not exclusively towards cloud burgers.

Travis: Do you think that—

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: There's a lot of cloud-based foods in this situation I'm whipping up live on stage.

Justin: [chuckles] Griffin's out there on a bold new frontier, and he is writing the rules as you watch.

Griffin: No, keep challenging me on this—on this goof.

Travis: What about cupcakes.

Griffin: God damn it.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Yeah, they eat those too, but cloud—they're made of clouds, in this situation I'm creating.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: What about—

Griffin: Have you guys ever seen improv before?

Justin: [laughs]

[audience laughs]

Griffin: This is how it works.

Justin: Normally, we record for an hour and fifteen minutes, and you get a fifty-five minute show, and these are the gems you're missing out on. If you can believe it.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Jesus Christ.

Justin: You would be robbed of cloud tacos.

Griffin: This is My Brother, My Brother and Me: Face 2 Face 3: Tokyo Drift, the cutting room floor.

[group laugh]

Justin: You at home are not hearing this, so I can say fuck anybody who doesn't live in Austin or the surrounding area!

[audience whoots]

Travis: Or New Orleans.

Justin: If...

[a couple of audience members whoot]

Griffin: Really?

Justin: There he is.

Griffin: Damn... good stuff.

Justin: [sighs] Hah...

Griffin: Angels don't—

Travis: You know what? I'm done.

Griffin: Do angels have to eat?

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Do angels have to—do angel—let me...

Justin: [titters] Bring it down.

Griffin: Do angels have to eat?

Justin: Things are getting too funny, slow it down.

Travis: [chuckles]

Griffin: [laughs]

Travis: Let's have a really intense theological discussion.

Griffin: If I get—

Justin: Yeah. [laughs]

Travis: What do you guys think about angels?

Griffin: If I get to heaven—

Travis: Taking all comers.

Griffin: When I get—

Travis: You guys?

Griffin: When I get to heaven, and I become an angel, because I think I did a pretty good job down here—

Justin: Right.

Griffin: Pretty sure that's how it works.

Travis: Uh-huh.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: I don't want to have to have the onus of eating on me.

Justin: Right.

Griffin: You know?

Justin: Clouds—angels only eat because they're hungry, because then—

Travis: Actually, angels only eat to take food away from poor people.

[group laugh]

Griffin: "This is mine! This isn't made of clouds, I hate it."

[audience chuckles]

Justin: I assume you mean non-Christian poor people.

Travis: Yes. Right, yes, obviously.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: That's how they punish them.

Griffin: No such thing.

Travis: But it's okay, because they don't listen to our show.

Justin: *Ah!* What?

Griffin: Because they don't have iPods. What are you talking about?

Justin: [laughs] What are you even talking about? The horse getting a present made more sense than what you're saying right now.

Travis: Our show is the one percent.

Justin: Yeah, that's all we're saying.

Griffin: Topical.

Justin: Jesus Christ...

Griffin: Shit.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Hey! [titters] Hey, I'm talking to this guy who's on my paper. "Hey, I'm a guy who just went on a first date with a girl today. She seemed really into me, so we'll go out again later this week. And that brings—"

Griffin: Oh?

Justin: Whoa. [titters]

Griffin: Sounds pretty sure of himself.

Justin: A little forward. "And that brings me to my question, what is the Crist-mas gift—did I add an extra T?

Travis: The Crist-mas?

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Crist—I—listen, I put the—I put the Crist in Cristmas.

Travis: What is the Christ-mas gift?

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "What is the Christ-mas gift giving etiquette for someone you just started dating? How much should I spend? And any gift ideas?"

Travis: You could give 'em a coupon that says they don't have to get you anything?

Justin: Yeah, that's what everybody really wants, isn't it? They don't want to have to get you anything. [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Travis: Oh! A coupon that says, "Hey, here's a coupon for let's pick this up in three weeks."

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: Are you talking about a temporary breakup slip?

Travis: Yeah, just like, "We're gonna take a break, past Christmas, but we're gonna kiss each other on New Year's, and then it'll be totally cool."

Justin: So they're gonna be lonely for the holidays?

Travis: No, because they have someone else, but just on layaway.

[audience laughs]

Justin: Such an asshole. Hey, don't start dating people now.

Griffin: Don't do that.

Travis: No!

Justin: What is wrong with you?!

Travis: If you—okay, like November 30th should be a cut-off.

Griffin: Right. Earlier than that.

Travis: No, because—

Griffin: Earlier than that! I'm saying Halloween.

Justin: You don't want to do—

Travis: You know what?! Let's just say June.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: If you haven't found 'em by June, you get their number and say, "I'll call you in February." No, no, March.

Justin: No, March, not February, after February.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: February 15th—

Griffin: Shit!

Travis: I'll call you February 15th.

Justin: Remember, remember the Ides of February, because then you can hook up.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: "But please don't forget my name, girl I talked to once."

Justin: [chuckles] "Hey, you're a down girl. I'm enjoying this. I will catch you in March."

Griffin: [chuckles]

Travis: But then you have to text them every couple of days and be like, "Does he know? Only a couple more weeks 'til we can talk again."

Griffin: "Got my name on you!"

Travis: [chuckles]

Griffin: I like that idea, because I like the mental image of somebody being like, "Oh, fuck, it's June 25th. I better get on it! I'm gonna be lonely for the rest of the year!"

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: "Who am I gonna spend Independence Day with? Not that I give a fuck, because I hate all holidays!"

[audience laughs]

Justin: Monster.

Travis: And then we invent a new holiday on June 30th called Last Call Day!

Griffin: [laughs]

[audience laughs]

Griffin: That would be—holy shit, that would turn the whole game on its ear! The whole game of love.

Justin: You're welcome, Hallmark!

Griffin: No, it's not Hallmark, it's dudes who are like, "Oh, gotta get down. It's the 30th. Everyone's gonna be window shopping. Better—"

Travis: "It's Last Call Day, let's stand on a mound with some pretty shells and do your mating call."

Griffin: Don't even do that! Just walk out on the sidewalk and people are gonna run to you like they're picking partners for cotillion. Like, "Come here!"

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: "I'm ready! I'm ready for you."

Travis: "I'm the best you'll ever do! 'Til February 15th."

Justin: "'Til February 15th or so, and I'll catch you then." Just, listen, this is easy stuff. Just get him something related to the holiday.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: At Christmas, get 'em like a—

Griffin: Well, find out—

Travis: How about the promise that they don't have to meet your parents?

Justin: Well, that's a—that's a good start. Christmas, you get 'em a... like a... stocking.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: That's great.

Travis: Whoa, whoa, whoa, whoa, whoa.

Justin: No, Christmas, you get 'em a stocking.

Travis: Like one sock.

Justin: Yeah, like a sock. For Hanukkah, you get 'em a dre... like a dre...

Griffin: A dreidel.

Travis: Like a what?

Justin: Dreidel?

Griffin: A dreidel, that's good, Justin.

Travis: Wait, hold on, what's a dreidel, Justin?

Justin: A dreidel? It's... made out of clay.

[audience laughs]

Griffin: It is a—a tradle, actually, is a purple eggplant-like fruit.

[audience laughs]

Griffin: Not many people know that.

Justin: That hates holidays.

Travis: [laughs]

Griffin: Justin, can you give me a Kwanzaa and also a Ramadan icon?

Justin: Yeah... Kwanzaa, you will want to get them a Kwanzaa cube.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: Whoa, whoa, whoa, whoa, whoa.

Griffin: 'I just can't solve this Kwanzaa cube!'

[audience laughs]

Griffin: "I got all the red ones matched up."

Justin: It is a puzzle-based cube, they give children for Kwanzaa.

Travis: Uh-huh. That was left there by the Transformers.

Griffin: [laughs]

[audience laughs]

Travis: [chuckles] "The only way—the only way to stop the Decepticons!"

Justin: [spoofing Optimus Prime] "Sam Witwicky, you must take this Kwanzaa cube to the head of Mount Energon! Take it to the peak, Sam Witwicky! Hold the Kwanzaa cube above your head."

Griffin: [laughs]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "Ignore that Christmas is way better in many ways. Stick by your conviction, Sam Witwicky!"

Travis: "Keep an open mind, Sam Witwicky!"

Griffin: [laughs] "It's just as good."

Travis: "This is getting weird for everyone, Sam Witwicky." [chuckles]

Justin: [laughs]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "Have some awkward conversations with your school friends, Sam Witwicky!"

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: "These are our convictions! Transformers only celebrate Kwanzaa, Sam Witwicky."

Travis: "And Robadan!"

Griffin: [laughs]

Justin: "And Ramadan!"

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Hey, how about a Yahoo?

Justin: Yeah, please.

Travis: Yeah, please!

Justin: Because I feel like we're like—

Travis: Hey, sorry, everyone!

Griffin: The next step in this conversation—

Justin: Careening towards unplayable for public.

Griffin: Yeah. [chuckles]

Travis: We've just offended both all humans and Autobots.

[audience laughs]

Griffin: We're quickly moving towards the fact that Ramadan sounds like a Transformer name—

Travis: [chortles]

Griffin: And then we're going to talk about what kind of Transformer Ramadan is.

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: [spoofs Transformer sounds] Juck-juck-jook-jook!

Travis: It's a smart phone that transforms then it's Ramadongle.

[audience laughs]

Griffin: That was—

Justin: And obviously the correct answer was—

Griffin: That was not—that was incorrect, I'm sorry.

Justin: Ramabong, anybody?

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Is that good? Pretty good?

Griffin: This Yahoo answer was sent—

Justin: I don't know what religion I'm offending. I hope it's not one of the ones—

Griffin: Autobong! That was—

Travis: [chuckles] The happy ones, right?

[audience chuckles]

Justin: [chuckles] The Autobots, versus the Decepticons, versus the Ramadans.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: It's a three-way war, no one knows who's gonna come out on top.

Griffin: I can't believe you finished your Tropic Chillerz?

Justin: As it turns out, it's Sam Witwicky! Okay, go ahead.

Griffin: This one was sent in by Jacob Locker. Thank you, Jacob Locker.

Justin: Thank you, Jacob.

A Man in the Audience: Whoow.

Griffin: [titters] Somebody whooped for him. Good work, Jacob Locker. It's by Yahoo Answers user... ah, it got cut off. "NYC trim I," and then an ellipsis.

Justin: I don't wanna know the rest. [chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles] I don't either.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: That guy asks, "Why are these cows yelling?"

[audience laughs]

Travis: "I keep stabbing them and they won't shut up!"

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: I live—

Justin: Be quiet, cow.

Griffin: [chuckles] "I live out in a field, close to some farms."

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: It's—

Travis: Whoa, whoa, whoa, whoa, whoa.

Justin: How do you have internet?

Travis: Not near a field!

Griffin: Lives up on it! "Close to some farms. It's a full moon outside, and these cows are making these loud screaming sounds."

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: "Do they do this on full moons? Or is it just them being killed by a predator?"

[audience exclaims and chuckles]

Travis: Or The Predator!

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: These tropical chillers are *strong*.

[audience laughs]

Travis: "Have you seen that new movie, Cow versus Predator?"

Justin: That's actually... that's actually how To Catch a Predator got its start.

Griffin: [chuckles] Did anybody—

Justin: You listen for the screams of cows, and then you're gonna—

Travis: You know, I would like to think that most people, when they heard this question, are thinking like the cows a simply going "*moo*." But I said they're going—the cows are going, [yells out] "Stop!"

Griffin: [yells out] "Oh!"

Travis: "Please help!"

Justin: "Help me, I'm a cow!"

Travis: "I'm being stabbed!"

Justin: "Someone forgot to give me a gift for Secret Santa!"

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "My feelings were wicked hurt!"

Griffin: Did anybody here have the kind of rural upbringing that would be required to shed some insight on this situation? Do cows actually scream? Is that—yes.

Travis: At the full moon?

Griffin: Do people—

A Lady in the Audience: Yeah. Well, they don't scream at the full moon, but they—

Justin: I should fuckin' hope not, by the way.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: If you had told me that, I would have stood up and walked right out that door and never looked back!

Travis: And now I have a new crusade.

Justin: [titters] Yeah!

Travis: It's to destroy cows.

[audience laughs]

Justin: So wait, so they do scream?

Griffin: Do they just moo super loud?

A Lady in the Audience: It sounds like, "*Meeh!*"

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Jesus, that sounds awful—

Travis: Whoa, whoa, whoa! One more time! Shh! Everybody, quiet. Shh, shh.

Griffin: Can you come up to the microphone and recreate that sound for the—

Justin: Hold on, hold on, hold on.

Travis: Get up here right now.

Griffin: This is for our radio audience at home.

[audience cheers]

Griffin: Everybody, this is a howl at the moon—

Travis: Say your name first.

Justin: Introduce yourself to America.

Kate: Kate.

Griffin: Kate!

Travis: And this is the sound—

Justin: This is the sound—

Travis: Of a screaming cow.

Griffin: Of a full moon—

Justin: This is the sound—

Travis: We're gonna loop this and sound it as one of those like—

Griffin: This is—

Travis: Tranquil tapes.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: This is—

Travis: A sound—

Griffin: A full moon—

Travis: Of the cow.

Griffin: Hate cow.

Justin: This is the sound a cow makes.

[pause]

Kate: *Meeh!* [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: [chuckles] That was awful!

Travis: The worst speak and spin ever!

[audience cheers]

Justin: Now, y'all, I always wonder things about like, how do we get milk? How did that start? And I think if you heard a cow making that sound, you're gonna try anything.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "You know what I wanna do? I'm gonna squeeze these pink things and drink what comes out. Because fuck, I don't—I have to try something!"

Travis: I've always been looking for a way to justify hamburgers.

Justin: Yeah, right. [chuckles]

Travis: It's our only defense!

Justin: You make that sound one more fuckin' time, I'm getting the A1.

Griffin: Well, they're not screaming-

[audience laughs]

Griffin: Are they screaming racist slurs, these cows? Is that why you wanna eat them to punish them?

Justin: What?

Travis: Punk cows.

Justin: What?

Griffin: I was imagining the cows screaming racist slurs. It didn't make any sense, I just like the mental image of it.

Justin: Next time, just maybe give me a—is there a hand signal we can work out to let me know you're going down a road like that?

Griffin: Sure.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: Wait, can we jump back real quick? Because I said punk cows, and I want to make joke about them standing around wearing leather.

Griffin: All right. Rewind it.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Okay. [spoofs rewinding sounds] Re-re-rle-bde.

Travis: Do you know how you know they're punk cows?

Griffin: How, Travis?

Justin: That sounded like a Transformer.

Griffin: Tell us how now.

Justin: How do—how do they—how do you know?

Travis: They stand around wearing leather.

Griffin: That's just their skin.

[audience cheers]

Griffin: Don't...

Justin: Pretty good. Pretty good.

Travis: Thank you, everyone!

Justin: Pretty good.

Griffin: But are the cows—the question is, why are these cows yelling?

Travis: It's a trick.

Griffin: [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: What are cow—

Travis: [yells out] "Come out here, Steve!"

Justin: "Steve, we need you!"

Travis: "We have presents! We can't—"

Griffin: "Shh, shh."

Justin: "Shh-shh."

Travis: "Be cool, guys. Be cool, he's coming."

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "Steve, we can't work the VCR! Come out here, Steve!"

[audience chuckles]

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: "It's just flashing twelve again!"

Travis: [chuckles] "Tell 'em that funny story you were telling me earlier, Steve! Shh-shh."

Justin: "Shh. I don't tell—keep telling you to come out."

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "Steve?"

Griffin: Are you—

Travis: "When he gets out here, we eat him. Right, guys?"

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Now, that's my problem. I don't think cows do that usually.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: Around the full moon!

Justin: Cows that scream do.

Travis: Around the full *Moo*-oon! There it is! Moving along!

[a few audience members whoot and applaud]

Griffin: Are you fuckin' kidding me?

Justin: Don't you fuckin' dare.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Fuck...

Travis: We know who the crowd favorite is.

[a few audience members whoot]

Justin: Yeah, two people managed to applaud. Enjoy your night alone!

[audience chuckles]

Justin: I hate your guts. You're out of the family. I'm just kidding, I love you.

[audience boos]

Griffin: No, no, no, no, no, no, no! Shh! Wait, wait, wait, wait, wait, wait, wait—

Justin: They're booing you now!

Griffin: Guys, wait, wait, wait.

[audience continues booing]

Justin: Listen, they're still booing!

Griffin: Let's take a second—

Travis: Maybe they were mooing?

Justin: [chortles]

[audience chuckles]

Travis: I just turned Justin into a little girl, everyone!

Justin: You brilliant son of a bitch.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: I...

Griffin: You got a Mad Libs for us you can bust out? Let's just keep this train—this shame train rolling.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Don't actually do it.

Travis: I can freestyle one. Who's got words?!

Justin: No, stop it.

Griffin: You guys, how about another Yahoo?

Justin: No, wait—okay.

Griffin: No, no, if you've got shit, let's do your shit.

Justin: No, please go right ahead.

Griffin: Okay, fine. This one's sent by Golly-a-Olly. Thank you, Golly. It's by Yahoo Answers user Totally Awesome, who says—

Travis: [laughs] Nope!

[audience chuckles]

Justin: I'm gonna put—I don't know what question this is. I'm gonna predict that is an inaccurate username, but go right ahead.

Travis: Unless the question is, "How do I stop being so totally awesome?"

Justin: "I'm embarrassing my friends. Help me, Yahoo."

Griffin: "Is it a sin to have sex with a robot for the purposes of procreation?"

Justin: Okay, I was right.

[audience laughs]

Travis: It's not a sin! It's just really misguided.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: "You know how some couples cannot have children?"

Travis: [laughs]

Griffin: "You know, because of an immune reaction by the mother? However, the husband could fertilize the wife's egg, and a child could be born if it is placed in a surrogate mother, right? Well, what if the surrogate mother is an Android robot, a robot that is holding the wife's egg? Could the husband have sex with the robot in order for the couple to have a child?"

Travis: "But what my book presupposes is..."

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: What if it... listen.

Justin: Listen.

Griffin: Listen.

Travis: This is the guy who watched the movie Surrogates and got really confused. [chuckles]

Justin: [laughs]

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Why do you have to put it—why can't you just like fuckin' put it in a petri dish? Why does it have to be inside of an android—

Travis: Or like another human!

Griffin: Why do you have to have sex with an android to do this thing?!

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Griffin, you're not answering the question, is it a sin.

Griffin: I'm so sorry, is it a sin.

Justin: Is it a sin. Obviously, God didn't know about robots. [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: That's true!

Justin: No one knew about—John Park... John Mark, Matthew, Luke, Ringo, no one... none of 'em.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: None of them knew about robots, so it can't be a sin. That's why—

Griffin: There are—there's a lot of shit that God don't know about, is what you're saying.

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: Robots, the internet?

Justin: Yeah, God doesn't know—

Griffin: You can jerk it to E-porn, and the Bible can't say anything about it, because the Bible don't know about the internet!

Justin: Right. That's why we at My Brother, My Brother and Me are writing Bible 2.

Travis: [titters]

[audience laughs]

Griffin: We're writing—we're writing the Cible. The cyber Bible.

Justin: Cyber Bible.

Griffin: It's the Cyber Bible for the digital age.

Travis: "Thou shall not robofreak."

Justin: [chuckles]

[audience laughs]

Griffin: Don't robofreak. Chu. What is robofreaking? Just so I know for sure.

Justin: So I'm clear.

Travis: How about anything where you talk about having a surrogate baby inside of a robot body?

Justin: That's a sin.

Griffin: I guess.

Travis: I like to have that discussion, and that the word sin enters into it.

Justin: [chuckles]

Travis: There's so many other things that is before it is a sin.

Griffin: Yeah. [chuckles]

Travis: Is it weird? Is it wrong?

Griffin: Is it imaginary?

Justin: Right! [chuckles]

[audience laughs]

Travis: Is it not real in any way?

Griffin: Don't... don't, fuck this robot.

[audience laughs]

Griffin: This robot is—

Justin: I know how it looks, wearing lipstick, sneaking around your garden.

Griffin: Looks great.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: It's got—it's got mystery, it's got intrigue. Can it even feel things?

Travis: Wait, is it a sin? Is it a girl robot?

Griffin: You're saying—

Justin: Wait! Hold on!

Griffin: Wait a second! Because you're saying, if he fucks a—if this is a lady that fucks a boy robot, then it's bad?

Travis: [laughs]

Griffin: Is that what you're saying?

Travis: No...

Griffin: Okay.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: You just want—you just don't want a bunch of robosexuals running around.

[audience laughs]

Justin: Undermining family values. Hey, by the way, first Republican presidential hopeful to adopt that platform, you've got my vote.

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: I will—I will switch parties if you come out against robofreaking.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: It is—

Justin: "Did you get one of those robo calls?"
"Yeah, I did. It was weird. It was about robofreaking."

Travis: "It was a robo sex call!"

Justin: "It was a robo sex call! It was really dirty and there's lots of bleeps and boops."

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Put it in my—

Griffin: Everyone knows that if it feels good, it's not a sin.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Tell that to fuckin' poor Cyber Dave, the robot who keeps getting fucked by a human! Like he doesn't care how it feels, he's a robot. He doesn't even get a vote! Which, by the way, that is a sin.

Griffin: It's criminal.

Justin: It is a sin.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: They've got emotions, they can decide—their logic circuits are better than ours.

Travis: Are you saying it's a sin that robots don't get to vote?

Justin: It is, yeah, exactly.

Griffin: I don't think robots are advanced enough yet to vote. Like, I have a... like, there are robots—

Travis: Whoa! It's that kind of mentality, Griffin.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: There's a kind of—no, no, no, no, no, listen—

Travis: Yeah, right, you're gonna start spewing some anti-robo bullshit!

Griffin: This—my Roomba doesn't grasp the subtle intricacies of our government system. I don't want to think that exclusively—

Travis: The robos are coming here and taking our jobs!

Justin: Yeah.

Griffin: This thing—

[audience chuckles]

Travis: Vacuuming our floors!

Justin: Griffin, if—

Travis: Mending our cars!

Justin: If that doesn't preclude many of the flyover states from voting, I don't see why it should preclude robots from voting. [chuckles]

Griffin: Well, most of the people who live in flyover states don't exclusively eat the Cheetos that I drop on the floor.

[audience laughs]

Griffin: Or maybe they do!

Justin: Are you talking about—

[audience chuckles]

Justin: I don't think *Roombas* will ever vote. Is that's what you're saying to me?

Griffin: That's what you're saying!

[audience chuckles]

Justin: [laughs] You just turned it back on me, *How To Kill a Mockingbird* style.

Travis: There wasn't a large turnout—

Justin: It's prob—it's not called—

Travis: For the 2012 election—

Justin: Wait a minute, hold on, I need to—

Travis: But there was a huge turnout for the anti dirty floors Levy.

Justin: I just called that book *How To Kill a Mockingbird*. I'm pretty sure it's not an instruction manual.

Griffin: Use rocks and guns and stuff! Catch 'em in a net and then hit 'em with something hard and heavy!

[audience chuckles]

Travis: How to murder a mockingbird!

Griffin: Just get 'em! They're really tiny and fragile! You can step on 'em, there's lots of ways!

Justin: It's easy, you goof—

Travis: What do angels eat? Mockingbirds!

Justin: [laughs]

Griffin: Feed 'em to an angel! Cook 'em! Throw fire at 'em! This is gonna be great.

Justin: What's his nickname? Mockingbird killer.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: You got a Yahoo? Or a regular question that's not by a crazy person?

Justin: Oh, yeah, where's Hesitant in Houston?

[pause]

Justin: What?

Griffin: Hi!

Justin: Hey!

Travis: Oh, a shadowy figure.

Justin: [titters] Rises from the night. Hesitant in Houston says, "I have a potential job opportunity in Salt Lake City, which is where my nuclear family lives." Whoa. [titters]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "However, all of my awesome friends and the whole rest of my life is in Houston. Should I leave it all behind to join the fam and advance the career, or should I stay with the friends I love and hope for the best?" It's from Hesitant in Houston. Listen, if you got a—[titters] I don't care how awesome your friends are, if you have a nuclear family? They're not gonna compete with that.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Yeah, do they have powers?

Travis: Or do you want to move there and focus on your half-life?

[audience exclaims and does a slow clap]

Justin: We—[titters]

[audience laughs]

Griffin: That's bad.

Justin: I've seen the Incredibles.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Yeah, do they have like—do they have like alien tendrils going on their body, because of the waste?

Travis: I want to know what your situation like here is, that you have to define it as "hope for the best."

Justin: You know, I believe you should be with your family. Record a podcast with them, just hang out with them, whatever.

Travis: Yeah.

Justin: But you—

Griffin: I... I don't know anybody in Salt Lake City, but I'm pretty sure that's where they filmed Sister Wives. Is that true?

[audience chuckles]

Justin: It's around there.

Griffin: Can you get to know the Sister Wives, people? Because if you get in that club, there's like forty-five people in it for you to just know and have in your—

Justin: Yeah, forty-five people, eh, forty-one of which are kids.

Travis: [chuckles]

Justin: So, if you want to be the guy who has a lot of little kid friends, which has worked out so well for many entertainers in the past, by all means, befriend the Sister Wives—

Griffin: Or you can't be wife five.

Travis: [chuckles]

Griffin: You can be the fifth wife in that unit, and then get all the perks of being in the Sister Wife unit.

Travis: No, because he's a dude, and then it gets weird.

Justin: Oh, yeah—

Griffin: He can be brother husband!

Travis: [laughs]

[audience laughs]

Justin: "This is my brother husband, Hesitant in Houston. I love him very much."

Griffin: I know nothing about Salt Lake City, except that that might be where Sister Wives is filmed. And that might not even be true.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Don't they have a sports team?

Justin: Yeah, the... jazz—

Griffin: The Jazzers.

Justin: Jazz...

Travis: The Jazzercisers.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Pretty sure it's not The Jazzers, Griffin.

Griffin: I say family beats friends any day the week. Isn't that right, guys?

Travis: In a fight.

Griffin: In a fight, you could get together.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Yeah... unless your family sucks.

Travis: Yeah.

Griffin: Are you—are you moving that here—there from Austin?

Hesitant in Houston: Dude, is says it's in Huston.

Travis: Whoa! [yells out] Snap!

[audience exclaims]

Travis: Oh, snap, Griffin!

Griffin: No, no, no, that was a good burn. In my defense, I drank like half of a Tropical Chillerz.

[audience laughs]

Griffin: I swear to...

Justin: Now the onus is back on you. You should—you should—

Griffin: How many tropical chillers have *you* drank?

Travis: Response?

Justin: Riposte? Griffin, you got another Yahoo?

Travis: I know someone who's not getting a picture with us later.

Griffin: Ooh...

[audience chuckles]

Justin: You absolute—

Travis: Pretty much everyone, because we'll be passed out in the dressing room. [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Yeah, right. [chuckles] We're gonna black out on tropical chillers. Did you go to the "My Brother, My Brother and Me show? Yeah, it was their last one. It was really funny for the first forty minutes, and then the tropical chillers caught up with them." Griffin, help me out.

Griffin: Oh, god, this one's sent in by Alithea Eckhart. Thank you, Alithea. It's by Yahoo Answers user Julia, who asks, "Does anyone know where to find a gargoyle nativity set?"

[audience laughs]

Griffin: "I'm looking to find a nativity set in the form of gargoyles. Any suggestions are helpful. Thanks!"

Justin: Not any suggestions. I bet the ones that we're going to have are not going to be particularly useful.

Travis: In my nightmares.

Griffin: Did...

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Are there other monsters that are getting their own nativity sets that I didn't know about?

Travis: Anywhere know where to find a werewolf nativity set?

Griffin: Yeah, I—

Travis: With like baby Jesus halfway through transformation. "Ergh!"

Justin: "Ah... They didn't follow a star, they followed the full moon."

[audience chuckles]

Travis: "We brought him frankincense and silver bullets!"

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: I... why do you need a gargoyle nativity set?

Justin: [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: You know, we don't take the time to ask the obvious questions enough here on My Brother, My Brother and Me. What are you—what are you doing with this?

Travis: So their gargoyle friends don't feel left out!

Griffin: Yeah!

Justin: Yeah, right.

Griffin: Oh, wait, there are two ways they... well, I guess they...

Justin: What?

Travis: [titters] They don't do that whole—

Griffin: They don't do the nativity thing, do they?

Justin: No, and I don't think they think it stars—

Travis: It breaks off right there!

Justin: Wait, were you thinking of the Golem?

Griffin: That's what it was.

Justin: Okay, good.

Griffin: I got it mixed around in my head.

Justin: Pretty good goof. We'll just edit this one out later, this is a director's cut goof for everybody here.

Griffin: Hey, let's say more things about Kwanzaa that we don't understand!

[audience chuckles]

Justin: I think anybody can appreciate the Kwanzaa cube gag. I've been working on that for ages.

Griffin: Can we help this person out and find monster-themed nativity sets anywhere?

Travis: This is my problem. To have a gargoyle-themed nativity set, at some point, some stone mason or carver would have to sit there and go, "I'm sick of all this human stuff."

Griffin: Yeah.

Travis: "I know what the people want."

Griffin: "I need a Jesus—"

Travis: "Gargoyle babies!"

Griffin: "I need a Jesus with wings and a beak."

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: "Also, he is made of stone! And he perches high upon a watchtower."

Justin: I don't think Jesus would be in a watchtower. I think we've gotta stick with the manger, or else it's not really a nativity.

Travis: Hey perches on the edge of a manger.

Griffin: Yeah! Because there's no room for him to perch—

Travis: And then they're saying, "Get back in that manger, Jesus."

Griffin: Yeah, "You're a baby, that's dangerous."

[audience chuckles]

Travis: "Watch out for the gargoyle cow, Jesus."

Justin: There were no perches left on the end, so he had to perch...

[audience chuckles]

Justin: The real—the real lie that this set tells is that you can get gargoyles to sit still for anything. Because they—you know, you get a bunch of them in a room together, they're going to start arguing, they're going to start having a political fight, and it's going to be a real disaster. Humans, you can get 'em to stand around, even cows and sheep and stuff. But gargoyles? Ugh.

Griffin: I have been trying to reference the TV show Gargoyles for a while, and I just—

Travis: I've been trying to do it in a way that wasn't just saying, "Gargoyles, the TV show!"

Griffin: "Hey! You guys remember that cartoon? I had gargoyles in it."

Justin: I almost said that one of the wise men would have to be voiced by Jonathan Frakes. But I think—

Griffin: Jesus!

Justin: Like it's a real deep cut, so... [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: I'm really going out to the boneyard for this one.

Griffin: I would really love to see the look on your face as you look around the audience like, "Guys? Jonathan Frakes? Anyone?"

[audience chuckles]

Travis: "How about that Jonathan Frakes goof!"

Justin: [sings] The stars at night are big and bright.

[the audience claps three times]

Audience: [sings] In the heart off Texas.

Justin: Yeah, get—

Griffin: That's our fuckin'—that's our fuckin' zip line—

Justin: Yeah, bad news, everybody, that's the rip cord, So, after this, we are—we are working without a net. [chuckles]

[audience chuckles]

Justin: You got anything else, Griffin. Do you have anything else saved—

Griffin: I do, but it's the question you hate and you didn't want me to read.

Travis: Oh, do it.

Justin: Don't read this fucking question, let's just—

Travis: Read it as loud as you can.

Griffin: It was sent by Lynn W.

Justin: Can we—wait, can we just end the show instead of that?

Griffin: It's by Yahoo Answers user Coopi-Coo, who asks—

Justin: I am against this. I'm not here for this part.

Travis: For the next thirty seconds, Justin's gonna check out.

Griffin: "How do I tell my girlfriend everything down there looks weird?"

[audience laughs]

Travis: Like everyone else does.

Griffin: "It was the first time I ever saw it on a woman, and it looked weird. How do I tell her?" Hold up...

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: It was the first time you ever saw it on a woman?

[audience laughs]

Griffin: I was looking—

Travis: You've seen illustrations and stuff.

Griffin: "I was looking through the tree line, and I saw it. It inspired me, like sunshine through the boughs."

Justin: Yeah, the first time I heard dubstep, it was weird to me. You just, you have—you have to get used to these things.

Griffin: Yeah. Hey, have you ever seen Skrillex's vagina?

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: It's like wicked weird looking!

Travis: I feel that this is like a whole avenue that Hallmark could go down, just like a series of cards, and on the front it says, "Hey, baby, I love you so

much." And there's like a beautiful sunrise. And then you open it and just says, "But your vagina is weird."

Griffin: "Your business region is like *what?*"

Travis: "Your downtown area is like what the fuck?"

Justin: You have to broach it with her scientifically. You have to say, "Hey, listen—"

Travis: And push your glasses up your nose.

Justin: Push your glasses up your nose and say, "Listen... I need to see some of your friends' vaginas."

[audience chuckles]

Justin: "Because right now, I—"

Travis: "I'm going to need you to do a side by side comparison."

Justin: Yeah, "I have no basis. This is purely scientific, you understand. Clinical. A clinical study of your friend Darlene's vagina."

Travis: I want you to read that—just the first sentence of that answer.

Griffin: Rosie says, "You're going to destroy her self-esteem if you tell her. So find a way to communicate that doesn't involve making her feel gross."

Travis: If her entire self-esteem is based upon the beauty of her vagina—

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: I don't have—

Travis: She doesn't have a lot—

Griffin: "I don't have a lot of things going for me, but man, is my vagina great!"

Justin: [chortles]

[audience laughs]

Justin: I would like to formally apologize for thinking we shouldn't read this question, because it's gone great so far.

[audience laughs]

Justin: What a gem. One for the—one for the—one for the record books I'd say.

Griffin: I'm pretty sure that nobody with a vagina listens to our show.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: Oops!

Justin: Oops!

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Sorry.

Griffin: Sorry.

Justin: Let's—we should—we should end this. Thank you guys. I want to hear Griffin's last question, but first, I should say thank you to all of you who have come to our show from Austin and the surrounding area and New Orleans. Thank you guys for coming. You're like the best people in the whole world and I love you very much.

Griffin: Thank you so much. Sorry about that stuff I said about nobody with vaginas listening. I feel bad about saying that.

[audience chuckles]

Griffin: There's a lot of people.

Travis: Juust just looking around the room—

Griffin: There's a lot of—

Travis: I can't help but notice...

Griffin: There's like thirty to forty vaginad people.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: And that is what they prefer, right?

Griffin: Yeah.

[audience chuckles]

Travis: That's the PC term.

Justin: That's the PC term.

Travis: Vaginad among us.

Griffin: There's a lot of vaginaeds.

[chuckles]

Justin: The vaginaeds among you.

Travis: The vaginese.

[audience laughs and applauds]

Griffin: I can't say that word anymore for the rest of my life. I burned 'em all this night.

Justin: Thank you—[chuckles]

Griffin: If anybody wants any super fruit gummies, we got 'em up here. Don't take more than—

Travis: Yeah, plenty don't be shy.

Griffin: Don't eat more than two of the acais.

Justin: Make sure you come by—

Griffin: You will freak out.

Justin: We'll be over here, come by and say hi and get a picture, and get something signed. And buy a poster, if you want the ten bucks. And we're gonna be going—where are we going to after we're done here?

Griffin: Oh, we're gonna go to the Kung Fu Saloon! They have skee-ball, so...

Travis: Free skee-ball!

Griffin: Free skee-ball, so—

[audience exclaims]

Travis: Drink—yeah, drink it in.

Griffin: Free skee-ball!

Justin: Were you guys just disappointed that the skee-ball is—

Travis: Ah!

Griffin: Ah!

Travis: "That's how you know it's real low-level skee-ball!"

Griffin: "I'll save my tokens!"

Justin: "There's gonna be commoners on it."

Travis: And special thanks to everyone who helped out with the show tonight. To Rachel, Sydnee and Bristol.

Griffin: Thanks, guys.

Travis: Justin.

Griffin: Tanner.

Justin: Jordan.

Griffin: Jordan. Thank you, everybody.

Travis: Thank you so much to the Blue Theater for having us.

Griffin: Yeah, thanks Blue Theater!

[audience cheers]

Griffin: I want to thank the creators of Tropic Chillerz with a Z.

Travis: Don't tell 'em about all the mean things we said about 'em.

Griffin: Your shit tastes so bad!

Travis: They probably don't have a lot going for 'em.

Justin: Except for their beautiful vaginas.

[audience chuckles]

Justin: Griffin, go ahead with the last question.
