Justin:

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Um, but yes, I mean, October 13th, right? It's just around—

Griffin:

Oh jeez.

Justin:

Just around the corner.

Travis:

What, that was the day?

Justin:

The big '02.

Griffin:

Hey, do you guys have your Halloween costumes picked out yet?

Justin:

The fifth... [laughs] I'm a... Fifth of... Gosh, Christmas, Christmas is just around the corner now. Isn't it?

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Um, you know, well, the Fifth of August is when they get in, got in. And then—

Griffin:

Oh, I see. Oh, well we're kinda close to that.

Justin:

And then, 70 days later...

Travis:

So we're celebrating, we're celebrating the two year anniversary of them b—getting trapped. Yay.

Griffin:

Yeah, we're celebrating entry day, not emergence day.

Travis:

Oh no, forget that.

Justin:

We're... Right now we're celebrating, um, the, the two year anniversary of when they went in. In two weeks, we'll celebrate the two year anniversary of when America kinda lost interest.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

And then, in like, uh, in 70 days we'll celebrate America getting back into it again in a big, big way.

Griffin:

Yeah. You know, day one. They probably didn't know that their, that their shit was so, so fucked. Right?

Justin:

Right.

Griffin:

They probably thought that they were going on another fun spelunking adventure.

Justin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

Right.

Griffin:

But, I think around day three the shine sort of came off the apple.

Justin:

It's just like camping, isn't it?

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

You go there. So nice to be back in nature or, in this case, a lightless, oxygen reduced—

Travis:

Yeah, but, but there's even less threat of bears, right?

Justin:

Mm, right.

Griffin:

Well, there's-

Travis:

Except for underground bears.

Griffin:

Exactly. Fossil bears.

Travis:

[laughs] Bone bears.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

So, so this is, uh, our advice to, to the Chilean miners. Really savor, savor this time. It's your time.

Griffin:

Cherish it.

Justin:

You've earned it. Because this is an advice show, after all. It's an advice show called My Brother, My Brother and Me. And I am the oldest mining brother Justin McElroy.

Travis:

I—I'm the middle... I don't mine things. Travis McElroy.

Griffin:

I'm Griffin McElroy. I'm playing Minecraft right now.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

Right this second.

Griffin:

While we record the show. So if I don't, if I'm not paying attention, it's because of the Minecraft.

Little known fact, Griffin is the canary of My Brother, My Brother and Me. If he, if he dies then we know that the air has become toxic and we have to stop doing the podcast.

Griffin:

Oh, I think we all know I'm not gonna be the brother that dies first.

Travis:

[laughs] Which brother is the brother that dies first?

Justin:

Which brother dies first?

Griffin:

Count of three. One, one. Two. Three. Travis.

Justin:

Justin.

Travis:

Yeah?

Griffin:

No. [laughs]

Travis:

See, I was gonna say Griffin and now we're all split.

Griffin:

Okay.

Travis:

I know that you have a weak constitution.

Griffin:

Yeah. What if we do a murder-murder-suicide pact.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin: Yeah.
Travis: Well, who's the suicide?
Justin: We're all gonna live up to that.
Griffin: Mm-hmm.
Travis: Um, I mean, if you guys need me to kill you, I would kill you.
Justin: Uh, unfortunately we're booked on sponsors for the next couple months so we can't off ourselves yet, but maybe—
Travis: Okay, great.
Justin: Maybe after that, we can kill ourselves. Maybe.
Travis: Oh, for sweeps. For podcast sweeps.
Justin: [laughs] For podcast sweeps.
Griffin: Hey, have you guys listened to me?
Justin: [laughs]
Travis: [laughs]
Griffin:

Super good. They go through some radical changes. Both personally and professionally.

Justin:

It's a big departure, um, literally. Uh, here on My Brother, My Brother and Me we take your queries. We turn them, alchemy-like, into wisdom. And, uh, let's get to it.

Our first question. "On and off for a year now. I've been sexty texting - that's a gray zone between sexting and flirty texting - a fella. Griffin:

Mm.

Justin:

Mm.

Travis:

Well, I mean, no, but I'm saying the previous bad is on him. Future bad is on both of you.

Griffin:

Yeah, yeah. Fool me once.

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Then, then that one's on, that one's on me. Fool me twice, for four months after you've been engaged?

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Griffin:

That's no good, dog.

Justin:

Yeah, that's not... Oh man, this is a tough putt. I can, I know you're, I understand you're invested in this in as so much as you can be invested in a relationship with your thumbs, but I think—

Travis: Which is a lot. It's a lot more than you would think.
Justin: It's a lot. It's a lot. Yeah, I mean, look at Billy Mitchell [laughs] But I—I think that, uh, this is a good time for you to make your egress from this situation.
Griffin:

Yeah.

Yeah, I think that's a great word for it. Uh, situation. That's the thing. It's like there is no end to this that's not messy.

Justin:

It has, you have been, you have been foisted against your will into a situation.

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Um.

Griffin:

A messy, messy situation.

Justin:

A messy, messy situation.

Travis:

And I would say, even outside the moral ambiguity, like, get out of it because you're better than that, like—

Griffin:

Yeah.

Travis:

This is an engaged dude that's, you know, he's taking out all of his, you know, whatever fear of the future with his fiancée with you. He's using you.

Griffin:

If, if you're in for, like, the excitement of a good sext, like, maybe start sexting your bank, you know?

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

[laughs] Now, now that, that creates some problems.

Griffin:

Sext the, sext the time and temperature line at your bank so that you don't have to, you know, you don't have to deal with that, that moral shadiness. And you can still get your, still get your, you know, your rocks off.

Travis:

Do you think that, just like there are, like, phone sex lines, that there are phone sext lines that people are working on where you can, like, sext something and they sext you back?

Griffin:

Absolutely.

Justin:

Absolutely.

Griffin:

And it's all, all computer generated. You know it's true.

Travis:

That's horrifying.

Justin:

You're completing texting with a robot that is learning and adapting.

Travis:

And you're texting their uncanny valley.

Griffin:

Right. Ugh, gross.

Travis:

[laughs] Gross.

Justin:

Uh, extricate yourself from this situation. Also, just to clarify something, if you find out that someone is engaged, the gray zone, if it ever existed between flirty texting and sexting, completely disappears.

Travis:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

If you, if you would not show... It's like, you know it's a sin if you wouldn't do it in front of Jesus. Like, if you, if the girl, fiancée would look at it, what you guys are doing, and say, uh, and, and get infuriated then it's, that's, that's, that's cheating. That's—

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

That's sexting. You're sexting.

Travis:

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

Like-

Justin:

He's, and he, you're too great.

Travis:

That's what I'm saying.

Justin:

He can't end it. He's begging for you to help. Guys are stupid. He's begging for you to help him get out of this cause he, he sees no solution. He's like, he's like a rat in a maze. He's, he's begging for you to lead him, lead him to daylight. Which you can do, and save face, and be totally cool, and, more importantly, like, feel good about it in... Justin:



That is a Jedi style that a lot of people, a lot of people don't know about. Old Obi-Wan Kenobi. Oof. It was like the, it was like the forests of Tatooine down there.

Justin:

You, you want it to... [laughs] You want it to be so whack down there that when you drop your pants, everyone in the room says, "That is not what I'm looking for." [laughs]

Griffin:

[laughs] "That is not the bush I'm looking for." Thank you, I uh—

Travis:

"That situation is not in any way what I am looking for."

Griffin:

So... [laughs]

They gotta have a braid down there. You said, you said that jokingly but you know it's braided.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm. Which, you know what that means. Jedi can't wear shorts. What's that coming out?

Travis:

[laughs] "What is that thing at your knee dad?"

Griffin:

Oh no.

Justin:

"Do you wanna go to the desert planet?" "Fuck. Again? Fuck." "Just put on some cargoes, you'll be fine." "I can't."

Griffin:

Um.

Justin:

Stupid braided bush.

Travis:

[laughs]

Griffin:

It's not only a bad... It's not only the worst look, right? It, it's the worst explanation of a look that you can... I think if I had this thing, I would rather say, "Oh, it's a rattail."

Travis:

I honestly was just thinking of rattail.

Griffin:

"I have a rattail because I'm a dirty boy." Which I think is better than, "Oh, it's my Jedi braid. I'm, I'm at, I'm at the academy."

Justin:

It's an unbraided, it's an unbraided Jedi braid. Can we start calling rattails lazy Jedis?

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Travis:

Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

"Hate leads to anger, buddy. Do you know?"

Justin:

Don't do this thing you're thinking of doing. Are you a Jedi? Because I will assure you that in the, in the wide pantheon of the Jedi lifestyle, that dumb hair thing is pretty low on the list.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Like, old Obi wasn't even rocking it. There are several other steps that are more important to the Jedi life.

Justin:

Griffin:

Mace Windu didn't have any hair. Except for the bush.

Justin:

Griffin:

I think that's, I think that's what it is.

Justin:

Is that the thing?

Travis:

Do you by like 900 years old that, that Yoda just had, like, the most rocking bush?

Griffin:

I imagine Yoda was half bush under there.

Travis:

[laughs] 60 percent of his body mass was bush.

Justin:

Let's just put it this way. If he fell forward, he would bounce like a gummy bear. It's complete, it's complete bush down there. Springy, green—

Travis:

But really well-groomed. Just well-groomed—

Justin:

Yeah, it's, it's like a fucking topiary. It's beautiful.

Griffin:

God, I can't, I can't wait for Star Wars 3D. We're finally gonna get the kind of depth that we need to finally peep that bush.

Justin:

[laughs] It's gonna look like you're buried in an avalanche. It's gonna be amazing.

Griffin:

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin: Yeah.

Justin:

Yeah, isn't that a thing?

Griffin:

Mitt Romney eats sandwiches with cereal on them, what's up with that?

Travis:

[laughs] It's craziness.

Justin:

Uh, that story about Mitt Romney doing that thing, uh, I think was terrible, uh, I think—

Griffin:

Pretty much the worst.

Justin:

Pretty much the worst. I would say that we're probably... None of us are, are proud of everything we did in high school. Um, but—

Griffin:

Are you apologizing for Mitt Romney right now?

Justin:

No, I wanted to make a broader point and that's what the... When you guys heard the story, was anybody else sort of disappointed that the end of it wasn't, "And then he turned out to be The Joker." Like, it reads very origin story.

Travis:

Oh, like, like, the kid that he punished.

Justin:

Exactly.

Travis:

That, that he teased.

Justin:

The kid that he teased turned... And then, as it turns out, he was somebody, like, some, like maybe—

Travis:

Like, oh, you're saying like Paul Harvey, like, the rest of the story—

Justin:

Exactly, like, and, and he had his butt cheeks taped, taped, like, taped together.

Travis:

And it turned out that was Obama.

Griffin:

Oh, shit.

Justin:

And, as it turns out, if was Obama.

Travis:

And now you know the rest of the made-up story.

Justin:

It was Muammar Gaddafi. Who knew? I was just disappointed. I like narrative arcs. I was disappointed it didn't pan out that way. I turned out he was just, just hazing some poor kid but I thought it would be cool if the poor kid, and this seems like a pretty good open window now, the poor kid, like—

Griffin:

Got psychic powers and burned down his high school during the prom.

Justin:

Something like that would be great.

Travis:

[laughs] They... Which, I think you were referencing, I don't know, Carrie, but I really wanted you to be referencing Zapped! Or Zapped Again!

Griffin:

I was referencing Zapped Again!

Travis:

Uh, you were?

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

And they all perished in the fire.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

Is that how Zapped Again! ends?

Griffin:

Uh-huh.

Travis:

Yeah, it's not a very good movie.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

It sounds like a really good movie. [laughs]

Travis:

You know, I'll let you be the judge.

Griffin:

What, do, okay... So, imagine the scene. You're this child's mother. You walk in on your child squeezing their butt cheeks together, are they, are they—

Travis:

[laughs] Well, he was trying to fly.

Justin:

I mean, I guess.

Travis:

You ever see that movie, Boy Who Could Fly? That's what it's about. That's what it is. If you push hard enough, the force just lifts you off the ground.

Justin:

Do you think that they were just sitting there and they were struck by a fantasy? Like, "Oh, I know what I'll do." Or, do you think—

I've got some time to kill.

Justin:

Do you think they really prepped for this? Do you think they put on some sweatband, maybe? And got ready to release... And maybe left school a little early to give themselves plenty of time to squeeze their butt cheeks.

Travis:

Before their parents got home.

Justin:

"Uh, excuse me, teach. Can I spend your class standing? I am, I am going for a world record this afternoon."

Travis:

"I am in training."

Justin:

"I'm in training."

Griffin:

"I need zero butt pressure until it counts."

Justin:

[laughs] "I need it, I need, I need it to feel like, uh, like, uh, popped bubble wrap underneath there. Just, like, soft and pliant.

Travis:

[laughs] "Please don't mind the doughnut. We're training."

Griffin:

"This is, this is..." [laughs]

Justin:

"This is my training doughnut."

Griffin:

"This is my training doughnut." [laughs] Um—

Travis:

"That's right, Sydnee, I don't have hemorrhoids. It's a training doughnut for my butt squeezing."

Griffin:

This is really unfortunate because this probably is a little kid. Can we, can... 16 or older for the internet, please. Can we? Can we get a license program?

Justin:

Can we just get a limit?

Griffin:

I, when I have kids, they're going to dumb shit because I did dumb shit, and, like, I don't want them going and telling the internet about the dumb shit that they did.

Travis:

Better question is, I, I mean honest to god, if I had a kid right now, if I had, like, a 14-year-old son. And I was like, "What are you going to do today, son?" And he was like, "Well, I'm gonna go in my bedroom and squeeze my butt cheeks together." [laughs] Sorry, I was looking. And I would say, "Okay, have a great day." Like, I wouldn't stop them.

Griffin:

Don't tweet that. But don't tweet it. Yeah.

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Travis:

What, what exactly was the advice that this person was asking for, by the way?

Griffin:

They just wanted to know if this was some sort of exercise. I'm gonna go ahead and say, "Yeah. You can probably increase your, like—

Travis:

The best kind of exercise.

Griffin:

Your butt resistance.

Travis:

If you can get to a point where you can pick up a pencil with your butt cheeks—

Griffin:

Mm.

Travis:

You are a god among men.

Griffin:

I guess.

Justin:

Promising, promising through with the landing strip, I guess.

Griffin:

That doesn't sound extremely difficult.

Travis:

No, man, have you tried?

You're just one step away, one step away from being able to pick up singles with your butt cheeks.

Travis:

Okay, well then let's say, pick up the pencil and sign your name with it.

Griffin:

Oh, that's... In cursive?

Travis:

Well, of course. Or else it doesn't count.

Justin:

Um, we uh, we have a lot of, uh, uh, sponsors lined up this week for the Money Zone. I'm excited to get there. But, as long as we're talking about Yahoo Answers, I wanted to, uh, draw to, uh, to your attention... Justin:

[laughs]

Griffin:

"I got in trouble and my stepdad, Ron, grounded me. Can he legally ground me if he is only my stepdad?" And, also, "Does lying make you stupid? My stepdad, Ron, caught me lying and called me disingenuous. I don't think that lying make you stupid. I see celebrities who lie all the time and they are famous. I know it's wrong. I was just wondering if anyone else thinks it makes you stupid."

Travis:

[laughs] I would watch a series of movies about just the relationship between Geoff and Ron.

Justin:

I, I was, I was just thinking, how is it that Shit My Dad Says is a TV, and I don't have stepdad Ron and his stupid stepson—

Travis:

Stepdad Ron Knows Best.

Griffin:

It's like we can watch, it's like we can watch their relationship develop, right? It's like, "I have this new stepdad. I stepped out of line, uh. Can he legally ground me because I don't know? This is a new, scary situation for me. I'm growing up so fast. Please help me. I'm Geoff." And then, a couple days later, he lies to him, and he says, "I, you know, I'm having a hard time making this relationship work. Does lying make you stupid? I don't know. Please help me. Griffin:

What's that?

Justin:

Money.

[theme music plays]

Justin:

Griffin, who's the first person taking us to the Money Zone this week?

Griffin:

Today, we have Wednesday Wolf, uh, whose art you can see at wednesdaywolf.com. It is, uh, they, they sell, uh, fucked up watercolor paintings. I have seen these paintings. I can indeed confirm they are pretty fucked up.

Travis:

But, oh man, there are some awesome ones just right at the top of the page there with, uh, Chewbacca and Yoda and, like, they're awesome.

Griffin:

There's a Mario—

Justin:

Like, Chewbacca looking more like a human pubis than he ever has before.

Travis:

[laughs]

Exactly. Um, but the paintings are really neat and they would look good on a wall of an apartment or a bathroom or a nursery of a child that you want to just ruin, um.

Justin:

[laughs] Just, yeah, just for life.

Griffin:

Yeah. Um, but, but go check it out. It's wednesdaywolf.com. I think you're gonna like what you see unless you're prone to nightmares. Day nightmares. Daymares.

Justin:

Daymares. If you're prone to daymares stay away, but otherwise you should get to wednesdaywolf.com. It's, uh... There's some Pokémon, too. Some really scary Pokémon.

Griffin:

Holy shit.

Justin:

They've even got my favorite Pokémon, Gastly.

Griffin:

He looks horrifying. So-

Justin:

He looks horrifying. He looks ghastly. Quite literally. But, uh, it's, it's awesome. You guys gotta go take a look. Wednesdaywolf.com. Just type it into your browser, don't think about it.

Griffin:

Justin.

Justin:

Just do it.

Griffin:

What, what's... Tell us about our next sponsor.

The Imps of Marge and Fletch. If you haven't heard of them you can to, uh, theimps.org. And they're a, uh, creative group that spends their time making absurd, this is a quote, "Absurd situational photographs," uh, to entertain their audience. Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

Griffin:

Now, hold on. They're giving away—

Justin:

Yes.

Griffin:

A limited magician?

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

[laughs] Griffin, as you should know by all of our associations with m—magicians, they are, by definition, unlimited.

Griffin:

Okay.

Justin:

But, um, uh, yeah. You can go to theimps.org and you'll find a link to their Kickstarter, Intergalactic Expansion. They're going to put the show on in

Vienna but they will send you cool stuff for helping them to get it mounted. Uh, and it looks fantastic and I support more cool things going into worlds, so go check it out.

Travis:

Speaking of, looks fantastic. Huh. Once again this week we're sponsored by Mob Rules Games, the makers of Haunts: The Manse Macabre. Um, they're working on a Kickstarter. It's going great. They've raised about, uh, I would say almost about \$11,000 so far. So they're, uh, almost, you know, close to halfway there. Highway robbery their stuff. Their goal is to get it out in time for Halloween this year, um, so there's, I believe, about another 30 days or another 45 days left in their Kickstarter. So make sure you Kick, uh, check it out. It's mobrulesgames.com. Uh, they have links there to the Kickstarter so make sure to go check out their stuff. It looks amazing. It's, um, kind of Edgar Allen Poe-inspired, um, you know, Edward Gorey stuff. It looks awesome. So make sure you check it out, uh, mobrulesgames.com.

Justin:

Uh, and last up, in the, in the Money Zone this week, uh, is... Travis, hit me.

Travis:

Well, it's a little TV show pilot called Don't Take This The Wrong Way.

Justin:

People are still watching TV?

Travis:

I know, it's amazing, right? Well—

Griffin:

Is this Everybody Loves Raymond again?

Justin:

That's the only TV show I know of.

Travis:

It's, it's basically like Everybody Loves Raymond again only better, if you can believe it. And, uh, it's a pilot developed by, uh, Craig Lewis and Matthew Chandler. Um, they're friends from college. They worked together, you know, since 2002. And so, basically, they're working on this show. Um, they describe it as, "A combination of The League," which is a show on FX, "And a younger, half-hour version of Men of a Certain Age." So—

Men of a Younger Age.
Travis: Men of a Certain Age that's not the age that the men are on the show.
Justin: [laughs]
Griffin: Maybe Men of a Funnier Age.
Travis: Men of a Younger, More Accessible Age.
Griffin: Okay.
Justin: Men of an Age where there are fewer jokes about prostate cancer.
Travis: Yeah, all their boners still work.
Griffin: And more jokes about, more jokes about iPods.
Justin: [laughs] I had to go to my doctor. He put his finger up my butt and found an iPod.
Griffin: Cool.
Travis: [laughs] Men of a Younger Age.
Justin: Kickstart it.

Travis:

They're... They've been working on the script for a couple of years now and they've reached a point where they're ready to film it and they wanna just grab that bull by horns and wrestle it to the ground and film that whole process.

Griffin:

Yeah, fuck that bull.

Travis:

And fuck that bull. So, basically, um, you know, they just need, uh, \$18,000 for development, shooting, post-production.

Justin:

Indiegogo.com/wrongway is where you can, uh, you can see a clip with the guys. You can hear a little bit about, more about the show, um. And, this is very exciting, if you mention My Brother, My Brother and Me, okay, not, and I can't stress this enough, not Jordan, Jesse, Go!

Griffin:

Uh-huh.

Justin:

My Brother, My Brother and Me, um. If we bring more people into their, into their donor pile. Then they are going to, uh—

Travis:

Their writhing pile of donors.

Justin:

[laughs] The writhing, nightmarish pile. Their daymare-ish pile of watercolor donors. Uh—

Travis:

Watercolor donors is an awesome band name.

Justin:

Yeah. By the way, um, it is, uh, then we will get into an episode. A mention of us. Some oblique reference that only people who enjoy our program will appreciate, and uh—

Travis:

Right now, across the internet globe, Jordan and Jesse and talking about this show.

Justin:

Right.

Travis:

And they're great and all. But we're, we're killing it. Their phoning it in. We're killing it. So we need you guys to go and prove that by mentioning us more than them—

Griffin:

Right.

Travis:

So that we can get in the episode and not them.

Justin:

Again, that's indiegogo.com/wrongway. Go support those guys but most importantly, uh, help get us into something, but even more importantly, keep Jordan and Jesse from getting into something. [laughs]

Travis:

[laughs] Just help us crush our friends Jordan and Jesse.

Justin:

Help our crush our foes in opposition. Uh, so anyway, that is all. Those are all our sponsors this week. Unless I'm mistaken, Griffin, um, that is a song you're going to weave together, to craft together.

Griffin:

I, I'm so fucking angry right now.

Travis:

So, let's see, you've gotta get, uh, wednesdaywolf.com, theimps.org, mobrulesgames.com, and indiegogo.com/wrongway.

Justin:

Actually, Mob Rules Games were not—

I always busted one out for them. I'll, I will give them a final draft of that come, come the end of this promotion.

Travis:

Okay. So it's Don't Take This The Wrong Way, The Imps, and Wednesday Wolf.

Griffin:

I like the idea of daymare pile of watercolor donors.

Travis:

I like that part. So far, so good.

Justin:

Maybe, start there.

Griffin:

Okay.

Justin:

Um, what does that cover? That covers Wednesday Wolf and The Imps.

Travis:

It covers all three.

Griffin:

They all want money.

Travis:

Yeah.

Griffin:

That's the connector. Everybody wants money. Here we go. Hold on. [guitar playing] [singing] Build a daymare pile, of watercolor donors. All these businesses need funds to operate. You can help Wednesday Wolf, the Imps Don't Take the Wrong Way. That's almost what it's called, but I ran out of words in the verse. Go give them some cash... to chase all of their dreams around.

Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

[laughs] Whoa. I like how it ended on sort of that unresolved—

Griffin:

[singing] Dreams a... dreams... I don't know guys. [singing] Build a daymare pile of watercolor donors. You need to give these people lots of cash. That's how the market works, they take your money and take it into goods and services, and you can take those services to the bank. While they take your literal money to the bank. Travis:

[laughs]

Justin:

[laughs] Oh, man. There... I think the real contest is to find which way of spending your money your grandparents who lived through the depression would approve of the least.

Griffin:

[laughs]

Travis:

And it's to buy messages on our show.

Justin:

[laughs] Yeah, surprise, big twist. It's giving us money that they would really approve of the least. Uh, "Hey, I recently met a girl that's wonderful. We have a lot in common. She's expressed interest in dating me and it's mutual. I worry, though, that in a year when I'm finished college, I will likely have to move a pretty large distance to start my career. I also worry that she wants to start a family sooner than I do. Is this a deal breaker? Should I just stay single yet another year?" That's from Concern in Canada. Oh man. Of course not. Of course not. Any time you start a sentence with, "I'm worried that in a year—"

Griffin:

Uh-huh.

Justin:

Travis:

Justin:

Yeah, like, no, of course not. Quetzalcoatl's coming for you and me and everyone you love and that's December 21st this year. So, no, I would—

Griffin:

Hey, Quetzalcoatl can I get just like a short extension? Is it cool if, let's just... I tell you what. Let me pencil you in for, like, March '014. Oh, no, you're, uh. You're a giant thunder bird. We're all dead.

Travis:

Yeah, we're all dead. Thanks for the slow pitch. Ask this girl out immediately.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Yeah, you have no time. You have to, everybody needs to live like Quetzalcoatl's coming back.

Griffin:

Yeah. Don't even bother with birth control any more, cause we are less than nine months out.

Travis:

[laughs] Don't even go to the dentist. Don't even... That's bullshit.

Justin:

You don't wanna get eradicated when you're six months pregnant though. That's, that, your back's gonna be hurting.

Griffin:

That is true. Life begins at inception, that's true.

Justin:

You know, weird cravings. What if you get a weird craving to talk back to Quetzalcoatl. Then you're gonna die, you know, uh, die a lot earlier.

Griffin:

I mean, it does, yeah. I mean, it's six of one, half a dozen—

Justin:

You're gonna live in his service.

Griffin:

"Oh yeah."

Justin:

"Oh yeah." "Honey, listen, um, I know this is gonna sound weird. I have a craving for a stew made from the feathers of Quetzalcoatl. I need you to fetch them from his—

Griffin:

Would you climb—

Travis:

And then just a picture of, like, the dude driving in a minivan grumbling. "Huh, I was just in the middle of a game. And, huh, now I gotta go take some feathers from Quetzalcoatl."

Griffin:

"Gotta go climb his nest of bones into the tower of death corpses—

Travis:

"That he's formed over where the White House used to be. Ugh, huh, huh."

Justin:

The watercolor pile of daymare corpses that he's, he's made and now he lives atop. Listen. In a year, what you want, if this is the person, the one, the person, the special person that's going to change your whole path. In a year, here's what you'll want. To be with them. And the other stuff you can figure out.

Griffin:

Yeah.

Justin:

Like, you don't know what you want because you are only living half of your life, right now, if this is the special person that you are going to—

Travis:

That's beautiful Justin. Yeah. That's fucking gorgeous. That's pretty. You're like a fucking Hallmark card.

Justin:

Right, you don't... Honestly, everything changes—

Travis:

Yeah.

Justin:

When you are in or into a, a committed permanent relationship with somebody.

Travis:

Here's the thing though. Like, I, I agree with you Justin. And, the other aspect of it is, anything could happen in a year. Like, maybe you guys get together, it's great for three months, it doesn't work out, it ends. Okay great. But to say, "Because of something happening a year away, I'm not even going to give it the chance." Like a year is... Now if you were saying that you were moving away in, like, a week.

Justin:

Yeah.

Travis:

That's different.

Justin:

Travis:

Griffin:

Justin:

She could die.

Griffin:

You could die.

Justin:

You could die.

Travis:

You could kill each other.

Griffin:

You could kill each other in a gunfight.

Justin:

[laughs]

Travis:

And like a, like, one of you tackles the other one off the top of a building and, like, you're falling together but still fighting.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

So you're still punching each other as you fall.

Griffin:

And you think, like, "If I can put her body below mine, when we fall and hit the ground, then she'll die but I'll okay like in Crank." But, guess what? Nah, life don't work like Crank.

Travis:

And then she pulls a parachute and you're like, "Bullshit."

Griffin:

"Ah, yeah, I don't have one of those."

Justin:

"Bullshit. I should have married you when I had the chance, you're very smart."

Cranked again. Hey, have you guys seen Cranked Again?

Justin:

[laughs] It's stars Scott Baio and, at the end, the school burns down. It's a pretty weird movie. [laughs] What would you be fighting over? I mean, it is, we're joking, it is very realistic that they could be in a gunfight when Quetzalcoatl comes.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Justin:

Maybe they're fight... Maybe, uh, their mom, both their moms have an infection and they both need penicillin. Of course, Quetzalcoatl drinks penicillin for energy.

Griffin:

Yeah [laughs]

Justin:

So there's not a lot to go around.

Griffin:

Oh, Hunger Games.

Travis:

There's also a lot we still don't know about Quetzalcoatl.

Griffin:

Yeah, sure.

Justin:

There's a lot you don't know about Quetzalcoatl. [laughs] I, I'm spilling all kinds of facts right now.

Griffin:

Is, it, it's a, it's a bird. It, it, it is avian in nature, right? Am I imaging?

Travis:

I believe it, isn't it bird-snake? Chicken-snake?

I can't be bothered to Wikipedia.

Griffin:

I don't know what we're talking about any more.

Justin:

I don't know either. So, yeah, go, go love this girl.

Travis:

The only, the only thing I, I know is, go love this girl.

Justin:

That's everybody by the way. Just pair up. [laughs]

Travis:

Yeah, just go and partner off now.

Justin:

Just partner off. It'll make you easier to consume.

Travis:

Stop. Just...

Griffin:

[laughs]

Justin:

His mouth is only two people wide, so actually it would, it would be great for him if everybody could pair up before he gets back. [laughs] No single kids.

Griffin:

Mm-hmm.

Travis:

And then maybe if you, like, if you each hold hands you can, like, loop around one of his giant fangs and try to hold on as long as you can.

Griffin:

Holy shit. And if you're, if you are mega-fat, hook up with another mega-fair. Pair up. He goes to... Dead. Choked to death.

You sacrificed yourself.

Travis:


"You've gotta first seduce Tom Arnold and then be eaten by Quetzalcoatl." I don't know which one is worse.

Travis:

Griffin:

Justin:

Come on.

Travis:

Justin:
